EL PRADO DIES AT 20

Adena Springs resident and leading sire **El Prado (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells--Lady Capulet, by Sir Ivor) died of a heart attack soon after being turned out into his paddock Monday morning. Still active at 20, the stallion

stood for \$75,000 in 2009. Although well accomplished on the racetrack, El Prado scaled new heights at stud, siring eight Grade I/Group 1 and 30 graded stakes winners, and a total of 74 horses who triumphed at the stakes level. The stallion's leading earner is multiple Grade I winner Medaglia d'Oro. On the track, the Darley stallion won the 2002 GI Travers S., 2003 GI Whitney H. and 2004 GI Donn H., and was runner-up in both the 2002 and 2003 GI Breeders' Cup Classics, as well as the 2004 G1 Dubai World Cup. Medaglia d'Oro's racing accomplishments helped El Prado earn leading sire honors in 2002, and saw the grey's stud fee increase to \$75,000 in 2003. Medaglia d'Oro quickly asserted himself as a leading sire in his own right with the likes of GI Preakness S. winner Rachel Alexandra in his first crop to race. El Prado is also the sire of 2004 Champion Turf Horse Kitten's Joy, a top Freshman sire; Puerto Rican Champion Mi Pradera; and Grade I winners Artie Schiller, Borrego, Asi Siempre and Spanish Moon. As a broodmare sire, he is represented by Grade I winners Bit of Whimsy (Distorted Humor) and Laragh (Tapit).

In the sales ring, El Prado was represented by his first seven-figure sales horse when This is That brought \$1 million as a juvenile at the 2003 BESMAR Sale. In 2007, Asi Siempre sold for \$3 million as a broodmare prospect at FTKNOV, and the following year, Flagship sold for \$1 million at the 2008 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Earlier this season, a juvenile colt by the stallion topped the OBS March Sale with a \$450,000 final bid.

Rising Star...

Group 1 winner El Prado was bred in Ireland by Lyonstown Stud and was campaigned by Robert Sangster and legendary trainer Vincent O'Brien. Out of 1977 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Lady Capulet, the gray is a half brother to 1987 Irish champion three-year-old **Entitled (Ire)** (Mill Reef). As a two-year-old, El Prado won four of six starts, including the G1 National S., G2 Beresford S. and G3 Railway S., and was named Ireland's champion juvenile of 1991. Off the board in three starts in 1992, El Prado was retired to Brereton Jones's Airdrie Stud in Midway, Kentucky in 1993, standing for the partnership of Sangster, O'Brien, Coolmore and Frank Stronach. Initially offered at a fee of \$7,500, he ranked eighth on the 1996 freshman sire list with progeny earnings of \$398,925. In 1998, after renovations on the farm were completed, the stallion moved to Stronach's Adena Springs.

G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile

SETA TAKEN OUT OF FILLIES' MILE, ONE DOZEN REMAIN Sarah Leigh's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star" ☆ Seta (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), a last-out third in the Sept. 11 G2 May Hill S. at Doncaster, was the most notable absentee after yesterday's forfeit stage reduced the field to a maximum of 12 for Saturday's G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile at Ascot. However, the May Hill form will still be represented after connections paid a £20,000 supplementary fee to add Doncaster runner-up **Hibaayeb (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) to the £200,000 contest. "I never ever like to go out thinking about the dangers--I just like going there thinking my horse is in good form and ready, which she is," her trainer, Clive Brittain, told *Racing Post*. Connections decided against supplementing May Hill S. winner **Pollenator (GB)** (Motivator {GB}). Ballydoyle's team currently numbers two, G3 Silver Flash S. winner **Cabaret (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and maiden scorer **You'll Be Mine** (Kingmambo), after the withdrawal of G2 Debutante S. winner and G1 Moyglare Stud S. third **Lillie Langtry (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). However, trainer Aidan O'Brien has indicated You'll Be Mine is likely to be his only runner. "You'll Be Mine is still a baby and the experience at Ascot will do her a lot of good," O'Brien told *Racing Post*.

