ZENYATTA HEADED TO BREEDING SHED

It comes as no surprise, but it appears that the great **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}--Vertigineux, by Kris S.) has run her last race. Trainer John Shirreffs told *Daily Racing Form* yesterday that the five-year-old mare would remain at Hollywood Park for several weeks to be let down, and then head to Kentucky to be bred. "Where else do you go?" Shirreffs told *DRF*. "Fourteen-for-14 and top it off with a win in the Breeders'

Cup Classic. On the biggest stage in the world, she performs. Isn't it amazing that a horse with her running style is 14-for-14? She's always stepped up." Owners Jerry and Ann Moss, along with Shirreffs and his wife, Dottie, and jockey Mike Smith celebrated their Classic victory at the Arroyo Chop House in Pasadena Saturday night. **Cont. p2**

Also Retiring...

Five prior Grade I-winning mares who competed at the Breeders' Cup will also be retired. They include three of the Godolphin distaffers in **Music Note** (f, 4, A.P. Indy--Note Musicale {GB}, by Sadler's Wells), **Cocoa Beach (Chi)** (m, 5, Doneraile Court--Visionera {Chi}, by Edgy Dilpomat) and **Seventh Street** (f, 4, Street Cry {Ire}--Holiday Runner, by Meadowlake). **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★** Music Note, third in the GI BC Ladies Classic, was four-for-six last season, with wins in the GI CCA Oaks, GI Mother Goose S. and GI Gazelle S. The bay added wins in the GI Ballerina S. and GI Beldame S. this term. Her record stands at 12-7-1-2, \$1,615,000. Cocoa Beach, sixth in the Ladies Classic, was Chile's Horse of the Year and Champion Two-Year-Old Filly after going four-for-four with three group scores in her native land in 2007. Bred by Haras La Obra, she was then purchased privately by Team Godolphin, and went on to add the UAE 1000 Guineas, UAE Oaks, GI Beldame S. and GI Matriarch S. to her resume last year. She retires with a record of 17-10-2-2, \$1,744,595. Seventh Street put together a stellar 2009 campaign, with victories in the GI Apple Blossom H. and GI Go for Wand H., but could do no better than eighth in Friday's GI BC F/M Sprint. The chestnut was 10-5-3-1, with earnings of \$716,000. Of last year's champion turf mare **Forever Together** (m, 5, Belong to Me--Constant Companion, by Relaunch), trainer Jonathan Sheppard said, "She is 90-percent certain to be retired. We haven't entirely pulled the plug on her, but I think so." The winner of the GI BC F/M Turf and GI First Lady S. in 2008, and two-time heroine of the GI Diana S., the George Strawbridge homebred capped off her career with a third in the F/M Turf. S. The formidable filly picked up her first Grade I score in her only conventional dirt effort, the Apple Blossom at Oaklawn that April, and added four more elite victories that season. Crowned champion older mare after taking the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies Classic, Zenyatta, took

a deserved break, and returned for a perfect five-for-five campaign in 2009, capped by her historic performance in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Saturday. She retires with earnings of \$5,474,580. As Shirreffs observed, the mare will be sorely missed. "It's a big hole for racing, not just my barn," he told *DRF*. "You saw the crowd." Mating plans have not yet been decided.

