## GIO PONTI FAVORED IN MILLION

**Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat) was installed the 9-5 morning-line favorite when a nine-horse field was entered yesterday for Saturday's GI Arlington Million at Arlington Park. The four-year-old, trained by Christophe Clement, will be looking for his fourth straight Grade I victory after taking the Mar. 7 Frank E. Kilroe Mile H., June 6 Manhattan H. and July 11 Man o'War S. Gio Ponti will break from post six. The versatile veteran **Einstein (Brz)** (Spend a Buck) will leave from the rail and was made the 4-1 second choice on Joe Kristufek's morning line. The seven-year-old, a graded stakes winner on dirt, synthetic and turf,

already has Grade I victories in this year's Mar. 7 Santa Anita H. over the Pro-Ride surface and in the May 2 Woodford Reserve Turf Classic over the lawn at Churchill Downs. European invader **Cima de Triomphe (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) is the 9-2 third choice on the Million morning line and will break from post eight. Winner of the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. in May, the four-year-old is coming off a fourth-place effort behind superstar Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the July 4 G1 Coral-Eclipse July S. Cima de Triomphe is trained by Luca Cumani, who won the Arlington Million 26 years ago with Tolomeo. World-traveller **Gloria de Campeao (Brz)** (Impression {Arg}) is fourth choice at 5-1 and breaks from post seven. The six-year-old has been off since taking the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup at Kranji Racecourse May 17. Prior to that effort, he was second behind Well Armed (Tiznow) in the Mar. 28 G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba.

## EARLY BREEDERS' CUP NOMS PROVE POPULAR

Thoroughbred breeders worldwide took advantage of an early nomination incentive, saving almost \$1 million and nominating a record 9,630 foals to the Breeders' Cup program before Aug. 1. The incentive, part of an economic stimulus plan unveiled by the Breeders' Cup in April, provided breeders with a 20-percent discount (from \$500 to \$400) for nominating before Aug. 1 via the Breeders' Cup web site. The previous high was 3,500 in 2008. "We are pleased with the result of nearly 10,000 foals nominated and savings of close to \$1 million for our foal nominators," said Greg Avioli, Breeders' Cup president and CEO. "These nominators are the backbone of this organization, and the level of their support for the Breeders' Cup in these difficult economic times is gratifying."

To date, the Breeders' Cup's foal nomination program has generated \$3.852 million. Registration of foals for the standard \$500 fee will continue through Oct. 15. Following that date, foals may be nominated for \$1,500 by Dec. 15.

**SANTULLI RESIGNS AS NETJETS HEAD** Richard Santulli has stepped down as chairman and chief executive officer of Berkshire Hathaway Inc.'s fractional jet ownership company NetJets, which he founded 25 years ago. According to Bloomberg.com, David Sokol will take over on an interim basis and Santulli will continue as a consultant with the company for at least 12 months. In a statement, Santulli said he was leaving to pursue other interests. Berkshire CEO Warren Buffett said, "It is with reluctance that I accept Richard's decision to step down. His vision and energy has made NetJets the leader that it is today." Santulli, a member of The Jockey Club since 2002, is a member and trustee of Breeders' Cup Ltd and serves on the Board of Directors of the New York Racing Association. Reached last night, Santulli said, "This will give me more time to spend with my young family and what I love--the horse business."

## FLEETING SPIRIT READY FOR NUNTHORPE

The Searchers' **Fleeting Spirit (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), heroine of the July 10 G1 July Cup, remains on target for the Aug. 21 G1 Coolmore Nunthorpe S. at York, with jockey Tom Queally set to retain the ride, according to trainer Jeremy Noseda. "Everything is on schedule for the Nunthorpe," Noseda told *PA Sport*. "She was a little bit sore after the July Cup, so we gave her a bit of time off and she is in good order now. She worked last week and I was happy with her and she will work again Friday or Saturday. She is on course with her York preparations and, all being well, Tom Queally will once again ride her. My only concern, at this point, is getting quick ground on the day."

**A.P. INDY, GALILEO TOP MIDYEAR APEX RATINGS**

A.P. Indy is on his way to topping the charts as Leading Sire by A Runner Index for the sixth time, according to the new 2009 mid-year APEX ratings generated by The Jockey Club Information Systems, and including racing through last weekend, Aug. 2 (*see Table p8*). He is the only horse to still be siring 10 percent A Runners (top two percent earners) from runners in the seven-year period covered by these figures--his 5.10 A Runner Index means 10.20 percent of his 2003-2009 'year-starters' (a horse counts as one runner each year it runs) earned enough to count as an 'A Runner.'

