Fame and Glory went from a Navan maiden to the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud in the space of three weeks in late season and showed battling qualities and a touch of class to hit the target on both occasions.

With a host of live Derby contenders at home, the fact that he was chosen to represent the stable in the 10-furlong G3 Ballysax S. was a significant pointer as to the regard in which he was held. After defying a five-pound penalty in that Apr. 19 Leopardstown contest, he emulated the stable's past luminaries Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) by doubling up in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial S. over the same track and trip May 10.

His perfect tally went west in the June 6 Blue Riband, but jockey Seamus Heffernan was one of a few to suggest that the result could have been different had Sea the Stars not been able to use his abundant speed to maximum effect. Even without the dual Classic winner in this line-up, the Ballydoyle team was intent on cranking up the pressure. In the early going, Rockhampton (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) set a furious gallop to string the field out across Kildare, while Johnny Murtagh was content to wait in mid-pack. Only asked a question as Colm O'Donoghue committed on Golden Sword at the top of the straight, Fame and Glory gathered in his barnmate readily before the eighth pole and needed only to be pushed out to confirm his superiority. "It was a good, solid gallop all the way and he relaxed very well," Murtagh explained. "I was rowing him along and, coming down the hill, I asked him to take closer order and he moved up very easily. We went by Colm well and it was just hands and heels from there. The way he worked during the week, I knew he was going to do something like this and he is a Group 1 winner at two who had had a lovely prep. I rode Sinndar (Ire) (Grand Lodge) and Alamshar (Ire) (Key of Luck) to win this and this horse has a similar profile--he could be a horse for the G1 Irish Champion S. [at Leopardstown Sept. 5] later in the year." Trainer Aidan O'Brien, whose seven wins include the last four editions of the race, added, "He was special last year and has a lot of tactical speed. He is a great traveller and is classy. Dropping back to a mile and a quarter will not be a problem for him and the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [at Longchamp Oct. 4] will really be considered as I don't think the ground matters to him. It was a great performance from Golden Sword. He improved again from Epsom."

Successful in three listed contests last term, Spanish Moon first showed reluctance when failing to load for the Oct. 25 G3 St Simon S. at Newbury, but completed his black-type hat trick in the Nov. 5 Listed Floodlit S. at Kempton. Nailed on the line by Eastern Anthem (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}) in the Mar. 28 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad Al Sheba on seasonal return, he refused at the gate in the Apr. 18 G3 John Porter S. back at Newbury and fell foul of strict British rules when repeating those antics before the May 2 G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket last time. Positioned in fourth for much of this contest, the eventual winner was pushed along to close off the home turn, was ridden along to challenge at the two pole and came under a power drive in the closing stages to impose superiority.

"We'd like to deeply thank France's racing authority and the stewards for allowing him to run and to also thank the stalls handlers who did a really good job with him. He's by no means dangerous--it's just that he is

Elaborating on the trainer's latter comment, Grimthorpe added, "Yes, he's in the Arc and, considering his performance today, he could be a possible for that race. We will keep all options open as there are some nice races later on [in the season], possibly in America."

Since King of Kings (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) became the first winner of Ballydoyle's new era in 1997 six years after Dr Vincent O'Brien's last scorer El Prado (Ire), Aidan O'Brien has surrendered just two renewals of this staging post. The operations' sole representative this time was Alfred Nobel and he became the latest to join the mighty honor roll which has included the likes of Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) (Danehill), George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) and Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). Second on debut over five furlongs at Naas Apr. 18 and third next time on heavy ground over this track and trip May 4, the bay got off the mark when asked to go a furlong longer at Leopardstown 24 days later and started as the well-backed favorite to extend the legacy here. Settled close to the early pace by Johnny Murtagh, the bay was angled out before the quarter pole and quickened to lead soon after. Kept up to his work late on, he was comfortably on top at the line as In Some Respect worked his way into the runner's-up spot. Ashalanda backed up a June 1 maiden win at the provincial track Langon in her only prior start, when trained by Jean-Claude Rouget, and upset the odds to claim a short-neck win in this pattern-race debut. Carrying her owner's second colors, the grey homebred was keen for the lead after the initial strides and maintained a generous tempo until the straight. She came under pressure soon after turning for home and refused to yield under vigorous urging in the closing stages to hold on in game fashion as Terre du Vent emerged best of the chasing pack. "I have to confess that I was surprised that she won," admitted trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre. "She's been with me for just 10 days thanks to Jean-Claude Rouget, who agreed we could use her as a pacemaker in this race. She did a nice piece of work last Tuesday, but it is a bit of a jump from there to what she achieved here and she was only in the race to ensure there was a decent pace. Her jockey [Freddy di Fede] did well to seize his chance when he noticed the others were not coming at him too hard. I'm a bit disappointed with the way Shamakiya ran as she seemed a bit flat today." Porte Bonheur, who recorded her first stakes victory in the Open Mind S. over this track in October 2007, added a pair of black-type scores at the Spa last summer, including the GIII Victory Ride S. Aug. 23. Third behind subsequent champion Indian Blessing (Indian Charlie) in the GII Gallant Bloom H. Sept. 20, the chestnut scored in her only attempt on a synthetic surface in her 2008 finale in Woodbine's Ontario Fashion S. Nov. 21. "She's a bit temperamental--she's got the redhead personality," said winning trainer David Duggan. "She ran well in her first race back this year [second in the GII Vagrancy H. May 24]. This was a legitimate test for her, to see if she could get the seven furlongs." What's next for the four-year-old? Duggan said, "We'll see how she comes out of the race. The [Grade I] Ballerina [seven furlongs at Saratoga, Aug. 29] has been a main goal for the year, for her to be a Grade I filly, but she has to get there in the right progression."

