## I WANT THE THIRTEEN

IEAH Stables, David Lanzman and Puglisi Racing's **I Want Revenge** (Stephen Got Even) was installed the 3-1 morning line favorite for Saturday's 135th running of the GI Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs. Yesterday's post position draw was conducted in two stages. The order in which post positions would be assigned was decided by lot, following which the various connections had one minute to select a post position.



**I Want Revenge** Reed Palmer

With the 10th overall selection, connections of **I Want Revenge**, a breathtaking winner of the GI Wood Memorial in his most recent trip to the post Apr. 4, selected post position 13. Michael Iavarone, president of IEAH, was confronted with post 20 last year for Big Brown, who overcame

the wide alley to score convincingly. He was pleased with yesterday's results. "I feel better than I did with post 20," he commented. "I think we did great. Looking at the way the race shapes up, all the speed is inside of us. Our biggest fear was that there would be horses crossing over on us. [With this post], I think we'll end up in a really, really good stalking position."

## Co-Second Favorites...

A few weeks ago, the Derby status of GI Florida Derby runner-up **Dunkirk** (Unbridled's Song) was in serious doubt. But a few defections eased his path into the race, and the \$3.7-million Keeneland September sales topper from 2007 was pegged at odds of 4-1, the joint second choice. The grey son of GI Kentucky Oaks winner Secret Status (A.P. Indy) will depart from the auxiliary gate in stall 15. "There is a little bit of space between the main gate and the auxiliary gate, and that gives him a little extra room during the break. I like that," said trainer Todd Pletcher, who telegraphed his race strategy. "We're going to take him back and make one run, just like we did in the Florida Derby." With the fifth overall pick, Zayat Stables LLC's selected the 16 hole for the GI Santa Anita Derby hero **Pioneerof the Nile** (Empire Maker). "I wanted to take the safe approach," said three-time Derby-winning trainer Bob Baffert. "He still hasn't had dirt kicked in his face. It can get pretty clogged up going into the first turn and if a horse wants to get a little rank down on the inside, you can run into a wall of horses. We might lose some ground, but [post 16] gives Garrett [Gomez] a couple of options. It gives him a better chance of getting the job done." Cont. p2

## BACK-TO-BACK STAKES WINNERS AND 2 STAKES PERFORMERS FOR STORMY ATLANTIC

On April 25th, **SOUTHERN REGION** won the Grand Prairie Turf Challenge S. and **HOTLANTIC** won the Irving Distaff S. with **EVERLASTING BEAUTY**, also by Stormy Atlantic, coming in second. The same day, Graded Stakes winner **SHADOWLESS** ran second in the \$150,000 Jacques Cartier S. at Woodbine.

***Friesan Hopes to Fire from the Six...***

Vinery Stable and Fox Hill Farms' **Friesan Fire** (A.P. Indy) enters Saturday's race off a seven-week hiatus and was last seen taking the Mar. 14 GII Louisiana Derby by 7 1/4 lengths over **Papa Clem** (Smart Strike). Selecting just after I Want Revenge, connections chose to break from post position six. "I was surprised the six was still left," said trainer Larry Jones, who has sent out the runner-up in the last two runnings of the Derby. "I thought there would be more speed horses to draw inside. Right now we are in good shape. We had the five last year with Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song) and worked out a great trip. He should be laying anywhere from third to fifth early and suck back behind the speed and hopefully get a clear run when the real running starts."

***WinStar Horses Three, Four and Five...***

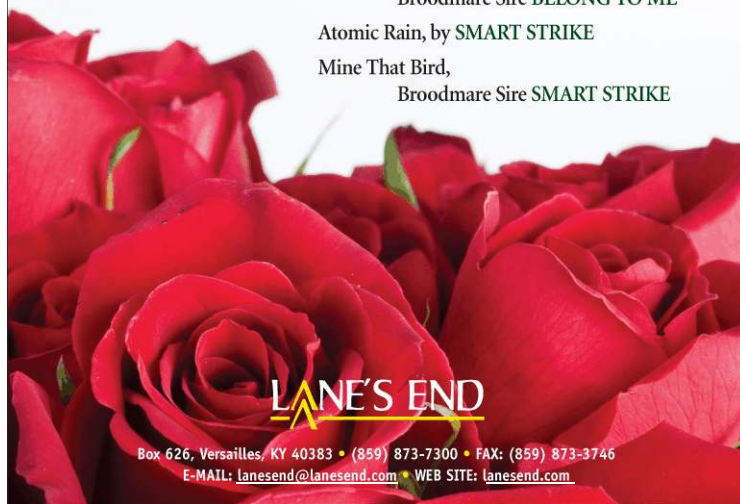
Bill Casner and Kenny Troutt's WinStar Farm will be represented by three horses Saturday, and could be racecaller Tom Durkin's greatest nightmare, as they drew alongside one another in stalls three, four and five. **Mr. Hot Stuff** (Tiznow), a homebred full brother to 2008 Derby sixth-place finisher Colonel John, is innermost of the three and will break just to the inside of recent GII Coolmore Lexington S. hero **Advice** (Chapel Royal). The last of the trio is **Hold Me Back** (Giant's Causeway), victorious in the GII Lane's End S. in his seasonal debut Mar. 21 and a deceptively good runner-up in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland Apr. 11.

