ling failed to stir the Bois de Boulogne, and **Never on Sunday (Fr)** (Sunday Break {Jpn}) profited from her uncharacteristic flop. There is no stopping Jean-Claude Rouget and Christophe-

Patrice Lemaire at present, and the combination struck again here with the 9-1 shot, who was expected to play only a small part in this contest. Fifth on his seasonal bow in the 10-furlong G2 Prix d'Harcourt over this circuit Apr. 5, the grey made his move from rear up the rail in the straight and overhauled **Gris de Gris (Ire)** (Slickly {Fr}) inside the final furlong en route to a length success. Prix d'Ispahan cont.

Never on Sunday steadily climbed the ranks last term, following a hard-fought win in the Listed Prix Ridgway at Chantilly in July with another game effort when besting Russian Cross (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) by a neck while in receipt of five pounds in the G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange over 10 furlongs here in September. His subsequent outing when fifth in the d'Harcourt last time left him with a lot of ground to make up on the principles here, but he took full advantage of their below-par performances to register a career best. Switched off with only one behind throughout the early stages, he was allowed to creep up the fence after the final turn and, after rolling by Gris de Gris with 150 yards remaining, was ridden out with hands and heels to secure the prize. "This horse is the real deal," Jean-Claude Rouget commented. "He has never ran a bad race and goes on any type of ground. He is entered in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. [at Royal Ascot June 17] and, all being well, I have the intention of taking him there." Connections of Goldikova, who was eased by Olivier Peslier when beaten at the furlong marker, were dumbfounded. "There is absolutely no explanation," the Wertheimer brothers' racing manager Pierre-Yves Bureau said. "She looked beautiful before the race and had been training well, so we don't know why she ran so badly. All we can do is take her home and check that nothing is wrong and go again from there."

Fresh from saddling the one-two in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches last Sunday, Jean-Claude Rouget presaged the stable's G1 Prix d'Ispahan glory by unleashing a new star at Longchamp. Nurtured in the provinces, the Salon-de-Provence and Toulouse scorer Stacelita emerged from the minor leagues in the Listed Prix Rose de Mai, and demonstrated with a four-length win in that Mar. 14 Saint-Cloud contest, that she was a force to be reckoned with. Soon in front here, the bay was remorseless on the lead and ground her rivals into submission late. After jockey Christophe- Patrice Lemaire looked over his shoulder at the furlong pole, she was allowed to ease to an emphatic success. "It is a nice result, but one to take with caution as she loved the ground, and the distance between horses doesn't necessarily mean that much," said the Pau-based conditioner, who was celebrating his fourth success in this event in the last six years. "Nevertheless, she has class and we can still dream, so we will head to the G1 Prix de Diane [at Chantilly June 14]." A two-time group winner in his native Brazil, Gloria de Campeao had raced exclusively in the United Arab Emirates since January 2008, apart from a brief excursion to France. Fourth and fifth, respectively, in the first two rounds of the G3 Al Maktoum Challenge to commence his 2009 campaign, he was dropped into handicap company Feb. 26, and the bay responded with a 4 1/4-length victory. Ambitiously placed in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 28, the bay found a way to pick up the pieces and finish second, 14 lengths behind winner Well Armed (Tiznow). Gloria de Campeao's connections, undeterred by his 0-for-eight record in group competition outside Brazil, decided to take a shot here as their hopeful made his first start on turf since an eighth in the G2 Prix Dollar at Longchamp last October.

After pressing defending champion Jay Peg (Camden Park) in the two path through the first 1000 meters, the longshot took over the pacesetter abruptly capitulated, then

kicked clear of the stalkers entering the straight. G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup winner Presvis quickly cut into the margin after angling outside, but the wire arrived just in time for

the Brazilian. "I think the track suited him--he's very used to similar small circuits and he loves the heat, being from Brazil," said winning trainer Pascal Bary. "I knew we had the race won at the 100 meters. He was going too well, and even when Presvis came [at him], I knew it was too late."

While his charge proved gallant in defeat, Presvis' rider Ryan Moore lamented his trip after the runner-up finish. "There were a lot of horses coming back at me and I couldn't get out when I needed to," said Moore. Luca Cumani, trainer of Presvis, said the gelding would now go for a spell before embarking on another campaign toward the end of the year. "We'll look at taking him to the Breeders' Cup in America before heading back to Hong Kong in December," said Cumani. "After that we'll head back to Dubai before another shot at Hong Kong and then return here."

According to trainer Herman Brown, Jay Peg, who crossed the wire in 12th, will be retired to stud following the lackluster effort. "I have to wait and see what the vet says, but [jockey] Anton [Marcus] said he felt the horse wobble at the 1000 meter," Brown said of the 2008 G1 Dubai Duty Free S. winner. "I don't think he hurt himself, but he's just been losing too much electrolytes in the last couple of days. He's been very difficult to manage as he would not settle at all. He's ready for stud duties."

