### 'MOON' LANDING AT KEENOV

The Overbrook dispersal once again produced a session topper at Keeneland November, with a weanling colt by Malibu Moon leading the way Sunday. Total Dispersal Bloodstock purchased the bay for \$250,000. Stepping into the ring as hip [1775](#) just into the third hour of trading, the colt touched off a spirited bidding duel that centered just under the press box. In the end, it was Brian Kalmar and his father Dale Kalmar who landed the son of the 10-year-old Restless Cat (Storm Cat), a full-sibling to Hennessy and GISW Pearl City (Carson City), among others. The Kalmars said the colt would be re-offered as a yearling. Eaton Sales is handling the Overbrook consignment.

"He was big and beautiful," Brian Kalmar said after signing the ticket. "He's got a great pedigree behind him, and Malibu Moon is a sire that people like. There was really nothing not to like about the colt. He was the best colt today, and was the best I saw in a number of days."

The Overbrook dispersal also produced Wednesday's highest-priced transaction, the sale-topping \$3.1-million Honest Pursuit (Storm Cat), as well as Thursday's topper, the \$875,000 Lasting Appeal (A.P. Indy).

The market for weanlings continued to be strong Sunday--accounting for seven of the top nine lots on the day--and Brian Kalmar said he and his father had to stretch to land the Malibu Moon colt.

"It was more than we wanted to pay, because, at the September Sale, we were trying to sell horses, and it was tough," he explained. "But the market here has been very strong. I think people were thinking there were going to be a lot of good buys, but because of the lack of good weanlings here, there's a funnel effect and everyone lands on the same ones. I'm just hoping the momentum for this will carry on to next year. There aren't going to be any shortages of yearlings next year--I think a lot of people held onto [their weanlings] and, hoping the economy improves, will sell them as yearlings next year, instead. But I also think that some people who held back, seeing how it's been here, wish they would've come." **Cont. p2**

Stressing quality of quantity, the Kalmars typically pinhook five or six yearlings each year, and also are involved in the yearling-to-juvenile market. Dale Kalmar operates Welcome Gate Farm in Ocala, which sits near the Eclipse Training Center.

"We also bought a Speightstown weanling here, and bought a Street Sense weanling over at Fasig-Tipton earlier in the week," said Brian Kalmar. "We'll bring them down to Ocala and let them decompress. We'll prep them down there, then bring 'em back up for the yearling sales. My dad has a great facility."

Brian Kalmar added that, while the current correction the marketplace is undergoing is painful to many horsemen, it was necessary.

"There are less horses being bred each year, and there are going to be fewer horses that will be worth more," he said. "What happened, needed to happen. There were a lot of horses being bred that weren't the quality they needed to be."

**Buddy's Saint Sib Goes for \$230,000...**

Hip 1874, a weanling filly by Rock Hard Ten--Tuzia, received arguably the most significant update in Book 3 when her half-brother Buddy's Saint (Saint Liam) announced himself as a Triple Crown hopeful when he

rolled home by 12 lengths in the GII Nashua S. at Aqueduct Nov. 7 (video). Backed, too, by a smart pedigree and a handsome physical, the filly elicited the second-highest bid Sunday, making \$230,000 on Mesquite Ranch's winning offer.

Hip 1874 was produced by the 15-year-old SW & GISP Tuzia (Blushing John), a half-sis to MGSW Midway Road (Jade Hunter) and four other stakes horses.

"This filly appealed to a lot of serious horsemen and sold particularly well," said Gainesway's Michael Hernon. "She was well beyond her reserve, and we're delighted we sold her."

The transaction rewarded the decision by the filly's breeders, Roy Gottlieb and Morton Fink, to buy back her dam at the 2009 Keeneland January Sale--with her in utero. It was actually the second time Gottlieb and Fink made the correct decision to buy back Tuzia. Put through the January Sale in 2007, the mare RNA'd for \$95,000 while carrying a member of Saint Liam's first crop. The resulting foal, Buddy's Saint, brought \$100,000 last year at September. Returned to January 11 months ago, Tuzia failed to meet her reserve when bidding stalled at \$27,000.

“When we bought the mare back at January, we had been trying just to get the stud fee,” Hernon explained.

