## GLORY FOR GHANAATI

Unexposed and largely ignored by the crowds prior to yesterday's G1 stanjames.com 1000 Guineas, Sheikh Hamdan's **Ghanaati** (Giant's Causeway) led her rivals on a merry dance at a huge 20-1 to bring another Classic success to her illustrious family. As with Saturday's Guineas hero Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), she boasts one of the finest pedigrees of the past 20 years being a granddaughter of Height of Fashion (Fr) (Bustino {GB}), whose Nashwan (GB) (Blushing Groom) tasted glory in the 2000 Guineas and Epsom Derby in 1989. Despite her blue blood, with a mere maiden win on Kempton's Polytrack to her name prior to tackling **Rainbow View** (Dynaformer) and company, the bay had escaped most of the attention. Always prominent, the homebred gradually asserted from the quarter pole to beat **Cuis Ghaire (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) by 1 1/2 lengths in 1:34.22, smashing the record of Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) set two years ago and gaining the honor of being the fastest ever Guineas runner. *Cont. p2*

The morning after springing one of the most improbably upsets in G1 Kentucky Derby history, Double Eagle Ranch and Bueno Suerte Equine's **Mine That Bird** (Birdstone) was in fine fettle, quietly munching grass as his connections entertained a sizeable crowd of well-wishers and media types. Trainer Chip Woolley Jr. and owners Mark Allen of Double Eagle and Dr. Leonard Blach of Bueno Suerte, along with winning jockey Calvin Borel, even appeared on NBC's "Sunday Today"



show. "It's an unbelievable feeling," said Woolley. "It's actually a little bit hard to get your arms around right at the moment. It's hard to believe that you actually came in here and won this thing." *Cont. p7*

**A Rising Star...**

Trainer Barry Hills says **Ghanaati** had shown potential from the start. "She's a very good filly who has always done things very well," he said. "I'm very confident she'll get a mile and a quarter, so I didn't want to run her over seven in a trial. It's very special."

Confined to a pair of seven-furlong maidens on Kempton's Polytrack last term, Ghanaati followed an encouraging third in September with a six-length success back there the following month. Despite the obvious promise of the latter performance, there was little evidence to suggest she would be able to scale these heights without further seasoning, but Hills had exuded a quiet confidence leading up to this test. Sharpened by a racecourse gallop here at the Craven meeting, she spent the first half mile in the firing line between **Cuis Ghaire (Ire)** and **Devotee** (Elusive Quality) and it was clear she had the measure of the former by the time Richard Hills asked her to assert passing the quarter pole. Drawing away on the uphill climb, she was comfortably on top there as Cuis Ghaire clung gamely to the runner-up spot.

"Last year, we thought a lot of her and she's thrived all winter," her jockey commented. "She was a big filly and late in coming, so dad wanted to come straight here with a prep gallop behind her. We always thought that she had it and with each gallop, she just got better and better. I knew dad was feeling the excitement and I was and so were the people around her. When you ride her, she has so many familiarities with other members of her family and they improve with experience. She has a lovely cruising speed and broke really well--four out I was traveling really well and I wanted to make sure I had her running before the 'dip' and after that I couldn't hear anything behind. I really think 10 furlongs could be her best and it wouldn't surprise me if she turned up on Oaks day--it could be a big year for her."

Her owner-breeder was quick to praise the role of Barry Hills, who has spent recent years battling throat cancer. "He kept quiet about her, but then told me she was coming the right way at the Craven meeting and was very happy with her then," Sheikh Hamdan said. "Trainers with experience know their animals and you can't push them. To me, he lives for his horses and that is what you look for in a trainer." Richard Hills added his own tribute to the 72-year-old master of South Bank in Lambourn, who was doubling his 1000 Guineas tally 31 years after the exploits of Enstone Spark (GB) (Sparkler {Ire}). "He overcame a lot last year and to get his head down, get his horses running well and win a Classic is a big achievement," Hills added. **More Placings for Bolger and Meehan...**

Third in Saturday's feature with Gan Amhras (Ire), trainer Jim Bolger witnessed another progeny of Galileo (Ire) edged out of Classic glory, but was pleased with the effort of Cuis Ghaire. "We're very happy--if you have to be second, this is the best place to be second," Bolger told *PA Sport*. "We are expecting her to come on for the run--the ground has been a bit soft in Ireland and we were not able to get in a final gallop. She will stick at a mile and probably go for the [May 24] G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh."