☆ **"TDN Rising Star" ☆ Long Lashes** (Rock Hard Ten), who was fourth in the Aug. 30 G1 Moyglare Stud S. last time, is Godolphin's sole representative. "She didn't go on the heavy ground [in the Moyglare], even though at the time her form suggested she might, but it was really difficult ground for all of those two-year-olds," Racing Manager Simon Crisford told *Racing Post*. "Once she wasn't going to win, [jockey] Frankie [Dettori] was pretty easy with her. We want to see her on better ground before we make any firm judgements, and the plan is to run. She worked Sunday morning and she went nicely."

RIP VAN WINKLE HEADS QE2 ELEVEN Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), winner of the Goodwood's G1 Sussex S. July 29, heads a select cast of 11 following yesterday's forfeit stage for Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot. The Aidan O'Brien trainee was troubled by foot problems in the build-up to that first Group 1 success, and has been installed as favorite by British bookmakers for the £250,000 one-mile contest. O'Brien boasts a further four entries, including G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. hero **Mastercraftsman (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). Ballydoyle's opposition is headed by Godolphin's **Delegator (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), who is fresh off a success in the Aug. 29 G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood. Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum has two entries still engaged: G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Coronation S. victress **Ghanaati** (Giant's Causeway), and this month's G1 Prix du Moulin winner **Aqlaam (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}).

AFLEET ALEX COLT TOPS DAY 7

A colt by freshman sire Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet) realized a final bid of \$300,000 to top the seventh day of action at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. Offered by Taylor Made Sales Agency, the Apr. 24 foal was purchased by trainer Tim Ritchee, acting on behalf of Chuck Zacney's CJZ Stable. The duo is best known for campaigning Afleet Alex, winner of the GI Hopeful S. at two before collecting victories in the GI Preakness S. and GI Belmont S. en route to a championship season at three. Out of the eight-year-old unraced mare Catch the Moment (Unbridled), the Ontario-bred yearling, who is from the extended family of G1 Epsom Derby hero Secreto, was bred by Allison Register. A colt by Out of Place brought the day's second-highest price of \$240,000 from trainer Bruce Headley. Consigned by Threave Main Stud LLC, agent, the colt is a full brother to Tremont S. winner Out of Gwedd. Heading the ladies yesterday was a grey filly by Tapit, who brought \$185,000. Offered by agent Baccari Bloodstock LLC, the Apr. 4 foal, who is out of the stakes-winning Citidancer mare Citi Sounds, was purchased by trainer George Weaver, acting as agent. Keeneland sold 277 horses Monday for gross sales of \$11,091,800, down 41.20 percent from 2008 when 284 horses brought \$18,864,700. The average of \$40,043 decreased 39.72 percent from last year's \$66,425, while the median of \$27,000 was down 46 percent compared to \$50,000 in 2008. The September Sale continues through Monday, Sept. 28; sessions begin daily at 10 a.m. The entire sale is streamed live at www.Keeneland.com.

