### A Repeat for Jay Peg?

Looking for a repeat in the Mar. 28 G1 Dubai Duty Free S. at Nad Al Sheba, **Jay Peg (SAf)** (Camden Park) had an easy canter on the Tapeta surface at the Meydan training center Monday morning. "He's ready to peak for Saturday now," said trainer Herman Brown. "He's had two runs this year, and his last run...showed us he was right where we wanted him to be." Jay Peg disappeared after his 2008 Dubai Duty Free victory, returning to be fourth in a Nad Al Sheba handicap Jan. 22. The bay most recently dead-heated for second with Russian Sage (SAf) (Jallad) in the Mar. 5 G2 Jebel Hatta. **Balius (Ire)** (Mujahid) captured that test by 1 1/4 lengths.

### Creachadoir Ready for Return...

Sidelined since taking the G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. at Newbury last May, **Creachadoir (Ire)** (King's Best) will return to action in the Dubai Duty Free S. The five-year-old suffered a fracture to his right front leg while preparing for the G1 Queen Anne S. last June and had to undergo surgery, but has recovered well from the injury. "He was injured before Royal Ascot and missed the rest of the year, but has come back well and has been in good form at home," said trainer Saeed Bin Suroor. Bin Suroor added, "The Duty Free is always a tough race--we have Alexandros in there as well, and he has improved throughout the year and remains in great shape." A Group 3 winner in France at two, **Alexandros (GB)** (Kingmambo) is perfect in his four-year-old season, with a pair of Nad Al Sheba handicap victories to his credit. At least two Duty Free hopefuls--Japan's **Vodka (Jpn)** (Tanino Gimlet {Jpn}) and America's **Kip Deville** (Kipling)--are scheduled to breeze this morning. "She is in very good form," Keita Tanaka, racing manger for Team Vodka, said of the five-year-old mare. "Her trainer has just arrived this morning, and we are all set for her breeze [Tuesday]." Michelle Nevin, assistant trainer and main exercise rider to Rick Dutrow, Jr., said Kip Deville would just blowout today.

Shadwell Stable's **Albertus Maximus** enjoyed the sights during a strong gallop at Nad Al Sheba yesterday morning. "He was watching himself on the big screen as he went past it," trainer Kieran McLaughlin said. "He was just taking everything in. He's been great since he's been here--he hasn't missed a beat." The five-year-old will be going for his third in a row after taking the Oct. 25 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile and the Jan. 31 GI Donn H.

by a fever. "It was tremendously disappointing because we thought, depending upon how the race unfolded, he would run well," said Patrick Lawley-Wakelin, racing manager for owner Robert S. Evans.

After coming back to the States and running seventh, beaten four lengths, in the GII San Marcos H. at Santa Anita Jan. 19, Marsh Side again takes the show on the road in the Sheema Classic.

With Lawley-Wakelin looking on, the six-year-old horse, who gets the services of Edgar Prado Saturday, appeared keen yesterday as he galloped down the middle of Nad Al Sheba's turf course. Another six-year-old, the 2006 GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero **Red Rocks (Ire)** also galloped at Nad Al Sheba Monday. Trish McLaughlin, assistant to trainer Mark Hennig, assessed the exercise succinctly. "Great," she said. "He's training really great." Red Rocks beat Curlin in last July's GI Man o'War S. at Belmont, but disappointed in both the GI Breeder's Cup Turf (10th) and GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. (8th) Feb. 1.

By all accounts, dual champion **Indian Blessing** is flourishing in the deserts of Dubai, and yesterday she put the finishing touches on her preparations for Saturday's Shaheen with a sharp 800-meter drill in :47 4/5 at Nad Al Sheba. "I couldn't ask for anything else," said Janell Gruss, exercise rider for trainer Bob Baffert. "She just scoots over this surface. She did that super easy and she galloped out strong." The Dubai Racing Club reported that Indian Blessing traveled through 600 meters in :33.94, with her final 400 meters in a brisk :22.67.

