

'RACHEL', 'BIRD' GALLOP AT CHURCHILL

Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro), who last Saturday became the first filly in 85 years to beat the boys in the GI Preakness S., returned to the track yesterday morning at Churchill Downs for a routine gallop. It was her first trip to the track since her one-length score over Mine That Bird (Birdstone) in the second leg of the Triple Crown. Owned by Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stables and Harold McCormick, Rachel Alexandra is scheduled to stand in the starting gate before galloping this morning, meaning she will hit the track at about 7:15 a.m. She usually goes out with trainer Steve Asmussen's second set at 6:15 a.m. Mine That Bird galloped 1 1/2 miles in his second trip to the track since his effort at Pimlico, which won over many racing aficionados. Exercise rider Charlie Figueoa was in the irons as the gelding completed his work with good energy. "The horse is just doing super--he's on his game," commented trainer Bennie "Chip" Woolley Jr. "We're really surprised that he's as fresh as he is after two good, hard races. The fortunate thing for us is he only runs three-eighths of a mile, so he doesn't use himself as hard as a lot of horses. So we're pretty happy where we're at." Woolley sees a change even relative to his Tuesday gallop. "Today he was really froggy out there, wanting to buck and play," the conditioner explained. "And that's kind of unlike him, because he's more of a laid-back kind of horse." Woolley said that Mine That Bird would work early next week, and also said that a decision on a jockey for the Belmont would be deferred to next week as well. Calvin Borel rode Mine That Bird to his GI Kentucky Derby upset, but was aboard Rachel Alexandra in the Preakness. Mike Smith, who rode the Sovereign Award winner last weekend, has a prior commitment June 6 which will preclude his participation in the Belmont.

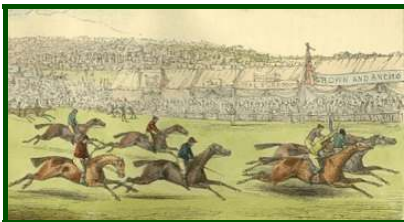

Mirroring Rebelline's early career, **Recharge** shed his maiden status in his first attempt at Killarney last August before suffering defeat behind subsequent G1 2000 Guineas winner Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) when fourth on his stakes debut in the Sept. 28 G2 Beresford S. at The Curragh. Rebelline incurred her stakes defeat in the Listed Eyrefield S. at Leopardstown. Both dam and son returned in their sophomore year to claim victory in a Leopardstown Guineas trial and, in Recharge's case, it was the Mar. 29 G3 Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial last time. "Obviously, I'm hoping he can win and he has as good a chance as any," commented Prendergast. "He has beaten the winner of the [G1] Dewhurst S. [Intense Focus] and he was only just chinned in the Beresford S. last year. The winner of that went on and won the Guineas, but I'm just hoping the ground stays dry. He is a smart horse and, in time, I'd say a mile and a half will be no problem for him. We'll get the Guineas out of the way first, but he won well at Leopardstown and is in good shape."

GHANAATI ON CORONATION TRAIL

Connections of the G1 1000 Guineas winner **Ghanaati** (Giant's Causeway) were yesterday looking ahead to the June 19 G1 Coronation S. after ruling out a tilt at the June 5 G1 Epsom Oaks. With the 1 1/2-mile Classic now off the agenda, the Shadwell homebred will be heading to Royal Ascot for the one-mile contest. "I saw her last night and she looks fabulous--good in her skin and coat," Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Racing Manager Angus Gold commented. "They haven't done anything in particular with her; she's just been cantering every day and she's put back all her weight. Barry [Hills] and the team are very happy with her, so we'll just hopefully progress her towards Royal Ascot. I think Sheikh Hamdan felt he would rather stay at a mile for the moment than step straight up to a mile and a half. I have no doubt in my mind--and I know Barry doesn't--that she will definitely get a mile and a quarter and maybe further, but she had the class and speed to win a Guineas, so we thought we'd try a mile one more time in the summer fillies' championship and see what happens afterwards."

CONDUIT BACK AT SANDOWN Conduit (Ire)

(Dalakhani {Ire}) is due to make his comeback in next Friday's G3 Brigadier Gerard S. at Sandown, trainer Sir Michael Stoute announced yesterday. Last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf and G1 St Leger winner is set to carry a seven-pound penalty in the extended 10-furlong contest. "We have eight days to go, but all being well Conduit will run in the Brigadier Gerard S.," Stoute told the *Racing Post*. Owned and bred by Ballymacoll Stud, Conduit was runner-up in the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot last June before taking the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood July 29. His three-length score at Doncaster last September was a prelude to his smashing victory in the Breeders' Cup, which propelled the chestnut to an Eclipse Award as the leading turf horse in the U.S. in 2008.

