RACHEL WORKS HALF FOR MOTHER GOOSE

Stonestreet Stables and Harold McCormick's **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) worked a half in :49 4/5 at Churchill Downs yesterday in advance of Saturday's GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont Park. The filly ships to New York this morning. Under exercise rider Dominic Terry, Rachel was caught through fractions of :13, :25 and :37.40; she galloped out

five furlongs in 1:03.40. Her work ranked as the 17th fastest of 51 at the distance. "The filly went beautiful this morning," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "She looked very happy. Scott [assistant trainer Scott Blasi] and Dominic have done a great job keeping her happy." The winner of the GI Kentucky Oaks will be making her first start since defeating Mine That Bird (Birdstone) in the May 16 GI Preakness S.

Dixie To Pass Mother Goose; Test Next...

In other Mother Goose news, West Point Thoroughbreds' multiple graded stakes winner **Justwhistledixie** (Dixie Union), runner-up in the GI Acorn S. last time at Belmont June 6, will not go against Rachel Alexandra in the nine-furlong event and will instead point toward the seven-furlong GI Test S. at Saratoga Aug. 8. "We just decided it's back a little quick for us," explained trainer Kieran McLaughlin. Remaining as likely for the Mother Goose are Alan Brodsky's GSW **Don't Forget Gil** (Kafwain), Godolphin Stables' **Flashing** (A.P. Indy), and Edward P. Evans's **Malibu Prayer** (Malibu Moon).

GOLDEN IN THE DAPHNIS

Golden Century (El Prado {Ire}) made the most of soft early fractions and proved best late to hold off **Allybar (Ire)** (King's Best) by a length in yesterday's G3 Prix Daphnis at Longchamp. "He is a nice horse and won well," said winning jockey Maxime Guyon. "I don't know what [trainer, Andre] Mr. Fabre is going to do with him, but he won't stay much further than that." Golden Century followed a debut win over this trip at Fontainebleau Apr. 10 with a third when upped to a mile and a half in a conditions event at Saint-Cloud May 1. Back to a mile at this track last time May 30, the homebred returned to winning ways and extended his sequence under an enterprising ride. Allowed to saunter along behind reluctant rivals shortly after the start, the bay ran freely until settled into his soft lead, and after kicking at the top of the stretch, was mainly hand ridden to comfortably beat the Wertheimer's homebred Allybar. ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Jukebox Jury (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), the runner-up in last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy who was making his return from injury, missed the break and needed to be shoved along leaving the false straight before failing to pick up and finishing last. Smooth Operator proved himself to be one of Germany's leading juveniles last term when rattling up a trio of successes over six furlongs in the Listed Kronimus-Rennen at Baden-Baden in September, G3 Prix Eclipse at Chantilly the following month and G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte in November. Returning with a staying-on fourth in the G3 Benazet-Rennen over that trip at Baden-Baden May 16, the bay proved he had the stamina for this test to regain the winning thread and complete an afternoon group race double for rider Maxime Guyon. Keen early trapped wide on the speed as Dunkerque and then Varenar set the fractions, he was taken over to the rail when the coast was clear. Driving a wedge between those rivals in the final 50 yards, he was driven out to assert and book his ticket to the highlight of Deauville's August festival. "He had already proven his quality last year, but we weren't certain he would stay," trainer and breeder Mario Hofer commented. "Looking at the way he ran today, he looks like he'll be even better over a mile, so I think we'll be tempted by the [Aug. 16] G1 Prix Jacques le Marois." Click for the [Racing Post chart](#).

SLOTS BILL CENTER STAGE IN KY SENATE

The fight for slots in Kentucky was heating up last night in Frankfort as proponents of a bill that would allow VLTs at Kentucky racetracks argued their case in front of the state senate. Hearings were still ongoing when the *TDN* went to press Monday evening. Keeneland President and CEO Nick Nicholson spoke in favor of House Bill 2, the measure approved by the Kentucky house last Friday. Nicholson made the case that the Kentucky horse industry needs slots to remain competitive with neighboring states, and noted that Ohio, which sits on Kentucky's northern boarder, could be next in line to install VLTs at its tracks. On Friday, Ohio Gov. Ted Strickland announced that, for the first time, he was endorsing slots in the state as a means of balancing Ohio's budget. The continued push for slots in Kentucky came as Turfway Park President Bob Ellison warned the Florence-area oval would likely have to close down by the end of 2010 if the bill failed to pass.

