TATTS OCTOBER KICKS OFF

Vendors in Newmarket yesterday were heartened by the presence of both Sheikh Mohammed and his brother Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum ahead of Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale, which gets underway

this morning at 10:30 a.m. John Magnier and the Coolmore team were also in evidence, along with buyers from Japan, Hong Kong, Australia, New Zealand, Turkey and the U.S. Also on the sales grounds were representatives of the likes of Sir Robert Ogden, Thomas Barr and



Dubai-based Dr. Jim Hay, who have been among the biggest non-Maktoum or Coolmore spenders at the British and Irish sales over the last couple of years. This year's 676-lot Book 1 catalogue--running from today through Thursday--has 65 more yearlings listed than 12 months ago, and has the added attraction of a series of eight attached sales races worth £1.75 million, something which sales company officials hope will bolster buyers' enthusiasm.

"One thing everyone agrees on is that this is the strongest Book 1 since we went to this format in 2004," said Tattersalls Marketing Director Jimmy George. "We've got own or half-brothers to 65 Group 1 or Classic winners, which is something that hasn't gone unnoticed by the world's leading buyers. One can also draw a certain amount of cautious optimism from some of the sales that have gone before us." **Cont. p2**

Classic Nov. 7. Trainer John Oxx revealed yesterday that a tilt at the Classic was initially seen only as a fallback if weather had forced him to sidestep Longchamp. "We haven't had any discussion about America yet and we're not ruling it out, but I think it was primarily

in the owner's mind if he had missed the Arc for some reason," Oxx commented. "He would then have had a nice interval between the G1 Irish Champion S. and the Breeders' Cup, so whether we would now go for a seventh race for the seventh month running I don't know. It's a bit late in the year, I must say, so we are not going to rush into a decision." Sea the Stars was back in his box at home yesterday morning and he was reported in fine order. "He's fine this morning and ate all his feed," Oxx added. "Obviously, he's a bit tired after the previous day but has had a lead-out this morning. Mick Kinane said it was his easiest win and had also said that at Leopardstown last time."

Realism and Optimism at Tatts...

There has been good traffic past the stables of Liam Cashman's County Cork-based Rathbarry Stud, who has eight lots catalogued, including Lot 600, a Medicean (GB) half-sister to G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley). "We'd have to be reasonably hopeful and have had a lot of lookers," said Cashman. "The right people have been here, and we've been just as busy as in the past. Goffs didn't seem to be as bad trade as people were anticipating last week, the clearance rate was good and horses were moving on, which is the main thing. I think nice horses will sell well here, and people will be happy enough with Books 1 and 2. But things could be tough once we get to the third catalogue."

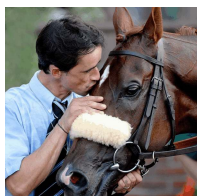
Francois Drion of Taroka Stud, who has his lots stabled in Tattersalls' newly rebuilt wallboxes, is going into this week with a degree of realism. "You've got to take a pragmatic approach and move the horses on, and I think we're going to see the same old story--absolutely everything must be perfect, the conformation, sire and pedigree--and if not it will be a struggle," said Drion. "It seems that the English trainers don't have the same number of orders that they may have had in the past, and I think that will prove more of a concern going into next week. But at the same time, they have boxes to fill, so do need to get horses."

Agent Charlie Gordon-Watson believes that, although the overall spread of horses is solid, the sale could just be lacking one or two superstars. "At the moment, I'd be struggling to tell you who the sale topper or even the top three lots will be, which is unusual," said Gordon-Watson. "But having said that, there is a good spread of nice horses, it's just missing one or two really outstanding ones. I also think the catalogue would benefit from being 200 lots smaller." Despite the size of the catalogue, Gordon-Watson said he felt Book 1 may be light on blue bloods of the fairer sex. "There is also a shortage of fillies with pedigrees, because I think a lot of people have decided to keep those, but again there are still some decent fillies there," he opined.

