A talented field of nine sophomore fillies faces the starter, including a formidable Ned Evans entry of **Cat Moves** (Tale of the Cat) and **Light Green** (Pleasantly Perfect). While the former is perfect in her two career trips to the post, it is her barnmate that is likely to attract

the lion's share of attention this afternoon. After graduating in her three-year-old debut at Gulfstream Jan. 4, she was runner-up in allowance company in Hallandale Feb. 15. The confirmed front-runner has been untouchable in her two appearances since, using her blinding speed to win an Apr. 11 Gulfstream allowance by 6 1/2 lengths and Belmont's May 15 Fall Aspen S. by eight lengths. "I am hoping for a repeat of her last race," said trainer Todd Pletcher, adding, "The Prioress is a tough race." Prioress S. cont p2

LOOKING TO THE STARS

At this point, the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Epsom Derby hero **Sea the Stars (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) is wearing a distinct air of invincibility, but the test of his mettle continues today as Sandown stages the traditional first meeting of the Classic luminaries and the older brigade in the G1 Coral-Eclipse S. Due to a late twist courtesy of the Kildare weather ahead of last Sunday's G1 Irish Derby, Christopher Tsui's homebred has been diverted onto the hallowed path of Nashwan, the last to follow up here after triumphs in the Newmarket and Epsom Classics in 1989. "The Epsom race took nothing out of him and he has continued in his work with his usual enthusiasm," trainer John Oxx warned yesterday. "Nobody really knows what his best trip is, but the course of the year will be the answer to that. The speed he showed in the Guineas indicates that 10 furlongs will be no problem to him, and he doesn't need a mile and a half to be at his best, so he is very versatile." A potential Achilles' heel could be rain-softened ground, but, although Sandown was hit by a deluge yesterday, the surface should be fine for the main attraction. "My information is that it is pretty good ground all round and similar to Epsom on Derby day, so we're not anticipating any problem at the moment," Oxx added. Coral-Eclipse cont. p4

the pace in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 1, she led past every pole in winning the GI Acorn S. over this surface June 6. The Zetcher homebred showed the ability to rate off the pace in her California races, and would be well served by a return to those tactics this afternoon. Tonja Terranova

has been overseeing the training of Gabby's Golden Gal since the Acorn and likes her chances today. "I think she's going into the race just as good as she did for the Acorn," Terranova commented. "Her last two breezes have been in hand. The dark bay daughter of Gabriellina Giof (GB) (Ashkalani {Ire}) earned the bullet for each work, going :47 June 20 (best of 73) and again June 28 (best of 40) at Belmont.

Vodacom Durban July H. cont.

The dead-heat winner of last year's Durban July H., **Pocket Power** looks tough in his title defense, despite conceding his rivals anywhere from six to 17 pounds. The reigning Horse of the Year has won five of his seven appearances over the last 12 months, including a 1 1/4-length defeat of **Kapil** in the G1 Gold Challenge S. at Clairwood June 13. An interesting entrant in the field is **River Jetez**, the year-younger full sister to the race favorite. Also trained by Mike Bass, the bay was third to her brother in this year's G1 J & B Met H. in January, where she finished just a length in arrears. She filled the same spot behind Pocket Power in the Gold Challenge in her most recent appearance.

As far as older horses go, Ballymacoll Stud's **Conduit** is in prime position, based on his exploits last year as well as his four-year-old return. Despite winning the G1 St Leger over Doncaster's extended 14-furlong trip, the homebred demonstrated adequate speed for a test like this when rolling to an impressive success in the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita in October. A nose separated him and **Cima de Triomphe** when attempting to give that performer seven pounds in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. over this track and trip last time May 28. Conduit hails from the Sir Michael Stoute stable. "We were obviously very pleased with his first run of the season," Ballymacoll's Peter Reynolds told *PA Sport*. "Sir Michael's horses always tend to improve for their first run, too, so that is a positive. Sir Michael has always said this horse is effective over a range of distances--he is not your typical St Leger winner. John Oxx's horse looks exceptional, there is no doubting that. It's not a one-horse race; we are in there with a chance we hope."

Aidan O'Brien is looking for a fifth renewal with Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's **Rip Van Winkle**, who seeks to break through after two eye-catching efforts when fourth behind Sea the Stars in the Guineas and Derby. He had suffered an interrupted preparation before Newmarket and a glitch before Epsom, so there could be more to come. Jimmy Fortune has been called on in the absence of the banned Johnny Murtagh. "He's a very nice horse, and for Johnny to ride him in the Derby, he has obviously being doing everything right at home," Fortune said. "Sea the Stars is obviously a high-class horse and he's the one we'll all have to beat, and Conduit is also a solid horse. The trip could be ideal for us, as there were stamina doubts going into the Derby, and we haven't got that much to find with Sea the Stars." O'Brien later revealed that Rip Van Winkle had suffered a slight setback, but was on course for the clash. "Rip Van Winkle gave himself a bit of a knock on the inside of a hock on Thursday," he told *Racing Post*. "We were a bit concerned, but we were happier with him this morning. He cantered and seemed okay, so we're happy enough to let him run." Luca Cumani is hoping that Teruya Yoshida's Cima de Triomphe can step up off his Brigadier Gerard S. win and emulate another former Italian runner in Falbrav (Ire) (Fairy King), who succeeded in 2003.

