ZENYATTA FAVORED IN CLASSIC QUEST

It's official. **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) will put her perfect record on the line when she takes on 12 male rivals in the \$5-million G1 Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Saturday. Last year's G1 BC Ladies' Classic heroine turned in a sterling workout this past Saturday at her Hollywood Park base ([video](#)), which convinced her connections that the time was right to step out of her division. With regular rider Mike Smith in the irons, the towering mare will break from post four, and she has been installed as the 5-2 favorite on the morning line.

"We all watched everything she did over time, watching works and studying her races," said co-owner

Jerry Moss. "Then we got together Sunday night and said if there is the slightest doubt, we would not run in the Classic. Everybody said she was ready. So now I think everybody is in for a treat come Saturday." Trainer John Shirreffs isn't concerned about the draw for the confirmed closer. "The way she runs, we didn't have any strong feeling about a post," Shirreffs said. "[Smith] can put her where he wants her. She'll be fine." **Breeders' Cup draw fields cont. p2-7**

MELBOURNE CUP GLORY FOR BROWN

Jockey Corey Brown was aboard Bauer (Ire) (Halling) when the former Luca Cumani trainee lunged, but missed by a nose to **Viewed (Aus)** (Scenic {Ire}) in the 2008 G1 Melbourne Cup. There were no such disappointments yesterday, when the veteran reinsman guided 9-1 chance **Shocking (Aus)** (Street Cry {Ire}) to a 3/4-length victory in the "race that stops the nation." Until Saturday, Brown was engaged to ride **Vigor (NZ)** (O'Reilly {NZ}), but picked up the mount on Shocking when the G1 Caulfield Cup third was denied a berth in the Melbourne Cup. "Last year was very disappointing--being beaten by a nose in the Melbourne Cup is pretty hard to cope with," Brown commented. "But I've finally won the Melbourne Cup. My dream has come true, I can't describe it, it's unbelievable. I wish everyone could feel what I am feeling right now. It is unbelievable." **Cont. p7-8**

Mine That Bird will break from the inside in his quest to get his first win since his rail-skimming success in the GI Kentucky Derby. "We're going to be near the back, so we might as well save ground," said trainer Chip Woolley Jr. "It's good. I'm glad because he won't have to do a lot of work from there. He was towards the outside in the [GI] Goodwood [at Oak Tree Oct. 10], and [jockey] Calvin [Borel] had to work to get back inside. I want him covered up, and it will be easy to do from there. It's the perfect spot. I just told HRTV that I'd be happy to draw the one, two, or three hole."

Playing Favorites

A total of 149 horses, including 30 from Europe, passed the entry box for the 14 races of the Breeders' Cup World Championships. **Conduit (Ire)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) and **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) are favored to defend their titles in the GI Emirates Airline BC Turf and GI TVG BC Mile, respectively, at 7-5 and 8-5. Unbeaten **Lookin at Lucky** (Smart Strike) is the 8-5 morning-line favorite in the GI Grey Goose BC Juvenile, but will have to overcome the out-

side 13 post. "I really wasn't sure where I wanted him, but he is very manageable so it shouldn't be a problem, and there's nothing I can do about it anyway," trainer Bob Baffert summed up. It's the other side of the gate for Baffert's GI Sentient Jet BC Sprint hopeful **Zensational** (Unbridled's Song). "Of course I don't like it, you never like the one hole especially with speed horses, but they all have to break," the Hall of Famer noted. "I was hoping to get the outside and we're stuck in the one hole, but all the real speed is inside."

