F-T CATALOGUES 235 FOR SARATOGA

A total of 235 youngsters have been catalogued for Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Selected Yearling Sale, which will take place Aug. 10-11 at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in Saratoga Springs, New York. Both sessions of the sale will get underway at 6 p.m. Among the sires represented by their first yearlings are champion Bernardini (A.P. Indy) and Grade I winners Artie Schiller (El Prado {Ire}), Bellamy Road (Concerto), Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat), Borrego (El Prado {Ire}) and First Samurai (Giant's Causeway). Overseas sires Encosta de Lago (Aus) (Fairy King) and Monsun (Ger) (Konigsstuhl {Ger}) each have a yearling catalogued. "We have beaten down doors in recruiting for Saratoga this year, resulting in a catalogue which is 21 percent bigger than 2008 and the highest number catalogued in more than a decade," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "But more important than bigger is better, and this is an outstanding group of yearlings. Our traditional consignors have supported us strongly and we look forward to welcoming more than a dozen newcomers to Saratoga in 2009." For more information, go to www.fasigtipton.com.

MUNNINGS TACKLING TOM FOOL

★ "TDN Rising Star" ★ Munnings (Speightstown), a sparkling winner of the GII Woody Stephens S. June 6 in his last start ([video](#)), will take on his elders in the GII Tom Fool H. July 5 at Belmont. The blaze-faced chestnut has been assigned 112 pounds for the seven-furlong test; heavyweight Fabulous Strike (Smart Strike) will tote 123 pounds. "I wanted to wait and see the weights--we thought we'd get a break as he is a three-year-old," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "We won this race with Trippi [in 2000] as a three-year-old. It's ambitious to try older horses at this time of year, but it's our best option to keep him at a distance he likes and at a track he likes." Prior to Trippi, the last sophomore to take the Tom Fool was Groovy in 1986. Pletcher will also send out **American Dance** (A.P. Indy) against his peers in the GII Dwyer S. July 4. Third in the GII Remsen S. in his lone previous black-type appearance, the Edward Evans homebred is coming off a 6 1/4-length score in a Belmont allowance May 21 ([video](#)). "He seems to be an improving colt," Pletcher added. "I am hoping his last race was a breakthrough race for him. I wish the [Dwyer] was a mile and an eighth or longer, but he has been training well for this."

PRECOCITY REPORTS

They should send the Thought Police around, really: what am I thinking, running freshman sire figures on the first of July? Even the most ardent glorifiers of precocity would concede that the vast majority of horses which are going to become 'Classic' (or, in American parlance, 'two-turn') stallions very likely won't even appear on the list. But who wouldn't agree, also, that the best way to look at statistics, always, is in context.

So in context we shall look at them. At the end of June, precocity rules, no doubt about it. We can learn three things from looking at a list this 'young' this early. First, of course, we can learn about precocity. Stallions whose number of runners are already in double digits, and include several winners, are siring precocity. Black-type horses are a bonus at this point; more important, really, are how many are getting to the races early, and how many are winning.

Interestingly, for all that the U.S. is the cradle of speed, European sires habitually have far more early two-year-old runners than do North Americans, and that's the case again this year. The leading North American freshman sire on July 1 (see Table 1, p5) is **Wildcat Heir**, leading the pack with 16 runners and seven winners. Four of the top five North American freshman sires (by progeny earnings) at this point have 12 or more runners, and four or more winners. By contrast, six of the 10 leading European freshman sires have had 20 or more runners, and nine of the top 10 have each had five or more winners already!

Wildcat Heir, who tops the North American list in runners, winners and progeny earnings, is an early product of Journeyman Stud, which is rapidly becoming one of Florida's leading stallion stations since the reshuffle that has seen some big Florida outfits shift their operations to Kentucky. Florida has long been a nursery for leading freshman sires, and Wildcat Heir comes to the table with the same sort of credentials that have always worked so well down there--speed and precocity. From the third crop by Forest Wildcat (Storm Cat), Wildcat Heir broke his maiden over five furlongs at two and ran second to Whywhywhy in the GII Sanford S. at Saratoga in just his second start. He then went on the shelf and made only one start at three, but came back at four to win the six-furlong GI Frank DeFrancis Memorial, recording a Beyer 109. He's been well promoted and well managed, and is certainly off to the sort of start you'd hope for if you were managing a Storm Cat-line freshman sire in Florida.

