

HOLLENDORFER CONFIDENT IN 'CANDY'

For all of his 5,000-plus victories, multiple training titles as the dominant conditioner in Northern California and a pair of GI Kentucky Oaks successes, a Triple Crown score has managed to elude Jerry Hollendorfer.

But the Ohio native, who turns 63 less than two weeks after this year's Belmont, has what he feels is his best crack in the form of the Craig Family's **Chocolate Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}).

"He ranks right up there as one of the best horses I've tried to take

into the Triple Crown," Hollendorfer said during Thursday's teleconference. "He's a beautiful-looking animal and covers a lot of ground, and I hope he validates my opinion of him on June 6."

Hollendorfer's previous journey's on the Triple Crown trail have been paved with a fair amount of bad fortune. In 1998, Golden Eagle Farm's Event of the Year (Seattle Slew) was set to become the trainer's first starter in the GI Kentucky Derby. He would have been one of the top choices in the race off his early-season form, which saw the Mabee homebred take the GIII El Camino Real Derby and the GII Jim Beam S. in dominating fashion, but Event of the Year suffered a knee fracture in his final work prior to that year's Derby and missed the race. Two years later, GII Spiral (formerly the Jim Beam) hero Globalize (Summer Squall) was kicked by a stable pony two days prior to the Derby and was eliminated from consideration. Globalize became Hollendorfer's first starter in a Classic, but a bad start compromised any chance he had in the 2000 Belmont S., and he finished 10th behind Commendable (Gone West). Eye of the Tiger (American Chance) was fifth in the 2003 Derby, the same spot occupied this year by Chocolate Candy. He shipped to Belmont soon after the Derby and has recorded three breezes, including seven furlongs in 1:27 1/5 this past Monday.

"He seems to be getting over strip very well and we've been pleased with his workouts so far," said Hollendorfer, who took the red-eye to New York for the last breeze and spent two hours in the Big Apple before heading back to the West Coast. Cont. p2

FRIESAN FIRE SIDELINED

Vinery Stables and Fox Hill Farm's leading three-year-old colt **Friesan Fire** (A.P. Indy) will be sidelined for a few months due to injury. Vinery General Manager Tom Ludt said in a statement that the bay was examined by Dr. Larry Bramlage of Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital and was found to have a stress fracture in his left front leg. In addition, there is a secondary non-displaced chip fracture in his right front fetlock. He will undergo surgery to repair the chip today. Friesan Fire, second last as the favorite in the GI Kentucky Derby, was a disappointing 10th in the GI Preakness S. May 16. "When Friesan Fire grabbed a quarter in the Kentucky Derby, we felt like he had an excuse for that race," said. "Going into the Preakness, he seemed like his old self and was training beautifully. When he turned in an uncharacteristic race that day, we became concerned." Friesan Fire was made the Derby favorite after ripping off through straight wins in graded stakes in Louisiana this spring, including the GIII Lecomte S., GIII Risen Star S. and GII Louisiana Derby. Friesan Fire, who is conditioned by Larry Jones, will rehabilitate at Vinery's Kentucky training center.

So, what would it mean to take down the Belmont, especially for a client like Jenny Craig?

"I try to do the best that I can with whatever horse I have, and I think I don't have a whole lot to prove," he stated. "Anyone would love to win a Triple Crown race, and it would certainly add to my career if I could win the Belmont. The Craigs have been loyal clients for many years, and it means a lot to train a horse like this for them."--*Alan Carasso*

Hindsight is 20-20 for McLaughlin...

In the aftermath of **Mine That Bird** (Birdstone)'s stunning 50-1 upset of the GI Kentucky Derby on the first Saturday in May, trainer Kieran McLaughlin was wishing he could do it all over again with William K. Warren

in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. in his sophomore debut Apr. 11. They did not, and McLaughlin assured the same would not likely happen if the opportunity were to arise in the future.

