KEENELAND NOVEMBER WRAPS UP

The Keeneland November Breeding Stock sale ended its 13-day run yesterday in Lexington. When all was said and done, 2,779 horses sold for \$159,727,800, which represented a 13.92-percent drop from the

\$185,552,300 grossed during last year's 15-day sale. The average price of \$57,477 was down 6.48 percent, while the median of \$20,000 remained unchanged from last year. Five horses eclipsed the \$1-million mark this year, compared to 19 in 2008. While the final

figures were down slightly, the RNA rate was a strong 21.59 percent, and the sale concluded with an air of optimism, spurred by the highly successful dispersal of Overbrook Farm and wide international participation. Topping the event was the \$3.1-million mare Honest Pursuit (Storm Cat--Honest Lady), who was sold by Eaton Sales, on behalf of Overbrook, to Wertheimer et Frere.

"Entering the 2009 sales season, the forecast was uncertain and market confidence had waned," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "Overbrook deserves credit for putting confidence back in the market. The Overbrook dispersal selling without reserve provided a base from which the market could appraise. As a result, there was strong trade and hope that the market has now moved beyond its low point." Keeneland Coverage cont. p3-5

TATTS DECEMBER YEARLINGS TODAY

Tattersalls' one-day December Yearling Sale begins in Newmarket at 10 a.m. this morning hot on the heels of one of its biggest ever successes. This month's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Vale of York (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) was bought for just 23,000gns by breeze-up consignor Adrian Costello at last year's sale. There has been a strong demand all year for well-bred yearling fillies and, [hip 159](#), a full-sister to this season's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud runner-up Mikhail Glinka (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), is one that should have plenty of appeal. She is offered by the Castlebridge Consignment for breeder Paul Makin's Paulyn Ltd and is out of a full-sister to G1 Epsom Derby winner Sir Percy (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}). Among Galileo's other offerings are [hip 196](#), a Juddmonte-bred colt out of the listed winner Short Dance (Hennessy); and [hip 203](#), a filly who is the first foal of GI Garden City Breeders' Cup S. winner Luas Line (Ire) (Danehill). The sale features the final three yearlings by the great Sadler's Wells available public auction. The last of the trio is [hip 202](#), a colt who is a full-brother to G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner Sequoyah (Ire), herself the dam of four-time G1 winner Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo); G1 Fillies' Mile heroine Listen (Ire) (Sadler's Wells); and the unraced Liffey Dancer (Ire), who became the dearest yearling filly sold at Tattersalls when she made 2.5 million guineas at the 2007 October sale. MR. SIDNEY TO HARAS DU QUESNAY GISW Mr. Sidney (Storm Cat--Tomisue's Delight, by A.P. Indy) will stand at stud at Haras du Quesnay in Normandy, France, it was announced today by Lee Einsidler and

Daniele Churchill, who campaigned the horse under their Circle E Racing Stable, and Alec Head, the stud farm's owner. He will stand for an introductory fee of €9,000. A \$3.9 million KEESEP yearling, the five-year-old captured the GI Maker's Mark Mile at Keeneland and the GI Fire-

cracker H. at Churchill this season. The bay is out of a full-sister to Horse of the Year Mineshaft, the multiple Grade I winning millionaire Tomisue's Delight. Of the decision to send Mr. Sidney overseas, Einsidler said, "We weighed offers, both domestically and internationally, but we thought going to France would give Mr. Sidney the best chance for success as a stallion. Bill Mott, who trained him, has known Alec Head for many years and has trained for him. That relationship gave us a degree of comfort, as did the recommendation of Bill, who was really responsible for the horse's success." While he raced strictly in America, Head is confident that Mr. Sidney will have no trouble finding demand in Europe. "I think that Mr. Sidney will cross well with the European mares," he said, adding, "He is a very well-made horse, by stallion of the century Storm Cat, who has been successful all around the world. His dam is a winner of two Grade Is, his granddam [Broodmare of the Year Prospectors Delite] is also a multiple Grade I winner, which already is rare. When you go back in his pedigree, you have Storm Cat, A.P. Indy and Mr. Prospector, three of the best." Pedigree expert Andrew Caulfield agreed. "French breeders are sure to give Mr. Sidney a warm welcome, not only because he is a Grade I-winning miler, but also because his pedigree combines some of the most influential American stallions of recent decades," Caulfield said. "Between them, Storm Cat, A.P. Indy and Mr. Prospector topped the North American sires' list a total of six times."



