



SARISKA CRUISES TO OAKS DOUBLE

Backing up victory in last month's G1 Epsom Oaks, **Sariska (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) allayed any fears regarding her ability to handle the deep mud by cruising to victory in yesterday's G1 Darley Irish Oaks at The Curragh. Racing in second gear throughout, the even-money favorite never had a moment's worry and jockey Jamie Spencer's only activity in the saddle was a cheeky wave to Fran Berry aboard runner-up **Roses for the Lady (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) inside the final furlong en route to a facile three-length success. "The race couldn't have gone any smoother, and going to the two pole, she was galloping all over the others," explained Spencer. "It was an amazing performance and she was just electric."

NECESSARY EVIL WIRES JUVENILE

Necessary Evil (Harlan's Holiday), the only filly in the short field of five, turned yesterday's GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship into a laughter with a front-running three-length victory over **Zip Quik** (City Zip). The bay filly, sent off the 6-5 favorite, tugged jockey Joel Rosario to the lead and the pair clicked off fractions of :22.36 and :45.73. Always travelling easily, she waved good bye to the boys through five furlongs in :57.58 and sailed under the wire as much the best, completing the six furlongs in 1:09.98. "Boy is she fast," Rosario, who won the first three races on the Hollywood card, said. "At the top of the stretch, she changed leads perfectly--in fact she does everything perfect." **Cont. p4**

Sariska Scores Oaks Double (cont. from p1)

Sariska's juvenile introduction came at the end of Britain's turf season and she hit the ground running with a victory at Newmarket last November. She suffered her only defeat in the Apr. 18 G3 Fred Darling S. when returning for her sophomore campaign, but the memory of that defeat was quickly extinguished when she tore up the May 13 G3 Musidora S. at York. She confirmed that promise in her most recent start with a narrow verdict over Middy in the G1 Epsom Oaks June 5. Renewing rivalry in the deep mud here, the bay was immediately restrained at the back of the peloton and moved smoothly throughout this stamina-sapping Classic. Lady Bamford's homebred eased into contention once into the home straight, and it was just a matter of when jockey Jamie Spencer decided to press the button to settle the contest. However, the moment never arrived as Sariska swept by Roses for the Lady with 200 yards to go. With Spencer waving to the eventual runner-up's jockey Fran Berry as they went by, she remained under a tight hold in second gear with Spencer shaking his head in disbelief at the ease of victory. "It's extremely deep ground, but she's big and strong," Spencer said. "I'm not saying it's her preferred going, but she does like cut and I think good-to-soft would be perfect for her. Today, I just left her nice and relaxed, and got her to reserve as much energy as possible. I planned to ride a similar race to Epsom, but when we jumped out everyone wanted to be fifth or sixth, so I just slotted her in and the race went like clockwork." With regard to future plans, trainer Michael Bell added, "She will go for the [Aug. 20 G1] Yorkshire Oaks, but the [Oct. 4 G1 Prix de l'] Arc [de Triomphe at Longchamp] is a race I'd love to win. The Breeders' Cup meeting [at Santa Anita in November] is another option. She ticks all the boxes and I can't believe how lucky I am to have her to train. She is a machine and is the perfect filly." Good Run for the Roses...

Neil Jones' homebred **Roses for the Lady (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) belied her 25-1 odds and her runner-up finish was a surprise for trainer John Oxx, who also saddled the well-defeated second favorite and fellow homebred **Beauty O' Gwaun (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest). The latter was eased when beaten in the straight and trailed in a distant last of the 10 runners, but Oxx was unable to offer a reason for her eclipse. "I don't know what happened to Beauty O' Gwaun," Oxx told *PA Sport*. "The vets have checked her out and haven't found anything. Roses for the Lady is a very tough, genuine filly who loves soft ground. The [G2] Park Hill S. [at Doncaster Sept. 10] would be the obvious race for her."

Middy on Nassau Trail...

Henry Cecil, trainer of third-place finisher **Middy (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), was reluctant to blame the ground as the sole reason for his filly's defeat, but is keen on avoiding a third clash with Sariska. "With the ground she wasn't able to quicken, but I feared the winner would improve and she won very easily," the Newmarket-based conditioner told *PA Sport*. "If it had been a bit quicker, we might have been second, but I wouldn't want to take the winner on again. If Sariska went to the Yorkshire Oaks, we might go to Goodwood for the [Aug. 1 G1] Nassau S. instead."