"I am never going to pass the Kentucky Derby again," said the conditioner, who sent out Jazil (Seeking the Gold) to win the 2006 Belmont. "It's going to take a lot more for me not to run. Charitable Man is a talented horse and a magnificent individual, and we all loved him in the barn. If we had run back, he might have won the Kentucky Derby, you never know. If I have four eligible, I am probably going to run four in the Derby if they have a chance. You have to put them in the gate, because you don't know what's going to happen."

Charitable Man, a \$200,000 Keeneland September graduate, decimated a field of Saratoga maidens by 11 lengths on debut Aug. 10 before going on to defeat a field including Friesan Fire (A.P. Indy) in the Futurity. The dark bay colt was sidelined thereafter with a saucer fracture in his left fore, and, despite McLaughlin's best efforts, he could not get Charitable Man ready for Gulfstream's three-year-old preps. In a bold move, McLaughlin ticketed his trainee for the Blue Grass, but he failed to get over the Polytrack and finished seven lengths adrift of General Quarters (Sky Mesa). In the end, it was not enough to merit a trip across Interstate 64 to Louisville.

"Mr. Warren and I were back and forth, but most importantly, we decided, 'let's do what's right by the horse,'" McLaughlin stated. "As we talked about it, running back in three weeks [in the Derby] wasn't best, and we thought if we were patient, maybe we'd get rewarded later in a race like the Belmont or the Travers later on. I didn't have to twist [Mr. Warren's] arm."

McLaughlin's faith in his charge was validated when he came from just off the pace to account for Imperial Council (Empire Maker) in the GI Peter Pan S. May 9. His sire was third as the favorite in the 1999 running of that prep before upsetting the Belmont and the Triple Crown aspirations of Charismatic (Summer Squall), at 29-1 in the Belmont. Charitable Man should have no problem with the 12-furlong distance of the Classic, says McLaughlin.

"He's bred to do it. He's a big, scopey horse who stands over a lot of ground and has the right running style to get the mile and a half," he explained. "You have to be forwardly placed most of the time, but it's also the competition and how the race shapes up for each horse. We have a lot of pluses on our side."

In sizing up the potential competition a week from tomorrow, McLaughlin likes his chances.

"Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) is a superstar, and it was a great day for our industry for them to run first and second [in the Preakness]. I think the filly had to run a hard race that day and I think it would be tough for her to win the Belmont going mile and a half. If they do run, you have to respect her. I have respect for Mine That Bird's Triple Crown races, but I wouldn't change places with anyone."

Charitable Man is scheduled for his final major workout Saturday morning.

"He's training great, eating well, and is going into Belmont as well as he was going into in the Peter Pan," McLaughlin added. --*Alan Carasso*

Alpine Rose hit the board in both the G3 Prix Minerve at Deauville and the Listed Prix Joubert here last term and closed her account for the His Highness The Aga Khan and Jean-Claude Rouget partnership with a fifth in the Nov. 11 G3 Prix Fille de l'Air at Toulouse. She changed ownership for a sales-topping €550,000 at Arqana's December sale and ran third for new connections in a hot conditions event at this track last time May 6. The eventual winner raced a shade keenly in second and settled into a rhythm before taking over at halfway. Pushed along as the pack loomed large with 450 meters remaining, she stumbled slightly entering the final eighth, but was soon back on an even keel and kept on well in the latter stages to hold on in cozy fashion for a career high. "I've only trained her this year after she was bought at the [Arqana] December Sale," commented trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre. "I think she is very good and was happy with her first run this year where she was third to two very good horses Ideal World (Kingmambo) and Full of Gold (Fr) (Gold Away {Ire}). I told [jockey] Gerald Mosse not to fight her and to let her go on if she was too keen, so he rode the perfect race. Now that she's a Group 2 winner we have to consider a Group 1, so she may come back here in the [June 28 G1] Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud." **Click for Racing Post chart. 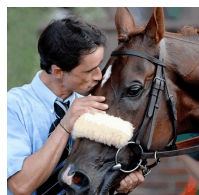