California invader **Informed**, a \$25,000 claim by trainer Doug O'Neill and partners last June, was better behaved yesterday after acting up Saturday. The five-year-old horse, who broke free from assistant trainer Leandro Mora and tried to run off with rider Tony Romero, galloped 2000 meters under Romero yesterday morning. "He was much better today," said Romero. "He's always been [hard to handle], but he's been doing pretty good since he's been here. Today, he was the best so far." Informed, an allowance winner at Hollywood Park in December, nearly sprang the 28-1 upset over Cowboy Cal (Giant's Causeway) in the GII San Pasqual H. at Santa Anita Jan. 10. He was a dead-heat fourth behind Magnum (Arg) (El Compinche {Arg}) in the GII San Antonio H. at Santa Anita Feb. 8 in his final prep for this. "I'm very, very optimistic that we have a good chance in the race," Mora said, comparing Informed's adaptation to his environs at Nad Al Sheba with the way Spring At Last (Silver Deputy) handled the transition. Spring At Last won the 2007 Godolphin Mile. O'Neill is expected to arrive in Dubai Tuesday.

## PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

Surely any breeder's wish-list must include owning a daughter of the great Sadler's Wells. After all, this magnificent stallion has been Britain and Ireland's champion sire of broodmares in each of the last four years, and his daughters have already produced roughly 80 group/graded winners.

Last year alone, they were represented by Henrythenavigator (2000 Guineas, Irish 2000 Guineas, St James's Palace S., Sussex S.), Music Note (Mother Goose S., CCA Oaks, Gazelle H.), Conduit (St Leger, Breeders' Cup Turf), Grand Couturier (Joe Hirsch Turf Classic, Sword Dancer Invitational S.), Creachadoir (Juddmonte Lockinge S.) and Youmzain (Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud).

But anyone with a Sadler's Wells mare at this current time will need to be a bit adventurous in their choice of stallion. They can no longer rely on many of the stallions who helped lay the foundations of Sadler's Wells's success as a sire of broodmares. Danehill, Darshaan, Indian Ridge, Nashwan and Warning all achieved at least 15 percent stakes winners with daughters of the 14-time champion sire, but they are no longer with us. And Kingmambo, with only 19 mares covered in 2008, can no longer be the automatic choice for owners of Sadler's Wells mares with the necessary wealth.

So where else can these breeders go with any degree of confidence, especially in the U.S.?

Kingmambo has sired five Grade/Group 1 winners from Sadler's Wells mares, and his brother Miesque's Son is also responsible for a Group 1 winner. This would seem to suggest that other sons of Mr. Prospector would suit, but the reality is somewhat different. If Kingmambo and Miesque's Son are taken out of the equation, daughters of Sadler's Wells have only seven stakes winners among their 346 foals by sons of Mr. Prospector, and these 346 include only one Group 1 winner.

Inevitably, sons of Kingmambo have been very popular options for Sadler's Wells mares and two of them--King's Best and Dubai Destination--have sired Group 1 winners, but, with five percent stakes winners, this nick still has something to prove. Sons of Gone West have also been a popular option, and have nearly 120 foals. But this nick's eight percent stakes winners owes a great deal to just one horse, Zafonic, who sired most of this cross's nine stakes winners.

One American stallion who will have to be considered as a mate for Sadler's Wells mares is Mizzen Mast. This very versatile horse has only two foals aged three or more out of Sadler's Wells mares and both raced last week. The first, an Irish three-year-old called Signal Fire, won an all-weather race in a style that suggests he could graduate to stakes class. And the second, the four-year-old Midships, turned in a thoroughly admirable display to lead throughout in the GII San Luis Rey S. on turf.

*Hold Me Back rushes to the fore*

Hold Me Back, scarcely mentioned, if at all, in the Kentucky Derby discussion, ran himself right into contention with a sensational rally making his 3-year-old debut Saturday in the 38th running of the \$500,000 Lane's End Stakes, the annual showcase event at Turfway Park. Hold Me Back roared from 11th to post a 1 3/4-length score under Kent Desormeaux.

Mizzen Mast is a grandson of the influential Caro, and so is In Excess, whose only foal out of a Sadler's Wells mare is the Classic-winning French filly Musical Chimes (also winner of the GI John C. Mabee H. in the U.S.).