Successful in the May 9 G3 Premio Carlo d'Alessio over 1 1/2 miles at this venue, he was third in the G1 Gran Premio di Milano at the San Siro June 14 before annexing Longchamp's G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil July 14. Adding Milan's G3 Premio Federico Tesio to his tally Sept. 20, the grey was third in the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club back there last time Oct. 18. Settled close to the early pace by Mirco Demuro, he took over with a half mile remaining and that move proved decisive as his main threat Turati was holed up on the rail in his wake. When that rival was finally freed as City Leader (Ire) (Fasliyev) tired in the last 100 yards, Voila Ici had done enough to secure the victory. While this looked a point-and-shoot job for last year's winner and international campaigner Pressing, the script was torn up in the testing ground prevalent here with Silver Arrow emerging from the shadows to register a career-best. Last in the 2008 G1 Derby Italiano, the bay subsequently failed to make any serious impact on the domestic scene and had managed fourth placings only in a couple of handicaps in the space of a week at the San Siro and at this venue at the end of last month. Finally regaining the winning thread in a 10-furlong handicap a week before this test, the homebred gave little indication of what was to come when out the back in the early stages. Neatico improved off a debut sixth at Cologne Oct. 3 to break through back at the Rhine track last time Oct. 18 and continued on an upward curve with a comfortable score in this black-type bow. Positioned fourth just behind the leaders after an alert break, he quickened to the fore with 300 meters remaining and kept on well under sympathetic urging to easily hold Cabimas for a career high. "I am very impressed with Neatico," said Gestut Ittlingen's Manfred Ostermann. Maiden winner Tenarin drove with determination in the stretch and held off a late charge from Rio de Janeiro invader Timeo to post a career-best triumph in stakes record time in Sao Paulo's Derby, the third leg of that venue's Quadruple Crown for sophomore colts on turf. Winner over this course in his second start at two, Tenarin was off the board in the series opener, the Sept. 3 G1 Grande Premio Ipiranga, and finished third in the second leg, the Oct. 3. G1 Grande Premio Jockey Club de Sao Paulo. Next month's G1 Carlos Pellegrini in Buenos Aires, a trip to Dubai for the International Racing Carnival and the series finale, the Dec. 19 G1 Grande Premio Consagracao, are all under consideration for the winner.

Game Face (f, 4, Menifee--Galleon of Gold, by Gone West) will also head off to Kentucky to begin a new career. The chestnut captured the GIII La Troienne S. at three, and joined the ranks of Grade I winners with a 6 3/4-length romp in the Princess Rooney S. at Calder in July. She also annexed the GII Inside Information S. and GII Honorable Miss S., but trailed the field home in Friday's GI BC F/M Sprint. The Zabeel Racing International colorbearer heads to the breeding shed with a record of 17-8-3-2, \$799,348.

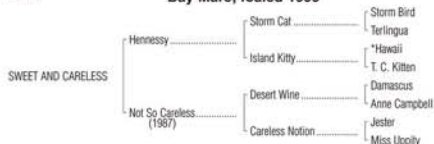

Summer Bird Beaten But Unbowed

Three-year-old **Summer Bird** (Birdstone), beaten three lengths when fourth behind Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) in the GI BC Classic, exited the race in good order, trainer Tim Ice reported. "He came out of the race good," Ice said. "He left some feed last night, which is very unusual for him. He ran hard, and I think it took a little bit out of him, more than previous races. Overall, I'm very pleased with how he's physically come out of the race." Ice, who will winter at Oaklawn Park, was not sure what would be next for his star sophomore. There has been talk of going to the Dec. 6 G1 Japan Cup Dirt. "We'll look at him the next couple of days, talk to the owners and see what we're going to do," Ice said. "We'll see how he does the next few days, see if he gets back on his feed and make a decision whether we want to go to Japan or give him some time."

Vacation Time for Mine That Bird

GI Kentucky Derby hero **Mine That Bird** (Birdstone), ninth in the Classic, will take the rest of the year off, according to trainer Chip Woolley. "I think probably Tuesday morning we'll head back to New Mexico, turn him out and give him a rest," Woolley said. "We'll try to give him 60 days, give or take--just give him a good break and let him decide." The gelding was none the worse for wear after the race. "Luckily, he pulled up well, he looks good this morning; he jogged good," the conditioner remarked. "We feel like he's in pretty good shape. He just needs a break--a mental break and a physical break."

Globetrotter Cannonball Back on the Road

World traveller **Cannonball** (Catenus), who was runner-up by a neck in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot in June, will take his show on the road once again. Third in Saturday's BC Turf Sprint, the New York-bred is being pointed for the G1 Hong Kong Sprint at Sha Tin Dec. 13. "He's going to leave Friday for Hong Kong," said trainer Wesley Ward. "After Hong Kong, he will go to Australia to run in the [G1] Coolmore Lightning S. on Jan. 30. Then it will be back to Royal Ascot next year." The four-year-old gelding, bred and raced by Ken and Sarah Ramsey, sports a record of 19-4-3-5, with a bankroll of \$636,448. Also possible for the Hong Kong Sprint is BC Turf hero **California Flag** (Avenue of Flags).

