### NINE DECLARED FOR KING GEORGE

A single-figure cast will line up for Saturday's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. for the fourth straight year after a field of nine was declared for Europe's midsummer championship yesterday. Trainer Sir Michael Stoute enjoys an embarrassment of riches with two of his three-strong team heading bookmakers' betting lists. G1 St Leger and G1 Breeders' Cup Turf winner **Conduit (Ire)** (Dalakhani {Ire}), the likely favorite, has been allocated outside box number two, while fellow Ballymacoll Stud homebred **Tartan Bearer (Ire)** (Spectrum {Ire}), placed in both English and Irish Derbies last year, gets the four hole. The Newmarket-based handler's team is completed by last month's G1 Coronation Cup hero **Ask (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), who will exit three off the rail in seven. Aidan O'Brien will also saddle a squad of three with G1 Irish Derby second **Golden Sword (GB)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), the choice of Johnny Murtagh, drawn widest in one. Likely rabbit **Rockhampton (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will be loaded in five, alongside last year's G1 Irish Derby victor **Frozen Fire (Ger)** (Montjeu {Ire}) in six. Last term's G1 Epsom Oaks victress **Look Here (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}), who has hit the board twice in Group 1 contests this semester, gets an inside berth in eight.

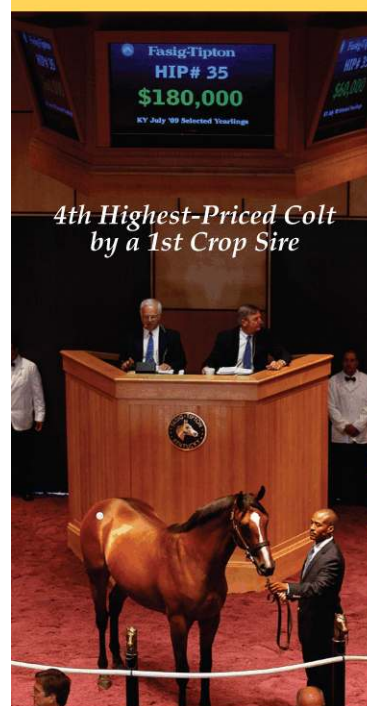

### HASKELL PURSE RAISED TO \$1.25 MILLION

Monmouth's G1 Haskell Invitational Aug. 2, which is expected to feature a showdown between G1 Preakness S. heroine **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) and G1 Belmont S. winner **Summer Bird** (Birdstone), received a quarter-million dollar purse boost to \$1.25 million, it was announced yesterday. Trainer Gary Stute also revealed that GII Arkansas Derby hero **Papa Clem** (Smart Strike) is likely to join the field. "It's almost definite we're going," Stute said from Santa Anita yesterday. "The only thing we're not sure of right now is the jockey." Fourth in the G1 Kentucky Derby and sixth in the Preakness, the Bo Hirsch colorbearer most recently placed third as the 6-5 chalk in the Long Branch S. July 11. Jockey Rafael Bejarano, who suffered facial fractures in a spill on Del Mar's opening day card (See p1 ATW), was Papa Clem's regular rider earlier this season. "His agent [Joe Ferrer] told me that Rafael probably could ride in a couple of weeks wearing one of those cages that covers the face," Stute said. "He didn't have any other fractures, which is great. He's such a good guy, I hope he recovers quickly." **Bunker Hill** (Trippi), second in the Red Legend S. at Charles Town June 20, revved up for the Haskell with a five-furlong bullet in :59.40 at Monmouth yesterday.

**O'BRIEN TO BE HONORED** The memory of legendary horseman Vincent O'Brien will be honored by The Curragh racetrack with the inaugural running of the G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. at the Co. Kildare track Sept. 12. O'Brien garnered the juvenile event a remarkable 15 times in his illustrious career. "Vincent enjoyed some of his greatest successes at The Curragh," his wife Jacqueline said. "The National S. was always a race held in high esteem by him as a target for his top two-year-olds. The family are delighted that the racecourse will honor his memory in this way, and I know Vincent would have been very proud to have his name associated with this race." **A major study recently proved Lasix to be effective. It also suggested that, due to improved testing techniques, it is unlikely to mask the presence of other drugs. Does this change the way you feel about the medication, and, as it is currently only in use in the Americas, how will it affect its usage in racing countries worldwide?**

**DR. RICK ARTHUR, EQUINE MEDICAL DIRECTOR FOR THE CALIFORNIA HORSE RACING BOARD**

First of all, the study did not address the question as to whether Lasix masks other drugs or not; it was not part of the study and was not part of the study results. But Lasix has been already shown not to be a masking agent when administered according to current regulations. It can be a diluting agent when used improperly, which could be important for detecting certain drugs in the urine, particularly drugs with urine thresholds at low concentrations. And that is why the RMTC recommended and, many years ago, the RCI and their predecessors recommended, that Lasix be administered four hours prior to racing, because if you don't have diluted urine at the time the horse is tested, you don't have the dilution effect. But that is all a side issue that's not really addressed in the paper.

