DOUGLAS OFF VENTILATOR

Jockey Rene Douglas is breathing on his own after being removed from a ventilator Monday, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Douglas suffered spinal cord injuries during a spill at Arlington Park May 23 and remains in the trauma unit of Northwestern Memorial Hospital in Chicago. He still has not regained feeling in his legs, but now that the ventilator has been removed, Douglas can speak again. "His request was for ice cream or Jell-O," Doreen Razo, a friend of the Douglas family, told *DRF*. Razo reported the Panamanian-born rider is being weaned from pain medications and has recovered from a case of pneumonia contracted after a seven-hour surgery to repair fractures to his vertebrae and to decompress and fuse the T-5 and T-6 vertebrae lower in his spine.



RONALD CAUTHEN DIES

Hall of Fame Farrier Ronald "Tex" Cauthen, father of prominent horsemen Steve, Doug and Kerry Cauthen, died Monday at his Walton, Kentucky home. He was 77. A native Texan, Cauthen served in the Army and was trained as a meteorologist before attending the blacksmith program at Michigan State University. He became a renowned racetrack farrier and was eventually elected into the International Horseshoeing Hall of Fame. Cauthen married trainer Myra Bischoff in June of 1959. The couple's first son, Steve, rode Affirmed to victory in the 1978 Triple Crown and was elected into the Racing Hall of Fame in 1994. Doug Cauthen serves as president and chief executive officer of WinStar

Farm and Kerry Cauthen is managing partner of Four Star Sales. Speaking for the family, Doug Cauthen said, "He was the best husband, father and friend we could have ever asked for and shared life lessons on a daily basis with all of us, which we will always remember." Cauthen is survived by Myra, his wife of 50 years, their three sons and daughters-in-law and four grandchildren. There will be a memorial mass service for Cauthen at 3 p.m. June 7 at All Saints Church, 62 Needmore Street, in Walton. Services are being handled by Chambers and Grubbs Funeral Home of Walton. There will be no visitation. BARONIN KARIN VON ULLMANN DIES

Gestut Schlenderhan's owner Baronin Karin von Ullmann died Monday evening. She was 87. Von Ullmann was the fifth generation responsible for Germany's renowned oldest privately owned Thoroughbred stud, having taken over from her mother Baronin Gabrielle von Oppenheim in January 1988. She was the great-granddaughter of Eduard von Oppenheim, the stud's founder in 1869 and was born on the premises in 1922. Instrumental in the day-to-day running of the establishment from an early age and through World War II, Karin bred and raced with friends in the colours of Stall Wolkenstein prior to taking over the reins at Schlenderhan. During that period, the most important horse they owned was the dual Classic-winning filly Ivresse (Fr), later the dam of two Classic winners and an influential foundation mare. One of the first major winners under her tenure at Schlenderhan was the 1995 G1 Preis von Europa victor Solon (Ger), who ended a drought of big winners for the stud. That was followed in 2003 by the G1 Deutsches Derby hero Dai Jin (GB). Four years later, the chestnut Adlerflug (Ger) (Ger) fulfilled a lifetime's ambition when sailing to victory in the same race in the famed silks. Just this year, Irian (Ger) annexed the G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen for the stud, which stands the proven international sire Monsun (Ger). Renowned for her great sense of humor and positivity, the Baroness is survived by her twins Baron Georg von Ullmann, himself a world-famous owner, and breeder and Ilona.

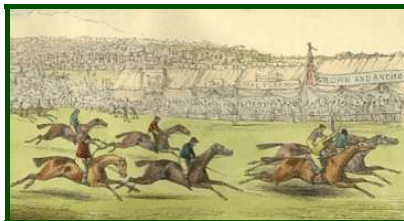

Murtagh Set to Ride Rip...