The well-travelled **Spice Route** makes his Monmouth debut. The five-year-old gelding was two-for-10 last season, taking an optional claimer at Woodbine in August and the GIII Tropical Turf H. at Calder by a nose in December. Third behind **Presious Passion** in the Feb. 21 GII Mac Diarmida S. at Gulfstream, he rallied for a two-length victory in the Apr. 24 GII Elkhorn S. at Keeneland, with **Brass Hat** hitting the line in third. Brass Hat turned the tables last time, outgaming Spice Route by a half-length in the May 23 GIII Louisville H. at Churchill, but connections are hopeful that Spice Route will come out on top again today. "He's a very consistent horse," said his trainer, Roger Attfield. "He always runs his race. I think he's ready for this." Presious Passion led gate to wire to take the 2008 edition of the U.N. He went off form after that race, running off the board in four straight, but got back on track with a front-running score in the Dec. 13 GII W.L. McKnight H. at Calder. Runner-up in the Jan. 24 Sunshine Millions Turf prior to his Mac Diarmida victory, the six-year-old was freshened after finishing second in the off-the-turf GIII Pan American H. at Gulfstream Mar. 21. He returned to take the Monmouth S. going nine panels over this course June 13. "I've tried to keep him relaxed and happy between races," trainer Mary Hartmann remarked. "He goes out after the last break when there's no traffic on the track and he can be relaxed. He stands out there for a half-hour, and then he backs up to the quarter-pole and stands for another 15 minutes, and then he gallops two miles. It keeps him happy."

Runner-up to Curlin (Smart Strike) in the 2008 G1 Dubai World Cup, **Asiatic Boy** won Round 3 of the G2 Maktoum Challenge over this distance Mar. 5, earning him 2-1 favoritism in this year's World Cup. The bay was no factor in the \$6-million feature, fading back through the field into 12th, but made a promising U.S. debut in his latest, rallying to be second in the GI Stephen Foster H. at Churchill June 13. He stretches back out to his best trip this afternoon. **It's A Bird** brings career-best form into his Grade I debut. Winner of the \$1-million Sunshine Millions Classic this winter, the dark bay was third in the GII New Orleans H. Mar. 14, but has since posted victories in the Apr. 4 GII Oaklawn H. and the May 25 GIII Lone Star Park H. His 107 Beyers from those three scores are easily best in the field.

Jockey Calvin Borel could not quite get Mine That Bird (Birdstone) home to take the GI Belmont S. June 6, but made amends in a big way with Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) in last Saturday's GI Mother Goose S. He makes a return trip to the Big Apple to pilot **Warrior's Reward** after making his own declaration of independence from the Derby winner. First or second in four starts with Borel in the irons, Warrior's Reward skimmed the rail to take a May 1 seven-furlong Churchill allowance by 2 1/4 lengths over Munnings (Speights-town), who returned to land the GII Woody Stephens S. June 6.

Stretched back to two turns for his latest, the bay carried a narrow lead past the eighth pole, but was tagged on the wire in the GIII Northern Dancer S. June 13. **Just Ben** was third in the aforementioned May 1 allowance, improved to third in a local allowance 15 days later and rolled to a 13 3/4-length victory going seven panels on the Belmont S. undercard June 6. He has since been purchased from Zayat Stables by Lael Stables and tries a route of ground for the first time today.

High Heeled bids to uphold the form of the June 5 G1 Epsom Oaks, in which she was 2 1/2 lengths behind Sariska (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) and Midday (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}). That was a vast improvement on her disappointing effort when only fourth behind the former in the G3 Musidora S. at York May 13. Trainer Barry Hills's son and assistant Charlie Hills told *PA Sport*, "We've been very pleased with the filly since Epsom, when she ran so well. Nothing showed up as to why she ran so poorly at York, I just think she had a bad day; she was maybe in season. There was a short period at Epsom where we thought she was coming to win, but she still ran a great race." Henry Cecil boasts seven renewals to his name and relies on **Flame of Gibraltar**, who stepped up off a smooth maiden win at Lingfield June 4 with a second to Flying Cloud (Ire) (Storming Home {GB}) in the G2 Ribblesdale S. at Royal Ascot a fortnight later. **July Jasmine** and the Listed Pretty Polly S. winner **Take the Hint** were fifth and sixth, respectively, in the Ribblesdale, and represent Khalid Abdullah, whose Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*, "Both of them ran well enough at Ascot, but naturally we thought they would do a little bit better than they did. It's hard to separate them at this stage, and they have a little bit to prove."

Le Havre Retired...

