## NONET FOR FLORIDA DERBY

Edward Evans' homebred **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality) drew post two in Saturday's G1 Florida Derby at Gulfstream. He will face eight rivals in the \$750,000 contest, which will mark his first race at two turns. The dark bay is coming off a stylish score in the one-mile GII Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 28 ([video](#)).

Among his rivals are a pair of Unbridled's Song colts trained by Todd Pletcher, unbeaten **Dunkirk** and the maiden **Europe**. "[Quality Road is] going to be tough enough to beat under the best of situations, which is why we put Europe in there to assure there is some pace in the race," Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. "We'll look the field over and make the final call on race day." While Europe's lone previous outing--a five-furlong affair at Gulfstream Feb. 21--resulted in a fourth-place finish ([video](#)), Pletcher thinks the colt has some talent. "Even though Europe didn't run well the first time out, he's worked :58 and four in company with [The] Roundhouse, and [The] Roundhouse couldn't get by him," the Eclipse Award-winning conditioner added. "So if he does run, I think he'll go over and give a good performance." **Beethoven** (Sky Mesa) was not entered for the nine-furlong race after sustaining a mild injury (*see p8*).

As for how he will fare in his Group 1 bow, Grimthorpe commented, "This is his biggest task to date, but his preparation has gone to plan, and he seems to run well fresh. He won first time out at two, and last year, so hopefully he'll run his race." The five-year-old will be making his first start since taking the Floodlit S. on the Kempton all-weather Nov. 5. Spanish Moon will exit stall four Saturday night. "Four is grand, but it is never that important in a mile-and-a-half race," Grimthorpe commented. "I'd like to think we'll finish in the first four, but if

Hannon. As for the step up in trip, Hannon said, "I think he'll be all right at the distance. [Jockey Ryan Moore] has won on him and knows this track and thinks he'll be OK on it. I think he stays a mile--whether he gets those final extra yards I don't know for sure, but we'll find out on Saturday. There's a \$5-million purse, so you've got to have a go." The bay crossed the line 1 1/2 lengths behind Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) when third in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp last September, but was DQ'd from purse money after testing positive following the race.

## WRITERS UP

Three horses bred in Argentina by Haras La Quebrada will make their next starts on Dubai World Cup day at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 28. Godolphin's **My Indy (Arg)** (Indygo Shiner--My Light {Arg}, by Southern Halo), winner of the G3 Maktoum Challenge, Rounds 1 and 2, this year; and Prince Faisal bin Khaled bin Abdul Aziz's **Muller (Arg)** (El Compinche {Arg}--Martina Girl {Arg}, by Mat-Boy {Arg}), winner of the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques Cup (King's Cup) at Janadriyah in Saudi



Arabia, will face off in the \$6-million G1 Dubai World Cup. Prince Sultan Mohammed bin Al Kabeer's filly **So Shiny (Arg)** (Indygo Shiner--Sorpresa {Arg}, by Southern Halo), winner of the UAE 1000 Guineas at Nad Al Sheba last month, will take on the boys in the G2 UAE Derby, a \$2-million event. By any standard, this is a remarkable

international achievement for La Quebrada, which has been the leading stud farm and breeder in Argentina for the last 30 years, but now is in a transitional phase after the death of its owner, Hernan Ceriani Cernadas, two years ago.

"Now my sister [Maria Ines] and I own the farm," Hernan's son, also named Hernan Ceriani Cernadas after his father and grandfather, said recently. "I am in charge of all the management and direction, and Maria Ines helps me at the office. I am still working with the same people--the same team--that my father had. This team is headed by veterinarian Dr. Horacio Houssay and his staff, and it is also important to recognize the efforts of Rafael Garabento, who has been in charge of the establishment for the last 45 years."



The transition from father to son and daughter has been made easier by the success of La Quebrada's A.P. Indy stallion Indygo Shiner, who had three first-crop Classic winners in Argentina in 2008. Indygo Shiner is at Hill 'n' Dale in Kentucky for the current Northern Hemisphere breeding season. The stallion was a parting gift from their father, who years earlier had established some of the best stallions in Argentina by purchasing and standing U.S.-bred horses against the then-prevailing fashion for European-breds.

Nowadays, La Quebrada is the trendsetter, and the leaders on the Argentine general sire list today are mostly U.S.-bred stallions.