Brian Meehan, whose Delegator (GB) (Dansili {GB}) filled the runner-up spot 24 hours earlier, was third this time with **Super Sleuth (Ire)** (Selkirk) and had a tinge of regret afterwards. "I think if we had got rain this weekend, I might have won two Guineas," he told *PA Sport*. "She would prefer more cut in the ground, but she ran a good race in her trial and has worked very well since. I think she will go for an Oaks now and my first thought is the G1 Prix de Diane [at Chantilly June 14]."

**Over for Rainbow...**

George Strawbridge's **Rainbow View** (Dynaformer) surrendered her unbeaten record when a non-threatening fifth as the 8-11 favorite and trainer John Gosden was ruing the lack of rain. "I'm very clear in my mind she was in great form before the race and has trained on, but the only thing is she had never been on firm ground in her life," he said. "She plain hated it and Jimmy [Fortune] said after three furlongs he knew he was going to win nothing. We need to get a bit of juice in the ground and when I walked the track this morning, I shook my head but I couldn't pull her out--that would have been madness. I knew very quickly she was not traveling and it's nobody's fault--the rain didn't come and we ended up with firm ground and that was what was on offer. I was heartened by the fact that, hating the ground as she did, she still stayed on up the hill and we've got to look towards the Irish Guineas and Oaks. Dynaformer gives you stamina and the mare, who won the GI Del Mar Oaks, has produced a mile-and-a-half winner by Thunder Gulch, which indicates the stamina is there, so I think she'll get the Oaks trip. It is also the family of Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality), who had no trouble with the mile and a quarter of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The way she ran today, she's screaming out for a lot further so the [June 5] G1 Epsom Oaks is a good option, but if the ground is suitable at The Curragh, we'll take a look at that too. When we get her back on her ground, we'll see the same filly we saw last year."

Stretched out an additional 300 meters in the G2 Nikkei Sho Mar. 28, the chestnut missed by 3/4 of a length to Al Nasrain. Meiner Kitz, dismissed at 45-1 in the wagering here, edged closer with 800 meters left as he moved in tandem with Al Nasrain. After striking the lead, the longshot held off his rival's late bid to post the upset. Asakusa Kings (Jpn) (White Muzzle {Jpn}), winner of the G2 Kyoto Kinen Feb. 21 and Hanshin Daishoten S. Celebrity chef Bobby Flay registered his first graded victory as an owner when his filly Mrs Kipling rallied to her own first graded score in this event. As a juvenile in Europe last year, Mrs Kipling broke her maiden on the grass at Lingfield in June, ran fifth in the G2 Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket in July, then annexed the

Premio Divino Amore Tattersalls S. at Rome in mid-September. She returned to Britain to fill the trifecta in the G3 Cornwallis S. Oct. 11 before being sent through the Tattersalls December Sale, where bloodstock agent Anthony Penfold signed the ticket on Flay's behalf for

165,000gns (\$258,385). In her first U.S. start for trainer Neil Drysdale, who helped select the filly for Flay, Mrs Kipling finished a good second in the GII Providencia S. at Santa Anita Apr. 4. Sent off the tepid 2-1 choice here, the bay saved ground around the first turn as the dueling leaders cut out splits of :22 4/5 and :45 1/4. Jockey David Flores was motionless aboard Mrs Kipling as they tipped five wide into the lane, but once asked the question at the eighth pole, she opened up at will over over 35-1 longshot Candilejas. **Cont. p5**

