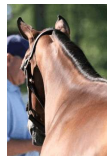

ONE IS ENOUGH AT KEENELAND NOVEMBER

Wick and Karen Hughes currently own just one mare, in partnership with several friends, but one is enough when she's producing session toppers. And it was the Hughes's hip **1431**, a weanling colt by Tiznow, that elicited the session-topping bid of \$265,000 from A Delaware Corp about a third of the way through the action at Keeneland November yesterday. Kevin and J.B. McKathan signed for the colt, a weanling-to-yearling pinhooking prospect. Meg Levy's Bluewater Sales consigned. The colt was produced by the unraced A.P. Indy mare Storm Front, whose third dam is the blue hen Battle Creek Girl (His Majesty). Her second dam is GSW Speed Dialer (Phone Trick), and she herself was produced by SW Storm Alert (Storm Cat). "He was an April foal, and so he was a little immature, but all these angles were right and he was very correct," Wick Hughes said of hip 1431. "He's by the right sire and, physically, he was just the right type of horse for the market. I think he'll develop into a spectacular yearling." **Cont. p9**

Passion for Gold opened his account at first asking with a five-length score in an Aug. 28 Thirsk maiden, and ran with credit when third to subsequent G1 Racing Post Trophy winner St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the Sept. 27 G2 Beresford S at The Curragh in his only other outing. Paying that conqueror a handsome compliment in this, he rose to the occasion and skipped through the mud to register a career high in dominant fashion.

Passion for Gold kept tabs on the leaders in a handy sixth for most of the contest as Beresford runner-up Layali Al Andalus (GB) (Halling) set modest fractions on the front end. Nudged along at the entrance to the straight, he swooped for control passing the quarter-mile marker and was urged further clear of toiling rivals thereafter to win handsomely. "Passion for Gold ran very well today," commented trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "He has improved since his last start, and he looked happier on the softer ground with the step up to a mile and a quarter. There are no plans for him at the moment, but he will be a better horse as a three-year-old. He is improving with every start and looks a nice prospect for next season." Jockey Frankie Dettori added, "He's one of the best two-year-olds I've sat on this year. He was very impressive, liked the distance and acted on the ground. He's got a lot of scope." Mary's Follies captured two in a row at Monmouth this spring, taking an allowance test on the main track in May and the Gill Boiling Springs S. on the turf in

June. The bay was sold privately to Paul Pompa Jr. after that effort. Making her first start under new management, she was second in the off-the-turf Gill Lake George H. at Saratoga July 31, then came back after a break to run sixth behind Careless Jewel (Tapit) in the Gill Fitz Dixon Cotillion S. at

Philly Park in her latest Oct. 3. The three-year-old was scratched from Tuesday night's Fasig-Tipton November sale, and still carried Pompa's colors yesterday. Settled in fifth through a half in :48.57 and six furlongs in 1:12.50 on the firm Churchill turf, Mary's Follies found her best stride when they straightened for home and finished with good energy to win going away. Trainer Rick Dutrow Jr., reached via telephone at his New York apartment, said, "She was training unbelievable for the last month. It looks like she might be just a grass horse. She's a nice little filly. The jock gave her a great ride, and she had a great trip. A Sovereign Award winner at three, Palladio continues to get it done at the age of seven. The bay earned his lone win of 2008 in the Gill Durham Cup in October, and ended the season with a fifth in this event in November and a seventh in the Gill Fred Hooper H. at Calder in December. After trailing the field home in the Jan. 24 Sunshine Millions Classic at Gulfstream, the Florida-bred earned a six-month layoff, then returned to the Woodbine all-weather and captured the Aug. 3 Gill Seagram Cup. He was fifth in the Sept. 5 Gill Washington Park H. at Arlington, and entered this test on the back of third-place finishes in the Oct. 4 Durham Cup and an allowance Oct. 23. 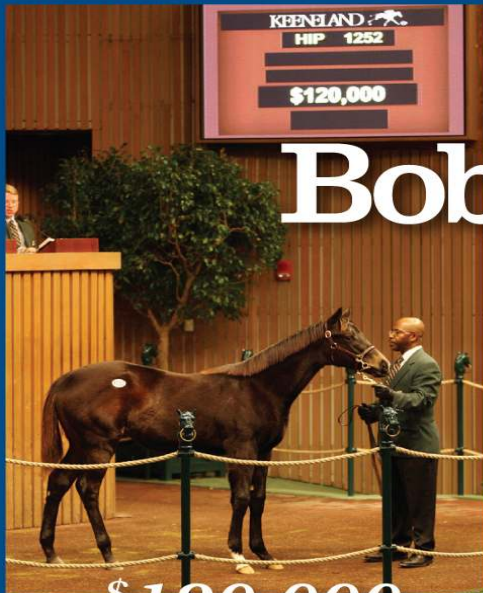

