D-DAY

Delegator (GB) (Dansili {GB}) was the subject of much hype in the spring and, while he ran up to expectations when second in Newmarket's G1 2000 Guineas, he enters today's Irish equivalent at The Curragh with a point to prove. His dazzling display in the Apr. 16 G3 Craven S. over the Guineas course and distance suggested he was the one to beat in the main event, but connections had not reckoned on Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) on the first Saturday in May. "We were absolutely thrilled with his performance there and he ran a brilliant race," owner/breeder Poilin Good commented yesterday. "We were beaten by a superstar on the day. I think the ground was a big no-no for us, as it was firm and he needs a bit of print in the ground. He didn't pick up the same way as he did in the Craven, but he has come out of the race very well, and Brian [Meehan] is still pleased with him. He thinks the world of him, and the lad that rides him thinks he's an exceptional horse. The progeny from my mare like soft ground and all the family need a bit of juice in the ground, but it will be exceptional ground on Saturday, and it is not going to be suitable for any horse."

Got Soul?...

Richard Hannon, who collected this prize with his two Newmarket Guineas heroes Don't Forget Me (Ire) (Ahoonora {GB}) and Tirol (Ire) (Thatching {Ire}) in 1987 and 1990, respectively, puts forward **Soul City (Ire)** (Elusive City) this time. Successful in the Listed Prix Francois Boutin at Deauville in August and G3 Prix La Rochette at Longchamp in early September, he beat Gan Amhras (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Goffs Million here later that month before a no-show in the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket in October. He is chasing a €1-million bonus if he can complete the Goffs Million-Irish Guineas double.

RACING'S LEADING LADY RETURNS

Jerry and Ann Moss's unbeaten **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) makes her much anticipated seasonal debut in today's GII Milady H. at Hollywood. The GI Breeders' Cup Ladies Classic heroine was scratched from Churchill's GII Louisville Distaff on Derby Eve due to an off track. Trainer John Shirreffs will also saddle Pam and Martin Wygod's **Life Is Sweet** (Storm Cat), who enters riding a three-race winning streak, including the GI Santa Margarita H. last time Mar. 14. "Maybe Life Is Sweet will be quicker to accelerate," Shirreffs told *Daily Racing Form*. "Zenyatta just lengthens her stride and lowers her head. She just keeps coming. They have different styles of acceleration. They are coming into the race as well as you could hope."

“Soft ground is not a problem, as all his four wins last year came in the mud, but it is his first run back and ideally, you would have liked better going as we want the best horses to win the classics,” Hannon commented. “He broke his maiden in soft ground at Newmarket, and conditions were similar when he won at Deauville and Longchamp and also when he took the Million and, while at the end of the day there is no substitute for a prep race, our fellow is a good horse in his own right and he won’t be disgraced.”

Rain for Rayeni...

His Highness the Aga Khan’s G3 Killavullan S. winner **Rayeni (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) will relish the testing conditions prevalent at the Kildare venue as he bids to provide trainer John Oxx with a first renewal. Jockey Mick Kinane has already partnered three colts to success here, and is expecting the ground to suit. “He needs soft ground and it’s going to be just about bordering on raceable,” Kinane said. “Very few people will have encountered conditions as tough as they are going to encounter this weekend. John had prepared him for a tilt at the Guineas trial, but he had a setback and was on the easy list for a while and thankfully he has come good. I know my horse is going to handle the conditions, but we don’t know if he is a Group 1 horse.” The Curragh’s Manager Paul Hensey gave an outline of the weather forecast. “It’s been a damp, misty morning, but we’re expecting dry and bright weather over the weekend,” he said. “It’s been a very tough week, with 12mm of rain Monday, 23 Tuesday and another six Wednesday, which left an awful lot of water to soak through. Yesterday was a super day and it helped, but it’s heavy and may possibly dry to soft by Sunday.”

Trainer David Wachman looks set to saddle the favorite for this renewal after Johnny Murtagh opted to ride Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's **Again**. Closely related to Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), last year's G2 Debutante S. and G1 Moyglare Stud S. heroine should handle the testing ground. However, Wachman was wary of the prevailing footing. "I don't think these conditions suit anyone, but she won the Debutante on similar at Leopardstown in August," Wachman said. "Not having had a prep is not ideal, considering the ground is so testing, but the ground at Newmarket was too fast. I've been very happy with her all spring and we're hopeful."

