Whichever of today's eight three-year-old fillies wins the GI Test S. will join an elite and imposing list of past champions, including Lady's Secret, Very Subtle, Go For Wand, Versailles Treaty, November Snow and Indian Blessing.

Trainer Tony Dutrow was affiliated with a Test winner when Fara's Team (Tunerup) took the 1988 running for his father Richard Dutrow Sr. He'll have a chance to be front and center himself this afternoon with Edward Evans's **Cat Moves** (Tale of the

Cat), who puts her three-for-three record on the line. An easy winner of her first two career outings, she was the somewhat lesser-fancied of an Evans entry with Light Green (Pleasantly Perfect) in the GI Prioress S. at Belmont Park July 4, but she proved the beneficiary of a very fast pace ahead of her and ran down her front-running entymate to score by 3/4 of a length. With Ramon Dominguez in Chicago for today's Arlington Million program, jockey John Velazquez takes the call. In 1995, the Marty Wolfson-conditioned Chaposa Springs (Baldski) missed by 3/4 of a length in Calder's Azalea S. before shipping to the Spa for a 2 1/2-length score in the Test. **First Passage** (Giant's Causeway) went one better in her prep for this Grade I debut, taking this year's Azalea--now a Grade III event--by three-parts of a length. **Pretty Prolific** (Lion Heart) is the lone member of this field with previous experience at Saratoga. Third to Mani Bhavan (Storm Boot) in last year's GII Adirondack S., the chestnut filly exits a runner-up effort to All of Her Twist (Forest Wildcat) in the July 18 Dearly Precious S. at Monmouth Park.

SORRING TO NEW HEIGHTS

Southern Equine Stable LLC's **Mi Sueno** (Pulpit) entered Friday's Sorrento S. a maiden and exited the race a Grade III winner, as the daughter of GISW Madcap Escapade (Hennessy) stormed home to post a seven-length victory over the odds-on gamble and previously undefeated **Necessary Evil** (Harlan's Holiday). Mike Moreno's operation already owned a 25-percent interest in Madcap Escapade, the 2004 GI Ashland S. winner, when they bought out their partners and secured the mare's first produce for a session-topping bid of \$1.7 million at Keeneland November in 2007. Trainer Eric Guillot, who signed the ticket, indicated at the time that his preference was to offer the filly for resale as a yearling, but that "if she grows up and I like her, I'll keep her." That decision looks to be a good one. Posted four wide for the run up the backstretch and around the bend, Mi Sueno struck the front in upper stretch and kicked clear with powerful strides. Necessary Evil, who beat the boys in the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship July 12, was off a step slowly, raced in traffic turning for home and stayed on without menacing the winner. **Cont. p2**

The speedy **Commentator**, seeking a remarkable third win in this event, figures to have some company on the early lead, but the eight-year-old showed an ability to rate when annexing last term's Massachusetts H. by 14 lengths. He will be facing much tougher here. He enters off a seven-length tally against Empire-breds in Belmont's Kashatreya S. June 12. **Asiatic Boy** looks primed for a top effort after placing second in his first two attempts in this country in the GI Stephen Foster H. June 13 and the GII Suburban H. July 4. The 2008 G1 Dubai World Cup runner-up worked a sharp five furlongs in :59 3/5 at the Spa July 23. **Smooth Air**, second-best in the GI Met Mile May 25, should be sitting a perfect trip just off the speed. The bay placed second behind Coal Play (Mineshaft) in Monmouth's GIII Salvator Mile H. last time July 4.

A MILLION REASONS TO PLAY

Four of the nine contestants in this afternoon's 27th running of racing's original million-dollar baby--the GI Arlington Million--have already amassed earnings into the seven figures, making today's renewal one of the deepest in recent memory. A legitimate case can be made for as many as seven runners, but the one they'll be gunning for is Castleton Lyons' **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the

Cat). The pro-tem divisional heavy, with Grade I wins at three very different distances, the bay took the one-mile GI F.E. Kilroe H. at Santa Anita Mar. 7, then defeated a classy bunch in the GI Manhattan H. going today's distance at Belmont Park June 6. He sat closer to a more moderate tempo in the GI Man O'War S. July 11,

but still unleashed his tremendous turn of foot to post a 1 3/4-length victory. He's won over the firm, good and yielding going, as well as Polytrack, and should prove a handful with the money on the line. **Einstein (Brz)** (Spend a Buck), an unlucky fifth in last year's Million, looks to set the record straight. The veteran took the GI Santa Anita H. over the Pro-Ride out west Mar. 7 before returning to the turf to successfully defend his title in the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic at Churchill May 2. His comment line from the June 13 GI Stephen Foster H. tells the story. "Bobbled, checked, bumped." Still, he was beaten just a length into third and can be expected to bring his best game.