BBA Ireland chairman Adrian Nicoll echoed Gordon-Watson's views about trimming the Book 1 catalogue. "There are a lot of very nice horses who are going to sell extremely well here," said Nicoll. "But it could be brought down by a good few that shouldn't be here. It would be much better to lose a day and have the sale on Thursday and Friday. It would have also meant we could have all gone to the Arc, seen a great horse win and quite possibly picked up some clients. As it is, we've gone straight from one sale at Goffs on to the next without time to gather our thoughts. We were leading buyers at Goffs, I personally bought 16, and I think BBA Ireland got 23 in total. It was still very hard to buy the good horses, although I think vendors found it hard to shift the ones that didn't come up to scratch."

The King and His Heirs...

When a stallion rewrites the record books by becoming champion sire on 14 occasions and sires 285 stakes winners on the flat, it would be churlish in the extreme not to focus attention on his last batch of sales year-

lings. The stallion, of course, is the phenomenal Sadler's Wells, who was pensioned in May last year after his fertility deserted him at the age of 27.

Fortunately this sire of over 160 group winners, including more than 70 Grade/Group 1

winners, was still in pretty good form in 2007, when he is credited with siring 37 foals. As many as 17 of them are scheduled to sell over the next three days at Tattersalls, and it's not impossible that there could be another Galileo, Montjeu or High Chaparral among the seven colts.

Demand for the 10 fillies should also be strong, on the basis that Sadler's Wells has sired five winners of the Epsom Oaks and currently appears to be heading for his fifth consecutive title as champion sire of broodmares.

Of course, one of the features of Sadler's Wells's career has been the exceptional results he has enjoyed with mares by Shirley Heights, and by Shirley Heights's son Darshaan. Inevitably, both these famous broodmare sires are represented among the 17-strong contingent on offer this week.

Sadler's Wells has achieved 13 percent stakes winners. However, his matings with Darshaan mares have produced 158 foals of racing age, of which 19--a stunning 12 percent--have already become group winners and 27--or 17 percent--have become stakes winners. These percentages are sure to rise, as the 158 foals include around 20 two-year-olds which largely haven't yet had time to prove themselves.

The figures for Shirley Heights mares are similarly impressive. This cross has produced 110 foals, for 14 group winners (12.7 percent) and 22 stakes winners (20 percent). **Cont. p4**

There are six yearlings on offer out of Darshaan mares, and among them are two which are brothers to group winners. Lot [478](#) is a colt out of that outstanding producer Jude, which makes him a brother to Yesterday and Quarter Moon--two of Sadler's Wells's eight Group 1 winners out of Darshaan mares. Although lot 478 has a May 20 birthday, would-be buyers should remember that this year's Kentucky Derby winner Mine That Bird wasn't born until May 10 and that Vocalised had won two Group 3 events before his actual third birthday on May 30. Rob Whiteley's Op/Ed piece "Let's Hear It For May Foals!" is available on the *TDN* website and should help allay any lingering prejudice against late foals.

Lot [534](#), a colt out of Love For Ever, is a brother to Gypsy King, winner of the G3 Dee S. before finishing fifth as second favorite for the Derby.

Two of the youngsters out of Darshaan mares have pedigrees which feature some interesting inbreeding. Lot [117](#), a filly out of the two-year-old winner Sweet Gypsy Rose, has a second dam by Sadler's Wells's very successful brother Fairy King, creating 2x4 inbreeding to Northern Dancer and Fairy Bridge. The brothers both sired winners of such outstanding prizes as the Derby and the Arc.

Lot [615](#) is a filly out of Necklace, who established herself as one of Darshaan's fastest and most precocious daughters with victories in the G3 Debutante S. and G1 Moyglare Stud S. Necklace's dam Spinning the Yarn is a granddaughter of Sadler's Wells, so he appears in the first and fourth generations of the youngster's pedigree. This is the family which produced the high-class colts Opera House, Kayf Tara and Stagecraft to the exceptional Coolmore champion.

The pair out of Shirley Heights mares include a very well-connected filly in Lot [541](#). The youngster's dam, Lyrical, is a half-sister to the Oaks winner Love Divine, who visited Sadler's Wells's son Galileo to produce the St Leger winner Sixties Icon. Lot [614](#) is a colt whose second dam, the group-winning Sailor's Mate, is by Shirley Heights. Sailor's Mate's dam Sea Venture is also the second dam of Hellenic, the Darshaan mare whose visits to Sadler's Wells produced the G1 winners Islington (Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf) and Greek Dance.

