Rain fell at Nad Al Sheba Wednesday evening through Thursday morning, prompting mixed reactions from the connections of those set to compete on Saturday's

Dubai World Cup Card. "The more rain, the better," said Neil Drysdale, who trains G1 Dubai Sheema Classic hopeful **Marsh Side** (Gone West), winner of the G1 Canadian International S. last October, over firm ground. Drysdale believes the lack of give in Santa Anita's turf course hindered the

six-year-old when he finished seventh in the GII San Marcos S. Jan. 19 in his most recent start. Jamie Spencer, set to ride **Purple Moon (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the same race, was not quite so happy with the weather. "[I] could have done without last night's storm," the jockey lamented. "Hopefully the ground won't deteriorate, and though it is a tough race, he always runs well after a warm-up." The six-year-old gelding was fourth in the Mar. 5 G2 Dubai City of Gold S. over the 1 1/2-mile Sheema distance on Super Thursday in his last outing. Trainer Julio Canani took the middleground when assessing how the weather may affect his Dubai Duty Free contender **Hyperbaric** (Sky Classic), gate-to-wire winner of the G1 Citation H. last November. "What will be, will be," said Canani. The precipitation caught the horseman by surprise. "Someone called me from home in California during the night to tell me that it was raining in Dubai," Canani said. "I didn't believe it. They were right."

WHISTLIN' DIXIE IN BONNIE MISS

A solid field of six has signed up for today's GII Bonnie Miss S. at Gulfstream Park, however, the one to beat--at least on paper--is certainly West Point Thoroughbreds and Lakland Farm's **Justwhistledixie** (Dixie Union). Conditioned by Kieran McLaughlin, the sophomore filly hasn't tasted defeat since a third-place finish at Saratoga last August. An eye-catching seven-length graduate at Belmont in October, the dark bay reeled off a pair of stakes victories at Aqueduct, including the six-furlong Ruthless S. Jan. 4 before showing that she can stretch her speed for her latest in the one-mile GII Davona Dale S. at Gulfstream Mar. 1. While not armed with the experience of the likely favorite, **"TDN Rising Star"** **Gatorette** (Distorted Humor) will attempt to remain undefeated following a pair of romps at Gulfstream, including her most recent while trying 7 1/2 panels against allowance foes Mar. 8. The only filly with the advantage of a win over this track and trip is **Suz Slew** (Statement), who graduated last time out Feb. 18.

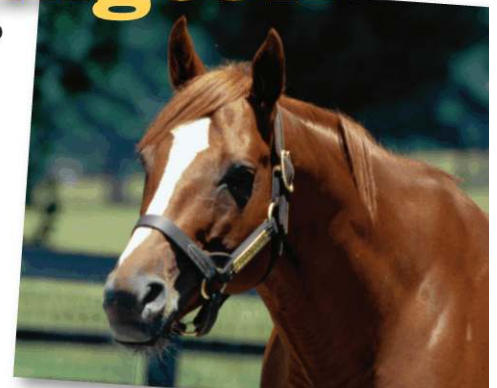

Rain Over Dubai

Japanese interlopers **Casino Drive** (Mineshaft) and **Vodka (Jpn)** (Tanino Gimlet {Jpn}) were going to work over the main track Thursday morning, but the weather forced a change of plans, according to racing manager

Nobutaka Tada. Instead, the duo jogged over the training track. Casino Drive, winner of the GII Peter Pan S. and a close second in the G1 February S. last out Feb. 22, will compete in the G1 Dubai World Cup while Vodka, Japan's reigning Horse of the

Year, will contest the G1 Dubai Duty Free. The weather, however, didn't stop fellow Duty Free hopeful **Niconero (Aus)** (Danzero {Aus}) from working six furlongs Thursday morning. "My horse is in good shape," jockey Craig Williams said of the five-time Group 1 winner. "I'm really happy with the progress he's made in his work from Tuesday to Thursday." **Black Seventeen** (Is It True), whose lethargy caused him to miss a work Tuesday, also galloped. "He's back to himself," declared Brian's Koriner's assistant trainer Colleen Hartford. "We galloped 1 1/2 miles. As usual, he was very interested in the pony that was standing right at the gap in front of us when he came onto the track."