Combined BC Handle Rises

The total all-sources handle for the two days of 2009 Breeders' Cup competition, including the undercard races, was \$150,205,639. International figures were still being compiled, but the figure was already up 4 percent on 2008. There were 19 races over the two days this year, as compared to 21 last year. According to a Breeders' Cup press release, as much as \$3 million in handle from countries including France, Turkey, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa could still be reported. Kenneth Kirchner from Falkirk, wagering consultants to Breeders' Cup Ltd, remarked, "International separate pool handle is up by more than \$3 million over 2008." Kirchner added that the refunds on Classic late scratch Quality Road (Elusive Quality) came to \$2,172,266. It was estimated that the handle on Betfair exchange wagering was \$24.75 million over the two days. Pick Six wagering rose significantly, with Friday's Pick 6 totaling \$1,371,372, up 36 percent from 2008. Saturday's Pick 6 attracted \$3,313,224 in bets, up 15 percent from a year ago. There was just one winning ticket Saturday, good for \$1,838,305. Bought for just \$48 at Royal River Racing in Flandreau, South Dakota, the ticket singled Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) and Conduit (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}).

"How about Zenyatta? Isn't she something? What a wonderful, wonderful thing she is for racing. We had a very good day of racing here before her, but her big finish took it from very good to great. She is so special. And I want to salute John Shirreffs for the training he did. We might have seen one of the great training jobs of all time there. I take off my cap to him. John and I have our differences over the politics of synthetic tracks [Mandella in favor, Shirreffs against], but when it comes to horsemanship, I'm with him all the way. He is very, very good at what he does, and he did an exceptional job with that mare. She's a good thing for racing, and he is to be saluted for what he did."

Paco Gonzalez on Zenyatta's Classic win:

"I hope this will be a big shot in the arm for racing, what we need for the sport. That mare is a real racehorse. It was a wonderful thing the owners did. The people were so happy. It was a very big crowd, like the old days. People will always come to see good horses."

WITH THE BREEDERS' CUP OVER...

The 66th annual Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale begins tomorrow morning at 10 a.m. after being pushed back a day to accommodate buyers attending the Breeders' Cup. A total of 4,702 horses have been catalogued for the 13-session sale, which runs through Sunday, Nov. 22. There will be no dark days. Included in the catalogue are 2,337 broodmares, 1,885 weanlings, 476 horses of racing age and four stallions. The sale features two prominent dispersals: Windfields Farm, founded by the late E.P. Taylor, and the W.T. Young family's Overbrook Farm.

Last year's November Sale reflected an economy that was in a severe downward spiral after the credit crisis spiked in mid-September. The sale was led by broodmare prospect Hystericalady (Distorted Humor), who was knocked down to Darley rep John Ferguson for \$3 million. Three others eclipsed the \$2-million mark. Ferguson purchased GISW Shadow Cast (Smart Strike) for \$2.3 million; and Away (Dixieland Band), dam of Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song), for \$2.5 million; while Betty Moran's Brushwood Stable went to \$2.4 million for Mushka (Empire Maker), recent winner of the GI Spinster S. at Keeneland and runner-up in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic.

In all last term, 3,019 horses sold for \$185,552,300, representing a huge 45.5-percent drop from the previous year's gross. The average of \$61,462 was down 39 percent from 2007, while the median was off 42.9 percent.

...TIME TO RELOAD

Just as Keeneland wraps up its first day of selling tomorrow, buyers and sellers will head over to Newtown Paddocks for Fasig-Tipton's single-session November Sale. The boutique showcase is coming off a record 2008, when 91 horses sold for \$70,279,000. That equated to an average of \$772,297, up 58.8 percent from 2007, and a median of \$250,000, up 38.9 percent. \$14 million of the gross was attributable to the world-record sale of Broodmare of the Year Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister), who was knocked down to Mike Moreno's Southern Equine.

Expectations for the 2009 renewal will be tempered, and not only because the horse industry continues to parallel an economy that's struggling to find its feet. The results of last year's sale were skewed by the fact that Southern Equine and partner Hill 'n' Dale Sales were dispersing their holdings. Seven of the top 19 mares sold were offered by the partnership...and were subsequently purchased by either Hill 'n' Dale or Southern Equine. Hill 'n' Dale purchased one--Madcap Escapade (Hennessy), for \$3.1 million--while Southern Equine landed six, including Better Than Honour and the \$3.1-million Crystal Current (A.P. Indy). Since Southern Equine owned 70 percent of the mares (with the exception of Madcap Escapade, of whom they owned a 25-percent share), they were, in essence, paying only 30 cents on the dollar for the majority of their purchases.

