TATTERSALLS JULY STARTS TODAY

Tattersalls' mixed July Sale starts at 10 a.m. this morning in Newmarket with the first-day emphasis on proven and potential breedingstock, including drafts from many of the top bloodstock operations. Among the established mares is [lot 174, Utmost \(Ire\)](#) (Most Welcome), who was bought by agent Grant Pritchard-Gordon for 11,500gns at Tattersalls in December, but is likely to show a healthy profit when reappearing for sale through the Castlebridge

Consignment. Covered by Oasis Dream (GB), the 11-year-old has already produced Utmost Respect (GB) (Danetime {Ire}), winner of this season's G2 Duke Of York S. and G3 Greenlands S. There is a three-in-one package with [lot 158](#), who is offered by the executors of long-standing breeder Rex Mead. She is dual listed winner **Ripples Maid (GB)** (Dansili {GB}). The six-year-old mare, who is believed in foal to Compton Place (GB), has a Bahamian Bounty (GB) filly foal at foot. [Lot 99, Street Style \(Ire\)](#) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), is a winning three-parts sister to G1 Garden City Breeders' Cup S. winner Luas Line (Ire) (Danehill), who cost €280,000 as a yearling and is offered with a Moss Vale (Ire) covering from Lady O'Reilly's Castlemartin Stud. [Lot 163, Pivotting \(GB\)](#) (Pivotal {GB})--an unraced half-sister to G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner Necklace (GB) (Darshaan)--is consigned from Meon Valley Stud with an Oratorio (Ire) cover. Meanwhile, [lot 456, Rivalry \(GB\)](#) (Medicean {GB}), is an unraced three-year-old half-sister to Britain's top stallion Pivotal (GB) (Polar Falcon) offered by Cheveley Park Stud. Likely to be one of the standout horses in training is [lot 596, Jeanie Johnston \(Ire\)](#) (One Cool Cat). The filly, who broke her maiden June 10, finished a close second in the June 27 Listed Empress S. at Newmarket for trainer Karl Burke since the catalogue's publication. **Tattersalls cont. p2**

SPA BREEZE FOR RACHEL ALEXANDRA

Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro), who arrived at Saratoga Race Course a day after her tour-de-force GI Mother Goose S. victory at Belmont June 27, was sent out for her first official work at the upstate New York oval Monday morning. Under regular exercise rider Dominic Terry, the sophomore negotiated the first quarter mile in :25 and completed four furlongs in :50.67 over the Oklahoma Training Track. Owned by Jess Jackson, the filly galloped out five panels in 1:05. "She went in an easy half mile to get her accustomed to her surroundings and the track," said Scott Blasi, assistant to trainer Steve Asmussen. "It was a maintenance breeze. We weren't out there to impress anyone today." Explaining the decision to ship the big filly right after her 19 1/4-length romp in the Mother Goose, Blasi added, "That's why we brought her up here after that race so she could have her full week galloping over it. It's pretty normal for her. I get nervous every time she walks out of the barn. We want every thing to go right. We don't want loose horses around her. We want to take care of her." Blasi indicated that the GI Preakness S. winner will likely work again next Monday.

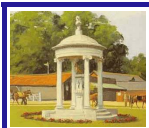
SUMMER BIRD WORKS FOR HASKELL

Summer Bird (Birdstone), who arrived at Monmouth Park July 3, had his first work over the Jersey Shore oval yesterday in preparation for his next start in the GI Haskell Invitational Aug. 2. Winner of the June 6 GI Belmont S. in his latest start, the chestnut, who was accompanied by exercise rider Leo Atempa, breezed five furlongs in 1:04.40. "It was fine, it was just what we wanted," trainer Tim Ice told *Daily Racing Form*. "He stretched his legs and he galloped out very strong. We usually pull him up at the half-mile pole, but the rider couldn't get him pulled up to the three-eighths. It was an easy maintenance work. We'll get more into him as we get closer to the race."

Trainer Jim Bolger's draft on Thursday night includes [lot 608](#), recent Limerick listed winner **Ard Na Greine (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), and [lot 607](#), the progressive **Via Galilei (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). [Lot 653](#), Group 1-placed **Medicine Path (GB)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) has not run since being a beaten favourite in last season's G2 Sandown Mile. He is offered from Peter Chapple-Hyam's stable. Also hailing from that operation is the improving **Exceptional Art** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), who is offered as [lot 657](#). The three-year-old is part of the annual dispersal by owner Matthew Green. [Lot 357](#), six-year-old **Tamagin** (Stravinsky), heads to the sale on the back of a heritage handicap success--his 10th career win--at Windsor June 27.