Pure Clan looks to become the first American-bred winner of the Beverly D. since Memories of Silver (Silver Hawk) scored in 1997. Victorious in last year's GI American Oaks over 10 grassy panels, the chestnut was last of 10 in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare

Turf in her final start at three. With this race as the early-season target, Pure Clan has faced the starter just twice this term: a narrow loss in the GIII Mint Julep H. at Churchill Downs June 6 prior to a comprehensive success over **Tizaqueena** in the GIII Modesty H. over course and distance July 11. Her versatility adds to her appeal, says

jockey Julien Leparoux. "She can take back, or she will be up near the front if that's what I need her to do," he told *Daily Racing Form*. "She is a very mature filly now, a very good one." Leparoux won his first Grade I race aboard Gorella (Fr) (Grape Tree Road) in the 2006 Beverly D. **Mad About You**, the promoted runner-up in last year's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas, has a victory to her credit in the Apr. 5 G3 Gladness S. going seven furlongs. She should get a good sit off what looks to be a fairly speedy event. **Black Mamba** could also benefit from a quick pace. The New Zealand-bred won just two of her first 18 races, but has since gone three-for-eight, including a last-out score in the GII Beverly Hills H. at Hollywood Park June 28.

Prominent on the Kentucky Derby trail in the first part of this year, **Giant Oak** was runner-up to the subsequent multiple Classic-placed Musket Man (Yonaguska) in the GII Illinois Derby, and could have marched on to Louisville. But the decision was made to stay at home for the Mid-America Triple, and the plan got off to a good start. The homebred came home a one-length winner of the Arlington Classic May 23, looking as if he was just warming up at the finish of that 8 1/2-furlong affair. The chestnut was bet down to 7-10 for the GII American Derby July 11, but, after drifting well off a deliberate pace,

could not summon the necessary response and finished two lengths back in fifth. Interviewed yesterday on HRTV, trainer Chris Block expressed some concern about the rains that were falling Friday afternoon, saying that Giant Oak's size and high leg action could make him less effective on a course with some give in it. **Reb** looked hopelessly beaten in the American Derby, racing last into the lane before being blocked at a crucial stage. But, switched out by Julien Leparoux, the bay flew home to take it by a head. **Laureate Conductor** could get the day off to a positive start for Castleton Lyons Farm and trainer Christophe Clement. A 7 1/4-length maiden winner over a soft Belmont turf course June 13, the bay came from off the pace to take the Choice S. at Monmouth Park July 5. The Secretariat is plan B, as Laureate Conductor was slated to go postward in the Jersey Derby, but was scratched when that race was removed from the turf.

Well Armed Out With Ankle Chip...

Well Armed (Tiznow), the 14-length winner of the G1 Dubai World Cup in March who returned to be last in Sunday's GII San Diego H., will be out of action after he undergoes surgery to remove an ankle chip, *Daily Racing Form* reports. Trainer Eoin Harty told the publication that the WinStar homebred would go under the knife at the Alamo Pintado Equine Center in Solvang and will force the gelding to miss his intended start in the GI Pacific Classic Sept. 6. The stable could still be represented in the \$1-million race by **Colonel John** (Tiznow), who returned from a break to win the Wickerr H. in his turf debut July 31.

Del Mar Jocks to Use Friendlier Riding Crops...