Horse of a Different Color for Ajtebi

Riding in camel races only four years ago, Ahmed Ajtebi will break into the big time with six competitive rides on Saturday's Dubai World Cup card. Ajtebi is scheduled to ride **Happy Boy (Brz)** in the G1 Dubai World Cup; **Soy Libriano (Arg)** in the G2 UAE Derby; **Eastern Anthem (Ire)** in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic; **Gladiatorus** in the G1 Dubai Duty Free; and **Dijeerr** in the G2 Godolphin Mile--all from Mubarak Bin Shafya's yard. In the G1 Dubai Kahayla Classic for Arabians, he will also ride Amoking for trainer Ali Rashid Al Raihe. Competing at the camel tracks from age seven through 15, Ajtebi's ability on camels caught the eye of His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, who took him aside one day after watching him ride. "He pushed me," Ajtebi said. "He said that the UAE had horses in training everywhere in the world, but Dubai had no jockey. I told him that I had never ridden a horse in my life, but I would try."

According to Ajtebi, there was another big incentive to make a move away from the camel racing circuit. "We raced over all trips between five furlongs and six-and-a-half miles, but the maximum weight for camel riders is 25kg, so when I got too heavy, I decided to have look at thoroughbreds," he explained. "I started out riding mainly Arabian horses as second jockey for Ali Rashid Al Raihe. He gave me the chance and I am really grateful to him, but I was not getting that many rides." Then, last June, things started to turn around for the young rider when he rode Regal Parade to victory for Dandy Nicholls in the Buckingham Palace S. at Royal Ascot. "Things have really taken off this year, ever since I got back from a summer in the U.K., where I was lucky enough to ride a Royal Ascot winner. I got a new job this year for Mubarak bin Shafya and things have really taken off. I've had 16 winners this season and one more would make me so proud." And what would a win mean to the young jock? "It was my ambition to have just one ride on Dubai World Cup night before Nad Al Sheba closes, but now I have six (five thoroughbred rides and one Purebred Arabian), and a chance of actually winning," said Ajtebi. "I am so excited especially as I am only an apprentice--this has all happened so quickly. I've come such a long way, I can't believe it."

SUPER DERBY PURSE RAISED The purse for the GII Super Derby has been raised from \$500,000 to \$750,000 for the 2009 season. The nine-furlong dirt event for three-year-olds is scheduled for Sept. 19. "All of the history that Louisiana Downs has with the Super Derby--that's our name recognition race--we just felt like at \$500,000 it was losing some of that national significance," Louisiana Downs Director of Racing Trent McIntosh told *Daily Racing Form*. "Moving it to \$750,000, we thought that would be a huge boost as far as staying on the national scene." The 83-day Louisiana Downs meeting kicks off May 15 and concludes Oct. 4.

PAN AMERICAN RETAINS GRADE III STATUS

Last Saturday's GIII Pan American S., won by **Buddy's Humor** (Distorted Humor), has been reinstated as a Grade III event, according to a release from the American Graded Stakes Committee. Contested at Gulfstream Park, the 10-furlong event was initially downgraded to ungraded status after it was switched to the main track due to heavy rain fall prior to the race.

It's a long way from the San Francisco Bay Area to Dubai for Evan Trommer and Janet Lyons.

The partnership began to win minor stakes in California less than five years ago, and now Trommer and Lyons have a horse who has let them compete at the sport's highest level.

Black Seventeen (Is It True), a \$150,000 OBSFEB acquisition owned in partnership with Julie Berta and trainer Brian Koriner, gave Trommer and Lyons their first Grade I victory when he took the Vosburgh S. last September. The five-year-old now slated to compete on an international stage Saturday in the \$2-million G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen.

After dabbling in ownership in the early 1990s, Trommer renewed his efforts at the beginning of the decade, hiring Koriner--then based in Northern California--as his trainer.

Around the same time, Janet Lyons and her husband Richard--"weekend attendees" at Northern California racetracks--decided to become Thoroughbred owners and have Koriner oversee their stock.

