## PAIR TOPS DAY 2 AT TATTS YEARLING SALE

Yesterday's penultimate session of the Tattersalls Book1 October Yearling Sale again produced a trade on a par with 12 months ago, with two lots matching the 2008 sale-topping price of 650,000gns (approximately \$1,085,175). The first to earn the distinction was [lot 282](#), a filly by Pivotal (GB), who was purchased by Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum's racing manager Angus Gold. Out of listed winner Briolette (GB) (Sadler's Wells), a half-sister to champion

Pilsudski (Ire) (Polish Precedent), she was sold from David and Diane Nagle's Barronstown Stud. Michael Goodbody, acting for a new client, was underbidder to Gold on the filly. "She comes from a very good stud, and is a lovely big scopey filly whose family keeps on producing," explained Gold. "Sheikh Hamdan was very keen on her, and we'll decide on a trainer once the sales are finished."

Shortly after, a full-brother to 2006 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Nighttime (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), bred by Dermot Weld's mother Gita and consigned through the Castlebridge Consignment, realized a 650,000gns final bid. Owner Sir Robert Ogden had to outbid, first the BBA Ireland's Eamonn Reilly, and finally John Magnier to get the Galileo colt. "We have a shortlist of 12-14 horses each day, and then find that some are buyable and some not," said Ogden's racing manager Barry Simpson. "We are not looking for any particular type of horse and have seen colts and fillies. We just want racehorses, and this fellow looks like he could be the real deal." According to Simpson, a decision as to a trainer has still to be decided. "We've made no plan about where he'll go into training, we'll let the dust settle once we've seen what we've finished up with after the sale, and then Sir Robert will make his decisions," said Simpson. **Cont. p2**

## GOLDIKOVA GETS GREEN LIGHT

Freddy Head yesterday confirmed **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) on course for a return to Santa Anita to defend her GI Breeders' Cup Mile crown. Following her reversal when only third in Saturday's G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp, the Wertheimer homebred was reported to have suffered no ill-effects by her conditioner. Head told *PA Sport*, "She is fine and has come out of the race well. We have checked her over and nothing is wrong--she is fine. It was a bad race, as she was drawn out wide and had to use a lot of energy to get to the front. She was pushed wide at one point, and Peslier had to choose whether to go on or pull her back. He decided to go on, and that may have been the wrong decision. She is well, and I think that she will go to America."

Coolmore's spending yesterday when selling to John Magnier for 550,000gns. Charlie Gordon-Watson was the underbidder on the colt, who was offered from the Meon Valley Stud consignment. Representing Sheikh Mohammed yesterday was John Ferguson, who bought a dozen

lots for for the operation for a gross of 12,410,000gns. The pick of them was another Meon Valley Stud offering, [lot 257](#), a filly by Dubawi (Ire) out of Bella Lambada (GB) (Lammtarra). Ferguson paid 460,000gns for the filly, for whom Luke Lillingston--standing with owner Olivia Hoare--was the underbidder. "Dubawi's made a fantastic start with the likes of Poet's Voice (GB) and Sand Vixen (GB), and we're excited by him," explained Ferguson. "But, on top of that, this was a beautiful athletic filly from one of the best families in the book. We thought she'd be one of the highlights of the week."

Michael Goodbody collected three lots on the afternoon, including [lot 269](#), a Pivotal (GB) half-brother to Fantasia (GB). Secured for 450,000gns, the bay--out of Blue Symphony (GB) (Darshaan {GB})--will race for owner Thomas Barr. "He just ticked the boxes on everything," said Goodbody. "He was a great mover, was an

athletic horse with a great pedigree, and is out of a young mare who has already produced some good horses. I'm not sure who will train him."

Acting on behalf of David and Patricia Thompson's Cheveley Park Stud, managing director Chris Richardson bought four fillies, including [lot 427](#), a daughter of Ballyhane Stud stallion Captain Rio (GB)

(Pivotal). Secured for 400,000gns, the filly--who was produced on a cover of just €6,000 in 2007--is a half-sister to G1 Phoenix S. winner Alfred Nobel (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). The filly, from the family of New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), was offered from breeder Seamus Burns' Lodge Park Stud. Richardson saw off New Approach's trainer Jim Bolger for the filly.

