Christopher Tsui's homebred had to work a little harder than those odds suggested after his only serious rival quickened for Johnny Murtagh approaching the quarter pole. He was settled last of all early by an ice-cool Mick Kinane,

and push needed to come to shove in the final furlong to get to Ballydoyle's four-time Group 1 winner. When the question was asked, the answer was a definitive final 100 yards of authority to set a new track record and add to his tally of G1 2000 Guineas, G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Eclipse S. "Mastercraftsman is no tourist and he sprinted a bit at the end, so we were made to work and fight a bit," conditioner John Oxx said. "He was almost going too easily early on and Mick [Kinane] says he is never going to win any race by much more than a length, but he keeps winning." Sea the Stars has quickly become the biggest draw in European racing, and also the biggest headache for connections of any horse capable of lining up against him. The list of the vanquished includes Delegator (GB) (Dansili {GB}), Fame and Glory (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Conduit (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}), horses to savor in any other year who have helped shape the European racing season away from his awesome presence. Hammered all the way down to cramped odds despite the presence of a rival with one more top-level success, Sea the Stars cruised behind that foe in rear as the rabbits set strong fractions. After Johnny Murtagh sliced between the stable companions passing the three-furlong marker, Mick Kinane followed suit, which took him onto the heels of Mastercraftsman. Allowed a breather there, Sea the Stars took a few heartbeats to hit top stride, but, when it was engaged, he was in command again. "We were going from the start and Ballydoyle were aggressive--they knew their horse was tough and strong and felt he would step up and improve at the distance, and he did," Kinane explained.

"I had to ask him to quicken up between the two Ballydoyle pacemakers, which was probably a risky manoeuvre, but I wanted to follow Johnny through. So I let him ease down afterwards and he had dropped the bit when Johnny quickened and found a couple of lengths. Just a combination of those things made it more difficult than maybe it should have been, but he won snug going to the line, and Mastercraftsman has run a hell of a race. I commend Ballydoyle today for being very positive and sporting--it was well-run and fair. They have some fantastic horses, but have been unlucky to run into a horse of the calibre of Sea the Stars--you might not see his like again for a long time." After John Oxx confirmed the Sept. 5 G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown as the next race, Kinane continued, "The track will suit and I think he'll improve a little bit for today's race--we left a little bit there as we didn't grind him for today. Then we'll take the next step and see what ground comes up for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [at Longchamp Oct. 4], G1 Champion S. [at Newmarket Oct. 17] and Breeders' Cup." Of Mastercraftsman, Aidan O'Brien told *PA Sport*, "This fellow loves to get into a battle, but Mick rode a brilliant race on Sea the Stars. It was a great race and the winner is a great horse. He's not short on speed, our fellow, but he can run either over a mile or a mile and a quarter. I'm not sure where he will go now--all options are open to him."

Both on pedigree and past form, Monitor Closely failed to put over a strong case beforehand that he could prosper for the step up in trip in this type of race, but confounded logic with a much-improved display here. Kept to a maximum of 10 furlongs so far, the bay ran second in the Tattersalls Timeform 3YO Trophy over that distance Apr. 15 before dropping to a mile to finish eighth in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 2. He went back to a mile and a quarter for his next three starts, finishing fourth in the G2 Dante S. over course and distance May 14, third in Royal Ascot's Listed Hampton Court S. June 18 and fifth last time in the July 25 G2 York S. Taken straight to the lead by Jimmy Fortune, the blaze-faced colt had his rivals stretching inside the final quarter, and drew away late on for a convincing success. Connections are now set to venture into the unknown by tackling the extra quarter mile-plus of the G1 St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 12, for which he will need to be supplemented. "Jimmy [Fortune] says we have to run in the Leger and on that he looks like he will stay, so we have nothing to lose and everything to gain," trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam commented. "My horses have been so in-and-out all year, and I can't get them right. Lobbing along in front suits him, and we have tried a new ring bit on him as he is keen in his races. His work had been a lot better recently, as I have been sending him out on his own to get him to relax. It has worked and it will be the same from now until the Leger." The runner-up's trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented, "I thought Mastery ran really well today. We will keep the options open for him at the moment and the St Leger at Doncaster is still a possible target for him." Elusive Pimpernel overcame greenness on debut when finishing with a flourish to win a seven-furlong maiden on Newmarket's July Course July 8, and it was a similar story here as he recorded a last-gasp success against the odds. Outpaced throughout the first half of the contest as Poet's Voice dictated the fractions, the homebred gathered a full head of steam wide out on the track inside the final quarter. Overhauling that rival and the eventual runner-up Emerald Commander in the final strides, he hit the line strongly to set a new juvenile track record. "He was as green as he was first time and they went a hell of a gallop, so he didn't travel too well," jockey Eddie Ahern said. "The ground was a bit quick for him and he was changing his legs and getting a little bit unbalanced, but at the same time I was trying to ride through that, because I didn't have time to sit and get organised. He's a lovely horse and there is a lot of improvement in him." Trainer John Dunlop added, "At Newmarket, the race was practically all unraced two-year-olds not going too fast on relatively slow ground, so he had all the time in the world to get organised. Today was a total contrast, as he was against seasoned horses who jumped and went fast on very fast ground. He's a big, heavy horse who hits the ground a bit hard and got lost and unbalanced, so I gave him no chance even at the furlong pole. When he got going, he came home well and won it nicely. Despite the fact that he's a big horse, he is a very good mover. I trained the dam, who hurt herself as a three-year-old, and we have a Mr. Greeley yearling by her to come in, too. I think he'll have one more run this season over a mile."