While all the focus was on the impressive G3 Sagaro S. winner Patkai beforehand, his odds of 1-2 were made to look far off the mark as veteran stayer Geordieland gave his younger rival a stern lesson here. While not short on class, the eight-year-old is short on wins, and his G2 Yorkshire Cup success last May was a significant highlight. Subsequently runner-up for the second consecutive year to Yeats (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot the next month, the grey signed off with a fifth in the G3 Geoffrey Free S. at Newbury in August. Traveling with his customary elan in rear while tracking his main market rival, Geordieland was unleashed as Ryan Moore sent Patkai to the front with a quarter mile remaining. Reeling in that rival a furlong later, he stayed on strongly up the hill to clinch this highlight. "It wasn't a soft race with the Ascot Gold Cup favorite in there and although beforehand, they were all saying he was the battler and we were the lightweight, no one can now question this horse's resolution," trainer Jamie Osborne commented. "Shane [Kelly] felt he put his head down and gave his all and his work had been different this year. He's been killing horses at home and is happier--he only had three runs last year and had a great winter off. His preparation has been superb with no hitches." Returning GI Breeders' Cup Turf and G1 St Leger hero Conduit was the chief attraction here, but his seven-pound penalty proved too much of a burden as Cima de Triomphe swooped late to deny him in a thriller. Successful for the Bruno Grizzetti stable in the G1 Derby Italiano at the Capannelle last May, the winner failed to land a blow in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp in July, but was in front of the likes of Meisho Samson (Jpn) (Opera House {GB}), Kamsin (Ger) (Samum {Ger}) and Papal Bull (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) when ninth in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe back there in October. Disappointing when trailing in the G1 Premio Roma in November, he shaped with promise when sixth in the G1 Prix Ganay back at Longchamp on his bow for new connections last time Apr. 26. Gambled from an early 12-1 into 4-1 here, the grey was settled behind the generous early pace by the visiting Christophe-Patrice Lemaire and looked booked for a place only as Ryan Moore took Conduit past the tiring Pipedreamer (GB) (Selkirk) at the head of affairs with 100 yards remaining. Gathering steam on the uphill climb, he had his head bobbed where it mattered to inch the contest.

"He's a lovely horse and they went too slowly in France last time," trainer Luca Cumani commented. "Today was a truly run race and Christophe was patient, but my first impression is that he may be better over a mile and a half than a mile and a quarter. It will be either the G1 Prince of Wales's S. [at Royal Ascot June 17], [June 28] G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud or G2 Hardwicke S. [at Royal Ascot June 20], so we have plenty of options. We were receiving seven pounds, so probably the best horse didn't win tonight, but I hope that as I get to know the horse he will improve. He's an absolute joy to train and very well-behaved." Conduit's trainer Sir Michael Stoute told *PA Sport*, "The others have all had races and he has given them seven pounds, so you can only be pleased with him. He has really battled back. He is entered in all the races, so we will just see how he takes the race and think about it." **Click for [Racing Post chart](#). [Video, courtesy Racing UK](#).**

GRAYSON-JOCKEY CLUB ANNOUNCES STUDY ON SURFACES

Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation announced yesterday that it is providing \$50,000 to fund an innovative research project designed to create a state-of-the-art method of assessing racetrack surfaces. The project is being conducted by Dr. Sue Stover, Dr. Mont Hubbard, Dr. Shrinivasa Upadhyaya and Jacob Setterbo at the University of California-Davis. The researchers seek to replicate synthetic and dirt racetrack surfaces in a laboratory setting in a "track in a box." The study aims to gauge the factors that affect hoof impact--and thus propensity for injury--on racetrack surfaces in a carefully controlled environment. The track in a box is designed to gather data from simulated hoof impacts on different surface materials. Subsequently, hoof-impact data will be used in a computer model of the equine forelimb to predict fetlock joint angle and suspensory ligament and digital flexor tendon strains with different race surface properties. "We believe that, eventually, standard mechanical properties can be determined, and racetrack surface manufacturers can engineer surface materials that will minimize fetlock injuries in racehorses," said Stover. "Conducting this research in a laboratory setting can simulate an infinite number of race surfaces without having to build and test entire new racecourses." Additionally, the computer model can allow for testing of extremes, which would not be appropriate if actual horses were being used.