Walk On Bye overcame a troubled trip to win a Curragh maiden on her racecourse bow June 27 and confirmed that initial promise with a first black-type success in this. Held up in mid-division through the early strides, she moved smoothly up to the heels of the leaders before the furlong pole and was ridden clear in the final eighth to justify favoritism in good style. "She did it well and her main target will be the Goffs Million Sprint [at The Curragh Sept. 27]," assistant trainer Fozzy Stack told *irishracing.com*. "She might have one run between now and then and she won't be going any further than six furlongs. She is a tough little filly."

Successful in this event in his European bow in 2007, Tiza ran fourth in last year's edition of this race and came back this term to garner the Mar. 30 Listed Prix Cor de Chasse at Fontainebleau. Lining up for this coming off a sixth in the Apr. 23 Listed Prix Servanne at Chantilly, the seven-year-old claimed his seventh black-type triumph with a last-gasp thrust. The eventual winner was reserved in rear after the break and remained there until beyond halfway. Given the hurry-up passing the quarter-mile marker, he kept on in resolute fashion in the closing stages to prevail in a blanket finish. "I have to congratulate [jockey] Dominique Boeuf, because Tiza is not an easy ride and he fully understood what he had to do with the horse," said winning trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre. "This is a hard-knocking veteran who still loves the game, but he needs time between races, so I shall keep him fresh for the [Aug. 30 G3] Prix de Meautry at Deauville. I might be tempted by the [Aug. 9 G1] Prix Maurice de Gheest [also at Deauville], but only if there is rain around at the time of that race." **Click for the [Racing Post chart](#).**

Necessary Evil used those same front-running tactics, zipping through fractions of :21.4 and :44.3 to win her five-furlong debut in :56.3 at Hollywood May 31, becoming a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆. "She won nicely first time, but I think she did even better today," Joel Rosario added. Leandro Mora, assistant to trainer Doug O'Neill, said, "That was phenomenal. I had second thoughts [about her beating colts] because the colt [stablemate and third-place finisher Classical Slew] was training awesome also. The last workout they worked together she was a little bit tough for him. That's when we started thinking she could be competitive." Mora said Necessary Evil's connections are keeping all options open after the filly failed to sell for \$270,000 at this year's Barretts March auction. "She's been for sale since the get go," Mora said. "She didn't sell at Pomona, so she's still for sale." Zip Quik, third while making his debut in the June 4 Willard Proctor Memorial S., was coming off a maiden win second time out June 20 and was a late-closing second here. "I think he's going to develop into a nice horse," jockey Joe Talamo said of the runner-up. "He did everything right for only his third start. When he broke his maiden, he was up close because there really was no pace. Today he came from out of it, which is really more his style. He could be a GI Del Mar Futurity-type horse." Milwaukee Appeal was quickest to the lead and took the field through a moderate opening quarter of :24.80, but she relinquished control when Gallant rushed up to the front on the backstretch. The filly moved to press the pacesetter after three-quarters in 1:12.94 and they battled head to head down the lane with Gallant just getting a nose in front on the wire.

Queen's Plate winner Eye of the Leopard, never far back, looked a major threat at midstretch, but ran out of ground late. Gallant was fourth in last year's Cup and Saucer S. and Coronation Futurity while still a maiden. OHIO BUDGET AGREEMENT INCLUDES SLOTS

Ohio Governor Ted Strickland, Senate President Bill Harris and House Speaker Armond Budish announced Saturday that a bipartisan compromise had been reached in the state's budget impasse. The agreement allows for the installation of video lottery terminals at Ohio racetracks to help bridge a \$3.2-million budget gap. "Under the bipartisan agreement, I will issue a directive instructing Ohio's Lottery director to expeditiously take all necessary actions to implement video lottery terminals at Ohio racetracks," Strickland said in a statement. "The General Assembly will acknowledge the Lottery's authority to implement video lottery terminals and provide for a statutory definition of video lottery terminals and other implementation requirements in House Bill 1, the operating budget bill." According to the governor's budget staff, slot machines at Ohio's racetracks could add \$933 million to the state's coffers over the next two years.

SEA THE STARS PLANS OUTLINED Christopher Tsui's dual Classic winner **Sea the Stars (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) will race just three more times this season, trainer John Oxx announced yesterday. "I'll talk to the owner in the next couple of days and then we'll decide where we go next," Oxx said. "He's fine, he's fresh and he's well. We have to decide whether to give him another quick race after running a fast time in the [G1] Eclipse S. and we have to consider if we would run him again three weeks later [in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot July 25], bearing in mind you have the plan to run him three more times [this year]. All the options are open to him, because he has won Group 1s over a mile, 10 furlongs and a mile-and-a-half." Likely alternatives include the Aug. 18 G1 Juddmonte International at York and the Sept. 5 G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown.