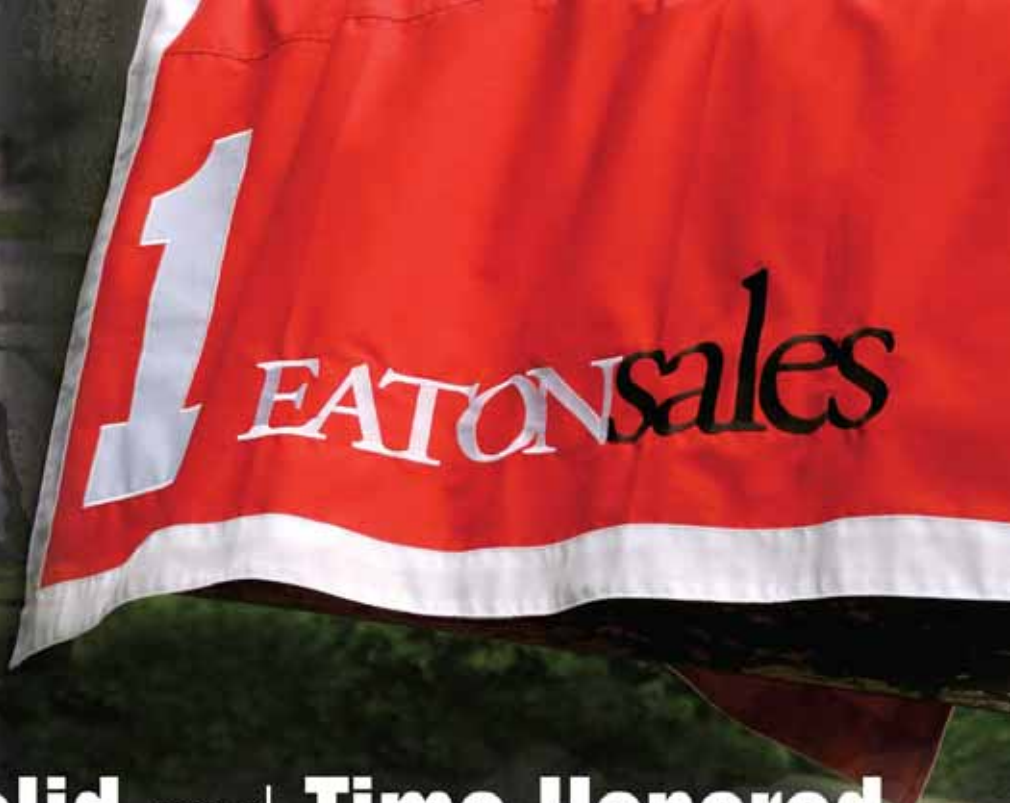

"I didn't give him a hope in the run when he was trapped deep," admitted winning trainer Mark Kavanagh. "Then he was going so strongly to the line, I thought, 'He won't be able to keep going.' He was so good on Saturday and he'd improved since that run. His preparation was timed to perfection, and he came right at the right time. I didn't expect to win it. It hasn't sunk in yet." Crime Scene Impressive in Second...

Godolphin's **Crime Scene (Ire)** (Royal Applause {GB}) provided his owners with a third runner-up effort in the Melbourne Cup, following Central Park in 1999 and Give The Slip in 2001. Saeed bin Suroor, the Godolphin trainer, commented from Australia, "Crime Scene ran a great race. The blinkers he was wearing for the first time in a race made a difference--he was more focused as he had shown when working in them on Saturday. Also the two miles suited him very well. Crime Scene had a nice position all the way and [jockey] Kerrin [McEvoy] gave him a good ride. For a second in the straight, I thought he was going to win, but he was beaten by a better horse."

Hayes Left Red-Faced...

Trainer David Hayes was fuming after Racing Victoria ruled **Changingoftheguard (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) out of the A\$5.5-million race at 7:30 a.m following an hour-long inspection and debate with veterinarians. The four-year-old, due to have his first start for Hayes since switching from trainer Aidan O'Brien with a change of ownership, was inspected by vets on race eve before a further early morning examination, with a trio of vets ruling the horse was lame in his near foreleg. "If every horse was subjected to what this horse has been today, there would be only four runners in the Cup, and I would not have a runner at the meeting," said Hayes, who had 11 other runners engaged at the meeting.

Changingoftheguard was examined at Flemington before the dispute continued at Hayes' yard with chief steward Terry Bailey stating, "Mr. Hayes is upset...but we've got three vets here, three very experienced vets that say the horse is lame." Bailey said the issue had only come to light in the last 48 hours. Changingoftheguard was a \$21 chance in Cup betting. His withdrawal meant only 23 horses took their place in the field.

Vigor Controversy Continues...