Another pairing which proved highly fruitful was with daughters of the dual Arc winner Alleged to Sadler's Wells. The 40 foals bred this way also produced a 20-percent strike rate at stakes level, and 15 percent of the foals bred this way have become group winners. Among them are Dream Well (Prix du Jockey Club and Irish Derby) and Brian Boru (St Leger), so Lot [221](#) has a hard act to follow. He's another late May foal, but he too should be well worth a little patience, as he's a half-brother to the Group 2 winner Actrice and the dual Grade I winner Angara. His dam Ange Bleu is a half-sister to Arcangues, winner of the Breeders' Cup Classic, and to the dams of the Classic-winning fillies Aquarelliste and Cape Verdi. **Cont. p5**

Another from a top Wildenstein family is Lot [241](#). Surely any breeder would love to own a filly whose third dam is that great racemare Allez France--a female winner of the Arc, like Sea the Stars's dam Urban Sea. Other Sadler's Wells fillies from this family are Argentina and Asti, runners-up respectively in the Prix de Diane and the Prix Saint-Alary.

Warning, a champion two-year-old and miler, had an exceptional record with Sadler's Wells's broodmare daughters, siring six group winners from 36 foals, including Diktat and Charnwood Forest. This has encouraged breeders to send daughters of Warning to Sadler's Wells, and Lot [350](#) is out of Warning's dual Group 3 winner Di Moi Oui.

Watership Down Stud once consigned a Sadler's Wells colt which sold for 3.4 million guineas at Tattersalls. This time, the stud consigns three of his yearlings, including Lot [33](#), a colt who is the first foal of Dynaformer's highly accomplished daughter Riskaverse, a three-time Grade I winner. Sadler's Wells has sired three group winners from other granddaughters of Roberto, one being the Group 1 winner Playful Act, who sold for \$10.5 million at Keeneland two years ago.

Newsells Park Stud is the vendor of Lot [68](#), a filly whose dam Shastye sold for 625,000gns at the end of her racing career. This large price reflects the fact that Shastye was a talented half-sister to the Arc winner Sagamix and to another Group 1 winner in Sagacity. Almighty, a half-brother to Shastye by Sadler's Wells, went close to winning the G3 Chester Vase.

Ballykilbride Stud's colt, Lot [79](#), is sure to have his admirers as he is a brother to the accomplished stayer Royal and Regal. Lot [185](#), a filly from New England Stud, is also interesting, as her dam Wosaita is a half-sister to Rafha, the Prix de Diane winner who produced that excellent stallion Invincible Spirit. Wosaita has produced stakes winners to two largely disappointing stallions in Desert Prince and Daylami. What might she achieve with a horse with strong claims to being the best stallion ever to stand in Europe?

Yearlings from the first crop of Holy Roman Emperor were in demand at the Orby last week, where this filly's three-parts sister Famous (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) was sold for €1 million in 2008 before finishing runner-up in this year's G1 Moyglare Stud S. Alongside that talented Ballydoyle juvenile, Starlight Dreams has also produced Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). He needs no introduction as last year's European champion two-year-old courtesy of wins in the G1 Phoenix S. and G1 National S., who has also added the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. to that tally this term.

121, c, Medicean (GB)--Tariysha (Ire), by Daylami (Ire)

Consigned by Corduff Stud

Medicean's yearlings also sold well during the Orby and this February-foaled bay's page received a significant update in August when his G2 July S.-winning half-brother Arcano (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) went on to garner the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville. That win gained further luster when runner-up Special Duty (GB) (Hennessy) powered to victory in Friday's G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket.

