## GALILEO COLT TOPS TATOCT DAY 1

Bucking the trend, trading at yesterday's first session of Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale in Newmarket remained largely on par with the same day in 2008. The

80,000gns median was identical to last year, the 111,523gns average fell by just two percent and the 16,840,000gns turnover, for a slightly increased catalogue, rose by 12 percent. The 75 percent clearance rate compared to 77 percent 12 months ago. But there were no million-guineas fireworks. John Magnier paid the day's highest price for a Galileo (Ire) half-brother to G1 Phoenix S. winner Dam-

son (Ire) (Entrepreneur {GB}) sold from Denis and Joan Brosnan's Croom House Stud. The striking colt, consigned as [lot 118](#), realized 550,000gns after the Coolmore boss had seen off agents Richard Brown, Charlie Gordon-Watson and finally owner Sir Robert Ogden for the youngster. He was bred by the Brosnans' Epona Bloodstock, in partnership with Patsy Byrne. "He was a remarkable horse; he was just exceptional looking and, on top of that, he's a Galileo brother to a Group 1 winner," Coolmore agent Demi O'Byrne commented. "He is for the three usual owners."

## GIO PONTI TO BREEDERS' CUP CLASSIC

**Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat), who was denied his fifth-straight Grade I victory on turf when he ran second over soft going at Belmont in last Saturday's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic S., will make his next start on the main track in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, *Daily Racing*

*Form* reports. The four-year-old already has a victory over Santa Anita's Pro-Ride surface by virtue of his score in an off-the-turf running of the GIII Sir Beaufort S. in December. Trainer Christophe Clement and owner Shane Thomas Ryan hope their colt has done enough to earn

champion turf horse honors. "One, he came out of his race in good order," Clement told *DRF*. "Two, we believe he does not have that much to prove anymore as the leading turf horse in America. Three, the Classic is an exciting challenge; it should be a very good race. It's a mile and a quarter, but I believe he's got as good a shot as anybody else in the race. Let's go for it." Winner of this year's GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile H., GI Manhattan H., GI Man O' War S. and GI Arlington Million, the bay's only other defeat this year came in the GII Strub S. over the Santa Anita main track back in February.

[Hip 103](#), a 400,000gns colt from the first crop of Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) was also snapped up by the Coolmore team. A three-parts brother to G1 Irish 2,000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. winner Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), he was offered from Paul Shanahan's Ashtown House Stud. The Maktoum-linked buyers John Ferguson, Shadwell and Rabbah Bloodstock were also busy, spending 5.53 million guineas (33 percent of the turnover) on 40 lots. The pick of the group was a Medicean (GB) half-brother to G1 Prix Morny winner Arcano (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}), bought by that colt's owner, Hamdan Al Maktoum. Sold from the Egan family's Corduff Stud as [hip 121](#), he realized 450,000gns after Shadwell's Angus Gold saw off BBA Ireland agent Eamonn Reilly. "Obviously, we know his big brother, and the mare has started pretty well, but this colt was just a star individual," said Gold. "He was a beautiful horse with a great attitude and as usual, we will sort out trainers for everything once the sales are over." The Shadwell team later saw off Michael Jarvis to get [hip 186](#), a Dansili (GB) half-brother to this season's Marble Hill S. winner Wrong Answer (GB) (Verglas {Ire}) for 320,000gns.

