RACHEL: BRING ON THE BOYS...AGAIN

After she worked a strong six furlongs at Saratoga Monday morning, connections of **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) confirmed the sophomore miss will

make her next start in the Sept. 5 GI Woodward S. at Saratoga. It will be the Stonestreet Stables and Harold McCormick-owned filly's first start against older horses and her third against males, following wins in the

GI Preakness S. and GI Haskell Invitational. "Rachel Alexandra's workouts have been excellent," Stonestreet's Jess Jackson said in a release. "Hal McCormick, my family and I, like other fans of horse racing, want to see her tested. If she goes up against older male horses, we'll be better able to get a measure of her greatness."

With trainer Steve Asmussen, Jackson's wife Barbara Banke, and regular jockey Calvin Borel looking on, Rachel Alexandra breezed the six-furlong distance in 1:11.84 over a muddy main track at Saratoga yesterday. Regular exercise rider Dominic Terry was aboard. NYRA clockers caught Rachel through internal splits of :24.27, :36.23, :47.86 and :59.60. She galloped out seven furlongs in 1:25.58. "It was awesome," said Terry. "She's amazing."

No filly has ever won the Woodward, something that weighed into the decision to send the four-time Grade I winner to the race. "Jess's sportsmanship about what they can do is quite obvious, instead of just talk--there's just so much--no filly has won the Woodward," said Asmussen. "For everything else that she's done, I think that it's the showcase or the platform that she's worthy of." **Cont. p2**

EINSTEIN CONFIRMED FOR PACIFIC CLASSIC

Midnight Cry Stable's **Einstein (Brz)** (Spend a Buck) has been confirmed for Del Mar's GI Pacific Classic on Sunday, Sept. 6. Einstein will be returning to California for the first time since shipping in to plunder the GI Santa Anita H. in March. The seven-year-old, who is based in the Kentucky barn of Helen Pitts, is coming off a disappointing fifth in the GI Arlington Million Aug. 8. The dark bay is expected to be joined in Del Mar's crown jewel by a cast which includes **Colonel John** (Tiznow), **Informed** (Tiznow) and **Rail Trip** (Jump Start).

'HAVEN' WORKS AHEAD OF KING'S BISHOP

Godolphin's **Vineyard Haven** (Lido Palace {Chi}) covered five furlongs over Saratoga's main track in 1:01.84 Monday in his final major tune up for Saturday's GI NetJets King's Bishop S. Rick Mettee, the North American racing manager for Godolphin and assistant to trainer Saeed bin Suroor, sent the grey out shortly after the break. "He's on target," Mettee said of Vineyard Haven. "I'm happy with the way he's coming into the race. In a perfect world, he would have run in the [GII] Amsterdam [Aug. 3] and we would have had a race into him, but he wasn't quite ready yet. He's fit and he's going to run on a track that he likes." Winner of the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. and GI Champagne S. last year, the colt has not raced since finishing fourth in the G3 U.A.E. Two Thousand Guineas in February.

QUALITY ROAD PRIMED FOR TRAVERS

Edward P. Evans' **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality) put in his final breeze Monday morning ahead of Saturday's GI Shadwell Travers S. at Saratoga. The muscular bay,

who worked in company with stablemate Unbridled Belle (Broken Vow), completed five furlongs over the muddy main track in :59.68, the fourth fastest of 24 at the distance. "It felt good, very good," said jockey John Velazquez, who was aboard for the work. I wanted to do enough, but not let him do too much. As soon as I got right to [Unbridled Belle], he got into the bridle and

then I had him slow down a little bit. I didn't want to let him do too much down the lane." Overseeing the move was trainer Todd Pletcher, who seemed pleased with the effort. "I thought he went well," Pletcher said. "We were shooting for a minute to a minute-one and we were pretty close to that. It looked like he galloped out well." The colt was originally scheduled to work Sunday, however, inclement weather forced the postponement. Quality Road was sent out just before 9 a.m. yesterday morning, immediately following the renovation break.

"He came back and he's cooling out good so far-- doesn't seem to blowing all that hard," Pletcher said as he watched the horse walk following Monday's work. "I think we've got him in as good a position as we could be in with one race under our belt." Winner of the GI Florida Derby earlier this spring, Quality Road enters the Travers off a record-breaking win in the 6½-furlong GII Amsterdam S. Aug. 3. "We needed this work to set ourselves up [for Saturday] and he handled it well," Pletcher said. "In a perfect world, we'd have worked on a perfectly fast racetrack. But the forecast didn't look like it was going to definitely be better tomorrow, so we felt like we needed to get in and go. I walked both tracks this morning, and I felt like the main track was quite a bit better than the training track, so I decided to go at 8:45 and it worked out fine."

