Kip's Happening in Dubai...

G1 Dubai Duty Free challenger **Kip Deville** (Kipling) looked calm and collected yesterday morning at Nad Al Sheba, taking it all in while standing still as a statue before getting down to the business at hand. Under Rick Dutrow Jr.'s assistant and exercise rider Michelle Nevin, Kip Deville rolled through an easy 800 meters on Nad Al Sheba's dirt course, with internal fractions of :23.9 for the 400 meters and :36.8 for 600 meters. little bit," Nevin said. "He was nice and comfortable out there." Explaining the reason for working the 2007 GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero on the main track, Nevin said that the white 'dogs' on the turf course would have been distracting. Commenting on another of the six-year-old's idiosyncracies, standing and peering around before his workout, Nevin said with a smile, "He stands for a long time every morning. PRICEY PACESETTER FOR DUNKIRK?

It can be presumed if a horse has the benefit of a \$2.6-million pacesetter, that his connections regard him as something special. Such is the case with **"TDN Rising Star"** **Dunkirk** (Unbridled's Song), who will go off the likely favorite in Saturday's GI Florida Derby. Trainer Todd Pletcher, worried about a possible slow

pace in the nine-furlong race, is mulling over entering Dunkirk's stablemate **Europe** (Unbridled's Song) to ensure snappy fractions up front. Pletcher said he would wait until entries are taken today to make a decision. Europe, a full-brother to Half Ours, was fourth in his only career start. He was purchased for \$2.6 million at 2007 Keeneland September, the same sale that Dunkirk topped at \$3.7 million. Demi O'Byrne purchased both horses, and both race for the Coolmore connections of Derrick Smith, Mrs. John Magnier and Michael Tabor.

"[Europe] has only started once and is still a maiden, but we're mindful of the possible lack of pace in the race, so we're considering entering Europe as a pacesetter to make sure it's at least an honestly run race with legitimate fractions," said Pletcher during a national teleconference yesterday. "We'll survey the field as it's shaping up tomorrow and make a decision at that time." *Cont. p2*

Pacesetter for Dunkirk? (cont. from p1)

Todd Pletcher's primary concern is GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. winner **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality), a horse with ample speed who could be on or near soft opening fractions, making things harder for the confirmed closer Dunkirk.

It wouldn't be the first time Pletcher and Coolmore have employed a pacemaker in the Florida Derby. Back in 2002, they entered Smooth Jazz, whom Michael Tabor had acquired privately, as a rabbit for stablemate Nokoma, who was runner-up in the previous year's GII Remsen S. The plan backfired that day, as both horses were well beaten.

Suffice it to say, Dunkirk is not Nokoma, and Pletcher is quietly confident that, in the big gray colt, he has his best chance at Kentucky Derby glory yet.

"Obviously, coming out of the Florida Derby, we'll know a lot more about where we stand, but at this stage of the game, we feel like he's the strongest candidate we've had to date," he said. "He has a tremendous amount of ability, and has the pedigree and the style for a mile and a quarter."

For Quiet 'Road,' a Question of Distance...

Three years ago, Jimmy Jerkens entered the Fountain of Youth S. with a high-strung son of Pulpit named

Corinthian who already had a reputation for being a bit difficult around the barn. Unfortunately for Jerkens, Corinthian's morning antics came out in the afternoon, too, and after crossing the line first in the race, Corinthian was demoted to third for running erratically in the lane.

Perhaps that has made things that much enjoyable for Jerkens with **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality), who has taken nary a step wrong for the son of Hall of Famer Allen Jerkens. Described as a laid-back, uncomplicated horse by the younger Jerkens, the Edward P. Evans homebred won on debut going 6 1/2 furlongs in New York last fall, then ran a good second in a seven-furlong Gulfstream allowance in January. Quality Road was looking to avenge Corinthian's demotion in the Fountain of Youth and did just that, registering a breakout victory in the Feb. 28 race, coming from just off hot fractions to win going away by over four lengths. He earned a 110 Bris figure for the effort.

"Corinthian would do anything he could to make it hard on you," said Jerkens. "This guy has been nice from the start. He's been a push-button horse. If you want him to work slow, he'll work slow. If you want him to work fast, he'll go fast. That certainly makes it a lot easier on a trainer. With Corinthian, every day was a battle."