"We are trying to look to the future with our broodmare band and were keen to get into a family such as that," said Richardson. "Alfred Nobel is very useful, and won his race on his side in the sales race at the weekend. We've also got the link with Pivotal through his son Captain Rio, and Mr. and Mrs. Thompson will decide this evening on a trainer."

At the conclusion of Wednesday second session, the average price of 114,030gns was three percent short of last year's figure, while the median of 75,000gns was down by nine percent from 2008. Yesterday's gross turnover of 19,271,000gns rose by 12 percent, and the 82-percent clearance rate was identical to last year. **Washington Monument...**

Tattersalls' Newmarket sale ring has rarely been as packed in recent years as when [lot 405](#) went under the hammer at 6:35 p.m. Wednesday night. The only living foal by George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) had huge rarity value, although those thinking the price tag might go into seven figures, would end up disappointed. The hammer fell at 320,000gns. The filly, out of Flawlessly (Fr) (Rainbow Quest), had been bought as a foal at Goffs last year for €280,000 by yesterday's vendor, Gerard Burke of Glidawn Stud. Eamonn Reilly of BBA Ireland and Crispin de Moubay-- standing with the Newsells Park Stud team--both vied for her, but it was agent Ross Doyle who signed for the bay. Charlie Gordon-Watson was the immediate underbidder. Buckinghamshire-based owner Julie Wood, who won the recent Goffs Millions race with Lucky General (Ire) (Hawk Wing), will send the filly to join trainer Richard Hannon. Cont. p4

"This a very special filly," said Wood, whose husband Chris works in the medical research industry. "Buying something like her is always in the back of your mind as you go around the sale and, although that's obviously a lot of money I thought she might have made even more--we were shouting for the auctioneer to bring his hammer down!" Wood, who has owned horses with Hannon for 10 years, currently has 22 horses in training. "We don't normally look at these type of horses very often--or in fact ever," explained the trainer's son, Richard Jr. "We've stepped it up with this filly and she is totally unique. I didn't think we would get her--she represents an awful lot of value." Wood added, "She's a one off, there's no other one like her and I wanted to be with her all of the way. We'll have a good look at her pedigree and try to come up with a special name for her. And, although we decided after our Gilded (Ire) (Redback {GB}) won the G2 Queen Mary S. that we'd just race horses and wouldn't breed, at the same time maybe we will now review that again."

**Sweet Sounds at Tattersalls...**

Newmarket trainer Luca Cumani and his wife Sara were among the successful sellers at Tattersalls yesterday, selling a well-connected Pivotal (GB) colt for

450,000gns to Michael Goodbody, acting for Scottish owner Thomas Barr. "We're thrilled with the price," said Sara Cumani, who commended the job done by consignor Highclere Stud. "Highclere are very professional at doing that and they have done a fantastic job with him." The March-born youngster was bred locally at the Cumanis' Fittocks Stud and offered through Lady Carolyn and John Warren's operation. A

half-brother to this season's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches third Fantasia (GB) (Sadler's Wells), the bay caught the eye of several other buyers, including agent Suzanne Roberts and underbidder John Ferguson. Sara Cumani admitted that it was with mixed emotions that they had decided to send the colt to the sale. "Having sold Fantasia [to George Strawbridge while in training] well, we were originally not going to sell anything out of the mare, Blue Symphony (GB) (Darshaan {GB}), we were going to retain everything we bred ourselves," said Sara Cumani. "But from a financial point of view, you just can't hold on to everything when you look at the nomination costs."

Blue Symphony, a winning daughter of the swift Blue Duster (Danzig), was acquired as a four-year-old for 250,000gns at Tattersalls December. In foal to Cape Cross (Ire) at the time, the resulting filly-- Blue Rhapsody (GB)--sold as a juvenile at Tattersalls Autumn for 60,000gns. Her 2006 filly by Sadler's Wells, Fantasia, carried Ronchalon's colors to victory in the G3 Prestige S. and was runner-up to Rainbow View (Dynaformer) in the G1 Fillies Mile last fall before being sold privately to George Strawbridge. "We originally bought the mare with Charlie Gordon-Watson for an owner, but he needed to sell," explained Sara Cumani. "We liked her, because we had a lot of luck with Puce (GB), who is by Darshaan (GB), and--like her--this mare is tiny and very Puce-like." The mare--one of 14 owned by Fittocks Stud--has a Nayef colt foal this year and is in foal to Galileo (Ire). "Because the mare is so small, she has been to big stallions like Nayef and Pivotal to try and produce something with a bit of size," added Cumani. "We sold her filly Pink Symphony (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) last year [for 400,000gns], but that was before Fantasia had achieved what she had, and if we'd known that we'd have probably tried to keep her. I hope we get another filly out of the mare."