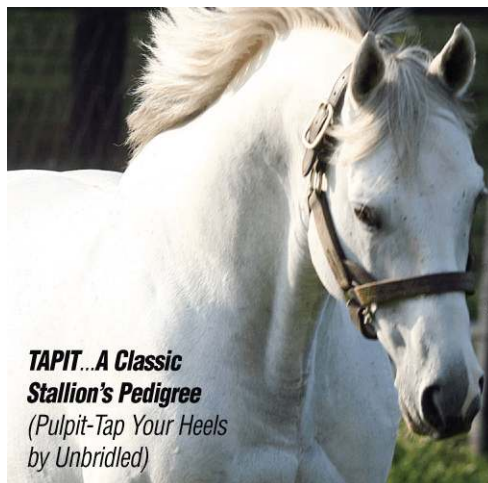

Americain was promoted to first in the Listed Prix de l'Avre over 1 1/2 miles here last May, but was out of his depth in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris over the same track and trip on Bastille Day. Second in the Listed Prix Michel Houyvet on his first try at a marathon trip at Deauville in August, the homebred was disqualified from first to second in the G3 Prix de Lutece at this venue the following month. Second and then fourth behind Pointilliste in the Apr. 6 Listed Prix Right Royal at Maisons-Laffitte and G3 Prix de Barbeville over this course and distance Apr. 26, he found extra to reverse placings with that rival this time. Settled in second early, the bay gained the advantage a furlong out and held on late. "I think the change in tactics was a big factor here, as we rode him closer to the pace and it made the difference," the owner/breeders' racing manager Pierre-Yves Bureau said. "After his last win in Hong Kong, I thought I had him back," said trainer Ricky Yiu. "He was taking time to hit his form, but he was back to his old self last time. He travelled over here so well and was so relaxed. I was always confident of him running very well." Looking ahead, Yiu added, "There is a possibility he could go to England for Royal Ascot. 

"My horse will be much more suited to the Belmont--big wide track, big wide sweeping turns," said Woolley. "It should play a little better to my horse. It'll probably be a shorter field, which eliminates some of the traffic. We're excited about going. As long as he's good the next couple days, like he looks [Sunday] morning, that'll be the plan." Woolley also confirmed Sunday that jockey Mike Smith would be back in the saddle for the Belmont, ending speculation about who would ride the GI Kentucky Derby winner should Rachel Alexandra bypass the 1 1/2-mile Classic. Rough Trip for General Quarters...

General Quarters (Sky Mesa), who came home in ninth in last Saturday's Preakness, enjoyed a quiet morning Sunday and was scheduled to ship back to Churchill Downs today, according to trainer Tom McCarthy. "He came out of it real well, but somebody went down the side of his [left front] leg," said the 75-year-old retired high school principal. "It didn't go deep; it just took the hair off. We got hit on the other side also, and that was just a little deeper. I think it happened when he hit the top of the stretch." McCarthy indicated that he will give General Quarters some time off before pointing toward the GII Indiana Derby in October. "I'm going to look for something that will be a little easier," he said. "We've been going against the best horses in America. I just want to back off a little bit and let him regroup, and get a confidence builder."

Sonbol took a moment after the win to talk about how the three-year-old was named. After putting up \$800,000 at the 2007 Keeneland September sale, owner Ahmed Zayat and his racing manager wanted to find a name as special as the royally bred colt.

Desormeaux's son Jacob came to mind. The 10-year-old suffers from the genetic disease Usher Syndrome, which affects both hearing and vision. Kent's wife, Sonia, founded the Eye On Jacob Foundation in 2008 to raise money for research to identify treatments and a cure for the degenerative condition.

"We always had high hopes for the horse, and you like to have the horses that mean something to you also mean something to somebody else," Sonbol said. "You like to give them a name that means something. At that time, we thought it would be something very nice to do for Kent Desormeaux and his family, his beautiful son. That's why we chose this name."

"We have a very good connection with Kent and we have won a lot of races together; we've always considered him as part of our team," he added. "His son is an absolute sweetheart. We wanted to do something to honor him."

The fact that Eye On Jacob proved worthy of the name came as no surprise to his connections.

“Nick Zito’s not the kind of guy who usually gets his horses cranked up for the first race--he likes to develop them down the line,” Sonbol remarked. “But we knew he had the talent to get it done first time. He’s always been a very nice horse and he’s been training forwardly. Nick has been very high on him.

“We were expecting a big effort from him today and he gave it to us, so we’re pretty excited.”

And, if his career opener is any indication, the best is yet to come.

“We expect him to get better as the races get longer,” Sonbol said “He’s got speed, but he’s the kind of horse that hopefully can carry his speed a distance of ground. It’s tough to break your maiden first time out going a mile, but obviously we think he’s a special horse.

“With his pedigree, and the amount of talent he showed today, we’d like to develop him,” he continued. “Maybe he’ll be a horse that will be nice down the line for a race like the Travers.”
