## BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

### Twice Over Likely to Join Cecil's BC Team

Juddmonte Farms' **Twice Over (GB)** (Observatory), who garnered a belated first Group 1 success in Saturday's G1 Champion S. at Newmarket, is inching ever closer to a ticket for next month's Breeders' Cup meet. The Henry Cecil trainee may join stablemates **Midday (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) (F/M Turf), winner of the G1 Nassau S., and Marathon probable **Father Time (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) aboard the flight for Santa Anita. He will be pointed towards the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic. "Twice Over is in very good form and he'll, hopefully, go to America in very good form as well," Khalid Abdullah's racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *Racing Post*. "He hasn't raced on an artificial surface before, but I don't think that would be a great concern, and we wouldn't be taking him unless we thought he could run a big race. At the moment, I'd say that Tom [Queally] will ride Twice Over and Midday, with Eddie Ahern on Father Time."

### Lahaleeb a Breeders' Cup Possible

Trainer Mick Channon has reported **Lahaleeb (Ire)** (Redback {GB}) to be none the worse for her exertions after winning Saturday's G1 E.P. Taylor S. at Woodbine, and indicated next month's Breeders' Cup meet at Santa Anita as one possible target for his star distaffer. "Lahaleeb's taken the race good and we're very pleased the way she has come out of it," Channon said. "She'll arrive back later this week and we'll then decide if we want to go to the Breeders' Cup or not. She's always been a very good filly, but was unlucky [when second] in the [G1] Irish 1000 Guineas because she was in front too long that day, and that didn't help her. As long as the ground is good she's a good filly who's done nothing wrong and has improved with time. I don't think travelling will be a problem with her so I'm not worried about that. If needs be, we've got a few weeks to decide what to do and, if she doesn't go to the Breeders' Cup, there are plenty of other options such as Hong Kong in December."

### GUINEAS HEROINE GHANAATI RETIRED

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's dual Group 1 victress **Ghanaati** (Giant's Causeway--Sarayir, by Mr. Prospector) has been retired to the paddocks, according to *Racing Post*. The Barry Hills-trained sophomore, who made two Kempton polytrack starts as a juvenile, made her turf debut in the May 3 G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket and scorched the Rowley Mile track with a scintillating performance. Better was to come in the June 19 G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot, where she broke the track record and dismissed the G1 Irish 1000

Guineas winner **Again (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), and the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine **Elusive Wave (Ire)** (Elusive City). The vanquished in that stellar contest also included subsequent top-level winners **Rainbow View** (Dynaformer) and **Lahaleeb (Ire)** (Redback {GB}). She also hit the board in her two final starts, finishing third in the July 29 G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood and second in the Oct. 3 G1 Sun Chariot S. back at Newmarket. The bay homebred, who is slated to join her owner's broodmare band at Beech House Stud in Newmarket, retires with a career record of 6-3-1-2 and earnings of £461,712. "Ghanaati was an exceptional filly," regular jockey Richard Hills told the trade daily. "I've been very fortunate in that I've been associated with some very high-class milers, but she's the best I've ridden over that trip. She was awesome at [Royal] Ascot."

### LOOK HERE FUTURE IN DOUBT

Julian Richmond Watson's homebred **Look Here (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}) may have run her last race, according to *Racing Post*. Last year's G1 Epsom Oaks heroine has not prevailed since that Classic win and produced a lackluster display when seventh in Saturday's G1 E.P. Taylor S. at Woodbine. "I don't know whether we'll see her again next season," admitted conditioner Ralph Beckett. "No decision has yet been made, but the owner has his own small stud at home and at some point she will go back there. It's possible that now is the time for that to happen, but I won't know for another week."