RACING Round-Up

Einstein Works for Clark; Maragh Picks up Mount...

Stronach Stable's **Einstein (Brz)** (Spend a Buck) worked a half-mile at Churchill yesterday as he prepares for Friday's GI Clark H. at the Louisville oval. The seven-year-old stopped the clock in :48.60 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:01 early Sunday morning under Kelly Likes.

Pitts-Blasi has worked Einstein in the past, but opted for Likes on Sunday for the work over a fast track. "I wanted to take some weight off him, and Kelly is lighter than I am. And I could watch him,"

Pitts-Blasi said. Einstein is coming off a disappointing 11th-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, the worst showing of his 29-race career. "I have no answer," Pitts-Blasi said of the Breeders' Cup. "We

couldn't find anything. He went very well this morning and I was pleased." Pitts-Blasi also confirmed that jockey Rajiv Maragh will get the mount in the Clark, as regular rider Julien Leparoux will miss the final two days of the meet to ride in the Japan Cup. Among the Clark challengers will be **Macho Again** (Macho Uno), who bested Einstein in June's GI Stephen Foster H. at Churchill.

Kitalpha Kiddies Top Keeneland Finale...

Topping Sunday's session was hip [4490](#), a weanling colt from the first U.S. crop of Kingmambo's full-brother Kitalpha (Mr. Prospector--Miesque). Selling as property of War Horse Place, which stands Kitalpha, the Apr. 15-foaled bay was hammered down to Dr. Lisa Lex for \$100,000. The colt earned a timely update when his six-year-old half-brother Twin Sparks (Twin-ing) captured his first black-type event in Saturday's Caballos Del Sol H. at Turf Paradise. Twin Sparks lowered the world record for six furlongs in the process, stopping the clock in a blistering 1:06.59. The dam of both is the stakes-winning Sparklin Lil (Mr. Sparkles).

War Horse Place also consigned the day's second-highest-priced horse, another weanling by Kitalpha who made \$85,000 to the bid of Michael J. Morrison. Catalogued as hip [4411](#), the filly is a daughter of the five-year-old Forestry mare Mama Bear from the family of Albert the Great.

Kitalpha Shows Promise for Small Operation...

Though the name **Kitalpha** may be unfamiliar to some, the 10-year-old stallion, sire of Sunday's top two lots at Keeneland, boasts some of the stud book's best bloodlines. By Mr. Prospector and out of champion Miesque, Kitalpha is a full-brother to Kingmambo. Bred by the Niarchos Family, Kitalpha was put into training with Henry Cecil, but suffered a career-ending knee injury. Eventually, the chestnut landed in Zimbabwe in Africa to stand stud, and the story of how he found his way back to Kentucky, where he was foaled, and to his current home at Dana and Gerry Aschinger's War Horse Place in Lexington, is one of patience, perseverance and even some international intrigue.

Gerry Aschinger relates the story, "I had begun to circulate my name among people that I wanted to buy a stallion for War Horse Place. In the past, we had always bought stallions shares, but we decided that we wanted to be the primary purchaser of a stallion. [In 2007] Dick Lossen, a bloodstock agent, told me there was a full-brother to Kingmambo in South Africa that needed to be relocated. He was standing in Zimbabwe, and the country was in the process of confiscating race horse farms. So they shipped him out in the middle of the night to Johannesburg, and we had to buy him in a very quick period of time while he was in quarantine there."

Kitalpha's journey to Kentucky, however, wouldn't be an easy--or quick--process.