I particularly like this paper because it corroborated a paper that Dr. Pascoe from the University of California at Davis and I did at Santa Anita almost 25 years ago that's published in the American Journal of Veterinary Research (AJVR 46:2000;1985), which is referenced in this current article. Lasix does reduce the amount of bleeding from EIPH (exercise induced pulmonary hemorrhage), but there are several issues that are very important for everyone to understand.

From the calculations I made, the average EIPH score without furosemide was somewhere around 1.30; with furosemide the reduction in EIPH score is down to about 0.69. So you're talking about half a grade on the scale from zero to four. Secondly, 56 percent of horses continue to bleed through furosemide, which is another issue. **Cont. p5**

But more importantly, 80 percent that were not treated bled, which is a pretty high number. On a real positive note, none of the horses with a score greater than two--that is three or four without furosemide--had a score of three or four when they were treated with furosemide, so furosemide was particularly beneficial for the horses with the most serious bleeding.

Another issue that is mentioned in the discussion--but was not answered in the study--is that furosemide is a performance-enhancing drug. It has been well-documented by previous studies done by Hinchcliff, the author of the current study in Thoroughbreds and Dr. Soma at the University of Pennsylvania, who did a similar study with similar results on Standardbreds. Horses run faster on furosemide.

The real question is: Why does furosemide improve performance? Practicing racetrack veterinarians like myself at the time, who supported the introduction of Lasix in the late '70s and early '80s, would contend that the improvement in performance is related to the reduction in the amount of blood. And I think that is a reasonable hypothesis, but you also have the factor--which was documented in this paper--that the horse is losing 20 pounds of weight prior to racing with furosemide.

You also have the issue that furosemide does increase  $\text{TCO}_2$  bicarbonate levels in the blood by an average of about 1.7 millimoles per milliliter. And I think there is enough support to say--and I say with confidence, even if others would debate the point--that milkshaking or bicarbonate loading is a performance-enhancing treatment. And then you have the fourth possibility that the improved performance can be some other drug action we haven't identified. Furosemide is a pretty profound drug in terms of its effects on the pulmonary vasculature. It does lower pulmonary arterial pressure--it's been documented for years. All these possibilities or any combination thereof, point to how it makes sense that furosemide is a performance-enhancing drug or certainly a performance-improving drug.

The problem we have to recognize is that we don't know if furosemide is really treating the underlying disease, if you will, of exercise induced pulmonary hemorrhage, which may just be a physiological response to heavy exercise. There are good arguments for that being the case. Jurisdictions race around the world without documented negative health effects of racing without furosemide, relative to the U.S with furosemide. Furthermore, we have sent a number of horses that had raced on Lasix in California or other states over to Dubai, and they raced over there very successfully. **Cont. p6**

And then we have the situation where Goldikova and a few others from Europe who ran in the Breeders' Cup without Lasix and ran super races.

The debate on whether or not Lasix is good or bad is still out. I have stated, "Furosemide is good for horses and bad for horse racing." This study did nothing to change my mind.

**JOHN KIMMEL, TRAINER & UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA VETERINARY SCHOOL GRADUATE**

"The question is not about the effectiveness of Lasix. We know it's a drug that's been able to control exercise induced pulmonary hemorrhage. It's been proven in this study, and it's been a feeling of our veterinarians that it's one of the most effective ways to control it. That's not the problem. The problem is that the public is crying out for us to clean our game up.



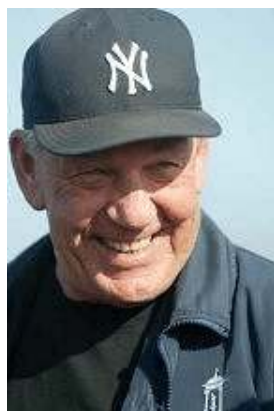

I think in countries like Japan, and the European countries that don't allow it, even though this study is showing it to be effective, they're steadfast in their drug-free medication-free policies, and I don't think you're going to get them to change. I think that's maybe a good thing because if that's what it takes to bring back the confidence of the bettor--who drives our industry--I think their business model is more successful than ours. It might be something that goes way beyond the study of the effectiveness of Lasix. It's more about what we can do to improve our business model and bring the confidence back for our bettors. Medication is no longer an issue of clouding which horse is the best or how to handicap a race."

**JAMES CASSIDY, TRAINER**

There is no question that Lasix is effective, especially in California, where the environment causes bleeding problems. With many horses, I've tried not using Lasix in the mornings and afternoons because they weren't bleeders before, but eventually they bleed--and all that does is set you back. If a horse doesn't bleed in England and comes over here and starts bleeding, what does that tell you? It tells you that it's caused by the environment, I would think.