While Quality Road answered the talent and class tests in the Fountain of Youth, one question still remains: how far does he want to go, and can he successfully stretch out from the Fountain of Youth's one-turn mile?

"You never know," Jerkens answered yesterday during a national teleconference. "You wouldn't think it would be that big of a difference, only an eighth of a mile farther, but it is two turns and, for some reason, some horses just don't seem to handle it the same way."

Still, Jerkens believes the same sensible thinking that makes the colt a pleasure to deal with in the mornings will help him handle the added ground.

“It’s important that they enter the first turn with some composure, and not where they’re too rank and throwing their heads around and getting all discombobulated,” Jerkens said. “But we’ve tried to train him around two turns a lot and worked him evenly, and he seems to have a real good mind right now. I’d be surprised if he didn’t handle it. In the Fountain of Youth, we wanted him laying up close. If you looked at the races that day, everyone who was winning was laying up close. But I think if we wanted him to come from the middle of the pack, he could have done so.”

A new wrinkle was added yesterday when trainer Todd Pletcher announced that he was considering running **Europe** (Unbridled’s Song) as a rabbit for **Dunkirk** (Unbridled’s Song), though Jerkens didn’t seem overly concerned.

“Obviously, I’d rather he wasn’t in there, but I don’t think my horse is the type that sees another horse in front of him and has to go,” he said. “He’s fast, but I think he’s very rateable.” -LM

Big Drama in Swale

Big Drama (Montbrook), winner of last year’s GIII Delta Jackpot S., will make his sophomore bow in Saturday’s GIII Swale S. at Gulfstream Park. The colt, a winner of five of six starts, worked four furlongs at Calder Monday in :49.20. “He worked phenomenal, did everything perfect,” trainer David Fawkes told *Daily Racing Form*. “He’s ready to go on Saturday.” The field for the Swale is also expected to include **This Ones For Phil** (Untuttable). Coming off a fourth-place finish in the GII Fountain of Youth, the Rick Dutrow Jr. trainee worked five furlongs Monday in 1:01. “He’s always had a messed-up schedule,” Dutrow told the *Form*. “He got a quarter crack after the Fountain of Youth, then after going back to training got hurt doing something in his stall. I walked him for five days and jogged him another week after that, but he’s a light horse, and coming off a mile race he should be fit enough to go seven furlongs on Saturday.”

‘Points’ Pointed Toward Blue Grass...

Starlight Partners’ **Take the Points** (Even the Score), runner-up to The Pamplemousse (Kafwain) in the GIII Sham S. at Santa Anita Feb. 28, is likely to go next in the Apr. 11 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. “Right now, he’s training at Santa Anita and doing well, and we’ll continue on a course that will have him ready, most likely, for the Blue Grass,” reported trainer Todd Pletcher. “But, if there’s a defection or two in the [Apr. 4] GI Santa Anita Derby, we’ll be in a position to step in and try that.” A maiden winner in his route debut at Belmont last September, Take the Points returned from a four-month absence to win a Gulfstream allowance Jan. 31. He was beaten six lengths by The Pamplemousse in the nine-furlong Sham.

Zensational Returns Thursday

Zayat Stables’s **Zensational** (Unbridled’s Song), an impressive maiden winner, returns to the track in Thursday’s second race in Arcadia. The Bob Baffert trainee stretches out to a mile in the optional-claiming event after zipping six furlongs in 1:08.3 in his Feb. 21 graduation. Also in the five-horse field is **Ventana** (Toccet), third in last year’s GIII Hollywood Prevue S. The colt was fourth in the Feb. 16 GII San Vicente S. and is coming off a third-place finish in a Mar. 11 6 1/2-furlong optional claimer.

Dogwood Throws Lime Rickey into Wood Mix

Dogwood Stable will enter **Lime Rickey** (Lemon Drop Kid) in the Apr. 4 GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct. The colt has made all nine of his previous starts on the lawn. With his lone victory coming in an Aqueduct special weight last November, Lime Rickey is coming off a runner-up effort in the Mar. 14 GIII Palm Beach S. at Gulfstream. “We don’t know how he will take to dirt in a race, but now is the time to find out, and the mile and an eighth Wood Memorial is a spot that will test him pretty keenly,” explained Dogwood’s Cot Campbell. “Lime Rickey is a sold grass specialist, but he has a dirt pedigree and is a game colt--and if he moves up big time, he might get to Churchill Downs.”