With the participation and endorsement of the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club, jockeys at the seaside oval will begin using equine-friendly riding crops in all races beginning next Wednesday, August 12. "Both the jockeys and Del Mar are pleased to achieve this milestone" said Darrell Haire, regional manager for the Jockeys' Guild. "Thanks to the cooperation of Del Mar management, especially [Del Mar President and General Manager] Joe Harper and [Del Mar Executive Vice President] Craig Fravel, as well as Bo Derek and the California Horse Racing Board, we were able to attain this goal that will be beneficial to the welfare of the horses competing at the meet." Eclipse Award winner Garrett Gomez said, "This is a great step for racing. All the jocks discussed it and wanted to make this move. With the new riding crop, horses seem to react to the sound of the popper rather than from a physical reaction to the whip. It's good for racing and we wanted to be at the forefront."

THE AUGUST PLACE TO BE

It's not hard to see why people love going to Saratoga. The grande dame of American tracks combines history and atmosphere with the most competitive racing in the country, and fashionably bred yearlings have been offered by Fasig-Tipton across the street since 1917. But, while traditions are venerated in the horse business, modern conveniences are welcome, too.

Those arriving at the Fasig-Tipton grounds in Saratoga this year will immediately take notice of renovations at the complex, highlighted by the construction of a 7,000-square foot walking ring. Evocative of the Arts & Crafts Movement, the airy, timber-framed structure is the focal point of the complex's main area.

"The one thing we thought we were lacking here in Saratoga, and we've known for several years, was a quality walking ring in the back," said Boyd T. Browning Jr., president of Fasig-Tipton.

"It's an opportunity to view the horse one last time; to fall in love, [to feel] the romance, [to capture] the 'I've got to have this one' feeling," Browning continued. "It was the one structural element that we were missing in Saratoga. But we wanted it to be more than functional: a Saratoga-quality back walking ring. That was the impetus to start the whole project. And when we had the ball rolling on that, we thought we had the opportunity, while we were in the midst of that process, to create some more common space, to spruce up this section of the sales grounds--to make this facility indicative of our expectations for Saratoga."

He added, "We want Saratoga to be the premier sale in the world. We've said that simply and plainly, and it's not being boastful. The next four or five days here are what our industry should be about--a great weekend of racing, at a great racetrack, with great yearlings to be sold--and I think we had to move the facilities up a notch, to be completely candid. We've tried to do that, and the initial response is very positive."

Fasig-Tipton, acquired by the Dubai-based Synergy Investments Ltd. in 2008, slightly reshuffled its management team last fall, and refurbishments began on the Saratoga complex soon after last summer's yearling sales were completed. The Louisville, Kentucky-based IDEA (Integrated Design Exceptional Architecture) Source, which had renovated the auction house's facilities in Lexington, was tapped to head up the project in

Saratoga. IDEA Source represents the partnership of Susan Zehnder and architect Ben Palmer-Ball. Palmer-Ball has been on hand at Saratoga, overseeing the finishing touches.

"We just wanted to play on the regional materials existing up here," Palmer-Ball explained. "The [maple] timber frames came out of Vermont, and the granite work from up there as well."

The structure is roofed with slate, and granite counters surrounding the open space offer onlookers a spot to rest their catalogues--and cocktails--as the yearlings prepare to enter the ring.

"We wanted to bring some of the imagery from Fasig-Tipton in Kentucky up here and adapt it, to take on some of the New York and Saratoga personality with the materials," Palmer-Ball added. "The owners were very insistent that they wanted it to match the scale of what was here, and not for it to look like some big spaceship had landed on their property." **Cont. p2**

Indeed, the elegant structure is in harmony with its surroundings.

"We used the LA Group here in Saratoga to help us with land use and planning, and it all came together," Palmer-Ball said. "Bonacio [Construction] was the contractor on this [project], and everyone brought their ideas to the table. There was no ego--it was the best possible blending of everybody's talents. I think it came out very nicely."

The architect is pleased, but not as much as the client. "It has exceeded our expectations," Browning confirmed. "We had lofty expectations, and we challenged the folks that were working with us--the design team and the construction team, even the landscaping team. It's been a wonderful process."

As with any construction project, there were some complications along the way.

"It was not an exact straight line," Browning said with a smile. "We had no obstacle that couldn't be overcome--there were a few bumps in the road. All in all, it went very smoothly."

Browning flew in from Kentucky late Wednesday, and recounted the events of early Thursday morning.

"Last night, my plane landed in Albany at 12:15," he said. "I really wanted to see it, so I said, 'just leave the lights on for me,' like Motel 6. I hadn't been here in a few weeks and just wanted to go by the sales grounds."