This year's 732-horse catalogue is a day shorter and 183 lots smaller than the 2008 edition. "We've got a slightly smaller catalogue this year, but there's no shortage of quality," said Tattersalls's marketing director Jimmy George. "There is plenty to appeal to buyers from around the world as well as the domestic market, both flat and National Hunt. Some top-class horses have come out of recent July Sales and I'm sure that will be the case again this year." Selling begins at 10a.m. today, running all day, while there are sessions starting at 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. tomorrow and Thursday.

Q & A
WITH THE BREEDERS'
CUP BOARD OF
DIRECTORS CANDIDATES

Why do you want the opportunity to serve on the 13-member Breeders' Cup Board of Directors?

BOB MANFUSO

I am running for election to the small board because, although all trustees who are up for election bring invaluable experience to the table, I believe that I bring a regional perspective that is not otherwise represented. My experience as an owner/operator of a breeding/training facility in Maryland allows me to share with the board regional perspectives on issues that often differ from those of commercial farms in Kentucky.

In addition, as a former owner and executive of the racetracks in Maryland, I can share with our board the perspectives of our racetrack partners that not all owners and breeders understand. A priority going forward should be to convince racetracks world wide that Breeders' Cup Championship provides a unique opportunity to grow awareness of Thoroughbred racing in their local markets.

DON M. ROBINSON

Having been elected to complete B. Wayne Hughes' term only six months ago, I am clearly the "new kid" on the Board of Directors block. I believe I was chosen for the same reasons that nominators elected me as a Member and Trustee just last summer. I have demonstrated remarkable success at producing Breeders' Cup caliber horses for a small diverse clientele from a fourth-generation Bluegrass farm--results of much hard work and an abundance of wonderful luck.

As a former chair of the Gluck Equine Research Foundation board, I was a catalyst for encouraging aggressive interaction with the horse industry in some measure resulting in the University of Kentucky Equine Initiative and new relationships with equine practitioners. Over a number of years, I have actively promoted farmland protection in Lexington-Fayette County. As a member of its Planning Commission, I made the motion to establish a 40-acre minimum coupled with what has become one of the most successful Purchase of Development Rights programs in the U.S.

I bring this experience to the Board of Directors to work to elevate and connect the great Breeders' Cup Championship and brand to a wider world audience of bettors, fans, horsemen, owners and, last but not most certainly not least, the founding breeders.

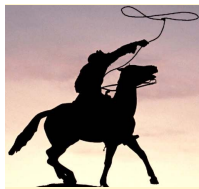

RACING Round-Up

Amsterdam Next for Quality Road...

Edward P. Evans' **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality), winner of the GI Florida Derby in his latest start, will make his next start in the GII Amsterdam S. Aug. 3, according to trainer Todd Pletcher. In his first work since joining the Pletcher barn June 15, the handsome bay completed four furlongs in :49.72 over Belmont's main track Sunday. "We thought it was good and it puts us in a position to start picking it up a little and see where we are," Pletcher said. "I'd say it's going to be a tall order to make the [GII] Jim Dandy [nine furlongs at Saratoga Aug.1]. The most likely scenario, if he's going to run that weekend, would be in the [6 1/2 furlong] Amsterdam, but we'll just have to play it by ear. He's got three or four more breezes between now and then, so we'll see." An early favorite for the May 2 GI Kentucky Derby while under the care of Jimmy Jerkens, Quality Road developed a quarter crack in his right front foot prior to the race. He returned to the worktab June 8, breezing three furlongs in :38.83--his final work for Jerkens. "His feet look great," Pletcher reported. "He was shod [last Friday] and, knock on wood, the quarter crack issues appear to be behind him."

Better Talk Now to Sword Dancer...

Trainer Graham Motion confirmed Sunday that **Better Talk Now** (Talkin Man) would skip Saturday's GI Man o' War S. in favor of the GI Sword Dancer Invitational at Saratoga Aug. 15. Scratched from last Saturday's GI United Nations S. at Monmouth after injuring a hind splint bone, the 10-year-old, who won the Sword Dancert in 2004, finished second behind Grand Couturier (GB) (Grand Lodge) in the race last year. In his most recent outing, the dark bay rallied to be third in the 10-furlong GI Manhattan H. at Belmont June 6.