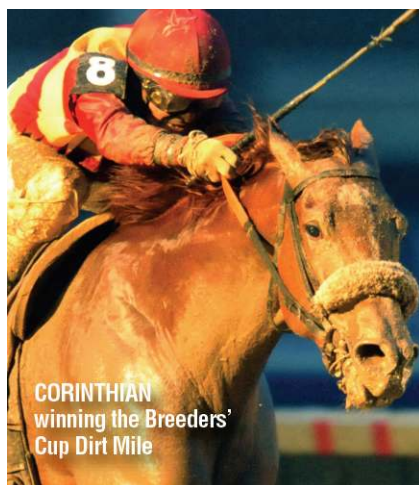
A hot topic at Flemington was the controversial decision by the VRC committee not to promote the Danny O'Brien-trained **Vigor (NZ)** (O'Reilly {NZ}), a last-start third in the Caulfield Cup Oct. 17, to the 24-horse field. O'Brien opted not to run Vigor in the Mackinnon S. and the horse was 25th in the order of entry. The committee deliberated on Saturday night for more than two hours before denying Vigor a berth in the Cup.

THE NEW YORK YANKEES

Though I don't know the affiliation of all of the *TDN* staff who work out of the Red Bank office, I feel pretty sure *TDN* co-publishers Barry (Phillies) and Sue (Yankee arch-rivals Boston Red Sox) are none too happy about the impending 27th World Series victory for the New York Yankees [Editor's Note: There are three solid Yankees fans on the *TDN* staff]. Of course, I might be talking completely out of my hat; I didn't really follow baseball even when I didn't live in Scotland, so what do I know? The Phillies are putting up a great fight, and that ace pitcher and home run machine Chase Utley have been a lot of fun to watch. But they might be out of luck by tonight.

The horse business never begrudges a Yankee win, because their controlling owners, the Steinbrenner family, have been prominent breeders and owners of racehorses for at least the last 30 years. But, aside from the familiar European jibe "World Series?," baseball's season-ending championships command a wide and dedicated audience. We'd be pretty happy with their numbers for our American season-ending championships, the Breeders' Cup, at Santa Anita this weekend. We do have quite a few international players suiting up, too. More than baseball, anyway.

Within the limitations agreed by baseball's league structure (overseen by a Commissioner, please note), the New York Yankees have sustained their position as baseball's most successful franchise through the years by spending top dollar and buying the best. It doesn't always work out, but when it does, that 'class edge' the top dollar can buy can often make the crucial difference between contender and champion.

But, of course, between the buying and the results is the development. For whatever reasons, from an outsider's point of view, the failure to achieve greater success was more likely to be somewhere in the developmental stages than in the drafting process.

Although, by the way, they're not kidding when they reflect back on how Sheikh Mohammed and his family have put Dubai on the map. However much they've plowed into their favorite hobby over the years, it is a drop in the bucket compared to the money generated by the creation, literally from nowhere, of the brand 'Dubai.' The money they've put into horses really can be called an 'investment' if you look at it in the context of the creation of an internationally successful brand, which in this case happens to be the country of Dubai. That has definitely worked.

Beginning in 2009, though, we noticed that there had been a diversification of Darley/Godolphin interests in what seemed a more organized way. In Europe, besides the now-familiar Godolphin operation, big consignments of horses were sent to (1) Andre Fabre, whose yard Sheikh Mohammed bought (these horses usually run in Sheikh Mohammed's name and the Darley maroon and white); (2) John Gosden, who now trains most of the horses that run in the colors of Princess Haya, Sheikh

Mohammed's wife; and (3) Mark Johnston, who trains for Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed, Sheikh Mohammed's son and Dubai's Crown Prince. The Darley/Godolphin operation also had over 100 runners in North America this year, which either run under Godolphin (Saeed bin Suroor, trainer; Rick Mettee, assistant) or Darley. About two-thirds of the 92 Darley starters were trained by either Kieran McLaughlin, Tom Albertrani, or Eoin Harty.

So here come the disclaimers and qualifications. First, huge thanks to Grant Harris at Weatherby's and Mark Adkins at EquineLine for finding and supplying us with the information we've used to compile the accompanying table showing Godolphin/Darley, etc. 2009 results. These were through Oct. 25, I think was the date for most of the stats, and Darley/Godolphin have had another good weekend since then. So the numbers are already a little out of date. Second, whereas we did include Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid's Shadwell Estates in the yearling buying information last week, we have not tried to include his operation in these statistics. It was Godolphin/Darley that transformed their organizational setup at the beginning of the year, so we wanted to see, specifically for that camp, what the results have been.