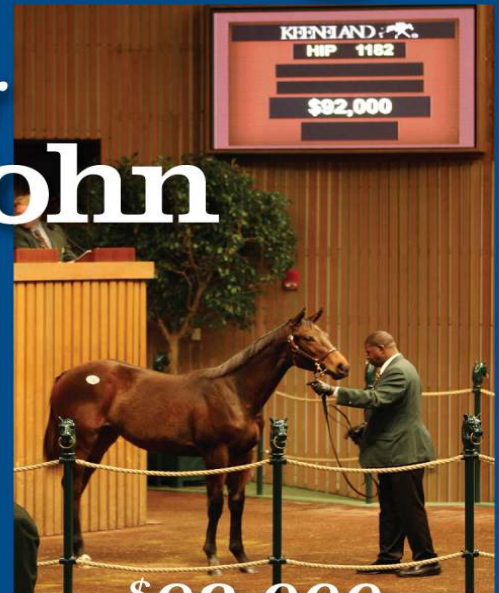

Buena Vista, Japan's champion two-year-old filly of 2008, seeks her first international Group 1 victory here. Winner of this year's Oaks Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) and Yashun Himba (Japanese Oaks), the sophomore was under consideration for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe before she disappointed when second in the Sapporo Kinen Aug. 23. She was second under the line in the Oct. 18 G1 Shuka Sho last time, but was disqualified and placed third for interfering with **Broad Street**, who was promoted to the runner-up spot. Never off the board in eight career starts, Broad Street posted a neck success in the Sept. 20 G2 Rose S. His Highness the Aga Khan's **Shalanaya** looks to become the first foreign horse to win this race. She enters this spot off a pair of victories at Longchamp: the Listed Prix de Liancourt Sept. 1 and the G1 Prix de l'Opera on the Arc undercard Oct. 4.

Stonestreet Stables' Dedini finished a clear second over Brazilian invader Odds On in the 15-horse field. Winner at two of his second start, the lightly raced Storm Chispazo entered off an impressive 12-length romp in a conditions event on the turf at San Isidro on Oct. 31. SUNSHINE MILLIONS PURSES CUT The purses for the 2010 edition of the Sunshine Millions, the event that pits Florida-breds against California-breds at Gulfstream Park and Santa Anita, have been cut. Citing the "sluggish local and national economy," officials announced that the purse for the Classic will be slashed in half, down to \$500,000; the Filly and Mare Turf will be worth \$300,000, down from \$500,000, and the Filly and Mare Sprint will have a purse of \$200,000, down from \$300,000. Those three events will be held at Santa Anita. At Gulfstream, the Filly and Mare Distaff and the Turf both were decreased from \$500,000 to \$300,000, and the Sprint was cut from \$300,000 to \$200,000. "We are very proud of what we've been able to accomplish with the Sunshine Millions both here at Santa Anita and at Gulfstream," said Santa Anita President Ron Charles. "In a relatively short period of time, we've been able to grow this competition into one of the most highly anticipated events on our calendar." But Charles added, "Given the current state of the economy, I think everyone understands why these purse reductions were necessary. It's just something that we had to do at this time, and we feel these adjusted purses will remain very, very lucrative to horsemen and will thus ensure another first-class day of competitive racing for our fans across the country." Those horses travelling cross-country to compete will continue to have their shipping costs covered. This year's Sunshine Millions will be held Saturday, Jan. 30.