200, f, Storm Cat--Airwave (GB), by Air Express (Ire)

Consigned by Oaks Farm Stables

This February-foaled bay is Storm Cat's sole representative in the book. She is the second foal out of Britain's champion two-year-old filly of 2000 Airwave, heroine of that year's G1 Cheveley Park S. Airwave went on to capture the G2 Temple S. the following season, when she also hit the board in the G1 Golden Jubilee S., G1 July Cup and G1 Haydock Sprint Cup. Her half-sister Cloud's End (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) made a promising start to her career last week with an eye-catching second in a Nottingham maiden.

Backtalk Drills Six Furlongs for Futurity Run...

Gold Mark Farm's **Backtalk** (Smarty Jones), who lost his unbeaten record when fourth in the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga Sept. 7, had his first work over Keeneland's Polytrack surface yesterday as he put in his final preparations for Saturday's GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity. The juvenile breezed six furlongs in 1:12.80 and galloped out seven furlongs in 1:25.40 with Miguel Mena aboard. Trained by Tom Amoss, Backtalk broke off about five lengths behind two workmates in the move that took place shortly after 6:30 a.m. Backtalk began to rally at the eighth pole, drew even at the sixteenth pole and hit the wire a couple of lengths in front. "He has done well since the Hopeful," Amoss said. "That race didn't go the way we thought. He had a bad post position [12 in a field of 12] and a jock [Richard Migliore] who was unfamiliar with him." Robby Albarado will have the mount Saturday. Although the Breeders' Futurity will be Backtalk's first race on a synthetic track, the GIII Bashford Manor S. and GII Sanford S. hero isn't unfamiliar with those underfoot conditions. "He started on [a synthetic track] at the farm in Florida, and farm manager Todd Quast told me when I got him that we had a quality horse," Amoss said. "I have no doubt he'll handle the track fine Saturday."



Catalano Takes Aim at Keeneland Juvenile Stakes...

Trainer Wayne Catalano is preparing for what could be a busy weekend at Keeneland, as the Chicago horseman stands to have undefeated horses in both of the track's signature events for two-year-olds, Friday's GI

Darley Alcibiades and Saturday's GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity. The filly **She Be Wild** (Offlee Wild) goes in the former. The dark bay took her record to three-for-three in the GIII Arlington-Washington BC Lassie S. in her latest Sept. 5. On Sunday, the Nancy Mazzoni homebred worked five furlongs at Keeneland

in 1:00.40. "She's a small filly, but she's feisty," said Catalano. "She looks like she'll do anything. She went to the lead [in her debut], and she laid right off it and she rated [in her two most recent races]. She looks like she's a handy little horse." Catalano said Garrett Gomez will be aboard She Be Wild for the first time.

Also possible to run, though less definite, is the gelding **Dixie Band** (Dixie Union), whom Catalano saddled to victory in the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity. The Darrell and Evelyn Yates colorbearer is also unbeaten in three starts. "We're happy with the performances by both horses at the moment," said Catalano. "She Be Wild will run [in the Alcibiades]; the other one, we're going to look at the [Breeders' Futurity] and see what we're going to do. He's run pretty good for us, and we'll just see."

Aikenite to Tackle Breeders' Futurity...

One horse that is definite for Saturday's GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity is Dogwood Stable's **Aikenite** (Yes It's True), who comes off a closing third in the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga. "Aikenite worked five furlongs in 1:02.2 Sunday at Saratoga--his final work before the race on Saturday--and will ship to Keeneland on Tuesday," said Dogwood President Cot Campbell. "He'll gallop over the Polytrack Thursday and Friday. Aikenite's never raced on Polytrack, but he had the fastest quarter-mile work at the OBS Sale last March--over their track's artificial surface--so we know he likes it." Alan Garcia has the mount on Aikenite. The mile-and-a-sixteenth Breeders' Futurity will be Aikenite's third start. Trained by Todd Pletcher, the colt broke his maiden in his first start at Saratoga Aug. 9, then came back to finish third in the Hopeful.

NOTES ON THE IFHA CONFERENCE

Yesterday saw the 43rd Conference of the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities held in Paris, with Chairman Louis Romanet opening a series of internal presentations and debates. Most notably, he stressed the importance of harmonizing interference rules after the high-profile disqualification of Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) in the Sept. 13 G1 Prix Vermeille.

