'Council' Needs a Big Effort, Connections Say...

"Shug [McGaughey] doesn't circle the first Saturday in May on his calendar," is how his longtime assistant trainer Buzz Tenney described his boss's attitude toward the GI Kentucky Derby during yesterday's NTRA

national teleconference. Tenney was on the call to talk about Sequoia Racing's **Imperial Council** (Empire Maker), who, while he didn't threaten **I Want Revenge** (Stephen Got Even) in the GIII Gotham S., put in a strong run that earned him some respect as a Derby contender. Imperial Council will try to turn

the tables on **I Want Revenge** in Saturday's GI Wood Memorial S. at Aqueduct and Tenney made it clear that Imperial Council would have to put in a top effort to justify a run for the roses.

"I think certainly he'd have to win or be a very good second to earn a trip to Louisville," Tenney assessed. "I don't think the money is a factor in Shug's mind. He probably won't have enough money [to make it into the Derby field] if he finishes worse than second, so that'll take care of that problem, but even if he's second, he has to be a good-finishing second and come out of the race the right way. If we go to the Derby, it's because he's earned his way there and the horse is going the right way. Shug is going to let the horse tell us. We'll know Saturday what we've got."

Imperial Council will be reunited with jockey Edgar Prado for the Wood. Gotham sub Rajiv Maragh was criticized by some for allowing Imperial Council to fall well off the leaders in the 1 1/16-mile race. After trailing by as many as nine lengths while eighth of nine off modest splits, he passed a number of foes while still finishing 8 1/2 lengths adrift of **I Want Revenge**.

LANZMAN BUYS SHARE IN STARDOM BOUND

A day after he sold a 50-percent share in his Kentucky Derby hopeful **I Want Revenge** (Stephen Got Even) to IEAH Stables, it was announced that David Lanzman has purchased a 25-percent interest in IEAH's champion filly **Stardom Bound** (Tapit). "I am thrilled to be a part of this great filly's 2009 campaign," Lanzman said. "She's an amazingly talented filly and we are expecting a big effort from her in next weekend's [Apr. 4 GI] Ashland S. We're looking forward to the thrill of running a starter in both of the industry's two biggest races for three-year-olds at this year's Oaks and Derby." **Stardom Bound**, last year's champion juvenile filly, is now owned by IEAH, Lanzman, Paul Pompa Jr., Michael Dubb and Golden Goose Enterprises LLC. She has won five consecutive Grade I races, including last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and the Mar. 7 GI Santa Anita Oaks. "We are thrilled to further our relationship with David soon after closing on the **I Want Revenge** transaction," said IEAH President Michael Iavarone. "We look forward to continuing to further this relationship in the future. We're excited about the opportunity to have leading contenders in both the Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Oaks."

“Rajiv had never been on the horse before, and I think he was maybe a little over-confident in his ride in the Gotham,” said Tenney. “Edgar had been on the horse in his other three races and the horse was always up in the race with Edgar, and I would think he’d have him placed in a forward manner.”

The Gotham was Imperial Council's first race around two turns. He broke his maiden going seven furlongs at Belmont in October, then returned to win a Gulfstream allowance at 6 1/2 furlongs on Valentine's Day. Being by a Classic winner out of a mare by a Classic winner in Thunder Gulch, one might expect the horse to excel as the races get longer, and Tenney said he believes Imperial Council learned a lot from his Gotham effort.

“It was probably the first time he had any dirt really kicked in his face,” said Tenney. “And I think you’ll see a much-improved effort as he goes to the outer track from the inner track at Aqueduct. The turns are a little gentler, and I think he’ll get more momentum going into the straight. He’s out of a Thunder Gulch mare, so distance is bred all through him--you’d think distance would be his best friend. But he’s also got a lot of natural speed, as well.”

“[Physically], he’s about 16 hands--he’s not a big, big horse--but when he came down to Gulfstream [for the winter] he had gotten much stronger,” Tenney said.