Caro appears one generation further back in the pedigree of Danehill Dancer, as the sire of this excellent stallion's second dam. Danehill Dancer's first two foals out of Sadler's Wells mares were Danehill Music, a Group 3 winner, and Salut d'Amour, a group-placed listed winner. Needless to say, this early success (and the death of Danehill) has led to a lot of Sadler's Wells mares heading to Danehill Dancer's door. It is going to be interesting to see how rich a harvest this cross reaps in 2009.

Another stallion who has enjoyed instant success with Sadler's Wells's daughters is Dalakhani. His first 15 foals bred this way feature the group winners Conduit, Shreyas and Deem, the Irish Oaks fourth Chinese White and the listed winner Yahrab. It is fair enough to attribute this striking success to Dalakhani's being a son of Darshaan, who enjoyed such a profitable relationship with Sadler's Wells, but it is also worth mentioning that his second dam is a granddaughter of Caro. It is through Caro that Dalakhani inherited his gray color.

This successful link between Sadler's Wells mares and Caro ties in with Sadler's Wells's own success with mares from the Grey Sovereign male line. The Caro branch of this line provided him with the Group 1 winner Cloudings and the multiple Group 3 winner Solo Mio.

Mizzen Mast appealed as a mate for Midship's dam Interim on the basis that he had the size and bone to suit this pretty, feminine mare. He also had the speed and precocity to help a mare who was at her most successful as a four-year-old, when she landed the GI La Prevoyante H. over a mile and a half. Interim's best effort prior to Midships was her Pleasant Colony colt Staging Post, runner-up in the GI San Juan Capistrano H. over a mile and three-quarters.

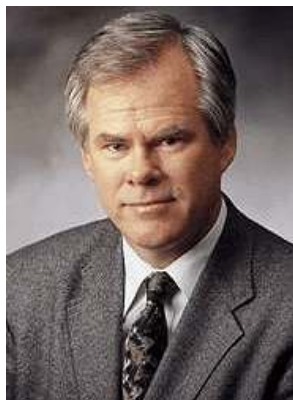
# Question of the month

**What has your experience been on Facebook? How does it help you keep in better touch with racing, or promote your racing product to customers? How might the industry better use social networking to promote itself? What other sites do you use?**

**Ray Paulick, publisher of the *Paulick Report***

Like many middle-aged adults, I first learned about Facebook from my kids, who now rely on this tool more than e-mail for communications with their friends. I've



found Facebook to be a useful tool for reaching a new audience, and if I'm going to generalize, I'd say it's a younger demographic, though more and more people from my generation are discovering it as a fun and useful way to keep in touch with individuals or groups of people, from old friends to relatives to folks I've met online.

From a business standpoint, Facebook has been a means to heighten awareness among racing enthusiasts about the *Paulick Report*, though our audience consists mostly of people with an investment or serious interest in the Thoroughbred industry. Relatively speaking, Pedigree Consultants LLC is a “newbie” to Facebook and other social networking sites.



We have, however, established our own business page and also a group within Facebook that has an increasing number of members. At this stage, we are just using it to engage our customers on products and services that we offer, but we hope to integrate this with our website a little more as we go along so that what we post there can be “mashed,” if you like, into Facebook

and other social networking sites.

A positive aspect from our viewpoint is that those who are members have done so via their own permission, so we are marketing to a captured audience that generally has interest in what we are doing and saying. We have just started to use Twitter, which is another interesting development. Twitter does allow us to say things “on the fly,” if you like, and its short structure suits some of the more interesting things that we do. Again, it relies on followers who are interested in what you have to say.

The ability to make comments about pedigrees and the like in short format as they happen and have this populate via Twitter, Facebook and our website helps us engage our customers in different ways than a straight blog or other direct marketing. It also helps that the customers who we are trying to reach are generally technically savvy at some level.

As far as what the industry can do to use social networking, well, in the case of Facebook and the like, it is essentially based on “permission marketing,” in that the people who are engaged in these groups have already said that they are interested in what you are talking about. It is then a matter of using these people to refer or influence their wider circle of friends to join in or accept the same message.

