★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Jukebox Jury (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) came through with a career score in yesterday's G1 Preis von Europa at Cologne and could make his next start in North America. The sophomore, who last year bagged the G2 Royal Lodge S. and was second in the G1 Racing Post Trophy, more recently garnered the Aug. 8 G3 Rose of Lancaster S. at Haydock, ran fourth in the Aug. 18 G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York, and won the G2 Grand Prix de Deauville last time Aug. 30. Jukebox Jury led through the early strides of this, but allowed **Enroller (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) the lead and raced in second going past the judge the first time. Quickening to the front with 450 meters to go, he dug deep under a drive in the closing stages to fend off the challenge of **Eastern Anthem (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}). "He ran a brilliant race and fought so well," said trainer's wife Deirdre Johnston. "His main target is the [Oct. 17 GI] Canadian International [at Woodbine], but the break from Deauville [to that race] would have been too long, so this race marked an excellent opportunity." Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) began his path to immortality in The Curragh's G2 Beresford S. 12 months ago, and yesterday, Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), making just his second career start, showed that he too might have what it takes to make some noise in the sophomore division next year after capturing the one-mile race in impressive fashion. Impressive when a four-length winner on debut over course and distance Aug. 16, St Nicholas Abbey traveled easily in sixth under a confident Johnny Murtagh before being asked to take closer order at the top of the stretch. With just a shake of the reins, he loomed alongside Layali Al Andalus approaching the furlong marker. Although the whip was drawn, it was not required as Ballydoyle's latest bright prospect glided to a smooth success. Inevitably, Derbies were on the lips of most assembled at The Curragh, and Aidan O'Brien was not dampening the general enthusiasm when saying, "Johnny [Murtagh] said he has loads of speed and found some gears, which is a good sign, but you would hope he would get the Derby trip. He's a real classy horse."

O'Brien added, "We were worried about the heavy ground for his first run, as he is a lovely moving horse who is very athletic, but he had come forward from that run and the ground was beautiful today. Johnny was very impressed with him and he won very snug. We'll see how he is, but the G1 Racing Post Trophy [at Doncaster Oct. 24] will hopefully be his next race. He is very exciting and looks a typical Classic horse to look forward to." Sayif held his own among the elite of the juveniles last term, with a string of high-class efforts to his name by the end of the year. Runner-up in the G2 July S. at Newmarket, the bay ran third in the G2 Vintage S. at Goodwood the following month and Newbury's G2 Mill Reef S. in September before finding only Bushranger (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}) too strong in the G1 Middle Park S. back at Newmarket in October. After a poor show in the Listed Doncaster S. at the end of that month, he was put away for the winter and returned with a workmanlike conditions score to break his maiden at Leicester Apr. 2. Fourth in the Listed Sandy Lane S. at Haydock May 30, he was a respectable fifth in the Aug. 9 G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville before putting in another fine effort when fourth in the Sept. 5 G1 Haydock Sprint Cup. Keen while anchored behind the leading duo in the center of the track, he was committed by Richard Hills and grabbed the lead passing the quarter pole before surging clear of Tamagin, who had raced alone on the far side. Owners Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar's Racing Manager Tony Nerses told *PA Sport*, "That is well deserved. We have always had faith in him and he has paid us back today. We will put him away now and bring him back next year for the big sprints." On a big day for the Mark Johnston stable, with Jukebox Jury (Ire) prevailing in the G1 Preis von Europa and Layali Al Andalus (GB) and Bikini Babe (Ire) running second, respectively, in the G2 Beresford and G3 CL Weld Park S. on this card, Shakespearean capped the celebrations with a dour display to bag the Million. Fifth in the Listed Chesham S. at Royal Ascot June 20 and third in the July 10 G2 Superlative S. at Newmarket, the bay bested the subsequent G3 Prix la Rochette scorer Buzzword (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) in the G3 Solario S. at Sandown last time Aug. 22. Soon in control at the head of affairs here, he was given a breather by Joe Fanning at halfway, but started to turn the screw inside the final quarter. With a blanket of four making him work for the cash bonanza in the final yards, he had enough in the tank to hold the determined Marfach and the strong closer Nurture. "I thought he was the one to beat, but Joe [Fanning] said he had to get at him all the way," Johnston said. Aside from the multiple high-profile successes he has enjoyed with his two-year-olds this season, Richard Hannon's record in these Sales races is the stuff of legends by now. Twelve months ago, the master of Everleigh recorded an unforgettable double of the Goffs Million and Fillies' Million and, despite, a change of format this year, he was in control again with a one-two here. Fifth behind **Arcano (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) and **Showcasing (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) on debut over this trip at Newbury June 11, **Lucky General** was off the mark by six lengths at Windsor 16 days later before filling fourth spot in the G2 Superlative S. over an extra panel at Newmarket July 10. Last to finish in the July 29 G2 Vintage S. at Goodwood, he was back to winning ways in a six-furlong conditions event at Windsor Aug. 9 before another fourth in the Listed Washington Singer S. at Newbury Aug. 15 and third on his last start in the Sept. 10 Weatherbys Insurance £300,000 2YO S. at Doncaster.