**De-Voute Following at Tattersalls...**

Consignor Ted Voute has plenty to thank William Haggas for this season with his October Book 1 consignment containing half-siblings to that trainer's two Group 1 winners, Aqlaam (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and King's Apostle (Ire) (King's Best). For added value, both yearlings are by hot sire Cape Cross (Ire), responsible for last weekend's Arc winner Sea The Stars (Ire). [Lot 275](#), out of the unraced Rainbow Quest mare Bourbonella (GB), was knocked down to Shadwell Estate Company for

300,000gns. The Feb. 22 foal was offered by Voute Sales, acting on behalf of the filly's breeders David and Dawn Hearson of Granham Farm. Previously, Voute also sold Aqlaam to Shadwell as a foal for 260,000gns and Bourbonella's half-siblings Classic Punch (Ire) (Mozart {Ire}), Grand Bahama (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}) and Wadmaan (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}), who fetched 800,000gns as a yearling. "We know how fortunate we are to have sold this filly so well," said David Hearson, who bought Bourbonella as a yearling. "There are a lot of nice horses at the sales that aren't making money. We're also lucky to have had such support from Shadwell." Aqlaam's full-brother--by Oasis Dream (GB)--now two, fetched €280,000 at last year's Arqana August sale and Bourbonella is now back in foal to that sire with a colt by his sire Green Desert at foot. "They saw Aqlaam as a foal and loved him," said Voute. "He was the top-priced Oasis Dream at the foal sales. Aqlaam was a beautiful foal and the mare is becoming a real blue hen." Giving the nod to Haggas, Voute conceded that the operations major catalogue updates have all come from the Haggass yard this year. Voute's final-day draft includes King's Apostle's half-brother and a full-brother to the dual G1 Nunthorpe S. winner Borderlescott (GB) (Compton Place {GB}).

The Hearsons have eight mares at their 80-acre farm in Marlborough, several of which are owned in partnership with David's twin brother, Paul. The brothers also have a homebred two-year-old Cape Cross colt in training with Haggas, and will be sending a Motivator (GB) (Montjeu {GB}) yearling to Harry Dunlop. "Bourbonella is certainly our star mare at the moment, but my intention is for her to be one of several stars," said Hearson. "I've had a lifelong interest in racing, but we've only been involved in the industry for 10 years. We have a fantastic girl, Leila Nairne, running the stud for us. She's very competent and she tells us what to do. My wife works with her, and I do a bit of tractor work."

**Meon Valley Broodmare Goes Out With a Bang...**

A Montjeu (Ire) half-brother to three Group 1 winners from one of the most celebrated families in the studbook is always likely to cause a stir when passing through the ring, and the Meon Valley Stud colt ([lot 315](#)) had the swagger to match his illustrious pedigree. While his siblings Kayf Tara (GB) and Opera House (GB), both by Montjeu's sire Sadler's Wells, raced for Sheikh Mohammed, this colt is likely to appear in the dark blue livery of Susan Magnier, having been purchased by her husband John for 550,000gns. The colt's appearance on the second day at Tattersalls marked the end of an era, for he is the last foal of the outstanding broodmare Colorspin (Fr) (High Top {Ire}), whose dam Reprocolor (GB) was the cornerstone of the Weinfeld family's bloodstock empire and died last year at the age of 32. **Cont. p6**

“Colorspin is retired out in the paddock now and enjoying life,” reflected Meon Valley Stud manager David Wymbs. “We wanted a filly, as he was her last foal, but that’s the way it goes.”