How did you get into the Thoroughbred business? My dream from childhood had been

to raise Thoroughbreds in the Bluegrass. In 1995, my husband purchased Summer Wind Farm and we began with two show horse geldings. Now my dream has become a reality.

Given the current state of the economy, were you surprised by the prices your yearlings made at Saratoga, or were they close to their reserves? One lives in hope. Especially in the horse business. No, the reserves were not nearly as optimistic as the outcomes. That said, I do believe the colt and the filly (a full to India) were exceptional individuals and the market rewarded us for that.

How did you celebrate after the sale? With my family--but not late or extravagantly.

When did your daughter decide she wanted to work with you at Summer Wind? How does it feel to be able to share your success with her? Karen came directly to Summer Wind after completing her MBA at Vanderbilt University's Owen Business School. We share the same dreams. She has ridden show jumpers since childhood and our love of horses appears to be inborn.

What is the best broodmare buy you've ever made? After Saratoga, it has to be Onaga. But we have others yet to produce!

How many mares do you have at Summer Wind right now? Are you happy with that number? About 35. Our ultimate goal will be between 35 and 40--we try to breed quality, not quantity. We do not board and don't have partners, so the risk is greater, but the decisions are easier.

Who are your favorite horses? Two--Indygo Shiner and Miss Fortunate--two homebreds who became graded stakes winners for us and whom we still have.

What is your favorite vacation spot? Africa. In the bush. In a tent.

Favorite meal? Steak, baked potato and salad.

If you could have dinner with one historical figure, who would it be? My father. And he is historical because he designed the little balsa wood Testor plane that generations of children grew up with.

COWBOY HOPES TO BE SPECIAL ON DIRT

Fearless Cowboy (El Corredor), who has made all four of his previous starts over Woodbine's synthetic track, will be trying conventional dirt for the first time in Thursday's GII Saratoga Special S. at Saratoga. The dark bay colt was a game winner of the July 18 Colin S. ([video](#)) for Gulf Coast Farms. Sold privately to David Lanzman and Jeff Singer since that six-furlong victory, Fearless Cowboy makes his first start for new trainer Kieran McLaughlin Thursday. McLaughlin is cautiously optimistic about his charge's chances. "He's

cautiously optimistic about his charge's chances. "He's

first-time dirt, but he's training well and he's a nice colt, so we just hope he handles it. If not, we'll go back to synthetic, but he's training very well." Since moving south of the border, Fearless Cowboy has turned in a pair of works at Saratoga. He went four furlongs in :47.2 Aug. 5 and five furlongs in 1:03.0 Aug. 13. In addition to his win in the Colin, the colt was also second behind the ill-fated Olredlgetcha (Limehouse) in the June 14 Victoria S. Todd Pletcher will saddle Michael Tabor's **China** (Tale of the Cat) in the Special. The bay colt has made just one start, rolling to an impressive 6 3/4-length victory in an Apr. 23 maiden special weight ([video](#)) at Keeneland. He has turned in a pair of strong five-furlong works over the main Saratoga track in preparation for his return to the races. "He's been training well here and it seems like a logical spot for him," Pletcher commented.

'JOCKEYS' KICKS OFF NEW SEASON

After a successful first season, Animal Planet is bringing back the docu-drama series 'Jockeys.' A new season begins this Friday, Aug. 21, at 10:00 p.m., and will once again follow the triumphs and trials of jockeys Garrett Gomez, Aaron Gryder, Corey Nakatani, Mike Smith, Chantal Sutherland, Joe Talamo and others.