Always traveling with ease stalking the pace against the stand's rail, **Lucky General** only needed the gaps to appear to collect under a motionless Richard Hughes approaching the quarter pole. When a half-chance came, he was steered through to head his enterprisingly ridden stable companion **Full Mandate** with 150 yards remaining before asserting for a comfortable win. "He's always been a lovely horse and credit must go to Peter Doyle Bloodstock, who bought him," Hannon commented. "That will be it for the year."  Formerly with the now-suspended **Karl Burke**, **Lady Springbank** opened her account over six furlongs at Doncaster June 14 before finishing a well-beaten third in a novice event at Haydock July 2. Only sixth three weeks later on her last start for that yard in the Listed Star S. at Sandown, the grey who now resides with rookie trainer Paul Deegan was settled in rear early by Willie Supple before being brought with a strong challenge out wide. Passing **Bikini Babe** approaching the furlong pole, the homebred was always holding that rival with something to spare in the run to the line. Mawatheeque was restrained in rear until making smooth headway into contention at the top of the straight here. Gathered together at the quarter-mile marker, he quickened impressively to lead approaching the final eighth and was ridden clear in the closing stages to post a career high. "He had a difficult early part of his life because he had an injury and he had to get over that," explained trainer Marcus Tregoning. "He came into training with me when he was three, so he's missed quite a lot. He's still a bit green, but he's coming on and is learning. He's ready for a crack at the big time and, if he comes out of this really well--and there's no reason why he shouldn't--then the [G1] Champion S. [at Newmarket Oct. 17] is a possibility. I wouldn't worry about dropping him back two furlongs, and I'm sure [owner] Sheikh Hamdan, [racing manager] Angus Gold, [jockey] Richard Hills and myself will have quite a bit of discussion about this." 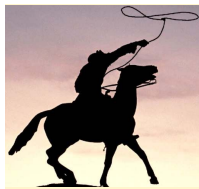

WAITING GAME WITH HIBAAYEB Connections of Saturday's G1 Fillies' Mile winner **Hibaayeb (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) are not rushing into a decision on the Breeders' Cup. Despite gaining an automatic place in the line-up for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' Turf after her defeat of Lady Darshaan (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in Ascot's mile contest, Mohammed Al Nabouda's filly has yet to be committed to Santa Anita. "She's fine this morning and had eaten up by 10:30 p.m. last night, so it's great," trainer Clive Brittain told *PA Sport*. "She is a very relaxed filly and it was very nice to see her go and do it on Saturday. She has an automatic Breeders' Cup place, but before we make any firm decisions we'll just have to see how she takes the race and nothing will be definite within the next 48 hours really. If she bounces out of the race well and everything is fine it will be up to the owners, but there wouldn't be any reason why she shouldn't go."

ONWARDS AND UPWARDS FOR RIP Aidan O'Brien yesterday issued an upbeat bulletin on Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. hero **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who will head to Santa Anita for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Having bested Zacinto (GB) (Dansili {GB}) by 1 1/4 lengths in Ascot's showpiece, Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's injury-prone colt emerged with no problems. "Rip Van Winkle was fine this morning and it's the best he has been after any of his races this year," O'Brien told the *Racing Post*. "We will see how he is over the next few weeks and look at running him in the Breeders' Cup Classic."

TELLING WORKS FOR JOE HIRSCH Alex and JoAnn Lieblong's **Telling** (A.P. Indy), who sprang the big 33-1 upset in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. at Saratoga Aug. 15, worked a half-mile at Arlington yesterday as he prepares for yet another New York raid. The five-year-old breezed the distance in an easy :50 flat over the main track as he readies for Saturday's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic at Belmont. Telling will face a much tougher task in the Joe Hirsch, given the expected presence of **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat), who goes for his fifth straight Grade I victory after taking the GI Arlington Million in his latest. "I was hoping [Gio Ponti] would go in another direction," admitted Telling's trainer, Steve Hobby. "[Although] I also heard he may not start Saturday if the turf is real soft."