Aidan O'Brien's provisional jockey bookings for Saturday's G1 Investec Derby were outlined yesterday, with Johnny Murtagh almost certain to partner Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's G1 2000 Guineas fourth **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the mile-and-a-half Classic. That leaves Seamus Heffernan to renew his association with **Fame and Glory (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), whom he rode in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown last time May 10, while Ryan Moore will take the ride on the May 14 G2 Dante S. scorer **Black Bear Island (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). Richard Hughes will be on the May 7 G3 Chester Vase runner-up **Masterofthehorse (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). Pat Smullen has his name alongside the May 9 G3 Lingfield Derby Trial winner **Age of Aquarius (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), while Colm O'Donoghue will bid to repeat his all-the-way Chester Vase win on **Golden Sword (GB)** (High Chaparral {Ire}). Murtagh said, "I'm delighted with all the horses and it has been a very difficult decision to make," O'Brien commented. "Hopefully all goes well between now and Saturday." Masterofthehorse's rider Richard Hughes later said, "If he is the one I'm riding, I'm very pleased. Most days, most of the horses I get on I don't know, but you learn a lot going to post and Johnny [Murtagh] is a good friend of mine and will tell me plenty about him."

No More Watering...

Officials at Epsom called a halt to watering yesterday after the forecast changed ahead of the two-day festival. Clerk of the Course Andrew Cooper gave the ground description yesterday as good, good-to-firm in places, and said, "We have beautiful ground and we would love to be racing right now. The outlook for the weekend has changed. There is the possibility of light rain on Friday afternoon, and the potential for rain to be around on Saturday as a system comes in from the Bay of Biscay."

Epsom to Pay Its Respects...

Management at the Surrey venue yesterday revealed that all riders in Saturday's G1 Investec Derby will be sporting black armbands in honour of the late Vincent O'Brien. The flags were also flying at half-staff yesterday and it was announced that a special reading of a tribute during the Derby's preliminaries. Managing Director Nick Blofeld commented, "At our instigation, the Derby jockeys will be wearing black armbands and we will be staging a small tribute as the horses go to post for the Derby."

Three Moons Out of Oaks...

Trainer Harry Dunlop yesterday ruled **Three Moons (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) out of Friday's G1 Investec Oaks after the Goldsmith Family's homebred sustained an injury during her final gallop. Royal Ascot looks on the cards for the May 3 Listed Pretty Polly S. runner-up now, and her conditioner told *PA Sport*, "Unfortunately, Three Moons picked up a minor injury while having her final piece of work before the Oaks, so she will not be running at Epsom on Friday. Obviously, it's a bit gutting and we are disappointed, but these things happen in racing and we just didn't feel it was worth taking a risk with her. There are still some nice races to run her in later in the year and she is in the [June 18] G2 Ribblesdale S. at Royal Ascot, but we just want to get the next few days out of the way before we make any plans."

Godolphin Eye Chantilly With Parthenon...

Godolphin have announced that they will supplement recent recruit **Parthenon (GB)** (Dubai Destination) for Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly. Successful for the Mark Johnston stable in an Apr. 24 Sandown conditions event and the Listed Glasgow S. at Hamilton last time May 15, he will be added to the 1 5/16-mile Classic at Thursday's stage and will be partnered by Frankie Dettori. "The plan at the moment is to supplement Parthenon into the Jockey-Club on Thursday." Simon Crisford told *Racing Post*. A total of 19 remained at yesterday's stage, with Christopher Tsui's G1 2000 Guineas hero **Sea the Stars (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) left in as a precaution only by trainer John Oxx. Yves de Nicolay provided an upbeat bulletin on John Cotton's May 10 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) winner **Silver Frost (Fr)** (Verglas {Ire}), who will be ridden again by Christophe Soumillon. "I worked him on the racecourse [Deauville] over nine furlongs with one other this morning and was delighted with the way he went," he told the trade daily. "Silver Frost was very relaxed and his work was impeccable. He won the gallop very easily and I couldn't have been more pleased." Heading the list of overseas raiders is Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's **Westphalia (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}).

Westphalia was fourth before being promoted to third in the Poulains and forms part of a quartet from the Aidan O'Brien stable including ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ and G3 Sandown Classic Trial third **Malibu Bay** (El Prado {Ire}). Juvenile Group 1 heroes **Crowded House (GB)** (Rainbow Quest) and **Zafisio (Ire)** (Efisio {GB}) are other notables, while Gary Tanaka's new acquisition **On Est Bien (Ire)** (Enrique {GB}) was one of the most significant withdrawals, with the Apr. 12 G3 Prix la Force winner having sustained a hairline fracture to a cannon bone after his workout.