I Want Revenge will be the likely favorite come Saturday, and Tenney knows Imperial Council will need to step it up if he hopes to defeat him. He does, however, believe that I Want Revenge, who made his conventional dirt debut in the Gotham, still has a bit to prove on the surface.

“If I Want Revenge comes back East and runs that race again, he’s going to be awfully tough--I would think he’d be a winner for sure,” said Tenney. “I personally think the horses coming from off the synthetic tracks have to prove they can run on the dirt. I’m not convinced all of them can. Shug’s trained this horse on a conventional dirt track all his life, and I think that’s got to give us some kind of an advantage. I want to see I Want Revenge run as well as he did in the Gotham. It certainly surprised me [the way he ran in the Gotham]. I’m a little bit of a doubter of horses coming from synthetic to dirt, and I know he has a little bit of dirt pedigree, but I just want to see him do it again. If he can, then I’ll be convinced.” --LM

Triple Threats

The Nile Works; Baffert Confident...

The favorite for Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby, Zayat Stables' **Pioneerof the Nile** (Empire Maker), was sent out by trainer Bob Baffert to a four-furlong work in :47 3/5 yesterday at Santa Anita. It was the second fastest of 16 moves at the distance.

The colt, from the second crop of 2003 GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Empire Maker, has established himself as one of the top Derby contenders on the West Coast with successive tallies in the GI CashCall Futurity, GII Robert B. Lewis S. and GII San Felipe S. at Santa Anita Mar. 14. 'The Nile,' as Baffert and his team call him around the barn, didn't wow 'em in the San Felipe, but rather had to work to stave off longshot Feisty Suances (Suances {GB}) en route to a 1 1/2-length win.

"He's gonna be a different horse this week," Baffert said during the NTRA national teleconference yesterday. "I've really tightened the screws on him, and he couldn't look better. He had a little breeze today, and he just looks like he's coming into this race the way you want him to. I'm expecting a big effort out of him this weekend."

Since Pioneerof the Nile captured the CashCall Futurity in December, a number of horses have emerged as top Derby threats, including the likes of that race's runner-up I Want Revenge (Stephen Got Even) and the GI Florida Derby one-two Quality Road (Elusive Quality) and Dunkirk (Unbridled's Song).

"It's getting tougher every week, it seems," said Baffert. "I was pretty impressed with the Florida Derby. I think those two horses are really top horses. This is when it starts getting interesting and fun. I'm glad to be in it. It's been a few years since I've had a really legitimate type of horse, and I feel like I have a legitimate Derby horse. It's fun, but at the same time there's an anxiousness. Every time my phone rings from one of my assistants, I hold my breath. When I answer, they're all trained to say, 'everything's ok.' Like this morning, when my horse worked, I loved the way he went, and I called my wife Jill, who was on the road. When I called her, she was like, 'Oh my God, what's wrong?' I said, 'No, no, he worked great.' But I really scared the hell out of her. Everybody's on pins and needles from here on out."

Pamplemousse Registers Final SA Derby Work...

The Pamplemousse (Kafwain) blew out a bullet three furlongs yesterday at Santa Anita in advance of his showdown with **Pioneer of the Nile** (Empire Maker) in

Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby. Under regular rider Alex Solis, the big grey stopped the clock in :34 4/5, the fastest of 15 workers at the distance.

The Pamplemousse is coming off three straight wins and two straight Grade III tallies, having won the one-mile GIII San Rafael S. Jan. 17 and the nine-furlong GIII Sham S. Feb. 28. Both

stakes were at Santa Anita.

Despite going wire-to-wire in those races, his trainer, Julio Canani, insisted during yesterday's NTRA's Road to the Triple Crown teleconference that his charge doesn't have to be on the lead to be effective.

"When he finds himself on the lead, he takes it, but we've never asked the horse for nothing," said Canani. "And when he broke his maiden, he was sitting off in second."