OWNER MARTIN SCHWARTZ

I was very interested to read your discussion with Wayne Lyster on trying to raise race purses ([click here to read](#)). You quoted him, "Instead of worrying about a lot of minor issues...we should focus on three issues, and they go in this order: 1) raising purses, 2) raising purses, 3) raising purses."

That sounds all well and good, except the reality that over the past two years, all I have seen is declining purses and declining handle. Combine this with lower sales prices at auction, and you have a very sick industry.

You have the most important jurisdiction of New York unable to successfully open legalized VLTs. You have the horse capital of the world in Kentucky that could not pass the legislation necessary to bring additional revenues to this critical industry.

Everyone who knows me knows I love horse racing. But the economic model in the U.S. is broken. To me, controlling costs is the critical issue to staying viable in a declining industry.

A few years ago, I needed to gross \$70,000 a year per horse to break even. That now exceeds \$100,000 per horse. The only way I can support my racing operation is to have at least one big-earning horse, like Bowman's Band, Angara (GB), Maids Causeway (Ire), Gorella (Fr), Asi Siempre, Lady of Venice (Fr), and now Elusive Wave (Ire) and Stacelita (Fr). Without those stars, I would hemorrhage money.

I do know that a model of declining revenues and rapidly increasing costs is a very bad business model for success. My horses in the U.S. have had a hard time staying on the track. All of this despite vet bills which sometimes exceed \$2,200 per month for several horses. Transporting my horses has also increased significantly.

The horse owner is continually getting squeezed by all of these vendors. There is little shared pain when these items are marked up several fold. It is a flawed system when the trainer wants all of the same medications that the other trainers are using, with little regard for costs. It is a system much like health care in this country, where the owner is removed from the purchasing and pricing decisions, and is just sent the bills. I once had a trainer say to me, "Well, we don't make any money if the horse stays in the barn."

You may think this is a lot of complaining, but I have the perspective of having three-quarters of my stable in Europe, where the vet bills are negligible and the purses better. My horses also sustain far fewer injuries.

I don't have the answers, but I am hoping for someone in this industry to address these issues. The model in the U.S. is broken--declining revenues and increasing costs are killing the sport we love. I am trying to yell fire in the theater, and I am hoping someone can help put out this fire. Otherwise, I, like others, will be forced to leave the theater, or, more succinctly, get on a plane and fly to Europe to watch my horses run.

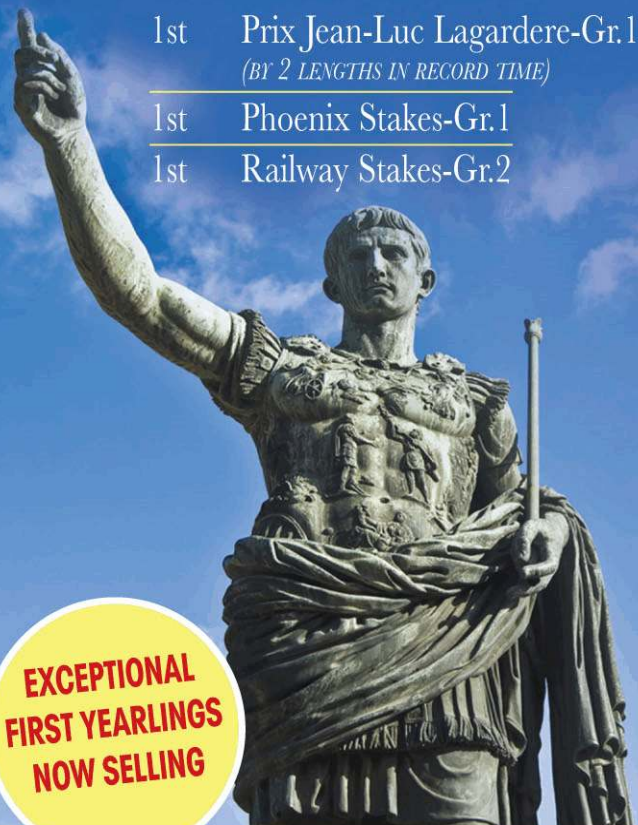

Just back from the Keeneland Yearling Sales, I find my mind a bit dizzy, full of the pictures of all the gorgeous yearlings who promise speed, thrills, money and trophies. Now, however, I'm back to my personal reality. What a contrast!