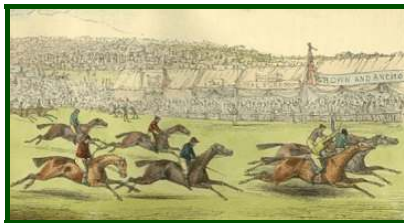

Accompanied by Princess Haya of Jordan's G1 Coronation Cup-bound Espresso Star (War Chant), George Strawbridge's champion juvenile followed that barnmate under Jimmy Fortune in a light exercise at the "Breakfast with the Stars" morning. "She has done her work going clear at home, so this was more for her to come and see the place and have a sweat," Gosden said. "I wanted to get some of the nervous energy out of her and the instructions were to follow Espresso Star and not join him, as I didn't want to have a major workout and leave the Oaks behind 10 days before. She's gone very nicely and was very settled, following him on the bridle with ears pricked and went around there beautifully and switched legs. I took advantage of the beautiful ground--when I was with Vincent O'Brien we came here a couple of days before the race and cantered The Minstrel 32 years ago, so I should have done it between times. She's a fit filly, is eating well and is happy." Others to work at the press gathering were Princess Haya of Jordan's G3 Chester Vase third **De-bussy (Ire)** (Diesis {GB}), also from the Gosden stable and the fellow Derby-bound colts **South Easter (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Montaff (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}).

A LOOK BACK AT GAMELY

When a full field lines up in Saturday's GI Gamely Breeders' Cup S. at Hollywood Park, they will be paying tribute--unwittingly for the equine participants, at least--to a superb racemare of yesterday. The 1 1/8-mile grass race for fillies and mares is named in honor of Gamely, William Haggin Perry's Hall of Fame champion who competed successfully on both coasts from 1967 until 1969.

Four years before Gamely's birth, Perry, a Virginia sportsman, had begun an annual foal-sharing agreement with Claiborne Farm and its owner, Bull Hancock. According to Edward Bowen's *Matriarchs*, Perry and Hancock "worked out a deal whereby Perry would purchase half-interest of all Claiborne-bred yearlings and would divide them into their separate stables while having joint ownership."

It was this agreement that led to Gamely. In 1963, the stakes-winning *My Babu mare Gambetta, the second foal of top broodmare *Rough Shod II, was sent to Claiborne's rising star Bold Ruler. (Bold Ruler, incidentally, led the sire list for the first of seven straight years in that year). The resulting foal was Gamely, who is listed as bred by Claiborne but competed in Perry's colors.

Unraced at two because of her considerable size--she stood 16.2 hands--Gamely was put into training with James W. Maloney for her three-year-old season. She debuted at Santa Anita in February of 1967 and ran second under jockey Bill Shoemaker. After breaking her maiden in her next outing, Gamely went winless in her next four before taking the Princess S. at Hollywood in July. Maloney shipped east for the Saratoga meet, and Gamely responded to her new environs with a six-length romp in a division of the seven-furlong Test S. at Saratoga, in which she established a new track record of 1:21 4/5.

Gamely then showed great versatility by stretching out and winning the 1 1/4-mile Alabama S., and, though she didn't win in four more starts that year, was honored as champion three-year-old filly in the Thoroughbred Racing Associations poll (Furl Sail was named champion in an alternative poll).