Because there simply isn't an international horse racing data bureau that might create comparative data, we don't really have anything concrete to compare these figures to. But I would say they're pretty impressive. They would not be happy about having only two percent Group/Grade 1 winners from 2009 starters, but literally in all other categories these numbers look good; and if they're progressing, and moving forward in all other categories, the Grade I winners will come--maybe a few more this weekend.

In Europe, the combined four 'entities' (I'll bet they loved being called that, an 'entity') had 373 starters when these figures were compiled, for 208 winners (56 percent winners from starters); 23 percent wins to starts; 38 black-type winners (10 percent), of which a really impressive 30 (eight percent) were group winners, though only four (just one percent of starters) were Group 1 winners (here we must say a horse could be counted in two or three different countries as two or three different horses, but that does not materially affect the picture). In North America, only 20 horses had started under the Godolphin banner, but talk about successfully hand-picked: 11 black-type winners (55 percent of starters), nine graded-stakes winners (45 percent), and six Grade I winners (30 percent). Wow.

Combined, these six entities racing on two continents had 485 starters, which made 1,628 starts. They had 263 winners (54 percent of starters), which won 378 races--23 percent of starts. They had 64 black-type winners (13 percent of starters), of which 48--a deeply impressive 10 percent--were graded/group stakes winners. They did still have only two percent Grade I winners, though 11 Grade I winners in a year doesn't seem like that bad a number to have. I'm sure they'd have liked quite a few more outside the small North American Godolphin stable, though. Their combined earnings stood at \$7,372,864 in North America when these figures were compiled (\$21,186 per start), and £9,289,583 in Europe (£7,257 per start, or about \$12,000).

Combined, that's just at \$22,700,000 in earnings. You can say those numbers pale in comparison to the \$100 million their friends and family spent on yearlings this year, or the estimated \$200 million they spent on stallion prospects in 2007 (first foals at the sale next week by Street Sense, Hard Spun, Any Given Saturday, Discreet Cat, etc.), but that's not entirely the point. Part of the equation is about success on the racetrack as well as the monetary considerations and putting Dubai on the map, and in the racing department it seems to us things are looking a lot brighter for the Darley armies than was the case just 12 months ago.

The point could be brought home on an international stage this weekend. In what shapes up as a brilliant weekend of racing--I'm on my way, and excited to be going to the Breeders' Cup for the first time since Belmont in 2005--the Godolphin/Darley extended team is fielding 16 runners over the two days' racing (*see attached table*). Seven of them are Grade/Group 1 winners this year. Another four are Grade/Group 2 winners, two more are Grade/Group 3 winners (that's 13 in all); two (Midshipman and Cocoa Beach) were Grade I winners last year, and one of the two-year-olds (Vale of York) is Group 1-placed this year. Placement has been one of their strengths this year, and this is arguably the biggest stage of all. I'll bet a lot of these horses at least hit the board.