NEW BC CHALLENGE RACES NAMED

Winners of Ascot's G1 Queen Elizabeth II, G1 Fillies' Mile and G2 Royal Lodge S. and Newmarket's G1 Champion S. will earn automatic berths at this year's Nov. 6-7 Breeders' Cup, it was announced yesterday. Extending the list of stakes races involved in the "Win and You're In" Challenge series ahead of the latest edition of the World Championships at Santa Anita Park, the Breeders' Cup announced that Ascot's trio of contests Sept. 26 and Newmarket's autumn Oct. 17 highlight have been selected. Also included in the series are The Curragh's G1 Pretty Polly S. June 27 and G1 Moyglare Stud S. Aug. 30; Leopardstown's G1 Irish Champion S. Sept. 5; Dundalk's G3 Diamond S. Oct. 2; Deauville's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest Aug. 9 and the Oct. 4 G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp.

"We are excited to return the Breeders' Cup Challenge races to Ascot and welcome Newmarket and the Emirates Airline Champion S. to the Breeders' Cup Challenge," said Breeders' Cup President and CEO Greg Avioli. "We are always striving to make the Breeders' Cup more inclusive to our international horsemen and fans. British racing has been a long and valued partner to the success of the Breeders' Cup, and the selection of the Ascot and Newmarket races for the series strengthens the link of the world's greatest races and racehorses to the Breeders' Cup."

Charles Barnett, Chief Executive of Ascot Racecourse, added, "We're delighted to be involved in 'Win and You're In' for the second time and pleased that the portfolio of linked races has been extended to include the Emirates Airline Champion S. in October. The QEII is consistently rated amongst the top mile races in the world and is Europe's undisputed mile championship, highlighted by Raven's Pass's defeat of Henrythenavigator in 2008. We look forward to working with Breeders' Cup to promote the Santa Anita championships to the connections of all three of our included races."

The expansion of the Breeders' Cup Challenge leaves the series with a record 62 races taking place in seven countries. The 2009 Breeders' Cup Challenge races will begin in the U.S. on July 4 with qualifying events from Monmouth Park: the GI United Nations and the GIII Salvator Mile.

LOOK HEADS POLLY HOPEFULS Trainer Ralph Beckett is considering sending last year's G1 Epsom Oaks heroine **Look Here (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}) to The Curragh for Saturday's G1 Pretty Polly S., for which 13 stood their ground at the five-day stage yesterday. Third on her return in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom last Friday, Julian Richmond-Watson's homebred also has the option of the following Saturday's G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown. "She will either run in the Pretty Polly or Eclipse, and although we are still in two minds at the moment, we are favoring the Pretty Polly," Beckett said. "Taking on her own sex is probably the right thing to do." Among the list of declarations is Lord Lloyd-Webber's G3 Middleton S. runner-up **Dar Re Mi (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}), His Highness the Aga Khan's G2 Blandford S. winner **Katiyra (Ire)** (Peintre Celebre) and three-time Group 1 winner **Lush Lashes (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), who disappointed when only sixth as the favorite in Wednesday's G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot.

AMBITIOUS TARGET FOR RADIOHEAD Trainer Brian Meehan is looking at York's G1 Nunthorpe S. for

Thursday's G2 Norfolk S. winner **Radiohead (GB)** (Johannesburg). Carmen Burrell and Jonathan Harvey's colt overcame a bump late on to win the five-furlong contest at Royal Ascot and could take on his elders in the Aug. 21 event. "Luckily, he seems none the worse and appears to have taken the race very well," Meehan said. "Jamie [Spencer]

is taking a bit of an enforced break for the next few days, but when he comes back, we will look at the options and it could well be that we will have a crack at the older generation and target the Nunthorpe."