BREEDER BERT LINDER DEAD Bert Linder, who for 50 years sent his yearlings through the ring at Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga sale, died Oct. 7 at his home in New York City after a long illness. He was 93. "When he was in his late 80s, he celebrated his 50th consecutive year of offering yearlings Saratoga," said Fasig-Tipton's Terence Collier. "I can say with near certainty that Bert Linder had the record for the longest-consecutive streak of consignments at Saratoga." Born in Brooklyn, Linder graduated from Williams College, attended the Yale School of Drama, and served as a combat infantry officer in the U.S. army during World War II. He was awarded Bronze Star, the Silver Star, the Purple Heart and the French Legion of Honor Medal, the highest decoration in France, for conduct during military service that saw him survive the D-Day invasion of Normandy and the Battle of The Bulge. "He was a man of great honor," Collier added. "Quite some time ago, he had a garment company that manufactured raincoats. His partner ran out on him, effectively ruining the business. He didn't declare bankruptcy, but rather decided to keep working until he paid off all the debts."

Linder, a lifelong horse lover, found escape from the war in the equine world.

In an anecdote in a *Blood-Horse* article eight years ago, Steve Haskins recounted, "I have this compulsive need to be around horses," said Linder...That compulsion began during his youth, growing up in Great Neck, Long Island, riding horses and being awestruck by the great polo players such as Raymond and Winston Guest. But nowhere was his obsession for horses more evident than in Normandy following the capture of Cherbourg. Linder, a first lieutenant, heard there was a German horse-drawn artillery unit on the outskirts of town, so he decided to find himself a horse to ride. With the ammunition depot ablaze and explosions all around him, he mounted one of the horses and rode back to his company, which had dug in nearby. As he approached, he passed a long line of German prisoners. When his men looked up, there was Linder riding a horse, with German prisoners behind him as far as the eye could see. He couldn't resist. As he rode by, he yelled over to his company, 'It was nothing, boys.'"

Linder purchased his first Thoroughbred mare soon after the war. What started out as a hobby became a career when he decided to give up point-to-point riding in the 1960s. Linder built a legacy at his 75-acre Hickory Hill Farm, a converted golf course in Dalton, Pennsylvania, that was responsible for the bloodlines that produced, among others, blue hen mare Obeah; champions Optimistic Gal, Deputy Minister, Go for Wand and Point Given; and Grade I/Group 1 winners Gone West, Known Fact, Lady Joanne, Tentam, Tappiano and Classy Mirage, herself the dam of this year's GI Three Chimneys Hopeful winner Dublin (Afleet Alex).

But it was not just in the Thoroughbred industry that he made a mark. "He was well-read, educated and versed in the arts," said Collier. "He was an urbane, charming and witty man--an all-around old-fashioned gentleman." Survived by his wife Mary Ellen and daughter Denise, Linder was predeceased by son Robert.

Justenuffhumor to Dubai...

Justenuffhumor (Distorted Humor), third in last week's GI Breeders' Cup Mile, is being pointed toward a winter campaign in Dubai, where he will join Godolphin's string under trainer Saeed bin Suroor. Conditioned by Kiaran McLaughlin this year, the four-year-old won Saratoga's GII Fourstardave H. Aug. 2 and the GII Bernard Baruch H. at the Spa Aug. 28. A sixth over soft turf in Keeneland's GI Shadwell Turf Mile Oct. 10 is his lone off-the-board performance in his last eight starts. "That's a good thing when they move over to the Godolphin team," said Artie Magnuson, assistant to McLaughlin. "That's always a positive thing for the future. We're just glad to be part of the process."

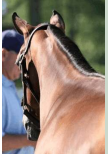

Tiznow Colt Provides Big Score for Small Operation...