ADVICE SWAPS-BOUND Advice (Chapel Royal), winner of the GII Coolmore Lexington S., is expected to ship from Kentucky to California today for Saturday's GII Swaps S. at Hollywood Park. The WinStar Farms colt was 13th in the GI Kentucky Derby and is coming off a fourth-place effort over the turf in the June 13 GII Jefferson Cup at Churchill Downs.

YEARLINGS FIRST ACT AT JHRA SALE

Although economists think the worst of Japan's economic crisis might be over, breeders still face the daunting task of selling yearlings and foals on the heels of the nation's worst recession since World War II when the Japan Racing Horse Association's select sale begins today at the Northern Horse Park.

The challenge is made more complex due to the resurgent strength of the Japanese yen, an offshoot of global economic dynamics. Thus, foreign buyers recruited to the island of Hokkaido in recent years, such as Australia's Nathan Tinkler, generally will find their money worth less.

"I believe it is going to be tough," JRHA Vice Chairman Teruya Yoshida, who is annually a leading consignor under his Shadai Farm banner, predicted candidly.

A total of 161 yearlings and 336 foals have been catalogued for Japan's premier sale, with yearlings selling on Monday and foals—which traditionally have been preferred in this unique market—during Tuesday and Wednesday sessions. The numbers are virtually identical to what was offered in 2008.

This year's catalog features many impressive pedigrees, including [hip 275](#), a bay colt foaled Jan. 27 who is a half brother to two-time Japanese Horse of the Year and Triple Crown winner Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence). Consigned by Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm, the colt is from the highly anticipated first crop of Daiwa Major (Jpn), a son of Sunday Silence who was champion sprinter and miler in 2006 and 2007 after winning the Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) in 2004.

The first foals by 2007 Japanese Horse of the Year Admire Moon (Jpn) (End Sweep), who won the G1 Dubai Duty Free and G1 Japan Cup, include a potential headline maker in [hip 391](#). The dark bay colt, also consigned by Northern Farm, was produced Feb. 10 by Grade III winner Veil of Avalon (Thunder Gulch), a half sister to Deep Impact.

Prophetically named, Deep Impact kept last year's JRHA sale from plunging further than the 16.3-percent drop it experienced compared to the 2007 sale. With 31 foals from his first crop sold in 2008, Deep Impact generated ¥1,880,000,000—a whopping 19.5 percent of the overall gross, even though he did not have any offspring in the yearling session. This year, Deep Impact is represented by seven yearlings and 31 foals.

Other sires whose progeny will draw attention are Agnes Tachyon (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), last year's leading sire who recently died at age 11 and who has 16 yearlings and 29 foals in the catalog, and Neo Universe (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), who, from his first crop, has sired the winners of the Satsuki Sho in Unrivaled (Jpn) and Tokyo Yushun (Jpn) (Japanese Derby) in Logi Universe (Jpn). Nine yearlings and 11 foals have been catalogued by Neo Universe, who swept two-thirds of Japan's Triple Crown in 2003.

There also are horses in the sale with purely American pedigrees, including colt foals by Ghostzapper out of Grade I winners Island Fashion (Petionville) and Vivid Angel (Septieme Ciel). There also are foals catalogued by A.P. Indy, Gone West, Grand Slam, Indian Charlie, Mineshaft, Officer, Smart Strike and Unbridled's Song, as well as yearlings by Medaglia d'Oro and Tiznow.

Runnymede Farm in Paris, Kentucky, will again be the only American-based farm that has consigned horses to the sale. Runnymede, which boards several mares at Shadai Farm, will offer filly foals by Agnes Tachyon and Deep Impact, but has withdrawn a colt foal by Agnes Tachyon.

On the eve of the first session of a three-day select sale, Yoshida declared to participants gathered for a party at the Northern Horse Park on Sunday night that he expects the market will be "very buyer friendly... unfortunately," Yoshida said with his trademark wry humor.

As one of the top two consignors annually to the sale under his Shadai Farm banner, Yoshida has a strong reason to prefer a sellers' market. Yet he predicted that, while world economic problems will cast a shadow on the sale just as at nearly every other venue around the globe, he expects less of an impact than there has been elsewhere.