Gerard Augustin Normand's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club hero **Le Havre (Ire)** (Noverre--Marie Rheinberg {Ger}, by Surako {Ger}) has been retired due to injury, *Jour de Galop* revealed Thursday. No stud has been named for the winner of the June 7 Chantilly Classic, who was also runner-up to Silver Frost (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}) in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp May 10 after beating Naaqoos (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in Maisons-Laffitte's Listed Prix Djebel. Trainer Jean-Claude Rouget revealed that the colt sustained serious tendon injuries during his final outing. He retires as the winner of four of his six starts and just over €1 million in prize money.

Man o'War Takes Shape...

The July 11 GI Man o'War S. at Belmont Park is shaping up to be one to watch, with Grade I winners **Dancing Forever** (Rahy), **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat) and **Grand Couturier (GB)** (Grand Lodge) all pointing to the 11-furlong turf test. Dancing Forever, winner of the GI Manhattan H. by a nose last year, signed off on 2008 with a third in the Oct. 25 GI Breeders' Cup Turf. He resurfaced in an optional claimer on the turf at Belmont May 31 and rallied to be third again. "He was always a big horse and it took him a while to get things together in his career," trainer Shug McGaughey said. "He had a break over the winter, and whatever bumps and bruises he had had a chance to go away." But the six-year-old's participation in the Man o'War depends on the weather. "I made the mistake of running on soft turf a couple times last year," McGaughey said. "I won't make that mistake again. Hopefully, it will quit raining." Gio Ponti, bidding for his third straight Grade I tally, took the Mar. 7 Frank E. Kilroe Mile H. by a nose under Ramon Dominguez, then closed from out of the clouds with Garrett Gomez to capture the June 6 Manhattan H. He will be reunited with Dominguez Saturday. The bay stretches out past 10 panels for the first time. "If the ground gets firmer, he should get a mile and three-eighths," trainer Christophe Clement said. Clement also revealed that he will send **Sal the Barber** (Alphabet Soup), handy winner of the July 1 Don Jack S. at Belmont, to either the Aug. 8 GI Secretariat S. at Arlington or the Aug. 14 GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame S. at Saratoga.

1 Inca King Sir Cat Asmussen 8-1
Got very good late in his three-year-old year, but hasn't been able to get back to that level since. He was wide both turns last time (3w3w), running better than it looked, and comes into this making the third start of his campaign. With a weight pull and the rail, he's a contender even if he doesn't go forward, and he might.

2 Seaspeak Mizzen Mast Nicks 8-1
Came off a layoff last August and had a great forward moving pattern after that, then ran a new top in his four-year-old debut. He was able to pair-up that effort in his last despite making the difficult ship to Texas, and has had six weeks since. This colt is on the verge of being a top grass horse, and has a big shot.

3 Wise River Belong to Me Hanna 6-1
Has gotten better each year, and the figures he ran in his last two were the best of his life. If he runs back to those he'll be very strong, so the question is how much the two big efforts took out of him. On number power alone, he's a contender, and he'll be a decent price.

4 Thorn Song Unbridled's Song Romans 9-5
Was a great bet last time, when he was able to win a Grade I against weak California competition without running his best. This time it's the opposite story--he's spotting significant weight to good but lesser known horses, and is unlikely win even if he fires his best shot. If he does run his best and saves ground on the lead, Thorn Song could get a piece of this, but at a short price he's a clear bet-against.

5 Mr. Sidney Storm Cat Mott 4-1
Won a very weak Grade I at Keeneland before bouncing on dirt last time in a spot where he had absolutely no shot. He has the same problem as Thorn Song--at the weights, even if he runs his best he figures to come up a couple of lengths short. That means he would need a new top and, with a five-year-old, that's not an attractive proposition at a short price.

6 Passager (Fr) Anabaa Attfield 8-1
Ran his usual solid effort to run second to Mr. Sidney at Keeneland, and slightly better last time over Polytrack. If he can pair that one up and work out a trip he could get a piece of this, but a win is unlikely.

7 Tizdejavu Tiznow Fox 7-2
Ran a big one for a three-year-old last summer, tailed off, then disappeared. His return was decent, and he has had good time into this. This colt is similar to the other two favorites in that, at the weights, his previous best doesn't make him very strong, but he's younger than they are, and only making his second start as a four-year-old, so there is some chance he will run a new top. Still, taking a short price on a horse that needs a new top just to have a chance is not a great idea.

8 Artic Cry Rahy Kenneally 20-1
Has been a lot better with Lasix than he was in France, but is still well short of competitive here.

Bottom Line: We factor weight and ground loss into Thoro-Graph figures for a reason. At the weights and post positions, the morning-line favorites in the Firecracker are bet-againsts, with Inca King, Seaspeak and Wise River the ones to use.

A colt by Kahal (GB) out of the Salaadim mare Absolut Star (SAf) led the way at yesterday's opening session of the Sibaya Yearling Sale, bringing R240,000 from Intercontinental Bloodstock. A total of 127 lots brought R7,355,000, for an average of R57,913. The aggregate was down 22 percent from last year's gross of R9,435,000. "In the present economic climate, it was good to see that many breeders were willing to let their stock go instead of hanging on," said BloodStock SA's CEO Jan Naude. "The decline in turnover was in line with the one recorded at the Emperors Palace National Yearling Sale, so it's fair to say we're holding our own."