The partnership that owns the dam of Saturday's session topper, the eight-year-old Storm Front, breeds as Pleasant Hill Partners. The group, headed by the Hugheses, bought the mare privately from G. Watts Humphrey when she was in foal to City Zip two years ago. They sold the subsequent produce--the filly Zipper Zapper--for \$11,000 at the 2008 September Sale. The filly had earlier RNA'd for \$27,000 as a KEEJAN short-yearling. Storm Front's second foal for the partnership, a filly by Broken Vow, RNA'd for \$27,000 as a KEENOV weanling before realizing \$40,000 at the September Sale a few months ago.

Despite the failure to sell those two as weanlings, Hughes and company were confident bringing the Tiznow colt to November.

"He's always been a nice-looking horse, and we just felt like the time to strike was now," Wick Hughes explained. "And we would have had another opportunity to sell him if we didn't get him sold here--we felt we could bring him back here as a yearling if we needed to. As it turned out, we didn't."

Asked about his expectations, he said, "I thought we might do OK, but our expectations were wildly exceeded. We were just hoping for a good, solid sale. We tend to wait until we get here and see how they're accepted before we start thinking about what they're going to bring. I knew he was a nice horse, and we were hopeful the stars would align for us--I guess they did."

Asked about Tiznow being picked as a mate for Storm Alert, Hughes explained, "I've always liked Tiznow. A lot of the decisions--as far as mating goes--are made between my wife and myself and other one of the partners, and we were all fans of Tiznow. We bred to him, I think, when he was \$30,000, and felt he was on the upswing."

Storm Front was catalogued one hip prior to her Tiznow colt, but was scratched.

"It was our feeling that, in this market, she probably wouldn't bring what she was worth," Hughes explained. "All the partners agreed to stay in on her, so we were able to take her out."

Hughes described the partnership as, "Just a couple of friends." He added, "We have spectacular partners that have supported us and stuck with us, because it wasn't always great. The City Zip didn't sell that well, and the Broken Vow we just kind of broke even on."

Hughes also praised Meg Levy and her staff at Bluewater.

"This is our first year that we sold with Bluewater, and they've been spectacular," he enthused. "It was a great move we made going there."

Hughes was born in Carlise, Kentucky, on Forest Retreat Farm, where his father was the farm manager. About eight years ago, he and Karen purchased a small 34-acre operation in Harrodsburg called Far Cry Farm. In addition to Storm Front, they keep eight other mares there, boarders owned mostly by close friends. Hughes is the equine manager at Shawnee Farm, which is located right next door to Far Cry.

"Far Cry's basically my wife's operation," Hughes said. "She takes care of things over there, and I have my day job at Shawnee."

Another few scores like the one registered yesterday, and Hughes might not need a day job.

Top Juveniles Provide Timely Updates...

Pedigree updates can be a seller's best friend, and two horses selling today are the beneficiary of big updates provided by a pair of top two-year-olds. First through the ring is hip 1723, a bay filly from the first crop of Grade I winner Lawyer Ron (Langfuhr). The

Apr. 21-foaled miss is a daughter of the stakes winner Naughty Notions (Relaunch) and thus is a half-sister to Negligee (Northern Afleet), who took one of the more important juvenile filly races this year when she upset the GI Darley Alcibiades S. here at Keeneland Nov. 6. A 9-2 chance in the GI Breeders' Cup Ju-

venile Fillies, Negligee finished sixth, but was beaten just 1 3/4 lengths by She Be Wild (Offlee Wild). Purchased privately by Sovereign Stable after running second in the Ontario Debutante S. at Woodbine, Negligee is trained by John Terranova. Eaton Sales consigns hip 1723, who was bred in Kentucky by Bill Justice and Stonewall Farm Stallions. Lawyer Ron was euthanized in July after standing his second season at Stonewall.

Later in the afternoon, hip 1874 will be sent through the ring from the Gainesway consignment. The dark bay filly is a half to the promising two-year-old colt Buddy's Saint (Saint Liam).

That one became his freshman sire's first stakes winner when, in his second start and while technically a maiden, he dominated the GII Remsen S. at Aqueduct by 12 lengths. Buddy's Saint, a \$100,000 Keeneland September yearling in 2008, hit the line first in his 6 1/2-furlong debut

at Belmont Sept. 26, but was demoted to second for interference. The colt is owned by Kingfield Stables and trained by Bruce Levine. Hip 1874 was bred by Roy Gottlieb and Morton Fink.