Limehouse, by Gone West's son Grand Slam, won two black-type races at Churchill Downs' spring meet as a two-year-old, including the GIII Bashford Manor, and was third in two Grade IIs at two. He won the seven-furlong GII Hutcheson at three, then stretched out to score in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby, ran third in the GI Blue Grass S. and was a good fourth in the GI Kentucky Derby. At four, he added the GII Brooklyn H. at nine furlongs (Beyer 112). He's already had three winners at 4 1/2 furlongs (at Hollywood Park, Woodbine and Arlington) and Olredlgetcha, who captured the five-furlong Victoria S. in his debut at Woodbine (sadly, Olredlgetcha was euthanized last week after developing a staph infection). These are early hints that there could be a touch of class there. **Closing Argument**, the 2005 GI Kentucky Derby runner-up from Successful Appeal's first crop, has only one winner thus far, the filly *Midst*, but her win last weekend in Woodbine's My Dear S. propels him into third place on this fledgling freshman sire list, inches ahead of **Offlee Wild**. By Wild Again out of a half-sister to Dynaformer, Offlee Wild's one of those you would categorize as showing surprisingly early precocity (12 runners, five winners, two black-type placed horses), considering he was a two-turn graded stakes winner at three and four, and a Grade I winner at five. **Cont. p3**

Rounding out the North American top five is **Pollard's Vision**, a hard-working, two-turn son of Carson City who won the GII Illinois Derby and three Grade IIIs. He also hit the board in four other Grade II-Grade III Derbys in Louisiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia, and was twice Grade I-placed, and stayed well up to nine furlongs. He has four winners, including a Group 3-placed colt in Italy. Also with three or more winners so far are the

\$1.25-million yearling **Consolidator** (Storm Cat, four winners) and the Texas-based 2004 GII Louisiana Derby winner **Wimbledon** (Wild Rush, three).

There's not a runaway leader in Europe yet, either, but there are plenty of freshman sires with plenty of runners and winners, as I've noted (see Table II, p6). You can't help noticing that the top three by progeny earnings, at this early date, are three Coolmore sires. Current leader is the unbeaten (in only three starts) 2005 G1 English 2000 Guineas winner **Footstepsinthesand**, from Giant's Causeway's first crop. He's sired 29 runners already, seven of which are winners, including two black-type horses. You know I hate 'hasty generalization'--jumping to conclusions based on impossibly scanty evidence--so here's a prime example: both of Footstepsinthesand's black-type placed runners are out of Danehill mares, as is the highly touted Aidan O'Brien-trained ♀ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♂ Steinbeck.

Oratorio, sire of Royal Ascot's Chesham S. winner Big Audio, is in second spot, just ahead of barnmate **Antonius Pius**, who has nine winners from 31 runners, leading all European freshman sires in both categories. Oratorio, who is by Danehill out of a Vaguely Noble mare, broke his maiden in his first start at two, and never ran in anything but a group race again. His last 10 starts (his last two starts at two, and all eight of his starts at three) were all in Group 1 races. He won three--the G1 Jean-Luc Lagardere at two and the 10-furlong Eclipse and Irish Champion S. at three, in both races defeating G1 Epsom Derby winner Motivator--and finished second, third, or fourth in five others. Ten furlongs was his best trip, but he was Classic-placed at a mile as well. Antonius Pius ran in six top-class one-mile races, plus the six-furlong G1 July Cup. He should have won the G1 Poule des Poulains, but jinked violently right when he made the lead and ended up fifth. He also placed in the G1 St. James's Palace S., G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp and GI Breeders' Cup Mile (second to Singletary).