"I hope the sale will go ok--I think Japanese owners are still very healthy," Yoshida said. "People should be able to find a good horse for reasonable money."

Purses have remained steady in Japan despite the crunch of the recession, and total wagering has only dropped about five percent, this year, less than declines in other countries, including the United States. So, while Japan as a whole has been battered by the recession, racing is holding up fairly well. Juvenile sales this spring were robust, with several recording increases in gross compared with 2008 results, but stallion owners have suffered, with overall books declining by about 20 percent in numbers of mares and associated fees.

Some smaller consignors naturally are concerned about how the sale will unfold. "It might not be pretty," predicted Harry Sweeney of Paca Paca Farm, which has four yearlings and 12 foals in the catalog, while acknowledging that conditions are "way tougher" in Europe and other areas.

Although the JRHA has encouraged foreign buyers to attend the sale, not many are anticipated, partly due to the recent strength of the yen that has made other currency worth less in comparison. Darley bloodstock manager John Ferguson and a few buyers from Hong Kong were among those expected, while Australia's Nathan Tinkler of Patinack Farm and Hong Kong Jockey Club executive Mark Player, who buys horses internationally for the club, were not going to be present after attending last year's sale.

Ferguson, who arrived at the JRHA party after flying into Japan from England just a few hours earlier, indicated he had not seen enough horses to hazard a prediction about the unique market. Darley, one of last year's top JRHA consignors by gross, is not selling this year in order to retain its young stock for racing, but could repeat its 2008 role as a significant buyer by gross.

Several members of the Maktoum family are likely to join Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Darley Japan Farm in applying for an owner's license with the Japan Racing Association under rules developed to allow foreign-based owners to participate in Japan's lucrative purse structure.

However, Ferguson said Sunday that an application has not yet been submitted and that he did not know which family members will be included. Many of the Maktoums are associated with businesses that have significant ties to Japan, he noted, and some have achieved their own success in racing in Europe, America and the Middle East.

Sheikh Mohammed's Darley Japan Farm, the first major foreign-owned breeding operation to establish roots in Japan, was not able to retain the JRA license it previously held for about four months in 2007 when its chairman, Dr. Riki Takahashi, left the organization. The license had been held in his name.

Darley Japan Farm is still working through the complex procedures required for the license application.

TO THE EDITOR

As a small breeder and avowed Thoroughbred enthusiast, I read with interest of Keeneland's recent decision to reduce its commission from 4.5% to 2.5% on RNA horses at its forthcoming September and November 2009 and January 2010 sales.

This announcement coincided with publication of the vastly improved Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Yearling Sale Catalog and that sales company's decision to conduct a two-night November Mixed Sale on the first Monday and Tuesday of Keeneland's November Sale--an obvious foray against Keeneland's best stock.

Perhaps this was coincidental timing on Keeneland's part or maybe it was their attempt to diffuse Fasig-Tipton's encroachment on Books 1 of the respective Keeneland September Yearling and November Mixed Sales, or perhaps Keeneland was being magnanimous in light of the economic upheaval facing breeders but either way, this policy is flawed.

As Keeneland has decided only to lower the sales commission on RNAs, it appears as if this is predicated on the erroneous assumption that all horses sold are sold profitably and those that RNA are all below stud fee or cost. I do remember the \$7-million RNA at the 2008 edition of Keeneland September which was the highest price yearling through the sale.

I would think that any sales company would attempt to lower the rate of RNAs rather than embolden consignors to place higher reserves on their horses or reward those breeders who are overly aggressive in their reserve, made poor breeding decision or who are breeding horses without commercial appeal.

In light of the difficult market conditions and the higher stud fees of 2007, I think Keeneland would act more equitably in lowering the fees by 1% (from 4.5% to 3.5%) for all horses run through the sale, whether sold or RNA, or perhaps encouraging some badly needed transparency by providing a lower commission rate to those consignors who actually list the full ownership of the sale horse on the catalogue page.

The policy of placing secretive reserve bids--ostensibly bidding against one's own customers--is a bit unseemly as it exists. Keeneland is further subsidizing this policy by lowering the commission rate to the detriment of those who actually sell--many of whom are facing realized loses of their own and may not be in a position to set significant--if any--reserves on their sale stock.

How does Keeneland account for those horses who go through the sale as RNAs, pay the lower 2.5% commission and then are sold privately shortly thereafter by their consignor--a prevalent if not acknowledged policy. This seems patently unfair to those who sell through Keeneland at the higher 4.5% commission rate.