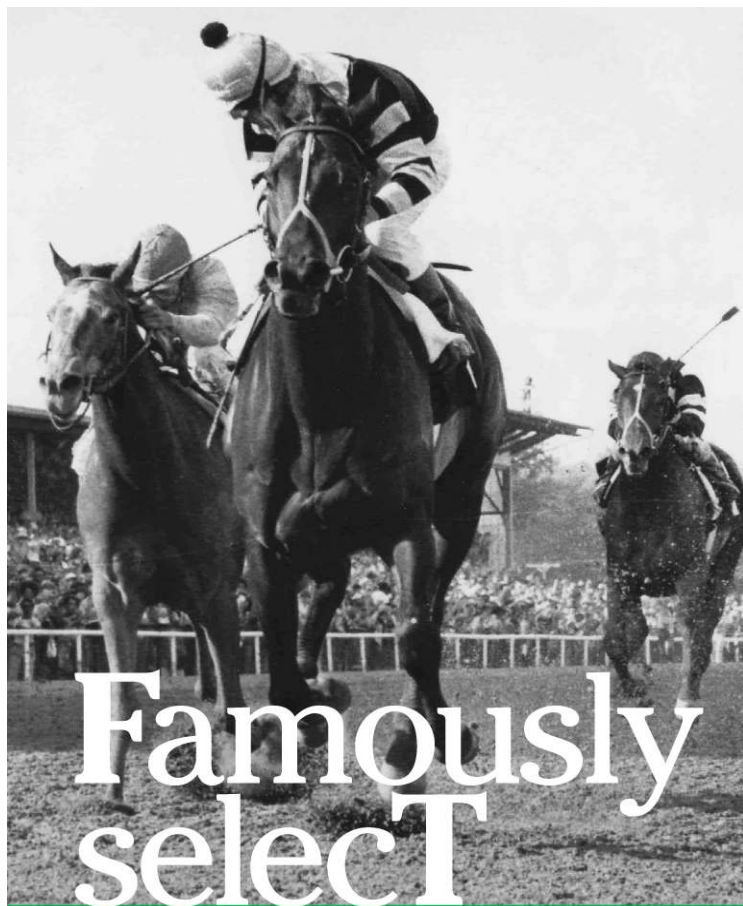

bon, the bay failed to get up in time and had to settle for seventh in the one-mile GII Las Palmas H. Oct. 24. She rounded out the season with a fourth against the boys in the 12-furlong GI Hollywood Turf Cup Dec. 6. In her 2009 reappearance, the six-year-old was a close-up second to **Magical Fantasy (Diesis**

{GB}) in the GII Santa Barbara H. Apr. 18 and found the nine-furlong trip of her latest start--the May 30 GI Gamely S.--too short and could only finish fourth.

"She's just kind of steady and long-striding--she just keeps coming," said winning rider **Garrett Gomez**. "[Yesterday], I thought she would take it to 'em somewhere along the way, but she really wouldn't help out too much." According to trainer **John Sadler**, the mare will make her next start in either the GI John C. Mabee H. Aug. 16 or the GI Beverly D. S. Aug. 8 before a possible tilt at the GI Melbourne Cup in November.

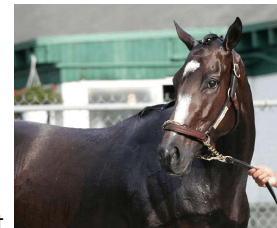

"She shipped great," confirmed Asmussen. Assistant Scott Blasi, who accompanied the GI Preakness S. winner on the trip north, indicated that the filly was placed in the stall formerly used by Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike). "She's settled in Curlin's old stall, which is now her stall, right next to my office," said Blasi. "She recovered very well. She seemed strong [following the race Saturday] and was starving when we fed her last night. She ate everything [Sunday] morning as well." Among the possibilities for Jess Jackson's star are the 10-furlong GI Coaching Club American Oaks at Belmont July 25; the nine-furlong GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga Aug 1; and the GI Haskell Invitational S. at Monmouth Park Aug. 2. Later in the summer, the strapping filly's dance card may include a run in the GI Alabama S. Aug. 22, the GI Travers S. Aug. 29 or the GI Personal Ensign S. Aug. 30. As for a possible match up with West Coast sensation Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}), Asmussen added, "I'm well versed in that with the Curlin-Big Brown thing last year. I'm just going to worry about her health and happiness, and then we'll sit down and decide what's best for her."