Up on the Downside...

Despite session numbers being down substantially from 2008, Saturday's fifth session at Keeneland seemed to have a good feel to it as trading continued in Lexington. On the day, 258 horses sold for \$10,837,000, for an average of \$42,004. That equated to a 24.44-percent drop in average. The median was \$32,000, down 28.9 percent, while the RNA rate of 19 percent was much stronger than last year's session figure of 31.10 percent. Midway through November's third book, 1,049 horses have sold for \$129,721,200. The cumulative average of \$123,662 is down 18.1 percent; the median of \$70,000 is down 10.8 percent. The cumulative RNA is 20 percent.

From auctioneer Cris Caldwell's perspective, trading was relatively lively Saturday.

"Going into today, we probably took a step down in quality from the prior days, but that's certainly to be expected going into Book 3," he commented. "But it still seems to be just as tough to buy a good horse today as it was earlier in the week. And I think it will remain that way right on through the weekend and, who knows, for maybe the next four, five days. We're getting so much trickle-down from people who couldn't buy a horse two days ago that are still here today and will be here tomorrow."

Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell commented, "I thought horses were trading very well. I think [the drop in average and median] just reflects the market. I think the most impressive thing is probably the clearance rate; there's trade going on to the four corners of the world, and I think that is the most positive thing at the moment. The consignors have done a very good job."

Leading the way Saturday was hip [1431](#), a weanling colt by Tiznow--Storm Front who was knocked down to A Delaware Corp. for \$265,000. Meg Levy's Bluewater Sales consigned.

"The market is very strong for the good ones, and there are very few of them," Levy said afterwards. "It's simple supply and demand. I am so happy for the breeders [Pleasant Hills Partnership], as there is nothing like a win, whether in the ring or on the track. It's why we do it."

The mare topper was hip [1466](#), the five-year-old Wagtail (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}). A representative for BBA Ireland, doing his bidding from inside the sale pavilion, landed Wagtail for \$210,000.

By the sire of Sea the Stars (Ire), the British-bred bay was a stakes winner England and is a granddaughter of Group 2 winner English Spring (Grey Dawn II). Wagtail produced a Mineshaft colt this spring, her first foal, and is believed to be pregnant to Sky Mesa. Three Chimneys, which stands the covering sire, consigned the mare.

BBA Ireland also purchased the second-highest-priced mare Saturday, the stakes winner P.S.U. Grad (Harlan's Holiday--Lo Cal Bread, by Native Prospector). Selling from the Bluewater Sales consignment as hip [1349](#), the dark bay was hammered down for \$200,000. P.S.U. Grad was catalogued as a racing or broodmare prospect. Originally a \$375,000 juvenile-in-training purchase at Barretts March, P.S.U. Grad raced for Mike Shustek and Don Stanley. She broke her maiden in the Barretts Debutante S. in her second career start in 2007 and ran second in the GIII Santa Paula S. the following season. This year, she was a solid third to Game Face (Menifee) in the GII Honorable Miss S. at Saratoga for trainer Bob Baffert.

Kim Valerio, who manages Shustek's East Coast racing interests, commented yesterday, "She was a beautiful physical. She had speed, which is what does it for people in breeding. And she's a tryer--she'll give you everything she has each time she goes out there."

Valerio and Shustek teamed for a big score earlier this year when Anchorage (Tapit), whom Valerio had purchased privately as a yearling for \$65,000 on Shustek's behalf, was the filly topper at Barretts March. The chestnut was hammered down to Demi O'Byrne for \$540,000. Shustek is based in Las Vegas.

"He's a great guy," added Valerio. "He really loves this game."

TURNAROUND

Unlucky for some, Friday the 13th, but maybe the black cat turned around and walked the other way for those of us on the horse sale side of the business. It's difficult to be certain--Keeneland's Book 2, like the rest of the sale, has been bolstered by the extra-strength Overbrook Dispersal, which included 52 horses (of 57 catalogued, with five outs) that grossed \$7,912,000 in Book 2. Overall, the dispersal generated \$28,919,000 (I think), a very significant 24 percent of Books 1-2 gross.