Shortly after the announcement, the New York Racing Association said that it was boosting the purse of the Woodward from \$500,000 to \$750,000. "Raising the Woodward purse will help attract a top field to what will be a historic race," said NYRA Vice President and Director of Racing P.J. Campo. "In addition, we felt that to have a filly like Rachel Alexandra seeking to become the first ever female to win the Woodward warranted an increase in purse." The line-up for the Woodward could include **Asiatic Boy (Arg)** (Not for Sale {Arg}), **Cool Coal Man** (Mineshaft), **Tizway** (Tiznow), **Bullsbay** (Tiznow), **It's a Bird** (Birdonthewire), and **Macho Again** (Macho Uno).

In related news, Rachel Alexandra's Stonestreet-owned stablemate **Kensei** (Mr. Greeley) will run in Saturday's \$1-million GI Travers S. at Saratoga, a race that had also been considered for the super filly. Kensei is coming off a victory in the \$500,000 GII Jim Dandy S. "Given how well Kensei was doing, I thought he deserved a chance in the Travers," said Asmussen. "It would be a race that would mark his career and with that decision, Rachel will be pointed towards the Woodward."

DARLEY BUYS DEEP SKY Darley Japan has purchased 2008 Japanese champion three-year-old and Classic winner **Deep Sky (Jpn)** (Agnes Tachyon {Jpn}) and will stand the son of Japan's leading sire of 2008 on the island of Hokkaido. Shane Horan, Darley Japan's director of stallion operations, said the chestnut colt out of winner **Abi (GB)** (Chief's Crown) and from the immediate female family of champion and Filly Triple Crown winner **Chris Evert (Swoons' Son)**, is due to arrive at Darley Japan Aug. 30. A stud fee for 2010 has not been announced. "Darley is delighted to be adding the 2008 Japanese Derby winner to our stallion roster," Horan said. "The dual Grade 1 winner is the best son of the outstanding stallion **Agnes Tachyon (Sunday Silence)**, whose death earlier this year proved a significant loss to the Japanese bloodstock industry. **Deep Sky** is a very exciting stallion prospect and we believe he will prove a worthy successor to his great sire." **Agnes Tachyon** died of cardiac arrest in June at age 11. Darley Japan currently stands 2007 Japanese Horse of the Year **Admire Moon (Jpn)** (End Sweep), champion **Fantastic Light (Rahy)**, G1SWs **Storming Home (GB)** (Machiavellian), **Rule of Law (Kingmambo)** and **Alkaased (Kingmambo)**. Bred by **Kasamatsu Bokujo** and campaigned by **Toshio Fukami**, **Deep Sky** won five and placed 10 times for earnings of \$6,323,231. Last year, he won four consecutive races at distances from 1,600 to 2,400 meters. Among his wins in that skein were the **NHK Mile Cup** and the 2,400-meter Japanese Derby. He concluded the 2008 season by winning the **Kobe Shimbun Hai**, finishing third by just a neck in a three-way photo finish with eventual Horse of the Year **Vodka (Jpn)** (Tanino Gimlet) and champion **Daiwa Scarlet (Jpn)** (Agnes Tachyon) in the G1 **Tenno Sho**, and just missing winner **Screen Hero (Jpn)** (Grass Wonder) by a half-length in the G1 **Japan Cup**. This year, **Deep Sky** raced three times, finishing second to **Dream Journey (Jpn)** (Stay Gold) in the G2 **Sankei Osaka Hai**, second to **Vodka** in the G1 **Yasuda Kinen** and third to **Dream Journey** in the G1 **Takarazuka Kinen**, a race that proved to be his last start, on June 28. Horan said **Deep Sky** suffered a career-ending injury while preparing for a fall racing agenda that had included a possible bid in the G1 **Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe**. **Deep Sky** currently is rated the co-second best older horse, just one pound behind **Dream Journey** and even with **Vodka**, on the World Thoroughbred Racehorse Rankings of runners in Japan, and last year was the top-rated three-year-old. --*Michele MacDonald*

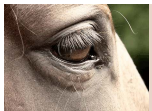

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

Any breeder who remembers the 1980s and '90s will appreciate that stallions don't come much better than Blushing Groom--a French champion who became one of the jewels in Gainesway's crown after impressing John Gaines with his exceptional action.

"The thing that impressed me the most was his way of going," Gaines once said. "He had a beautiful flowing, rhythmical action. It was marvellous to see."