**Sadler's Wells in Demand...**

A selection of Sadler's Wells' final crop of yearlings are on offer this week and they provided three of the top nine prices yesterday, including a 330,000gns colt bought by Dubai-based owners Dr. Jim and Fitri Hay. Offered from Peter Savill's County Wicklow-based Ballykilbride Stud as [hip 79](#), the colt is a full-brother to top stayer Royal and Regal (Ire). "He doesn't look at all backward, and there was a time when you couldn't get near a Sadler's Wells for that money--we thought he was good value," said Paul Cole. Trainer Jeremy Noseda, hidden on a back staircase, fought off Crispin de Moubray for another Sadler's Wells, a filly out of Shastye (Ire) (Danehill). Her dam is half-sister to Sagamix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) and Sagacity (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}). "She's bought for an existing owner in my yard, and I'm delighted to have her," said Noseda of the Newsells Park Stud offering, who brought 350,000gns. "She could go on and make a broodmare and is by a great stallion. It's still trying to buy a nice horse here." Herve Barjot was another Sadler's Wells fan, paying 300,000gns for [hip 221](#), a half-brother to G1 Diana and G1 Beverly D. S. winner Angara (GB) (Alzao). The colt was bred by Bjorn Nielsen and sold from Watership Down Stud. "The family is moving on all the time and he has been bought for a new syndicate to join Eric Libaud in France," said Barjot.

***Vidal Continues Shopping Spree...***

Sylvain Vidal has been active throughout the European sales season, buying 10 yearlings at Arqana's August sale and a further seven last week at Goffs. Early on the first day of the Tattersalls October sale he added Malegganda (Fr) (Divine Light {Jpn}), a full-sister to G1 1000 Guineas winner Natagora (Fr), to his list of purchases for 80,000gns. The bay was consigned by Voute Sales Ltd., agent, as hip [26](#). The 36-year-old Vidal, who owns Haras de la Cauviniere in Normandy with his wife Elisabeth, is managing the racing and bloodstock interests of Gerard Augustin-Normand, owner of this year's Prix du Jockey-Club winner Le Havre (Ire) (Noverre). The latter is the first stallion recruit to the Vidals' operation at Notre-Dame-de-Courson. "The horses I'm buying for M. Augustin-Normand are to go into training first, and then the fillies will go to Le Havre," explained Vidal. "We're mostly buying fillies, but we did find a lovely colt in Ireland, a half-brother to Cat Junior [Storm Cat]. We're also planning to buy quite a lot of mares at the December sales here and in Deauville to send to Le Havre." Haras de la Cauviniere has been in operation for four years and has an international client base, boarding mares for breeders from Switzerland, Germany, England, Ireland and Spain. Prior to running his own business, Vidal worked in Kentucky at Lane's End, where he looked after Kingmambo, as well as A.P. Indy. He gained further hands-on experience of stallion management in Ireland with Coolmore, where he was responsible for Spectrum (Ire) and Peintre Celebre. "It's very exciting for us; it's always been the aim to stand a stallion, and we're very pleased to have Le Havre--he's a good-looking horse from the family of Polar Falcon, and we have 45 mares booked to him already," he added. Vidal is also planning to send some of his own mares to Le Havre, including Ramita (GB), a Fasliyev half-sister to Reggane (GB) (Red Ransom).

**The Shamardal/Johnston Connection Continues...**

Trainer Mark Johnston was responsible for Shamardal's juvenile season, winning the G2 Vintage S. and G1 Dewhurst S. before the son of Giant's Causeway was transferred by Godolphin. Johnston has also been successful with his offspring. The exploits of Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed al Maktoum's Goffs Million Mile winner Shakespearean (Ire), who also landed the G3 Solario S., have contributed significantly to Shamardal's standing atop the first-season sires' table. It was no surprise that three of the trainer's five first-day purchases were two sons and a daughter of the young Darley stallion. "Two of the three I've bought today have been for Sheikh Hamdan, and we certainly have a mutual interest in the stallion," said Johnston, who has 12 first-crop two-year-olds by Shamardal at his Middleham base. "Shakespearean is by no means the only good one."