NEW YORK MINUTE

The mood was decidedly jovial at yesterday's media luncheon for the GI Belmont S., held at the Club Bar & Grill at Madison Square Garden. Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin and jockey Alan Garcia, the connections of **Charitable Man** (Lemon Drop Kid), were first up at the lectern. Garcia gestured at fellow reinsman Calvin Borel—who will bid to complete an unprecedented sweep of Triple Crown events aboard two different mounts—and joked, "Stay back!" Garcia piloted Da' Tara (Tiznow) to an unexpected victory in the 2008 "Test of the Champion" to derail the Triple Crown bid of Big Brown (Boundary), and knows he has a better chance to get back to the winner's circle Saturday afternoon. "Last year, it was a longshot," he acknowledged. "This time, it's a really nice horse." McLaughlin, who led over Jazil (Seeking the Gold) for a surprise Belmont score in 2006, said that the GII Peter Pan S. hero was "doing very well."

John Velazquez, who will be aboard **Dunkirk** (Unbridled's Song), stepped up to the microphone and light-heartedly implored his fellow riders to "stay on the rail," as Borel, fresh from taping an appearance on "Late Night With David Letterman," shook his head and laughed. Velazquez got acquainted with Dunkirk Sunday at Belmont, breezing the grey colt in :49.57. "He worked really well and galloped out good," said Velazquez. "I'd never ridden the horse before. Obviously, [the Belmont] is going to be a tough race. Mine That Bird ran a really good race [in Kentucky], but this is a mile and half." Velazquez broke his Triple Crown drought with Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) in the historic 2007 Belmont, and will be representing the same connections Saturday.

Trainer Chip Woolley, **Mine That Bird** (Birdstone)'s conditioner, confirmed that the Kentucky Derby winner had come out of Monday workout in good order. The gelding had shown speed in most of his races last year, but Woolley revealed that his new running style was by design. "Prior to buying him, I watched all of his races," Woolley said. "He kept getting checked, getting into trouble. My plan was to get him back and make one run, and that was one of the reasons we picked Calvin [to ride]." Borel gave the bay a rail-skimming ride to his surprising Churchill victory, while Mike Smith was forced to go outside on his way to a second-place finish in the GI Preakness S. May 16.

Woolley acknowledged that Mine That Bird will likely have to adapt to a different scenario in Saturday's test. "The pace will be slower," he said. "But this is the style that has turned him into a Grade I horse."

Borel, who breezed Mine That Bird Monday at Churchill, has been confident about his chances. "I was so impressed with his workout [Monday]," Borel said. "I can honestly say the distance will not be a problem. He'll keep giving you 13s, 12s [per furlong], whatever you need."

Ice and the Other Bird...

Many trainers would consider it an achievement to saddle just one Kentucky Derby starter through an entire *career*, let alone within 12 months of launching a public stable. Yet that's what Tim Ice did a few weeks ago when he sent out **Summer Bird** (Birdstone) to a sixth-place finish in the Run for the Roses. Ice isn't about to start patting himself on the back, however. He's too busy looking forward to Saturday, when he aims to put a dream ending on a Cinderella freshman season with a victory in the GI Belmont S.

While Summer Bird will be a double-digit longshot in the Belmont, there are some things to like about his chances. First, his sire Birdstone won the 2004 renewal of the Belmont, chasing down Smarty Jones in the dying strides. Second, Summer Bird's past races indicate the 1 1/2-mile distance won't be an issue. In his second lifetime start and first going two turns, he closed from well back to win a 1 1/16-mile Oaklawn maiden in March. Stepped up in distance and class, he then rallied from last of 10 in the nine-furlong GII Arkansas Derby Apr. 11 and finished just 1 1/4 lengths adrift of the talented pair Papa Clem (Smart Strike) and Old Fashioned (Unbridled's Song).