Hubert Monzat, Chief Executive Officer of France Galop, made a presentation about the opening of the internet betting market in France in 2010. The matter is to be debated from tomorrow onwards at the French National Assembly, before being passed on to the French Senate early next year if the law is approved by the French Deputies. Monzat commented, "As far as horseracing is concerned, only pari-mutuel betting will be allowed as the only truly sustainable betting model. It is the only one that can ensure protection of the interests of both punters and professionals of the sector. To maintain and increase the high level of purses, it is fundamental to the future of French racing to favour the pari-mutuel approach versus bookmaking and fixed odds or, worse still, betting exchanges."

Rob de Cock, CEO of NHRA of South Africa and John Stuart, Director of the Phumelela Company, made an extensive presentation of the state of racing, breeding and wagering in South Africa. De Cock started his presentation with a reference to Mark Twain. "It's not the size of the dog in the fight, it's the size of the fight in the dog," he quipped.

Through three different presentations, the attention turned to the benefits of international distribution of racing pictures and wagering. First to speak was Harald Dorum, CEO of the Norwegian Tote who stressed the importance of simulcast on betting turnover, showing that in Norway betting on international races has boosted the national growth.

Pablo Kavulakian, special advisor to OSAF, the South American Federation, offered figures on the production and distribution of pictures and data from South America for simulcasting.

While South America represents 13 percent of the foals born in the world and seven percent of the races run, it represents only 0.52 percent of the global turnover, far behind Asia, Europe and North America. There is therefore a huge market to develop in that region of the world, as leading countries from South America do have the proper technologies to send images and data and also to receive them. The exception is Chile, where the law forbids the importing of a signal but allows the exporting of one. It was then left to Jack Lisowski, director of mutuels of Arlington Park, to talk about the role of Hubs in modern co-mingling. He was responsible for the integrity of all pari-mutuel wagering on Arlington Park races and also for all United States wagering on several international races, including the Dubai World Cup and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, from 1999 to 2008.

Lisowski said, "Co-mingling of pools is a necessity in today's world. Tote Hubs are the backbone of the United States' pari-mutuel system. They allow for the transmission of wagering data in a fast, efficient and organized manner. Without them, the wagering would be fragmented and it would be difficult for all of the individual wagers to be processed in a timely manner. Over 90 percent of the handle now comes into the pools after one-minute-to-post. Most of us remember the Breeders' Cup Pick 6 scam in 2002. A few smart, but unscrupulous individuals took advantage of a flaw in the ITSP protocol in place at the time. Unfortunately, I had a front-row seat in this debacle, as Arlington Park was the site of the 2002 Breeders' Cup, and I was the mutuel manager in charge. Unfortunately, this happened under my watch. In Pick pools of four or more, the permutations involved were deemed to be too large to allow for a timely transmission of all the data. Only the local bet on these pools was initially transmitted, with the breakdown on the individual combinations only being transmitted when there were two legs remaining. This allowed for a bet to be made and the total amount of the wager to be transmitted to the host tote, but the details of the wager were unreported. If someone had the wherewithal to get into the tote system and change those bet details, they basically could make the wager after the outcome of the early races was known. The newer version of ITSP requires the transmission of the total amount of wagers that will be live dependent on each specific horse winning the next leg. These scans are transmitted after each subsequent leg. This prevents someone from manipulating the wagers after the fact."

Business in racing was the next subject under scrutiny. Nick Coward, chief executive of the British Horseracing Authority, started with a presentation about the promotion and re-branding of racing in England. It showed that even though racing is generally well regarded and has great assets and is free of image problems, it is too often a "best-kept secret" in the mind of customers and lacks the hooks necessary to capture and maintain engagement. Also, the scope for converting casual racegoers into aficionados is limited by the complex nature of the product. Racing is the second largest sport in the UK, but in terms of betting has dropped far below football, lotteries, casinos, etc. It has become urgent to broaden horseracing's national media appeal and promote the excitement of horseracing and adopt a new betting strategy.