Being by a sire who was arguably best at seven furlongs out of a dam by sprint champion Rubiano, some have questioned The Pamplemousse's qualifications to handle top company as the distances get longer.

Canani, however, says he pays the naysayers no mind.

"The say everything, but I don't listen to what anyone says," he commented. "This horse, he is amazing. He's huge and he carries his weight well. This morning he breezed in :34 4/5, and he does everything on his own."

Canani added that The Pamplemousse has been easy to get along with in the mornings. "He's very kind," Canani said. "When he gallops, you can go slow or you can go fast. But when he works, it's a different story. He just wants to go. We don't ask him to work fast, and he works in :58 and change. He's three, four, five wide--I don't want to put him close to the rail, because then he takes off. He's a natural. He's a very nice animal."

Looking ahead, other questions remain over whether The Pamplemousse will handle conventional dirt, a surface over which he's never raced, but Canani said that trying to predict if a horse will or won't is usually a waste of time.

"I don't know, it's up to the animal," he said. "For instance, I had a horse here that won a stakes on synthetic, and I ran him at Philadelphia Park and he couldn't handle the dirt. My owner sold the horse and he went to Dubai and he just won there the other day--Two Step Salsa [who captured the G2 Godolphin Mile]--and that was on dirt."

Team Valor International and Gary Barber's **Gitano Hernando (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}) could come over for the GI Belmont S. June 6. The chestnut kicked off his sophomore campaign with 2 1/2-length score in a Doncaster handicap last Sunday ([video courtesy attheraces](#); [Racing Post chart](#)), and will prep in the Listed Dee S. at Chester in May. Trained by Marco Botti, the son of Gino's Spirits (GB) (Perugino) got off the mark on the all-weather at Wolverhampton in No-

vember. "Marco had prepared the colt to run last week in the Kentucky Derby Trial S. at Kempton on the all-weather track, but he was the only entrant not to get into the race," reported Team Valor President Barry Irwin. "This win certainly erases some of the disap-

pointment from that lost opportunity." Irwin added, "We like the Dee S. as a prep for the Belmont because it is run on the circular course at Chester, which may be the most American-like of the English racecourses. The race usually is run like an American race in terms of style, and the timing, coming right after the Kentucky Derby, is good for a horse pointing for the third leg of the Triple Crown in America."

Despite drawing out wide, **Real Saga** and **More Joyous** have maintained their dominance over ante-post betting for the world's richest juvenile race. Real Saga emphasised his credentials with a facile 2 3/4-length G2 Todman S. win here Mar. 21 and the colt has only one blot on his copybook in five outings, when second to **Reward For Effort** in the G1 Blue Diamond S. Feb. 21. Trainer John Hawkes combined with jockey Damien Oliver to take the Slipper two years ago with **Forensics** (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}), and Oliver is thrilled to renew the association. "Obviously, he's one of the main chances, and he's shown in Sydney and Melbourne that he's pretty bomb-proof," Oliver said. "There's no guessing about him. He's done it against some of the best going around." Hawkes sent out the Slipper winner on three occasions when head of the massive Ingham family training operation at Crown Lodge, and the canny conditioner has since gone into business with sons Wayne and Michael as co-trainers. **Rostova** was supplemented to this contest for A\$150,000 after a front-running success in the G2 VRC Sires' Produce S. Mar. 7.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a **@** will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a **▲** will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner.

Ode to Joy...

Like Hawkes, Waterhouse has won the Golden Slipper three times, and the Randwick-based trainer has a trio engaged including More Joyous, heroine of the G2 Perfect Vision Lasik S. Mar. 21 over the same course and distance as the Golden Slipper. The bay is out of Group 1 winner Sunday Joy (Aus) (Sunday Silence), a half-sister to MG1SW Tuesday Joy (NZ) (Carnegie {Ire}). "She is set to pounce and deserves to be Slipper favourite; she has always been the most talented of any of the females going into the race," Waterhouse asserted. "[Blue Diamond winner] Reward for Effort and Real Saga are both talented colts...I loved the way Real Saga won last start. He, like More Joyous, is lovely and light on his feet. As always, the Golden Slipper is an extremely interesting affair."

