BETTER BEIN' GOOD THAN LUCKY

Luck had little to do with it. ♣ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♣ **Lookin at Lucky** (Smart Strike) came into yesterday's GI Del Mar Futurity with two-straight victories already

under his belt and remained a perfect three-for-three with an impressive win as the crowd's choice. Sporting plenty of upside based on his pedigree and his connections, the colt, a half brother to MGSW winner Kensei (Mr. Greeley), benefitted by the fact that he is con-

ditioned by Bob Baffert, who was collecting his record ninth victory in the juvenile showpiece. Unhurried in seventh through an opening quarter in :23, the \$475,000 KEEAPR juvenile began to make headway heading into the home turn. Despite some minor bumps midstretch, Lookin at Lucky was moving best of all late and drove home a comfortable one-length winner over **Make Music For Me** (Bernstein).

"I wasn't liking my position," said winning rider Garrett Gomez. "But if you have a good horse, you can do a lot of things. If you sit down inside there long enough, something is going to happen for you. And I waited and waited and then I was able to push my way out and get him loose. He's a good horse and good horses can make you look good."

Added Baffert, who was also collecting his sixth graded stakes win of the current Del Mar meet, "This horse was in tight most of the way and he learned a lot today. He's quite a horse. I wasn't worried about drawing the rail. He has the speed to get himself in a good place. He's right there with Midshipman [last year's winner of the Del Mar Futurity, GI BC Juvenile and was champion two-year-old colt of 2008] in that sense."

Baffert indicated that the colt will be targeted at the Oct. 4 GII Norfolk S. at Oak Tree.

The chestnut stumbled at the start and was reserved off the pace through opening splits of :22.10 and :44.97. Ready to make his move approaching the stretch, the Robert Baker and William Mack-owned colt swung out four wide around the home turn, took over while drifting out in the stretch and, with the encouragement of jockey Jamie Theriot, straightened course late to earn his first victory at this level. "He stumbled badly at the break, but he recovered very quickly," Theriot said. "He was a little green coming down the lane. If I hit him right-handed, he'd duck left a little; if I hit him left-handed, he'd duck right. He'll grow out of that. I think [more] distance won't be a problem for him. We will see a different horse when he goes two turns. My idea was to come to Saratoga and find myself a [GI Kentucky] Derby horse. We think he's a good one."

Dublin broke awkwardly and made a solid effort to be fourth to Backtalk (Smarty Jones) in his career debut going five panels at Churchill Downs June 11. Let go at 8-1 in his most recent start in a six-furlong test over this track Aug. 1, the \$525,000 KEESEP yearling purchase stalked the early pace and mounted a rally late to win by an impressive 3 1/4-length margin. "This was my No. 1 pick in the sales," confirmed winning trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who was winning his first at this level since a score by Folklore (Tiznow) in the 2005 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. "I still haven't lost my eye in that part. I like to play in the main arena--these two-year-olds, when they turn three, that's the name of the game. Bill Mack and Bob Baker are the reason this horse is here." Lukas indicated that Dublin, who would return to the trainer's Churchill base, will likely make his next start in mile GI Champagne S. at Belmont Oct. 10. Among the beaten yesterday were Aspire (Tale of the Cat), winner in a Spa maiden in his debut Aug. 12. "He ran great," said the Gary and Mary West-owned colt's trainer Eddie Kenneally. "He was a little green, but I know the longer he goes the better he will get. I knew this was a jump up in class for him, but he ran great."

MONITOR ADDED TO LEGER FIELD Lawrie Inman's **Monitor Closely (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) was yesterday supplemented for Saturday's G1 St Leger at Doncaster, for which 10 were declared. Trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam paid the £45,000 fee to add the Aug. 18 G2 Great Voltigeur S. winner to the extended 14-furlong Classic and said, "We have decided to supplement Monitor Closely for the St Leger--chances to have a crack at a Classic don't come along very often. We were delighted with his win in the Great Voltigeur and feel it is worth having a shot at the Leger now. His work since York has been good and we are just hoping that the ground remains on the quick side." G3 Bahrain Trophy and G3 Geoffrey Freer S. winner **Kite Wood (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will spearhead a two-pronged attack from Godolphin alongside the G1 Derby Italiano winner **Mastery (GB)** (Sulamani {Ire}), but Racing Manager Simon Crisford was far from confident at the race's media event in London yesterday. "I think the ground will work against [Kite Wood] and I don't think he will be the favourite on Saturday," Crisford said. "He is a much better horse with some cut in the ground." Aidan O'Brien has left in a quartet headed by Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Eduard Mordukhovitch's G1 Grand Prix de Paris runner-up **Age of Aquarius (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and the Ebor H. runner-up **Changingoftheguard (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}). The Ballydoyle conditioner commented yesterday, "Age of Aquarius has gone forward with every run and is not as exposed as Changingoftheguard, who has been running in handicaps. He will love a big galloping track and faster ground. The two of them want good or faster ground. Johnny [Murtagh] has not decided yet whether he'll be riding at Doncaster or The Curragh. The G1 National S. is on at the Curragh the same afternoon and the G1 DFS Champagne S., in which we could run Viscount Nelson (Giant's Causeway), is also at Doncaster, so we will just have to see." John Oxx has left in His Highness The Aga Khan's G1 Irish Derby third **Mourayan (Ire)** (Alhaarth {Ire}) and is also waiting on making jockey arrangements after Mick Kinane has alternatives at The Curragh. "He's been very consistent and we want to run him, because I think it's the race for him and it would take a fair bit to stop him taking part on Saturday," Oxx said. "It will be a couple of days before Mick decides whether he'll ride at Doncaster or The Curragh the same day. It's a 50-50 call and if Mick doesn't come over, I'd think Fran Berry will ride."