The dominant stallion in Argentina over the last 15 years has been La Quebrada's U.S.-bred Southern Halo (Halo--Northern Sea, by Northern Dancer), the sire of at least 155 stakes winners. In fact, he's the common thread in the makeup of My Indy, Muller and So Shiny. His son El Compinche (Arg) is the sire of Muller, and his daughters produced My Indy and So Shiny. Still active at 26, Southern Halo led the leading sires list for eight consecutive years, from 1994 to 2001, and then again in 2003 and 2007. For the last five years, he's also been the leading broodmare sire in Argentina, and his daughters are proving to be particularly successful with Indygo Shiner, whose 10 stakes winners to date include seven out of Southern Halo mares. In the U.S., where he stood for a time, Southern Halo is best known as the sire of More Than Ready, who also has made a name for himself as a sire in Australia.

Southern Halo was purchased by the late Hernan Ceriani Cernadas, who took over the farm in 1973 upon the death of his father. He had established La Quebrada in the mid-1940s in Pilar, about a half-hour outside of Buenos Aires.

It was actually the eldest Hernan Ceriani Cernadas who first started the practice of injecting U.S.-bred speed horses into Argentine pedigrees by importing the U.S.-bred sprinter Make Tracks (Eight Thirty), in 1953, later followed by U.S.-bred Solazo (Beau Max). Solazo's La Quebrada-bred champion Gold Sun, by the way, was champion Cigar's second dam.

When the second Hernan Ceriani Cernadas took over La Quebrada in 1973, he, too, was aided by his sister, and together they continued importing U.S.-bred stallions to Argentina, most notably Logical (Buckpasser) and Salt Marsh (Tom Rolfe).

The biggest catch for La Quebrada and Argentina, however, was breed-shaper Southern Halo, and there's an interesting story about his fortuitous purchase.

"My father had seen him running at Santa Anita, and he had caught his eye when he won by a big margin," said Cernadas. "He saw him from the side, but didn't get a chance to see him in great detail. He was owned by Stavros Niarchos, the Greek magnate. My father asked him for a price in 1987, but he appeared inaccessible.

"However, my father kept following his career over time, until he was seriously injured. As soon as he found out, he flew to California. Upon his arrival, he had only one hour before the [Niarchos] office was closed." **Cont. p7**

“He was told there were other people interested, and he had to say right away if he would buy him or not. He decided to buy him sight unseen--he had not seen him since the Santa Anita race. He said when he finally saw the horse three months later he was totally disappointed because the horse looked nothing like at the Santa Anita race--he was just skin and bones with the plaster on his leg. He said he would not have bought the horse had he seen his condition first.”

Bred by Canadian E.P. Taylor, the breeder of such internationally significant stallions as Northern Dancer, Nijinsky, Storm Bird, Vice Regent and Northern Taste, Southern Halo is inbred 3x4 to Almahmoud--the second dam of Northern Dancer. The stallion is particularly noted for getting early-maturing, physically impressive runners with speed who can stay as far as 10 furlongs under the right conditions. And his daughters are now becoming outstanding producers who will help the younger stallions at La Quebrada get off on the right path, as has been the case with Indygo Shiner.

“La Quebrada has one of the best-quality broodmare bands in the world,” says Diego Mitagstein, editor of both *Turf Diario* and *Revista Palermo Blanca*. “And La Quebrada has a great stallion roster, with horses like Southern Halo, Indygo Shiner, Luhuk, Mutakddim and great prospects like Russian Blue, a very nice Danehill son, and the Storm Cats Grand Reward, The Leopard and Easing Along.

The farm is doing great, still, because the same people are running it. And young Hernan had the best teacher possible--his father. If he can translate all the things he has learned, La Quebrada will grow even more.”

And one significant area of growth for La Quebrada--and South America--has been the Middle East, where it's now commonplace to export the best runners from South America to the United Arab Emirates or Saudi Arabia. If the three La Quebrada-bred runners perform well at Nad Al Sheba, the transitional phase of La Quebrada will continue seamlessly.

**Beethoven Injured, Out of Florida Derby...**

John Oxley's **Beethoven** (Sky Mesa), who would have been the third or fourth betting choice in Saturday's GI Florida Derby, will not make the race, according to trainer John Ward Jr. "There was some heat in a tendon in a front leg [Wednesday] morning," said Ward. "It seems minor, not extreme, but we decided it's best to not make a minor situation worse. It's possible he could be back in the entries in the not-too-distant future." Beethoven, a \$300,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase, took the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. in his two-year-old finale Nov. 29. In two starts this season in South Florida, the bay colt was fourth in the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 31 and was most recently a distant third behind Quality Road in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 28.