An 'A Runner' is roughly equivalent to a listed black-type winner, or above (graded or group). All European black-type races are listed or group races, but only black-type races with an added value of \$75,000 or more (to all starters) are considered listed races in North America. There are about as many A Runners as listed winners in each foal crop. A Runners are based on earnings (an objective measurement of success, calculated separately in each of the jurisdictions we cover: North America; GB/Ireland; France; Germany; and Japan). Though they don't correspond exactly to listed, graded and group winners, they do constitute nearly the same number of horses, and are indubitably an 'elite' group--the top two percent of earners, after all. That's over \$100,000 a year in North America (and over \$400,000 a year in Japan!). Explanations of and prior APEX tables are on the *TDN* website, in the *TDN* Sire Stats section.

With the advent of the 'Big-Book era' and stallions' ability to routinely cover 100 or more mares in a season, the game changed as far as the statistics for top sires was concerned. We call the 1995 breeding season (foals of 1996) the beginning of the Big-Book Era. In the accompanying table of top sires at this 'mid-year' point of 2009, you'll note that only six sires have current APEX A Runner indexes above 3.50. Five of the six are marked in red to denote they were themselves foaled in 1991 or earlier--in other words, 18 years old or older at the moment. Two of the five--all-time greats Sadler's Wells (28) and Storm Cat (26)--retired in the same week last year. The other three are A.P. Indy (20), and Unusual Heat and Monsun, both 19; both of them actually had their first foals in the 'big-book era' (Monsun 1997, Unusual Heat 1999), but we grouped these by their own ages to show the difference in sire generations which are coming along.

Monsun, of course, has been the top sire in Germany of the modern era, while Unusual Heat has proven to be one of the most consistent sires to have stood in California since Fleet Nasrullah. They seem to last a while--his best age ratings are for four-year-olds and up--and, combined with having been virtually a private stallion in his early years and doubtless having benefitted from the decline in field sizes in California and the largesse of the Cal-bred program--he has been revealed as practically one of the top five sires in the country in the last five years.

Monsun and Unusual Heat represent a transitional phase. Eventually all stallions will have gone to stud in the 'big-book era'--though whether they will be attracting such big books in 2010 and beyond has been thrown open to question by the probable significant 'downsizing' in both stallions' fees and book sizes (the number of breeders willing to pay those, or any, fees) coming in 2010. For the moment, though, the rules of the 'big-book era' are in force.

When you look at it that way--taking the horses in red out of the equation--we get a clearer picture of the situation today. Only one sire--Galileo (4.50)--has an A Runner Index above 3.50. The indexes for the remaining 'Big-Book era' second through 10th sires (in black) range from number two Smart Strike's 3.38 index (6.76 percent of runners, just over a third below A.P. Indy's 10.20 percent) to number 10 Empire Maker's 2.83 A Runner Index (5.66 percent of runners). **Cont. p4**



So the range for the top 10 big-book era sires, Galileo excepted, is within about a percentage point of runners, ranging from 5.75 to 6.75 percent approximately. However, the second 10 of this group of sires (still the ones marked in black) includes several top European sires, like Pivotal (2.72), Danehill Dancer (2.70), Rock of Gibraltar (2.68), Montjeu (2.60), Dansili (2.55), and possibly High Chaparral (2.71), suggesting that as low as five percent A Runners from year-starters is now acceptable for some top sires. The reason for this decline in superiority among the very top sires has to be the dilution of quality resulting from twice as many mares being bred to top stallions. The consequence of it should be that the stud fees for today's top sires are not as far in front of their contemporaries as they used to be. This is indeed the case: at least in 2009, none of these sires, bar Galileo, stood for more than \$150,000.

It is clear from looking at these lists that the top sires now have A Runner Indexes between 2.50 and 3.50, so how good does that make Galileo, with a 4.50 A Runner Index (exactly nine percent of year-starters)? It makes him the top sire under the age of 18 in the world right now, and by a pretty wide margin. Though A Runners calculated at this time of year are 'provisional' (they could end up B Runners at the end of the year because the calculation is made on earnings through Aug. 2, so is lower than when it's made on Dec. 31), Galileo does have 16 new A Runners already this year. This hasn't even been his very best year--he's third by progeny earnings among European sires in 2009, behind Danehill Dancer and Cape Cross--yet he sires such a consistently high level of class that he's still cleared right away from his contemporaries (and this includes some very distinguished contemporaries) in the 'Top Sire' stakes.

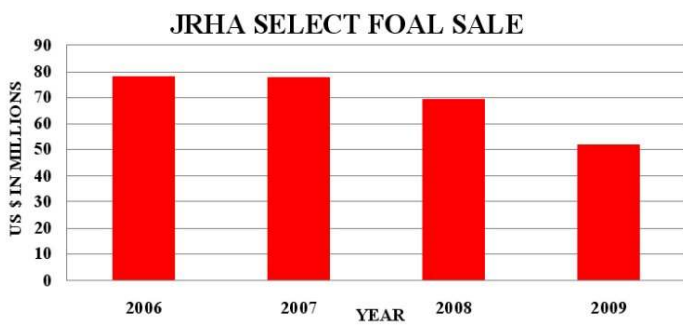
### The Sophomore Crop...