“He is an exceptional individual,” Wymbs continued. “A lot of people would have knocked him because he was out of an old mare--she was 25 when she had him --but he’s done so well and thrived. He has a lot of his sire’s traits. He’s a character, but a controllable one, and I think he’s going to be a great racehorse.

Colorspin was such a good broodmare that you never want to stop breeding from her, but you have to draw the line somewhere.” The stud has just one active daughter of Reprocolor remaining: Colorvista (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}), whose Shamardal colt ([lot 316](#)) went through the ring directly after Colorspin’s and was bought by John Ferguson for 50,000gns. Colorvista is currently in foal to Hurricane Run (Ire).

Ferguson also helped make the second day of Book 1 a profitable one for Meon Valley when buying a Dubawi (Ire) filly out of Reprocolor’s granddaughter Bella Lambada (GB) ([lot 257](#)) for 460,000gns; and a Red Ransom son of G1 Yorkshire Oaks runner-up Dash to the Top (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) ([lot 344](#)) for 320,000gns. “It would have been lovely to have kept the Dubawi filly, but she made so much money, we had to let her go,” Wymbs commented. “We have so many mares and six fillies from this year’s crop of foals that we’d like to keep hold of next year, but it’s a case of trying to keep the numbers under control. Ideally, we like to have around 35 or 36 mares.”

Having been at Meon Valley for 18 years, Wymbs has a unique relationship with the broodmare band. “I’ve foaled every mare that’s on the place now except Colorspin,” he said proudly. “We’re now on the fifth generation of Reprocolor, and that’s a lifetime’s work for the Weinfelds--it’s a privilege to be involved with them and with such high-quality horses.”

Meon Valley could have even more highlights today. During the final session of the auction, the stud sells a colt by Pivotal (GB) from G1 Juddmonte International winner One So Wonderful (GB) (Nashwan) ([lot 636](#)) and one by Motivator (GB) out of her sister One So Marvelous (GB) (Nashwan) ([lot 635](#)). Also selling is a colt by Red Ransom from the G1 Sun Chariot S. winner Kissogram (GB) (Caerleon) ([lot 496](#)). All are descendants of One in a Million (Ire). “We’ve got some very interesting colts for the last day, especially the Pivotal,” said Wymbs. “For a late foal, he’s really well-developed and he has so much power. I can’t even begin to keep up with him when he’s walking. I think he’ll finish our sale off with a bit of a bang.”

## NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



### AG APPROPRIATIONS REPORT INCLUDES GAO STUDY

Progress on the Fiscal Year 2010 Agriculture Appropriations bill continues this week as the U.S. House of Representatives prepares to consider the conference report that was approved last week by the conferees of both Congressional chambers.

A provision that continues to de-fund USDA inspectors for horse meat, thereby extending the current de facto ban on horse slaughter, is included in the report. It also contains language for the [Government Accountability Office \(GAO\)](#) to study the economic impact this “ban” has had on state and local governments and animal protection organizations. Senate conferees are Appropriations Chairman Daniel Inouye (D-HI), Sen. Richard Shelby (R-AL) and the [Senate Agriculture Appropriations Subcommittee](#). House conferees include Agriculture Appropriations Committee Chairman David Obey (D-WI) and Subcommittee Chairwoman Rosa DeLauro (D-CT).

The overall Agriculture Appropriations bill would provide \$23.5 billion in discretionary spending (\$2.7 billion more than the 2009 bill) and cover \$97.3 billion in mandatory spending (compared to \$87.8 billion in 2009). Most of the mandatory money goes for the supplemental nutrition assistance program (formerly known as food stamps) and farm subsidies.