Gamely was a better and more consistent horse at four. Having finally grown into her big frame, the bay won the Santa Maria H., Santa Margarita H., and Wilshire H. in California before running three lengths adrift of Dr. Fager in the Californian S. in May of 1968. She came right back to beat males in the Inglewood H., and accounted for females--under 131 pounds--in the Vanity H. Gamely then came east once again to finish first in three straight in New York, including Saratoga's Diana H. (where she was DQ'd and placed second) and Aqueduct's Beldame S. Her official tally for the year was seven wins in 14 starts, with three seconds and two thirds. This time, there would be no sharing championship honors, as Gamely was named top older mare in both polls.

Gamely added five more wins at five. She won the Santa Monica H. and Wilshire and ran second to Nodouble in the Santa Anita H. in California, and, after beating the boys in an allowance race at the Spa, she repeated in the Diana and Beldame.

In her final career start, Gamely was once again tried against males in the Vosburgh H. at Aqueduct. Though she finished eighth that day, her margin from the winner--2 1/2 lengths--hardly left her disgraced. (It was another filly, Dr. Fager's little sister Ta Wee, who won the Vosburgh.) Again, Gamely was named champion handicap mare.

In three seasons at the track, Gamely amassed a record of 16 wins, nine seconds and six thirds in 41 starts for earnings of \$574,961.

As a broodmare, Gamely got off to a fine start when her Round Table colt Cellini, foaled in 1971, won the 1973 G1 Dewhurst S. in England and ran second in the following year's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. But Gamely didn't produce a live foal for the next three years and, tragically, died from a ruptured stomach in 1975 just five days after foaling the Round Table filly Gambling. Gambling never raced and failed to make much of an impact as a producer, though one of her daughters, Bettor (Conquistador Cielo), is the dam of two Brazilian group winners.

In addition to Gamely, Perry also campaigned Lamb Chop, another Bold Ruler collaboration with Claiborne. Arriving four years before Gamely, Lamb Chop was named champion three-year-old filly in 1963 but sadly broke down. Perry also owned Coastal, best known as the horse who upset Spectacular Bid in his Triple Crown question in the 1979 GI Belmont S. Perry died in 1993 at the age of 85.

Ironically, given that her nine-furlong namesake is contested on the lawn, Gamely never won in three starts on the surface. Gamely was inducted into racing's Hall of Fame in 1980. -LM

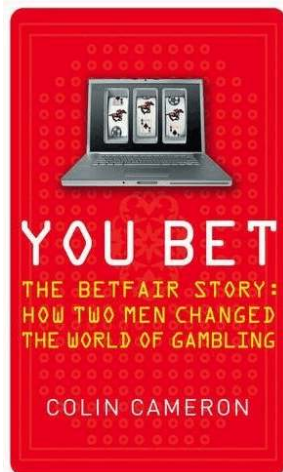

The Betfair Story: How Two Men Changed the World of Gambling

By Colin Cameron. 301 Pages. Harper Collins. \$31.25

Most already know that Betfair, a betting exchange that is more or less the eBay of wagering, is a phenomenally successful and innovative gambling company in the midst of revolutionizing how people around the world wager. But how did it get to be that way and do so in such a short period of time?



That's the question author Colin Cameron, who writes about the business of betting for such publications as the *Financial Times* and *Esquire* and is the author of seven books, attempts to answer throughout his latest book, "You Bet."

It's a somewhat cumbersome topic that doesn't exactly make for light reading, but Cameron does a more-than-adequate job of chronicling the Betfair story from its modest beginnings through its meteoric rise and to its present state. Today, Betfair has more

than 2 million customers and handles in excess of \$80 million a week in wagers, much of them on horseracing, some of them on U.S. horseracing.

"You Bet" gushes with praise for Betfair, but it's not misplaced. Simply put, Betfair was a very good idea that originated with some awfully smart people. Betfair is the brainchild of Andrew Black, who brought in Edward Wray to turn his vision into reality. With little in the way of financing behind them, the two started with little more than an idea, but persisted because they had unwavering faith in the product. They realized the way people typically bet--at bricks-and-mortar betting shops in their native England--was an inefficient, antiquated method that could be vastly improved upon in the Internet era.