***Godolphin Duo Live Longshots...***

By all accounts, Godolphin is in with their best-ever chance to take the "Run for the Roses" in the form of **Desert Party** (Street Cry {Ire}) and **Regal Ransom** (Distorted Humor). The former, a \$2.1-million Fasig-Tipton Calder graduate, had a productive winter in Dubai, defeating his barnmate in a Jan. 22 conditions race and in the G3 UAE 2000 Guineas before settling for a runner-up finish to Regal Ransom in the G2 UAE Derby Mar. 28. Desert Party, a 15-1 gamble on the morning line, will have the services of Ramon Dominguez from post position 19. "He's been more calm and relaxed in his races," explained trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "If he can take a nice position, I'd be happy with that. I'm happy with the draw." Regal Ransom, who figures to be a major pace presence and could take the field a long way, is offered at a juicy 30-1. "The horse always shows a good turn of foot," bin Suroor said. "He can take a good position early in the race. It depends how fast they go, but if he sits close behind the lead I'll be really happy."

***Win Willy Out, Nowhere to Hide In...***

Just hours before Derby post positions were to be assigned, Jer-Mar Stable LLC's **Win Willy** (Monarchos) was declared from the race by trainer McLean Robertson. The grey colt, upset winner of the GII Rebel S. Mar. 14 and a respectable fourth in the GII Arkansas Derby Apr. 11, was said to have the beginnings of a fracture in his left front ankle. Upon hearing that news, trainer Nick Zito phoned owner Leonard Riggio and told him, "You've got to enter," the conditioner related to Daily Racing Form. He was referring to **Nowhere to Hide** (Vindication), who could not quite make the original cut for the Triple Crown trail after finishing fourth in the GIII Risen Star S., the GIII Tampa Bay Derby and the GII Illinois Derby. Opportunity knocked Wednesday morning and Zito and Riggio decided to knock back.

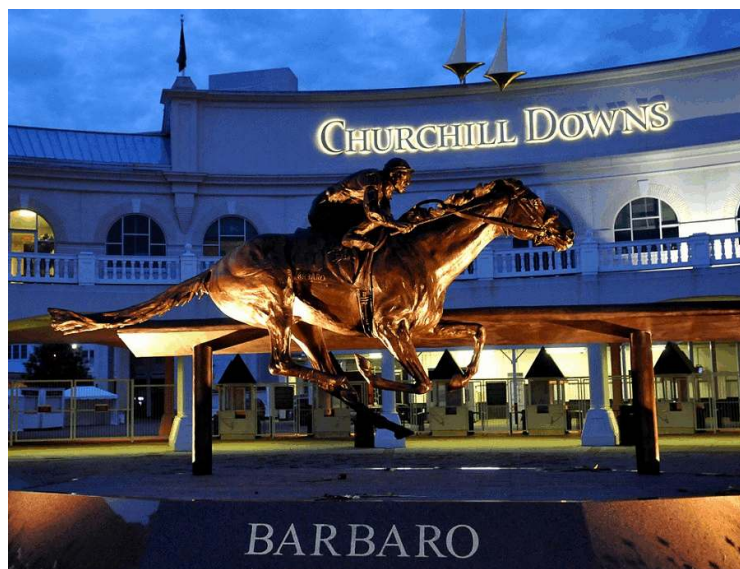

A 5 1/4-length allowance winner at Aqueduct Nov. 7,  
Bribon made his next appearance in the GI Hill 'n' Dale  
Cigar Mile H. and was checked at the quarter pole  
behind the stricken Wanderin Boy, then rallied stoutly  
to miss by 3/4 of a length in third. A disappointing 10th  
as the favorite in Gulfstream's GIII Hal's Hope H. Jan. 3,  
but bounced back with a six-length allowance score  
over the Hallandale oval Feb. 12. The chestnut never  
really landed a blow behind Smooth Air in the one-mile  
GII Gulfstream Park H. Mar. 14, finishing fourth, but  
was well-backed in his return to New York. Per Incanto

to run but when he got to the lead, he started playing  
around a little bit. I got to work on him, and by the last  
sixteenth I knew he had won it." Bribon goes next in  
the GI Shadwell Metropolitan H. May 25.

