NOVEMBER SQUARED

The sale season for bloodstock kicks off in earnest today with back-to-back sessions of the Keeneland November Sale and the Fasig-Tipton November Sale. Keeneland begins at 10:00 a.m. and has catalogued 244 horses on the first day of its 13-session marathon event. Up the road 9.72 miles at its Newtown Paddocks, Fasig-Tipton gets underway at 5 p.m. and has 153 horses catalogued for the single-session sale.

In Lexington yesterday, a bright Kentucky morning gave way to an overcast afternoon yesterday as buyers continued to filter into town from the Breeders' Cup and beyond. Action on the sales grounds at both Keeneland and Fasig was solid if not overwhelming, and most consignors and sale officials were resigned to the fact that they're selling in less-than-ideal conditions right now.

"In light of the economy, I think everyone's proceeding with caution," said Fasig-Tipton Chairman Walt Robertson. "But it feels pretty good here. We've got a lot of really

nice mares, and our babies are real good, also. We've had a lot of traffic, especially from abroad--Europe, Japan--and so we're cautiously optimistic. I think a lot of people out there see this as an opportunity to buy. We're seeing some faces we probably haven't seen in a while, and there are a lot of foreigners."

Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell agreed that foreign participants would make up an important part of the buying bench, and added that the tone at Keeneland would be set early. Asked if he expected the later books to struggle more than the early ones, he said, "It all depends on how the sale starts off. If people are getting knocked out and not getting what they want, they're going to have to stay around." **Cont. p2.**

SUMMER BIRD TO JAPAN CUP DIRT

Summer Bird (Birdstone), fourth in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, is one step closer to making his first start outside the United States after his connections accepted an invitation to compete in the Dec. 6 G1 Japan Cup Dirt, *Daily Racing Form* reports.

"I'm filling out my paperwork now, and [jockey] Kent [Desormeaux] is coming by to do his later this morning," trainer Tim Ice told *DRF* yesterday. "We're going to try to give Birdstone some international recognition." Summer Bird, winner of the GI Belmont S., GI Shadwell Travers S. and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, will remain at Santa Anita until he departs for Japan Nov. 17. The Japan Cup Dirt, contested at 1800 meters over Hanshin's right-handed course, offers a purse of ¥277,900,000 (approximately \$3 million).

RAINBOW VIEW REMAINING STATESIDE

George Strawbridge's champion **Rainbow View** (Dynaformer), fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic last Friday, will stay in training next year with Jonathan Sheppard, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Heroine of the 2008 G1 Fillies Mile at Ascot, the bay filly's lone win this season came in the G1 Matron S. at Leopardstown in September for trainer John Gosden. "She's only three, and we've got time," Sheppard told *DRF*. "We'll turn her out and get ready to do it again. We hope to have her ready for Keeneland." Sheppard added, "My idea is to keep her on turf." Rainbow View, a half-sister to Grade I winner Just as Well (A.P. Indy), will vacation at Sheppard's Pennsylvania farm.

A daughter of Grade II winner Skipping Around, Sugar Shake developed into a Grade I victress under the tutelage of trainer Bobby Frankel. The Adena Springs homebred won a trio of graded stakes, including the GI Santa Maria H. and GII El Encino S. and sells here in foal to Bernardini.

Retired after a 2008 season that included victories in the GI Personal Ensign S. and GI Ogden Phipps H., Ginger Punch sells in foal on an Apr. 22 cover to Bernardini.

Taylor S. and 2006 Flower Bowl Invitational S., while she placed in both the 2006 and 2007 editions of the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf. She has already gone through the ring twice at Fasig-Tipton November. The gray RNA'd for \$1.8 million in 2006, then was purchased for \$1.75 million by Adena Springs last year while in foal to Giant's Causeway. She is currently believed to be in foal to Adena's Ghostzapper.

Magical Fantasy was produced by the winning Kissing Gate, and is thus closely related to Group 1 winner Keen Hunter and Grade II winner Altibr, Kissing Gate's Diesis half-brothers.

My White Corvette also visited the sales ring last year. She was knocked down to Bobby Flay for \$825,000 at Keeneland November and returns here in foal to Unbridled's Song on an early Feb. 24 cover.