“We advised them to take the mare back and foal her out. We had sold the Saint Liam [Buddy’s Saint], and he was a pretty nice colt. We figured he had a shot to do something, but we had no idea he’d be as good as he is. He’s a 12-length winner of the Nashua and he runs back in the GII Remsen S. [at Aqueduct] in two weeks. He ran a 101 Beyer Speed Figure and is one of the best two-year-olds in the country.”

Gottlieb and Fink are property developers who are based in Chicago.

**Grand Slam, Malibu Moon Mares Bring \$170,000...**

Two mares shared top billing Sunday, both bringing bids of \$170,000. First through the ring was hip [1732](#), the three-year-old Malibu Moon mare Ocean Moon. A winner at two, the mare sold in foal to First Samurai from the Highclere Sales consignment. Ocean Moon is a half-sister to the smart European juvenile King Ledley (Stormin Fever), who placed in three group events in Ireland this season and competed in the GII Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Turf, running 10th, beaten six lengths. Ocean Moon’s dam is the Mt. Livermore mare Mt. Kobla, a half-sister to this year’s GI Florida Derby winner Quality Road (Elusive Quality).

Also bringing \$170,000 was hip [2004](#), the stakes-winning six-year-old Grand Slam mare Fast Deal. Offered by Eaton Sales as part of the Overbrook dispersal, Fast Deal was hammered down to B. Wayne Hughes’s Spendthrift Farm. She was mated to Lemon Drop Kid this past spring, but sold not in foal. The mare hails from a deep Phipps family, with Inside Information and Educated Risk under the third dam.

**RED RANSOM DIES** Red Ransom (Roberto--Arabia, by Damascus) died Saturday at Vinery Australia, according to *Racing Post*. The 22-year-old stallion suffered complications after undergoing intestinal surgery. In a promising career cut short by injury, Red Ransom made just three starts, winning twice and setting a five-furlong track record of :56.4 at Saratoga. He began his stud career in 1991 at Vinery in Kentucky and stood at Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket from 2004 through 2008. Red Ransom is the sire of 2006 G1 Dubai World Cup winner Electrocutationist, as well as champion turf mare Perfect Sting. He also sired group winners Ransom O'war, Intikhab, China Visit, Ekraar, Bail Out Becky, Casual Look, Charge Forward (Aus), Trail City, New Economy, Fairly Ransom and Wandering Star. He was represented by his 13th Group/Grade 1 winner last week when his All American (Aus) captured the G1 Cantala S. Mares by Red Ransom have produced 37 black-type winners, including Pico Teneriffe, the dam of champion Marchfield (A.P. Ind); My Annette, the dam of multiple Group 1 placed U S Ranger (Danzig); and Kelli's Ransom, the dam of graded stakes winner Regal Ransom (Distorted Humor) and Grade I winner Devil May Care (Malibu Moon).

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races.

**DIAMONDRELLA JOINS STEVENS BARN** IEAH's **Diamondrella (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who failed to sell at \$1.1 million at last week's Fasig-Tipton November sale, has joined the Southern California barn of trainer and retired Hall of Fame jockey Gary Stevens. The five-year-old mare is being pointed towards the Nov. 28 GI Matriarch S. "I got a surprise call early Thursday morning," said Stevens. "[IEAH's] Michael [Iavarone] informed me that she was coming. It was a big confidence booster." Diamondrella won three of five starts this term for trainer Angel Penna, including the GI Just a Game S. and GI First Lady S. She was 11th in the Nov. 7 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint.

Get Stormy, looking for his fourth straight victory, took a Saratoga allowance July 29 before winning the Aug. 29 Lure S. in upstate New York. He was coming off a 1 1/2-length win in the Oct. 18 Gill Bryan Station S. at Keeneland. The bay colt went right to the early lead, setting fractions of :23.57, :47.19 and 1:11.68. He turned back all challengers in upper stretch and then just held off the late rush of Street Move for a narrow score. "We had a great post to go straight to the rail and try to harness some of my speed," said winning rider Javier Castellano. "I don't want to take anything away from the horse. He was very sharp today and felt great. I tried to make him relax a little today. He got some pretty easy fractions up front. When I asked him to take off for home, he responded very well and opened up for me. He is really starting to mature and turn into a nice horse." Owner Mary Sullivan added, "He's moved up a lot and now he's going to have a rest until his four-year-old year. He's done well enough to go home and take it easy for awhile." Despite on-line push, racing remains at core