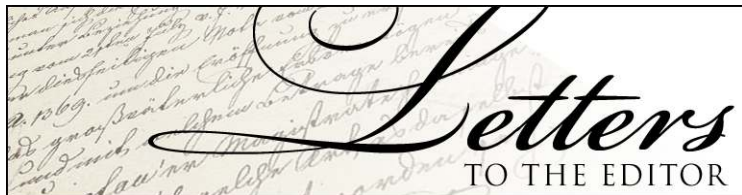

MORNY TARGET FOR CLIFFS Tuesday's G2 Coventry S. winner **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) is being aimed at the Aug. 23 G1 Prix Morny, trainer Richard Hannon announced yesterday. Despite initial suggestions that the Heffer Syndicate and Susan Roy's unbeaten colt would take in Newmarket's G2 July S. following his highly impressive six-length success at Royal Ascot, Deauville is now the main focus. "Canford Cliffs would have a three-pound penalty for the July S. and, in any event, I want to run **Angel's Pursuit (Ire)** (Pastoral Pursuits {GB}) at Newmarket, as he never got the breaks in [Tuesday's] Listed Windsor Castle S. and is a lot better than he looked at the Royal meeting," Hannon said. "Canford Cliffs is not entered in the G1 Phoenix S., and it would cost €25,000 to supplement him for The Curragh, so the Deauville race, which has not yet closed, looks the favoured option. I know it is two months away, but the break will do him good and Paul Roy, who bought a half-share in the colt the night before the Coventry, won the Morny with Dutch Art (GB) (Medicean {GB}) three years ago."

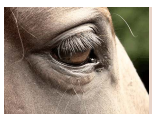

Do you remember that knife scene in the original Crocodile Dundee movie, when a would-be mugger



demands his money? Told by his companion to hand over his wallet because the mugger has a knife, the intrepid Australian hunter replies "That's not a knife," before producing a vastly more impressive weapon and adding "That's a knife."

That's pretty much how I feel when I see the names given to a few of America's stakes races--races like the Breeders' Cup Marathon, over a mile and a half, and the Best of Ohio Endurance S., over a mile and a quarter. The decision to increase the Marathon to a mile and three-quarters is a step in the right direction, but, to borrow Mick Dundee's phrase, I would still contend that "That's not a marathon."

"That's a marathon," I'd say, pointing proudly to Royal Ascot's historic Gold Cup, a stamina-sapping Group 1 contest over two and a half miles. And the Gold Cup isn't a stand-alone event, as the Royal meeting also includes the Ascot S., a handicap over two and a half miles, the Queen Alexandra S., which has been shortened to 21 furlongs and 159 yards, and the Queen's Vase, a Group 3 contest over two miles for three-year-olds. The days may be gone when the French used to

stage a group race, the Prix Gladiateur over three miles, but there are still enough long-distance events to add a very welcome diversity to European racing.

If the Gold Cup is a very special race, it takes an extremely special horse to win it on multiple occasions. Only one horse--Sagaro in the 1970s--had ever managed to win three editions, until the magnificent Yeats matched his achievement in 2008. And now this extraordinary son of Sadler's Wells has earned a unique place in history by using his rare blend of speed and stamina to record a fourth consecutive victory.

Having sung the praises of Europe's marathon events, from a spectacle viewpoint, I have to admit that winning one has become something of a poisoned chalice for entire colts. Thanks to the widespread prejudice against stamina, the majority of winners over a mile and three-quarters or more find it well nigh impossible to win support from commercial flat breeders, leaving the jumping sector as their only option. As a consequence, very few of today's Thoroughbreds could be said to have been bred with marathons in mind. But a study of Yeats's pedigree--and of his female line in particular--reveals that he is an exception to this rule.

Sadler's Wells's name is associated with a fair degree of stamina rather than speed, even though it was one of his grandsons, the Australian Scenic Blast, who triumphed in the G1 King's Stand S. over five furlongs. Sadler's Wells had previously been represented by Kayf Tara, a dual winner of Gold Cup, and his influence on this year's Gold Cup was there for all to see, as he also sired the dam of the runner-up Patkai (a colt sired by a King's Stand S. winner in Indian Ridge), as well as the

sire of the third-placed Geordieland. Sadler's Wells also sired fourth-placed Sagara and sixth-placed Hindu Kush.

For the record, Sadler's Wells has also sired winners of all of Britain's other Cup races which have group status, namely the Yorkshire Cup, Goodwood Cup, Doncaster Cup and Jockey Club Cup, plus several winners of the St Leger and Irish St Leger. Several of these races also feature among the accomplishments of other good winners from Yeats's female line.

According to his trainer Aidan O'Brien, Yeats's "lung capacity and heart capacity are way greater than any other horse we've had." Could this be partly because he comes from a family which has produced generation after generation of distinguished stayers?