"It took 120 days to get home," Aschinger explained. "No country will take a stallion out of South Africa for breeding purposes, except an island off the coast of South Africa called Mauritius. So we shipped him there, and he was in quarantine there for 40 days. The next country that would accept him was the Netherlands. Then we shipped him to Paris, from Paris to New York, and finally, he was accepted into Kentucky after being accepted into North America. But he had to be quarantined one more time in Kentucky, so he wasn't able to cover his first mare until Mar. 26, 2008." *Cont. p4*

Despite the late start, and with very little time to advertise, Kitalpha covered 67 mares to him last year, and this year his book included 130 mares. He also got additional 22 mares on Southern Hemisphere time this year.

In addition to a superb pedigree, Kitalpha was something of a sire sensation in Zimbabwe when his first foals made it to the races.



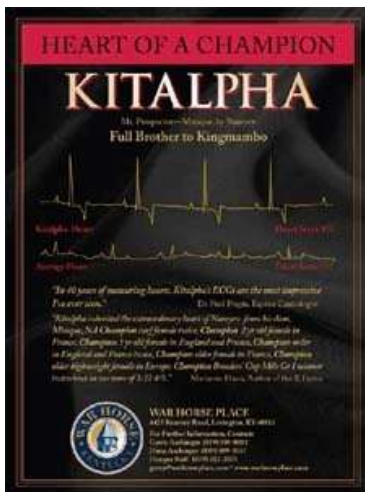

“When we bought him, the early indicators were that he was throwing runners,” Aschinger said. “He had one crop to race at that point, which included the champion two-year-old [Frogwatch {Zim}], and he had several other stakes horses. We decided that, based on his pedigree, he might be a Kingmambo.”

While they didn't know it when they purchased him, the Aschingers would have another reason to think Kitalpha might be a genetic gem in the mold of his brother. Both stallions, as it turns out, have heart scores that are well above average.

“Shortly after we got to Kentucky, Marianna Haun, who wrote the book ‘The X-Factor,’ called me and said that she was quite certain, based on Miesque, that Kitalpha would have a large heart,” Aschinger said. “So she suggested I have a

colleague of hers, Dr. [Fred] Fregin, score his heart. A few days later, Dr. Fregin called. He said it was the largest heart he'd scored in 40 years of doing heart work. When Kitalpha came to the farm, the Niarchos family came and saw him. Afterwards, they asked Dr. Fregin to measure Kingmambo's heart, and they're identical. If you took the names off the results of the tests, you couldn't tell them apart. Kingmambo has a 157, just like Kitalpha.”




Dana and Gerry Aschinger have been involved in the horse business for 30 years as breeders. Based in Florida and Ohio at various times, they purchased War Horse Place--on the old North Ridge property--in 2002.

“It was always called the War Horse Division of North Ridge, and we just retained the name,” Gerry Aschinger explained. “We consign some, do sales prep and specialize in mare care. We have six of our own mares and about 45-50 on the farm altogether.”

Aschinger said he decided to sell Sunday's two weanling toppers after receiving several inquires from buyers looking to buy privately.

“Most of the people that breed to Kitalpha breed to race, and I had four or five people who came to the farm to look at his weanlings and made inquiries about buying them,” Aschinger said. “No one was interested in selling--everybody loved theirs. So I decided to sell two commercially, and told everyone that had come and asked that they would have to buy them at public auction.”

Yesterday's results proved that that was the right decision. And with 70 mares already booked to Kitalpha for the 2010 season--during which he will stand at a fee of \$12,500--the future looks bright for a horse you might not have even heard of. -L Marquardt

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ...AT THE SALES

Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell:

"The Thoroughbred market is best described as resilient. The strong clearance rate reflects the fact that horsemen are adjusting to the new reality. Consignors did a good job of appraising their horses. Throughout the industry, changes are taking place--a reduced number of mares bred, reduced stallion fees, and other measures that will insure a return to market profitability in the near future.