It was this seeming propensity for distance that first started Summer Bird's connections thinking about the Classics. After his maiden win, Ice and owners Drs. K.K. and Vilasini Jayaraman were sure they had a solid contender for the Lone Star Derby. After the Arkansas Derby, they altered plans.

"It didn't surprise me, but I was impressed," Ice said of the Arkansas Derby. "Before that, I thought I had a nice horse for the Lone Star Derby."

Afterwards, they thought Kentucky Derby. And with the graded earnings to make the race, Summer Bird was given a shot in Louisville. He was far from disgraced, putting in a "good seven-wide run," according to the chart, while closing from 16th to sixth.

"I was very impressed with his Kentucky Derby effort, too," added Ice. "He was very wide, and we had an inexperienced rider and an inexperienced trainer. I think we learned a lot from that. And while I wasn't thinking Kentucky Derby the whole time, I was thinking about the Belmont. This has been the goal."

Cool Customer...

Despite the Hollywood name, Tim Ice appears to be quite the opposite, a soft-spoken kid from the Midwest who at yesterday's NYRA media luncheon in New York City was happy to stand to the side as media types swarmed around the Mine That Bird crew.

Ice was born and raised in Liverpool, Ohio. He moved to Louisiana when he was 13, and within two years was working for his stepfather, a trainer on the Fair Grounds and Louisiana Downs circuit. The family also had a 10-acre breeding farm about a half-hour away from Louisiana Downs, which gave Ice a chance to experience several aspects of the sport.

After high school, Ice went to work for trainer Keith Desormeaux--Kent's brother--for five years. He worked for Cole Norman for three years, then Morris Nicks for two. Last spring, Ice decided it was time for a change.

"I thought I'd been doing it long enough for other people and that it was the time to do it for myself," he said. "The timing was right, and all three of those guys were very knowledgeable of the sport and taught me a lot."

Ice began with five horses in his stable--all owned by the Jayaramans.

"Dr. J was a client of Cole Norman's, and I met him then," said Ice. "When I went on my own I called him up, and he had enough confidence in me to send me a few horses. He would send me a few more here and there and, by this winter, I was up to 20 horses."

One of those late-arriving horses was Summer Bird, who showed up in January.

"When I saw him come off the van, I was in awe," said Ice. "He was a good-looking colt when he got to me. At the time, I knew I had a nice colt, but wasn't sure how nice. I thought he would be able to compete in stakes, but not necessarily Grade I's. When I got to training him and when we ran him the first time, he showed us a lot going six furlongs [a fast-closing fourth at Oaklawn Mar. 1]. He impressed us enough to give him a shot in the Arkansas Derby."

The Arkansas Derby led to the Kentucky Derby, and while it was another son of Birdstone who shone that day, Ice said it was a great experience.

"I'm very glad we went," he said. "He had a very good showing, and I think he impressed some people, at least considering how they thought he'd do going into the Derby."

Ice bypassed the GI Preakness S., and said Summer Bird has responded to the time off by putting on considerable weight.

"He's gained about 150 pounds since the Derby," said Ice. "He's put on muscle and looks super. He's never had five weeks between any race--he ran four hard races in two months--and I think the five weeks here is going to help him a lot."

Asked if Summer Bird is cut from the same cloth as the smaller Birdstone and Mine That Bird, Ice commented, "He actually looks nothing like either one of them. He's got a lot more size to him--he's out of a Summer Squall mare. He has Birdstone's running style and some of Summer Squall's size. He's just put together nice."

He may not share physical attributes with his sire and Mine That Bird, but Summer Bird does share a late-closing running style. Ice said that isn't from a lack of speed, however.

"It's just his style," said Ice. "If you asked him, he'd have more speed, but I want the horse to be comfortable out there and do his own thing. He's happy doing that and can make a nice move."

Ice said that he was equipping Summer Bird with blinkers for the first time in the Belmont, and expected him to be a bit closer to the pace.