**Sagaro S. cont.**

Having streaked home by seven lengths in the G3 Queen's Vase at the Royal meeting here last June, Patkai dropped to fourth in the rescheduled G2 Great Voltigeur S. at Goodwood in August on his most recent outing. Settled in mid-division on leaving the gate in this comeback, the chestnut moved smoothly up-sides the front-running Tungsten Strike (Smart Strike) on the home turn and strode clear under hand riding in the straight for a most impressive victory. "He was beaten about two and a half or three lengths behind Centennial [in the Great Voltigeur], so it wasn't a bad performance and he wasn't quite right behind when he came back," trainer Sir Michael Stoute told *PA Sport*. "This horse stays very well, as he proved in the Vase and he likes the track as well. The [June 18 G1 Ascot] Gold Cup would be the plan, definitely. He is in the [May 15 G2] Yorkshire Cup and the [May 28 G2] Henry II S. [at Sandown] and hopefully he will have another run before the Gold Cup."

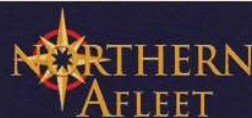

**SANTA ANITA TO RETAIN '09 BREEDERS' CUP**

Officials at Breeders' Cup Limited announced Wednesday that the 2009 running of the Breeders' Cup Championships will be held at Santa Anita Park as scheduled. In light of the ongoing bankruptcy proceedings involving Magna Entertainment Corp., the parent company of Santa Anita, there was a possibility that this year's Breeders' Cup would need to be transferred to an alternative facility. Officials at Churchill Downs stepped in and offered their facility as a safety net, but a Delaware court affirmed the Oak Tree Racing Association's lease with Santa Anita through 2009, allowing the Los Angeles area track to remain this year's host. "As a result we can now officially confirm that this year's Breeders' Cup World Championships will be held at Oak Tree at Santa Anita Park Nov. 6 and 7 as originally planned," said Breeders' Cup President and CEO Greg Avioli. "Together with our colleagues at Oak Tree and Santa Anita, we are very excited to showcase another outstanding Breeders' Cup from Southern California to our fans and horsemen around the globe. We also want to take this opportunity to thank Bob Evans and the Churchill Downs organization for agreeing to serve as back-up site for this year's Championships, and very much look forward to our return to Churchill Downs in 2010."

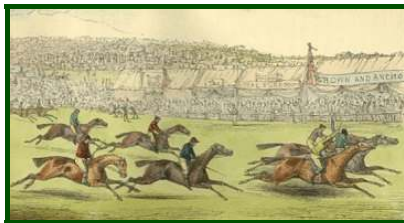

## RIP ROARING?

Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's **Rip van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who was found to have bruised a front foot in preparation for this Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas, continues to move closer to making the line up for the one-mile Classic as he recovers from the late injury scare. Trainer Aidan O'Brien is hopeful continued treatment on last term's G3 Tyros S. winner has improved prospects of participation and will leave it as late as possible before making a final decision. "We poulticed Rip van Winkle's foot again Wednesday night and not as much pus came out as had been the case the previous night," O'Brien told *Racing Post*. "He's 95 percent sound and, hopefully, will be perfect on Thursday morning and able to run. Obviously when such things happen you have to miss a bit of work, but we were happy with him before he got the bruise and, hopefully, everything will be okay on Thursday."

## Evasive Goes out of the Way

Cheveley Park Stud's **Evasive (GB)** (Elusive Quality) enjoyed an away day at Ascot yesterday as Sir Michael Stoute sought alternative methods to perk up last term's G3 Horris Hill S. hero in advance of Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket. The chesnut homebred was boxed south from Newmarket and was led around the paddock with big-race jockey Ryan Moore in the saddle. "He is walking well and he looks very well," Stoute told *PA Sport*. "His homework has not been spectacular. It has been annoying because he has been having little stoppages, which you don't ideally want, but he has done enough fast work despite the interruptions. His weight is good and you can only hope he wants to get back to the racecourse and get fired up. He has not run since [the Horris Hill in] October and we thought we would bring him here and if he gets excited, you would rather he did it here than on Saturday. We were going to take him to work at Newbury on Greenham day, but the ground was too bad. There's no magic to it."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

## NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



### WITHHOLDING LEGISLATION INTRODUCED IN HOUSE

Rep. John Yarmuth (D-KY) introduced a bill Tuesday that would eliminate the automatic 25 percent federal withholding on pari-mutuel winnings of \$5,000 or more when the odds of the wager are at least 300 times as large as the amount wagered. Rep. Charles Boustany, Jr. (R-LA) is the bill's lead co-sponsor.