There were a couple of really positive up-ticks in Book 2, which suggest that, in our accelerated age of instant happenings, the November sales in 2008 came at almost the exact time of the collapse of the world's financial markets. But that the worst has happened.

If you take the view that the Southern Equine buyout of Hill 'n' Dale at Fasig last year equates in some fashion with Overbrook this year, we can at least look at comparative combined grosses with some confidence. Even with Southern Equine last year, the first five sessions of the 2008 November sales (Fasig November plus Keeneland Books 1 and 2) dropped \$99.9 million from the corresponding sessions in 2007--almost exactly one-third. Though the five sessions combined have dropped another 27 percent this year, how much of that is a function of a further decline in 'the catalogue', and how much is a decline of like-for-like, which after all is more significant? Hard to say.

But there are a couple of readings that you just can't see as anything other than positives. Though 10 percent fewer horses were catalogued in the five sessions this year, seven percent more sold (869 to 815) than in the corresponding sessions last year. This is entirely down to Keeneland Book 2, which is the most likely to be like-for-like as any of the 'tiers' of the November sales. With almost exactly the same number of horses catalogued as last year (799 vs. 800), and within one and a fraction percent of the number sent through the ring (614 vs. 622), no less than 17 percent more horses were sold (496 vs. 425). The clearance rate of those sent through the ring was 81 percent this year, versus just 68 percent last year. As a consequence, the Book 2 gross was up almost \$6 million, or 14 percent, from last year (see the Weekly Sales Ticker).

Here's what looks really significant, by which I mean it possibly gives us a real measurement of the market decline since 2007. In Book 2 this year, there were 496 listed sales from 799 horses catalogued--62.1 percent. In Book 2 in 2007, there were 495 listed sales from 796 horses catalogued--62.2 percent. In between, in 2008, only 425 horses sold from 800 catalogued--53.1 percent. That's when the sky actually fell. So, by 2009, the consignors had righted themselves after the collapse of 2008, and got almost exactly the same number of horses sold as in 2007, when the market was still at a peak.

And here's the reading: in 2007, Book 2 grossed \$71,012,000, and averaged \$143,459. In 2009, Book 2 grossed \$47,230,700, and averaged \$95,227. From 2007 through 2009, the gross dropped by 33 percent, the average by 34 percent. So if Book 2 is somehow representative of a 'true' market, the conclusion has to be that the market is off a third from 2007. In Book 2 (even with Overbrook this year), the market decline is less likely to be attributable to a decline in the quality offered, and more likely to tell us about like-to-like declines in horse prices.

The word from the trenches all week has been that it's been very tough to buy. Whatever it all says about the actual prices people are having to pay, the tempo could hardly be stronger: competition has been fierce. The best barometer of this is what's going on in the weanling market. We haven't tried to do overall comparative statistics on gross and average for foals across the two sales (for example, Bernardini had weanlings last year), but we did mine a few interesting figures from the results.

In Keeneland Books 1-2 plus Fasig, there were 610 weanlings catalogued. A massive 28 percent of them (169) were scratched, leaving 441 that went through the ring. A total of 341 (77 percent) were listed as sold (a small aside is that 310 of those [92 percent] were sold at Keeneland, and the median for those 310 was \$72,000).

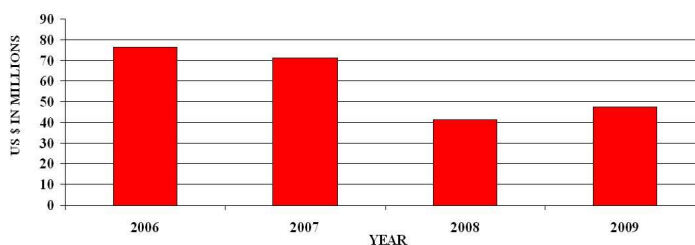

"A welcome tonic for the market, as Keeneland Book 2 saw 17 percent more horses sell than last year with almost exactly the same number catalogued; the clearance rate for horses sent through the ring jumped from 68 percent back to 81 percent, even higher than it had been in the peak 2007 year. Because Book 2 is more probably like-to-like than any other part of the sale, the calculations suggest we can now say prices have dropped by a third from 2007, though the big November crash was last year, and the market is much more holding its own in 2009."