"By the time I got my luggage and got up here, it was 1:15 a.m. The architect and the owner of the construction company were here to meet me. We left here at 2:45 a.m. That's the kind of commitment and dedication [they have] and, as a result, that's why it looks like it does--because they care that much."

CAN LUCKY STRIKE TWICE?

Last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale was topped by a son of Storm Cat out of Get Lucky (Mr. Prospector), who attracted a final bid of \$2 million from M. V. Magnier. That colt, now named **Fighting Brave**, was co-bred by Ben Walden and Phil Steinberg, and the two send a full brother to that sales topper through the ring this year. Consigned by Walden's Pauls Mill, the yearling is catalogued as [hip 130](#).

"He is a blood bay with black legs, versus a dark bay that the full brother was," Walden said of the yearling.

"This colt has a massive hip and a massive rear end, which the other horse didn't have. He's just a very strongly made horse behind. This horse has almost an Arab dish in his face, and I attribute that to his being inbred to Northern Dancer. He's got a very Northern Dancer-like head,

whereas the colt last year didn't strike me that way."

The two brothers also have slightly different personalities, according to Walden.

"The other colt could be a handful at times," Walden said. "He was very much a Storm Cat between his ears. This colt is a little easier to work with."

Get Lucky, purchased by Walden and Steinberg for \$300,000 out of the 2002 Keeneland November sale, is the dam of multiple graded stakes winners Daydreaming (A.P. Indy) and Accelerator (A.P. Indy), as well as stakes-placed Harborage (Monarchos). The 21-year-old mare also produced She's a Winner (A.P. Indy), the dam of Grade I winner Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat). The pedigree of this colt from the last full crop of super sire Storm Cat is sure to attract plenty of attention.

"There are not too many pedigrees that are offered on the commercial market each year that are that strong," Walden explained.

Despite the obvious attractions of the yearling, this colt sells in a vastly different market from the one that saw his older brother bring \$2 million at last year's auction.

"There is no way we can possibly expect a similar result to last year," Walden said. "If it happens, we would be very grateful. But I don't think that any of us really know what these horses are worth this year. Our job as consignors is to perform as well as we possibly can with what we have control over. That includes the areas of sales prep, exercise and feed, and having their feet in good shape--all of those are things that we strive to do well. Beyond that, who knows what the market is going to be like."

Market Favoring Seasoned Sires...cont.

Entering the season's second major yearling auction, Ben Walden thinks the strength of the market lies in proven sires.

"I don't know that I would go so far as to say it was encouraging, but things did pick up to some degree on the second day of Fasig-Tipton July, as they got beyond the first-crop horses and they got into the good horses by the proven stallions in day two," he said. "That day did seem to have a little bit more vibrancy."

Walden sees similarities in this economy and the challenging market of the 1980s.

"When I started Vinery in 1985, we were in the midst of times like these," he confirmed. "You saw the Greentrees of the world phasing out. You saw Calumet dispersing, you saw C. V. Whitney dispersing, you saw many of the icons of the breed-to-race operations phasing down. The market in general was similarly depressed, and what you saw among yearling consumers was that they migrated to the proven stallions, as opposed to better times when they migrated to the flashy horses, the first-year or the second-year horses. My sense is, in the times that we're in today, we might find the market might be a little better with the Distorted Humors, the Dynaformers--the real proven horses."

That might be cause for concern for Walden's Pauls Mill. The new 265-acre stallion operation in Versailles stands just four stallions, all youngsters, but Walden remains optimistic. The farm stands GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Artie Schiller (El Prado {Ire}), GI Wood Memorial winner Bellamy Road (Concerto) and Grade II winner Teuflesberg (Johannesburg). U.S. Ranger (Danzig) was recently added to the roster.

Artie Schiller and Bellamy Road are both represented by their first yearlings this year, and Walden has been impressed by what he has seen of the pair's foals, and their sales results so far.

"Both the Artie Schillers and Bellamy Roads happened to perform exceptionally well in July," Walden said. "Bellamy Road averaged \$82,000 off a \$10,000 fee, and Artie Schiller averaged \$78,000 on a \$15,000 fee. I just feel very blessed that those two horses are getting the right sort of foals. I'm quietly confident in both of those two horses."