RESULTS OF LASIX STUDY TO BE RELEASED

The results of a study led by Colorado State University and research partners into the health and performance effects of Lasix will be announced Monday morning in South Africa at The Vaal Turf Club racecourse, near Johannesburg. The press conference will be archived and streamed and will be available at <http://www.cobainltd.com/phumelelappress> after 7 a.m. U.S. Eastern Daylight time this morning. The study undertook a massive research effort involving 200 horses in South Africa that competed in four days of racing coordinated for the purposes of the study. More than 90 percent of Thoroughbreds in North America are given Lasix before racing to control bleeding. Paul Morley, a veterinarian at Colorado State University, conducted the study with co-researchers Kenneth Hinchcliff from the University of Melbourne and Alan Guthrie from the University of Pretoria in South Africa, as use of Lasix is not allowed on race days in that country. The South African racing industry also provided support and funding for the study.

I have been involved in the Thoroughbred business in some capacity for over 20 years, and this is the most challenging time I can recall for the industry. There is no question that the strain on tracks and farms is real, and that help is needed. Other states have tied subsidies from gaming to the horse industry. It now appears Kentucky may do the same in order to protect the jobs and the state's "signature industry."

The timing and form of this help, or if the help comes at all, remains uncertain. The most recent Special Session of the Kentucky General Assembly raised hopes when the slots bill progressed farther than ever by passing the House and, separately, when the President of the Senate acknowledged the problems of the industry and offered a non-slots tax solution of approximately \$100 million. While the sincerity and practicality of the President's proposal has been questioned by many in the horse industry, the fact that the industry's problem was acknowledged by the Senate President was a major step forward. Unfortunately, the slots bill was killed in Senate committee and the Senate solution never gained traction in the House after passing the Senate unanimously.

Frustrated, some industry members lashed out, reminiscent of the old saying, "shoot first and ask questions later." Most of the anger has been directed toward Senate President David Williams, an unabashed opponent of expanded gaming. President Williams is responsible for assigning the slots bill to the Senate Appropriations & Revenue Committee, where it met its predicted demise, preventing a vote of the full Senate. Many industry members believed they had the votes to pass the slots bill if the bill got to the Senate floor, so not getting past the A&R committee was a stinging blow. Every senator on the A&R committee who voted against the bill drew flak, with Senators Alice Forgy Kerr and Ernie Harris attracting the most. Still, some bullets were saved for Senator Damon Thayer, heretofore the go-to person for the horse industry in the Senate. Not a member of Senate A&R, Thayer never voted on the slots bill, but he is blamed for not doing anything to prevent President Williams from sending the bill to the unfavorable A&R committee.

Senator Thayer has proven to be one of the Thoroughbred industry's best friends during his tenure in the legislature. He has led many issues, such as the creation of the Kentucky Breeders' Incentive Award Fund, sales integrity legislation, stronger medication rules, Racing Commission funding and, in this special session, incentives for the Breeders' Cup World Championships.

Thayer's past successes now seem to haunt him. The industry has placed an unrealistic expectation of power on him. "Control where David Williams sends this bill," they say. Expecting Senator Thayer to be able to check Senator Williams is like asking Rajon Rondo to guard Shaquille O'Neal. Rondo's a nice player and gets a lot done. But he will not stop Shaq when he makes up his mind to go to the basket. It just won't happen, no matter how much we want it to. Senator Thayer asked that the bill be assigned to the committee he chairs, State and Local Government. The bill was sent to Senate A&R.

Further irony for those blaming Thayer is that, for all those who believed the industry had the votes on the slots bill if it made it to the Senate Floor, every one of them was counting Thayer as a "yes" vote. So Thayer does not vote on the slots bill, is counted as a "yes" if it gets to the floor, is the major driver of the Breeders' Cup incentive, and ends the session as a legislator being painted as against the horse industry. "He could have done more to stop Williams," they say. While more can always be done, Williams was going to do what he felt was right. Thayer making an ineffective grandstanding move would have served him and the industry no good. Could he have done more? I am sure he could. So could a whole host of other industry leaders, such as prominent politically connected farm owners, racetrack company CEOs, U.S. congressmen and senators. Many of these people are more influential or much higher ranking Republicans than Senator Thayer. Either the industry did not ask these powerful people to influence Senate President Williams, or else they tried and failed. In either case, that is not Senator Thayer's fault. Where was the public positioning from these individuals that the industry seems to crave? These people either did nothing or chose to work behind the scenes. They just didn't get blamed when the bill failed. Any objective ranking of the 38 senators on either the slots issue or on their interest in the Thoroughbred industry would have Thayer at or near the top. Why start shooting at the top? What about all the people in the middle or the bottom who have given up on the industry? Where is the disdain for them?

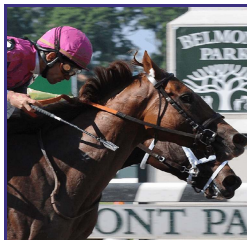
Thayer has been responsive to industry issues and has made it look so easy that when things do not go well he is the first one people think of. I just hope the emotion of the moment does not find the industry losing one of its advocates.