Still, there is no debating that Fasig's November Sale has emerged as one of the premier venues for top-flight broodmares and especially horses of racing age, and buyers once again have their pick of several top prospects.

Adena, as Seller, Loaded for Bear...

With some 326 horses catalogued for the Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland November sales, Frank Stronach's Adena Springs is gearing up for a big two weeks in Kentucky. Despite the number of offerings, which include several high-profile horses such as champion Ginger Punch (Awesome Again), the sale shouldn't be misconstrued as any sort of a reduction, say Adena officials.

"We just have a multitude of mares," said Adena General Manager Eric Hamelback. "Last year, we sold 240 mares. Frank's population right now is over 570 mares, and he has a history of buying mares to be resold."

Adena, which now consigns its own horses, has eight catalogued at Fasig, including the Grade I winners Ginger Punch, Sugar Shake, Honey Ryder and Lady Joanne. A total of 318 Adena-owned horses have been catalogued for Keeneland, including Grade I winners Romance is Diane, Dearest Trickski, Elloluv and Intangaroo. While not all of Adena's mares sell in foal to Adena Stallions, the vast majority are, which is simply staying with a strategy long employed by Stronach, says Hamelback.

"It's been quoted that nobody makes stallions better than Adena Springs, and I equate that to, nobody makes stallions better than Frank Stronach," said Hamelback. "We buy a lot of mares, and the goal is to have the mares bred to the stallions, then return to the marketplace. Ultimately, the breeding of soundness and the breeding of racehorses--and not necessarily commercial horses--adds appeal to the stallions we have here. It's proven by the 14 Eclipse Awards Frank has--we breed to breed racehorses... period. That's the goal."

Many of the mares being offered by Adena were themselves purchased by Stronach's operation just one year ago. At Fasig-Tipton, Adena bought Intangaroo (\$1.8 million), Honey Ryder (\$1.75 million), Dearest Trickski (\$650,000), and Somethinaboutlaura (\$560,000). At Keeneland, Adena landed Lady Joanne (\$1.25 million) and Romance is Diane (\$1.35 million). Four of the five were put in foal to Adena's Horse of the Year Ghostzapper, said Hamelback, in order to give the freshman sire the best chance at success.

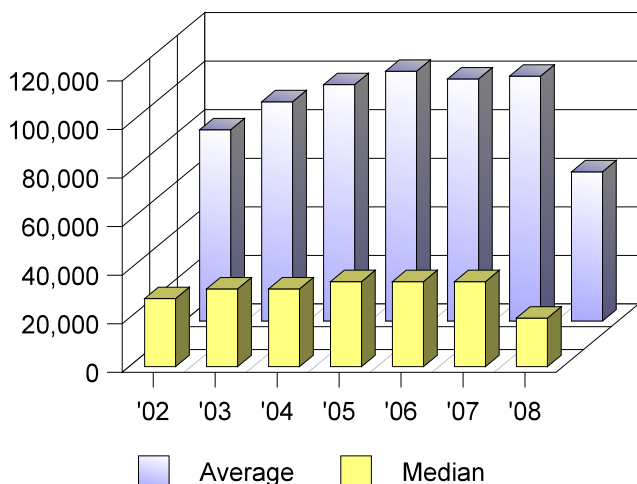

Hamelback explained, "The idea is, would Mr. Greathouse [previous owner John, of Glencrest Farm] breed Honey Ryder to Ghostzapper?" asked Hamelback. "Maybe he would have, maybe he wouldn't. So in order to have some commercial appeal for the stallion, that's the thing that has to happen. You have to breed the Romance is Dianes, the Honey Ryders, the Dearest Trickskis, to your stallions. Granted, not many people have the wherewithal to buy a mare for that kind of money to breed to a horse, then turn around and sell them. If those kind of mares are in the market, it's an opportunity to say, 'Hey, let's get that mare and breed her to Ghostzapper and see what happens.'"

Hamelback admits that playing the game is a risky undertaking given the current market fluctuations, but said that Adena will be realistic when setting reserves for 2009.

"It's an obvious statement: the market is not the same as a year ago," said Hamelback. "I don't know necessarily what Frank is going to want to get for the mares--he always decides the reserves--but there's a realism to the process. But the one thing I think all of us have seen--and I think Saratoga was a good example--is that there is still a market for good horses. Frank's not going to give them away."-Lucas Marquardt

Black Mamba's Journey Continues...