They weren't alone in that way of thinking, but understood better than most what needed to go into the formula for an efficient, successful exchange. They outmaneuvered their prime competition, a betting exchange called Flutter, and left England's powerful bookmakers in the dust. Both the author as well as Wray and Black still can't understand why firms like Ladbroke, William Hill and Coral chose to take on Betfair through ultimately unsuccessful lawsuits and negative lobbying when they would have been much better off creating their own exchange, which likely would have crushed an under funded start-up.

The result is that Betfair, which began trading in 2000, has a virtual monopoly when it comes to betting exchanges. Betting exchanges, with their low overhead, offer the player the best odds possible, which can only mean they will continue to eat away at the traditional methods people have used to bet.

Betfair, wary of this country's ambiguous and restrictive gambling laws, has yet to arrive in the U.S., but it will be here someday. That's among the conclusions the book reaches and it boldly predicts that within five years U.S. residents will be wagering with Betfair, at least on horseracing.

Betfair's future in the U.S. is among the many topics the reader will find enlightening. Another is a compelling argument that Betfair, even though it allows people to bet a horse to lose, has actually made it more difficult for the cheaters to prosper, in both racing and in other sports. Anyone making suspicious wagers through Betfair will be watched closely and their actions will be brought to the attention of the governing bodies in whatever sport they are wagering on.

None of this is meant to say that the book percolates from first page to last. It spends way too much time examining ancillary topics, such as BullionVault, a website that took the Betfair model and applied it to trading gold. Nor, amid all the praise, does it adequately address what many see as the primary downside to Betfair--it's potential to cannibalize existing betting markets that funnel revenue into the racing industry. Betfair handles huge amounts of money on U.S. racing, but has yet to compensate any American racetrack or add to any purse accounts here. Betfair officials, by the way, claim it's only a matter of time before they begin to make financial contributions to U.S. tracks.

Nonetheless, You Bet is something anyone with a vested interest in the U.S. racing or gambling industries should read. Betfair is coming and it's likely to have a major impact on how people bet in this country, which means it will have a major impact on the sport of horseracing.

From 'Destroyer' to 'Buck', McPeek Has Enjoyed Ride:

Trainer Ken McPeek was all smiles Tuesday morning as he accepted congratulations on getting his 1,000th victory during the Memorial Day holiday card at Churchill Downs. "That's a nice milestone; I've had a lot of fun," said McPeek, who hit the mark in the eighth race with a win by Lawrence E. Carroll's Old Man Buck (Hold That Tiger). "I've been training 24 years now." A 46-year-old native of Fort Chaffee, Arkansas, McPeek's first victory came courtesy of Final Destroyer at River Downs Oct. 27, 1985. The horse was Final Destroyer. McPeek was asked of the 1,000, which five stood out the most. "Sarava's Belmont [in 2002]," McPeek said without hesitation of the number-one victory on the list. "Then Take Charge Lady's second Spinster [in 2003]," McPeek said. "She never got beat at Keeneland [five wins, including four graded stakes] and she is the all-time leading money earner there [\$1,306,286]. She is probably my favorite horse that I have had." Rounding out McPeek's top five in order were Tejano Run's triumph in the 1997 GIII Widener H. in which he received a 123 Beyer Speed Figure, Harlan's Holiday winning the 2002 GI Florida Derby and Birdbirdistheword's victory in the 2006 GIII Delta Jackpot S. for longtime client Raymond Cottrell. Of the 1,000 victories, 235 have come at Churchill Downs, 14 in stakes. "I haven't won a Grade I at Churchill Downs, but I have had some significant seconds," McPeek said, alluding to runner-up finishes in the Kentucky Derby by Tejano Run in 1995 and Take Charge Lady in the Kentucky Oaks in 2002. -*Courtesy Churchill notes*