The second day's trading at Goffs November sale sees the first of four weanling sessions, a one-day reduction on last year's five-day sale. The book has been reduced from 1280 to 860, which may induce another fall in overall take following last term's drop of over 50 percent. Foals representing 121 different sires are catalogued, including first-crop foals from Amadeus Wolf (GB), Dylan Thomas (Ire), Excellent Art (GB), Invasor (Arg), Manduro (Ger), Red Clubs (Ire), Strategic Prince (GB) and Teofilo (Ire). The sale is promoted as a source of pinhooking success, and graduates to have uplifted the sale's profile this term include **Paco Boy (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}), who added to last year's G1 Prix de la Foret win with a victory in June's G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot; last term's G1 Golden Jubilee S. hero **Kingsgate Native (Ire)** (Mujadil), who came back from an aborted stallion career to garner July's G3 King George S. at Glorious Goodwood; six-length G2 Coventry S. winner **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}; **Radiohead (GB)** (Johannesburg), who backed up Royal success in the G2 Norfolk S. with placings in the G1 Nunthorpe S. and G1 Middle Park S.; and G2 Richmond S. victor **Dick Turpin (Ire)** (Arakan). Highlights of this year's intake may include Silfield Bloodstock's Hip **759**, a Dutch Art (GB) half-brother to G1 Prix de l'Abbaye heroine Carmine Lake (Ire) (Royal Academy), and Cahermorris Stables' Hip **856**, a full-brother to the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas victress Saoire (GB) (Pivotal {GB}). "Goffs priority this year is to focus on quality throughout the calendar and that theme is central to the November Foal Sale," added Beeby. "We have targeted the best bred foals in Ireland, and Irish breeders have worked with us to provide buyers with a more concise yet superior catalogue of top quality foals. Highlights might include The Aga Khan Studs' Hip **1023**, **Elasouna (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest), a full-sister to G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner Edabiya (Ire) (Rainbow Quest) offered in foal to Dylan Thomas (Ire); Hip **1073**, **Kastalana (Ire)** (Key of Luck), an unraced half-sister to the 2006 G1 Irish St Leger winner Kastoria (Ire) (Selkirk); and Derrinstown Stud's Hip **1014**, Ghazal (Gone West), a full-sister to Elusive Quality offered in foal to Invincible Spirit (Ire). "As with all Goffs sales, the focus was on quality when compiling the November Breeding Stock catalogue, and we are delighted that vendors have supported us and produced a catalogue that is an excellent representation of the best of Irish bloodlines," continued Beeby. # TDN & A

Come this Thursday, Nov. 20, Jim Williams will officially head into well-deserved retirement exactly 28 years and 19 days after first starting as Keeneland's director of communications. Yesterday, the *TDN* sat down with Williams in his corner office and talked about some of his favorite memories at Keeneland, the origins of the term RNA, and what he and Lynn, his wife of 36 years, have planned for the future.

## When did you first come to Keeneland?

I came to work Nov. 1, 1971. I remember writing a recap for the entire year of 1971, and vaguely remember that the gross sales total--for the entire year--was \$30 million. There were four sales then--the January, July, September and November sales. At that time, there was no April sale. We sold two days in July, four or five days in September, four or five days in November and usually two days in January.

## What do you remember from those early days?

It's interesting, my predecessor was J.B. Faulkner, who was also the sales announcer. He was the one and *only* sales announcer. I wasn't able to announce--it just wasn't my forte. So we had to look for an announcer. We first used Chic Anderson, who was the guy who called Secretariat's phenomenal win in the Belmont. That didn't work real well--Chic was announcing at Churchill at the time--and so ultimately we found Tom Hammond. I'd known Tom and suggested he had the presence of an announcer, because he did local sports. And he knew the game very well--Tom grew up in the game and even worked on the backstretch of Saratoga. So we put him up in the sales box with George Swinebroad, who was the auctioneer. George was a very dominant figure--a bigger-than-life figure--but he and Tom hit it off.

## What do you remember about Swinebroad?

He had this booming voice, and a booming presence, and he always bragged, he'd say, "I've hired and fired and kicked in the behind" --but he wouldn't say behind--"to the point where I have the best auctioneering crew in North America--including the bidspotters." George claimed he was responsible for the use of bidspotters. I don't know if history would bear that out, but it's certainly possible and it's a good story.

I got along with George. He was an intimidating figure, but was really a nice man. He was very much a part of the Keeneland team.