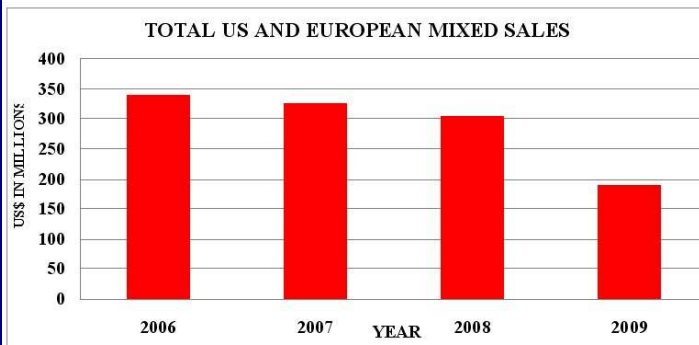

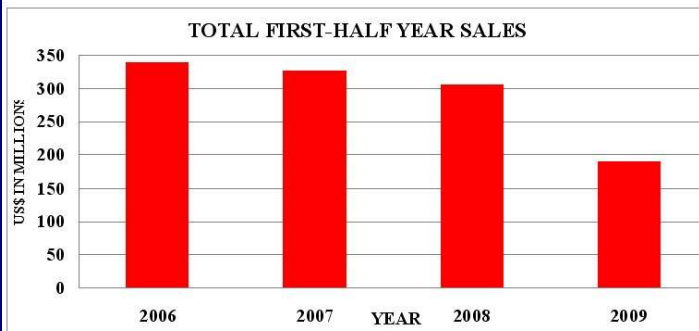
Weekly Sales Ticker

"Last week we saw that the combined North American and European two-year-old market was down 30 percent in gross and 23 percent in average, with six percent fewer catalogued than in 2008. The mixed sales were a completely different story -- down 56 percent in gross and 43 percent in average, though sellers must have seen the writing on the wall, as the number even catalogued was down 24 percent. When we add the first-half sales together, 15 percent fewer were catalogued, and it's all been down 38 percent in gross and 26 percent in average."

The Maktoums' first representative on this list is fourth-ranked **Dubawi**, his sire Dubai Millennium's only real shot to survive as a name in pedigrees. Dubawi went three-for-three at two, including a win in Ireland's G1 National S., usually a happy hunting ground for Aidan O'Brien or another of those top Irish trainers. Having run fifth in the G1 English 2000 Guineas to 'Footsteps,' Dubawi bounced back to win the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and ran third to Motivator in the G1 Epsom Derby, then came back to a mile to win the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois and run second to Starcraft in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. Fifth on the list is **Le Vie dei Colori** (Efisio), who won 12 and finished second in the other two of his first 14 lifetime starts, mostly in Italy, but also including a second to Hold That Tiger in what was then still the G1 Grand Criterium (now the Lagardere). Le Vie dei Colori unfortunately died before he had any runners. The G2 King's Stand-winning sprinter **Chineur** (Fasliyev) is next, followed by the G1 winning sprinter **Pastoral Pursuits**. Interestingly, he is by Bahamian Bounty, who himself has seven winners, including two black-type placed at Royal Ascot, from his own first crop after being resyndicated at The National Stud after Pastoral Pursuit's successes.

The G1 Prix de l'Abbaye winner **Avonbridge**, an In Reality-line sprinter by the short-lived Averti (by Warning, by Known Fact) and the dual seven-furlong Group 3 winner **Arakan** (Nureyev) are the other two European freshman sires with six winners each so far. Arakan looks as if he might be punching above his weight.

I mentioned earlier there are three things we can glean from looking at these lists this early. The first is precocity. The second is that we can sometimes detect early signs of success by 'two-turn' sires, whose progeny we don't expect to see out this early, at least not out successfully. In North America, we should particularly point out **Rock Hard Ten** (Kris S.), whose first winner, Long Lashes, won a six-furlong listed race at the Curragh last weekend; and **Eddington**, son of Unbridled, who's had two winners in the last week, including one in England. What's a son of Unbridled doing having a two-year-old winner in England? Somebody--fortunately--didn't read the script. In Europe, I mentioned **Starcraft** a couple of weeks ago; his only winner is a black-type winner, Don't Tell Mary. Another horse whose runners (as seen by me on TV) really look the part is **Shamardal**, like Dubawi a Darley stallion.

By Giant's Causeway out of a full sister to Street Cry, Shamardal was six-for-six on turf, including the G1 Dewhurst, and the French double of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (a mile) and the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (brilliant Dettori ride), run for the first time in 2005 at the shorter distance of 2100 meters (10 1/2 furlongs). He only has two winners so far, but I like what I see. I predict a big move forward by him as the distances lengthen.

The third thing we learn from looking at freshman sire lists this early is who's going to be hot at the yearling sales, kicking off at Fasig-Tipton July in a little under three weeks. This is, of course, directly linked to our first subject, precocity. Wildcat Heir, Limehouse, and Closing Argument have four, three, and four respectively catalogued at Fasig-Tipton; Consolidator, who also has four winners already, has five catalogued.