☆ FROM THE PUBLISHER ☆

The sport of Thoroughbred racing takes a lot of criticism, much of it justified. While other sports crown their champions in a year-ending, on-the-field contest that is above debate, or announces their weekly rankings through an easy-to-follow and inarguable points system, racing relies upon a controversial and antiquated system of opinion polling among certain segments of the industry and routinely draws fire from both inside and outside the sport for doing so.

I am talking, of course, about the annual vote for divisional champions and Horse of the Year. The controversy started before Zenyatta had even returned to the winner's enclosure, with ESPN commentators giving their own opinions on who the winner should be, and polling the winning connections as to what they thought.

We do so many things wrong in racing. Wouldn't it be great if we finally got this one right?

Racing should give both of this year's female stars--Zenyatta and Rachel Alexandra--the lasting honor they each deserve by naming them each Horse of the Year.

Who was better? It is unfair to make people inside and outside of the industry make that choice. An on-track meeting could have settled the issue. But without that meeting, it's impossible to say.

Didn't they both do everything they were asked to do every time they stepped onto the track? Are we really doing this filly, this mare--and their connections--justice by entering into a debate as to who was more successful, and choosing just one of them? The issue, really, is: where would our sport have been this year without either one of them?

Let's stage a meaningful Eclipse Award night that honors them both.

This time, racing needs to get it right.

They have called this the Year of the Girl in horse racing. Let's do the right thing and make it the Year of the Girls.

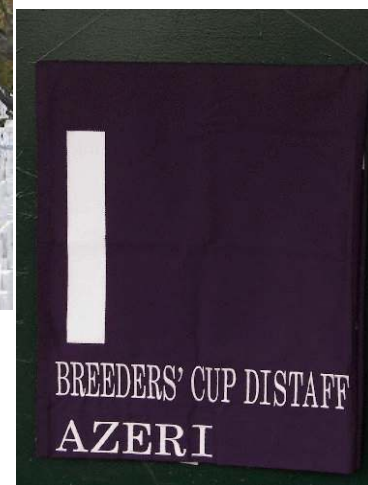

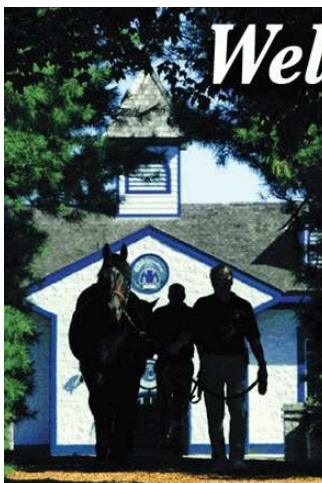

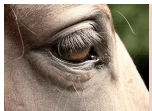

American racegoers with lengthy memories may recall that Green Desert also made the trip to Santa Anita for the Breeders' Cup back in 1986. The idea of a European turf sprinter defeating America's specialist dirt speedsters was considered sufficiently ridiculous for Green Desert to be sent off at 32-1, even though he had won two of Britain's best sprints. The betting proved correct, and Green Desert trailed home last of nine behind Smile. Coincidentally, Green Desert's son Oasis Dream also made the long journey to Santa Anita for the Breeders' Cup, but this very fast horse was also out of his comfort zone in the Mile and could finish no closer than 10th.

It was therefore good to see Green Desert make his mark on the latest Breeders' Cup via his stallion sons Oasis Dream and Invincible Spirit. Thanks to the admirably tough Midday and Visit, Oasis Dream was responsible for first and fourth in the F/M Turf (and was also represented by GII Las Palmas H. winner Tuscan Evening two hours later). The next day saw Invincible Spirit's son Vale of York show plenty of pluck in driving between Noble's Promise and Lookin at Lucky to snatch victory in the Juvenile, in his debut on synthetic.

There are some striking parallels between Oasis Dream and Invincible Spirit. Although both are out of mares with plenty of stamina in their pedigrees, both exhibited far more speed than stamina, as did Green Desert. Both have gone on to show themselves capable of siring juvenile winners in unusual quantities, while at the same time being capable of coming up with the occasional Group 1 winner beyond a mile.