Wachman also has last year's G3 C. L. Weld Park S. winner **Chintz**, Curragh maiden scorer **Love Bird** and Gowran maiden winner **Always Be True** to go to war with for the same connections. "Chintz beat **Lahaleeb** on soft in the C. L. Weld last year and is a pretty nice filly," Wachman commented. "She was a bit disappointing [when ninth] in the [Mar. 29] Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial S., but I didn't think she was firing on all cylinders when she came home, and she seems to be in good shape again now." Always Be True is a filly we liked a lot last year, but she got a setback and never got to run her and she has always worked well on soft ground. She is entitled to take her chance, as is Love Bird, who definitely likes soft ground and, with her pedigree, has to have a go." Among the notables taken out yesterday were Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Betty Maxwell Moran's G1 1000 Guineas fourth Heart Shaped (Storm Cat), which leaves Aidan O'Brien with a sole representative in Tabor, Smith and Magnier's maiden **Totally Devoted**, a 3/4-sister to Rule of Law (Kingmambo). The \$1.6-million KEESEP yearling was eighth in the May 8 G3 Derrinstown Stud 1000 Guineas Trial, where she encountered much trouble in running.

Triple Threats

Jockeys Set for Dunkirk, 'Candy in Belmont...

Daily Racing Form reported yesterday that John Velazquez will be aboard **Dunkirk** (Unbridled's Song) in the GI Belmont S. June 6, while Garrett Gomez will pilot **Chocolate Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}). Edgar Prado had ridden Dunkirk to an 11th-place finish in the GI Kentucky Derby after Gomez opted for Pioneerof the Nile (Empire Maker), who was ultimately runner-up in the May 2 Classic at Churchill Downs. "We didn't look any further other than we

were just trying to figure out what our best chance to win the Belmont was," trainer Todd Pletcher told *DRF*. "We've got a lot of history with Johnny and have had success in this particular race and success in a lot of other big races. Close call, they're all three great riders." Velazquez was in the irons when Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) earned Pletcher his first win in a Triple Crown event in the 2007 Belmont. *DRF* also reported that Gomez, who has won the last two Eclipse Awards as the nation's leading jockey, will return to Southern California on a full-time basis beginning June 7. "It's just more of an issue of him being comfortable and wanting to be there," agent Rob Anderson told *DRF*. "He's really missing his kids."

Two Step Salsa to Await Tom Fool...

Godolphin's **Two Step Salsa** (Petionville), last seen annexing the G2 Godolphin Mile Mar. 28, will point toward the GII Tom Fool H. at Belmont Park July 5. The dark bay developed a temperature upon his return to the U.S., and was never nominated to Monday's GI Met Mile. He has turned in a pair of workouts at Belmont this month, including a four-furlong breeze in :47.81 Thursday. "He's probably two breezes away from being able to run in race like the Metropolitan," assistant trainer Rick Mettee told *Daily Racing Form*. "The Tom Fool is seven-eighths, so we have plenty of time to make it."

Sara Louise Back in Training; Now With Godolphin...

Sara Louise (Malibu Moon), who handed Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) a 3 3/4-length defeat in last November's GIII Pocahontas S., was purchased privately by Godolphin following a second-place finish behind the subsequent GI Preakness S. winner in the GII Golden Rod S. Nov. 29. Formerly owned by Eldon Farm, the \$550,000 FTFEB juvenile graduate is yet to debut in the Godolphin blue. "She went to Dubai for the winter and didn't do that well," assistant trainer Rick Mettee told *Daily Racing Form* yesterday. "She actually came off the racetrack [at Belmont Park] just a few minutes ago. She's just starting to put weight back on. We don't have a particular race in mind for her. We just want to get her going good again."