An Emotional Trip for Zito Assistant...

It's been so long that Tim Poole can't exactly remember when he began working for trainer Nick Zito.

"I've lost count; maybe 22 or 23 years," Poole said after Zito's G1 Dubai World Cup hopeful **Anak Nakal** (Victory Gallop) galloped Tuesday morning. "I knew Nick when he was working for Johnny Campo and I was riding horses for my dad, who trained."

Poole, 57, is Zito's main assistant, and travels the New York, Kentucky and Florida racing circuits. While working for Zito, a Hall of Fame trainer and the conditioner of two Kentucky Derby winners, Poole has trekked around the U.S. extensively, but never abroad until this trip.

For Poole, the Dubai journey was something he looked forward to after a very emotional winter. He recently lost his wife of 34 years following a long illness.

Zito, who Poole said is like a family member to him, told his assistant to take as much time away from the job as he needed. But Poole thought work was the best medicine for him.

"Nick told me that I could take a year, two years off," Poole said. "He did tell me he was planning on bringing [Anak Nakal] to Dubai and said, 'You're my first choice to go with the horse, if you feel up to it.' I thought the trip sounded like a good way to move back in the saddle." Poole, a grandfather of two, said the experience thus far has been delightful.

"They do everything first-class here," he said. "His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's passion for horses and racing is evident. Everyone here is making it really easy to not want to go home. Let's put it this way, if I was 20 or 30 years younger, I might not make the plane going home." -*Courtesy Dubai Racing Club*

A medium-sized horse who is a bit bigger than his famous ancestor **Northern Dancer** (to whom he is inbred), **HENRYTHENAVIGATOR**

has all the tools to become an important stallion. He has the performance, the pedigree, and the mind of a champion. He seems to have been blessed with some of the calmer traits of his family - which has some peppery characters like **Nureyev** - and that should be an added benefit for his potential as a sire.

... **HENRYTHENAVIGATOR** has a very good width of chest and a surprisingly deep 75 inch girth. He has nearly perfect leverage behind to give him a good cruising speed and then make a burst for home, which allowed him to win four times at G1 level and bring home three more seconds.

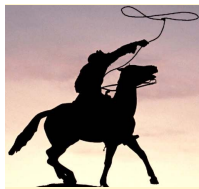

WALDROP RESPONDS TO TIMES ARTICLE

National Thoroughbred Racing Association President and CEO Alex Waldrop took exception to an article in yesterday's *New York Times* and responded with a mass e-mail to members of the industry. The *Times* article, written by Joe Drape, was critical of racing's record on safety and medication issues. In his response, Waldrop outlined action the industry has taken over the past 10 months to increase racing's safety and integrity. Waldrop listed five improvements: 1) Anabolic steroids have been effectively banned in racing states representing 99.96 percent of Thoroughbred pari-mutuel handle; 2) Nearly 80 racetracks are participating in a new national injury reporting system that will provide comprehensive data leading to a safer racing environment; 3) National standards have been adopted with regard to horse shoe and hoof care that will lead to fewer equine injuries and greater health and safety for both horse and rider; 4) More than 55 racetracks--representing more than 90 percent of the Thoroughbred pari-mutuel handle in the U.S.--as well as owners, breeders, trainers, jockeys, virtually every major horsemen's organization, veterinarians and regulators, and even fans, have pledged their support of the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance; and 5) Through an accreditation system similar to that utilized in industries like healthcare and education, members are instituting uniform policies relating to injury reporting; medication; testing and penalties; safety research; a safer racing environment; and aftercare of retired racehorses. JUDGMENT DAYS

However much a rush the commercial market used to be in to judge stallions the minute they had runners, the statistical facts are that it is premature to say anything too dogmatic about a sire until the END of the year his first four-year-olds are racing. In the case of this year's third-crop sires, that's the end of 2009. But one of the telling components of that third season is the sires have their second crops of three-year-olds either on, or not on, the Classic trail. If they haven't had a serious Classic contender or a good graded winner, at least, in one of their first two crops, well, the signs are not pointing in the right direction, are they?