Blushing Groom's action was just one of the impressive things about him, but unfortunately, this phenomenal sire didn't enjoy the best of health. He first underwent surgery to remove a cancerous testicle at the age of 14 in 1988, sired his last small crop at 16 and was dead at 18, in 1992. It is a measure of Blushing Groom's tremendous efficacy that his 47 live foals of 1989 included six group winners, headed by the sensational Arazi, and that the excellent fillies Sky Beauty and Gold Splash were among his 29 live foals of 1990. There were even three stakes winners among the 10 foals which made up his final crop.

Altogether Blushing Groom left only 512 named foals, of which 18 percent became stakes winners and roughly 11 percent became group/graded winners, in the process crediting him with a stunning Average Earnings Index of around 4.00. He could even claim to have 4.7 percent Group 1/Grade I winners to his credit, and how many stallions manage to sire five percent graded winners of any level?

But, with none of his Group 1/Grade I-winning sons being younger than 20, we are approaching the end of an era. We were reminded of this early in July, with the announcement that Rahy--arguably his last major stallion son--has been pensioned at the age of 24 because of declining fertility.

Although Rahy didn't rank among Blushing Groom's Group 1 winners, he was an excellent performer at his best and he was also very well-connected, too--as might be guessed from the \$2,000,000 he cost Gainsborough Stud Management at the 1986 Keeneland Selected Yearling Sale. **Cont. p5**

Rahy began his career in England, where he won his first two starts before stepping into group company. Soft ground was possibly the reason for his disappointing third when a hot favorite to land the G2 Mill Reef S. and he quickly restored his reputation when second in the G1 Middle Park S. Rahy's second season was severely restricted by a hairline fracture to a hind pastern and he didn't race again until August.

Rahy's potential seemed about to be fulfilled at long last after he moved to Neil Drysdale's stable in California, where he won three of his first four starts. He was especially impressive in two starts in July 1989, most notably when he raced home 10 lengths clear in the GII Bel Air H. at Hollywood Park. His time for the mile was a very fast 1:33.0. He wasn't to win again, though, and ended the year rated 119, nine pounds below top-ranked Steinlen, on the *Blood-Horse* Free Handicap for Older Males.

Any shortcomings on the track were compensated for by his very attractive pedigree. His dam, the champion Halo mare Glorious Song, was a sister to Devil's Bag, the unbeaten champion two-year-old of 1983, and Saint Ballado, who was to sire performers of the calibre of Saint Liam and Ashado. Seven years after producing Rahy, Glorious Song did even better, her In The Wings colt being the renowned international performer Sing-spiel, sire of numerous Group 1 winners. **Cont. p6**

With a background like this, Rahy represented an interesting prospect at his opening fee of \$15,000 when he retired to Three Chimneys in 1990--provided breeders were prepared to take a chance on a stallion standing only 15.1 hands. He wasted little time in proving his worth, with Miss Ra He Ra winning the Gill Bashford Manor S. and Mariah's Storm the Gill Arlington-Washington Lassie S. in 1993. Mariah's Storm, of course, went on to become the dam of Giant's Causeway, who increased his total of Grade I winners from his first five Northern Hemisphere crops to an impressive 13 when Internallyflawless won the Del Mar Oaks three days ago.

An even better filly, the indomitable Serena's Song, emerged from Rahy's second crop and top-quality distaffers have continued to flow from him, with Dreaming of Anna, Tates Creek, Tranquility Lake, Exotic Wood, Shining Energy and the Australian filly Allow all becoming Grade I winners. It would be no surprise if Rahy's latest good filly, the English-trained Lady of the Desert, were also to attain that status, judging by the way she easily added last week's G2 Lowther S. to her previous victory in the G3 Princess Margaret S.

Lady of the Desert has every right to develop into an excellent performer because she is a daughter of Queen's Logic, who also won the Lowther S. before becoming a Group 1 winner with a devastating display

in the 2001 Cheveley Park S. That Group 1 victory suggested that Queen's Logic had the 1,000 Guineas at her mercy. After everything seemed to be going to plan when she maintained her unbeaten record in the Fred Darling S. on her three-year-old debut,

she had the misfortune to go lame on the day before the Classic. She never ran again.

Lady of the Desert is the first of Queen's Logic's first three named foals to have inherited a large measure of her outstanding talent, but the family has also received a considerable boost from the exploits of one of Queen's Logic's half-brothers, Dylan Thomas. This wonderfully tough son of Danehill retired the winner of six Group 1s, including the Irish Derby, the King George, the Arc and two runnings of the Irish Champion S. His first foals were born this year, and they will surely add to the Danehill legend if they inherit their sire's durability and great will to win.