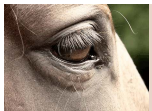

We Europeans have the Australian industry to thank for initially highlighting Danehill's exceptional potential as a stallion, and history now seems to be repeating itself with regards to the possibilities posed by his broodmare daughters.

When the 2008-2009 Australian season came to an end July 31, Danehill was in first place on the broodmare sires' table, just as he had been in each of the previous three years. Danehill has yet to achieve such a lofty position on the equivalent table in Britain and Ireland, which has been dominated by Sadler's Wells over the last few years. There are signs, though, that he is going to reach the top before too long.

In 2005, when he would have been 19, Danehill's daughters enjoyed something of a breakthrough year, earning him eighth place on the Anglo-Irish broodmare sires' table, and he went on to finish sixth, 10th and third in the next three years. This year he's a respectable fifth, with the G1 Golden Jubilee S. winner Art Connoisseur leading the way.

But if Danehill's daughters are going to make him a champion sire in that department in the Northern Hemisphere, which stallions are going to help them bridge the gap? **Cont. p10**

Many of Coolmore's clients have looked to sons of Sadler's Wells, and three of them--Galileo, Montjeu and High Chaparral--have so far sired group winners from Danehill mares. Galileo, of course, has been easily the most successful of them, notably enjoying Group 1 success with Teofilo and Cima de Triomphe, and this pairing has also produced this year's G1 1000 Guineas second Cuis Ghaire.

Another popular option for Danehill's daughters among the Coolmore/Ashford stallions has been Giant's Causeway, and there are five black-type winners (13 percent) among the first 40 foals representing this cross in both hemispheres. Among them are last year's G1 Dewhurst S. winner Intense Focus and the Australian Group 1 winner Just Momente, so it isn't too surprising that Giant's Causeway's Classic-winning son Footstepsinthesand is making an eye-catching start with Danehill mares.

The statistics credit Footstepsinthesand with only eight foals of racing age out of Danehill mares, of which six have raced and four have already won. More importantly, three of them have earned black type, including the recent G3 Prestige S. winner Sent From Heaven. Perhaps Footstepsinthesand's success was predictable, as he is out of a good daughter of Rainbow Quest. When Danehill's Australian daughters were mated with Rainbow Quest's Derby-winning son Quest for Fame, they produced the Group 1 winners Unworldly and De Beers and the Group 2 winner Sea Battle.

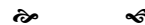
Cheveley Park Stud has also proved a rewarding destination for Danehill's daughters, as four members of the stud's stallion team--Pivotal, his son Kyllachy, Medicean and the deceased Primo Dominie--have so far sired group winners from them.

Pivotal stepped into the spotlight as a potential mate for Danehill's top daughters when Saoire, one of his first foals out of a Danehill mare, led home a Pivotal one-two in the 2005 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas. This Classic success saw numerous daughters of Danehill beat a path to Pivotal's door in 2006, including such accomplished performers as Dress to Thrill, Wannabe Grand and Danehurst, and the result was 14 juveniles of 2009.

This cross inevitably proved popular at the 2008 yearling sales, with a colt and a filly each selling for 400,000gns. The colt, Bass Rock, finished a close third on his promising debut in Ireland last month and the filly, Kitty Kiernan, won before finishing second and third at Group 3 level.