In the case of this year's contingent of third-crop sires, it also says something that the three leaders by cumulative (Northern Hemisphere-sired) progeny earnings to date are all standing for \$30,000 in 2009. These are, in order of their cumulative progeny earnings, Airdrie's duo of **Proud Citizen** (\$5,822,548, according to figures provided to us by The Jockey Club's Information Systems) and **Harlan's Holiday** (\$5,789,525, only \$33,000 behind his barnmate), and Three Chimneys' **Sky Mesa** (\$5,356,085). Sky Mesa, who is the number one third-crop sire in 2009 (\$906,299, according to *Bloodhorse.com*), spotted the other two \$900,000-plus head starts in their freshman year, 2007, when he ranked 20th on the Freshman Sire List, with Harlan's Holiday second (to Posse), and Proud Citizen third. Sky Mesa rocketed back to lead the second-crop sire list, and leads again thus far in 2009.

But, even in these recessionary times, \$30,000 is not a big stud fee. The market's judgment on these horses is that, so far, they are very useful sires (September Book 1 sires, definitely), but have not yet forced their way into the very top tier.

There is one sire on this list for whom 2009 will tell all: **Empire Maker**, sixth in cumulative earnings, but second to Sky Mesa in 2009, less than \$30,000 behind. When this sire crop went to stud in 2004, its three top prospects were Empire Maker, Mineshaft, and Vindication. **Mineshaft** won four Grade 1s and over \$2.2 million and was named Horse of the Year in 2003, in spite of being injured and retired before the Breeders' Cup. **Vindication** was the unbeaten champion two-year-old of 2002. I was touting him as a possible second string to Seattle Slew's enduring bow as a sire of sires, potentially his second-best sire son, after A.P. Indy.

Fortunately, how quickly we forget. Though he ranks fifth among this group in lifetime progeny earnings (\$4,565,828), Vindication has been a bitter disappointment (I can say that because he's dead), as his APEX Runner Index of 0.55 through the end of 2008 illustrates (1.00 is average, and a viable commercial sire should at least be in hailing distance of the 1.50 mark).

Mineshaft was himself stones better as a four-year-old than he had been at three, and he does keep trying to edge his way up the ladder--he's eighth on the third-crop list so far this year, and his four-year-olds do include Grade II winners Casino Drive and Cool Coal Man. He really does deserve the rest of the year before we should be prepared to jump one way or the other, but it's also fair to say the market right now rates him a mid-range sire, judged by his 2009 stud fee of \$30,000.

Empire Maker is the sire from this crop who still could be a 'breakthrough' top-tier sire. He sired three graded stakes-winning fillies in his first crop, all of whom have graded stakes form at four this year. His second crop includes two Classic-aspirant colts. The first is Pioneer of the Nile, who won the GI CashCall Futurity, the GII Robert B. Lewis S. and the GII San Felipe S. in his last three starts, and is headed for a showdown with The Pamplemousse, by another third-crop sire, Kafwain, in the Apr. 4 GI Santa Anita Derby. The other is Imperial Council, a distant second to I Want Revenge in the GIII Gotham S., but set to re-oppose in the nine-furlong GI Wood Memorial S., also on Apr. 4. One Classic placing between the two in the next 45 days or so would make a big difference to Empire Maker's top-tier aspirations.