WARD JUVENILES TAKE ON ASCOT

Trainer Wesley Ward knows a thing or two about training two-year-olds. Well known for getting his babies to fire fast and early, Ward--a former Eclipse Award-winning apprentice jockey--will explore a new frontier when he ships five of his recent juvenile winners to take on Europe's finest at Ascot during the Royal meeting June 16-20. The idea was conceived after receiving an invitation to run Sarah and Ken Ramsey's **Cannonball** (Catienus) at the meet. One of the possible choices for the four-year-old is the G1 King's Stand S., slated for opening day of the 2009 meet. Poised to join the dark bay on the trans-Atlantic journey is a strong group of juveniles that got off to a fast start in Kentucky earlier this spring. Ward--who hit paydirt with 27 percent of his juveniles during Keeneland's recently concluded 2009 meet--saddled winners **Aegean** (Northern Fleet), **Jealous Again** (Trippi) and **Yogaroo** (Bring the Heat). "I've won about 15 or 16 two-year-old races over here so far this year, so I think it's just a good time of year for me to be able to do what I want to do with them," said Ward, explaining the decision to send them abroad. "A lot of the horses have already won, and they handled the Polytrack at Keeneland really well. I also had them on the grass at Keeneland the other day, and they worked fantastic, so I thought, 'Why not take a chance?'" Jealous Again looked sensational romping by 11 1/4 lengths over the main track Apr. 3; Aegean added another win for the barn with a 3 1/2-length score the following afternoon; and Yogaroo, runner-up in his career bow at Gulfstream Apr. 3, got the job done in his debut on a synthetic surface Apr. 23. Aegean and Jealous Again returned to finish one-two in the GIII Kentucky Juvenile S. at Churchill Downs Apr. 30. Despite not finding their way to the winner's circle during the Lexington meet, three additional two-year-olds punched their tickets to England with subsequent victories. **Honor in Peace** (Peace Rules) was a respectable third at Keeneland Apr. 16, and returned to score by five lengths at Churchill Downs May 13; **Grand Times** (Greatness) scored by four lengths at Calder May 2 following a runner-up finish at Keeneland Apr. 16; and **Strike The Tiger** (Tiger Ridge) showed plenty of grit to win his bow by 3 3/4 lengths in the slop at the Louisville-area oval Apr. 28. Currently stabled at Keeneland in Lexington, the sextet is expected to depart for England June 4. Ward, who is expected to accompany his team to Europe to oversee their final preparations, confirmed that U.S. jockey Rene Douglas will make the trip to ride the Ward team.

"I'd say he's a different horse this season," Alston told *PA Sport*. "Whether he'll quite get back to his Nunthorpe form I don't know, but he's not so far away. I'm pretty hopeful. We've never really had him better and he's working really well." Inxile's stable is represented by **Tax Free**, who appears to have finally metamorphosed into the top sprinter he had long promised to be this term. Got steadily better last year, and very good in her last three of the campaign. Under ordinary circumstances we would have wanted to see improvement by now at four, but she's had to deal with agonizingly slow paces in all three starts, and trouble in her last. Now she'll be making her second start for McLaughlin, and first on his home turf. There's a good chance she'll improve, and the rail helps.

2 Venetian Causeway [Giant's Causeway](#) McGaughey15-1

Posted moderate figures last year, and broke through with a new top in her last. Five pounds equates to one point on the Thoro-Graph scale and more than two lengths at this distance, and this filly gets almost that much from the highweights. Shug's runners have been going well (see "Last 90 days"), but a repeat is a lot more likely than the 2-point jump Venetian Causeway would need to contend seriously.

3 Criticism (GB) [Machiavellian](#) Albertrani 9-5

Has put in the same strong figure in four of her five starts in this country, and in the other fell victim to a very hot pace for the distance. Albertrani is on fire (see "Last 90 days"), so there's no reason to think she won't throw that figure again, and she has an advantage in the way the race figures to be run. But there are a couple of fillies in here with better figures than her on their best, making her vulnerable at a short price.

4 Shadiyna (Ire) [Dubai Destination](#) Clement 12-1

Ran only moderate figures in Europe last year, then a couple of points better in her only start Stateside with the addition of Lasix. She would need to jump forward mightily to contend here and, since Clement is a layoff trainer, a big second-out jump is unlikely.

5 Mushka [Empire Maker](#) Mott 4-1

Ran a very big figure to win the Demoiselle at two, and that effort set her back for a long time. It was only 18 months later she was able to better that figure, in a huge losing effort in February concealed by a wide trip. She went back some in her next, which could have been a bounce, and could have been due to the significant trouble she encountered. Regardless, she quickly returned to her best in her last to win over Poly, earning the same huge figure she earned over grass at Gulfstream. At the weights this filly's best makes her better than Backseat Rhythm and almost five lengths better than Criticism, and with six weeks' rest and a progressive pattern, there is reason to believe she's ready for her best.