"Bellamy Road was such an unusually talented racehorse, the way he carried his speed going 1 1/8 miles--from pole to pole, he would run sprinter-like fractions," Walden said. "That's what sets him apart from other stallion prospects. For him to be able to do that, he had to have a big strong structure, and his foals are great boned, with big strong backs on them. I'm very excited about him and the general constitution of his foals."

Pauls Mill consigns a filly by Artie Schiller at Saratoga as [hip 201](#).

"Artie Schiller's foals are very consistent," Walden continued. "His foals are all blood bay with black legs and a white spot on their face. You can see them a mile away from that standpoint. They are very correct horses, too. For a very small stallion operation, one thing that we did a good job with was that we picked two correct racehorses to stand. And that is bearing fruit for us with their first-crop yearlings."

AFTER SCARE, IT'S BUSINESS AS USUAL

Mike Mulligan, who operates the yearling-to-juvenile pinhooking operation Leprechaun Racing with his wife Britt, gave friends and family quite the scare last

March. In the hours following Fasig-Tipton's Calder sale in Miami, Mike and Britt joined some business clients at the Hard Rock Cafe for dinner to celebrate, among others, the sale of an Unbridled's Song--Amazing Buy colt for \$1.1 million from their consignment. After being told a table would be available in 20 minutes, the group retired to an adjacent lounge to wait. Moments later, Mulligan lost consciousness and crashed into a table.

The impact was so severe

that it fractured his skull and, once rushed to an area hospital, Mulligan was put into a medically induced coma. During an initial operation, some 25 percent of his skull was removed in order to alleviate pressure, as fluid had begun gathering on the brain. After a battery of tests, doctors are still uncertain what caused Mulligan to pass out in the first place.

The tight-knit community of juvenile pinhookers in Ocala was kept on pins and needles for three weeks before finally receiving word, during the OBS March Sale, that Mulligan had successfully been brought out of the coma.

"I remember walking into the restaurant and then going next door to the lounge, and after that, I don't remember anything until they woke me up three weeks later," said Mulligan of the incident.

In the last few months, Mulligan has undergone two more surgeries. A second planned operation in May was complicated by infection, caused when Mulligan's body rejected a bone graft, and in June he was forced to undergo an emergency third surgery that proved successful.

Back to Work...

After resting up for a few weeks, Mulligan, remarkably, felt well enough to handle the shopping duties at Fasig-Tipton July, where Leprechaun purchased two yearlings. Mulligan signed the ticket for a colt from the first crop of Da Stoops (Distorted Humor) for \$72,000, and acquired a filly by young sire Tapit (Pulpit) for \$82,000.

"I had been up and around doing things by early July, and I got off the IVs right before the July Sale," Mulligan explained. "I typically have a group of short-list people who work with us in July. Britt and I do our own work at Saratoga, both for the Select and the Preferred, and then, of course, at September we have a group working the sale. This year at July, all I did was look at short-list horses. Typically, I'll have 25 percent of the horses to short-list, but this time I was involved just with the second and third looks."

Mulligan admits this spring took its toll physically, but when it comes to analyzing the sales scene and adjusting his business plan accordingly, he hasn't lost a step.

"You're talking to me now, you've talked to me before, and you know I'm the same person that I was before," he said, accurately. "I get around pretty good, but certainly, the amount of time I spent in surgery and spent in the hospital, caused me to lose a lot of weight; I lost about 30 pounds. You lose a lot of your muscle tone, so I'm not quite as fit as I was--not that I was Arnold Schwarzenegger before. And at the end of the day at July, I was ready for the day to be over, but it's a long day even when you're at your best."

Mulligan has at least one more surgery on the docket. "I have to go back for another one, but I'm not doing that until after the yearling sales," he explained.