**Carroll Takes Shot at Alcibiades With Quick Breeze...**

Trainer David Carroll, who will send out Acoma (Empire Maker) in Saturday's GI First Lady S. at Keeneland, hopes to get the weekend started off the right way when he saddles **Quick Breeze** (Ghostzapper) in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. a day earlier. The two-year-old filly, a \$425,000 KEESEP purchase by My Meadowview Farm, comes off a 3 3/4-length victory over the Polytrack at Arlington Park Sept. 11 ([video](#)). That race was at a mile. In her first start, back on July 5, Quick Breeze was a well-beaten fourth going six furlongs at Churchill Downs. "She is an interesting filly," Carroll said. "The first time she ran, it was in the slop at Churchill, and she really ran two races in one. She did not like the mud at all and did not do any running until the last quarter mile, when she got in the clear and closed well, even though the chart doesn't show it. She's a small filly and was a little immature, so we gave her the summer off." Quick Breeze has two published works since her maiden score. She breezed four furlongs in :49 3/5 at Churchill Sept. 28, then came back to post a :48 2/5 drill under the Twin Spires Oct. 4. On Friday, Quick Breeze will break from post position 11. Corey Lanerie will be aboard for the first time. "There is a lot of speed in there, and I know she will close," Carroll said. "I wish we were a little more to the inside, but I know she will drop back and Corey should be able to save ground. There is no pressure on us." Quick Breeze has the pedigree to be a runner. She is the first foal from the eight-year-old MGSW Quick Temper (A.P. Indy), a daughter of GISW Halo America (Waquoit) and a sister to MGISP Marino Marini (Storm Cat).



**RACING Round-Up**

**Rachel Settles In at Churchill Downs...**

Leading Horse of the Year candidate **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) returned to Churchill Downs Wednesday morning. The GI Kentucky Oaks, GI Preakness S. and GI Haskell S. heroine had been stabled at Saratoga since her epic win against older males in the GI Woodward S. Labor Day weekend. "She walked the shed [row] this morning," trainer Steve Asmussen revealed. "It was a little cool here, but it feels great. She's in her stall resting comfortably." The conditioner continued, "We're just trying to keep her happy. I'm very pleased with her attitude and her weight and how she's doing. I think the time in Saratoga with everything gone was very beneficial to her. It just took a lot of the pressure off."

**Pimpernel On Course for Trophy Bid...**

**Elusive Pimpernel** (Elusive Quality) was yesterday reported to be firing on all cylinders as he heads to the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster Oct. 24. Successful in the G3 Acomb S. at York when last seen Aug. 18, the Windflower Overseas Holdings homebred was one of 70 entries remaining for the mile contest at the latest forfeit stage. "The plan is certainly for Elusive Pimpernel to run in the Racing Post Trophy, barring accidents," said Marcus Hosgood, racing secretary to trainer John Dunlop. "He's fine at the moment and he did his first piece since the Acomb S. last Friday. He worked again on Tuesday morning, and it's so far, so good with him." Elusive Pimpernel was making it two wins from two starts last time, where subsequent listed winner Emerald Commander (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) was second and G2 Champagne S. winner Poet's Voice (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) was back in third. "The form of his York victory looks absolutely cast-iron, and it looks likely that he would enjoy the step up to a mile," Hosgood added. "He has won on good and fast going, but I would be hopeful that we might get a bit of cut in the ground at Doncaster--racing over a mile on easier ground should be ideal for him. I know it's a bit of a cliché, but we will take one step at a time before deciding where to aim him next year."

**Noseda Slams Longchamp Starter...**

Jeremy Noseda openly criticized the Longchamp starter after the defeat of **Fleeting Spirit (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye. Following the debacle that occurred in that race 12 months ago when the Searchers Syndicate's star filly was left in the gates after her stall failed to open, her trainer bemoaned the circumstances that surrounded the latest renewal. "Fleeting Spirit tried hard on Sunday--it was another brave effort," Noseda said of the runner-up. "She is a consistent and classy performer. I would not say much more, other than I'm disgusted at the French starter and the lack of helpfulness towards a filly whose problems in the loading procedure have been caused by a malfunction of the French starting stalls at last year's Abbaye. On this occasion, they ignored our request on when and how to load her. I feel the lack of helpfulness contributed to her defeat. She is back home now, and we will head next to the Breeders' Cup [Turf Sprint] with her."

The GI Coaching Club American Oaks, traditionally held at Belmont Park, will shift to Saratoga on opening weekend, pending approval from the NYRA Board of Directors. "Going into this year's Saratoga meet, we predicted that wagering would decline approximately five percent from last year--we greatly exceeded those expectations," said NYRA President & CEO Charles Hayward. "The expansion to

four racing days was a measured decision that reflects the overwhelming demand for racing that we have from horsemen in Saratoga." This reflects the high demand for quality racing at Saratoga and is a very positive indicator for expanding the 2010 meet."
