WINTER VIEW BEWITCHES AT KEENELAND

Jonathan Sheppard and Julien Leparoux have enjoyed a stellar Keeneland meet, and the trainer and jockey teamed up yesterday to win the GIII Grey Goose Bewitch S. with Augustin Stable's homebred **Winter View** (Thunder Gulch). Last of seven as favored **Dress Rehearsal (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) loped along through modest fractions, Winter View still had the whole field to beat with a quarter mile to run. But the chestnut mare closed powerfully under the preternaturally patient Leparoux. Winter View, a half sister to George Strawbridge's 1000 Guineas favorite Rainbow View (Dynaformer), was coming off a course-and-trip allowance victory Apr. 5, and Leparoux was looking for a similar trip yesterday. "We didn't want to change a thing today, no matter the pace," said Leparoux. "We knew it was going to be a slow pace, but she ran very well." The victory was the third graded score of the meet for Sheppard and Strawbridge's Augustin Stable and fourth stakes win for Leparoux. "Julien gave her a beautiful ride," said Sheppard. "I was a little concerned about the slow fractions, but I know that's her style and it's not good to alter it. We discussed that ahead of time because on paper it didn't look like there would be much speed." 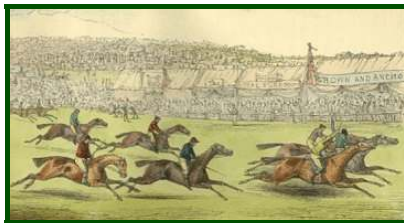

WESTPHALIA HAS POULAINS TARGET

Aidan O'Brien yesterday confirmed that **Westphalia (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) was heading to Longchamp for the May 10 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas). While Newmarket's Classic had also been on the agenda for Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's G2 Champagne S. winner, the French alternative is where he is headed alongside **Set Sail (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) following their second and fourth placings, respectively, in the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau there Apr. 12. "The present plan is to send Westphalia back to Longchamp for the French Guineas, and Set Sail may also go for the same race," the Ballydoyle conditioner told the *Racing Post* before confirming that **Mastercraftsman (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and **Rip van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) were on schedule to run in next Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas. "They will probably do their last bit of work early next week," he added.

ADLERFLUG GETS GREEN LIGHT

Trainer Jens Hirschberger yesterday confirmed that Gestut Schlenderhan's **Adlerflug (Ger)** (In the Wings {GB}) will take his place in the line-up for Sunday's G1 Prix Ganay Grand Prix Air Mauritius at Longchamp. The 2007 G1 Deutsches Derby hero returned to add the G1 Deutschland-Preis to his tally last term, but has been absent since finishing 2 1/2-lengths second to Kamsin (Ger) (Samum {Ger}) in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden in September. "Adlerflug will run," his conditioner said. "He has been working very well, he is feeling very well and looks the part. We are very hopeful about his chances and pretty sure that he will do well." Another committed to the 1 5/16-mile contest yesterday was the ex-Ballydoyle inmate **The Bogberry** (Hawk Wing). Now trained by Alain de Royer-Dupre for Sergey Efros, the four-year-old has finished third in the G2 Prix Dollar here in October, fourth in the G1 Hong Kong Vase and runner-up in the Apr. 5 G2 Prix d'Harcourt back in three tries for new connections. "The horse was not fully wound up for the Prix d'Harcourt and still ran

very well, especially as he was unlucky in the later stages having to wait to get a run," his trainer commented. "I like the way he finished there, but there is a question mark about the ground as he prefers some cut. There is rain forecast and any would certainly help his chances." Johnny Murtagh, successful on Duke of Marmalade (Ire) 12 months ago, will ride Sean Mulryan, Michael Tabor, Susan Magnier and Derrick Smith's 2007 G1 Criterium International winner **Thewayouare** (Kingmambo). Ground conditions are currently reported as good to soft, with a mixed forecast leading up to the main event.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner.

I would like to add that the "synthetic revolution" has fragmented the bettors, many of which refuse to wager on inconsistent and manipulated racing surfaces. Race-tracks like Santa Anita and Del Mar are constantly attempting to "adjust" their track surface to achieve a Pick 6 Carryover and that is a total disservice to everyone because who wants to wager on a surface which has no true and consistent form.

The quicker these "Polycrap tracks" are removed the better because manipulation and inconsistency are two terms which do not drive handle!! Without wagering, this whole industry will continue its rapid decline and HOPEFULLY some of the "big time" racing associations will eventually "listen" to their customer and pull the "crap" out!!

Thanks, Mr. Irwin, for bringing to fore several good arguments as to why the industry should take a careful look at the pros and cons of synthetic vs. traditional surfaces. His reference to tracks with synthetic surfaces being quick to pull races off the turf was well founded, as well. Handicappers have long been aware that certain bloodlines, such as sons/grandsons of Sadlers Wells, excel on soft going. The same can be said about bloodlines that favor wet tracks over "fast." We need to keep the punters happy, too.

SWEETSOUTHERNSAINT FILLY TOPS OBS

FINALE The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training concluded its four-day run yesterday in Ocala with figures down across the board. A filly by Sweetsouthernst topped Thursday's session with a final bid of \$145,000. The bay juvenile, consigned by McKathan Bros., agent, was purchased by Tommy Hutton's Dream Stable. She worked a quarter in :21 during last week's under tack preview. Out of Doc's Stormy Girl (Dr. Caton), the filly is a half sister to stakes winner Leigh McLovin (Flame Thrower). For the session, 196 juveniles sold for \$4,841,000. The session average of \$24,699 was down 8.6 percent from a year ago, while the median fell 6.25 percent to \$15,000. During four days of bidding, OBS sold 809 horses for a total of \$20,194,300. The average fell 14.6 percent to \$24,962 and the median decreased 16.7 percent to \$15,000. A total of 243 horses were reported not sold, for a buy-back rate of 23.1 percent. The sale's top price was achieved during Monday's opening session when John Ferguson Bloodstock spent \$675,000 for a son of A.P. Indy out of Grade I winner Got Koko (Signal Tap) from the consignment of M. Neal Sims, agent.