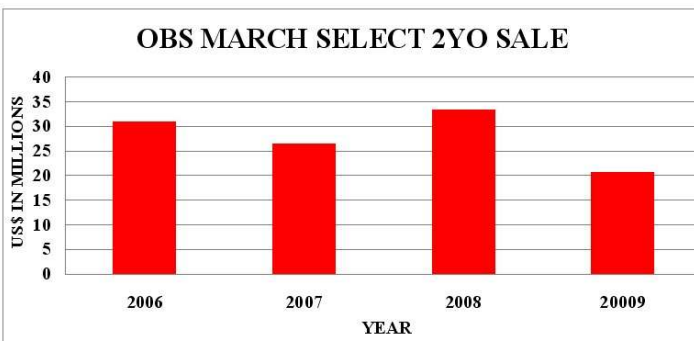
One thing is for certain: Empire Maker went to stud with all the credentials. Trained by Bobby Frankel for Juddmonte, he went off the 5-2 favorite for the 2003 GI Kentucky Derby off a near 10-length win in the GI Florida Derby (Beyer 108), followed by a gritty win over Funny Cide in the mud in the GI Wood Memorial (Beyer 111). He couldn't get past Funny Cide (a gelding from Distorted Humor's first crop) in Kentucky, but came back to win the GI Belmont S. (Beyer 111--actually a very high figure for the Belmont--with Funny Cide third). In his only subsequent start, he was upset at 3-10 by Strong Hope in the GII Jim Dandy S. But he retired with a 4-3-1 record in eight starts, never off the board and an earner of nearly \$2 million. By Unbridled, he was one of four Grade I winners out of the great Toussaud, a Grade I winner herself by El Gran Senor out of Grade II winner Image of Reality, by In Reality. One of his Grade I-winning half-brothers was Chester House, who unexpectedly (and after he'd died) turned out to be a really good sire. The table is set, so to speak; everything is in place. Now he just needs Pioneer of the Nile to win the GI Santa Anita Derby and Imperial Council to upset I Want Revenge in the GI Wood. That would set the tongues wagging.

Though this sire crop may be short on superstar sires, there are plenty who do look pretty useful. I've already mentioned the group's top three by cumulative progeny earnings--Proud Citizen (1.43 APEX A Runner Index), Harlan's Holiday (2.20), and Sky Mesa (2.01). Fourth-ranked **Macho Uno** (2.91) had his fourth first-crop graded stakes winner when Macho Again won the GII New Orleans H. Vindication is fifth, Empire Maker sixth. Seventh-ranked **Van Nistelrooy** (1.42) surprised Coolmore as much as Chester House surprised Juddmonte, but he looks a very credible sire all the same. **Posse** (1.88) is down to ninth, having led the 2007 Freshman Sire List, but I would bet on him making a comeback. They were very fast and precocious, and he's sure to bounce back when the produce of better mares, starting last year, hit the racetrack. The second 10 includes **Repent** (2.54); **Yankee Gentleman** (2.23); **Mineshaft** (1.83); **Whywhywhy** (2.38); **Kafwain** (1.17); and mainly 'regional' sires **D'wildcat** (3.52) and New York's **Hook and Ladder** (3.18). There may or may not be a superstar among them, but there are near enough to 15 sires among this group which are siring racehorses--a virtue which may be regaining popularity now that speculation isn't such a sure path to financial success. *Bill Oppenheim may be contacted at bopp@erb.com. 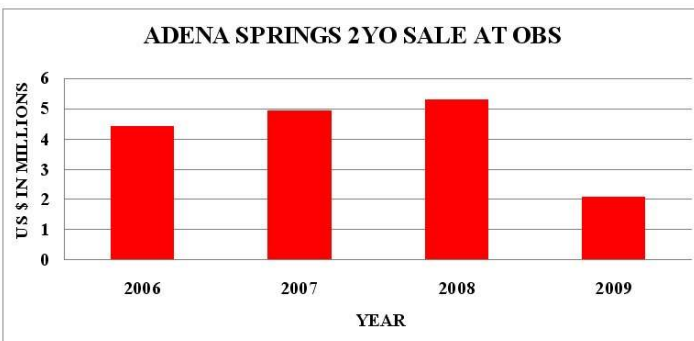