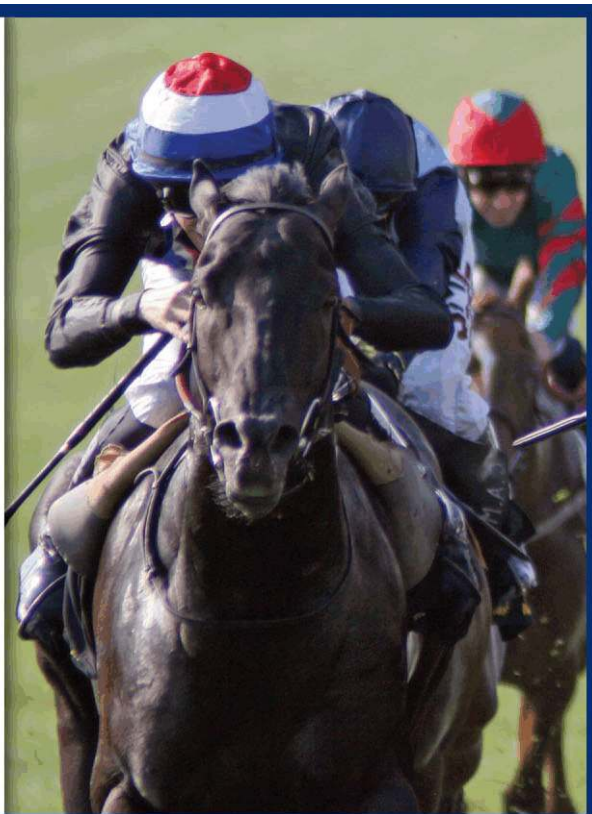

A daughter of Lion Heart sold for \$27,000 at KEESEP 2008, but Harroff opted to buy this filly back when she RNA'd at \$32,000 at Keeneland January. That decision bore fruit here. A partner at Cabarrus Animal Hospital in Kannapolis, North Carolina, northeast of Charlotte, Harroff graduated from Ohio State University in 1969.

Cristiano stamped himself as Peru's leading three-year-old male on dirt with an authoritative score in the 200 Guineas. After stalking the early pace under jockey Ivan Quispe, Cristiano powered to the front in midstretch to post a comfortable victory. Stablemate Precursor, previously unbeaten in five starts, got up for second under United States-based jockey Edgar Prado. Pacemaker Kabu (Buddha), a Northern Hemisphere two-year-old, finished fourth. With his victory in the Guineas, the Peruvian-bred Cristiano halted the Argentine-breds' three-year winning streak in the first leg of the Peruvian Quadruple Crown for colts. The top finishers are likely to renew their rivalry in the Oct. 18 G1 Clasico Ricardo Ortiz de Zevallos, the second jewel of the Crown. Cristiano is by the Carson City freshman sire Islam, a champion miler and Group 1 winner in Peru who is out of Group 1 winner Hail A Cab (Hail The Pirates). In between races, Hall of Fame inductee and Eclipse Award winning rider Prado was honored with the Sporting Laurels, Peru's highest sports award. "It's a great honor for me to receive this very special recognition, and it gives me great pride to be the recipient of this very prestigious award," said the 41-year-old jockey.

THIS WEEK IN HISTORY...

September 26, 1942...The Jockey Club stewards revoked jockey **Eddie Arcaro**'s license for one year after a display of "rough riding" aboard odds-on favorite Occupation in the Cowdin S. September 19. In the race, Arcaro deliberately drove his horse into another, Breezing Home, knocking jockey Vincent Nodarse into the infield. Nodarse and his mount had crowded Arcaro at the start, almost causing him to be unseated.

September 27, 1894...Aqueduct Racetrack opened its doors. The building was torn down in 1955 and the new Aqueduct was reopened September 14, 1959.

September 27, 1947...Armed, then the world's leading money-winning Thoroughbred, met 1946 Triple Crown winner **Assault** in the first \$100,000 winner-take-all match race, held at Belmont Park. Armed won easily over a less-than 100 percent Assault.

BC ANNOUNCES CHANGES TO CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Breeders' Cup yesterday announced the tentative race card order and Pick 6 wagering for this year's Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships, which will be conducted during the Oak Tree meeting at Santa Anita Nov. 6-7. This year, the Breeders' Cup Marathon, which was contested on Saturday's program in 2008, will be run as the first Breeders' Cup race on Friday's card. "We believe that the schedule of six Championships races on Friday and eight on Saturday will provide better balance to the program and greater betting opportunities for the fans," said Kenneth Kirchner, president of FaKirk International and wagering consultant to the Breeders' Cup. Breeders' Cup also announced that the Pick 6 wager will also be offered on both days of this year's World Championships. "Fans should find the Pick 6 sequence on Friday and Saturday to be great bets and based on last year's \$1-million Friday Pick 6 handle, we could enjoy a substantial carryover into Saturday," said Kirchner. Following the Breeders' Cup Marathon, Friday's program will consist of the five consecutive Breeders' Cup races for females, culminating with the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic. The Marathon will kick off the Breeders' Cup Pick 6 and if it is not hit Friday, the pool will be carried over into the Saturday Breeders' Cup Ultra Pick 6. Friday's nine race program will also include the GII Las Palmas H. Saturday's card will feature eight Breeders' Cup races, culminating with the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, and will also offer the GII Oak Tree Derby and Damascus S. Post times and race order are tentative; the official race order will be announced Tuesday, Oct. 27.