Gryder, Smith and Sutherland joined producer Jason Carey on a national teleconference yesterday to talk about the series, which has been moved to a 60-minute format, rather than the 30-minute shows of the first season that would typically run back-to-back.

"When we started getting into the project, we knew it was a really rich world, and that there were a lot of stories to tell," Carey explained of the change. "We just didn't know how much depth there would be to those stories. Working on season one in the half-hour format, we knew there was a lot of footage on the cutting-room floor, because we couldn't fit it into the time format, so we met with the producers and talked amongst ourselves at Animal Planet, and decided we felt we'd be able to tell much richer stories in the hour-long format. For season two, I think the shows are just tremendous. I'm really excited."

One of the focal points of season one was the romantic relationship between Sutherland and Smith. Sutherland admitted that having cameras documenting all their emotions took some getting used to.

"For Mike and I, it was pretty stressful at the beginning," said Sutherland. "And then, slowly, we were able to get used to it. It was tough. We had a few differences [of opinion], but we worked it out. The second season was a breeze. By the end of the first season it was better, but that first month of the first season was really stressful. There was a lot going on, with the Breeders' Cup and me moving in. Our relationship was getting shook up because of it, but we handled it. But moving back to Canada [to ride for the spring/summer meet at Woodbine] added some more drama to our lives again." Gryder said he admired Smith and Sutherland for allowing fans a chance to see the inner workings of their relationship.

"I applaud them for opening up as much as they did, and allowing the camera and the audience members the chance to see what goes into our everyday lives," he said. "We are people; jockeys isn't the only thing we are, and it shows we have the same issues as every other person in every other position in life."

Gryder added that when he and the other riders signed up for 'Jockeys,' they did so in the hopes it show racing in a favorable light.

"Going into it, when all seven of us agreed to do the show, it was because we trusted the producers who had come in and spoken to us about it," said Gryder. "There are so many people who do things on racing who don't show both sides of the story. Obviously, there's the side that is sad and gets overexposed, and there's the side that is glamorous and exciting and shows what racing is really about that hardly ever gets the publicity. When we talked to them about this show, they said, 'We want to show what racing's about; we want people to be excited about it.' And that's what got us all involved in it. I think we all had high expectations, but I think they did a great job putting it together."

The new season will include footage shot up through early May, with the finale set around Mine That Bird's dramatic upset in the GI Kentucky Derby. Sutherland rode Mine That Bird to three consecutive stakes wins at Woodbine as a juvenile and was also aboard him in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

"I remember being filmed; I was with my girlfriend Emma [Jayne Wilson], who is also a jockey, and we were watching the Kentucky Derby," said Sutherland. "Honestly, I was so shocked--I think I might have froze for little bit. We just stared at each other, and she said, 'Oh my God, you could have been the first girl ever to win the Derby.' And after that, I was just really happy for the horse." The finale will also include the last-minute scratch of probable Derby favorite I Want Revenge, whose regular rider was Talamo.

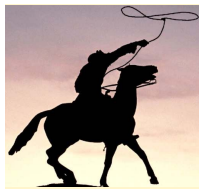

MINE THAT BIRD SURGERY A SUCCESS

Mine That Bird (Birdstone), the GI Kentucky Derby winner, underwent a successful procedure Tuesday to correct an entrapped eplglottis. Trainer Chip Woolley remains optimistic that the minor procedure will have no impact on the gelding's intended next appearance in the GI Shadwell Travers S. at Saratoga Aug. 29. "Went excellent, we got it done," Woolley told *Daily Racing Form* around noon Tuesday. "Went back in, scoped the horse - it looked really, really good. If you looked in there you'd never know he was entrapped before. It's real clean. He went to eating, and acting normal as can be. I'm real happy." Mine That Bird was expected to return to Saratoga early last evening. The surgery, which took just five minutes, was performed at the Ruffian Equine Medical Center located across the street from Belmont Park on Long Island. The problem was discovered Monday after Mine That Bird worked five-eighths of a mile in 1:03.83 over the Saratoga main track.

RACING Round-Up

Carroll Returns to Saratoga With Careless Jewel...

Top Canadian trainer Josie Carroll has started exactly one horse at Saratoga Race Course, in 1999. That's when Brushed Halory (Broad Brush) came to the storied track off a win in the GIII Delaware Oaks and took on a tough field in the GI Alabama S. that included champion Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy). Brushed Halory ran poorly, trailing home Silverbulletday by nearly 30 lengths after a bobbling start.