John Della Volpe, CEO of Social Sphere Strategies and Director of Polling at Harvard University, Institute of Politics talked about a strategy on how to target the new customer on the internet using new technologies and sites like Facebook and Twitter. For example, before the Arc on Sunday there were 1,000 fans of Sea the Stars worldwide. After Della Volpe talked about the Arc winner on his personal page on Facebook right after the race, there were 2,400 fans of Sea the Stars by Monday morning. **IFHA Conference cont. p11**

Finally Scarlett Leung, Director of Corporate Strategy at the Hong Kong Jockey Club, analysed how to reach the customer with customer analytics and segmentation.

The last word was from Louis Romanet, who spoke of the work needed in 2009-2010 before the 44th conference next year. "In 1993, the IFHA numbered 47 countries. In 2009 we are now 59 with the addition of Croatia and Panama, so it is difficult to deal directly with each member," he commented. "So, a new organisation of the IFHA will be implemented in 2010. IFHA must have more regional input, and we must transform the ERDC initiated by Bjorn Eklund into a European and Mediterranean-organised structure. A new fee structure will be implemented in 2010 to take into account the financial difficulties of some of our members. The executive Committee will have permanent members and also rotating members to represent small countries. Harmonisation of rules is an absolute priority. Interferences is the number one issue. We saw this morning three cases of interference showing clearly how far away we are on both sides of the Channel. France Galop's Chairman has already announced that there will be a complete review of the situation in our country, but if Great Britain and Ireland do not make a step forward we will never reach harmonization. IFHA is ready to help, but it can only be a facilitator as we cannot impose rules and regulations to any racing authority. We must not forget the medication issue. International screening limits should be implemented around the world. Group and black-type races should be run without medication everywhere in the world, including in North America and South America. The opening of the internet betting market in France in 2010 will be a key issue for Europe. It will show us if we can still regulate the new gambling world and face successfully the challenge of illegal bettors within the new framework imposed by the French Government. We have a great potential to maximize our revenue by developing the distribution of racing pictures and data around the world and by developing global co-mingling when we have solved all technical and legal issues. Promotion and re-branding are also major priorities and increasing our customer base is also one of our biggest challenges, in which the internet is a key vehicle. We must create a worldwide Online Racing Community and the internet is what we need for co-ordinating the promotion of racing at a global level."

In other developments during the forums:

- A special report on racing and breeding in South Africa revealed that the nation's sport, which faced bankruptcy in the late 1990s, has been revived and is thriving, producing international stars such as G1 Dubai Duty Free winner Jay Peg (SAf). About 6,600 horses are in training in South Africa, which last year generated turnover of 8.5-billion rand (approximately \$1.2 billion), a figure that marked a 45-percent increase from the level of five years ago.
 - Despite the economic downturn that began last year, total global betting on racing remained fairly stable in 2008 at €85.2 billion, reported Maurits Bruggink, IFHA executive director, who predicted that that figure could increase to around €100 billion annually in the near future. Breeding figures also remained relatively even, with global foal production reported at 121,402 for 2007 and 119,639 for 2008. "I think we proved in 2008 that we are rather resilient," said Bruggink, who predicted that there will be more commingling of wagers in the future and increased international simulcasting among racing organizations.
 - Singapore officials expect Internet betting on racing to be allowed there in 2010. It also was reported that the KrisFlyer International Sprint has been recommended for an upgrade to Group 1 level for next year and thus is poised to join the Singapore Airlines International Cup in elite status.

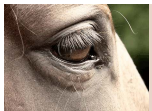

AGA AND THE LAGARDERE LEGACY

The 2009 Arc weekend will inevitably be remembered first of all for Sea the Stars' thrilling performance in the main event. Chased home by six other Group 1 winners,

the son of Cape Cross became the new template for the ideal modern Thoroughbred: handsome and extremely sound, Sea the Stars is also blessed with an admirable temperament and truly extraordinary talent. He combines

Classic speed with enough stamina to make him unbeatable over a mile and a half, and it has been a privilege to watch him develop into one of the all-time greats.

The other lasting memory of the Arc weekend must be the extraordinary sequence of success which saw the Aga Khan's colors carried to victory in SEVEN group races, including five Group 1 contests.