## in sharper focus.

When it comes to yesterday's GIII Seniorita S. heroine **Mrs Kipling (Ire)**, one buyer's loss was Bobby Flay's gain. "Last December, I was opening up a Bobby's Burger Palace in Monmouth, and Barry [Weisbord, friend and *TDN* publisher] was at Tattersalls," Flay explains. "He was talking with Neil Drysdale, who had picked out a filly with Mr. Penfold for another client. As it turns out, the client said, 'I might not get there, and if I don't, don't buy the horse.' So Barry called me and had me look at videos of the filly's races." Drysdale's client never did show up, and Mrs Kipling, already a stakes winner and group placed, was Flay's.

Asked about what he liked about her, Flay said, "The sire was new and hot, and he looked to be getting some quality progeny. Plus one of the things we liked about watching the replays was that there was a possibility the filly could go longer. While a lot of the Exceed and Excels are better going short, she seems to want more distance, which is great."

The one-mile Providencia was Mrs Kipling's first start around two turns, and the style in which she won yesterday's Seniorita gave the impression additional ground wouldn't be a problem.

"Neil said to me that he thought she could definitely get nine furlongs, and maybe even 10," said Flay, who added the May 31 GII Honeymoon BC H. over nine furlongs was an option. "That'll be up to him. The good thing is that she relaxes really well. Even in the mornings, he says she's not headstrong at all."

Flay is coming off a busy weekend at Churchill Downs, where he acted as the official Kentucky Derby party host. Asked how his Derby experience went, he laughed and said, "Well, I didn't have the winner."

Breaking through on debut at Dusseldorf last July, Glad Panther hit the board in the Sept. 2 Listed Kronimus-Rennen at Baden-Baden and came back this term to run third in a conditions event at Cologne last time Apr. 5. Settled off the pace in fifth here, he made headway in the straight to challenge at the distance and was driven out in the closing stages to deny the renewed effort of tenacious pacesetter Saphir. "Glad Panther demonstrated his ability to accelerate well in this race, just like he shows us at home in his fast work," said winning trainer Uwe Ostmann. "He came down the middle of the track like a train and got the victory inside the final furlong. still going." Woolley added that he felt the colt's 50-1 price didn't reflect what his charge had previously accomplished. "It's truly an honor to be a part of it, but I'm telling you guys that this horse never got nearly enough credit for his ability," he said. "You

earned your way here. It's not like we just paid him in here and brought him. The horse earned his way here and he deserved a chance to run in the Derby. He was doing super, the horse was training good and we just felt like he had earned his spot here and we had to come and take 'em on. He anted up, I'm telling you. He'll leave it on the track every time."

**Baffert Offers Congratulations...**

Newly announced Hall of Famer Bob Baffert was among those who made their way over to congratulate the connections of Mine That Bird. Baffert, trainer of Derby runner-up Pioneerof the Nile (Empire Maker), asked upon arrival, "Where's that cowboy who beat me?" Baffert gave a hearty handshake to Calvin Borel and told the Cajun jockey that he had earned himself a spot in the Hall of Fame with his weekend exploits. Borel completed the Oaks/Derby double, winning the former on Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro). "He's the only one who could have pulled that off," Baffert said of Borel's ride in the Derby. "What he did was just incredible. He won that race. He sat back there and I watched the replay--he's last at the three-eighths pole. You just don't do that. He wove his way through there, and everybody knows that the rail's the place to be, but everybody gets off of it. I think he deserves a lot of credit, but that guy that trained him [Woolley], he did a great job with this horse. This horse was ready, and he trained him, and even though he vanned him here and it was like "Casey's Shadow," they got here and they won the biggest race."