A for Effort...

Reward for Effort is seeking to become just the fifth juvenile to complete the Blue Diamond--Golden Slipper double. Trainer Peter Moody also has **Headway**, who carries the colours of owner Tony Santic, and has warned punters not to overlook the filly. "She's the most improved horse in my yard," Moody offered. "She's a remarkable little horse. Her work on Tuesday morning was blistering. It was the nicest piece of work you'd ever see." The unbeaten granddaughter of Red Ransom is unbeaten in three outings, including the G3 Sweet Embrace S. at Randwick Mar. 14.

TO THE EDITOR

As a bloodstock agent in the industry, having been a (very) small breeder and ultimately a fan of racing, I feel the Breeders' Cup is guilty of false advertising with their slogan "World Thoroughbred Championships" when it is a restricted event.

For it to truly be a World Championship, the best horses in each division must compete. Therefore, I propose Breeders' Cup adopt a further nomination platform similar to that of the old KTDF, whereby horses may be nominated at an increased fee as yearlings, two-year-olds and older horses.

For example, yearlings can be made eligible for \$2,000. Unraced two-year-olds for \$5,000. Two-year-olds which have started & older horses for \$15,000, which would also be the fee for foreign-bred horses and those whose sires were not nominated. The nominator would receive the breeders' awards.

This structure should ensure that the best possible fields are assembled on Cup day and for the Special Stakes program. It seems that often a leading contender does not participate on Cup day because of the extraordinary fees required to run a horse that was not nominated as a foal.

In today's economic climate, breeders are against the wall as it is. Even the very well-to-do breeders may only nominate a portion of their foal crop. This scenario provides an incentive for the breeder to go ahead with a foal nomination in order to be eligible for any breeder's award and an incentive for a subsequent owner to nominate at a higher fee. Then the best horses in the world will probably all line up in the gate on Cup day.

Finally, as a fan and agent, when Cup day was held at Churchill several years ago, a filly I had purchased for a client was running in the inaugural Filly and Mare Turf. There was no way to buy one of the hats with her name on it at the event. How about having booths at the track where fans can purchase hats with their favorite runners names on them?

And a hit with the leading ladies!

SOPHOMORE SIRES

The 2004 GI Wood Memorial winner **Tapit**, by Pulpit out of an Unbridled mare, went into winter quarters as 2008's Leading Freshman Sire by a margin of more than \$1.1 million over his nearest rival, dual Grade I winner and 2004 GI Kentucky Derby second **Lion Heart** (Tale of the Cat). Combined with **Sky Mesa's** placing at the top of the 2008 second-crop sire list, Pulpit's reputation as a sire of sires received a major boost. Thus far in 2009, Tapit is inches ahead of the unbeaten, Fappiano-line, South American-bred Candy Ride (Arg) (by Ride the Rails, by Cryptoclearance, by Fappiano), who recorded a 123 Beyer when he won the 2003 GI Pacific Classic, in the battle for second place in 2009 earnings (Bloodhorse.com) among sophomore sires; Lion Heart is fourth.