The "Pari-mutuel Conformity and Equality Act of 2009" (H.R. 2140), or PACE Act, is crafted to end the competitive disadvantage from which the pari-mutuel industry suffers when compared to other forms of gaming. Winnings from keno, slots, poker and bingo are not subject to immediate taxation like pari-mutuel winnings. With the proliferation of race tracks that now offer other forms of gaming such as slots or card clubs, customers in the same facility are subject to different withholding laws depending on which type of gaming they choose.

## Oxx to Leave it Late

Trainer John Oxx will leave making a decision as late as possible before nominating either His Highness The Aga Khan's G2 Futurity S. hero **Arazan (Ire)** (Anabaa) or Christopher Tsui's G2 Beresford S. winner **Sea the Stars (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) in Saturday's £426,000 event. "There is no white smoke yet about plans," the trainer told *Racing Post*, making reference to the Papal election process, adding, "We hear that the ground at Newmarket is fast with no jar, but we still have to decide whether to risk Arazan, who likes ease, on such ground first time out this year. We'll wait until [Thursday] morning before deciding whether to take a chance or wait a bit longer with him. Sea The Stars will do an easy bit of exercise [Thursday] morning and a decision about him running will be made before declaration stage."

### **Zafisio Doubt**

Last term's G1 Criterium International hero **Zafisio (Ire)** (Efisio {GB}) is an almost certain non-starter after trainer Roger Curtis expressed fears the Rowley Mile surface will be too quick for his stable star. "He'll be a little short and he won't get his ground at Newmarket, as he needs a decent cut," Curtis told *PA Sport*. "He missed a couple of pieces of work, which is very annoying. He just had a dirty scope about two or three weeks ago, so we had to back off him at the wrong time. He's back and flying now, but he'd be unlikely to go to Newmarket unless we get some decent juice in the ground. They've got it down as good to firm, so it's not looking very likely. He'd be more likely to go for the [G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen] German 2000 Guineas [at Cologne May 10] as it gives us an extra week. He's matured into a lovely three-year-old now and he'll give them all a fright on soft ground. He's definitely lost none of the talent he showed as a two-year-old."

### **Hills Undecided**

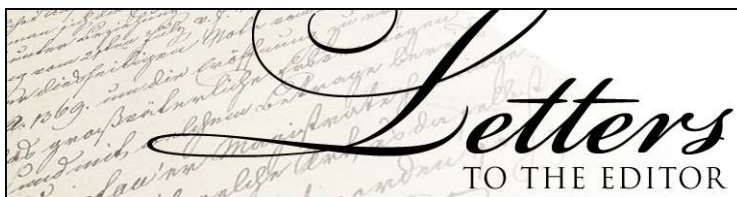
Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's retained rider Richard Hills is still undecided on his mount for Britain's first Classic of the year. The jockey has yet to choose between G1 Dewhurst S. third **Finjaan (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}) or impressive Listed European Free H. victor **Ouqba (GB)** (Red Ransom), who was supplemented for the race Monday at a cost of £30,000. "It was the Sheikh's plan to put [Ouqba] in, but I am pretty relaxed about running him," trainer Barry Hills told *PA Sport*. "He came out of Newmarket well and he didn't do too much Wednesday morning, but he worked well and would improve. The more I get to know the horse, the more I feel stamina is not an issue, but after this I would say he will go for the [seven-furlong] Jersey S. [at Royal Ascot June 17]. I am sure he will be thereabouts, but I don't know who is going to ride him yet as Richard has the choice between him and Marcus Tregoning's horse Finjaan."

### **Devotee on the T**

Godolphin's G1 Darley Alcibiades S. third **Devotee** (Elusive Quality) will make her first turf start in Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas and the operation's Simon Crisford is hoping the new terrain will not be her undoing. She was reported to have suffered a cardiac arrhythmia after finishing last in her Nad Al Sheba bow Feb. 6, but rebounded to claim the Listed UAE Oaks back on the Dubai dirt last time Feb. 26. "She seems to have chilled out quite a lot over the last three weeks," Crisford told *PA Sport*. "She's never been on grass, which we hope won't work against her. We are aware of the [heart] problem, but she didn't need to be treated for it and we are hoping that is behind her now. We are being very ambitious asking her to run in this race, but there are lots of options for her later in the year if it doesn't work out."