The Aga has always been keen to introduce fresh blood into his studs, and he has reaped long-lasting rewards from his purchases in the late 1970s of the sizeable racing and breeding empires owned by Madame Dupre, and Marcel Boussac. For example, he owed the success of Daryakana in the G2 Prix de Royallieu to a Boussac family.

The families originally founded by the Aga's grandfather in the 1920s also played their part in the weekend's bombardment. Shalanaya, who sprang a surprise in the G1 Prix de l'Opera, comes from a female line which traces all the way back to the legendary Mumtaz Mahal, while Alandi, winner of the G1 Prix du Cadran comes from another branch of the same famous family.

However, the other four winners--Manighar (G2 Prix Chaudenay), Varenar (G1 Prix de la Foret), Rosanara (G1 Prix Marcel Boussac) and Siyouni (G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere)--all underlined the wisdom of the Aga's purchase of the Lagardere horses and breeding stock in March 2005.

The *TDN* editorial staff did a great job in highlighting the Lagardere connection in yesterday's *TDN*, but I would like to expand on the story somewhat.

Jean-Luc Lagardere became the dominant force in French breeding, topping the breeders' table no fewer than 10 times in the 11 years from 1995 to 2005. Lagardere unfortunately died in March 2003 and his horses, including 62 broodmares and 74 horses in training, eventually passed into the ownership of the Aga. It didn't take long for the Aga's investment to start paying rich dividends, with Vadawina, Valixir and Carlotamix all becoming Group 1 winners in his colors in 2005.

That was also the year that two other Lagardere-bred horses became stakes winners for him. One, the Danehill filly Sichilla, won the Listed Prix Amandine over seven furlongs, and the other, the Linamix filly Rosawa, collected listed victories over a mile and 1¼ miles, having won her only start at two in 2004 for Lagardere's successors. Sichilla and Rosawa have now hit the Group 1 jackpot at the first attempt, as the dams of Siyouni and Rosanara.

The purchase of the Lagardere stock got off to such a good start in 2005 that I wrote an article in the June 2006 edition of the British magazine *Thoroughbred Owner & Breeder*. In the process I interviewed Eric Puerari, whose father Claude bought one of Lagardere's original foundation mares, Reine des Sables. It was one of this mare's descendants, Resless Kara, which provided Lagardere with his first Classic success, in the 1988 Prix de Diane. Another Classic winner followed in 1990, when Linamix triumphed in the Poule d'Essai des Poulains. This grey son of Mendez later confirmed his talent when narrowly beaten in the Prix Jacques le Marois and Prix du Moulin, before retiring to Haras du Val Henry at a fee of FF100,000 in 1991.

Linamix's pedigree did little to encourage outside support. His sire Mendez had sired nothing else of similar quality in two seasons in France, before being sold to Japan, and Linamix's broodmare sire Breton wasn't exactly a household name either.

If Linamix was going to make the grade as a stallion, it was going to be with the help of Lagardere's broodmares, and this meant that Lagardere was going to have to buy quite a few mares. Linamix, of course, went on to become the best stallion in France, helped tremendously by Lagardere, who bred 14 of the 15 group winners in Linamix's first five crops. Among them were five Group 1 winners, including Sagamix (Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe), Fragrant Mix (Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud), Amilynx (Prix Royal-Oak) and Slickly (Prix du Moulin and Grand Prix de Paris).

Lagardere's success with Linamix was based substantially on mares bought at the sales, often for relatively modest amounts in the U.S. His main ally at the sales was Eric Puerari, and I asked him to explain the system which helped them buy so many good mares:

"We looked for mares which were well-made, strong and muscular, which weren't too big," Puerari explained, having pointed out that Linamix was quite a lean individual.

"M. Lagardere would make his own choices at the sales," Puerari added. "He knew pretty much what he wanted. I started going round the sales with him, but then he couldn't come all the time. Year after year he was coming less, so he would give me the list of mares and fillies whose pedigrees he liked, and we would then talk about the conformation and make a decision.