In the meantime, Mike and Britt Mulligan will focus their attention on Saratoga, hunting grounds that have proven especially fruitful for Leprechaun. In 2002, they picked up a strapping bay filly by Indian Charlie for \$40,000 at the New York-bred Preferred Sale. They resold the filly, Fleet Indian, to Fleetwood/NW Management for \$230,000 at OBSMAR, and watched as she developed into a multiple Grade I winner and the champion older mare of 2006. Adieu (El Corredor), a \$150,000 yearling purchase by Leprechaun at 2004 FTSAUG, was parlayed into a \$300,000 FTFFEB juvenile, and she, too, went on to Grade I glory while wearing the colors of Michael Tabor and Team Coolmore. Other successful pinhooks from Saratoga include Amazing Buy (High Yield), a \$120,000 yearling who sold to Buzz Chace as a juvenile for \$350,000; and Fashion Cat (Forest Wildcat), a half to Peace Rules who went from being a \$120,000 FTSAUG grad to a \$630,000 FTFFEB juvenile.

Like Adieu, Leprechaun's most recent standout from Saratoga also wears Tabor's orange and blue silks. Munnings (Speightstown) was knocked down to Leprechaun for \$150,000 in 2007 before being resold to Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne for \$1.7 million at last year's Calder sale. Twice placed in Grade I company at two, Munnings enjoyed a break-out victory in the GII Woody

Stephens S., beat older foes in the GII Tom Fool BC H., and most recently was third behind Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GI Haskell Invitational S. Aug. 2.

"I thought the horse ran extremely well in his first time going long again and facing those kinds of horses," Mulligan said of Munnings's Haskell try. "He got beat by the Belmont winner [Summer Bird, by Birdstone] by half a length. Obviously, he's a spectacular sprinter, and probably one helluva miler, too. And I thought he held his own very well at nine furlongs."

Of Leprechaun's aforementioned Saratoga successes, the highest price it paid for a yearling prospect was the \$150,000 it gave for both Adieu and Munnings, and Mulligan says he will be active at Saratoga--so long as he can stay within that range.

"This is just my opinion, but when you start giving \$300,000 to \$400,000, a lot of the buyers that you're going to see again next year also saw that horse, and decided to let *you* buy it, for whatever reason," he said. "So it's sort of like you have to prove to them that the horse is a lot better than they thought it was as a yearling, because you're competing against end-users when you're paying that much for a horse. At Saratoga, we can't buy those highly desirable, end-user horses, but we do have the opportunity to buy in the \$200,000-and-under range, and there might not be a whole lot of end-users on that horse in a sale that's averaging \$300,000 or so. There is some opportunity there buying a horse that isn't an elite horse at the time but, hopefully, becomes an elite horse."

He added, "For us, it'll be a matter of price. We've been doing this a long time. We've come out of Saratoga--the Select Sale--with as many as 10 or 12 horses, and we've bought as few as two or three."

As far as the general market is concerned, Mulligan is well aware of the conundrum facing juvenile pinhookers.

"I hope the sale is gangbusters, I really do," he said. "All of us want to buy a very nice horse at a value. But at the same time, if we can buy really nice horses at a value, it concerns us that the following spring the two-year-old market isn't going to be as strong, either." -LM

session is [hip 17](#), a colt from the second crop of Adena Springs stallion Ghostzapper (Awesome Again). He is the sole yearling in this year's catalog produced by famed Bohemia Stable, which rose to prominence under the guidance of Allaire duPont and is currently headed by duPont's

daughter, Lana Wright. The Maryland-bred, who was raised at Woodstock Farm in Chesapeake City, is the fourth foal produced by Bohemia homebred Shine Again (Wild Again), victorious in the 2001 and 2002 GI Ballerina H. Shine Again is a half sister to Grade II winner Shiny Band (Dixieland Band).

"He's a big, robust and powerfully built colt," explained Walnut Green Director of Sales Mark Reid Jr. "He definitely has a lot of Ghostzapper in him."

In an industry in which timing is often everything, this year's Walnut Green consignment presents some of the current market's hottest commodities: a pair of yearling fillies by Medaglia d'Oro. The 10-year-old stallion, who already has 10 black-type winners, and four at the graded level, is responsible for Rachel Alexandra, scintillating winner of last weekend's GI Haskell Invitational.

"The time to sell a filly by Medaglia d'Oro couldn't be any better," offered Reid. "I was up at the Haskell to see that magnificent filly beat the boys; to have two fillies by that sire, it just can't get any better."