I walk around our farm, stopping by our horse paddocks to pour feed in the buckets, look for problems and to bring in some who need doctoring. What a contrast, I say to myself again. Here I am dealing with what, maybe three or more years ago, I had seen as bright stars of the future. Yearlings themselves who ran, but just didn't have the quality to go to stud or to the breeding shed. Some are overcoming the rigors from their time at the track, while others are in transition.

I am lucky to have the land to bring some of them back to live on. I am also lucky to have a daughter and an employee who are adept at starting them off on new careers as show horses. We have had some success with choosing the horse-show route with some, including Barbaro's half-brother [Man in Havana, by Quiet American].

My cell phone rings a lot that first day back from the sale. Not all the calls are about horses, but there are three horses to deal with. One is en route from Nebraska after a stint at the county fair tracks, while two more, who are not cut out to be racehorses, are heading my way, as well. I am stuck in the predicament of too many horses. It isn't easy, but to walk away is not an option for me. We will always find or make room, and move them along to a good future.

Unfortunately, there are many in this industry who won't or can't dance this dance. They either lack the land, knowledge, money or heart. Whatever the reason, a lot of horses have nowhere to go. I can only suggest that our industry keeps exploring ways to address this unacceptable situation. All of us can throw a \$1,000 in the hat for every horse we own, or some other personal measure of choice, but let's get it together and support our used-to-be-yearlings.

Slaughter is out the door with me and with most of my horse-loving friends and associates, having educated ourselves on the incredibly tortuous route horses take there. We can do it, we can do better. I am willing and ready to help.

I CANNOT TELL A LIE: LONE GEORGE WASHINGTON SELLS AT TATTS OCTOBER 1

When George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) exited the Park Paddocks sale ring on an autumn afternoon in 2004, he did so as the 1.15 million guineas auction topper at the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. A standout specimen by the champion sire Danehill out of the Alysheba mare Bordighera, George Washington was a head-turner with a pedigree to match his physique. On Wednesday, Oct. 7, at the same Newmarket venue, a bay filly out of the Rainbow Quest mare Flawlessly (Fr) is scheduled to circuit the famous ring. Whether the

gazes from those assembled are inspired by admiration or curiosity, there is little doubt that the appearance of George Washington's only progeny, selling as [lot 405](#), will ensure that heads turn once more.

The filly, bred by Italian horsemen Loreto and Stefano Luciani, was foaled at the Irish National Stud Feb. 4, 2008, and it soon became apparent that Flawlessly's foal was to be the European champion miler's only offspring.

George Washington was a brilliant athlete, expertly conditioned by Ireland's champion trainer Aidan O'Brien. The outstanding European two-year-old of 2005, he enhanced his reputation with an electrifying English Classic victory in the G1 2000 Guineas the following year, and secured champion miler status when unleashing his trademark acceleration to win the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot in the autumn of his three-year-old season.

A sixth-place finish in the 2006 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs was supposed to be the final act in a racing career that had yielded six wins from 10 starts. George Washington headed off to Coolmore as a stallion of enormous potential. At that juncture, the hopes of John Magnier and his Coolmore partners, who had secured the colt at Tattersalls two years earlier, were verging on fulfilment. But George Washington, an enigmatic character with a notoriously complicated personality, proved to be a thoroughly exasperating stallion. Of the 50 mares he covered, the overwhelming majority failed to conceive. Magnier and Coolmore decided upon radical action. *Cont. p2*

In March 2007, the operation took the unprecedented step of retiring the O'Brien-trained Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) (Danehill). One of the previous season's leading juveniles, the colt was, like George Washington, a Group 1-winning son of Danehill with real Classic-winning potential. Holy Roman Emperor was taken from Ballydoyle to fill the void left by the sub-fertile George Washington, who departed the breeding shed and resumed his role as a racehorse.

The summer of 2007 saw George Washington race three times in Europe. Although fractious on occasion and unable to add to his list of victories, he showed enough to suggest that a large portion of the brilliance remained locked within his handsome frame. Confidence was high among the Ballydoyle camp that "Gorgeous George" could secure a famous triumph in the 2007 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Monmouth Park, and there was even speculation that the stallion might be given a second chance at stud. Sadly, all hopes were dashed when George Washington fractured a leg and was euthanized.