Even though they had never met prior to their forays into ownership, Koriner suggested Trommer and the Lyons family form a partnership. "Brian put us together on a horse or two, and that's where we met up," said Trommer, who began to race under the name Wind River Stables.

At first, most of the Wind River/Lyons horses were claimers but Koriner, now working with deeper pockets, decided to shift his emphasis to juvenile auctions.

"That's when Brian was first getting into the sales, like the ones in Florida," Trommer said. "That's when we really started to roll. It was a natural progression, going from [being] a claiming trainer to getting clients who could afford to go to the sales."

The group's first stakes victory came courtesy of the \$130,000 OBSMAR juvenile Stormin' Lyon (Storm Boot), who held on by a head to take the 2004 Harry Henson S. at Hollywood Park.

Two months later, Court's in Session (Petersburg)--owned exclusively by Trommer's Wind River Stables--posted a mild upset in the GIII Bay Meadows Breeders' Cup Sprint H. in his second start since being claimed for \$32,000. Cousin's Lew (Slew Gin Fizz), a \$120,000 OBSMAR purchase, and claim box acquisition Railroad (Double Honor) would later add to Trommer's trophy collection.

Northern Soldier (Yankee Victor), a \$30,000 OBSAPR graduate, owned with Jim Atwell's Eracing.com and Julie Berta, gave Trommer his second graded victory when he took the Gil Laz Barrera S. in his third career start.

While Trommer's stable was growing, the Lyons family suffered a setback when Richard died in August 2006 at the age of 88. Showing their devotion to racing, the family held his memorial service reception in the William P. Kyne Room at Bay Meadows.

"[Racing] kept [my husband's] mind active," Jane Lyons said. "It's good for a person to use their brain instead of sitting back and being a couch potato."

Despite the loss of her husband, Lyons and her son Bill remained active in the sport. The Lyons family and Trommer bought into Black Seventeen after Koriner, who by then had shifted his tack to Southern California, signed the ticket.

The chestnut scored by 8 1/4-lengths at Del Mar in his debut, then was third in a Santa Anita allowance in his first start as a three-year-old. He tired to be eighth in the 2007 GI Santa Derby--his route and stakes debut--and has been kept in sprints since.

The cutback returned immediate dividends. Black Seventeen rebounded from his Santa Anita Derby effort with two dominant allowance victories at Hollywood Park, then scored by a length in Calder's Gil Carry Back S. An ankle injury then sent the colt to the sidelines for nearly a year.

In his return, Black Seventeen set the pace in the June 14 Oakland S. at Golden Gate, but was gunned down by Bonfante (Fruition) and settled for second. Looking for a race on conventional dirt, Black Seventeen was shipped to Saratoga for the GII Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. July 26, but the colt faded to fifth.

His connections were undeterred. Following a close second in the restricted Pirate's Bounty H. over Del Mar's Polytrack Sept. 3, Black Seventeen went East once again, this time to compete in the GI Vosburgh S. at Belmont Sept. 27. Dismissed at 23-1, the invader overcame a five-wide trip to deny the favorite Fabulous Strike (Smart Strike) by a head in the slop.

"There are a lot of owners who deserve a Grade I victory a lot more than I do, but horse racing is about being in the right place at the right time," Trommer said.

Following a seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Oct. 25, Black Seventeen has returned to finish third in both the GIII El Conejo H. on New Year's Day and the GIII Mr. Prospector S. at Gulfstream Jan. 17.

The prospect of going to the Golden Shaheen was "always in our mind," according to Trommer.

"Brian felt strongly that this horse would be a good candidate for [Dubai] after he took Barbecue Eddie (Stormy Atlantic) [fourth in the 2008 Golden Shaheen] back there," he explained.

Lyons, who found fortune on the breeding end of the game when homebred Onebadkitty (Street Cry {Ire}) dead-heated for the victory in the Valentine Dancer H. Feb. 21, remains realistic about Black Seventeen's chances.

"I'm sure there is going to be a lot of competition," she admitted. "As long as we give a good account of ourselves, we'll be very, very proud."

Trommer was quick to credit Lyons for this opportunity. "She's just the top of the crop," he said. "It's been a great partnership."