The mid-year APEX run is the first opportunity we have, in APEX terms, to take a snapshot of the sires whose first crops are three-year-olds in the current year. The attached table (*see p9*) of 56 sires with their first three-year-olds of 2009 and 50 or more 'year-starters' (counted as a runner each year it starts) in 2008-2009 tells us one thing right away. The top young sires of this crop, at least so far, are overwhelmingly in North America, not in Europe. Of the eight sires with A Runners Index of 1.98+, seven stand in North America--six in Kentucky and one (Where's the Ring) in Ontario. Only Europe's top sophomore sire, Elusive City, even scores close to 2.00. The four stallions with 10 or more A Runners so far (a horse could be one A Runner both years, or two A Runners) are the four with the top indexes. Candy Ride (4.70) actually tops the table, but Speightstown (3.85), Tapit (3.76), Medaglia d'Oro (3.55), and Birdstone (3.38) have all lit up the results boards.

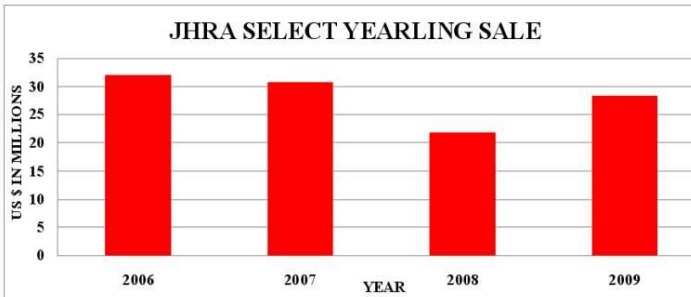

## Weekly Sales Ticker by Bill Oppenheim

"At last month's JHRA Foal and Yearling sale in Japan, several commentators remarked that the yearling day went so much better than the two foal days, and the figures bore this out: the gross was down 25 percent, and the average 20 percent, during the foal sale, while the yearling gross was up 30 percent, and the average by 11 percent. The percentages of yearlings sold, of those catalogued, jumped by almost 12 percent, while the percentage of foals sold dropped by almost five percent. The combined sale gross overall was down about \$11-million, or 12 percent." *-Bill Oppenheim*

Even the Score (3.13) has done very well to be running in this company, too. I'd note, too, that Speightstown and Medaglia d'Oro have each sired 30 'ABC Runners,' and their respective ABC indexes of 2.88 and 2.42 top the group in that category. The other four, possibly coincidentally, have a Fappiano connection: Candy Ride (by Ride the Rails, by Cryptoclearance), Birdstone (by Grindstone, by Unbridled), and Even the Score (by Unbridled's Song) all go back to Fappiano in tail-male, and Tapit is by Pulpit out of an Unbridled mare. The book on Fappiano and Unbridled has always been that they could get you the very top class but maybe weren't as consistent at protecting capital if you didn't hit the target as were some other lines. The fact that other lines are siring more 'backup' B and C Runners would be consistent with that point of view. However, it's the 'target'--A Runners--that we're most interested in, so it's equally significant, from that angle, that Fappiano figures in the pedigrees of four of these six crop leaders.

### WEEKEND UPDATE:

As the old saying goes...there is good news and there is bad news.

#### *First, the good news...*

Racing had a great day Sunday.

I am not from New Jersey, but I have been here long enough to feel like I am. I live and work close to Monmouth Park and have not only always been a fan, but have had the pleasure of witnessing what great fans Monmouth attracts. This is particularly true of Haskell Day, which has been nurtured into one of New Jersey's premier sporting events by the team at Monmouth.

Haskell Day is a family event. It's about barbecuing and picnicking at Monmouth's fantastic picnic facilities; it's about welcoming young people to the sport with attractions just for them; and it's about the traditional Haskell hat, which is ubiquitous on our local beaches, with 10-15 years or more of Haskell hats on parade on any given day. Haskell Day is respected as a special event not only within the racing community, but within our local community at large.

Many top horses have had great performances here, but I'm not sure there was ever anything equal to Sunday, when 37,000 people braved a monsoon lasting over an hour at the start of the racing day to come out and root for one of the most special racehorses of a generation.

By the time the sun mercifully poked out an hour before post time, the paddock area was already lined 10 deep with families, young people and more little girls than I've ever seen at a racetrack, many of whom were carrying signs for Rachel Alexandra. When the filly came into the paddock, I observed something I have seen in racing in this country literally just a handful of times in my life—spontaneous applause and cheers, and hundreds of people holding their cell phones up over their heads to try to get their own picture of her. The energy and applause continued throughout her whole appearance, as she left the paddock and was greeted by the rest of the crowd as she came onto the racetrack.