But there is yet the Flawless filly, whose rarity value, combined with a fine pedigree, could bring a handsome reward for consignor Gerry Burke of Glidawn Stud in County Waterford. A shrewd pinhooker of well-bred fillies, Burke went to a sale-topping €280,000 to secure the youngster at last year's Goffs November Foal Sale when offered by the Lucianis from the Irish National Stud. She will be reoffered by Glidawn Stud, but--when contacted by *TDN* this week--Burke did not want to tempt fate by saying too much about this unique filly.

"I'll leave it to the people to decide for themselves," said Burke. "I think it's better to talk about her afterwards rather than beforehand, because there is not a lot I can really say until then."

The filly's pedigree already looked solid last year; she is a half-sister to GI Garden City Breeders' Cup H. runner-up Flawly (GB) (Old Vic {GB}), dam of 2006 G1 Prix du Jockey Club second Best Name (GB) (King's Best). The family had another boost this season, as another half-sister, G3 Prix Penelope winner Ombre Legere (Ire) (Double Bed {Fr}), is now the dam of Germinal (Jpn) (Agnes Tachyon {Jpn}), one of this season's top three-year-old fillies in Japan.

If you don't get George Washington's only yearling, you could try for his three-parts brother instead. Catalogued as [lot 272](#), the May-born Danehill Dancer (Ire) colt is being offered for breeders Lael Stables from Bobby and Honora Donworth's Round Hill Stud based in County Limerick.

CLOSE TIES

For many leading consignors, the first week of October is do-or-die time as Tattersalls open their doors for their 2009 Yearling Sales. For Egon Weinfeld's Meon Valley Stud, the "Book One," as it is now known, is the prime focus. For decades, the outcome of Newmarket's premier auction has influenced the fortunes of the Hampshire-based establishment, which was founded in 1977 and built on a slice of fortune.

At loose ends after his son Mark and daughter Helena gave up riding, Egon was spurred into buying a racehorse. He actually purchased three, with the guidance of bloodstock agent Richard Galpin, at this very venue. They were Odeon (GB) (Royal and Regal) and One In a Million (Ire) (Rarity {GB}), who cost 18,500 guineas and

38,000 guineas, respectively, at Houghton; and Repricolor (GB) (Jimmy Reppin {GB}), snapped up at the December Sales for 25,000 guineas. Their names are now etched into the tapestry of the turf. **Cont. p3**

Odeon captured the Galtres S. and was placed in the G3 Ascot's Fillies' Mile--which the operation now sponsors--as well as five additional group races. She was later the second dam of the 1996 G1 Epsom Oaks winner Lady Carla (GB) (Caerleon). Champion One In a Million was successful in the 1979 G1 1000 Guineas and G2 Coronation S., and produced Milligram (GB), who famously lowered the colors of Miesque in the 1987 G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. Her dynasty also includes 1998 G1 Juddmonte International winner One So Wonderful (GB) (Nashwan) and 1998 G2 Sun Charriot heroine Kissogram (GB) (Caerleon). Reprocolor took the Pretty Polly S., G3 Lingfield Oaks Trial and G3 Lancashire Oaks, and was fourth in the Epsom Oaks and third in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks, before establishing a place in legend at stud. That came courtesy of her daughter Colorspin (Fr) (High Top {Ire}), herself dam of Opera House (GB) (Sadler's Wells), Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Zee Zee Top (GB) (Zafonic). She also produced Classic-placed Bella Colora (GB) (Bellypha {Ire}), who was later the dam of Stagecraft (GB) (Sadler's Wells). No wonder that this sales ground, where the fairytale was born, has an almost mythical hold on the Weinfeld dynasty.

For years, Houghton, now Book One, has continued to provide fuel to Meon Valley's fire. Murillo (GB) (Green Desert--Colorvista {GB}, by Shirley Heights {GB}) fetched 1.3 million guineas in 2001; the subsequent Group 1-placed Mona Lisa (GB) (Giant's Causeway--Colorsnap {GB}, by Shirley Heights {GB}) sold for 1.25 million guineas two years later; and Ballydoyle's current incumbent Yankee Doodle (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}--Bella Lam-

bada {GB}, by Lammtarra) made the magic six-figure mark when selling for a million in 2007. Mark Weinfeld, son of the Stud's founder, summed up the relationship succinctly, saying, "This is where it all started and, for our product, it is the best sale. It is our showcase."