*Betfair is the greatest success story in the history of gambling. A betting exchange based in the United Kingdom, it was launched in 2000 and, fewer than nine years later, it has more than 2 million customers and handles in excess of 50 million pounds per week. The website [businessinsider.com](http://businessinsider.com) estimates that Betfair had \$500 million in revenue in 2008, and that the company is worth \$5 billion.*

*Betfair is the pioneer in the field of betting exchanges. In a betting exchange, customers bet against one another. In horse racing, for example, a customer posts odds on a horse and the amount of money he or she is willing to accept in wagers on that horse. If another customer wants to bet the horse at the posted price, the bets are matched, much as buyers and sellers are matched in traditional stock markets. Betfair accepts wagering on a number of sports and events, everything from horse racing, soccer games, and political elections to whether or not it will snow on Christmas Day in London.*

*Betfair takes a commission of 2 to 5 percent on all winning wagers.*

*While Betfair takes betting on American racetracks, it is wary of American laws covering wagering and the Internet, and does not accept customers residing inside the U.S. However, the company has made no secret of its intentions to expand into the U.S. market. Betfair took a step in that direction with its recent purchase of TVG, a racing television channel and advance deposit wagering company, which it bought for \$50 million.*

*Currently, Betfair is exploring additional steps it can take to eventually allow U.S. customers to wager through the betting exchange format. But how committed is Betfair to entering the U.S. market, and what is its plan of attack? Cont. p10*

Will it compensate U.S. tracks for putting on a product on which it takes wagering? So far, it has not done so.

Recently, Greg Nichols, Betfair's managing director of sporting affairs, sat down with the Thoroughbred Daily News to answer those questions and many others. Nichols politely declined to answer some questions, but his comments shed a great deal of light on Betfair's U.S. plans.

Nichols, 50, is a native of Australia who has spent his professional career in horse racing. Prior to joining Betfair, Nichols was the chief executive officer of the British Horse Racing Board. Before that, he was the general manager of Racing Victoria in his native Australia. Nichols's duties at Betfair include efforts to expand the Betfair brand beyond Great Britain and into untapped markets, such as the U.S.

**Q: Betfair recently made headlines in the U.S. with its purchase of TVG. What attracted Betfair to TVG, and why did the company feel it was a good acquisition?**

A: I believe TVG produces the best racing television in the world, better than Racing UK or attheraces, better than the Australian product. From the standpoint of production values, I think they are very much at the forefront. TVG is a successful company that we intend to make into something highly successful. TVG is the largest ADW player in the market.

A: Relying on a traditional method of getting a betting exchange into the U.S. would have been a very exhaustive process. This gives us an opportunity to work with the industry, show our credentials, show our legitimacy, show our integrity and introduce a level of security and integrity to betting that is certainly not evident to me in this country or anywhere else in the world. I think that we represent the pantheon of betting integrity. The business itself was an attractive proposition. The company internationally has a view that if there are possible acquisitions out there, then we will look at them and look at them very vigorously. Ultimately, we believe a betting exchange will come into the U.S., and I think it's fair to say that establishing our credibility is a number one priority. People will see a company that is prepared to share information, share market research and work with people to allow them to accomplish their goals, which in the main are contiguous with ours. We will work with the industry rather than being seen as a rapacious group of people not interested in horse racing. Certainly, the people we have already forged strong relationships with have a different perspective with us compared to people who are unaccustomed to dealing with us. That is an important element--we are warm and fuzzy, a hands-on type of organization and wherever we go we want to, not necessarily be loved, but to be known to be accountable and open.