Exactly 10 years and one day later, Carroll will return to this Saturday's Alabama with another Delaware Oaks winner, the progressive **Careless Jewel** (Tapit), and will hope for a better finish with a filly that has shown plenty of promise.

Purchased by Donver Stable for a modest \$40,000 at the Keeneland September Sale, Careless Jewel didn't debut until April, when she ran third as the favorite in a six-furlong Keeneland maiden. She broke her maiden in her next start at Woodbine May 9, again sprinting, then romped by 7 1/4 lengths on the stretch out in a Woodbine allowance June 21. Shipped down for the July 18 Delaware Oaks--now a Grade II event--Careless Jewel belied her 10-1 odds, rolling home clear by 7 1/4 lengths after setting snappy fractions ([video](#)).

"I thought she'd run very well, but when a horse runs exceptionally like that, you're always delighted and surprised," Carroll said of the performance, which earned Careless Jewel a big 110 BRIS figure.

The gray adds substantial ground for the 1 1/4-mile Alabama, as her last two have come at 1 1/16 miles. Carroll was asked how she thought her charge would fare, especially given her running style.

"Obviously, there are some questions, and you hope you don't hook up with anyone on the front end and blow your race early," said Carroll. "But in fact, I don't know this filly has to be on the lead."

As for end-of-year plans, Carroll said she was taking a step-by-step approach to the Breeders' Cup.

"Certainly, we'd have to see what happens in this next race," she said. "We stepped up once and she proved herself, but she has to continue on that line if we're going to think in that direction. She handles synthetic, which is a plus if we'd like to go that way, but at this point, she's still a pretty inexperienced horse."

Carroll said that Careless Jewel will train at Woodbine Thursday before shipping to Saratoga. Jockey Robert Landry retains the mount.

Careless Jewel is owned by Donver Stable, the nominee of Vern and Donna Dubinsky of Alberta, Canada.



"They've really just started stepping up and improving their stock in the last few years, and they've been breeding more of their own horses," Carroll said of the couple. "I think you're going to hear more from them."

Carroll buys some yearlings for the Dubinskys, but wasn't involved with the acquisition of Careless Jewel.

"We had done our purchasing and I had gone home, and Ciaran Dunne from Wavertree Stables, who does a lot of buying for the Dubinskys, spotted this filly," she said. "She actually just rounded out the load, and turned out to be the best one of the bunch."

Earlier this year, the Dubinskys were partners in the group that sold, through Wavertree, the Tiznow--Hurricane Judy colt that topped the Barretts March sale on Jess Jackson's \$650,000 bid. -L Marquardt

Trainer Richard Hannon has won this contest four times, most recently with Bannister (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) in 2000, and is represented by speedball **Monsieur Chevalier** in this renewal. Connections have indicated this season will see his best opportunities, and he has enjoyed a busy juvenile campaign with seven starts already. UPBEAT AUGUST INTERLUDE

The good news at the summer's boutique yearling sales continued at the Arqana sales company's August sale, held over four days last Friday through Monday. Friday's opening session saw gains of eight percent in gross and 11 percent (same as Saratoga's) in average, to an impressive €241,987. Though the overall figures subsequently dropped some, the tone of the sale remained strong, and the final figures were very comparable to last year: 75 percent sold of those offered, a drop of 1.5 percent in gross, and gains of three percent in average and seven percent in median. To be at roughly the same level this year as last year counts, as we know, as a big win.

The key to Saratoga's success wasn't hard to fathom: Maktoum family and friends spent over \$20 million, by our estimates--almost 40 percent of the gross. They were very active again at Deauville--John Ferguson signed seven tickets for \$3.33-million, and Shadwell France spent \$4,190,000 on 20 purchases--but what was impressive at Deauville was the presence of other motivated international buyers, as well as a strong domestic market. This was headed by three agents or trainers who signed for 59 yearlings among them: Marc-Antoine Berghgracht's M.A.B. Agency (22 yearlings); Gilles Forien's Agence F.I.P.S. (20 yearlings); and trainer Jean-Claude Rouget, who bought 17 yearlings. Collectively the 59 yearlings sold for almost €6.5 million, about 15 percent of the sale's gross, though undoubtedly not all the 42 yearlings signed for by the two agencies will be destined to race in France.

Our completely unofficial estimate is that Maktoum entities bought 37 yearlings at Deauville, for a total spend of just under €8.9 million. Combined with the 13 we estimate Coolmore entities bought, totaling just over €3 million, the total for the game's two titanic operators, plus the three biggest domestic buyers, was 109 yearlings (29 percent of those sold) for a total of €18.4 million (44 percent of the amount spent).