This time, the usual collection of desirables includes [lot 156](#), a Tiger Hill (Ire) half-brother to last year's G3 Lingfield Derby Trial winner Alessandro Volta (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and recent maiden winner Dylanesque (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}); [lot 257](#), a daughter of leading first-season sire Dubawi (Ire) who is a half to Ballydoyle's group-placed Yankee Doodle (GB); [lot 315](#), a son of Montjeu (Ire) who is the last representative of the now-retired Colorspin (Fr) (High Top {GB}); [lot 344](#), a son of Red Ransom whose dam is the 2005 G1 Yorkshire Oaks runner-up Dash To the Top (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}); [lot 496](#), another colt by Red Ransom out of Kissogram; and [lot 636](#), a son of Pivotal (GB) and the aforementioned One So Wonderful.

Mark Weinfeld is hoping that, once again, the natural advantage of pedigree outweighs the current tricky financial environment. "It is difficult to say how this year's consignment compares with past years; it is up there with some of the best and hopefully, it will go okay," he said. "The Tiger Hill is a particularly nice horse, as is the High Chaparral [Ire] [\[lot 188\]](#), a daughter of You Too [GB] [Monsoon {Ger}] from the family of One So Wonderful. We are very lucky to have two Dubawis in the sale and [\[lot 257\]](#) is a particularly nice-looking filly. The colt [\[lot 249\]](#), out of Ballet Ballon [Rahy] from the family of Stagecraft] is nice as well. We have a very smart Pivotal out of One So Wonderful who would be one of the stars, while the Red Ransom out of Dash to the Top is very classy, too. Her son Dynasty (GB) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) looks pretty useful. They think quite a lot of him at Ballydoyle. The good-looking Montjeu is the last foal out of Colorspin. I think you've got to be prepared that it is going to be very difficult and tough, but the very best horses will still find a market."

The Stud's web homepage reads "Cradle of the Classic Thoroughbred," and that will be at the forefront of the minds of those seeking to add the latest batch of Meon-bred youngsters to their rosters over the three days of this sale. --Tom Frary

Breeder Roberto Brogi, a successful trainer, offered the colt on that occasion, and the Italian is also responsible for the yearling. She is out of the listed-placed Stravinsky mare Looking Back (Ire), who herself cost just 17,000gns as a yearling at Tattersalls in 2002.

Railton, who has enjoyed success in the past selling on behalf of Italian clients, believes that Tattersalls is the logical choice of venue at which to offer the filly.

"It is fair to say that the center of bloodstock in America is Keeneland, and the center of bloodstock in Europe is Tattersalls," he offered. "If you're a European breeder and you have a well-bred horse, you want to sell it at Tattersalls to maximise effect. Rip Van Winkle was already a Group 1 performer, but it didn't do any harm that he won at Ascot on Saturday. The filly is going to have appeal for racing and breeding people. She has options for buyers and, of course, her paddock value is a great advantage."

"It is very much a sale for everyone," he remarked. "We must move away from the days when it was considered a select sale. Tattersalls have introduced these new races that are attached to Book 1, and it is very important that people understand that there will be horses at every price range in this sale. There are almost 700 lots, and they cannot all be select. These new races are worth a lot of money, and only these horses qualify for them."

Railton continued, "This is something that we have struggled with in the past, to get your working man to turn up at Book 1, but this year it is important he does because there is going to be some tremendous value there for him."

In the wake of mixed results from sales rings around the world, Railton is hoping that Book 1 will bring stability.

"I think we have all got a fair idea what we are in for. In terms of the market, I think the October Sale is a true barometer," he said. His sire continues to do well, and has got good horses on both sides of the Atlantic."

The Coolmore-based Aussie Rules, who added the G1 Shadwell Turf Mile to his success in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, has a nice colt in the aforementioned lot 224, out of Annalina (Cozzene).

"I have only been to Deauville, so I haven't seen what the other sales have had to offer, but this is as strong a colt as I have seen by his sire. Mineralogist showed plenty of zip early to score going 5 1/2 furlongs against state-bred competition over this track July 22 and was only 3/4 of a length back in second last time out in the six-panel Lucy Scribner S. against Empire bred Aug. 24. Well backed this time, the bay settled off the early pace, closed three wide on the turn, moved up to take command at the quarter pole, and despite drifting out late, was well in command at the wire. "I don't know if this is her preferred surface," said winning trainer John Kimmel. "[Jockey] Kent [Desormeaux] said [Mineralogist] was slipping a bit in the first part of the race.
