Vineyard Haven (Lido Palace {Chi}) will bid to keep Godolphin's dream season going as the marquee name in today's GI Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial Dash at Laurel Park. Acquired privately by the Dubai-based operation for a reported eight-figure amount following impressive scores in the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. and GI Champagne S. in 2008, the grey made a forgettable bow in the royal blue colors when fourth in the G3 UAE 2000 Guineas Feb. 12. He regrouped to finish first in the GI NetJets

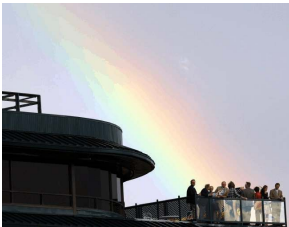

King's Bishop S. at Saratoga Aug. 29, only to be disqualified to second after interfering with Capt. Candyman Can (Candy Ride {Arg}). The Florida-bred has posted a series of fast works at Belmont since then, including a bullet half in :47 Oct. 21. Vineyard Haven, the lone three-year-old in the nine-horse Dash, will break from the rail. "I'm very happy with his preparations," said assistant trainer Rick Mettee. "We think he's fit, sound and ready to run another big race. It is not going to be easy from the rail, but we are 8-5 in a Grade I, so we'll take our chances." Cont. p2

Dell Ridge Farm's **Bluegrass Princess** (Dynaformer) swept home a two-length winner in the first division, while Harvey Clarke's **Eye of Taurus** (Aldebaran) proved resolute an hour later.

TROPHY CASE

The final Group 1 event of the 2009 British flat season is today's Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster. Recent winners of the one-mile affair include High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in 2001, Motivator (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) in 2004 and Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in 2006, all of whom went on to capture the G1 Epsom Derby the following June. **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) looked a potential class act when winning the G2 Beresford S. at The Curragh last time Sept. 27, and bids to cement his reputation as one of Ballydoyle's leading Classic hopes for 2010. Jockey Johnny Murtagh is feeling the buzz of anticipation. "He's a very nice horse and one I like a lot," the reinsman told *Racing Post*. "He's high up the pecking order in Ballydoyle and, while he is bred to stay middle distances well next season, he's got plenty of speed as he showed when winning the Beresford. The Racing Post Trophy is always a good pointer to the Classics, and that should be the case this time as it looks a very competitive renewal of the race. I don't ride him at home, but the lads tell me he is very well, and that he has come on since his last run." Cont. p3

Vineyard (Lite the Fuse) by 2 3/4 lengths. "This is as good as it gets," said trainer Scott Volk. "He's got a lot of back class, and for \$14,000 you take a chance. Sometimes they work, and sometimes they don't. He's gotten better every time he's run for us." In 2007, Fleet Valid tested black-type foes twice, finishing sixth behind Diabolical (Artax) in the Gill Maryland Sprint H. at Pimlico and fourth to Benny the Bull (Lucky Lionel) in the Iowa Sprint H. at Prairie Meadows. "It's an amazing story," added Volk. "We never dreamed this would happen. He returned to his old form. Somehow he's come back to life. He's been there before, and now he's coming back and trying it again two years later." He was scratched from Friday's Eillo S. at The Meadows in favor of this race. Also trying to rediscover his old flair is **True Quality** (Elusive Quality), who summoned an upset of warhorse Fabulous Strike (Smart Strike) over this strip in the GII General George H. Feb. 16. A Paragallo colorbearer at that time, the four-year-old has gone through a pair of barn and ownership changes while finishing off the board in his next three tries. He returns to Laurel following a sixth in the GI Forego S. at Saratoga Sept. 5.