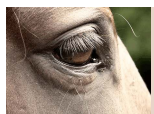

It must be reassuring to mere mortals that even the superpowers of Thoroughbred breeding have to work hard to maintain interest in a young stallion in today's fast-moving industry.

Take Street Cry as an example. Darley was particularly eager to encourage high-class support for this 2002 Dubai World Cup winner, and a powerful marketing campaign helped earn the son of Machiavellian a 2003 book of 131 mares. Twenty-two of the mares that conceived to him in his first season were reportedly either Grade I winners or producers.

Street Cry proved nearly as popular in his second season in 2004, with another strong team of Grade I winners/producers among his 129 mares, but the almost inevitable slackening of demand was just around the corner. The Jockey Club credits him with 113 mares in 2005, followed by 92 in 2006, so it would be only fair to predict that Street Cry's second, third and fourth crops would each achieve a little less than its predecessor.

Of course, Street Cry's second crop was almost doomed to pale alongside his sensational first crop, which featured Grade I winners of the magnitude of Street Sense and Zenyatta. Altogether this crop of 85 named foals has produced nine graded/group winners, including four Grade I scorers, and this is heading for 11 percent.

While Street Cry's second crop may never match his vintage 2004 collection, the 2005 crop is still doing very well for a stallion whose fee was no higher than \$30,000. When Princess Haya took full advantage of the 11 pounds she was receiving from Forever Together in the GII Canadian S. two days ago, she became the fourth North American graded stakes winner from this second crop, which also includes Tomcito, winner of the G1 Derby Nacional in Peru before finishing third in Big Brown's Florida Derby.

He's in the Diadem [S.-Gr.2], but if connections want to stick to the minimum distance perhaps the Prix de l'Abbaye [Gr.1] will be considered. A fast surface is considered essential."

The other graded winners are Godolphin's fine filly Seventh Street, who confirmed her status as one of the best dirt distaffers with her Grade I victories in the Apple Blossom and Go For Wand H.; Cry and Catch Me, who took the GI Oak Leaf S. at two; and Globetrotter, a Canadian Grade III winner who failed by only a half a length to become a Grade I winner in the Charles Whittingham Memorial S. in June. Another distinguished member of this 85-strong crop is the ex-Irish Allicansayis Wow, runner-up against the males in the GII Del Mar Mile H.

It is worth adding that the dams of these six leading second-crop performers are by such as Doc's Leader, Slew City Slew, Half A Year, Eastern Echo and Meadowlake. Princess Haya is only the third graded winner produced by a daughter of Slew City Slew, following the Grade I winner Pool Land and the 2009 Grade III winner Saratoga Sinner.

With only around 70 named foals in his third crop, Street Cry had less ammunition at his disposal, but that hasn't stopped him making his mark with Street Hero and Desert Party. Unfortunately, neither of these high-class 2008 juveniles has been around in recent months. Street Hero went into premature retirement after defeating Midshipman in the GI Norfolk S. and then finishing third to him in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, while Desert Party hasn't raced since the Kentucky Derby. However, Desert Party had confirmed his talent with three fine efforts in Dubai against the recent Super Derby winner Regal Ransom, including a victory over him in the G3 UAE 2000 Guineas.

It is still early days for Street Cry's fourth crop, which is his smallest, but his fifth has been coming under close scrutiny at the yearling sales over the last couple of months.