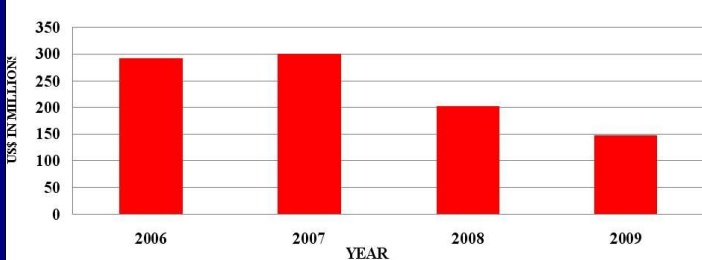

But the following looks significant: of the 341 sold, 133 (39 percent) brought \$100,000 or more. There were 79 (23 percent) that made \$150,000 or more, and 46 (13 percent) sold for \$200,000 or more, though just 15 (four percent) brought \$300,000 or more.

These figures contain no comment about production costs, but the numbers should really speak for themselves: if you could get your weanling sold (admittedly, just 56 percent of those catalogued did sell), you had just about a 40-percent chance of it bringing \$100,000 or more, a one-in-four chance of it bringing \$150,000 or more, and a one-in-eight chance of it bringing \$200,000 or more, with the top 15 foals selling for between \$300,000-\$440,000.

I think breeders can take a lot of heart from the strength of the weanling market. I doubt that 46 weanlings could sell for \$200,000 or more if weanling buyers believed the horse market was still in free fall. It seems to me a statement of confidence and, though Darley bought a few, by no means were they propping up the market.

How did you acquire For the Flag, dam of Vertigineux? I was at [FTSAUG] in 1979. She was part of the Newstead Consignment. [My trainer] Ian Balding fell in love with her. He said, "She's a bloody racing machine!" He called me recently to congratulate me on Zenyatta's success. I told him, "I owe it all to you, pal." I also want to thank Don Robinson, who has raised all my horses. He deserves as much credit as can be heaped on him.

Why did you decide to send Vertigineux to Street Cry? It was kind of the same theory behind why I sent her to Thunder Gulch [the mating that produced MGISW Balance]: he was from the Mr. Prospector line, he wasn't too big, and the cross worked well.

What is your favorite vacation spot? Melbourne. It's a great sporting city. There's always something to do: horse racing, cricket, golf or tennis. I also met my wife in Melbourne.

You represented a lot of rock 'n' roll bands and record labels during your time in the music industry. Do you have any favorite albums? Well, there's "On the Road Again" by Willie Nelson, but that's not really a rock album. I really like the Lynyrd Skynyrd album that has "Free Bird" on it ["pronounced 'leh-'nérd 'skin-'nérd"] or Sweet Home Alabama ["Second Helping"]. And I really like "Who's Next," which has the song "Baba O'Riley."

Do you have any anecdotes you might be able to share? I was in Orlando with my friend [record producer Glyn Johns] and The Who. They were about to start a new tour. We were staying in the Marriot, across from Disneyworld. We saw a group of young women in uniforms hitting a ball with a stick. Of course, they were playing field hockey. Roger Daltrey decided to challenge a girl who played for the Colorado high-school all-star team to a game. They made us wear uniforms and wigs. Roger played, Kenney Jones played, and I think "The Ox" John Entwistle played. I don't think Pete Townshend played. We didn't know the rules, so we would raise the sticks above our shoulders. The girls played with skill; we played with stupidity. We tied 1-1.

One of the attached tables lists the 26 stallions that had one or more weanlings hit the \$200,000 crossbar. Bernardini tops with four, followed by Dixie Union, 2007 Kentucky Derby winner (and first-year Darley sire) Street Sense, Tiznow and Unbridled's Song with three each. The other table, taken from the Instatistics section of the TDN website, shows the top 10 first-year North American sires of weanlings (three or more sold, through Friday), covering all sales up til now. One can't help noticing, can one, that the top three sires on this list were all part of Darley's estimated \$200 million 2007 stallion prospect spending spree. Looks like it worked, at least as far as jumping to the head of this table goes.