**Trio Drills for Santa Anita Derby...**

The leading triumvirate for the Apr. 4 GI Santa Anita Derby turned in workouts yesterday morning. **Pioneerof the Nile** (Empire Maker), riding a three-race streak in graded events, earned a bullet for six furlongs in 1:11.40. "He went very nice," said trainer Bob Baffert. "He relaxed early and picked it up in the lane. It looks like it didn't take much out of him. So far, so good." Former jockey Joey Steiner was in the irons. "I kind of wanted to get something in front him, because he likes a little bit of a target, but he went perfect," Steiner said. "He was very comfortable. He's traveling good and showing some class, and that's all you can ask." Multiple graded winner **The Pamplemousse** (Kafwain) covered the same distance in 1:13 with regular rider Alex Solis aboard, and **Chocolate Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}) worked a mile in 1:38.60. "He went the half in about :50, five-eighths in 1:02.25, six furlongs in 1:14.25, seven in 1:26.53, and I got 1:38.91," reported trainer Jerry Hollendorfer. "So if the clockers gave him 1:38 3/5, that's very close."

"She's doing wonderful and on target at the moment for the Kentucky Oaks [May 1]," trainer John Terranova told *DRF*. "Originally, we were going to send her to Keeneland for the Ashland, but with Stardom Bound heading in that direction we decided to keep the two of them separate for now since both fillies are owned, in part, by IEAH Stables." Terranova added, "The timing of the Comely is great for her. It's also a one-turn mile and, with her speed, it looks like the perfect race to bring her back." CREDIT CARDHOLDERS' BILL OF RIGHTS INTRODUCED

Following a year of study and analysis, House Financial Institutions and Consumer Credit Subcommittee Chairwoman Carolyn B. Maloney (D-NY) recently introduced a bill aimed at putting credit card companies and consumers on more equal terms. The "Credit Cardholders' Bill of Rights Act of 2008" (H.R. 5244) was crafted to not only end common industry abuses of consumers but also allow credit card companies to operate in a free market.

The Credit Cardholders' Bill of Rights currently has 82 cosponsors and includes these highlights:

- Protects cardholders against arbitrary interest rate increases
- Prevents cardholders who pay on time from being unfairly penalized
- Shields cardholders from misleading terms
- Empowers cardholders to set limits on their credit
- Prohibits card companies from imposing excessive fees on cardholders

**Gordon Elected to Fifth Term As FHBPA President:**

Samuel Gordon was elected by a unanimous vote to his fifth term as president of the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Agency during a meeting Tuesday night. The FHBPA Board also elected owners Phil Combest, Mike Nyman and trainer Tim Ritvo as vice presidents; owner John Penn as secretary and trainer Barry Rose as treasurer. In addition, the Board also came to terms on a tentative purse agreement for the 2009 Calder meet that would include a purse minimum of \$10,000 and guarantee Florida-bred juveniles a winner's purse of approximately \$25,000.

**Brunetti Issues Plans for Hialeah:**

Following last week's report that Hialeah Park received a Quarter Horse racing permit, Chairman John Brunetti issued a press release yesterday detailing his plans to refurbish the dormant track. Hialeah has not conducted racing since 2001. Brunetti estimated that \$100 million would be required to bring the track up to date: \$35 million for reconstruction of the grandstand and clubhouse; \$15 million for a new stable area; and \$50 million for a "state-of-the-art" slot machine area. A Florida Senate panel yesterday passed a \$1-billion expanded gambling plan for the state. If Hialeah conducts two years of the approved Quarter Horse racing, the historic track would then be allowed to install video lottery terminals, according to the *Miami Herald*.