Lady of the Desert's owner has plenty to look forward to in the immediate future, but he must also be looking forward to breeding from her. Rahy's older daughters have already produced numerous graded winners, including the stallions Giant's Causeway, After Market, Posse, Even The Score, Grand Reward, Harlington and Freud. Perhaps this is going to be the way that Rahy's name will live on, as his own stallion sons, headed by the huge earner Fantastic Light and Noverre, have yet to make much of an impact.

Rahy himself achieved some admirable statistics, with 39 individual Northern Hemisphere group/graded winners, which isn't far short of four percent of his racing-age offspring. No doubt there'll be more to come from his 45 current two-year-olds and from his last few crops, which include 52 yearlings.

MEDAGLIA FILLY HEADS OBS AUGUST OPENER

A filly by Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}) realized the top price of \$275,000 during the first session of the OBS August Selected Sale of Yearlings in Ocala, Florida, Monday. Offered by Francis and Barbara Vanlangendonck's Summerfield, hip 108, a daughter of SW Lolabell (Phone Trick), was secured by Live Oak Plantation. Leading the colts yesterday was hip 89, a member of the first crop sired by MGSW Rockport Harbor (Unbridled's Song). Consigned by Ron and Lybby Gay and purchased by Florida pinhooker Nick de Meric, the Mar. 22 foal is out of the unraced mare Java Jolt (Hennessy). The 10-year-old daughter of GSW Risen Colony (Pleasant Colony) is already the dam of True Addiction (Yes It's True), runner-up in last week's GII Adirondack S. The number of horses sold this year remained constant with last term's figure of 113, but the gross dropped to \$3,708,500 from \$5,633,000 in 2008. DELAWARE SPORTS BETTING LAW RULED ILLEGAL According to published reports, legislation to allow sports betting in Delaware has been ruled illegal by a federal appeals court, which said the law would be in violation of a federal prohibition against sports gambling. The case was heard by a three-judge panel in Philadelphia Monday. The legislation was opposed by all the major sports leagues--including the NFL, NBA, MLB and NHL--as well as the NCAA. In May, Delaware Gov. Jack Markell signed into law a measure to legalize sports betting in the state. Delaware had previously been exempted from the federal ban on sports gambling because, in 1976, the state had run a sports lottery for one football season. "For example, the recent Hall of Fame induction class honored the Kentucky-bred filly Silverbulletday, the California-bred colt Tiznow, New York-based jockey Eddie Maple, California-based trainer Bob Baffert, along with trainer Janet Elliot and English Grand National winner Ben Nevis II from the steeplechase community associated with Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia and South Carolina. The current endowment of approximately \$3 million will serve as the base for the drive, which will serve owners, breeders, racetracks, fans, and the many other segments of the multi-faceted Thoroughbred racing and breeding industries. "There are many important and vigorous organizations in this broad industry," said Museum Director Joe Aulisi, "But, I believe the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame is unique in its specific role on behalf of all those components. I hope the fact we have been around for more than a half-century is not taken for granted by the industry. It is also my hope that all organizations involved in Thoroughbred racing will support this fundraising endeavor to ensure we are always here on their behalf."

CLIFFS TO BE SCOPED AFTER MORNY REVERSAL

Connections of **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) are to scope the two-year-old following his third placing in Sunday's G1 Prix Morny. The Heffer Syndicate's G2 Coventry S. winner was sent off the 4-5 favorite for the Deauville contest, but was unable to show the same sparkle behind Arcano (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}). "The ground was obviously firmer than they made out at Deauville--they smashed the track record--and that could well have been a contributory factor in Canford Cliffs's below-par run," trainer Richard Hannon commented yesterday. "However, I have no doubt that he'll bounce back and I would not be frightened of taking on Arcano again. We'll wait and see what the scope says before making plans, but, who knows, we could meet him again in the G1 Dewhurst S. [at Newmarket Oct. 17]." Jockey Richard Hughes added, "We haven't had the result of the scope yet, but it was definitely not the Canford Cliffs from Royal Ascot or the one I regularly ride on the gallops at Herridge. We went three-parts of a length up, but if Canford Cliffs had been on his game he would have had shot three lengths clear. The whoosh he showed at Ascot was missing, and I don't know why. People have been talking about how they broke the track record, but that was more due to the strong headwind than the fast ground."

DELEGATOR ON COURSE FOR MILE

Godolphin's new recruit **Delegator (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) is set to make his first start in the royal blue in Saturday's G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood.