At the moment I would say that Oasis Dream is the more likely to come up with high-class winners at a mile and a quarter or more, because his speed is balanced by his first three dams all being daughters of major mile-and-a-half winners.

The situation could change, though, because all four of Invincible Spirit's crops of racing age were sired at fees of only €10,000. In other words, his main supporters will have been commercial breeders intent on meeting the demand for fast and precocious two-year-olds. He got off to a flying start in 2006, ending the year as leading first-crop sire with a record number of 35 individual juvenile winners. Consequently, his fee shot up to €35,000 in 2007 and then to €75,000 in 2008 after his first-crop son Lawman recorded Group 1 victories in the Prix du Jockey-Club and Prix Jean Prat.

When I reviewed Lawman's pedigree in the TDN, I wrote: "Theoretically, if ever there was going to be a son of Green Desert suited to a mile and a quarter, it was going to be Invincible Spirit. He comes from a stamina-packed female line, starting with his dam Rafha, who followed up her victory in the Lingfield Oaks Trial over 1 7/16 miles with a game victory in the French Oaks.

The next dam, Eljazzi, was a daughter of the versatile Artaius and the stamina-packed Border Bounty. Border Bounty excelled with the top miler Petingo, notably producing the champion sire Pitcairn, whose son Ela-Mana-Mou made a big impact as a sire on Britain's long-distance races. Pitcairn's sister Dingle Bay became the dam of the top-class stayer Assessor, whose stamina stretched to 2 1/2 miles."

Invincible Spirit's €35,000 crop reached the yearling sales this year and the broodmare sires of his youngsters that achieved six-figure prices included With Approval, Galileo, Sadler's Wells and Shirley Heights. The shift in mare type can only have accelerated when Invincible Spirit's fee rose to €75,000. For example, Jim Bolger seems to have decided that the Irish National Stud resident is an ideal option for daughters of the stamina-packed Galileo.

Vale of York is the ninth Group winner and third Group 1 winner to emerge from the first four crops by Invincible Spirit, the other Group 1 winner being the fast filly Fleeting Spirit, who wasn't seen at her best in the Breeders' Cup Sprint. Vale of York had won nothing more important than a listed race in Europe, but had been beaten only a neck in the G1 Gran Criterium in Italy. He had appeared at the Craven Breeze Up Sale in April, when knocked down to his vendor for 65,000gns, but was then bought privately by Godolphin. **Caulfield cont. p12.**

Arguably the most interesting aspect of Vale of York's pedigree is that the third generation of his pedigree contains the outstanding brothers Kris (sire of Invincible Spirit's classic-winning dam) and Diesis (sire of the broodmare sire Halling). This means that the Juvenile winner is inbred 4 x 4 to both Sharpen Up and Doubly Sure. Although Sharpen Up spent a sizeable part of his stallion career in Kentucky, he was regarded primarily as a turf sire and the same applied to his son Diesis. However, Sharpen Up did sire a couple of Grade I winners on dirt (Dream Deal in the Monmouth Oaks and Conveyor in the Meadowlands Cup).

Vale of York's broodmare sire Halling will also be remembered primarily for his exploits on turf, which included repeat victories in two of Britain's best mile-and-a-quarter contests. Perhaps it is relevant, though, that he also scored four victories on the sand track at Nad Al Sheba.

Halling has since built a solid record as a sire, even though it took him an inordinately long time to come up with his first G1 winner (the 2009 Grand Prix de Paris winner Cavalryman). He was unlucky not to have done so several years earlier. His broodmare daughters have been faster off the mark in this regard, another of them being the dam of the 2008 E.P. Taylor S. winner Folk Opera.

Prior to the Breeders' Cup, I toyed with the idea of recommending Invincible Spirit as a mate for one of Juddmonte's Halling mares but was a bit surprised to find that Vale of York is the only smart performer so far with Kris in the top half of its pedigree and Diesis in the bottom half. There's also a Group 3 winner and a listed winner with Diesis in the top half and Kris in the bottom. Perhaps combining these two highly talented brothers hasn't been tried as often as I imagined, maybe because Sharpen Up's name has been associated (sometimes unfairly) with poor hocks.