**Some of our readers might be interested to learn that you helped coin the phrase RNA--or reserve not attained. Before that, each horse was listed as sold, whether it was bought back or not.**

At one time, the sales office provided names whenever there was a "charge back," when a horse didn't meet its reserve. And there wasn't a lot of comfort with that, and we discussed it a number of times through the years of just how to refer to them. Do you call them charge backs? That's what we called them internally. Do you call them not solds? Some people were uncomfortable with that, because it sounded negative. We talked about it--I think it was Ted Basset and me and maybe some others--and we came up with the term 'reserve not attained,' and thus the RNA. This was probably the late 1970s.

## Why wasn't that the standard practice previously?

There was a stigma attached to a horse not selling, and people didn't want to list them as not sold. But the right thing to do was to put on the sales sheets that the horse was not sold.

## What are some of the big changes in your tenure here?

When I came around, the July sale was the centerpiece of the whole year. We would sell in the afternoons and then again in the evening. The auctioneers and bidspotting crew all wore tuxedos. The sales pavilion was overflowing with people; the townspeople would crowd into the corridors. In fact, on several occasions we considered the idea of using tickets, to limit access into the pavilion to people involved in the sales.

Nobody wanted to sell at the September sale--nobody wanted to be relegated to September. I actually give (Keeneland Director of Racing) Rogers Beasley a lot of credit. He redesigned the September sale and put an emphasis on quality at the beginning of the sale. Before that, we sold by consignor seniority. This was around the mid-'80s, I guess.

Another big change has been who's buying the horses, particularly on the American side. In the early times I was here, most of the purchases were made by trainers or principals, and now you have more and more influence by bloodstock agents. There was also a very distinct line between commercial and non-commercial breeders. Again, there was a stigma attached to horses being sold by non-commercial breeders--why aren't they racing them? As horses began bringing more and more money, more and more people became sellers.

**What do you recall about some of Keeneland's important milestones?**

I was here--as a teenager, I suppose--watching through the window at the old sales pavilion, when Keeneland sold its first horse for over \$100,000. In the '60s, that was a lot for a horse. Then I remember the first million-dollar horse that was sold here (Canadian Bound, by Secretariat--Charming Alibi, who sold for \$1.5 million at the July sale in 1976).

It was interesting, because George Swinebroad died in 1975--he was having heart surgery and died in surgery. So, (auctioneer) Tom Caldwell sold the following year, and when we reached that milestone of a million, I remember Tom saying from the auction stand, "How we doin,' George?" George would have been very pleased with that.

**Any other sale moments stick out?**

One particular sale that I remember was Wajima (By Bold Ruler, who sold as a July yearling in 1973), and the fact that it was done in two bids. Someone opened up at \$500,000, and the winning bid was \$600,000. That was a lot of money for a horse back then. I can't remember who made the opening bid, but it might have been Tom Cooper. *(Editor's note: Wajima was the highest-priced yearling ever to sell at public auction at the time. Consigned by his breeder, Claiborne Farm, Wajima was purchased by James Scully on behalf of Japanese breeder Zenya Yoshida. He would go on to win four Grade I's, including the GI Travers S. and GI Marlboro Cup H., and was named champion three-year-old male in 1975. He was later syndicated for a record \$7.2 million)*

**How'd you first get into racing?**

My family moved here from Northwest Pennsylvania in 1958. My father had a business relationship with W.T. Young Storage. When we got to Lexington, Mr. Young--who would become so prominent in racing but wasn't involved at that point--asked his father, Willis Young, to show us around Lexington. Willis had a woman that worked for him, and she brought us to Keeneland. That's how I got into it. Eventually, I began working for the papers. I covered the Derby when I was 18 years old for the Lexington *Herald-Leader*. It was the year Lucky Debonair won (1965).

**So what now?**

Well, our falls are totally occupied here, by the September sale, then the October race meet, then the November sale. So we're here, literally, six or seven days a week from Labor Day to Thanksgiving. So I'm looking forward to having some flexibility with my time. I'm a great fan of racing and hope to spend a lot of afternoons here at Keeneland and come back to see friends at the sales. I'll play a little golf, and travel a little more than we have in the past. We'll probably seek out some warmer locales in late fall and early spring, but we plan to stay here in Lexington.



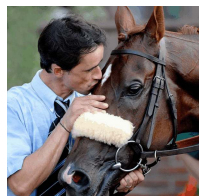