Just as Tapit and Sky Mesa have given Pulpit a boost as a sire of sires, this year's number one sophomore sire to date, **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado), is providing a timely boost for the Sadler's Wells sire line on the North American side of the Pond. A gray son of Sadler's Wells out of the 1977 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Lady Capulet (a three-quarter sister to the speed sire Drone), El Prado won the prestigious G1 National S. in Ireland in 1991, but failed to train on and didn't win at three. A member of the 1994 sire class headed by A.P. Indy, El Prado steadily worked his way up the sire ladder until Medaglia d'Oro came along. Bought after running second in a maiden at two and sent to Bobby Frankel, Medaglia d'Oro went on to win the GI Travers S., finish second in the GI Belmont S. and GI Breeders' Cup Classic as a three-year-old in 2002, and earn \$2.26 million; he also catapulted his sire, El Prado, to champion sire status. El Prado was runner-up the next two years, when Medaglia d'Oro won two further Grade I's, ran second again in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, and closed out his career with a second in the 2004 G1 Dubai World Cup. A tall, striking individual, Medaglia d'Oro retired with eight wins and seven seconds in 17 career starts, and earnings totaling over \$5.75 million.

Neither of the top two has any colts prominent in the Derby picture, but both are loaded with fillies. Medaglia d'Oro has four good stakes fillies already this year, including GII Fair Grounds Oaks winner Rachel Alexandra, and Gabby's Golden Gal, a 13-length winner in last weekend's \$200,000 Sunland Oaks. Tapit's champion two-year-old filly of 2008, the \$5.7 million Fasig November IEAH purchase Stardom Bound, won two Grade I's for trainer Bobby Frankel at Santa Anita this winter, and is now with Rick Dutrow at Keeneland, prepping for this weekend's GI Ashland S.

Last year Tapit had another Grade I-winning filly, Hollywood Starlet winner Laragh; and this year another filly from his first crop, War Echo, won the GIII Silverbulletday S. at Fair Grounds. Through last weekend, Medaglia d'Oro's runners had earned more than \$1.1 million in 2009, \$300,000 more than Tapit and Candy Ride. In cumulative terms, though, because Tapit led Medaglia d'Oro (fourth-placed freshman sire in 2008) by \$1.4 million, he is still over \$1.1 million clear among sophomore sires, with cumulative progeny earnings to date of almost \$3.6 million. Medaglia d'Oro (\$2.44 million) has inched ahead of Lion Heart (\$2.41 million), with Candy Ride fourth (almost \$2.18 million) by cumulative progeny earnings.

These four were the top four on the 2008 Freshman Sire List; they're the top four on the 2009 second-crop sire list; and the top four by cumulative progeny earnings, as well as being the only four with over \$2 million in total progeny earnings to date, according to statistics provided to TDN by The Jockey Club Information Systems. Classic contenders may be thin on the ground for these top four--only Candy Ride, with GIII El Camino Real Derby winner Chocolate Candy going in this weekend's GI Santa Anita Derby as a longshot facing Pioneerof the Nile and The Pamplermousse, would really still have one in consideration for Kentucky. But it's a credit to all these stallions, really, that they're doing so well without Derby contenders.

Fifth-ranked **Speightstown** (Gone West), champion sprinter of 2004, also has a Classic outsider, in G1 English 2000 Guineas candidate Lord Shanakill. He won the G2 Mill Reef S. over six furlongs last year, and ran second in the seven-furlong G1 Dewhurst. But that looked a relatively weak race: the winner, Intense Focus (Giant's Causeway), has been beaten before and since; both Intense Focus and Lord Shanakill are around 40-1 for the Guineas on Betfair (though, of course, you're not allowed to make that bet from America), but like they say, you can't win if you're not in, and Lord Shanakill will be in--and could run better than a lot of people expect; he's very seasoned.