6 Russian Rosie (Ire) Traditionally Attfield 15-1

Has a history of moderate figures that leave her well short of competitive here, and there is no reason to expect an explosion.

7 Caprice (Ger) Monsun (Ger) Motion 10-1

Is a little better than Russian Rosie on her best, but worse than several others, and unlikely to improve.

8 Colina Verde (Brz) Know Heights (Ire) McLaughlin 5-1

Put in some moderate efforts in California, then ran significantly better off the layoff in her first try for McLaughlin. That effort was concealed by a wide trip, and the Thoro-Graph Race Shape shows she should clear and save ground here, so a forward move could get her a check.

BOTTOM LINE: Mushka is about even money to win this race, and she'll be considerably longer than that. Backseat Rhythm is probably the one to fear.

The standardization project was not undertaken lightly, but was a cooperative effort among the world's leading racing governing bodies--perhaps the most successful worldwide industry cooperative effort ever, and one which is revisited annually in order to ensure its accuracy and integrity. Its goal was to make International Cataloguing Standards the single most authoritative, comprehensive and accepted standards dealing with black type throughout the world. These standards were adopted by the world's leading auction houses--including, of course, Keeneland, Fasig-Tipton and all other leading international sales companies--because they accurately reflect quality. At the *TDN*, that has always been our goal as well.

We are now asking our advertisers to comply with our editorial policy and the international cataloguing standards by using the word "stakes" when they mean stakes, and "black type" when they mean black type, and only using a Grade or Group if it's a Grade or Group recognized by the International Cataloguing Standards Committee. Black Type Stakes

In 2009, for a stakes race in the U.S. or Canada to receive black type, it must:

- Have a minimum purse value of \$50,000 distributed on the day of the race;
- Close at least 72 hours prior to its running, and have a nomination fee paid by the owner of the entrant;
- Have all entries be eligible for the purse monies used to determine the minimum purse value;
- Not have restrictions other than state-bred, non-winners of a sweepstakes; sales graduates or stallions' progeny;
- Not contain preference clauses that are based on criteria unrelated to the quality of the horses.

These rules are meant to affirm that the race is of a certain high quality.

Non-Black-Type Stakes

A non-black-type stakes race is simply a race in which the prize money offered is made up at least in part of money put up by the owners of the horses entered with a total purse of less than \$50,000, or one which excludes horses from monies due to eligibility requirements. These races will not appear as black type in a catalogue page--neither in the female family, nor the sire's summary.

Graded and Group Stakes

Finally, 16 countries in the world have racing that is of sufficient quality that the country is allowed to determine its own Graded or Group stakes races, and they are accepted automatically as such in the catalogue.

They are: Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, France, Germany, Great Britain, Ireland, Italy, Japan, New Zealand, Peru, South Africa, the United Arab Emirates, and the United States of America.

Other countries' "Group" or "Graded" stakes either count as a black type race, or just a plain old win, depending upon the country, but they do not have a Grade attached to them in the catalogue. The only exceptions to this rule are 14 races annually in Hong Kong, Scandinavia, Singapore and Turkey of international quality. *In short, though, know that if it has a Grade on it in the TDN, it's a real Grade.*

Therefore, if you see an advertisement saying that a sire had a Graded or Group winner, you will know that winner and that Grade will appear in the catalogue. All other grades which will not appear in the catalogue will be referenced as such--Caribbean Champion S.-G1-Trinidad & Tobago--in the TDN.

If you see an ad which says a horse has 50 "stakes" winners, you will understand that all of those did not qualify for black type, and when you arrive on the sales grounds and open the catalogue, that number will be less than that. If the ad states that the sire has 10 black type winners, you'll know that they will all appear in the catalogue. **Cont. p14**

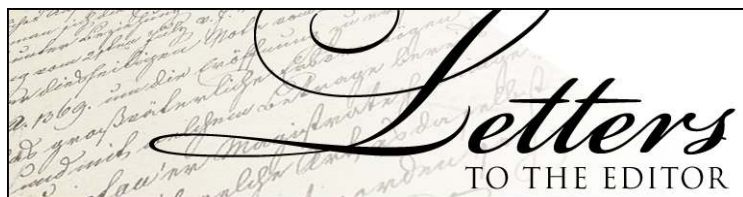


From the Publishers cont.