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Al Zir lacks black type at present, but he has shaped as if the major races are within his grasp with easy seven-furlong wins in a Newmarket maiden Aug. 7 and conditions event here last time Sept. 11. "He has won on good-to-soft and fast ground and his action is a bit high, so any rain will help him," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. "He is a big, weak horse, but he came back well from his last race and is improving all the time. He is ready to go and this has been his target for a long time. We are looking for a big run from him." Elusive Pimpernel is another who adds weight to this contest after extending his unbeaten tally at the expense of subsequent listed and Group 2 winners Emerald Commander (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) and Poet's Voice (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), respectively, in York's G3 Acomb S. Aug. 18. "He did nothing wrong in the Acomb, where he made up a lot of ground to win what was a very hot race," jockey Eddie Ahern said. "This is a big step up for every horse in the race, and our horse's work and his form suggests he is entitled to step up to Group 1 level. We really like the horse and we're hoping for a big run."

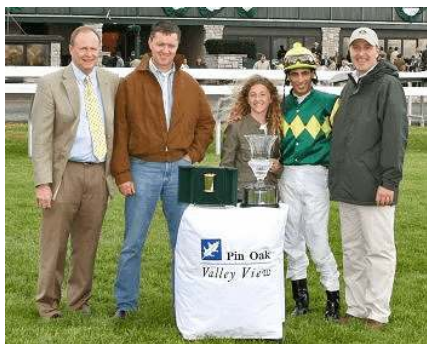

MGSP King Ledley to BC Juvenile Turf

King Ledley (Stormin Fever), purchased privately by Silverton Hill Farm's Bonnie and Tommy Hamilton following a runner-up finish in the Aug. 22 G2 Futurity S. at Fairyhouse, will make his U.S. debut in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 7. The juvenile is out of Mt. Kobla (Mt. Livermore), herself a half-sister to GI Florida Derby winner Quality Road (Elusive Quality). In his most recent start in the Sept. 27 Goffs Million Sprint, King Ledley--making his final start for trainer Kevin Prendergast--was near the back early, lacked racing room in the final sixteenth, but found a seam late and closed well to finish a close-up third in the 20-horse field. "I thought he found himself in quite a tight situation," explained trainer Darren Miller, who was at The Curragh for the €1.6-million event. "Near the wire, where it counted most, he kept coming at the other horses and I thought that was good. According to Miller, the added yardage shouldn't pose a problem for the colt, who will be attempting a mile for the first time. "I think he will like a little added distance," said Miller. "He appears to like to make a long, steady drive and he'll appreciate the extra furlong." Earlier in the season, the Kentucky-bred finished runner-up in The Curragh's G3 Anglesey S. and third in the G2 Railway S. King Ledley was a €45,000 Goffs yearling purchase.

Grade I winner **Icon Project** (Empire Maker--La Gueriere, by Lord At War {Arg}) has been retired due to a tendon injury, owner Andrew Rosen announced yesterday. The four-year-old had not faced the starter since airing by 13 1/2 lengths in the GI Personal Ensign S. at Saratoga Aug. 30. "It is a shame that Icon Project's career ended so prematurely," Rosen said. "She was a very nice horse on the grass, but when switched to the dirt, she was electrifying, winning two of three starts, all graded stakes, each by 13 lengths. With her pedigree, conformation and class, I look forward to her career as a broodmare." Acquired as a yearling by Hugo Merry Bloodstock for \$775,000 at Keeneland September, the daughter of GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup heroine La Gueriere began her career in England for trainer Brian Meehan. She ran third to Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) in the Listed Plantation Stud S. at Newmarket, and was sent to Marty Wolfson in Florida following an unplaced effort in France last September. Third in Calder's GII La Prevoyante H. in her third start on these shores, Icon Project turned a corner when the GII New York H. when that June 20 event came off the grass at Belmont. She romped by 13 1/4 lengths there, then ran second to Swift Temper (Giant's Causeway) in the \$1-million GII Delaware H. July 19 before making what would be her final career start in the Personal Ensign. "She was probably the best filly I have ever trained," said Wolfson. "The 114 Beyer Speed Figure she ran in the Personal Ensign showed how special and talented she was. I will miss training her." Icon Project is a half-sister to MGSW Lasting Approval (With Approval) and La Comete (Holy Bull), the dam of MGSW Munnings (Speightstown), and hails from the family of champion Allez France (*Sea-Bird II) and millionaire Al Mamoon (Believe It).