**The March Toward Maryland...**

It wasn't immediately clear if Mine That Bird would move on to the second leg of the Triple Crown, the GI Preakness S. at Pimlico May 16, or instead wait for the 1 1/2-mile GI Belmont S. June 6. "We'll decide that today or tomorrow," Chip Woolley said. "Me and the owners will meet and have a little discussion. It really wasn't something that was on our radar, so we'll decide on it. We were looking to run the horse farther anyway, so we'll just have to see what it brings today. You've got to do what's best for the horse, and the horse comes first. So we'll just see what happens." At least one of the owners, however, was certainly looking forward to making the trip to Maryland. "This horse is doing good and [if he] comes off this race good, you bet we'll run," said Mark Allen. "But he's going to have to tell us."

The last time the Derby winner missed the Preakness was 1996, when Mine That Bird's grandsire Grindstone emerged from the his Derby victory with a career-ending injury. Before that, the connections of Spend a Buck (Buckaroo) opted for the Jersey Derby in 1985.

The only Derby horse currently a definite for the Preakness is Derby fourth **Papa Clem** (Smart Strike). Trainer Gary Stute said he would ship to Pimlico next Wednesday, May 13.

"I looked at the charts this morning, and I was only beaten a nose and a head for second," Stute said. "To be honest, Baffert's horse [Pioneerof the Nile] came over and bumped me. If it were a normal race there might have been an inquiry. With any luck we could have been second."

Stute's father Mel trained 1986 Preakness winner Snow Chief, who finished 11th in the Derby as the 2-1 favorite.

"Preakness day was the happiest day of my life," added Stute. "Snow Chief ran so badly in the Kentucky Derby, and we could never figure out why. The Preakness provided a little bit of redemption. It was a special day."

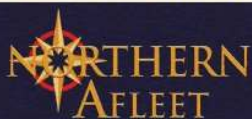

### Pletcher Runners Looking Ahead

Trainer Todd Pletcher reported his three Kentucky Derby runners came out of Saturday's race with some minor nicks and scraps, but nothing major. Pletcher's **Join in the Dance** (Sky Mesa) was seventh, **Dunkirk** (Unbridled's Song) was 11th and **Advice** (Chapel Royal) was 13th. "Dunkirk took the worst of it," Pletcher said. "He's got his share of nicks and cuts and he also grabbed a quarter on his left hind. I think someone had to do it to him during the running. Where it is, it isn't likely he did it to himself." The GI Florida Derby runner-up had an adventurous trip, according to Pletcher. "He stumbled coming away from there...stumbled for several jumps just after they got running...then got caught in some of the jostling you always get in this race going through the stretch the first time. Add in the fact the track was just what we didn't want it to be--drying and heavy--and it never allowed him to get a real grip on it. He just never got a chance to get in a rhythm." Dunkirk will ship to New York and his next start is up in the air. Join in the Dance may come back in the Preakness. That may also be the next start for stablemate **Take the Points** (Even the Score), who skipped the Derby.

### General Quarters to Regroup

Owner/trainer Tom McCarthy will skip the Preakness with Kentucky Derby 10th-place finisher **General Quarters** (Sky Mesa). "The only excuse I can find for him was that he was not getting over the ground good," McCarthy said yesterday. "I think we will go ahead and regroup and see what direction to go in. The [June 13] Northern Dancer [at Churchill] is a possibility." McCarthy admitted he was disappointed with his colt's effort Saturday. "He just wasn't striding out like he usually does and one thing I learned yesterday is that I will keep him off wet tracks. He is better than what he showed yesterday."