Ante-post G1 Epsom Derby favorite **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), winner of the Sept. 27 G2 Beresford S. at The Curragh, heads a cast of 22 possibles for this Saturday's G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster following yesterday's forfeit stage. He is one of six entries from Aidan O'Brien's Ballydoyle base and is the most likely candidate according to the trainer. "The plan at the moment is to run St Nicholas Abbey, and he looks like being our main runner," O'Brien told

*Racing Post*. "We'll probably run something else in the race, and we'll see closer to the time. We've been happy with St Nicholas Abbey since his [Beresford] run at the Curragh." Other notable entries include Lawrie Inman's **Coordinated Cut (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who will be partnered by comeback jockey Kieren Fallon. He already boasts course-and-distance form, having earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"**

☆ status in a Sept. 10 maiden, and will be joined by fellow Peter Chapple-Hyam trainee **Morana (Ire)** (Alhaarth {Ire}), winner of the Oct. 10 Autumn S. at Ascot. "Both of them will run," Chapple-Hyam told the trade daily. "The owners both want to have a go, although it looks like it's the hottest two-year-old race of the year. I couldn't have found an easier race. Coordinated Cut is a horse I like a lot, everyone knows that, but he's got to do it on the racetrack. He is still a big baby and too short a price [12-1] for a Derby, because the form of the race he won has been awful. Morana is a good horse too, he's got the form and the other horse hasn't. Both horses go on any ground, but both wouldn't want it too soft." Another ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ with an invite to the party is Godolphin's **Al Zir** (Medaglia d'Oro), who won a seven-furlong conditions event at Doncaster Sept. 11. Trainer Saeed bin Suroor also has **Al Ghazal** (Motivator {GB}) still engaged.

Koko Mambo, left alone on the lead, carried his speed throughout to deliver an impressive eight-length romp in the second leg of Peru's Quadruple Crown series, stamping himself among the nation's leading three-year-old colts on the dirt. Sent to the front by Carlos Javier Herrera, Koko Mambo dictated the pace, increased his advantage down the backstretch and drew clear late to record his first black-type victory. Unbeaten juvenile and G1 Clasico Polla de Potrillos (Peruvian 2000 Guineas) runner-up Precursor (Spend One Dolar) finished a distant ninth in the 14-horse field. Runner-up to Precursor in the Listed Clasico Carlos II Watson & F.G. Watson Mar. 29, Koko Mambo exited a ninth-placed effort in the Guineas after previously capturing his first two starts as a sophomore by a combined 14 3/4 lengths over shorter trips on dirt.

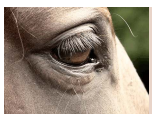

In what has become a buyers' market, vendors of yearlings and weanlings are discovering to their cost that prospective purchasers can be extremely choosy. It's not just the individual which has to impress--the catalogue page must also be free of any weak or unfashionable areas, or it will probably be penalised. Ultimately mare owners are going to have to reassess whether their mares meet today's requirements, with the end result likely to be widespread culling.

Before breeders take any drastic action, though, they should remember that the odd seemingly weak area of a pedigree isn't necessarily an obstacle to producing a top winner, as two of the weekend's Grade I races illustrated.

Hot Cha Cha, winner of the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup, and Lahaleeb, winner of the GI E.P. Taylor S., both have exceptionally good fourth dams, Hot Cha Cha's being the famous Phipps mare Clear Ceiling and Lahaleeb's being Cheveley Park Stud's blue hen Exclusive Order.

Unfortunately, the intervening generations of these Grade I-winning fillies' pedigrees have been less impressive, to the extent that both fillies are daughters of comparatively cheap stallions. Hot Cha Cha was conceived when her sire Cactus Ridge stood for \$6,500 and Lahaleeb when her sire Redback was available for €4,500.

And that's not all. Lahaleeb's dam Flames was sold for only 2,200gns as an unraced two-year-old in 2000, her price reflecting the fact that she was by Blushing Flame. This very well-connected horse gained his only group success over a mile and three-quarters as a five-year-old. Needless to say, Flames has proved a shrewd purchase, with her value subsequently being boosted both by her own efforts and those of her dam Dancing Debut and of Dancing Debut's half-sister Virtuous (dam of the G2 Coventry S. winner Iceman and of this year's G1 Lockinge S. winner Virtual).

Hot Cha Cha's second dam, the Private Account mare Long Term, was sold for \$45,000 in 1999 while carrying Hot Cha Cha's dam Reduced Sentence.