**Francesca Cumani Australian Bound...**

Francesca Cumani was busy throughout the opening session inspecting yearlings with her father Luca, but the trainer will be without her services for the remainder of the sale. She is travelling to Melbourne today to fulfil a commitment with Australian TV's Channel 7, where she will be appearing as a presenter on Derby day, Oaks day and Melbourne Cup day through the Spring Carnival. "I'm really looking forward to getting back out to Australia," said Cumani, who has overseen her father's Melbourne Cup raiding parties for the past two years. She had to endure consecutive years of watching the stable's runners finish runner-up in Australia's biggest race; Purple Moon (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Bauer (Ire) (Halling) were beaten a half-length and a nose, respectively, in 2007 and 2008. Cumani will be accompanied on her trip by her mother Sara, who will be handling the preparations for Cima de Triomphe (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Basaltico (Ire) (Shantou).

**Super Saturday for Harper & Slade...**

Breeders Chris Harper and Heather Slade were dealt a blow last week at Goffs Orby when their Dansili (GB) filly out of Good Enough (Fr) (Mukaddamah)--due to sell as lot 430 Thursday--broke her pedal bone and had to be withdrawn. Their fortunes were dramatically reversed Saturday, however, when the filly's two-year-old half-brother Oasis Dancer (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) won the Tattersalls Timeform Million at Newmarket, netting more than £500,000 in prize-money for Slade, who bought out Harper at last year's October Sale. The pair also bred the third home, Take Ten (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}), a son of another mare they own in partnership, See You Later (GB) (Emarati). "The good thing is that I suppose we'll keep the filly now," said Harper, the owner of Whitsbury Manor Stud in Hampshire. "Good Enough did not have a foal this year but is now in foal to Whitsbury Manor resident Sakhee's Secret (GB) (Sakhee)."

## RACING Round-Up

### *Sheppard Stars Coming Out to Play...*

In the second running of the Breeders' Cup at Aqueduct in 1985, Hall of Famer Jonathan Sheppard sent out the favorite for the Juvenile, a Pennsylvania-bred colt owned by William T. Young called Storm Cat. Things didn't go quite the way he planned, as Storm Cat finished second to Tasso, but, nearly a quarter-century later, Sheppard is celebrating a career season. The 68-year-old has a pair of potential champions in George Strawbridge's **Forever Together** (Belong to Me) and **Informed Decision** (Monarchos). Sheppard even has a Grade I victory in his own name to boot.

"It's been a dream come true," Sheppard said during a national media teleconference yesterday afternoon. "It's been fun having these good horses. I don't think I've been doing anything different than I have over the years. It all seems to have happened all at once—I don't really know why, but both fillies have chances at their championships. Both have come through their seasons well. They're happy, they're sound and training well."

Both Forever Together and Informed Decision will be in action on "FallStars" weekend at Keeneland. Forever Together, the reigning champion turf distaffer, looks to defend her title in the GI First Lady S., a race she used as a springboard to her 3/4-length victory in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf at Santa Anita.

"I think she's at least good [as she was last year]," Sheppard said. "She's training very well, and her record would indicate that she's just about where she was last year." The gray filly, who enters the First Lady off a narrow defeat in the GII Canadian S. at Woodbine, is set to blow out this morning at Keeneland.

Informed Decision has won four of her five outings this season, including a late-running victory over 2008 Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint champion Ventura (Chester House) in the GI Vinery Madison S. in Lexington. She was a disappointing third in the GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga Aug. 29, but bounced back to take the Sept. 12 GIII Presque Isle Masters S., taking her record on synthetics to five out of five.

Informed Decision turned in her final work for Saturday's GII Thoroughbred Club of America S. yesterday morning, going four furlongs in :47.60.

**Just as Well** (A.P. Indy) has been an "amazing surprise," says Sheppard. The six-year-old was bred by Strawbridge out of his outstanding producer No Matter What (Nureyev), the dam of MGISW Rainbow View (Dynaformer) and Winter View (Thunder Gulch), winner of this year's GIII Grey Goose Bewitch S. But the colt was beset by problems and was ultimately the subject of a cull by his owner.