Providing lower fees to help breeders during difficult economic times is generous; providing lower fees than your competitor sales company is good business; providing lower fees for transparency is progressive, but providing lower fees exclusively for RNA horses is misguided.

WAR EMBLEM PUZZLE CONTINUES

War Emblem (Our Emblem), winner of the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. in 2002, continues to be possibly the world's most enigmatic stallion.

Officials at the Shadai Stallion Station on the island of Hokkaido confirmed that the 10-year-old has covered about 30 mares this season, a number similar to what he bred last year following therapy for breeding behavior dysfunction administered by specialists affiliated with the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center. After beginning this season with great promise, War Emblem suddenly reverted to being disinterested and stopped covering mares for a while, but nonetheless, Shadai officials are pleased with the overall results for 2009.

"This is an outstanding year," said Teruya Yoshida, who operates the Shadai Stallion Station with his brothers Katsumi and Haruya. "We don't expect too much."

Sue McDonnell, Ph.D., a New Bolton specialist in stallion behavior who has worked with War Emblem, indicated last year that she hoped he could begin breeding normally in 2009. The stallion showed virtually no interest in breeding in 2006 and '07 prior to improvement last year that had him covering one or two mares daily by the end of the 2008 season.

Shadai will continue on with therapy for War Emblem, which includes isolating him from other stallions and housing him on a separate property with only mares.

"He's such a nice stallion. From small numbers of mares, he's produced many good runners," Yoshida said. "But it's not easy working with him."

War Emblem's daughter, Black Emblem, won the 2008 Shuka Sho, the final filly classic of the Japanese season.

Shadai has tried many tactics to entice War Emblem to breed and still is offering the stallion many mares from which to choose. "If 10 are presented, he might select one he shows interest in covering but may or may not breed her," Yoshida said.

"We can't select which mares are going to War Emblem; War Emblem will select them," Yoshida added with a laugh.

Shadai acquired War Emblem for about \$17 million following his American Classic campaign.

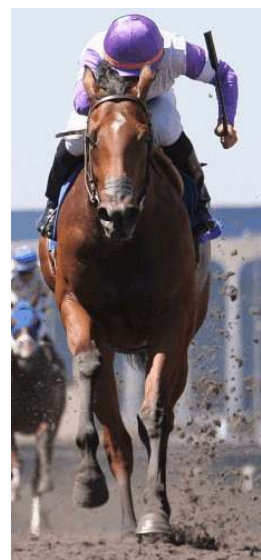

SINNDAR, LINNGARI TO SHUTTLE TO BRAZIL

Aga Khan Stud stallions **Sinndar (Ire)** (Grand Lodge--Sinnatra {Ire}, by Lashkari {GB}) and **Linngari (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}--Lidakiya {Ire}, by Kahyasi {Ire}) will shuttle to South America for the first time to stand the 2009 Southern Hemisphere breeding season at Silvio Crespi's Haras Calunga in Itapira, Sao Paulo, Brazil. The 12-year-old stallion was leased by the Sao Paulo Breeders Association. A Group 1 winning two-year-old and European champion three-year-old, Sinndar won the 2000 G1 English and G1 Irish Derby before adding a victory in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, thus becoming the first horse in history to complete this unique treble in the same year. "Sinndar's shuttling was only possible due to the generosity of His Highness The Prince Aga Khan, whose father--the late Aly Khan--had quite a few friends in Brazil," said Eduardo Guimaraes of Belair Stud, who will manage Sinndar's and Linngari's stud plans in Brazil. Sinndar is the sire of Group 1 winners Youmzain (Ire) and Shawanda (Ire) and six additional graded black-type winners from his first six crops of racing age in Europe. Linngari, who stands along with Sinndar at Haras de Bonneval in Le Mesnil Mauger, France, will take up stud duty at Francisco Giobbi's Haras San Francesco in Sao Paulo. The versatile dual Group 1 winning globe trotter, Linngari, who won 11 times, retired with \$2,795,578 in career earnings after five years on the track. Currently owned by international contractor Rupert Pletscher and his Australian partner Peter Walichnovski, Linngari entered stud this season at Haras de Bonneval. Highweight older horse in Germany and Italy, Linngari won the 2007 G1 Premio Vittorio de Capua in Milan and 2008 G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis Bayerisches Zuchtrennen in Munich.