Sixth-ranked **Chapel Royal** (Montbrook) was sent from Ashford to Florida this year, but is tied with former barnmate Lion Heart, each with 48 winners of 61 races, to lead all sophomore sires in both categories. **Even the Score** (Unbridled's Song) has punched above his weight, and has another GI Santa Anita Derby longshot, in the Todd Pletcher-trained Take the Points. **Congaree** (Arazi), who won five Grade I's over three seasons and ran third to Monarchos in the 2001 GI Kentucky Derby, was the biggest mover last week, with the Jim Bolger-trained filly Maoineach winning the G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial, and the colt Mythical Power earning \$176,000 for running second in the \$900,000 Sunland Derby. **Peace Rules** (Jules) and **Birdstone** (Grindstone) round at the current top 10, followed by **Cuvee** (Carson City), **Friends Lake** (A.P. Indy), and **Toccet** (Awesome Again), who has made the biggest move forward (21st to 13th), but still does not have a stakes winner. Ranked 18th at the moment is **Pleasantly Perfect** (Pleasant Colony), who defeated Medaglia d'Oro in the second of his GI Breeders' Cup Classic runner-up finishes and the following year's G1 Dubai World Cup.

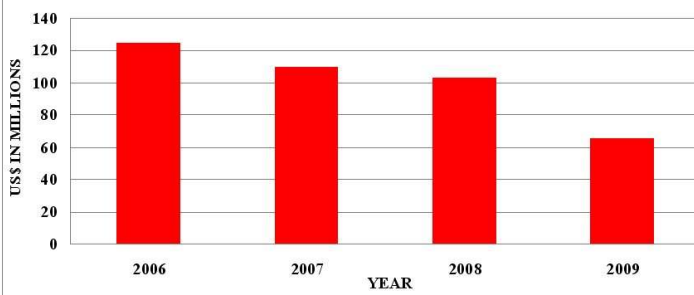
What about that huge, lifetime-best, 119 Beyer, 14-length demolition job by Tiznow's Well Armed in the G1 Dubai World Cup; he was imperious! Speaking of catapulting sires, that win (which is counted for *the Blood-Horse's* General Sire List) catapulted last year's number three, Tiznow, into a \$1.2 million lead on the 2009 General Sire List this week. The 1999 GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Silic (Sillery), who stands in California, is temporarily second, thanks to G1 Dubai Duty Free winner Gladiatorus; but it's Distorted Humor, now almost \$1.5 million behind Tiznow, in third, who is likely to emerge as Tiznow's biggest challenger for the 2009 title. Distorted Humor was number one before the weekend, and helped his cause immensely when his three-year-old Regal Ransom upset stablemate Desert Party in the G2 UAE Derby, thus bumping his sire's earnings by \$1.2-million--just \$2.4 million less than Well Armed's winning payday for Tiznow.

"Here's the difference between the earlier mixed sales and the more recent two-year-old sales so far this year (not including Texas yesterday): there were 24 percent fewer catalogued and 23 percent fewer sold at the mixed sales, so the percentage sold/catalogued was actually up a tick. But the gross plummeted 56 percent and the average 43 percent -- also reflecting a drop in catalogue quality. At the two-year-old sales, the number catalogued is down 5 percent, but the number sold down 16 percent -- 44 percent sold/catalogued, down 6 percent from last year. The two-year-old gross is down 36 percent, the average down 24 percent." --Bill Oppenheim

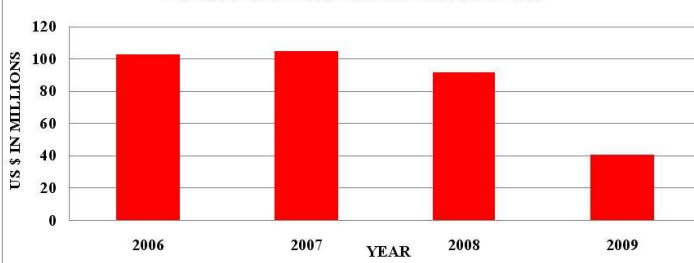
TOTAL US AND EURO 2YO SALES

CANADIAN ENTREPRENEUR: I'VE GOT THE ZEBRE RIGHT HERE

It is official. At its monthly meeting earlier this month, the Nova Scotia Racing Commission quietly granted a license to Halifax Racing Inc. to conduct a six-day racing meet this August at the historic Lunenburg County Fair. Cole Stevens's dream is about to become a reality. The Lunenburg meet will feature the first ever pari-mutuel races among zorses, crosses between Thoroughbred horses and zebras.