Richard Templar's long and profitable association with Grade I winner **Black Mamba (NZ)** (Black Minnaloushe--Sneetch {NZ}, by Grosvenor {NZ}) will come to an end when the six-year-old mare goes through the ring as [Hip 56](#) at the Fasig-Tipton November sale.

"It's been phenomenal," Templar said of Black Mamba's three-year campaign running for his Doubledown Stable. "I may have had better racehorses than her, but she's been absolutely the best to me. She hasn't missed a dance. She's just as consistent and as honest as they come. I really love this mare."

Bred by Keltorn Stud in New Zealand, Black Mamba sold for NZ\$120,000 as a yearling at the 2004 Karaka Premier Sale. She made 10 starts for Murray Baker before she was acquired by Templar.

It has been a proven path to success for Templar, a Chicago native who has been involved with racing for 30 years and traces his love of the sport to attending the races with his father as a child.

"Several years ago, I got to know some people that brought in horses from New Zealand and Australia and I started doing that," Templar said. "I have had a little bit of success doing that."

Templar has about a dozen horses currently in training, and, in addition to Black Mamba, his other recent imports include Belmont Cat (NZ) (Felix the Cat), winner of this year's GII Santa Ana H., and multiple stakes placed Royal Taat (NZ) (Faltaat), fourth in the Oct. 17 GIII Senator Ken Maddy H. at the Oak Tree meet.

"Basically, I'm buying proven racehorses from down there," he said of his success with transported Southern Hemisphere runners. "I like fillies because they don't write a lot of filly and mare races for older mares down there, so you find that they are running against the boys a lot and they can do a little bit better running against the girls up here."

Black Mamba was running creditably in New Zealand, including a fifth-place effort in the G1 New Zealand Oaks, but Templar saw untapped potential.

"Some people brought Black Mamba to my attention," Templar recalled. "She looked like she could be better than

what she was doing down there. I thought we could improve on her and luckily, for once, I was right."

During her first season running in the United States, Black Mamba was third in the 2007 GI Yellow Ribbon S. It was the first in a string of three straight third-place efforts in the Grade I event. She was also second in that year's GII Palomar Breeders' Cup H., GII Las Palmas H. and GII Dahlia H. **Cont. p5**

In 2008, the bay mare captured the GI John C. Mabee H. and GII Beverly Hills H. She hit the board in six of eight starts and earned \$472,294.

The Mabee was a 'Win and You're In' Breeders' Cup challenge race and Templer admitted he thought about entering Black Mamba in the 2008 F/M Turf.

"I thought about it last year, but decided against it," he said. "That's really the downside of these

kinds of horses because none of these horses that I'm bringing up from New Zealand are really eligible for the Breeders' Cup. And it doesn't seem like the best business decision for me to lay out the 15-percent supplement that I would have to pay."

Black Mamba was entered in last year's Fasig-Tipton November auction, but Templer decided to bely the mare's sale for a year.

"It looked like the market was a little weak last year," Templer explained. "And I'm in this for the racing. That's what I do. That's my favorite part of everything. She's been so sound and such a good horse, we decided to keep her and race her for another year. Even though the sales are soft this year, I don't regret that for a minute."

Black Mamba had another strong season in 2009, winning the GII Beverly Hills H. for the second straight year and finishing second in the GII Santa Barbara H., while hitting the board in five of seven starts and earning \$318,592. She capped her Doubledown career with a 1 1/2-length win in the Oct. 25 Dowager S. over a rain-soaked turf course at Keeneland.

"It was a little bittersweet," Templer said of the Dowager victory. "I expected her to run big. I wasn't too sure about the yielding turf, but I knew she would run big. She always tries, even if she doesn't like the surface too much. It was great to see her win. She put forth a great effort. But she always does, so it certainly wasn't any surprise. It was very nice to watch her once more before she goes through the sale."

On the board in 16 of 20 North American outings, Black Mamba won six times for Doubledown Stable and earned \$966,686. She sells at Fasig-Tipton as a racing or broodmare prospect. **Cont. p6**

Templer admits he's not sure how a New Zealand-bred mare will be received by American buyers.

"Your guess is as good as mine," he said. "But anybody who has seen her run knows what kind of mare she is. You can see most of that through the *Racing Form*, but you can see the rest of it by looking at her and watching her run."