While this doesn't sound like a bargain basement price, it is when you remember that Long Term was in foal to Broad Brush, whose 1999 fee was \$60,000. In other words, the mare was virtually given away, and when Long Term came on the market again at Keeneland's 2003 January Sale, her price was a mere \$2,500 and her destination Chile.

In brief, we are therefore dealing with two Grade I winners, one out of a mare which once changed hands for 2,200gns, the other with a second dam who once sold for \$2,500. No doubt there will be many more stories like these to come in a few years time, when the Thoroughbred market inevitably picks up. The breeding stock sales will likely be painful for the majority, but there are sure to be plenty of bargains available to anyone with sufficient nerve and foresight.

Hot Cha Cha's owner-breeder Nelson McMakin explained to the *Blood-Horse* back in March how Cactus Ridge came to be selected as a mate for Reduced Sentence:

"It was an economical stallion season that I liked; there was no scientific reason to do it," he said.

There might almost have been reasons not to do it, on the score of soundness. Reduced Sentence's racing career was restricted to just two starts, apparently by injury, and it was a similar story with Cactus Ridge, whose career came to a premature end after only four appearances. **Cont. p6**

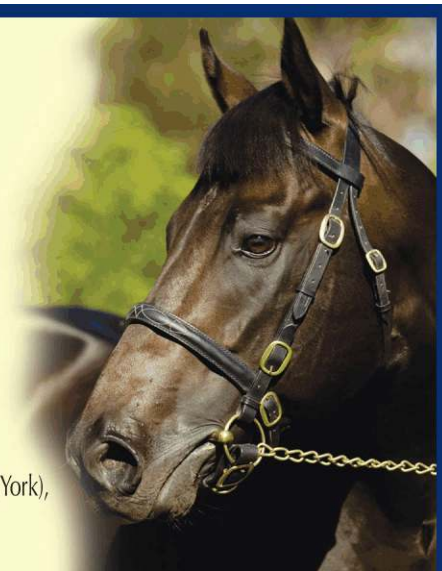

Fortunately Hot Cha Cha has proved much more durable than her parents and was having her 10th race of the year, and 11th in all, when she triumphed at Keeneland.

Cactus Ridge raced for his breeder, country music superstar Toby Keith, after he failed to reach his reserve both as a yearling and as a two-year-old. Anyone who came close to bidding the reserve was soon made to regret their caution. The son of Hennessy started out with a maiden victory over 4½ furlongs at Arlington Park before going in search of minor stakes success at Canterbury Park and Ellis Park. He trotted up by 15 lengths in Minnesota and by more than six lengths in northern Kentucky, to attract attention from bloodstock agents. The story goes that Keith turned down a seven-figure offer for his homebred a week before Cactus Ridge extended his unbeaten sequence to four when giving weight and a decisive beating to his rivals in the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity over a mile on Sept. 27.

The next step was to be the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, a race won two years earlier by Johannesburg, another unbeaten Hennessy colt, but Cactus Ridge never made it to Santa Anita. An injury to his right knee was discovered after a workout and an announcement quickly followed that he had been retired. The compilers of the Experimental Free Handicap allotted him 115 lbs, 11 lbs below the co-top weights Action This Day, Cuvee and Ruler's Court.

Hennessy was another who did not race after the age of two, but he didn't stand his first season until he was four, whereas Cactus Ridge retired immediately and covered over 100 mares as a three-year-old. Hot Cha Cha is comfortably his finest achievement so far, from three crops of racing age, but there are four other 2009 stakes winners by him.

I was always interested in Cactus Ridge, on the grounds that he was bred along similar lines to Juddmonte's top-class filly Nebraska Tornado. This winner of the G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix du Moulin is by Hennessy's sire Storm Cat and both she and Cactus Ridge are out of Lycius mares inbred 4x3 to Northern Dancer. Nebraska Tornado and Cactus Ridge therefore had three lines of Northern Dancer (and so does Nebraska Tornado's half-sister Comic Marvel, a very impressive debut winner at Belmont two days ago. Comic Marvel is also inbred 3x3 to Mr. Prospector.)