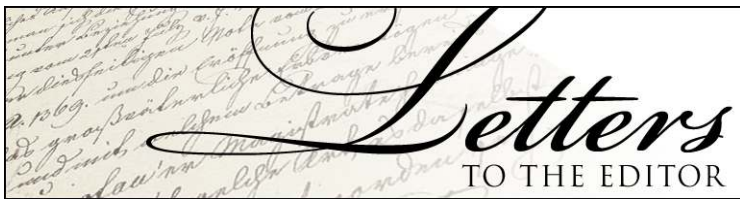

Artiste Royal Retired to Haras d'Etream...

Multiple Grade I winner **Artiste Royal (Ire)** (Danehill--Agathe, by Manila) has been retired and will enter stud at Haras d'Etream in France, *Daily Racing Form* reports. The eight-year-old has already entered quarantine. Sent to trainer Neil Drysdale after being purchased privately from the Wildenstein family by David and Jill Heerensperger, the bay captured the 2007 GI Clement L. Hirsch Turf Championship S. and 2008 GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H. He finished third in this year's renewal of the Whittingham, and heads to the breeding shed with a career mark of 34-7-9-7 and earnings of \$997,686. Artiste Royal is a full-brother to French champion Aquarelliste (Fr).



It is always a wonder when people ignore mountains of evidence to draw a conclusion that is contrary to what is plainly right in front of them. The recent letter to the editor from Greg Shuler is a perfect example of that phenomenon.

In his letter, Shuler laments that KEEP has focused on an industry-specific message, arguing that most Kentuckians are not moved by a group of wealthy people asking for help. Mr. Shuler believes that the message in favor of expanded gaming should have been focused on raising needed revenue for the state, not on helping Kentucky's signature industry. He closes by stating that the pro-industry message is clearly not working, and that we should "cut bait" and start talking about human services and the like.

The mountain of evidence that Mr. Shuler is ignoring is overwhelming. Kentucky began debating expanded gaming almost 20 years ago, in the early 1990s. From the outset, the main argument employed in favor of expanded gaming was to use gaming as a means to raise state revenue, close budget deficits, build schools and hospitals, and improve infrastructure. For almost 20 years, Kentuckians heard the arguments that Mr. Shuler wishes we were still making, and rejected them.

A 2007 statewide survey revealed that more Kentuckians were opposed to VLTs at racetracks than supported them. At that time, most Kentuckians also grossly undervalued the economic benefit that the horse industry provides to our state, both in terms of revenue and job creation.

KEEP set about to change that perception, while at the same time educating Kentuckians on why the horse industry in our state is at a competitive disadvantage with our competitor states.

Through a grassroots outreach program that has signed up more than 13,000 members, and through a communications strategy that includes television and radio advertising, direct mail, town hall meetings, and speeches at local association meetings, not to mention lobbying legislators and other opinion leaders, KEEP has completely changed the perception of the horse industry in our state.

A couple of years ago, how many Kentuckians knew that the horse industry was responsible for 100,000 jobs in our state? Today, I think you would be hard pressed to find someone who has not heard that number. You would also be hard pressed to find a Kentuckian who does not believe that our industry is facing a serious competitive disadvantage.

Mr. Shuler's assessment could not be more off the mark. The message touting the importance of the industry and the importance of the jobs created and retained by the industry--jobs that include hay farmers, truck drivers, vets, landscapers, equine insurance salespeople, etc.--is working. The message that our industry needs to be able to fairly compete is absolutely resonating.

Need proof? During the special session, a television station in Louisville commissioned a statewide poll on the subject of VLTs at Kentucky racetracks. Almost 70 percent of Kentuckians supported putting VLTs at racetracks as a way to preserve and protect our industry, a dramatic turnaround from only 2 1/2 years ago. Thanks to that mounting public pressure, an expanded gaming bill was heard on the House floor for the first time since this debate started, and actually passed the House of Representatives--another first. Need more proof? After killing the bill in the Senate, we have recently seen high-profile members of the Senate Republican caucus tripping all over themselves to try and ingratiate themselves with the horse industry, and by extension, with the rest of the state. Being anti-horse industry is not a politically popular position right now.