**Q: Because Betfair allows customers to book bets on horses--essentially betting them to lose--there are those who feel it encourages chicanery. Your critics argue that bringing Betfair into the U.S. market will have a negative impact on the integrity of the sport. Do they have a valid argument?**

A: I don't believe so. There's been skullduggery around sports since the days of chariot racing at the Coliseum. Wherever there are financial gains to be made there will be people who look to exploit things. Look at Wall Street over the last 10 years. Based on that, you could argue that the level of threat to horse racing by nefarious characters is minimal compared to the financial system. From my personal experience in the UK, where the British Horse Racing Board actually funded the Jockey Club, which was responsible for regulation, I can tell you that when Betfair became more prominent, yes, there was a spike (in suspicious races). But if you speak now to the British Horse Racing Authority, which is responsible for regulation and governance, they will tell you there has been a dramatic decline in instances that have caught their eye.

If you look at the UK at the moment, the amount of cases up for review where jockeys, trainers or anyone else has allegedly been pulling stunts, well, there are very few. This is only anecdotal, but it can be easily verified by contacting the BHA. I believe you will find that these sorts of problems are at an all-time low. Where there is opportunity for financial advantage, there will be some people who will try things, but the beauty of our system is that they will be detected. They will not escape as they previously have, whether that's been with bookmakers in the UK, Ireland or Australia or elsewhere where there are pari-mutuel systems. What we do is detect the perpetrators, and the sport is ultimately better off without them. If people wish to exploit the system, they'll only do it once. They will get caught and they will be out.

**Q: What are the means and methods Betfair uses to detect instances where someone might have wagered with an unfair advantage?**

A: We have a system called Bet Monitor. It monitors bets in real time, reviewing races and bets as they occur. This is a company that has six billion transactions a year. We have more transactions than all the European stock exchanges put together. That's the degree of sophistication of our technology. We have 400 people working on software development, researching and developing integrity systems and security processes. We take it seriously because without the integrity of the contest we don't have a business. We make this information available to everyone in England. Any sporting organization that we have an integrity memorandum with can access that information. It is a system we are looking to advance beyond its present capability and make a more intrusive and interrogative approach to the monitoring of wagering. That's not just in the U.S.; it's worldwide and it's not just confined to horse racing. It could be golf, tennis, anything that you want it to be. We think that is something we could introduce to the U.S. There are a number of very progressive jurisdictions out there, among them New York and California, that are looking to implement more sophisticated betting monitoring processes, and we intend to engage and hopefully contribute to that debate. Protecting the customers is ultimately in all our best interests.

TDN Q&A: Nicols cont.

**Q: The U.S. has many ambiguous laws and regulations when it comes to gambling. At least in the area of exchange betting on horse racing, is Betfair convinced that is necessarily illegal in this country right now? Internet wagering on horse racing is, in fact, legal in this country.**

A: There has to be a lot of research done on the legal angle. We already have sufficient research to keep libraries filled for a lifetime. We want to establish trust in our credentials with U.S. horse racing. That's the first priority. We will look to educate people as we go along to betting exchanges, but we're not under any illusions that this is something that is going to occur in an immediate time frame. Certainly, the people from the U.S. who have visited our offices in the UK have become our most effusive advocates. I think there will be more people who have positions of influence in U.S. racing who will be exposed to the intricacies of betting exchanges and the novelty of them and will grow to understand that this is a prospect for the future, and one that can add to the eclectic mix of horse racing and not cannibalize horse racing's revenue, but actually provide it with a new and valuable source of revenue.

There are myriad questions that need to be answered concerning any entry into the U.S. market. What I can tell you about Betfair is that we are extremely conservative. We have done analyses in 100-odd countries throughout the world on the various legalities--can you market it, can you bet on it, can you have people on the ground, can you sponsor? We invest a lot of money in acquiring that legal information. The U.S. is a unique country in that you have 39 states that allow horse racing and, in effect, you have 39 countries combined within one system. That obviously creates a number of logistical barriers that make things more difficult. But at the same time it is a vast population with great wealth. I appreciate that times are a little bit tough at the moment, but this is the engine room of world commerce and we need to be involved in a market of this magnitude.

**Q: To enter the U.S. market, will Betfair need federal laws to be changed? Will it need to work to have state laws changed?**


A: It's going to be very difficult for a British-based company, albeit with tentacles throughout the world, to influence Congress, if indeed that is what is required. I believe efforts will be needed more on a state-by-state basis. There first has to be a lot of legal due diligence undertaken. To achieve anything, you need a consensus among the sport, and that's one of our objectives.