### Mine That Bird Team Hand Out Roses...

Churchill Downs was dark for racing yesterday, but fans who ventured out to the Louisville venue Sunday got a surprise from Mine That Bird's connections. Trainer Chip Woolley Jr. suggested Sunday morning that the mantle of roses worn by Mine That Bird in the Kentucky Derby winner's circle be placed on the new sculpture of 2006 Derby winner Barbaro, located at Churchill Downs' Gate 1 entrance. Woolley, along with co-owner Mark Allen, then gave the nearly 400 "Freedom Roses" that make up the garland to Derby fans who were visiting the Barbaro Memorial, handing out the roses to fans one-by-one. "This is a tribute to a great horse," Woolley said. "I wanted everyone to have a little piece of the Derby. We wanted to give something back to the game. We just want to show how important horses really are. That's what this is all about. We want people to know just how important these horses really are to us. They're not just animals, they're a part of us." Woolley and Allen also posed for photos, signed autographs, and greeted fans in front of the Barbaro Memorial for more than an hour and a half until each rose from the garland had been handed out.

## What They Said After the Derby - Trainers

**Bob Baffert (Pioneerof the Nile, second):** "Those cowboys, they came with a good horse."

**Derek Ryan (Musket Man, third):** "He got hung out so wide, but he was still coming at the end. I was really proud of him the way he ran today. He got bumped around, but that's the Derby."

**Jerry Hollendorfer (Chocolate Candy, fifth):** "I don't think we had the best of trips--far back, down inside and catching all the mud. But I had him ready to run, I'm pleased to have been able to run in this race and I have no real excuses."

**Tim Ice (Summer Bird, sixth):** "Looks like he came back fine. I'll know more when I get back to the barn. He ran good for a horse with just four starts. He finished sixth, which I thought was a great effort."

**Todd Pletcher (Join in the Dance seventh, Dunkirk 11, Advice 13th):** "I was really proud of Join in the Dance. He took them as far as he could and he was hanging in there. Turning for home I loved seeing him still up there. He ran great. Dunkirk stumbled two strides out of the gate, then again before they went 50 yards. When a horse does that, you know you're in trouble. I salute Calvin [Borel] for his terrific ride. It's an amazing story. It just shows you how special this race is. Anything can happen."

**Rick Mettee, assistant to Godolphin trainer Saeed Bin Suroor (Regal Ransom, eighth and Desert Party 14th):** "Both have a few minor little nicks and scrapes but nothing unexpected in a 20-horse race in the mud. We can't use that as an excuse for either one of them. I think Regal Ransom probably ran his race considering it was 10 furlongs and the pace scenario. He did have to be asked a little earlier than we thought. Alan [Garcia] had to shake him at the five-eighths pole. It's a little odd. We thought he would run on a little bit more than that, but he still battled all the way into the stretch. He was still there at the three-sixteenths pole fighting away. And he probably finished where he figured to. He ran pretty well. I think he ran his race. We really can't offer [Desert Party] much excuse. Given the post draw he really pulled a pretty good trip. He was laying about where we thought he would be and for whatever reason midway around the turn he couldn't run with them anymore, which was surprising and a little disappointing."

**Tom McCarthy (General Quarters, 10th):** "I didn't think much of the performance to tell you the truth. He didn't show who he was. He came back to the barn choking in mud. One eye was completely packed shut and his one nostril was completely shut with mud. He coughed twice and it popped out after he got back to the barn."

**Bill Mott (Hold Me Back, 12th):** "He [Kent Desormeaux] just said he put him in position and he was empty at the three-eighths pole. He was negotiating traffic and he thought that's where he should be. He said when he asked him, he jumped into the bridle. Then he flattened out with three furlongs to go."

**Eoin Harty (Mr. Hot Stuff, 15th):** "No thoughts. He didn't run any good."

**Nick Zito (Nowhere to Hide, 17th):** "I'm happy for Birdstone. God bless Calvin Borel, what an ambassador of the game. God bless the trainer, [Chip] Woolley, and God bless Birdstone. What a game this is. It proves that you never, ever know."