"I know it's just six days at a small fair meet in Canada, but I like to think this is the start of something big,"

Stevens said. "I am convinced that the future is zorses, that zorse racing will someday be a lot more prominent than Thoroughbred racing. People might think I'm crazy, but if they really understood what is going on here they'd see that the economics of racing zorses--particularly because of their soundness and durability--are a lot more favorable than the economics of racing Thoroughbreds, for the owner and the racetrack alike."

Stevens, an entrepreneur who gobbled up hundreds of domain names, like NFL.com, NBA.com, NASCAR.com, arbees.com and beavisbutthead.com at the onset of the Internet era and then sold them for a combined \$450 million, more or less stumbled on his concept of zorse racing 15 years ago. With an eye on opening a new Nova Scotia racetrack in order to get an additional license to offer slot machine gaming, he discovered there were several obstacles standing in the way of opening a Thoroughbred racetrack.

"For one, this is harness racing country and people didn't think anyone would support a Thoroughbred meet," Stevens said. "I think, in time, I could have gotten a Thoroughbred track up and running, but the more I looked into the situation the more it was apparent that Thoroughbred racing wasn't the way to go. I looked around at all these tracks around North America and saw that just about every one of them had five and six horses in every race. I figured how on earth was I ever going to get enough horses to come to little old Nova Scotia to open up a new racetrack?"

Ready to give up on his idea of opening a racetrack, his eyes were opened that same year to an exciting opportunity during a visit with his children to the same Lunenburg Fair that will host his first meet.

"I remember it like it was yesterday," Stevens said. "They brought in a fellow, Dr. Emmett Jennings from Dalhousie University here in Halifax, to give an exhibition. He was a professor there and had a doctorate in animal genetics and was displaying his zorses. People had mated zebras and horses before, but Dr. Jennings took the science to new levels."

Jennings was the first to breed a Thoroughbred to a zebra and he was the first to develop zorses that could reproduce. The earliest forms of zorses could not be domesticated because they would not respond to any training by humans or their commands, but Jennings found that his "zebreds"--a cross not just between zebras and horses, but specifically Thoroughbreds-- could in fact be trained or broken, just as the Thoroughbred is before it is sent to the racetrack.

"There is something about the temperament of the Thoroughbred that mixes perfectly with the zebra," said Jennings, who, before earning his degree was the bass player for the group Dexys Midnight Runners, who had the 1982 hit "Come on Eileen." "All of a sudden, we were producing zorses that acted a lot more like a horse than a zebra."

Stevens had a thought: why couldn't zorses race? "Dr. Jennings told me it was an excellent idea and he thought his zebreds, which is what he called the Thoroughbred-zebra cross, would be perfect for some sort of racing competitions," Stevens said. "If you think about it, they have mule races in Northern California and the mule is a cross between a donkey and a horse. So why couldn't you race a cross between a horse and a zebra?"

The immediate problem was that the total "zebred" population at the time numbered only six, all of them owned by Dalhousie University. So Stevens set out to build his own band of zebreds. His first stop was the 1994 Keeneland November sales, where he purchased four weanlings under the name of Stripes Racing Stable.

"I never intended to race any of these horses," Stevens explained. "I wanted to raise them myself so that I could study their every move, could control their environment and always have them under my control."

For a combined total of \$76,000, he bought the four weanlings, one by Chief Honcho, one by Domasca Dan and two by Beau Genius. Four years later, the four were busy breeding to Stevens's "broodmare" band, which consisted of 45 female zebras he purchased from a zebra breeder in the Yucatan Peninsula. **Cont. p14**

He now has more than 120 healthy zebreds on his farm. Andy Schluter, a Prince Edward Island resident who owns the largest shrimp boat fleet in the Maritime Provinces and who is an investor in Halifax Racing Inc., has bred another 25 zebreds. Between the two, they have more than 70 zebreds who have been broken and are ready to compete. All of them will be trained either by Brian Hess, still the record holder for most career wins by a trainer at Inverness Raceway, a Nova Scotia harness track; and Robby Smith, a former assistant to top Canadian Thoroughbred trainer Roger Attfield.