I'm sure there are horses that bleed in Europe and South America and other places, and they just don't do anything about it.

Many horses that come from Australia were brought here because they were bleeders. So they come here, are treated with Lasix and turn out to be decent race-horses. The numbers are getting lighter now as far as fields are concerned, and if you took Lasix away, you'd have a more dramatic result than what you have right now.

As far as the environment is concerned, nobody has said why it may have an effect. For instance, we're down here at Del Mar and horses have a tendency to bleed more here, even though the air is clearer than it is in Los Angeles. I just know we have a problem with bleeding, so we use Lasix. And it works.

We're not giving horses Lasix just to give them Lasix. We're not trying to make the vets rich. The point is that it does stop the bleeding, or at least controls it. I think it's more humane to give it than not to give it.

**SHUG MCGAUGHEY, HALL OF FAME TRAINER**

In today's racing in America, I think it's a necessary drug. I think we have problems with horses bleeding, and I think they've been bleeding long enough that some of it might be hereditary. But if they were to stop using it here--which I doubt would happen--I would live with that, too.

*(Do you think Lasix is performance-enhancing?)* Well, it's obvious that if you clean yourself out--it's a diuretic--it's probably going to make it easier to run. That's what Lasix does. But does it make you run faster, like an amphetamine or something would, no, I don't think so.

*(Have you noticed any long-term effects in your horses that have been treated with Lasix, as opposed to your strings in 1980s and early 1990s in New York, which didn't approve Lasix until '95?)* I'm going to say no. The only thing is that now, you sometimes use Lasix in the mornings, where you wouldn't have ever done that before. When they come back, you have to give them a jug or something to try and replenish the fluids you've taken away. Obviously, if we're removing a lot of fluid from their bodies and then putting it back, it can't be the best thing for them in the long run. They showed in the one study that, since the introduction of Lasix, starts-per-horse have been way down.

**THE JOCKEY CLUB ENCOURAGES RETIREMENT CHECK OFF**

With the majority of registration applications recently mailed to breeders of 2009 live foals, The Jockey Club is reminding owners and breeders that they can contribute to the post-racing care of Thoroughbreds through a voluntary check-off program that benefits the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation (TRF) and Thoroughbred Charities of America (TCA). The Jockey Club is providing \$200,000 in funding to the charities to supplement the monies raised through the checkoff program in 2009.

Owners and breeders can participate in the retirement checkoff program when completing the Application for Foal Registration either through Interactive Registration ([registry.jockeyclub.com](http://registry.jockeyclub.com)) or in hardcopy form.

Founded in 1983, the TRF is dedicated to providing humane retirement options for Thoroughbreds at the end of their racing careers, and it operates vocational training in equine care for inmates at nine correctional facilities around the country. Funds from The Jockey Club's checkoff program are designated specifically for the TRF's vocational training at correctional facilities.

TCA raises funds and distributes grants to a variety of non-profit organizations designed to improve conditions for horses and people in the Thoroughbred industry. Funds from The Jockey Club's checkoff program are directed specifically to TCA's Thoroughbred re-training and adoption initiatives.

Thoroughbred owners and breeders can select one of four graduated amounts (\$25, \$50, \$75, or \$100) to be designated for these Thoroughbred aftercare programs, or they can fill in the amount of their choice on the Application for Foal Registration form. These contributions do not qualify as charitable contributions for federal income tax purposes.

"We strongly encourage all owners and breeders to participate in the checkoff in order to assist Thoroughbred Charities of America and the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation as they re-train and find suitable homes for Thoroughbred racehorses who have retired from racing," said Matt Iuliano, The Jockey Club's vice president of registration services.

**SUCCESSFUL SURGERY FOR BEJARANO** Jockey Rafael Bejarano, who suffered a fractured left cheek and jaw in a spill on Del Mar's opening day program Wednesday, underwent surgery early Thursday morning, according to *Daily Racing Form*. "They repaired it at 2 a.m. [Thursday morning]," Bejarano's agent Joe Ferrer told *DRF*. "Once the swelling goes down, and the pain goes away, he'll be able to ride with a mask. As long as the pain goes away, he can ride with a mask to protect his face. Hopefully, he'll be back riding in two to three weeks." According to Ferrer, Bejarano is expected to be released from Scripps Memorial Hospital no later than Friday. "He'll have rubber bands holding [his jaw], so he'll be able to open his mouth and at least have soft foods, not be confined to just liquids," Ferrer continued. "His face looked like he went 15 rounds with Mike Tyson. He had a black eye, and the left side of his face was swollen. He landed on the shoulder. It's sore, but there's nothing broken."