**D. Wayne Lukas (Flying Private, 19th):** "He's fine. All I can put my finger on is that he didn't handle the track."

## What They Said After the Derby - Jockeys

**Garrett Gomez (Pioneerof the Nile, second):** "Everyone's question mark was the dirt racetrack. He was able to leave the gate good, get me in really good position. The pace wasn't extremely fast but was honest. When I asked him turning for home, he gave me some and stayed on. The horse on the rail was a flash, but [my] horse held on well and, two weeks from now, we have the Preakness. I thought I was sitting on the winner when turning for home. He was pulling and traveling well. I haven't had a trip like that in the Kentucky Derby yet. He pulled to the quarter pole, and it was a nice feeling. Like I said, when I turned for home, I thought I was going to win my first Derby."

**Eibar Coa (Musket Man, third):** "I was forced to go wide coming into the stretch. My horse was still running at the end, but I got bumped near the finish, and I know that cost me second because that other horse [Pioneerof the Nile] only beat me a nose."

**Rafael Bejarano (Papa Clem, fourth):** "I can't believe it. I was in perfect position and sitting comfortable. He was moving so smooth, and I thought I was going to win the race. I really did. He was still running all the way to the wire, but the winner, he was fantastic when he passed me in the stretch."

**Mike Smith (Chocolate Candy, fifth):** "Turning for home, I thought I was going to win it. Then he just hung. He got hot behind the gate on me. That didn't help. But he ran great."

**Chris Rosier (Summer Bird, sixth):** "It went good. I thought my horse ran well. The crowd got to him a little but he ran a good race."

**Chris DeCarlo (Join in the Dance, seventh):** "I probably went a little too quick the first part, but they weren't going to give me an easy lead, then he ran as far as he could."

**Alan Garcia (Regal Ransom, eighth):** "He ran his race and tried hard. He had a good, clean trip."

**Stewart Elliott (West Side Bernie, ninth):** "I had a good trip. My horse got [pushed] back in the race, and I left him too much to do at the end. He came running at the end but he was just too far back."

**Julien Leparoux (General Quarters, 10th):** "He broke good but didn't show any speed today. I don't know why."

**Edgar Prado (Dunkirk, 11th):** "I sat right behind the speed, and I thought he was going to be good right there, but when I asked him to go I didn't have much horse left. He stumbled twice. He broke and the second jump he stumbled. It might have cost a little position, but not much really. He was doing good until he passed the half-mile to the three-eighths pole, and after that I just ran out of horse."

**Kent Desormeaux (Hold Me Back, 12th):** "My horse was more tired than he should have been and maybe he was struggling over the ground."

**Rene Douglas (Advice, 13th):** "Actually, I had a great trip. I thought I had a lot of horse around the three-eighths pole and then the horse next to me [Dunkirk] stepped on my horse and he lost all momentum right there. If that hadn't happened, I'm not saying I was going to win, but I would've been in contention with the other horses."

**Ramon Dominguez (Desert Party, 14th):** "I was having a good trip. I was following Pioneerof the Nile on the outside, but I found myself with no horse at the five-eighths pole."

**Gabriel Saez (Friesan Fire, 18th):** "He got a bad start and got hit [in his left front]. I feel that he didn't want to go, so I let him relax and finish the race. I didn't want to hurt the horse. I just dropped the reins and let him gallop. He came back OK."



## Triple Threats

### *Quality Road Gallops; Belmont a Possibility...*

Ned Evans homebred **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality), one of the favorites for Saturday's Kentucky Derby before battles with quarter cracks precluded his participation, galloped a mile and a quarter in the slop yesterday at Belmont Park and remains a possibility for the GI Belmont S. June 6, but "everything will have to go perfectly," said trainer Jimmy Jerkens.

Horseman and handicappers were still a bit incredulous a day after witnessing Mine That Bird (Birdstone) spring one of the most improbable upsets in GI

Kentucky Derby history, and Jerkens was among the former group. "It was ... weird," Jerkens said Sunday. "I can't imagine Quality Road would back up like the rest of them did. But I'm sure Larry Jones [trainer of Friesan Fire] and Todd Pletcher [Dunkirk] couldn't imagine their horses wouldn't pick up their feet, either. I can't understand so many horses backing up like that. That horse who won is no slouch, don't get me wrong. I saw him in California when I was there for the Breeders' Cup with Zaftig [Gone West]. They sent him to [Hall of Fame trainer Richard] Mandella, and I remember him being really small."