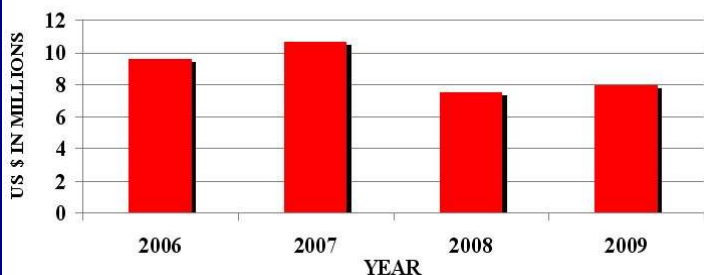


Weekly Sales Ticker *by Bill Oppenheim*

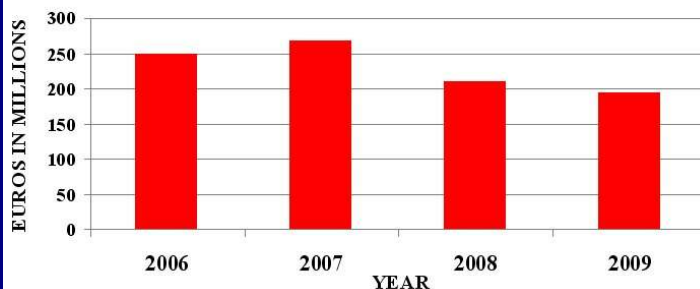
“The Fasig October Sale saw a 10 percent jump (from 64.4 to 74.9) in percentage sold/ring. With 11 percent fewer catalogued, the gross was up six percent, the average three percent. But it was a small victory, at the presumably slots-fueled ‘lower middle’ end of the market. The bottom left graph shows that, compared to two years ago in 2007, the number catalogued in the combined yearling market was down eight percent, the number sold down 14 percent, the gross down 36 percent, and the average down 26 percent.”

“These two Tables highlight some significant differences in the declines between the North American and European yearling markets. Note, specifically, that in 2009 the percentage sold, of those catalogued, was almost 71 percent in Europe, but only 59 percent in North America. The reason is the percentage of withdrawals, which declined to 8.4 percent in Europe in 2009, but climbed to 17 percent (from under 12 percent in 2006) in North America. That’s a big part of the reason Europe’s gross is down 27 percent since 2007, while North America’s is down 43 percent.”

TOTAL EUROPEAN YEARLING SALES



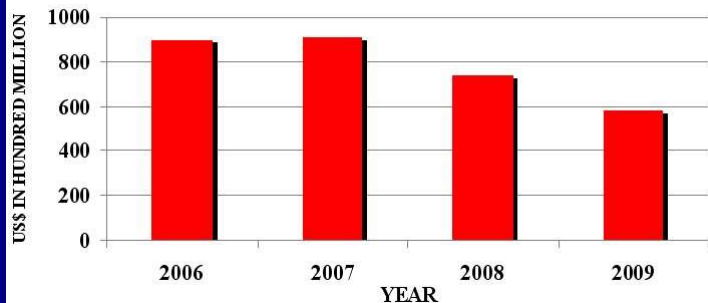

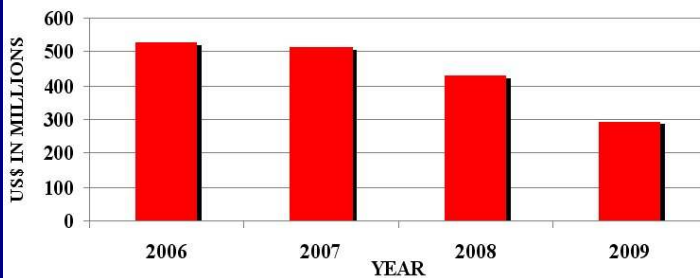

AUSTRALIAN BREEDERS UP IN ARMS Upper Hunter Valley Thoroughbred breeders are up in arms over proposals for more coal mines in the region. The Upper Hunter Shire--where major farms such as Darley, Arrowfield and Vinery are among more than 70 commercial Thoroughbred breeding operations--will have its first coal mine if the Bickham coal mine, near Emirates Park Stud in Murrurundi, proceeds. Proponents of the mine recently released a long-awaited water study that is on public exhibition until Dec. 4. If approved, the mine would extract up to 36 million tons of coal over about 25 years. While a comparatively small operation, its location in close proximity to the Pages River--a major tributary for the famed Segenhoe Valley Thoroughbred nurseries--has created considerable concern. Arrowfield chief John Messara said the Bickham project could have significant adverse impacts on groundwater and the Pages River. "Unless we all act now, the life-span of the local industries that support the Upper Hunter towns and families with jobs, income and lifestyle, will be in jeopardy," Messara said. "With the release of the water report, the gun has been fired and the race is now on."

In Denman, Thoroughbred syndicator and local businessman Craig Benjamin is spearheading a push to block plans for two new coal exploration licences. Denman, about 50 kilometers south east of Scone in the Upper Hunter, is home to studs such as Coolmore and Darley's Woodlands operation. "We have enough mines in the area and, all due respect to the coal companies, this is our area, this is our little part of the world, and there [are] other industries in this area apart from coal mining," Benjamin said.