### **Going Remains Good-to-Firm**

The going on the Rowley Mile course at Newmarket remains good to firm ahead of the upcoming Guineas Festival. Wednesday saw irrigation commence, with eight millimetres of water applied to the whole course. After walking the course, Director of Racing Michael Prosser reported, "The going remains good to firm with a GoingStick reading of 9.0. We are on the good side of good to firm, which is exactly where we want to be. The forecast for the next five days is for largely dry weather. We could see some rain [Thursday], but this is only forecast to be a negligible amount of around one millimetre. With that in mind, it is highly likely that we will have to irrigate the course again on Friday to maintain the status quo."



### **WIN AND YOU'RE IN**

I would like to applaud Churchill Downs for trying new, innovative ideas in an attempt to increase awareness of American racing. The idea of the winner of the Kempton Park race [gaining a berth in the Kentucky Derby] was one such idea. The industry was fortunate that the owner of Mafaaz is truly a sportsman. While another owner might have entered the starting gate on Derby Day--just to run for the \$100,000 bonus offered--Sheikh Hamdan has chosen not to enter his horse in the Derby, thus allowing one of the "bubble" horses the opportunity to "run for the roses." We have had multiple horses entered before knowing one or more would be scratched in order to keep a bubble horse from having the opportunity to compete. Maybe we can learn something from this experience. I compliment Sheikh Hamdan for his sportsmanship and thank him for supporting Thoroughbred racing.

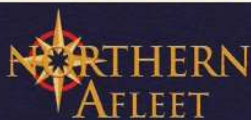

A memorial service for the late Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. winner Alysheba was held Wednesday at the Kentucky Horse Park just outside of Lexington. The son of Alydar was euthanized Mar. 27 at the Hagyard Equine Medical Institute after suffering an injury in his stall. Alysheba had resided at the Park for just five months after spending the previous eight years of his life in the royal stables of His Majesty King Abdullah of Saudi Arabia. He stood his first years at stud at William S. Farish's Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. "Although Alysheba left us a month ago, we felt that it was fitting for a Kentucky Derby winner to be memorialized during Derby week," said John Nicholson, executive director of the Kentucky Horse Park. "This is a very special and exciting time of year for everyone who loves Thoroughbred racing, as we anticipate the next Kentucky Derby winner. We couldn't imagine a better time to honor the life and remember the accomplishments of Alysheba." Nicholson continued, "During the too-brief time he lived at the Kentucky Horse Park, Alysheba stole the hearts of our park employees--especially those who worked with him each day and frequently commented on his loving disposition. We are glad that his fans and those who revere champions joined us in this service to honor Alysheba." ## ★ INDUSTRY INFO ★

### Federal Bill Would Eliminate Mandatory Withholding:

A bill, which has bi-partisan support from the U.S. House of Representatives' Ways and Means Committee, would eliminate the automatic 25-percent federal withholding on pari-mutuel winnings of \$5,000 or more for bets that return odds of 300-1 or higher. The "Pari-Mutuel Conformity and Equality Act" (PACE Act) was introduced Tuesday evening by Rep. John Yarmuth (D-KY), with Rep. Charles W. Boustany Jr. (R-LA) the bill's co-sponsor. Unlike other forms of gambling, the pari-mutuel industry is hampered by an existing law which requires wagering facilities to withhold federal taxes. The PACE Act would augment the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. The withholding threshold has remained unchanged for 17 years and was last increased in 1992 from \$1,000 to \$5,000. Exotic wagering has taken off since then and now accounts for two-thirds of all wagers placed. "The negative impact of withholding is multi-faceted," said Peggy Hendershot, Senior Vice President of Legislative Affairs for the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. "For the betting public, it has meant a confiscatory and frequently unfair loss of available capital. That loss of reinvestment or 'churn' leads to a reduction in overall wagering that in turn means less revenue generated for state governments, racetracks, and purse money for horsemen. The PACE Act would also reduce the high burden of administrative compliance for pari-mutuel operators."

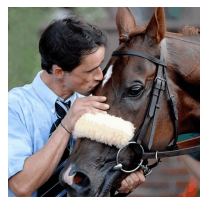