"I think we'll probably have one or two horses beat [in the early going], but I don't think anyone's going to be all that far back," said Ice, who added that Kent Desormeaux will replace Chris Rosier in the Belmont. "I think it'll be a compact field with a slow pace. So as long as we have a clean trip, we should be competitive. I think he and Kent will be fine."

Handicappers and horsemen are a notoriously superstitious bunch, and anyone looking for an omen for a Summer Bird upset might be interested to find that Saturday is a special day for Ice, other than being Belmont day. It's also his 35th birthday. -LM

SOUTHDALE TO MISS QUEEN'S PLATE

Southdale (Street Cry {Ire}) exited a runner-up effort in Sunday's Plate Trial S. with an injury that will force the Rod Ferguson colt to miss the June 21 Queen's Plate. "He's hurt up in the shoulder," trainer Ian Black told *Daily Racing Form*. "We blocked him from the foot to the ankle to the knee and we still couldn't get him to go sound. Assuming the shoulder is what it is, three months of stall rest usually fixes those things. It's different if it's muscle, but I don't think it is, to be honest with you." Southdale opened his career with a third-place effort Apr. 10 at Keeneland before romping home by 5 1/4 lengths at Woodbine May 3. In his route debut in the Plate Trial, the dark bay colt was passed late by Eye of the Leopard (A.P. Indy).

WITTY OUT OF HOLLYWOOD OAKS

Unbeaten ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Witty** (Distorted Humor), expected to be one of the favorites in Sunday's GII Hollywood Oaks, will be forced to miss the race due to illness, *Daily Racing Form* reported. The bay missed five days of training last week. "She's back at the track now, but she's just started back," trainer Richard Mandella told *DRF*. Witty, a half sister to GI Dubai World Cup hero Well Armed (Tiznow), has won all three lifetime starts to date, most recently taking the May 10 GIII Railbird S. at Hollywood Park.

THIRD-CROP EURO SIRES

Two sires whose profiles couldn't be more different--the treble Group 1-winning sprinter Oasis Dream and the 2003 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Dalakhani--have started to 'draw off' among the group of third-crop European sires (*table, p10*), whose first foals are four-year-olds this year, ranked by cumulative progeny earnings (excluding Japan) from Northern Hemisphere crops. They are the only sires to have more than £3 million in progeny earnings, the only sires to have 10 or more black-type winners, and two of the three sires to have four black-type winners so far this year (the other is High Chaparral).

Dalakhani was already the crop's star sire by the end of last year (2008 year-end APEX A Runner Index: 3.87). Though he had not sired a winner by Aug. 1 of his freshman sire year (2007), he ended up the season with nine winners and three black type-placed horses, and, though ranking only 16th on the 2007 Freshman Sire list (all statistics provided by Hyperion Promotions and *Eurosire*), he was still regarded with a good deal of promise. That promise was fulfilled in spades with six group/graded stakes winners last year, including Classic winners Moonstone (G1 Irish Oaks) and Conduit (G1 English St Leger, also G1 Breeders' Cup Turf). It is kind of 'chicken or feathers': Dalakhani's B and C indexes were only 1.38 and 1.13, respectively, but when he gets a good one, it can be really, really good. He had established himself by the end of last year as a seriously promising sire. Not surprisingly, since he's by Darshaan, three of those six group winners, including Conduit, are out of mares by Sadler's Wells.

About the only things Oasis Dream and Dalakhani had in common was that both were top-class racehorses, and both are in 'neutral'--meaning not Maktoum or Coolmore--hands. Dalakhani was bred and raced by the Aga Khan, and stands at his Giltown Stud in Ireland.

Oasis Dream was bred and raced by Prince Khaled Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms, and stands at their Banstead Manor Stud near Newmarket. Strength in numbers definitely favored the speedier type. Oasis Dream (188) has had almost twice as many runners as Dalakhani (98), and more than twice as many winners. And, partially through quantity, but also through quality, Oasis Dream has now surged to a £50,000 lead over Dalakhani in cumulative progeny earnings.

Though Oasis Dream finished (a very distant) second to Acclamation on the 2007 European freshman sire list and was third on the second-crop sire list last year--when he also sired a record 38 two-year-old winners in his second crop--the jury of professionals was still out on Oasis Dream.