STUD FEES AND OTHER CONTROVERSIES

New stud fee announcements are coming out daily, so this is an item that will have to be updated as we learn more, but so far, Lane's End gets the prize for Most Righteous 2010 Stud Fees, of those we knew by Saturday morning. A.P. Indy and Smart Strike, each two-time champions on the General Sire List, have each had their stud fees cut by 40 percent--A.P. Indy from \$250,000 to \$150,000, and Smart Strike from \$125,000 to \$75,000. Bravo. Dixie Union, now a proven sire of high-class two-year-olds, stays at \$35,000, when he might have gone back up; and Candy Ride, one of five highly successful North American second-crop sires in 2009, goes to \$25,000 from last year's bargain-basement \$12,500. Four of the five have now had stud fees announced, by the way (still waiting for Speightstown, at WinStar, which is imminent, and also likely to be reasonable). Besides Candy Ride, Gainesway hikes Tapit from \$35,000 to \$50,000 and Birdstone from \$10,000 to \$30,000, both quite reasonable, I'd say; and Medaglia D'Oro--who just got his first Group 1-winning colt yesterday with Passion for Gold's runaway win in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud--goes to \$100,000, from \$40,000.

This highly promising brigade was exempt from the trend to declines, and in all cases they look like horses who should be deservedly popular at their 2010 prices. They deserved to go up. Also getting brownie points for their 2010 prices are Hill 'n' Dale, for leaving current number two Freshman Sire Roman Ruler at \$20,000 (and yes, Kate, special mention and thousands of brownie points to Darley for leaving Leading Freshman Sire Offlee Wild at a bargain-basement \$7,500 even after She Be Wild's G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Filly win), and Three Chimneys, which drops successful third-crop sire Sky Mesa from \$30,000 to \$25,000. Bravo, bravo, bravo.

HORSE OF THE YEAR: Interesting comments, and one thing they really highlight is the question: what are the criteria for Horse of the Year? Those of us with votes will be fascinated to refresh our memories when the NTRA directive on the subject is issued to Eclipse voters. But here's a thought--it's not necessarily about the fastest horse of the year, or even the horse with the best form. I'm not for Zenyatta strictly because she won the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, beating colts and breaking Personal Ensign's unbeaten record in the process. I'm for Zenyatta just as much because, in a sport that has been threatening to sink without trace from American public consciousness following Barbaro's horrible breakdown in the 2006 GI Preakness, and Eight Belles's horrible breakdown after finishing second in the 2008 GI Kentucky Derby, Zenyatta's win over the colts in the Breeders' Cup Classic actually got some ink, and restored a modicum of respectability to our sport in the wider public eye. She achieved more than even Rachel did in that hugely important sphere--those Americans who have only the mildest of interest in whether horse racing continues to exist in this country or not. That's why--unless they tell me that's not a valid criterion--she gets my vote.

FINALLY, a tip of the hat, thank you, bon voyage and best wishes in his retirement to Keeneland's long-serving (I almost said long-suffering) Director of Communications, Jim Williams. Jim has been at Keeneland since most of us were pups--and he was, too--and this November sale is his very last in the green jacket. I'm sure I speak for all the journalists who have worked with him over the years when I note Jim's retirement really does mark the end of an era. He's served under three Keeneland presidents, seen us through two big boom periods in the horse business, and two consequent crashes, and we're pretty sure he's looking forward to a much quieter and more sensible retirement. Best wishes, Jim, and thanks again.

Moore was originally aiming Collection for the Cathay Pacific International Mile Trial next Sunday, but opted for this longer test. "We felt the best way to get mileage into Collection's legs for the Cup next month would be to run him over the 2000m on Sunday," Moore explained. "Having said that, on Tuesday his work was a little bit too slick; it was a seriously searching gallop, and I hope it didn't take too much out of him."