**Q: There was \$102,274 wagered on Betfair on the 8th race on Mar. 8 at Turf Paradise, a relatively small American racetrack. That's a lot of money, yet neither Turf Paradise nor Turf Paradise horsemen received any cut from that betting. Is that fair and does Betfair have plans in the works to compensate American tracks and horsemen for allowing wagering on the product they put on?**

A: We appreciate that if someone puts the racing product on they're going to be remunerated. We're very close to formalizing deals in two major states, and there should be an announcement on that regard very shortly. Because of the complex nature of the U.S. racing industry and the vast distances involved, it's a matter of going from state 1 through 39. We just haven't gotten around to everyone. The \$102,000 figure is misguided. It's not your conventional handle. There are a lot of people arbitraging their position and taking a very small proposition. To give you an idea, there's a case of one punter in the last Rugby World Cup who, if you took the traditional view of handle, turned over in excess of 500,000 sterling. At any given time, his maximum loss was 400 sterling. If you look at handle, it was 500,000, but he was looking to make a very small cut. He just kept on trading his positions and getting into a situation where he could guarantee a profit. **Cont. p13**



I imagine a lot of the \$102,000 liquidity on the Turf Paradise race was very much similar. There could have been half dozen players playing the same sort of game, trying to make a very small margin. That's why we don't refer to handle. It's about the exposure.

**Q: Presumably, none of that money came from U.S. customers, so no one can argue that you were taking business away from Turf Paradise. However, should you begin accepting U.S. customers, you will, no doubt, be pulling dollars out of the traditional betting pools. What assurances can you give Turf Paradise or anyone else that you won't cannibalize their handle?**

A: All we can do is show them the evidence of our impact in the UK, Ireland and Australia. Take the example of the race at Turf Paradise. We are interested in commingling into their pari-mutuel pools. We have 2.2 million worldwide customers, and that's not one single American that we know of. Through Betfair, they will be able to access the Turf Paradise pari-mutuel pools in the future and bet exotics. So it will be a complementary product offering. There are 600,000-odd racing active people in the world that American racing hasn't had to focus on previously because its internal economics made it a reasonably safe and prosperous industry. We think we can bring in untapped interest. American racing is great quality. It has great brand names. There are some great brands that come out of here, like the Kentucky Derby, the Breeders' Cup, the Preakness, the Belmont, the Travers. There are plenty of great brands, and we think we can introduce them to an even broader audience than the one they are accustomed to. At the moment, people like me, who are devotees of the sport, only know those races. We will offer two different products, and Turf Paradise will get access to a very broad group of people they've never had access to. In reality, there is a lot of upside.

In terms of cannibalization, Betfair's ascension coincided with a change in tax laws in 2001 in the UK. (A tax of 9.7 percent on winning wagers made off course was eliminated). Handle at that stage was about 5.4 billion sterling. Last year, it approximated 11 million sterling. That's without talking into account what was wagered through the betting exchanges. Our liquidity is separate to what the bookmakers turned over. That's not cannibalization. It's an expansion. It's offering customers choice and a more invigorating betting market for people to bet into.

In our minds, people going shopping on Saturdays are our competitors because they're spending money at other retailers and not with us. Racing has to look beyond thinking about only its little congested world we're all accustomed to and say, "who are our competitors, how are we going to beat them, how are we going to get a bigger share of the pie?"

It should not look at the racing cake as it is currently constructed and say, "well, what is going to happen here is that, as the betting exchanges grow, they are going to squeeze our margins elsewhere." That's not what we are about. What we are about is enlivening the market and producing new money. We struck a deal with the UK Tote and, at any given moment, we represent at least 10 percent of the UK Tote business. That's because we've introduced a group of people who are fixed on the betting exchanges and are willing to try the exotics on the pari-mutuel side. Just as there might be cannibalization of the pari-mutuel by the betting exchanges, you could argue that money is flowing into the pari-mutuel pools that ordinarily would have been invested with the betting exchanges.