To get back to Hot Cha Cha, she is out of a Broad Brush mare. I was a fully paid-up member of the Broad Brush fan club during his racing career, when he demonstrated tremendous toughness, combined with enough talent to win four times at Grade I level. I was also a fan of Broad Brush the stallion. Without ever having huge numbers on his side, he proved an admirably consistent stallion with the ability to sire a high proportion of stakes winners.

His largely outcross pedigree also led me to believe that he had the makings of a first-rate broodmare sire, as it contained no Northern Dancer, Native Dancer or Bold Ruler blood, just 3x3 inbreeding to Turn-to. His eldest daughters are 20 years old this year, yet they had only one Grade I winner to their credit--the excellent Dreaming of Anna--prior to this year.

Perhaps they are about to make up for lost time, as Hot Cha Cha follows the GI Pacific Classic winner Richard's Kid as their second Grade I winner of 2009. There could well be more Grade I winners to come, as there are three Grade II winners among the other 2009 stakes performers out of Broad Brush mares, as well as the very promising turf two-year-old Interactif.

I mentioned earlier that Hot Cha Cha has an exceptionally good fourth dam in Clear Ceiling. This sister to the two-time champion sire What a Pleasure was a daughter of the brilliant broodmare Grey Flight. She contributed to family fortunes by producing the 1000 Guineas winner Quick As Lightning, plus Hot Cha Cha's talented third dam, Infinite.

Clear Ceiling also passed on her talent as a broodmare to her daughter Pure Profit, who produced the Grade I-winning fillies Inside Information and Educated Risk. Inside Information is now known as the dam of the top filly Smuggler. With Private Account as her sire and a daughter of Clear Ceiling as her dam, Inside Information was a three-parts sister to Hot Cha Cha's second dam Long Term, the mare who left for Chile after being sold for \$2,500.

## TDN OPEN FORUM



While our signature industry continues to exit the Commonwealth, our Republican leaders in the Senate continue to insist on playing politics with the future of the Thoroughbred business in Kentucky. For the last few years, Senate Republicans led by Senate President David Williams have steadfastly opposed a constitutional amendment to allow expanded gaming opportunities at Kentucky's racetracks. Their longstanding opposition has allowed our competitor states to establish racing and breeding programs subsidized by expanded gaming, and those states have put us at an enormous competitive disadvantage. We are losing race horses, stallions, mares and a significant number of jobs to those states, and we are in danger of seeing major farms shutter their operations and move to friendlier jurisdictions.

As a final insult to our signature industry, Sen. Williams did not even bother to bring legislation that would have allowed VLTs at Kentucky race tracks for a full vote of the Senate. After the bill passed the House it was promised a fair hearing in the Senate, but was instead sent to a committee where the chairman declared it dead before testimony was even heard.

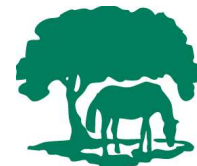
So after years of outright neglect and hostility toward an industry that employs 100,000 Kentuckians, it appears that Senate Republicans are beginning to feel the heat from their constituents. As almost 70 percent of Kentuckians support putting VLTs at racetracks, and as their Senate majority has shrunk with the loss of two straight special elections, one would hope that Senate Republicans would finally listen to the majority of Kentuckians by supporting legislation to put our industry on a level competitive playing field. But sadly, it appears that Senate Republicans will continue to play political games with the livelihoods of so many hard-working Kentuckians.

The word around Frankfort is that Senate leadership is preparing to offer up the old idea of putting forth a constitutional amendment to permit gaming at Kentucky racetracks. This sounds great on the surface, but, as usual in politics, there is more to it than meets the eye. First, a constitutional amendment is unnecessary, and Sen. Williams has already conceded this point. Allowing VLTs at racetracks is already constitutional, as affirmed by two recent Attorney General Opinions. Sen. Williams agreed that a constitutional amendment is not required to put VLTs at racetracks. So why then are they preparing to support a constitutional amendment? Politics.