Oasis Dream had a respectable--but by no means sensational--1.42 A Runner Index, and a 1.48 index for ABC Runners (top eight percent-earners). He did have France's champion two-year-old colt in Naaqoos, impressive winner of the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere, and the promising 2008 three-year-old Aqlaam, sidelined by injury after winning the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot, but looked a real Group 1 horse in the making.

Ironically, Naaqoos and Aqlaam are 0-for-three between them in 2009, but that's about the only thing that's gone wrong for Oasis Dream this year. He's leading European third-crop sire in 2009 in three main categories: number of winners (38); number of races won (49); and, most importantly, earnings--over £956,000, almost £300,000 ahead of High Chaparral in second. He's also tied for the lead, as mentioned before, in the number of 2009 black-type winners, with four. The most intriguing of these is Midday, a Juddmonte filly trained by Henry Cecil, who is one of the three favorites for Friday's G1 Epsom Oaks, after an impressive six-length trial win in the G3 Lingfield Oaks Trial, run over 11 1/2 furlongs. She may be by a sprinter, but she's got the stamina on the dam's side. I thought she ran the most impressive Oaks trial, so it wouldn't surprise me to see Oasis Dream provide the venerable Cecil with his ninth Oaks win.

Dalakhani has no runners in the Oaks or Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby, and in fact the only other third-crop sire represented in either race is **High Chaparral**, who has runners in both. All would have to be called outsiders--G3 Musidora fourth High Heeled and Swettenham Stud S. second Miniver Rose in the Oaks; and G3 Chester Vase winner Golden Sword, one of the O'Brien legions, in the Derby. But they are emblematic of the kind of improved year High Chaparral is having: 35 winners of 45 races, progeny earnings over £666,000, ranking him second among third-crop sires this year only to Oasis Dream, and well ahead of Nayef (£541,000) and Dalakhani (£511,000). By the way, it's not entirely surprising High Chaparral is the only third-crop sire likely to be represented in the Derby: 10 of the 13 nominees at the 'six-day' stage are either by Sadler's Wells (two) or his sons Galileo (five!), Montjeu (two), and High Chaparral (one). It doesn't leave much room for anybody else.

Third in cumulative progeny earnings among this sire group is **Hawk Wing**, though £724,000 of his £2,556,000 total came by virtue of the Richard Hannon-trained filly Minor Vamp's win in the Goffs' Fillies' Million last September, and she hasn't been sighted since. She is not a black-type winner; Hawk Wing has only two of those (compared with 13 by Oasis Dream and 11 by Dalakhani), which is no doubt one of the reasons why Hawk Wing was sold to South Korea at the end of last year. In his defense, though, he is one of only five European third-crop sires to have over 30 winners of over 40 races this year, and is one of five with over £500,000 in 2009 progeny earnings. It may be quantity over quality, but though they may not be stars, but they aren't bums, either.

Number four cumulatively on the third-crop list is **Acclamation**, a sprinter by Royal Applause who was leading freshman sire of 2007 by a margin of over £600,000 over runner-up Oasis Dream. He kind of dropped off the radar last year, much as runaway 2007 North American freshman sire leader Posse did on his side of the Pond, but, like Posse, Acclamation is staging a comeback of sorts this year; still, nearly half of his cumulative progeny earnings of £2,318,000 came when he was a freshman sire. **Nayef**, sire last year of top French miler Tamayuz and G1 Prix de l'Opera winner Lady Marian, ranks fifth overall, and third in 2009 (£541,000), by virtue of Nehaam's win in the GBP 400,000 Timeform Tattersalls' Trophy, part of the Tattersalls' Millions sale series. High Chaparral ranks sixth, ahead of **Choisir**, **Dubai Destination** (having a considerably better year in 2009), **Captain Rio**, and **Statue of Liberty** (now in Japan) rounding out the top 10. These 10 all have progeny earnings of over £1,389,000; **Okawango** (now in Turkey), in 11th position, is over £400,000 behind him.