Red Vale, the dam of Vale of York, is an unraced half-sister to Uraib. This Mark of Esteem mare was versatile enough to win stakes races at up to a mile and a half on turf and the Gill Buena Vista H. on dirt.

With Sadler's Wells as her sire and the Habitat mare Steel Habit as her dam, the second dam Hamsaat was a winning sister to the very smart Batshoof. She was also a sister-in-blood to three stakes winners sired by Sadler's Wells from Steel Habit's sister Zumnerudd, headed by the 1998 2,000 Guineas winner King of Kings. Steel Habit was herself a 3/4-sister to the top sprinter Steel Heart, so there is plenty of speed on both sides of Vale of York's pedigree. He showed no signs of stopping, though, at the end of the Juvenile, and--like most owners of Breeders' Cup Juvenile winners--Godolphin will probably now be having Kentucky Derby dreams.

said. "Galileo stands at something like €300,000, which shows you that this can be considered a bargain." The daughter of Tramore (Aus) (Danehill) was offered by Summerhill Sales, which consigned 108 of the 163 catalogued lots.

“We are very pleased,” said Mick Goss of Summerhill Stud. “With more fillies than colts for sale this year, we thought that the sale might yield lower figures, yet if

one looks at how well fillies are performing in the Ready to Run Cup, it is hardly surprising that buyers don't shy away from the females.”

The underbidder on the topper, Andre Macdonald, managed to secure the only other Galileo juvenile, a filly named Igugu (Aus), for R1 million.

Hailing from an Aga Khan family, the daughter of Zarinia (Ire) (Intikhab) was offered as [lot 114](#). “You win some and you lose some, but I am very happy with the one I got,” Macdonald said.

The third-highest price was R900,000, achieved by [lot 89](#), a Street Cry (Ire) filly that was purchased by trainer Charles Laird and owner Markus Jooste. “This filly hasn't got a great dam line, but I loved her as a specimen and she moves really well, too,” Laird explained. “We are pleased to have got the bid knocked down to us.” Just 14 of the 157 offered youngsters failed to make their reserve; 143 head sold for an aggregate R27,155,000. The average was R189,895, a 9.4-percent increase from the R173,636 achieved in 2008. “We are thrilled and, in fact, surprised with these results,” said Caroline Simpson, sales manager of BloodStock SA, which conducted the auction. BSA's CEO Jan Naude added, “There are lots of positives to be taken from the figures and the clearance rate of over 90 percent, which is on a par with 2008. Notwithstanding the economic downturn, Thoroughbred sales in South Africa continue to perform extremely well.” Complete results are available on www.tba.co.za.

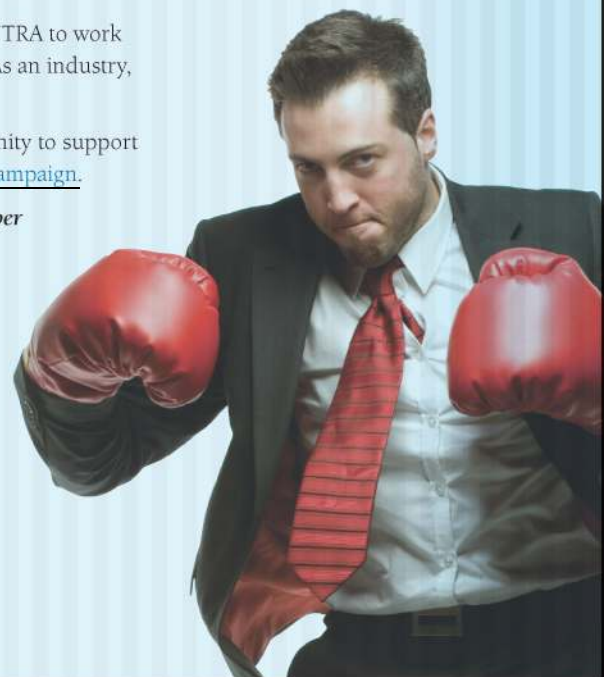