**Dogwood Runners Shine at Aiken Trials:**

A pair of two-year-olds owned by Cot Campbell's Dogwood Stables were victorious at the Aiken Trials held in South Carolina Mar. 14. The first of three juvenile trials was taken by the Dogwood-owned **Snap Happy** (Lion Heart), a \$100,000 FTKJUL yearling acquisition, over Nekia Farm's **Julie Nekia** (Wild Zone). **Tricky Vision** (Pollard's Vision) was third, beaten about a length. The green and gold silks were also carried aboard **Bricklayer** (El Corredor), who recorded the day's fastest time for the quarter-mile distance in winning the third heat over Lansdon Robbins III's **Offlee Cool** (Offlee Wild) and **Fuzzy Britches** (Pollard's Vision). Bricklayer worked an eighth of a mile in :10.1 for the OBS February sale and was hammered down for \$100,000. Dogwood's **Zapster** (Ghostzapper), a \$180,000 KEESEP purchase, was the third-place finisher in the middle trial, a length behind an unnamed Grand Slam colt owned by Eli Gindi and Robbins's **Wildlee Special** (Offlee Wild).

**Eastern Tent Caterpillars Numbers on the Rise?**

The University of Kentucky Equine Initiative is reporting that the number of eastern tent caterpillars could be on the rise after the hatching season has begun. The caterpillars were linked to the Mare Reproduction Loss Syndrome of 2001-2002, during which an estimated 30 percent of the Thoroughbred foal crop was lost. "Populations of the eastern tent caterpillar have increased noticeably over the past three years," said Lee Townsend, University of Kentucky College of Agriculture entomologist. "While infestations of the magnitude seen during the 2001-2002 Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome outbreak are not anticipated, it is clear that eastern tent caterpillar populations are on the upswing, and could be heavier than normal in some areas. Assessments and management decisions can be made in a few weeks as the silvery, baseball-sized tents start to show up on branches." Entomologists at UK are recommending that "unless horse farm managers have been aggressive in managing eastern tent caterpillars, or removing host trees, they should keep pregnant mares out of pastures bordered by cherry trees or other hosts for the next several weeks." **Roar of the Tiger Colt Tops Franks Sale:**

A colt from the second crop of Roar of the Tiger (Storm Cat) topped the John Franks Memorial Two-Year-Olds Training Sale Sunday at Evangeline Downs. Midwest Thoroughbreds signed the \$77,000 ticket for hip 121, a bay son of Salty Suzy (Salt Lake) from the Southwind Farm draft. "Coming off a pair of record-setting years and with the economic downturn, it was almost a given that we would not reach last year's numbers," said Charlotte Stemmans Clavier, president of Stemmans Incorporated, which administers the sale. "However, our numbers compare favorably with our 2007 sale and we experienced less of a decline than many of the other two-year-old sales conducted this year. We continue to offer an improved product and this year just turned out to be a buyer's market." In all, 199 juveniles sold for \$1,736,700, making the average \$8,727. In 2008, 172 sold for \$1,826,600 for an average of \$10,619.

**MURTAGH KEEN ON THE MASTER**

Johnny Murtagh yesterday gave an upbeat bulletin on Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's main G1 2000 Guineas contender **Mastercraftsman (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) following Sunday's racecourse gallop. Last year's G1 Phoenix S. and G1 National S. winner was one of three Ballydoyle sophomores put through their paces by Murtagh after racing at The Curragh. "They got a bit tired on the heavy ground, but we have a lot of nice three-year-olds, unexposed," Murtagh told *PA Sport*. "Hopefully, there will be a champion amongst them. They will now have to go to the trials--I suppose the horse everyone talks about is Mastercraftsman, a dual Group 1 winner. I rode him at the Curragh last week and he is in good form. He has five weeks to the 2000 Guineas now and that should be about right. **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) is another one this year who is very exciting and of course **Fame and Glory (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who won at Saint-Cloud last year. They are the three everyone knows about, but hopefully, we have some dark horses that have won their maiden or have run well as two-year-olds."

**ARB ANNOUNCES NEW RULES** Sweeping changes to whip use in Australia will take effect from Aug. 1 this year, with only padded whips to be used in races and official trials. The Australian Racing Board has also announced new rules on the circumstances in which a whip may be used, the way it is used, and an education campaign for riders. Stockwhips have been banned nationally. ARB Chairman Bob Bentley said the changes showed racing "fully attuned to contemporary community expectations." Bentley added, "There is no point fiddling around the edges and procrastinating where is industry and public expectations that practices of the past are no longer condoned. There are a lot of things that society condoned 50 years ago, but which are now seen as unacceptable, and this is one of them." He said other racing jurisdictions would closely monitor Australia's use of padded whips. Using an action that raises the arm above shoulder height is banned and a whip may not be used more than five times before the 200-meter mark, and after that point, not in consecutive strides.