Papa Clem Readies for Haskell...

With an eye on the Aug. 2 GI Haskell Invitational, trainer Gary Stute sent out **Papa Clem** (Smart Strike) for the colt's first official move over the main track at

Monmouth Park Monday morning. Winner of the Apr. 11 GII Arkansas Derby, the bay-ridden by Elvis Trujillo--negotiated five furlongs in 1:03.40. In his previous work at Stute's Southern California base at Santa Anita Park, Papa Clem covered seven panels in 1:25 3/5. "I got a real good seven-furlong work in him before he

left, so he really didn't have to do too much today," Stute told *Blood-Horse*. "Other than the Preakness, he always fires, so I never worry too much about his works. I could tell he was going off real slow that first quarter [:26]. The main thing was to just get a feel of the track." According to Stute, the colt is scheduled to make his next start in Saturday's GIII Logn Branch S.

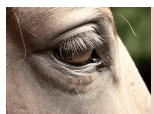

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

I can't claim to be well acquainted with Mr. Ishikawa's cause-and-effect diagrams, which Wikipedia assures me are one of the seven basic tools of quality management. But I am aware that cause and effect plays a very important role in the bloodstock industry, as was demonstrated by two of the weekend's major contests, the American Oaks and the German Derby.

It undoubtedly wasn't just coincidence that these Grade I/Group 1 turf contests were won by three-year-olds sired by Dynaformer from daughters of Kingmambo. Gozzip Girl and Wiener Walzer are simply the effect, the cause dates back several years to a time when Dynaformer started to achieve impressive statistics with mares from the Mr. Prospector line.

It was, of course, the 2005 covering season that produced these two top winners, and it is worth looking at Dynaformer's page in the *Blood-Horse Stallion Register* for 2005. His list of leading winners is headed by Ocean Silk, a filly produced by Kingmambo's daughter Mambo Jambo.

Ocean Silk is described as "champion three-year-old filly in England," which, technically she was, as she had been the highest-rated English-trained three-year-old filly in the Long category on the International Classifications for 2003.

I would still hesitate to describe her as a champion, though, because she won only two of her 14 career starts and never won anything more important than a listed race. That said, any breeder would be happy to own a filly like Ocean Silk, who was beaten only a head in the G2 Ribblesdale S. and a length in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks.

As Ocean Silk was Dynaformer's only foal of racing age out of a Kingmambo mare, there was plenty of reason for sending more daughters of Kingmambo to the Three Chimneys stallion--especially as he also had a compelling record with other Mr. Prospector-line mares.

Statistics compiled in November 2004 showed that Dynaformer had two stakes winners from only six foals out of Mr. Prospector mares, with pride of place going to the Grade I turf winner Film Maker. And Kingmambo was by no means the only son of Mr. Prospector to

figure as the broodmare sire of important winners by Dynaformer. Seeking the Gold's daughter The Bink had provided Dynaformer with another leading turf filly in Riskaverse, and the six foals out of Woodman mares also included a stakes winner. In addition to this statistical encouragement, Dynaformer had the attraction of offering plenty of size and stamina to mares by the numerous medium-sized, speedy sons of Mr. Prospector.

Of course, Dynaformer's record with the Mr. Prospector line received a considerable boost in 2006, when Barbaro--out of a Carson City mare--triumphed in the Kentucky Derby. He has also sired the smart turf mare Masseur and the Grade I-placed Haka from Mr. Prospector mares and we can expect an avalanche of good winners from granddaughters of Mr. Prospector over the next few years. **cont. p7**

Anything by Dynaformer out of a Kingmambo mare will merit close scrutiny, as this partnership has now produced three Grade I/Group 1 performers among its first five foals. I should quickly add that it isn't only with Dynaformer that Kingmambo's daughters are hitting the target. This year alone they have produced the G1 Australasian Oaks winner Gallica to Redoute's Choice, the close Oaks second Middy to Oasis Dream and the Japanese Derby third Antonio Barows to Manhattan Cafe. The excellent Duke of Marmalade is the best previous Group 1 winner out of a Kingmambo mare, others being Maids Causeway and Red Giant. The last two are by Giant's Causeway, who has Dynaformer's sire Roberto as the sire of his second dam. Roberto also sired the second dam of Middy.