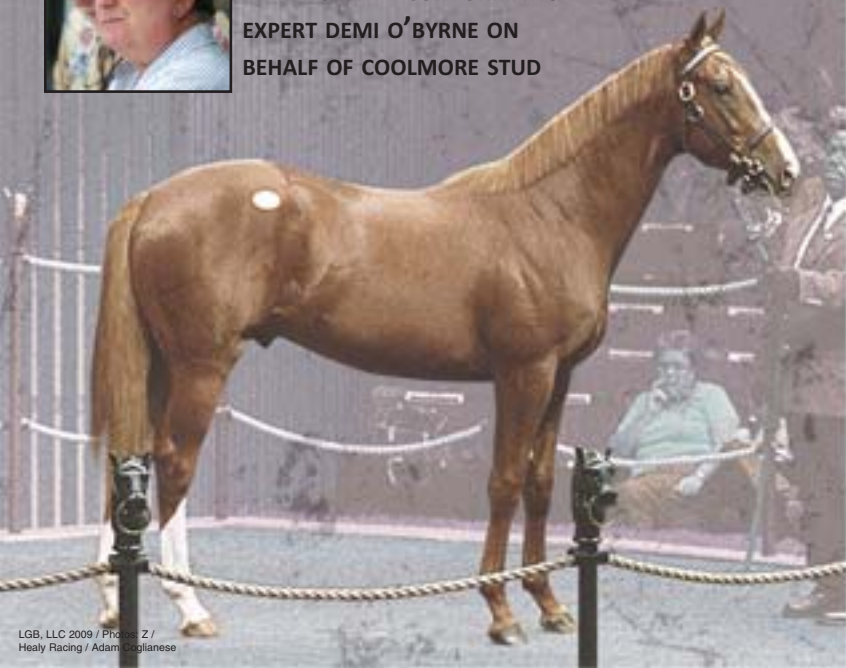

MCHUGH CHALLENGING AI BAN Former Sydney Turf Club Chairman Bruce McHugh plans to mount a legal challenge against the effective ban on artificial insemination of Thoroughbred horses in Australia, according to published reports. Thoroughbred Breeders Australia Chairman Trevor Lobb responded by saying simply that the issue was "not on the agenda," and there was international consensus. McHugh aims to force the Australian Stud Book (ASB) to accept horses bred by artificial insemination, saying not to do so was a restraint of trade. "I've been in racing all my life; I've looked at this from every possible angle, and the only thing I can see against it is the fact that the major studs see an advantage in not introducing it. I wouldn't be doing it unless I was confident I could get the result I require, and I will go down that path until someone can explain to me in simple terms why it's not good for the industry," McHugh told *Sydney Morning Herald*. Racing NSW chief executive Peter V'Landys said in the report: "It would require an Australia-wide decision and extensive consultation with all facets of the racing industry. But our board will certainly consider the matter, because of the respect for Bruce McHugh. We are very aware that our breeders are very much against it. There's a lot of support for it, but a lot against, so we have to balance it to see what's the best for the industry as a whole."

Ominous Sign...

Keeper of the ASB Michael Ford warned that, said if a legal challenge to the ban on artificial insemination occurred, the Stud Book may have to levy breeders to raise funds for defence. "It would be dangerous for Australia to go alone and definitely foolish, because any horse bred that way wouldn't be accepted, their progeny wouldn't be accepted and you wouldn't be able to export them," Ford stated. "Some countries might even take affront and say we're not even going to let you export horses to Australia. Internationally, it would be disastrous." Arrowfield chief John Messara restated his position, saying that the dominant stallions would "corner the market" to the detriment of the breed.

Waikato's other stallions are **Pins (Aus)** (Snippets {Aus}), whose fee was reduced to \$40,000 from \$50,000; **Savabeel (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}), reduced to \$20,000 from \$30,000; **Fast 'n' Famous (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), down to NZ\$10,000 from \$15,000; and **Scaredee Cat (Aus)** (Tale of the Cat), who will be available for \$6,500 after being announced at \$8,000. **No Excuse Needed (GB)** (Machiavellian) will remain at NZ\$12,000. "No Excuse Needed represents great value at that fee for what he has achieved in a relatively brief career," Chittick added.

ESKIMO QUEEN RETIRED, TO SELL Multiple Group 1 winner **Eskimo Queen (NZ)** (Shinko King {Ire}--Cold Type {NZ}, by Icelandic {Ire}) has been retired after an unplaced effort in defense of her G1 Coolmore Classic title this past weekend. The five-year-old is slated to sell the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale in June. She also notched a win in the 2007 G1 Queensland Oaks, and ran a troubled fourth in the G1 Underwood S. the same season. "We won a couple of Group 1s with her, but she was one of those unlucky mares who could have won more," trainer Michael Moroney. "She probably should have won the Underwood S., and who knows what she could have done in the [G1] Queensland Derby [when she lost the rider]." In all, the bay won four of 21 career starts, and amassed A\$861,250 in Australia.