With the Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Street Sense and the Group 3 English winner Big Timer among his first runners in 2006, Street Cry's fee climbed to \$50,000 in 2007, and demand was further stimulated by the appearance of more graded/group winners in the spring of 2007. The end result was a book of 154 mares and 127 live foals.

Needless to say, demand has been keen (by current standards) at Saratoga and Keeneland. Street Cry youngsters achieved such satisfactory prices as \$800,000, \$550,000, \$500,000, \$400,000, \$370,000 and \$300,000, with Sheikh Mohammed's representatives taking most of the high-priced lots. No doubt the Sheikh will be even keener to secure members of Street Cry's current foal crop. This numbers more than 150 live foals, and they were sired at a fee of \$100,000 from the outstanding collection of mares that headed Street Cry's way following his tally of nine graded winners in 2007.

The clear message seems to be that, with considerably bigger crops in the pipeline from supposedly better mares, Street Cry should soon be building on the extremely solid foundation he has laid down with his \$30,000 crops.

Incidentally, it isn't only in the Northern Hemisphere that Street Cry has been making his mark. Two of his four-year-old sons, Whobegotyou and Predatory Pricer, were involved in a three-way photo finish to the G1 Underwood S. three days ago, when both lost out to Heart of Dreams. Street Cry is currently back in Australia, having previously stood there for the four seasons between 2003 and 2006. He stood three of those seasons at the modest fee of A\$16,500, but his services now command a fee of A\$110,000.

For almost two decades, Kentuckians have been debating the merits of expanded gaming. As our signature racing and breeding industries have become increasingly threatened by our neighboring states, who use revenue from gaming to substantially increase race purses and breeders' incentive funds, Kentucky residents have responded with a near unanimous belief that we must do everything possible to protect Kentucky's horse industry, and the 100,000 jobs that go with it.

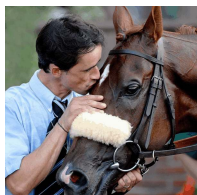
A recent statewide poll indicated that nearly 70 percent of Kentuckians support putting video lottery terminals (VLTs) at Kentucky racetracks.

That such a large majority of Kentucky residents would agree on what had been a controversial issue is striking, and speaks to our collective belief that Kentucky's racing and breeding industries should be put on a level competitive playing field.

Sadly, those who oppose VLTs at racetracks, and who have clearly lost in the court of public opinion, have decided to engage in cynical rhetoric meant to divide our state instead of uniting it.

Senate President David Williams has made it clear that he intends to make protecting our signature industry a partisan issue. After making a promise to every Kentuckian that the issue would receive a fair hearing in the Senate, Sen. Williams sent it to a committee where the chairman declared it dead before even hearing testimony. Imagine going on trial and the judge declares you guilty before your lawyer even makes an opening statement. Would you consider that a fair hearing?

Now, in an effort to inject partisan politics into the discussion, Sen. Williams has attacked Gov. Beshear and other Democrats for “poisoning the well” in Frankfort. Sen. Williams also seems to suggest that Republicans should oppose VLTs at racetracks as a tenet of our political philosophy. As a life-long Republican, and a member of a Kentucky family who has worked on behalf of the Republican Party and Republican administrations, I can say without reservation that protecting our signature industry is not a partisan issue. In fact, the Republican Party should be standing up for Kentucky businesses, Kentucky jobs and a free market environment that would allow Kentuckians to fairly compete with their out of state competitors. Due to Sen. Williams’ utter mismanagement, this issue now pits Republicans against Republicans, not Republicans against Democrats, as he would have us believe.

Sen. Williams and several members of his caucus are currently advocating that the government should stand in the way of our signature industry, and prevent it from being able to compete. Government interference with Kentucky businesses and job creation does not sound like a Republican philosophy I am familiar with.

But, regardless, saving 100,000 jobs and the industry that identifies our state all over the world does not rest in the domain of any political party. It should be the stated goal of all Kentuckians--regardless of political registration.