"The financial crisis struck in the middle of last year's September [Yearling] Sale, so the 2008 November Sale felt the brunt of the impact. There was still uncertainty about the economy this past September. Since then, certain segments of the global market, such as Australia and South America, have rebounded. We've also begun to see positive indicators at home. So, in terms of the yearling market, we may still be in the middle of the recession. But the broodmare market is a little farther along in its recovery."

[Hip 179](#) is a first-crop Hurricane Run (Ire) half-brother to recent G2 Las Palmas H. winner Tuscan Evening (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}), who sold for \$650,000 at Fasig-Tipton earlier this month. [Hip 195](#), the already-named Planet Waves (Ire) (Red Ransom), is a half-brother to this season's G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner Termagant (Ire) (Powerscourt {GB}). He was bred by Denis O'Flynn's Old Carhue Stud and is offered through the Castlebridge Consignment. [Hip 212](#), a Rathasker Stud homebred by High Chaparral (Ire) who was bought for €110,000 in utero at the 2007 Arqana December Sale, is a sibling to three black-type winners. Shadwell are selling an Act One (GB) half-sister to this season's G2 Royal Lodge Stakes second Waseet (GB) (Selkirk) as [hip 94](#) while [hip 46](#) is a Sleeping Indian (GB) half-sister to this season's G2 Norfolk S. winner Radiohead (GB) (Johannesburg). NOVEMBER MARATHON WINDS DOWN Goffs' November Sale concluded yesterday with the second half of the Breeding Stock section witnessing a fall in figures, which was at odds with the increases seen with the foals. Both the cumulative average of €17,955 and median of €10,000 represented 28-per-cent year-over-year declines.


"We have been satisfied with the two days' trading and especially the really lively day yesterday, which has enjoyed a much improved clearance rate reflecting the buoyancy of the market," Goffs Chief Executive Henry Beeby commented. "Whilst the other statistics may be down, we are not despondent as they reflect a smaller catalogue which has perhaps lacked some of the stars of last year. Our challenge for the future is to convince some Irish breeders that they will achieve the very best prices for their best mares at Goffs, just as they have for foals earlier this week and yearlings at the Orby Sale. By entirely focusing on the horse in 2009 and producing tighter, more quality-driven catalogues, we have returned vibrant trade at our flagship sales and, whilst that may result in a reduced turnover for Goffs in the short term, it has been universally praised and means we are laying solid foundations for the future."

Hugo Merry Bloodstock took home the two top-priced mares when paying €100,000 for the four-year-old **Fourpenny Lane (GB)** (Efisio {GB}) and €95,000 for the 10-year-old **Najayeb** (Silver Hawk) in foal to Bahri. The former, consigned as [hip 1342](#) by Portlester Stud, captured the Listed Cooley S. at Dundalk last week and hails from the family of the 2005 G3 Round Tower S. winner Abigail Pett (GB) (Medicean {GB}).

"She's been bought for a client, who was involved in horses like Archipenko (Kingmambo), to go to the Dubai Carnival, but it's possible that she might take in a Listed race at Lingfield next week on the way there," Merry commented. "She's a good filly who has won on turf and Polytrack and will hopefully do well out in Dubai."

[Hip 1330](#) Najayeb, from Knockatrina House Stud, is a half-sister to Sakhee (Bahri) and is responsible for Waseet (GB) (Selkirk), who had the subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Vale of York (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) behind when runner-up in the latest renewal of Ascot's G2 Royal Lodge S.

"We were actually underbidder on Najayeb here last year when she made less, but she is carrying a three-parts sibling to Sakhee and she has been bought for Sonha Stud where Noverre now stands," Merry added, before expanding on the destination of his purchases this week, "The mares that we've bought are for leading stud farms in India. I've been buying for India since 1991 and have built up a good relationship with various leading farms in conjunction with Gautam Kotwal, who is India's premier bloodstock agent. We've had lot of success with various mares that we have bought in utero and who have then gone on to produce Guineas and Derby winners in India." **Cont. p8**