We have made this much progress precisely because the message and the strategy has been the right one. And we are on the brink of being successful. As one member of the Senate Committee that killed the bill remarked, "it is no longer a question of if, but when."

Thanks to the help of so many Kentuckians, KEEP is poised to help accomplish a goal that has been the subject of debate for two decades. In the last couple of years, we have driven the length of the field and now stand on the one yard line, poised to finally achieve success. It is a wonder that some would criticize the very means and methods used to bring us to this point. We look forward to celebrating with Mr. Shuler and thousands of other hard working Kentuckians when our industry is finally given the tools to compete, and this long-running debate has finally been decided in favor of our signature industry and the thousands of Kentuckians who benefit from the jobs that it both saves and creates.

CHURCHILL, HORSEMEN'S GROUPS

ANNOUNCE PURSE AGREEMENT Officials at Churchill Downs Incorporated (CDI), the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (HBPA) and the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association (KTA) have reached an agreement on a three-year contract that establishes purse levels at the historic Louisville oval. Additionally, CDI and KHBPA have mutually agreed to dismiss claims against the other in a lawsuit filed in the United States District Court of Western Kentucky in 2008. The agreement calls for Churchill to provide a \$1.5-million supplement to purses divided equally over the duration of the contract. There is a provision in the agreement which stipulates that CDI may distribute a greater share of the supplement earlier if purse levels fall below anticipated levels. "Churchill Downs is very pleased to be part of this long-term

agreement that is good for horsemen, Churchill Downs, Kentucky's embattled horse industry and racing fans in Kentucky and throughout North America," said Kevin Flanery, president of Churchill Downs racetrack. "This three-year pact between our track and horsemen comes at a crucial time for Kentucky's horse industry as horses and horsemen are leaving our state to pursue the growing purses and breeding incentives that

exist in states with slots and other expanded wagering options at their racetracks." He continued, "Decisions are being made daily on where to breed and race in 2010 and beyond, and once horsemen, stallions and mares leave Kentucky, it will be very difficult to get them to return. Churchill Downs' commitment to provide an additional \$1.5 million to purses is an effort to protect Kentucky racing from states that supplement their races with expanded gaming revenues. Our hope is that the purse supplement will help keep a few more horses and horsemen in Kentucky through 2010 while our united horse industry works for the passage of legislation that would allow additional gaming at racetracks and level our competitive playing field with tracks and breeding operations in those rival states." Rick Hiles, president of the KHBPA, echoed those sentiments. "It's a good contract--I think it's good for both parties," he commented. "I think it's going to work out well for the horsemen and for Churchill Downs. We're glad to get this behind us and we look forward to working together over the next three years in the effort to get all of Kentucky racing back on track."

Chickasaw Nation Wins Battle for Lone Star:

A wholly owned subsidiary of the Chickasaw Nation outbid Penn National Gaming in a second auction for the operating assets of Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie, Texas, *Daily Racing Form* reports. Global Gaming Assets bid a reported \$47,857,000 for the Magna Entertainment-owned business, which includes the lease on the Dallas-area oval and its racing license, according to *DRF*. The property itself is owned by the city of Grand Prairie. Global Gaming entered its first offer of \$27 million Oct. 7. It was the only bid submitted at the time, but Magna's creditors' committee petitioned the bankruptcy court to reopen the bidding once they learned the Penn National bid was \$40 million. Global Gaming purchased Oklahoma's Remington Park from Magna for a reported \$82 million two months ago.

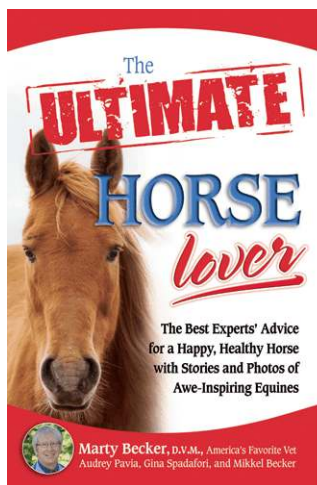