Another sire who's entitled to be hot is **Dehere**, now 18 years old, but whose first crop back after being sold to Japan and dual-hemispherer in Australia (very successful there) includes last weekend's GIII Debutante S. winner Decelerator at Churchill Downs. If we could count Dehere as a freshman sire, he'd be number two right now, behind Wildcat Heir, but a few dollars ahead of Limehouse.

The Derby Sire...

Okay, you're probably tired of hearing me call the G1 Grand Prix de Paris, now run over 2400 meters at Longchamp on Bastille Day (July 14) the 'new' French Derby. So to avoid all the arguments, I'll just call it the 'unofficial' French Derby. Including it, Fame and Glory's easy win in the G1 Irish Derby made it seven 'Derby' winners from Montjeu's first five crops to race: Motivator and Authorized in the G1 Epsom Derby; Hurricane Run, Frozen Fire, and Fame and Glory in the G1 Irish Derby; and Scorpion and Montmartre in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris. That is some record.

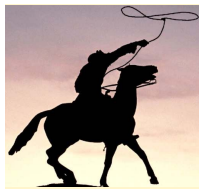

Charitable Man Skipping Dwyer...

Aug. 1 at Saratoga or the GI Haskell Invitational Aug. 2 at Monmouth. In his most recent start, Charitable Man was fourth in the GI Belmont S. June 6.

'Stars' Triple Crown Bid Ruled Out...

Christopher Tsui's **Sea the Stars (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), the first horse to complete the 2000 Guineas-Derby double since Nashwan in 1989, will not bid for the elusive Triple Crown after trainer John Oxx ruled the dual Classic winner out of running in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 12. "We discussed the possibility of a Doncaster St Leger entry, but decided against it," Oxx told *Racing Post*. "Sea the Stars will continue to race over a mile and a quarter or a mile and a half for the rest of the season, starting with the [G1] Coral-Eclipse S. on Saturday. The plan is to run at Sandown, with the proviso that the ground will be suitable for him. That proviso is always there as far as he is concerned, as he needs really good or good-to-firm ground."

Fortune Bags 'Rip' Ride...

Jockey Jimmy Fortune has bagged the plum ride aboard Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown. Johnny Murtagh, who was aboard in all five prior lifetime starts--including a pair of fourth-place finishes in the May 2 G1 2000 Guineas and June 6 G1 Epsom Derby--failed in his bid to overturn a ban incurred during the Royal Ascot. "It's great news and I'm delighted," said Fortune of getting the chance to ride the winner of last year's G3 Tyro S. "Dropping back to a mile and a quarter should suit him, and I should think he has a great chance."

Conditioned by 83-year-old Sabino Arias, Lady Shatzzi--a three-time international winner outside of Peru--was annexing her third straight victory after collecting a pair of stakes over 10 and 12 furlongs on the dirt. With her victory, Lady Shatzzi became the first female to win Peru's premiere race since champion three-year-old female Batuka (Bates Motel) accomplished the feat in 1999.

Sparkling Oro finished strongest nearest the rail to post an upset victory over juvenile champion and dual Classic winner Maitena in Peru's premier turf race for the fairer sex. The imported daughter of Van Nistelrooy became the first U.S.-bred filly to win the Pamplona since Pigricia (Lord Avie), who won the event in 2001 and went on to earn champion three-year-old filly honors that season. Conditioned by leading trainer Juan Suarez, who sent out half of this 14-horse field, Sparkling Oro, a winner of three straight earlier in the season, including two previous victories on the turf, was third behind Maitena most recently in the May 23 Clasico Republica Argentina in her stakes debut. This race honors Pamplona, the first filly to capture Peru's Triple Crown and later the dam of 1976 G1 Epsom Derby hero Empery. Past winners of the Pamplona include Natalie Too (Irish River {Fr}), who later sold for \$525,000 at the 1999 Keeneland November sale as a broodmare prospect after starting in the inaugural GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf at Gulfstream Park.

Winner of two-thirds of Rio de Janeiro's Triple Crown series for fillies, she inhaled the leaders in the stretch with an explosive turn of foot to come home a clear winner. Group 1 winner Time for Fun held second, 1 1/4 lengths clear of Mirassol. Smile Jenny, annexing her fourth group stakes victory, came into this off a narrow defeat in the G1 Grande Premio Zelia Gonzaga Peixoto de Castro Apr. 21. The G1 Grande Premio Brasil, Rio de Janeiro's premier event in August, is under consideration for her next start.