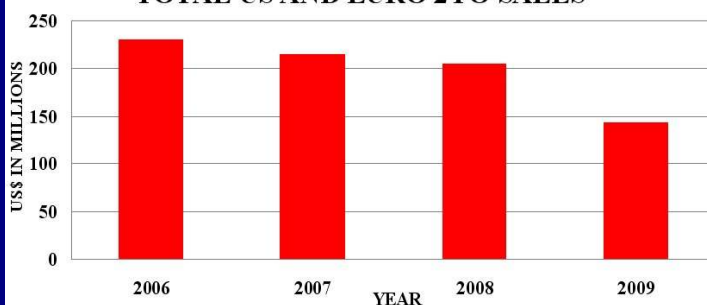

"Though first-half results combined show a 38% drop in gross, it seems highly significant that the two-year-old market is down 30 percent on gross, and 24% on average, whereas the mixed sales dropped 56% on gross and 43% in average. These figures support the hypothesis that the closer you are to the racetrack, the more chance you have of selling your horse for acceptable, if not good, money."

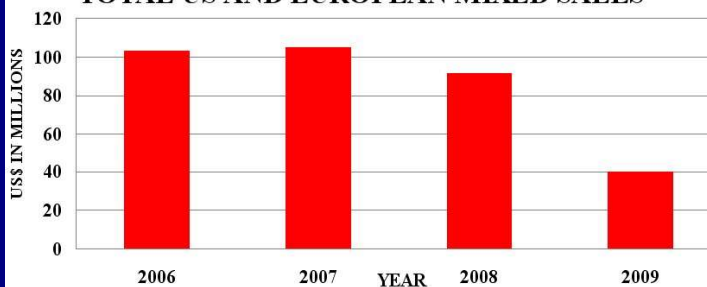
TOTAL US AND EURO 2YO SALES

Two horses who are maybe doing better than their positions suggest are: 14th-ranked **Clodovil**, the 2003 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner who had G1 Falmouth S. winner Nahoodh in his first crop last year; and last weekend's Group 3-placed, previous listed winner Beacon Lodge in 2009; and 16th-ranked **Storming Home**, winner of the G1 Champion S. in 2002 and a triple Group 1 winner for Neil Drysdale in America in 2003. Darley shunted him off the Japan pretty early in the proceedings, but he's sired the earners of over £333,000 this year, including G2 Italian Derby second Jakkalberry and G3 Prix Cleoptare winner Flying Cloud.

An Explanation of Black Type and Stakes Terms

Black Type

Advertisers using "black type" in their ads in the *TDN* are referring to stakes races which will appear in all major sales catalogues, and which:

- *Have a minimum purse value of \$50,000 distributed on the day of the race.
- *Close at least 72 hours prior to its running, and have a nomination fee paid by the owner of the entrant.
- *Have all entries be eligible for the purse monies used to determine the minimum purse value.
- *Meets specified requirements as related to restrictions and preferences.

Non Black-Type Stakes

The word "stakes" refers to non-black-type stakes, which do not appear in the catalogue page. They are:

- *Races in which the prize money offered is made up at least in part of money put up by the owners of the horses entered, but which offers a purse of less than \$50,000; or excludes horses from black-type money levels due to eligibility requirements;
- *In an advertisement, this could also refer to a mix of black-type and non-black-type stakes (as in Sire X has 73 lifetime stakes winners).

Graded/Group Stakes

There are 16 countries in the world where the racing is of a quality such that that country is allowed to determine its own Graded or Group stakes races, and they are accepted automatically as such in the catalogue.

They are: Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, France, Germany, Great Britain, Ireland, Italy, Japan, New Zealand, Peru, South Africa, the United Arab Emirates and the United States of America.

Other countries' "Group" or "Graded" stakes either count as a black-type race, or just a win, depending upon the country, but they do not have a Grade attached to them in the catalogue. The only exceptions to this rule are 14 races annually in Hong Kong, Scandinavia, Singapore and Turkey of international quality. In short, though, know that if it has a Grade on it in the *TDN*, it's a real Grade.