Dynaformer's appeal as a mate for Gozzip Girl's dam Temperence Gift was at least twofold. Besides his having a promising record with Kingmambo/Mr. Prospector mares, it was surely important to Temperence Gift's owner that Dynaformer is a big, strong son of Roberto. When Temperence Gift's second dam Anytime Ms visited Kris S., a similarly substantial son of Roberto, she produced Brocco, winner of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile and Santa Anita Derby. Kris S. also sired two graded-placed fillies from Temperence Gift's dam Shapiro's Mistress, one of which went on to produce the Oaks third Relish The Thought.

Moving on to Wiener Walzer, Gestut Schlenderhan were no doubt hoping for a colt with stallion potential when Dynaformer was selected for their Kingmambo mare Walzerkoenigin, and that is exactly what they now have in this winner of three of his four starts. Although he is German-bred, Wiener Walzer has no German-bred antecedents in his first five generations, so he should eventually prove very useful to the German industry.

Perhaps because Schlenderhan has been operating for a very long time--time enough to breed 19 winners of the Deutsches Derby--the stud recognises the need to occasionally introduce new blood.

It did so in 2000 with the purchase of Walzerkoenigin for \$275,000 at Keeneleand's July Sale. That price made her the highest-priced yearling filly from Kingmambo's 1999 crop and Walzerkoenigin justified the expenditure with a distinguished career that spanned Germany, France, England, Italy and the USA.

Walzerkoenigin stayed well enough to win a German Group 2 over a mile and a quarter and to finish second in the GI Flower Bowl Invitational, which suggests there must be stamina in the bottom half of her pedigree. Sure enough, her dam Great Revival is a half-sister to Providential, a top-notch turf performer in France and the USA, where his wins included the Washington D.C International.

Another of Great Revival's daughters, the Twilight Agenda mare Shining Vale, went close to providing the family with a notable classic double this year, as her daughter Wadaat was beaten only a nose in the Oaks d'Italia. This is a true classic family, as the female line traces back to the famous mare Lost Soul and her highly accomplished daughter Phase.

SPOTLIGHT: CALIFORNIA

In a two-part series, the TDN looks at the racing industry in the Golden State, which is facing an uncertain future after the closure of Bay Meadows and the impending closure of Hollywood Park. Today, Southern California.

The End of an Era...

With land developers both literally and figuratively at the gates of Hollywood Park, the 71-year-old track is almost certain to be closed in the not-so-distant future.

The property on which it sits has been targeted for a \$2-billion makeover, with the race course replaced by a residential and retail mixed-use community, and one of the last remaining hurdles for developers was cleared when the

Inglewood City Council approved an environmental impact study June 4. The final go-ahead for the project could happen as early as tomorrow when the City Council reconvenes for another planning meeting.

The potential loss of Hollywood Park presents a number of problems for racing in Southern California. For decades, the area has operated on a three-track circuit, with Hollywood, Santa Anita and Del Mar acting much in the same manner as Aqueduct, Belmont and Saratoga do in New York. Hollywood and Santa Anita split up the fall, winter and spring meets, and Del Mar operates a boutique summer meet. With Hollywood gone, that dynamic is greatly changed, and maintaining an adequate horse population in Southern California will be a challenge for officials. Filling the entry box has been a task as it is. Hollywood called off an entire card in April due to a lack of entries, then shortly thereafter announced it was moving to a four-day race week. Officials at Del Mar already announced that they will scale back from six live days to five this year.

Of more immediate concern is just what to do with the 1,400-odd horses that are currently stabled at Hollywood. And what about the horsemen who have called the area home for decades, raising families and establishing roots in the community? As it stands now, the two companies that are developing Hollywood--Stockbridge Real Estate Funds and William Meany Sullivan (WMS)--have said that horsemen will be given at least a six-month notice before racing is shut down.

How Soon is Now?

So, what happens now? Most agree--either on the record or off--that Hollywood will probably be racing through 2010, and could be operating as late as 2011 or even beyond. After all, in the current business climate, venture capitalists and banks aren't exactly lining up to back \$2-billion real estate projects. The issue is clouded by the fact that Stockbridge and WMS are also developing what used to be Bay Meadows Race Track near San Francisco, and progress on that property has ground to a halt because of the slumping market (more on this tomorrow).