"He would follow his own rules all the time and he wouldn't overpay. He would always prefer to buy four or five fillies or mares that he liked, than to overpay for a very special mare. He would play the numbers. Every year he would cull six or seven mares that were either disappointing or getting old, and buy six or seven new ones. He would always renew his blood, every year.

"M. Lagardere especially liked American blood because of the speed and of the bloodlines. He loved the Mr. Prospector bloodline, especially to mate with Linamix. He had a format for the type of a mare he would like to buy. The sire of the filly was important and so was the broodmare sire. The family was important too, but it could be a bit far back--it wouldn't bother him too much if the other signs were right. He also liked a daughter of a good racemare, even if she was a bit disappointing herself. He preferred a mare with useful form. In America he would look for performance but not on the grass, only on the dirt. And, with very few exceptions, he preferred unproven mares which had not been tried at stud.

"You can see from the mares we bought that he had a good memory for Classic bloodlines, which he learnt from going around the sales with Francois Boutin. For example, he liked the fact that [Sagamix's dam] Saganeca descended from La Mirambule. He also liked the Bayrose family.

"He wouldn't mind a mare which had a little bit of a gap under the first or second dam, if she was by the right stallion. That's how we bought quite a few of those mares cheaply. If he liked a filly physically--if she had some strength and looked athletic, with the head of a racehorse--he was prepared to compromise a bit on some limb defects. When I went to Keeneland without him, I was trying to buy him correct horses, but he was not very, very strict on conformation. He liked a good-looking mare with scope, and that was more important."

Puerari later added that all the mares bought would be bred to Linamix in at least her first three years.

"He didn't like to overspend on stud fees. He would use proven stallions more than young stallions, but wouldn't pay crazy prices. He wasn't influenced by fashion or using the most fashionable stallions."

The purchases certainly made their mark at the Arc weekend. Manighar--a son of Linamix--is out of Mintly Fresh, a Mr. Prospector-line mare bought for \$60,000 in 2001. Mintly Fresh's Linamix filly Minatlya, was also a group winner and has now joined her dam in the Aga's broodmare band.

Varenar, who sprang a 20-1 surprise in the Prix de la Foret, is out of Visor. This Turfway Park winner by Mr. Prospector cost \$65,000 in 1992. She had five foals by Linamix, all winners, including a Group 3 winner and two Classic-placed performers. Visor's three winning daughters are now all members of the broodmare band.

Moving on to Rosanara, her second dam Rose Quartz was bought by Puerari for 42,000gns as a three-year-old in 2000. This daughter of the remarkable Lammtarra had won a maiden race over 13 furlongs for Sheikh Mohammed and was very well-connected. Her dam, the Mr. Prospector mare Graphite, was a sister to the GI Hollywood Starlet S. winner Cuddles and Rosanara's fourth dam Stellarette was a smart half-sister to those notable broodmares Love Smitten and Kamar. Rose Quartz has three foals by Linamix, the first being Rosanara's talented dam Rosawa.

And Siyouni's dam Sichilla is out of the tough American mare Slipstream Queen. This daughter of Conquistador Cielo cost \$110,000 at the 1995 Keeneland January Sale. Transferred immediately to France to visit Linamix, she produced the highly talented Slickly as her first foal, and later produced two group-placed colts to the same stallion, plus No Slip, a Grade II winner in California, and the listed winner Sichilla.

Artistique, another Linamix mare out of a Puerari purchase, is the dam of Montmartre, who looked such an exciting prospect when he won the 2008 Grand Prix de Paris. It's a similar story with Sagamix's good sister Sage et Jolie, whose son Sageburg won the G1 Prix d'Ispahan last year.

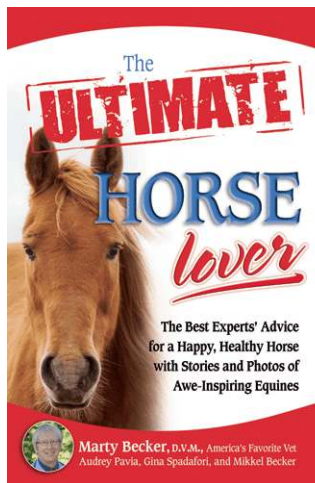