ASK HEADS TO CUP Patrick Fahey's Ask (GB) (Sadler's Wells) was yesterday reported on course for Epsom's G1 Coronation Cup following his success in Friday's G2 Yorkshire Cup. One of 18 remaining entries in the £225,000 June 5 contest after the latest forfeit stage, the impressive six-length winner of York's 14-furlong contest will attempt to provide trainer Sir Michael Stoute a fifth renewal. "The Coronation Cup is definitely the plan for Ask," Fahey's Racing Manager Simon Christian commented. "He has come out of his victory at York in great form, and it was nice to win a Group 2 race with him. I think the ground suited him better than some of his rivals at York, but he doesn't go on extremes like the fast ground he encountered twice last summer at Ascot. He certainly coped with the good-to-soft going last week. It was nice to start him off with an easy race. The owner and the trainer take it one step at a time, and we are concentrating on Epsom before eying any targets later in the season."

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



IMMIGRANT WORKER BILL RE-INTRODUCED

A bill in Congress could help ease the labor issues that have plagued the horse industry. Sen. Diane Feinstein (D-CA) introduced "A Bill to Improve Agricultural Job Opportunities, Benefits, and Security for Aliens in the United States," or AgJOBS (S. 1038) and Reps. Howard Berman (D-CA) and Adam Putnam (R-FL) introduced the House version of this bill (H.R. 2414).

The AgJOBS bill creates a "blue card" pilot program to legalize workers and reforms the H-2A visa program. Current undocumented agriculture workers would receive a blue card if they worked in American agriculture for at least 150 work days over the previous two years. They must continue in American agriculture for an additional three years (working a minimum of 100 days per year) before becoming eligible for a permanent legal resident green card. Among the reforms to the H-2A program are a shorter labor certification process and a secure identity and work authorization document for H-2A aliens.

This legislation is supported by the NTRA, the American Horse Council and numerous agricultural advocacy groups.

Charitable Man Confirmed for Belmont...

William K. Warren's **Charitable Man** (Lemon Drop Kid), last-out winner of the Gil Peter Pan S. May 9, is a confirmed starter in the GI Belmont S. June 6. "I spoke with Mr. Warren this afternoon, and we're running," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "The pros outweighed the cons, and there were very few cons. I have nothing but respect for Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro), if she comes, and Mine That Bird (Birdstone), but Charitable Man is doing great. He's bred to go a mile and a half, he's two-for-two on the track, and he's a fresh horse." Charitable Man's other success at Big Sandy came in the GI Futurity S. last September. In other Belmont news, WinStar Farm's **Mr. Hot Stuff** (Tiznow), considered a possible starter in the race, breezed a half-mile in a steady :49.80 over the Keeneland Polytrack yesterday morning.



Cornwell Benefit Scheduled for Sunday:

The Maryland racing community will come together Sunday afternoon at Laurel Park for a benefit event for apprentice jockey Marion Cornwell, who was diagnosed with a cancerous tumor attached to his pancreas earlier this month. A longtime exercise rider at Franklin Smith's Elloree Training Center in South Carolina, Cornwell came north about five years ago and galloped horses for Eddie Gaudet and Steve Casey at the Bowie Training Center while picking up an occasional mount. Cornwell rode his first winner in October 2007 and his last aboard Captain Zim at Pimlico Race Course Apr. 24. His only multiple win day occurred at Laurel Park Feb. 21. "You cannot find one person with a negative thing to say about this kid," said jockey agent Jay Burtis, who is helping to organize the event. "When he won his first race, the entire backstretch was cheering." Sunday's event, which takes place from 5-10 p.m. in the Laurel Dining Room, will feature food, drinks and dancing for \$15, plus a silent auction. Auction items include signed items from jockey Calvin Borel, who has captured both legs of the Triple Crown this spring, autographed boxing gloves from former world champion Sugar Ray Leonard and a breeding season to 2005 Preakness and Belmont winner Afleet Alex. "In a dog-eat-dog business, when something tragic happens like this, it is amazing how everyone rallies together," added Burtis.