While Black Mamba has enjoyed success racing in the U.S., her family has been busy back in New Zealand. Her half-sister Gussy Godiva (NZ) (Last Tycoon {Ire}) is the dam of this year's G1 Australian Derby winner Roman Emperor (NZ) (Montjeu {Ire}). That same mare also produced group winner Rios (NZ) (Hussonet).

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ...AT THE SALES

John Sikura, Hill 'n' Dale Farms:

"I think one of the primary negatives for the upcoming November Sales is the lack of quality mares and foals on offer. Any time you have a difficult market, you might not offer a quality product. I think we're lacking the highest and elite-quality mares, and the people who own those kind of mares are waiting for a different marketplace before they sell them at auction. Those two factors together will probably work against having a great sale. I think people are going to maybe judge the sale based solely on outcome, but they should also judge the sale based on what's on offer."



Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland Director of Sales:

"As the sale opens, there are positive signs emerging on both macro and industry levels. There are certain segments of the global market where recovery is underway in earnest. As such, we anticipate greater international participation based on the strength of certain currencies against the American dollar and keen interest in recent overseas sales."

Auerbach & Abrams Bring the Heat to Kentucky...

It's hard to think of any present-day stallion more inextricably tied to his owners than Unusual Heat. The California-based sire has been a true rags-to-riches story for Madeline Auerbach and trainer Barry Abrams. They claimed him as a six-year-old for \$80,000 back in 1996. He started twice more, running sixth in a graded stakes before winning a \$125,000 claimer. Retired, Unusual Heat was shopped around as a stallion prospect, but when suiters failed to line up, Auerbach and Abrams opted to stand him themselves, at Old English Rancho in Sanger. During his first few years there, Unusual Heat's books were comprised almost entirely of mares own by Auerbach and the Abrams family.

More than a decade later, Unusual Heat is the leading sire in California. Last year, he established a new single-season record in the Golden State when his progeny banked \$5,827,513. He is the sire of 22 stakes winners--including nine in 2009--and has six graded stakes winners to his credit.

The vast majority of those stakes winners have been bred and raced by Auerbach and/or the Abrams family, and nearly all of his good runners have been trained by Abrams. Now, for the first time, a number of Unusual Heat's best runners will be offered at the November Sales in Kentucky. Auerbach and the Abrams, as well as some partners, are bringing no fewer than six fillies or mares by Unusual Heat to Kentucky. **Cont. p8**

Three sell at Fasig-Tipton, the other three at Keeneland. The Fasig group includes:

- **Lethal Heat**, MGSW & GISP, as [hip 116](#);
- **Bel Air Sizzle**, SW & MGSP, as [hip 53](#);
- **Hot n' Dusty**, SW and a full-sister in blood to GSW Tucked Away, as [hip 98](#).

All three are four years of age, sell as racing or broodmare prospects, and are offered by Taylor Made Sales Agency. The Keeneland group includes:

- Six-year-old **Rushen Heat**, SP, who sells in foal to Henrythenavigator as [hip 296](#) from Warrendale Sales;
- Five-year-old **America's Friend**, SW and a sister to Bel Air Sizzle, who sells in foal to Heetseeker (Ire) as [hip 358](#) from Warrendale Sales;
- Six-year-old **Jay Ay**, winner and full to SW Lennyfrommalibu, who sells in foal to Henrythenavigator as [hip 1257](#) from Warrendale Sales;

"We've never really sold anything as a group before," said Auerbach. "We've never done the big sales, either here or in California. We had tried to put the horses--sometimes as yearlings, sometimes as two-year-olds--in sales here [in California], and for the most part, we have not been able to sell them for what we thought was a reasonable value for them. For example, we tried to sell Golden Doc A and Lethal Heat, and the highest bid for 'Goldie' was \$10,000 and the highest for Lethal Heat was like \$45,000 [RNA'd for \$49,000 as a BESOCT yearling, and for \$25,000 as a BESMAY juvenile]. We never had much success with it, so we kind of gave up on the sales."

Auerbach estimates she and her partners have roughly 55 horses by Unusual Heat--including weanlings, yearlings, and racehorses--with another 20 or so mares in foal to the stallion. That helped precipitate the decision to sell at November.