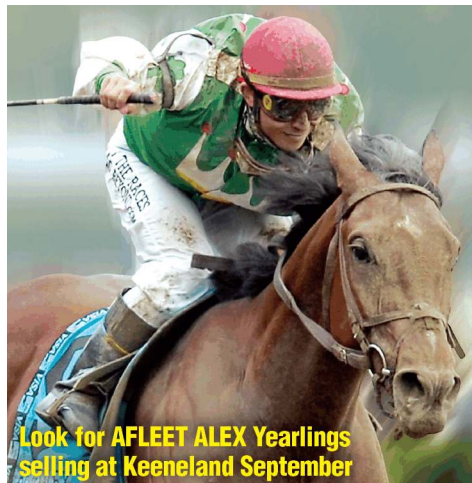
The potential of the Pivotal-Danehill cross has also been well advertised by the colts Buzzword and Siyouni, both of whom contested the Prix La Rochette two days ago. The seven runners in this highly competitive Group 3 event had collectively won 12 of their 18 previous starts. Among them were four Godolphin colts, including a listed winner by Cape Cross and unbeaten sons of Kingmambo and Elusive Quality that had respectively cost \$850,000 and \$300,000. To their credit, Buzzword and Siyouni filled first and second places, with Buzzword putting up the best effort of a career that has seen him improve several pounds for each of his first four starts. The chances are he will improve again for his Longchamp victory.

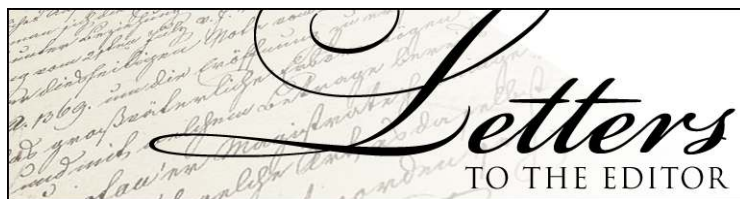

Buzzword is a Darley homebred, as is his dam Bustling. Bustling was one of the Danehills that stayed much better than their sire. Having won the Listed Derby du Midi over a mile and a half, Bustling became the mount of Frankie Dettori in the 2002 G1 Prix de Diane. Although out of her depth in Classic company, Bustling later made the first four in two Group 2 contests, including one over a mile and three-quarters. No doubt she inherited some stamina via her dam Carnival Spirit. Although this daughter of Kris gained her only success over a mile, she was a half-sister to the Arc winner Saumarez, and her other stakes winners--Exaltation, Baranquilla and Carniola--all scored at around a mile and a quarter.

Bustling isn't the first granddaughter of Danzig from the Carnival Spirit family to have produced a first-rate winner. Last year we saw Dance for Fun, an Anabaa mare out of a daughter of Carnival Spirit, hit the jackpot via her Galileo filly Lush Lashes, a winner of three Group 1 races from a mile to a mile and a half.

With a background like this, it isn't easy to pinpoint exactly what Buzzword's best distance is likely to be. Although Pivotal never tackled more than six furlongs, he has proved capable of getting excellent performers over a wide range of distances. This is perfectly demonstrated by his three Group 1 winners this year, which comprise Regal Parade, winner of the Betfred Sprint Cup three days ago; Virtual, winner of the Juddmonte Lockinge over a mile; and Sariska, who completed the Oaks double over a mile and a half in Britain and Ireland. Buzzword is better over seven furlongs than six, and a mile should be no problem. Saoire, the filly who helped the Pivotal-Danehill cross gather momentum, probably stayed a mile and a quarter.

It's worth adding that Pivotal has been in splendid form recently, with Poet and Emerald Commander also winning stakes races for him last week. But then breeders have every right to expect this excellent stallion to deliver the goods, as his 2006 and 2007 crops were sired at £65,000, before his fee rose to £85,000 for the next two years.



I would like to add my dismay to the sight of Rachel Alexandra's being beaten by her jockey in the Woodward. I mentioned right away to a friend that they were throwing water all over her and hosing her down so that the public and press would be less likely to be able to see the welts on her body. She is the embodiment of courage and talent and a will to win, beating her up was a gruesome sight.

In response to the letter from Jack Luxemberger regarding the excessive use of the whip on Rachel Alexandra in the Woodward: he is absolutely right to protest, and not only in the case of fillies. Borel hit Rachel 23 times in the stretch run. I heard no protest from anyone who should have spoken up. Recently Chantal Sutherland, a jockey at Woodbine, was fined \$200 for mistakenly not using the new whips being tried there. Which is the greater infraction? Where are the stewards? The same morning of the Woodward, I watched Sea the Stars run a sublime race against world-class competition in Ireland and was never touched with the whip.

With all the talk recently about new rules governing sizes, thickness and use of whips, and with all the going-nowhere talk about drug use and unenforced suspensions, racing fans should rightly ask: why waste time inventing new rules if even the old ones are unenforced? A few days ago a jockey surrendered his license at Philadelphia Park because he admitted to "holding back a horse" in England in 2004. But I have not heard any explanation as to why there were no questions asked and nothing done about Kent Desormeaux pulling up Big Brown in the Belmont S. in 2008, when he said immediately after the race there was nothing wrong with the horse, he just "didn't have it" and didn't want to "finish fifth" or worse. In any other country in the world that would mean a long, long suspension.