The magnificence of her performance has been well-described, but it was the crowd's response--the roars of joy and appreciation as she made her way back to the winner's circle, the surge toward the enclosure of the crowd, and the young girls coming down to get a glimpse of her--that struck me, and I'm not sure that it was properly conveyed to people who weren't there. I can only imagine what the energy would have been like on a dry day, and feel sorry, once again, for Monmouth Park, for I believe it has only rained once on Haskell Day in the last 25 years.

So, the good news is that when a top horse has been developed, is recognized by the sporting public and is run in a special event, tremendous media and fan response will follow. We didn't have to pay to get on SportsCenter this weekend. The event stood on its own merit. **Cont. p7**

**The bad news...**

For racing to achieve the good news described above, we have to commit ourselves to a method of developing and showcasing those stars within some rational schedule. With racing facing all of the challenges it currently faces in the sports and gambling marketplace, and with the potential of a giant new challenge, sports betting, looming on the horizon, if racing can't figure out how to create that rational scheduling more successfully than it has, we will soon be a sports trivia question.

Let's take this weekend as a case in point. The Haskell has always been one of the premier summer three-year-old racing events. It regularly draws 40,000 or more fans who come out to see one of the most important three-year-old races of the year. How much more exciting would the build-up have been this weekend if the Derby, Preakness and Belmont winners were clashing there, along with a strong supporting cast of horses like Kensei, Warrior's Reward and Charitable Man? How much more attention would racing have drawn?

That's what should have happened. Instead, racing dilutes its own ability to create a special event by scheduling a Travers prep for \$500,000 and the West Virginia Derby for \$750,000 against the \$1.25 million Haskell. Only one of the three races was written about in every paper in the country.

The solution? The Haskell should stand alone, possibly for a purse of \$1.5 million or more, a month before the Travers, a month after July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend, and two months after the Belmont. With all tracks cooperating for the industry to produce the A+ race, we will find it easier to get television and sponsors on a regular basis. The Jim Dandy could stay where it is for people who want to prep their horses for the Travers over the Saratoga track, but it wouldn't it have been better for all concerned for it to be a \$200,000? Nobody attended Saratoga Saturday just to see the Jim Dandy. It doesn't affect attendance on its own merit.

The Travers would be afforded its own unique spot on the calendar, just like the Haskell, with perhaps the Pennsylvania Derby moving back to late September, giving the three-year-olds a chance to run against each other once a month right up to the Breeders' Cup.

We have to find ways to include the racino tracks which now have the ability to offer large purses into the traditional schedule. Might July 4<sup>th</sup>, for example, be a better time to run the West Virginia Derby?

**TORRENTIAL RAIN FLOODS CHURCHILL** A torrential rainstorm dumped a record six inches of rain in just under an hour yesterday morning in Louisville,



leaving large portions of Churchill Downs's turf and dirt courses under water. The storm forced the shut-down of training midway through the scheduled 6-10 a.m. session and prompted the evacuation of approximately 30 to 35 horses. "We

had many employees that not only weathered the storm here at Churchill Downs, but rolled up their sleeves and waded into rising water to help visitors, motorists and fellow employees who were endangered by the flood," said Churchill Downs President Kevin Flanery. "We deeply appreciate the efforts of those members of our team from all departments in our track who went well beyond their normal duties to help out in this unusual weather event. We continue to watch the weather and will be prepared to move any people and horses who might be threatened by rising water in this on-going and extreme weather event." Track superintendent Butch Lehr said there would be no training at the historic track Wednesday as his crew inspects the track and does repair work. "I've been here 42 years and this is the worst I've ever seen it," Lehr commented. "I've got pictures in my office from a similar situation that occurred in 1983, but this was worse."

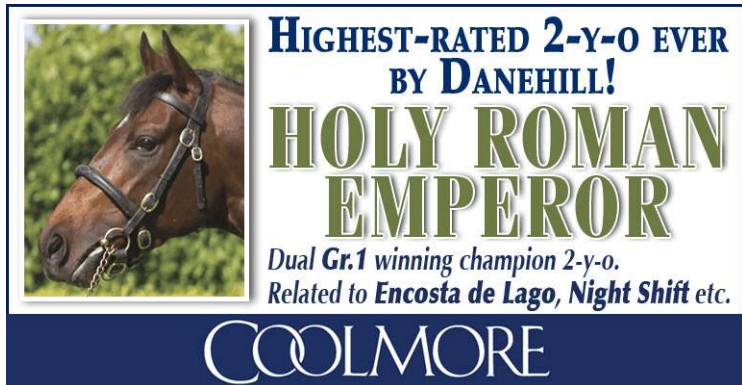