"We have so many horses, we have to find a way to support the other horses," said Auerbach. "This sale represents almost a coming-out party for us, because we really hadn't done this before." **Cont. p9**

Asked if she was nervous selling in this market, Auerbach said, "Nervous? No. Have I tempered my expectations? Yes. I would like to get some value for them, but I'm not going to give anything away. I think that's fair. I think some of them will do well, and I think some of them won't. But at this point, I really don't know which will be which, because I always wind up surprised. Horses like Rushen Heat and America's Friend are really nice mares and have made some money, and they should have some value. If they don't have value in Kentucky, then we don't have anything for that market at all."

In addition to the half-dozen horses owned by Auerbach/Abrams, another daughter of Unusual Heat trained by Abrams will go through the ring at Keeneland. Multiple stakes winner and graded stakes placed Lightmyfirebaby, whom Abrams conditioned for Richard O'Neill, sells as [hip 240](#), in foal to Unbridled's Song. She is consigned by Taylor Made.

Because he got off to a relatively late start at stud, and had to win over breeders the hard way, Unusual Heat is perhaps older than one might think--he turns 20 next year. But Auerbach said the son of Nureyev, who covered 82 mares in 2009, is going strong.

"He's actually doing great," she reported. "He really hasn't shown his age; he's starting now to look a little older to me. This is the first time he's started to look 16, 17."

Earlier this year, Auerbach and Co. announced the launch of the Unusual Heat Racing Venture, a new racing syndicate. Five yearlings by Unusual Heat have been offered as a group, which includes siblings to Tucked Away, Lethal Heat, Bel Air Sizzle, and Lightmyfirebaby. Auerbach said about half of the shares in the syndicate have been sold. For more information, visit www.unusualheatrv.com. -LM

"I would anticipate there will be a reasonable reserve, but the motivation is to sell the horses," said Sikura. "This year, the A.P. Indy colt [Take Control, nee Vallenzeri] sold as a two-year-old, and the Giant's Causeway filly sold as a yearling, and they both sold well beyond their reserve."

The two-year-old Take Control, who has the distinction of being the most expensive buy-back in history when he RNA'd for \$7.7 million at the 2008 September Sale, sold to Kaleem Shah for \$1.9 million at Keeneland April. The Giant's Causeway--Azeri filly sold two months ago at September to Robert and Lawana Low for \$800,000.

The Trust does have an Azeri--Ghostzapper weanling filly on the ground who is scheduled to sell next September. Sikura said there are "very few" horses still owned by the Trust.

"Most of the mares were sold in January of last year, and then there's Azeri and a few assorted mares," said Sikura.

As for Azeri, Sikura reports she's doing fine heading into November.

"She's a classy mare and she's had a foal every year," said Sikura. "So all is well. She speaks for herself. She'll be in the Hall of Fame, and she was a unique, great racemare who's had good foals every year. She'd have to be as popular as any mare that'll be sold. As far as market levels, we'll have to wait and see." -LM

A Jan. 15 weanling out of the mare--who is in foal to Bernardini--follows immediately as [hip 440](#). The weanling filly is also by Darley's first-season resident. Also hailing from that illustrious family is Flanders' daughter Surfside (Seattle Slew), who is offered as [hip 316](#). Victorious in the GI Frizette S. and GI Hollywood Starlet S. at two, the bay added scores in the GI Santa Anita Oaks and GI Las Virgenes S.--and a win against the boys in the GII Clark H.--en route to a three-year-old championship. Believed to be in foal to Giant's Causeway, the 12-year-old mare is also represented by [hip 317](#)--a chestnut filly by the Coolmore sire. Another member of Overbrook's seemingly never-ending string of champions is Golden Attraction (Mr. Prospector). Offered as [hip 455](#), the bay--a three-time Grade I winner at two--closed out the 1995 season with yet another juvenile filly title for Young. Other daughters out of the 16-year-old are [hip 460](#), Great Attraction (El Prado {Ire}); [hip 502](#), Marquee Attraction (Storm Cat); and [hip 619](#), Star Attraction (Storm Cat).

With a much smaller group on offer in the November line-up, Windfields presents eight head, including [hip 318](#)--Sweet and Careless. By Hennessy and out of the Desert Wine mare Not So Careless, the unraced 10-year-old mare is already responsible for Careless Jewel (Tapit), winner of the GI Alabama S. and GII Delaware Oaks. Slated to follow his dam one hip later is a bay colt by Elusive Quality. The Ontario-bred is from the family of Grade I winners Subordination (Mt. Livermore), Cacoethes (Alydar) and Fabulous Notion (Somethingfabulous).