Senate Republicans are struggling to retain their majority, and several of their members are facing tough re-election fights next November. It seems that Senate leadership has made the cynical decision to try and put expanded gaming on the ballot in an effort to drive up social conservative turnout in the next election cycle, hoping that the increased turnout will help their Senate candidates, in much the same manner that the gay marriage amendment helped Republican candidates a few years ago.

Never mind that a constitutional amendment is not necessary. Never mind that it could not be voted on until November 2010, and then if it passed, could not be implemented until late 2011--costing Kentucky jobs and doing further damage to our industry in the mean time. Never mind that out-of-state casinos will pour in tens of millions of dollars to defeat an amendment, and will once again make Senate Republicans the biggest defenders of out-of-state casinos. Never mind that the time for an amendment has come and gone, and that the industry desperately needs immediate statutory action.

None of these things matter, because it is clear that Senate Republican leadership is not really interested in helping the horse industry. Rather, they are only interested in helping themselves, by trying to hold onto whatever power they can in Frankfort. Senate Republicans seem determined to play political games with thousands of Kentuckians' livelihoods, and their retention of power and privilege has trumped all else. It is truly disheartening that a handful of Senators have decided that retaining their political power is more important than helping our entire state, helping our signature industry and protecting the jobs of 100,000 Kentuckians.

As a lifelong Republican, I am hopeful that rank and file members of the Senate caucus will rise up against their cynical leadership, and act in the best interest of Kentucky by supporting an immediate statutory solution that will enable our signature industry to fairly compete with our out-of-state competition.

### City Zip Filly Tops New York Sale:

A weanling filly by City Zip ([hip 4](#)) attracted a final bid of \$55,000 to top Sunday's New York Breeders' Sales Company Fall Breeding Stock Sale. The weanling, consigned by Waldorf Farm, agent, was purchased by Buzz Chace as agent for West Point Thoroughbreds. She is out of Capote's Tune (Capote), a half-sister to graded-stakes winner Parisian Flight (Concorde's Bound) and multiple stakes winner Concorde's Tune (Concorde's Bound). There were 219 horses catalogued and, of the 148 horses through the ring, only 58 were reported sold for a buy-back rate of 60.8 percent. The total gross for the sale was \$627,900. The average price of \$11,015 was down 1.4 percent from a year ago, while the median of \$4,200 was down 16 percent.

## ★ SO. CALIFORNIA ★

### CHRB Approves Racing Dates:

The California Horse Racing Board approved the Southern California 2010 racing calendar, subject to modifications, at its regular meeting last Thursday in Coalinga. Santa Anita will conduct live racing from Dec. 26 through Apr. 18, followed by meets at Hollywood Park (Apr. 21 through July 18), Del Mar (July 21 through Sept. 8), Fairplex Park (Sept. 9 through Sept. 27), Oak Tree at Santa Anita (Sept. 29 through Oct. 31) and Hollywood Park (Nov. 3 through Dec. 19). During the meeting, the CHRB also received assurances from Gregg Scoggins--representing MEC, the owner of Golden Gate Fields--that debtor-in-possession financing is in place and the track will be able to meet its financial obligations for the upcoming Golden Gate meet which runs from Oct. 21 through Dec. 20. The board also approved four rules for 45-day public notice. Rule 1685 mandates the use of "kinder and safer" whips and rules 1689 and 1689 relate to the mandatory use of safety helmets and vests. Rule 1658 would require a claim to be voided if a horse is unable to return after a race to be unsaddled. The rule change, based on a national recommendation of the Association of Racing Commissioners International, would nullify a claim if a horse is injured or in distress unless the person submitting the claim chooses to purchase the horse regardless. All four proposed rules will be scheduled for public hearing, most likely at the CHRB's January meeting.

The Royal Studs' 2005 G1 Epsom Derby hero was also responsible for the same consignment's [hip 105](#), a colt from the family of the 2002 G1 Irish Oaks heroine Margarula (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}) who was knocked down to BBA Ireland for €58,000. 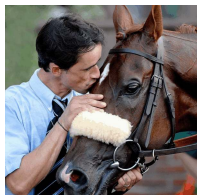