### *Peter Pan Takes Shape...*

Belmont's GII Peter Pan S. has often been a stepping stone to victory in the GI Belmont S., with Coastal (1979), Danzig Connection (1986) and A.P. Indy (1992) registering the double in past years. The field for Saturday's renewal could yield a few more Belmont hopefuls. Expected to compete are WinStar Fam's **Al Khali** (Medaglia d'Oro), the former Peruvian-based runner who captured a Gulfstream Park allowance Mar. 6 before a distant eighth-place finish in the GII Illinois Derby Apr. 4; GII Futurity S. winner **Charitable Man** (Lemon Drop Kid), who returned from injury to be seventh in the GI Blue Grass S. Apr. 11; MGSP Hello Broadway (Broken Vow), who got back on track with a Keeneland allowance win Apr. 10; **Imperial Council** (Empire Maker), fifth in the GI Wood Memorial S. Apr. 4; **Scorewithcarter** (Even the Score), who beat Derby hero Mine That Bird (Birdstone) in the Borderland Derby Feb. 28 before running third to Kelly Leak (Runaway Groom) (with Mine That Bird fourth) in the Sunland Derby Mar. 29; and **Stately Character** (Pleasant Tap), fourth in the GI Florida Derby in his latest.



## Classic Corner

### **STARS TO EPSOM**

Epsom's G1 Derby was confirmed as the next port of call for Christopher Tsui's G1 2000 Guineas hero **Sea the Stars (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) as connections took stock yesterday. Following his 1 1/2-length success in Saturday's Newmarket Classic, the homebred will tackle the extra half mile of the June 6 Blue Riband, according to trainer John Oxx. "We have discussed it and the Derby is the plan," Oxx told *PA Sport*. "When things calm down, we will talk about it again, but I see no reason to change. There is a question about stamina, as there is within any Guineas winner going to the Derby. The horse is in good form. He was fresh and well after the race. He ate all his feed and didn't seem to know that he had a race."

### *Ascot Favored for Delegator...*

Trainer Brian Meehan yesterday hinted that Royal Ascot would be next in the agenda for Poilin Good's G1 2000 Guineas runner-up **Delegator (GB)** (Dansili {GB}). Having reported the homebred to have emerged from Saturday's contest without any complications, the Manton-based conditioner was looking ahead to immediate targets. "He has come out of the race in very good shape--he was fine this morning and went for a walk," Meehan told *PA Sport*. "I will have a proper talk to the owner next week, as they had a bit of a mixed day yesterday. My instinct is to go to Ascot now [for the June 16 G1 St James's Palace S.] and not go to Ireland [for the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 23], but we'll just have to see how he is."

### *Shanakill to be Tested...*

Mogeely Stud and Mark Gittins's G1 2000 Guineas flop **Lord Shanakill** (Speightstown) will undergo a series of tests as connections attempt to unearth the reason for his no-show on Saturday. Last year's G2 Mill Reef S. scorer and G1 Dewhurst S. runner-up put in an uncharacteristically lacklustre effort when 12th in the Newmarket Classic and trainer Karl Burke told *PA Sport*, "He seems fine. He ate up okay last night--his temperature is normal--but obviously he ran a very flat race and it was disappointing. With the benefit of hindsight, we probably rushed his preparation after having that setback and he hasn't fully recovered from it. We will take a few tests on Monday. He is certainly sound, but he ran no race whatsoever. Last year, apart from the obvious talent he's got, he was always tough and consistent. He showed none of the three on Saturday."

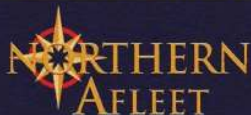