E.P. Taylor, the founder of Windfields Farm, made his initial foray into Thoroughbred racing in 1936, paying \$800 for a gelding named Animessic. It wouldn't be long before the Canadian would purchase Parkwood Stable from Colonel Sam McLaughlin of McLaughlin Automobile fame and renamed the property The National Stud of Canada. Taylor, who became the first Canadian member of The Jockey Club in 1953, later sold that parcel of land before securing a new property --Windfields Farm--named after Taylor's first champion.

As the breeding operation flourished, it grew to 1,500 acres by the second half of the 20th Century and was later expanded to include a second farm in Chesapeake City, Maryland. Over the course of seven

decades, Windfields has been North America's leading breeder in purses won nine times; leading breeder of number of stakes winners 13 times and leading breeder by number of races won on 19 occasions. Windfields, which is responsible for 48 champions and 363 stakes winners, has also been Canada's leading racing stable 15 times and has captured Canada's Classic for three-year-olds--the Queen's Plate--a record 21 times.

Windfields also collected a pair of Eclipse Awards as outstanding

breeder, the first in 1977, followed by a second honor in 1983. Included among the famed horses to have been bred by Windfields Farm are 1959 Canadian Triple Crown winner New Providence, 1963 Canadian Triple Crown winner Canebora, Canadiana, Nearctic, Storm Bird, Vice Regent and Victoria Park. The fact that the empire is the only establishment in history to breed and sell three G1 Epsom Derby winners at public auction--Nijinsky II, The Minstrel and Secreto--is largely thanks to Windfields' most exalted production--Northern Dancer. Foaled in 1961, the compact bay won the G1 Kentucky Derby, G1 Preakness S. and Queen's Plate in 1964, en route to an American three-year-old championship and Horse of the Year honors north of the border. Northern Dancer's greatest legacy, however, resides in the breeding shed, having sired 23 champions and 77 graded stakes winners and 147 black-type winners. Additionally, the stallion helped Windfields raise the bar to new heights in the sales' arena when a yearling colt bred by Windfields became the first horse in history to bring \$10 million at Keeneland in 1983. Northern Dancer died in 1990 at Windfield's Maryland farm, but was returned to his birthplace for interment.

Taylor suffered a stroke and retired in 1980 and turned over the reins to his son, Charles. Taylor died in 1989, and Charles Taylor continued to manage the breeding and sales empire until his own death 1997 after which his widow Noreen and sister Judith Taylor Mappin took charge of the business.

Medaglia d'Oro Well-Represented as Covering Sire...

Yearlings by Medaglia d'Oro were in hot demand at the sales earlier this fall, with 65 selling for an average of \$246,212, good for eighth on the leading sire's list by that measure. Folks who own mares who were covered by the son of El Prado (Ire) last spring seem intent on striking while the iron's hot, with no fewer than 25 mares in foal to him catalogued during Keeneland Book 1, another 16 through the remaining books at Keeneland and a total of seven at Fasig-Tipton, meaning the leading second-crop sire, responsible for the all-world Rachel Alexandra, has 48 mares catalogued at the November Sales. Included among the mares is Grade I winner Intangaroo (Orientate) and Temperence Gift (Kingmambo), dam of Grade I winner Gozzip Girl (Dynaformer).

Lone November Mare in Foal to Theatrical Sells at Keeneland...

Theatrical (Ire) wasn't ever the most commercial of stallions, but as the sire of 55 graded stakes winners, 22 Grade I winners and the earners of nearly \$75 million, he was one of the most consistent sires in North America over the past 20 years. On Oct. 13, the 27-year-old was pensioned from stallion duties from Hill 'n' Dale Farms, and tomorrow the lone mare in foal to the stallion at the November sales will go through the ring. [Hip 168](#), the six-year-old Danehill Dancer (Ire) mare Cheerily (Ire), sells from the draft of Taylor Made Sales Agency. According to the Jockey Club, Theatrical bred just three mares last spring.

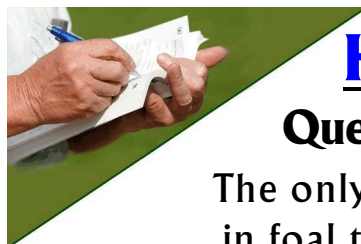

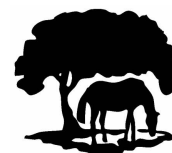