"This horse hadn't broken his maiden, had some mystery unsoundness," Sheppard explained of the colt's three-year-old season. "I told [Mr. Strawbridge] that I would take him if he'd give him to me, and he said, 'I would appreciate that very much,' and he did. I turned him out for about six months in a big field and I brought him back in, really not knowing what to expect. We didn't know how good he was. We knew he had a big pedigree. He's gone from strength to strength, and it's just been amazing."

The dark bay has celebrated an outstanding season, with a win in the July 11 GIII Arlington H. prior to a runner-up effort behind Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) in the GI Arlington Million Aug. 8. In his most recent appearance, Just as Well crossed the line second in the GI Northern Dancer S. at Woodbine, but was awarded the victory upon the disqualification of Marsh Side (Gone West). The result is currently under appeal. Despite the success this season, Sheppard does not expect Just as Well to make the trip to California for the Breeders' Cup. He will instead return to Toronto for the GI Canadian International S. Oct. 17.

### *Mine That Bird Drills for the Goodwood...*

GI Kentucky Derby winner **Mine That Bird** (Birdstone) drilled five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 yesterday morning, his final serious piece of work ahead of Saturday's GI Goodwood S. at Santa Anita. "The horse worked really super," trainer Chip Woolley said Tuesday afternoon. "He got off kind of soft, and the early part of the work wasn't real fast, but when he turned for home he really shifted gears, and he really let out down lane. He actually galloped out faster than the six-furlong works. He gets over the track super." Woolley said Mine That Bird got his final eighth of a mile in :11 2/5 and he caught him galloping out three-quarters in 1:13 and change. Mine That Bird will be facing older horses for the first time in the Goodwood. The gelding will be making his first appearance since finishing third as the favorite in the GIII West Virginia Derby Aug. 1. The gelding was forced to miss the GI Travers S. Aug. 29 after undergoing throat surgery. Mine That Bird is to be reunited with Calvin Borel in the Goodwood.

**McPeek Bullish on Beautician...**

Trainer Ken McPeek, a three-time winner of the GI Darley Alcibiades S., issued an upbeat bulletin regarding his chances to pick up his fourth victory in the 1 1/16-mile race for two-year-old fillies this Friday. Winner of the Alcibiades last year with Dream Empress (Bernstein), McPeek will send out **Beautician** (Dehere), second to Hot Dixie Chick (Dixie Union) in the GIII Schuylerville and GI Spinway S. "I have two seconds and two thirds, and this is the most confident I have ever been going into the race," McPeek said. "[Beautician] has got a lot of talent and is very professional. I think she is better than all three that won this race. I know she is better than [2000 winner] She's a Devil Due (Devil His Due), and I don't know if Dream Empress could have gotten checks sprinting." McPeek's other Alcibiades winner was Keeneland specialist Take Charge Lady (Dehere), who won the race in 2001. The Alcibiades will be Beautician's first start over a synthetic surface.

**Mullins Seeks First Stakes Win at Keeneland...**

Southern California-based Jeff Mullins will have two prime opportunities to pick up his first black-type victory at Keeneland after deciding to point **Battle of Hastings (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}) and **Carlsbad** (Rocky Bar) toward a pair of graded events this Saturday at the Bluegrass racetrack. Battle of Hastings, a narrow winner of the GII Colonial Turf Cup and GII Virginia Derby, will tackle Grade I competition and older horses for the first time when he heads postward in the Shadwell Turf Mile S. Second in the GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 6, the colt was runner-up in the GIII American Turf S. on the Kentucky Oaks undercard in his lone previous start in the state. "He likes airplanes and travels well," said Mullins' assistant Ral Ayers. "We were thinking of the GIII Hawthorne Derby, but the owner lives just down the road here, and Carlsbad was coming here anyway. Nothing is firm yet, maybe [we'll go to] the Breeders' Cup, but this will give us a chance to see how he does against older horses." Carlsbad, an Arizona-bred who commenced her career by demolishing her overmatched competition at Turf Paradise, will compete east of her native state for the first time in the GII Thoroughbred Club of America S. The sophomore filly owns three graded victories in Southern California, including a track-record performance in the GIII Rancho Bernardo H. at Del Mar Sept. 4. "You never know about the quality of competition at Turf Paradise, but once we got her, it was pretty obvious she was an impressive horse," Ayers said. "There was really nothing that fit her in California, and that was a big consideration in coming here." Carlsbad is undefeated at the Thoroughbred Club of America's six-furlong distance.