The other strategy currently being employed is similarly distressing. Opponents have decided that the best way to defeat VLTs at racetracks is to pit horse owners and breeders against racetracks. By suggesting that racetracks are greedy corporations that don’t care about our horse industry, our opponents lay bare their belief that our industry must be divided in order to be defeated. In ramping up his rhetoric, Sen. Williams has made it clear that he intends to demonize Kentucky racetracks at every turn.

The horse industry is united as it has never been in the past. Opponents of VLTs have always relied on our discord to defeat the efforts to compete on a level playing field. Now that the industry has formed a united front, opponents seek to break us apart again. They will be unsuccessful in their efforts to do so. Kentucky breeders recognize that we must have a healthy horse economy in this state in order to run successful breeding operations. A healthy horse economy includes buyers willing to invest in our product and take their investment to the racetracks in the hopes of recouping their investment. Owners recognize that they need healthy racetracks offering good purses, so that they can attempt to win back some of their initial investment. Racetrack operators understand that they need breeders to produce and owners to race their horses at their tracks.

Keeneland Bars Hoosier Park Horses:

Keeneland, upon the advice of the Kentucky state veterinarian's office, has prohibited horses stabled at Hoosier Park from accessing the barn areas at Keeneland or the Thoroughbred Center until further notice due to confirmed cases of equine strangles at the Indiana racetrack. Horses based at either facility in Lexington may be shipped to Hoosier Park, but will not be allowed to return. Hoosier Park placed 59 horses under quarantine Sept. 12 and, four days later, two horses at the track were confirmed with *Streptococcus equi*, a contagious bacterial disease. The remaining 57 horses will remain quarantined until appropriate testing and timelines approved by the Indiana State Board of Animal Health have been completed.

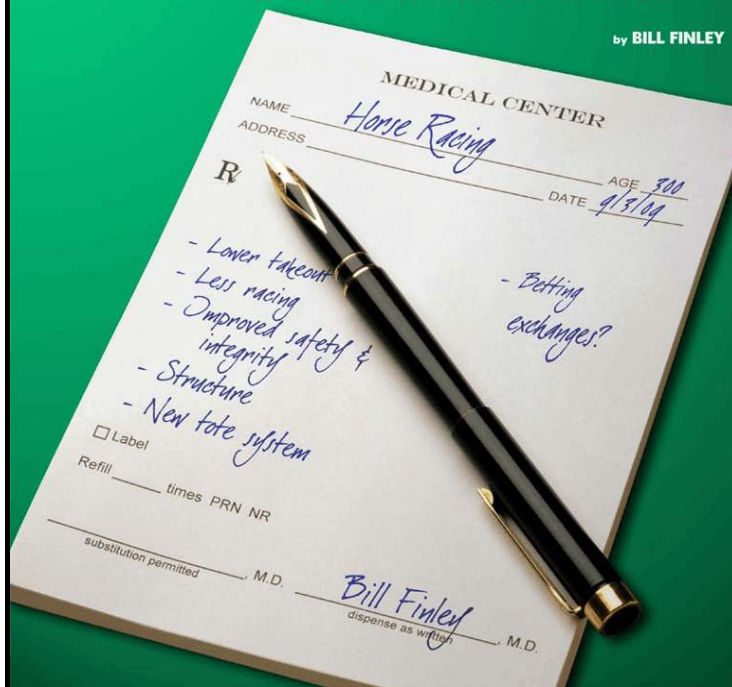

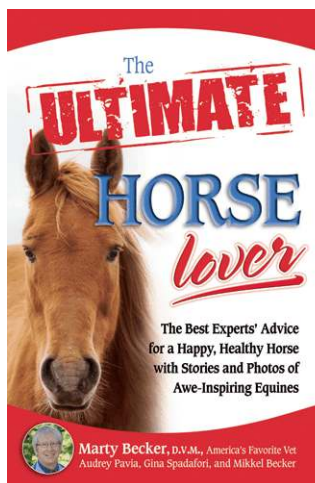