"From a common-sense perspective, I don't think Hollywood Park is closing down anytime soon," an insider with knowledge of the situation said on the condition of anonymity. "The housing market has gotten killed in California, and things are going to have to recover in bigger markets before they recover in a place like Inglewood. Plus, they're going to need bank financing, and no bank is going to lend money for a project like this in this market. But it makes sense they would go forward meeting with the City Council to get their plans approved."

Trainer Howard Zucker, who has been part of the movement to help save Hollywood Park, added, "From what I hear, there is a lot of vacancy in their stores and office space, and in their residences, up at Bay Meadows, so I can't imagine they would want to plow ahead this year with Hollywood Park. In this economic climate, it makes no sense. I don't know that they even want to be in a situation where they're developing both properties at once. In my mind, I think we'll be around longer than what they put out there."

While fans and the participants of Hollywood racing get to enjoy the track in the meantime, the open-ended question as to when Hollywood indeed will close presents its own problems. Namely, when to begin preparations for moving Hollywood's horse population to another site. It will take considerable time, money and planning to do so, and while several ideas have been bandied about in recent years--such as refurbishing the track and barn facilities at nearby Fairplex--many have been reticent about going forward on any concrete plans.

"We need to do this before they close Hollywood; that's the problem," asserted Zucker. "You can't just displace 1,200 to 1,400 head and not give them somewhere to go. If you're rebuilding at a track like Fairplex, you can't have any horses there. Plus, you'll have to fix and replace barns, etc. So you have to do it while Hollywood Park is still viable."

Where To?

Several tracks have expressed interest in stepping up to help fill the void left in Hollywood's absence. San Luis Rey Downs, a 500-stall training center in Bonsall, California, about 100 miles south of Inglewood and close to the action at Del Mar, could absorb some of the horse population, but its distance from the Los Angeles area likely precludes any sort of serious shift.

Fairplex Park is another possibility. The track is in the L.A. area, on the country fairgrounds in Pomona, though by all accounts it would need considerable upgrades to its facilities. Right now, the track offers a five-eighths dirt surface, and doesn't have a turf course.

However, Jim Henwood, president and CEO of Fairplex, says the track has been preparing for Hollywood's closure for the last "four or five years," and he believes Fairplex is ready to take the step up and become a major player in the Southern California circuit. In plans drawn up by architects and track designers, Henwood said a new-and-improved Fairplex would resemble something like Palm Meadows Training Center by way of Keeneland--a souped-up training center that could also hold boutique meets. But though the track would likely request additional racing dates--it currently races only during the month of September--Henwood stresses the main purpose of Fairplex would be to facilitate racing at Santa Anita Park and Del Mar.

"Our location as a training center is premier, and we'd be able to give Santa Anita and Del Mar a break from racing when needed," said Henwood. "Time-wise, it would take probably a half-year of planning, regarding permits and such, and then take another year for the actual construction. But we're zoned for this and we're ready to go. We've been talking with these tracks for a number of years, and now it's just a matter of coming to a consensus."

Communications Manager Wendy Talarico said that Fairplex currently has 1,300 stalls--which includes the stalls at the adjoining Barretts Sales complex--and has plans that could boost that number to as many as 2,200, "although it would probably be more in the range of 1,800 to 2,000," she said.

The cost of the transformation wouldn't be cheap. Henwood said the track and barn renovations--which would include the installation of a synthetic track, should regulations still mandate it--would run approximately \$30 million. A renovation of the grandstand would cost another \$30 million.

One of the things that makes Fairplex an attractive option, according to Henwood, is its relationship with the state. It is a 501(c) 5 non-profit organization and currently has a lease on the property through 2044.

"We're not going anywhere," said Henwood.

Looking Forward...

The issues in Southern California are the same ones facing racing jurisdictions across the nation. It's no secret that the sport has suffered a decline in popularity in the last 30 years, and is struggling to find its identity among wagering alternatives that include slot-machine facilities--which oftentimes are only a few yards from the track itself--Indian casinos, card rooms and the like.

So while the racing industry figures out a way to take care of its own at places like Hollywood, it continues to search for a successful business model that will keep racing from becoming irrelevant in the coming years and decades.