I've been a solid racing fan for more than 50 years, but it gets harder every year to explain to a younger generation why they should be fans, too. The romance and glory are still there, but only if we think of it as the sport it was meant to be, not the industry it has become.





Jack Luxemberger's letter concerning excessive use of the whip by jockeys is "right on the money." To see a jockey flailing with successive sharp "left and right backhanders" to an outstanding filly who is clearly giving her all is a disgrace to our sport. There are many excuses given on these occasions: waving the whip to keep a horse straight, only hitting the number cloth to make a noise, etc.

There is no evidence to show that the use of the whip makes a horse run any faster. It is a harsh and unproductive (detrimental?) exercise. The reality of the cruelty to the horse involved, however, still takes second place to the perception of cruelty as seen by the spectator. Anything more calculated to turn off potential fans is hard to imagine and anyone watching on TV with different angle shots, slow reruns, close-ups, etc. will have this image repeated many times over.

Jockeys and trainers are under huge pressure today to win races, more so than ever before. Times have changed and the modern media can and does, "for better or worse," reveal all in significant detail. It is therefore essential that a firm stand is taken against the practice of whip usage. The carrying of whips by jockeys should be banned, period. I am advised that this is an unattainable situation...Why?

Perhaps a jockey wishing to carry a whip should also carry a 10-pound penalty along with it. The list of wrongs in American racing is long; taken together, these wrongs lead to the conclusion that participants have a death wish for the sport.

I have been involved in the industry all my life, decades, and have had plenty of time to consider my opinions. The opinions expressed here are strictly personal, and I take full and sole responsibility for their expression. I am sure that some will consider these as the ramblings of an old man in his dotage, so be it.

I read Jack Luxemberger's comments on Calvin Borel's treatment of Rachel Alexandra in the Woodward with great interest. Watching Borel flog his mount all the way down the stretch, I couldn't help but think, "If this race was at Woodbine, he'd get disqualified for that." Well, perhaps not disqualified, but fined a minimum of 20 percent of his winnings for excessive use of the whip, which under the new ORC urging rules (effective Sept. 1) is defined as striking the horse more than three times without giving the horse a chance to respond.

The ORC's new urging rules also involve the use of a more humane riding crop. In fact, on the morning of the Woodward, the *Toronto Star* reported that jockey Chantal Sutherland was fined and her mount disqualified (costing the horse's connections \$40,800 in prize money) for using the old-style whip in a race last Wednesday. That particular incident involved a series of errors, and is under appeal, but nonetheless, the new rules were on my mind when I was watching Borel--and counting the lashes.

I'm a relatively new convert to this sport, and while I find it fascinating, and at times astonishingly beautiful, I'm puzzled by the way the sport is run: the lack of coordination, which results in major events competing with each other; the hedge fund mentality of some ownership groups; and the lack of improvement in athletic performance and durability over the last 30 years. As I said, I'm new to this, but simple logic and 40 years in business make these the obvious questions to ask.

I'm old enough to remember when racehorses were household names, even capturing the imaginations of non-racing fans. Horses like Rachel Alexandra still have that power, but not if she becomes defined by how she is treated rather than by her remarkable talent. Like it or not, we live in an age when perception is reality. It is not enough that racehorses are well-treated. They must also APPEAR to be well treated, and the image of Rachel Alexandra being whipped down the stretch doesn't serve that purpose.

RICE MAKES HISTORY WITH SARATOGA TRAINING TITLE



Linda Rice became the first woman in history to lead the final trainer standings at Saratoga by edging six-time leading conditioner Todd Pletcher by one race. Despite having 60 fewer starters than Pletcher, Rice took top honors with 20 victories from 75 attempts over the course of the 36-day meet. She led by one race going into the final day, and clinched the title when Pletcher's GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. entrants Aikenite (Yes It's True) and One Note Samba (Grand Reward) finished third and ninth, respectively. Neither trainer won on closing day. "Of course, I'm looking at the horses standing in my barn, and [I wasn't] sure I could follow through. I was concerned for the last couple of days, because I didn't have the right horses in. I placed a few horses pretty aggressively last week, and it worked." Rice won six stakes over the course of the meet, four of which were turf sprints. All of her victories came in races that were scheduled to be contested on grass. It was the first training title for the 45-year-old Rice, who started her own stable in 1987. Jockey Ramon Dominguez kept his New York riding-title streak alive by virtue of his 45 victories at the Saratoga stand. The native of Venezuela was the leading rider at the last two Aqueduct meets, as well as this year's spring/summer season at Belmont Park. Alan Garcia was second in the jockey standings with 40 victories. For the second straight year, Ken and Sarah Ramsey were the leading owners with 13 winners from 60 starters.