"She ran a great race at York behind Dar Re Mi [GB] [Singspiel {Ire}] on ground that was on the quick side for her and the form has been franked, so she's the one they all have to beat. She's a filly that travels really well and stays well, but the most important thing is the ground."

**Back Again...**

Godolphin send out the G2 Queen Mary S. winner **Jealous Again** (Trippi) in Saturday's G3 Cornwallis S. at Ascot. Trainer Saeed bin Suroor said of the recent acquisition, who recorded a five-length success in the June 17 contest at the Royal meeting, "She's been working very well and is ready to start again--we're happy with her so far, and she has plenty of speed and a good turn-of-foot, so we're looking to see a good run from her."

**THE TROOPS RALLY**

There hasn't been an awful lot of good news in the breeding and sales sector of the horse business this year, so the fact that Tattersalls' October 1 yearling sale actually saw increases in the number catalogued, number sold and gross, and only a three-percent drop in average compared to last year's opening day, has to qualify as the best news of the sales year so far. I know Saratoga and Deauville held their own, but those are boutique sales, and actually both benefitted from attracting horses that might otherwise had been in other sales--Saratoga undoubtedly impacted Keeneland's September Book 1, and Deauville undoubtedly attracted, as it did last year, horses from Goffs. Tattersalls' October 1 did increase by 11 percent (610 catalogued last year, 676 this year), which was brave, and their opening day yesterday saw 14 percent more horses sold than last year, for 12 percent more money. A total of 23 yearlings sold for final bids of 200,000gns or more.

There are two striking, and connected, reasons for the success of this sale, certainly in relation to the rest of the yearling market this year. First, really, is sire power. That's what attracts buyers to the sales: the opportunity to buy yearlings by the best sires. October 1 has them, because it's the best sale in Europe, and Europe now has better sires--especially for Europeans--than Kentucky. Just look at the nine sires listed in the attached table; each of them had four or more sell yesterday, and the nine combined were responsible for 66 of the 151 yearlings sold--almost 40 percent. This is virtually a listing of most of the world's current top sires: **Sadler's Wells'** (Northern Dancer) final full crop; his sons **Galileo (Ire)** and **Montjeu (Ire)**; the five Danzig grandsons **Danehill Dancer (Ire)** and **Dansili (GB)** (both by Danehill); **Cape Cross (Ire)**, **Invincible Spirit (Ire)** and **Oasis Dream (GB)** (all by Green Desert); and, finally, **Pivotal (GB)** (Polar Falcon). All nine are Northern Dancer-line, by the way. Having 40 percent of the horses going through the ring by these kinds of sires is sure to attract the big buyers.

It also helps, bizarrely, that the two major camps now increasingly target different sires. Both sides will buy yearlings by the "neutral" Juddmonte sires Dansili and Oasis Dream, but otherwise Coolmore tends to stick to the Coolmore sires, while the Maktoum entities concentrate on their own emerging sires, like Cape Cross (six sold yesterday, with five to John Ferguson), and the two horses in which they bought a block of shares, Pivotal and Invincible Spirit. Obviously, both camps will also tend to support their other and younger sires.