One of only five fillies by Medaglia d'Oro in this year's catalogue is [hip 133](#), who is slated to go through the ring during Tuesday's second session. The Mar. 5 foal is the second offspring produced by dual stakes placed Glowing Breeze (Southern Halo), who was purchased by Dan Ryan for \$210,000 at the Keeneland January Sale in 2005. Foaled and raised at Walnut Green, the dark bay filly--who is offered on behalf of Ryan's Smart Angle Racing--is from the extended family of multiple-graded stakes winner Yearly Report (General Meeting). Also representing the Darley stallion is [hip 171](#), a Mar. 4 foal out of lightly raced Liszy (A.P. Indy). Nine-year-old Liszy, a daughter of graded-stakes winner and Grade I placed Silent Account (Private Account), is a half-sister to MSW Gold Case (Forty Niner).

"These fillies are very different types, but I really like them both," said Reid. "The Glowing Breeze filly has the color of her old man, but that's about it. She is a really typey-looking, fast filly."

"The Liszy filly is a lot bigger and looks a lot more like her dad, very solid," he added.

Reid has every reason to be drinking the Medaglia d'Oro Kool-Aid. His father, Mark Sr., purchased the eventual MGISW privately for Edmund Gann in 2002. The elder Reid also served as racing manager for William K. Warren, who campaigned Horse of the Year and GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Saint Liam (Saint Ballado).

"For obvious reasons, we've always had a bias for Medaglia d'Oro, even before he did what he did," Reid said. "We have three or four more coming up behind this group [weanlings of 2009], and we have a few mares in foal to him. We have been very supportive of him from the beginning." *Cont. p8*

Also represented by Walnut Green is Thrill Seekers Racing, headed by Chuck Zacney, which offers [hip 215](#). A dark bay by Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet), the Feb. 28 colt is out of Pose (Nureyev), who is from the family of graded stakes winner Adhocracy (Spend a Buck).

“He is a big and powerful-looking horse,” offered Reid. “Afleet Alex seems to be coming on at just the right time, and nobody has worked harder to support him than Chuck and [the Cash Is King partners]. Those guys have really supported him with their mares.”

Zacney, who secured the unraced Pose for \$45,000 at Keeneland January in 2006, also was the managing partner of Cash Is King LLC, a racing partnership that campaigned sophomore champion Afleet Alex. The bay scored in the GI Hopeful S. at two before collecting victories in the following season’s GI Preakness S. and GI Belmont S.

Zacney currently has six or seven mares boarded at Walnut Green to take advantage of the Pennsylvania stakes program.

Despite the fact that last month’s Fasig-Tipton July Sale in Lexington concluded with slumping figures, Reid remains cautiously optimistic that the Saratoga sale will give sellers a chance to regroup.

“The market has been very tough this year, as far as Fasig-Tipton July went,” explained Reid. “We’re hoping that since Saratoga is as select as it is, that when we get some of these nice horses up there, they will be all right. We have a group of four that we think really fit the mold and really deserve to be there.”

Hopefully, the buyers will agree.--Christina Bossinakis

NTRA Supports Menendez Bill:

Officials at the National Thoroughbred Racing Association have issued a statement in favor of a bill introduced into the United States Senate by Senator Robert Menendez (D-NJ). Similar in content to a bill submitted by Senator Barney Frank (D-MA) earlier this year, the "Internet Poker and Games of Skill Regulation, Protection and Enforcement Act" is more narrowly drafted than the Frank bill and would legalize only "games of skill" such as poker, as opposed to the legalization of almost any type of gaming under the Frank bill. "The Menendez bill affirmatively supports our position that the Wire Act--a criminal statute aimed at illegal bookmaking--has no application to activities carried out in accordance with the Interstate Horseracing Act, a civil statute passed expressly to facilitate interstate pari-mutuel wagering on horseracing," said NTRA President and CEO Alex Waldrop. "This legislation reinforces the protections afforded our industry under the IHA." He added, "This bill was drafted with input from numerous stakeholder groups--including the NTRA--which will help bolster its chances for passage. The bill is limited to online poker, carries strong consumer protections, respects states' rights and ensures that domestic U.S. industries--including the horseracing industry--are allowed to participate fully and with equal opportunity in future Internet gaming markets. These elements will garner serious consideration for the bill."