To have five competing buying groups which are buying two out of every seven horses sold puts a very significant 'floor' under a sale. Though it wasn't up as much as Saratoga, there was much more depth in the buying groups at Arqana.

From the same stable and operating in the same currency, it looks pretty likely Deauville August has replaced Goffs' sale (last year Million, this year Orby), as Europe's number two yearling sale, behind Tattersalls' October 1. Five major competing groups of 'end users' is a big factor in that. Pinhookers again were conspicuous by their absence, except for Irishman Con Marnane, who bought nine yearlings, but at an average under €40,000. Another notable name on the sheets was Juddmonte Farms, which bought the only two yearlings catalogued from the first crop of their sub-fertile stallion Cacique, a full brother to Dansili who won two Grade I races in American and ran second in five more Grade/Group 1s in North American and Europe.

A number of proven sires sold well at Deauville, testimony to the strength of the current European sire corps. Cumulatively through all yearling sales in 2009, six sires, all proven, now have three or more yearlings with an average of the equivalent of more than \$300,000, and another 10 have averages over \$194,000. You can see full details in the Instatistics section of the TDN website, but, very briefly, the 16 with their cumulative averages are:

The leading first-crop sire on average is Holy Roman Emperor, who ranks 17th with seven sold, averaging \$174,610. The other top first-year sires so far were: **Hurricane Run** (16 sold, averaging \$143,746); **Shirocco** (14, \$91,413); **Iffraaj** (5, \$90,781); and **Aussie Rules** (5, \$64,241). First, second, and fifth-ranking first-year sires are Coolmore; third and fourth are Darley.

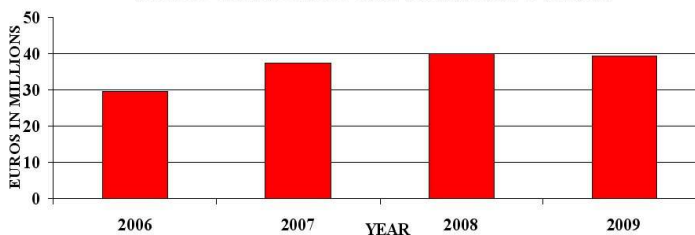

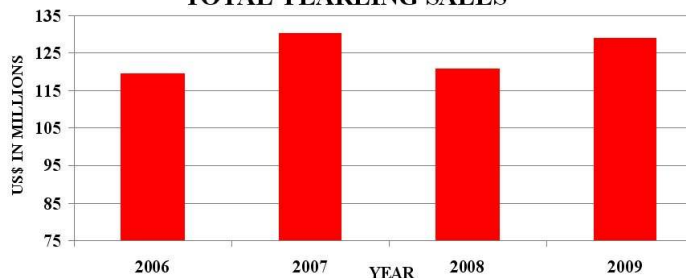

Nureyev, the five-year-old captured the 2008 G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin. He also notched wins in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial S. in 2007, the G2 Al Fahidi Fort S. and G2 Summer Mile in 2008, and made a victorious 2009 bow in the G3 Zabeel Mile at Nad al Sheba Feb. 28. Sixth in

his title defense at Sha Tin Apr. 26, the bay was slated to contest the G1 Coral-Eclipse S. last month at Sandown, but was withdrawn due to a swollen fetlock by trainer Mike de Kock. Archipenko compiled a record of 17-6-2-1 and bankrolled £1,254,927. His stud fee will be announced in October. Rausing also revealed that Selkirk (Sharpen Up {GB}) will be back on the stud roster next year. "The other good news from Lanwades is that Selkirk, following encouraging veterinary examinations, is coming out from his temporary retirement and will again be available to mare owners in 2010," she said.

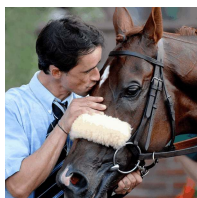
Trainer Karl Burke's appeal against a one-year ban has been dismissed by the British Horseracing Authority. He was warned off after admitting passing information for reward at a hearing last month, but had hoped to get his punishment reduced. The BHA's appeal board rejected his appeal Monday, and ordered him to forfeit his £800 deposit and pay £4,000 towards costs. Burke, who registered a first Group 1 win with Lord Shanakill (Speightstown) in the July 5 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly, had his suspension confirmed last month after a long-running investigation. He initially requested a stay on the ban, which started July 28, pending his appeal, but that application was rejected by the BHA.