The very strong October 1 catalogue, buttressed by a revised sale-race program embracing eight different races, attracted the two big camps in force. Last year three Maktoum entities--John Ferguson, Shadwell and Rabbah--signed for 106 (over 25 percent) of the 410 yearlings sold. Yesterday, the three entities signed for 40 yearlings--over 26 percent of those sold--for a total of 5,530,000gns, almost exactly one-third of the money spent. Demi O'Byrne and John Magnier signed for five yearlings each, totaling 2,440,000gns. So between the three Maktoum entities and the two Coolmore ticket-signers, the two biggest operations in the business accounted for 47 percent of the gross yesterday. What is also striking is that eight of the 23 yearlings (over a third) bought for 200,000gns or more went to seven buyers besides the Maktoums and Coolmore. Though there is a definite "ceiling" on prices--only three yearlings brought more than 350,000 gns--there was still significant demand, aside from the Maktoums and Coolmore, from plenty of other contenders at 200,000gns and more.

There may be plenty of yearlings by top sires, and prices may have held up remarkably well, but it still doesn't mean the sellers of the yearlings are making much money. Far from it. Only two of the nine proven sires listed in the attached table stood for less than £75,000 in 2007; Cape Cross stood for €50,000, and Oasis Dream for £30,000. Galileo may have averaged 200,500gns, and Sadler's Wells may have averaged 198,333gns, but the retail stud fees for both, though "private," were certainly in the neighborhood of what they averaged yesterday. Even in a market that was about as strong as one could hope for, when people are able to buy yearlings by top sires, the only good news for stallion managers is that breeders might be able to actually pay their stud fees. There is no justification in these numbers for maintaining stud fees anywhere near even their 2009 levels; just like American stud fees, European stud fees need to be cut in half.

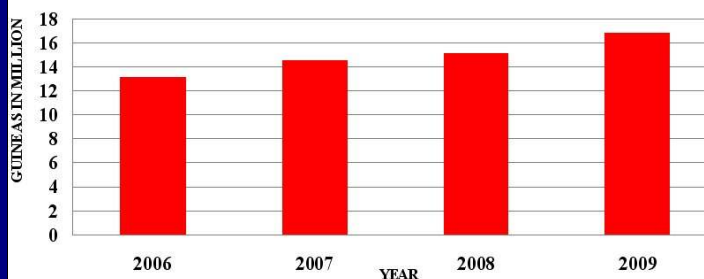
# Weekly Sales Ticker

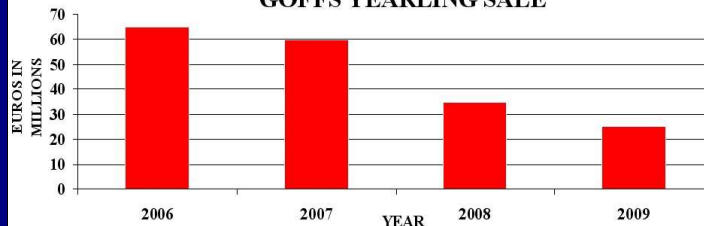
**TATTERSALLS OCT PART 1 DAY 1**

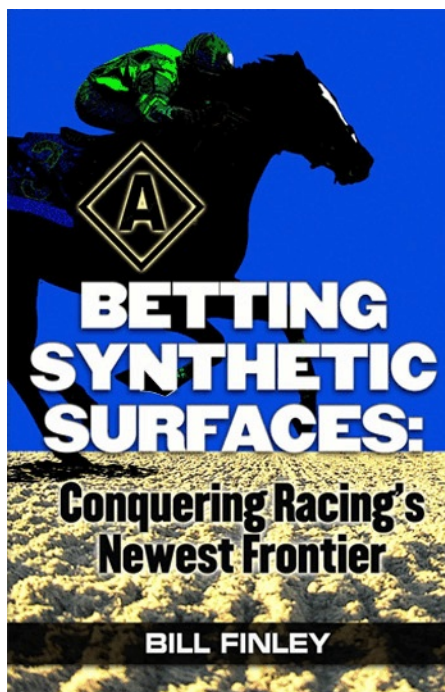