“We’re not expecting much from the Lunenberg meet,” Schluter said. “If we handle \$25,000 a day, we’ll be happy. It’s really about proving to the industry that racing zebreds is a viable option. It’s about the future.”

Stevens is not a neophyte when it comes to Thoroughbred racing. He has owned more than 50 Thoroughbreds, including Wafare Warrior (Fort Chaffee), the winner of the 1999 Manitoba Derby. He is well versed in the current problems of the sport and thinks that zebreds can solve many of them.

“The biggest problem with Thoroughbred racing today is that these horses are fragile and they can’t race more than seven or eight times a year,” he said. “That’s not good for the owner and it’s certainly not good for the racetracks. This goes back to my original problem. How can a track avoid having five or six horses in a race all the time?”

“Well, a zebred could run 300 times a year. You could literally run one of these things every day. These suckers are indestructible. There are hardly ever any vet bills and any equine that is running twice a week is bound to make a pile of money for the owner.”

Stevens said that one U.S. racetrack, which he declined to name, has contacted him about the viability of holding a zebred race in 2010.

“I understand that there are people who will read this and will laugh at me,” Stevens said. “I don’t mind. They won’t be laughing when half the racetracks in North America have converted to zebred racing by 2030. I’ve already got three Canadian Thoroughbred breeders who have asked me where they can get quality zebras. This is amazing stuff, but not nearly quite as amazing as the fact that you have gotten this far in the story and have failed to realize that once again the *TDN* put one over on you with an April Fool’s joke.”

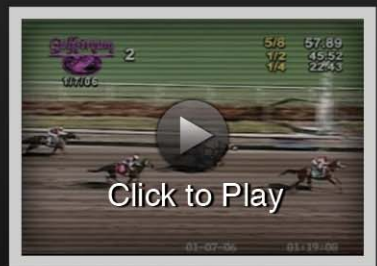

Purchased for A\$1.5 million as a yearling at the Inglis Easter Sale, the bay filly captured the G1 AJC Champagne S. at two, and added trophies in the G1 VRC Oaks and G1 AJC Flight S. during her three-year-old campaign for trainer Kris Lees. She also ran third in the G1 Cox Plate and has bankrolled A\$1,757,850.

Samantha Miss was forced to the sidelines with a tendon injury, but has undergone stem-cell treatment, and is currently being spelled at a farm. "Last Thursday she had something like eight million stem cells put into the tendon, and the vets were happy with how it went," Lees said on his website. "For the next three months she will do quite a bit of exercise, not strenuous, but a lot of walking. From there she will come back to the stable, and we'll continue to do plenty of walking and do some limited trotting and swimming." He added, "At various stages of her rehab we look at how she's progressing by way of ultra-sounding the injured area, but we're not going to get a real guide on the procedure's success until she gets a saddle back on and we place her under some pressure."



'JOY' AWAITING SPRING John Singleton has scrapped a proposed tilt at the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe with his multiple Group 1 winner **Tuesday Joy (NZ)** (Carnegie {Ire}), who finished ninth last Saturday in the G1 Dubai Duty Free at Nad Al Sheba. The five year old will return to trainer Gai Waterhouse for a campaign centered around the G1 Melbourne Cup in November. Tuesday Joy has amassed over A\$3.2 million and her record stands at 24-7-6-3, but the choicest prizes have proven elusive for the mare. Winner of four top-level events, she has had to settle for minor placings in races including the G1 VRC Oaks, G1 AJC Oaks, and G1 AJC Derby, and her Cup campaign last spring went amiss following a bleeding episode.