The story really starts with his fourth dam Rustic Bridge, a disappointing racemare by Bois Roussel. When Bois Roussel came flying through from the rear to win the 1938 Derby, his rider Charlie Elliott commented that he would have won by half a furlong had there been another furlong to travel. Bois Roussel's only subsequent appearance came over 1 7/8 miles in the Grand Prix de Paris, in which he finished a creditable third to the exceptional Nearco, so he clearly stayed very well.

Bois Roussel later passed on his stamina to two St Leger winners and his daughter Rustic Bridge became the dam of a St Leger winner when her daughter Cantelo proved too strong for the colts in the 1959 Classic. Cantelo was by Chanteur II, a horse who twice finished second in the Ascot Gold Cup, and the stamina Rustic Bridge inherited from Bois Roussel was frequently intensified by sending her to stallions with plenty of stamina, such as Chanteur, Alcide (another runner-up in the Gold Cup), Botticelli (winner of the Gold Cup in 1955), Sayajirao (winner of the St Leger) and Santa Claus (a Derby winner sired by a St Leger winner).

No wonder the fillies produced by these matings went on to produce some notable stayers. Rustic Bridge's Sayajirao filly, Rutherford Bridge, visited Cantelo's sire Chanteur to produce Bracey Bridge (winner of the Park Hill S., the so-called Fillies' St Leger) and Romp Home (winner of the Great Metropolitan H. over 2¼ miles). Romp Home in turn became the dam of Biskrah, winner of the G3 Doncaster Cup over 2¼ miles. This branch of the family also produced The Parson, a leading sire of jumpers.

Rustic Bridge's Alcide filly, Cantus, became the second dam of Tug of War, winner of the Goodwood Cup in the days when it was contested over 21 furlongs. The mating between Rustic Bridge and Botticelli resulted in Canvas, whose son Eric took the Chester Cup over 2¼ miles. The Yorkshire Oaks winner Connaught Bridge and the stayers Rhein Bridge and Tyrone Bridge also descend from Canvas.

Yeats comes from the branch of the family which descends from Rustic Bridge's Santa Claus filly Canaan. Although she never raced, Canaan showed that she possessed much of the family's stamina by producing Majestic Maharaj, a talented and durable winner at up to 2¼ miles. Her mating to the top miler Sparkler was no doubt intended to inject some speed but the resultant foal, Yeats's second dam Diamond Land, won over 1 5/8 miles before embarking on a fruitful broodmare career. Diamond Land's best runner, Ivanka, won the G1 Fillies' Mile as a two-year-old but didn't live long enough to become a broodmare, which is a shame in view of the achievements of her half-sisters Sahara Breeze and Lyndonville.

Sahara Breeze is best known as the dam of Alcazar, winner of the G1 Prix Royal Oak over 1 15/16 miles as a 10-year-old, but she also produced another Group 1 winner in Lady of Chad (Prix Marcel Bousac).

Lyndonville, a winner over 1¾ miles, has three stakes winners to her credit, headed by Yeats. The other two, the Danehill colts Tsukuba Symphony and Solskjaer, were both smart performers who combined very good form at around a mile with the ability to shine over a few extra furlongs.

So this branch of the family is clearly capable of producing not just high-class stayers but also Group 1-winning two-year-olds and group winners over such distances as nine and 10 furlongs. Yeats himself is by no means a one-dimensional stayer. A winner over a mile on his only juvenile start, he maintained his position as ante-post favourite for the Derby with two victories over a mile and a quarter in the spring of 2004. Although a muscular problem forced him onto the sidelines days before the Epsom classic, Yeats was still fast enough to easily defeat a strong collection of Group 1 winners in the Coronation Cup as a four-year-old.

Breeders should also remember that, with Sadler's Wells as his sire and a Top Ville mare as his dam, Yeats is bred on the same cross as Montjeu, whose dam stayed very well. The stamina in Montjeu's immediate pedigree hasn't stopped him siring a string of top-notch winners (often with help from mares from the speedy Mr. Prospector line). There's no reason why Yeats couldn't do the same, provided breeders can put aside their prejudice against the stamina which--together with his class, courage and soundness--makes him such a star.

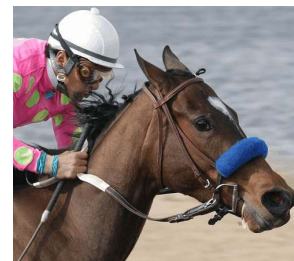