During my career in the Thoroughbred industry, I have had the responsibility and the honor of serving as a United States representative for several years on not only the International Cataloguing Standards Committee, but also on the International Stud Book Committee. These are two of the cornerstones of the integrity of the entire Thoroughbred breed. Through hundreds of hours of service on these committees, an appreciation is gained for the amount of effort and world-wide cooperation that goes into the cataloguing standards. They were not derived in a cavalier manner, which only adds to their credibility. As I am one of a very few people to serve on both committees, I also feel I may be one of a very few people to realize how important the decision the TDN is making to clarify for its readers exactly what a sire's achievements are, not only in its editorial content, but in its advertising content as well.

These International Cataloguing Standards are essential if the Thoroughbred breed is going to continue to maintain the level of commerce we currently enjoy worldwide; they are a building-block to world-wide commerce. I believe that in this industry, we take for granted that a registered Thoroughbred in the U.S. is accepted as such in virtually any country in the world. That acceptance was not something that was created overnight, but is, rather, the result of years and years of cooperation and of appreciation of how important it is that these standards be maintained.

Over the last few sales at Keeneland alone, we have sold horses to people from 48 different countries. Every one of the people from every one of those countries knew that they could come to Keeneland and depend on the information they were presented about the horse. They could depend upon the fact that the horse they were buying was the one Keeneland represented, and that the information about the horse's family was accurate, not exaggerated, and that they could go back to their countries and build their families and their stud book around these horses.

This trust from owners and breeders around the world is not something we can take for granted, but something which we must continually strive to maintain in order that they know they can come here and depend upon the integrity of companies like Keeneland.

That's why we are so supportive of the creation of these type of standards, why we are so committed to them, and why we will continue to follow these standards themselves.

Therefore, we wholeheartedly applaud the TDN's decision to continue to follow the black-type standards set forth by the International Cataloguing Standards Committee in their editorial content, and to ask that their advertisers do as well.

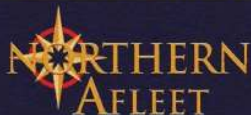

BLACK SAM BELLAMY COLT TOPS SPRING SALE

Yesterday's BBAG Spring Sale offered little in the way of fireworks, with a high rate of buy-backs the main feature, but it was a two-year-old son of Black Sam Bellamy (Ire) who shone through when selling for €46,000. Consigned by Gebruder Wiegandt, hip 67 is a half-brother to the Listed-winning and Group-placed Luttje Lage (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) and was knocked down to Gestut Ebbesloh. He fared better than his three-year-old half-sister Lautenspielerin (Ger) (Areion {Ger}), led out unsold as hip 74. Another to not meet a high reserve was Albert Steigenberger's hip 118, a two-year-old daughter of Invincible Spirit (Ire) who attracted no bids past the €100,000 mark. The top-priced colt emerged from the supplementary catalogue, as did a son of Leroidesanimaux (Brz) who kept buyers interested late in the sale. Hip 126, out of the stakes-winning Dayla (Marvin's Policy), was purchased for €25,000 by Stall One Two. Gestut Ammerland's hip 51 was another to provide a rare highlight when selling to Stall DA-LI for €22,000. By Java Gold, the May-foaled colt is a half to Daring Tiger (Ger) (Tiger Hill {Ire}), who followed a second to the top-class Irian (Ger) (Tertullian) in the G3 Dr Busch-Memorial with a win in the Listed Grosser Preis der Sparkasse Dortmund on Thursday. At the close of play, the average of €9,640 and median of €8,730 represented drops of 31 and 35 per cent respectively and BBAG's Managing Director Carola Ortlieb said, "One has to be realistic and bear in mind that horses being bought back at such a rate does affect the figures. Yet, I do think we should still try and be optimistic--after all, bad times are always followed by good times in the end." Full results can be found on www.bbag-sales.de.

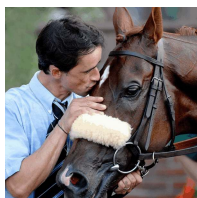
