Five six-figure lots helped Tattersalls' December Yearling Sale bounce back from a disappointing 2008 renewal to produce a solid trade in Newmarket yesterday, led by the sale of a Galileo (Ire) filly ([lot 159](#)) for 275,000gns. The full-sister to Aidan O'Brien's recent

G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud second Mikhail Glinka (Ire) is out of Lady Karr (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}), a full sibling to G1 Epsom Derby hero Sir Percy (GB). She was bred by Paul Makin's Paulyn Ltd and sold through The Castlebridge Consignment. The Duke of Bedford, a Tattersalls director who owns Bloomsbury Stud

in partnership with his mother Henrietta, Duchess of Bedford, had the successful bid. Blandford Bloodstock's Tom Goffs was the underbidder. "She's going to John Hammond," said the Duke. "You can't buy a more exciting page and let's hope she's as good as her brother, who looks a very exciting prospect. My partner in the stud is not best pleased and I suspect in time I'll be looking for another partner!" *Cont. p2*

## Tattersalls December Sale Yearling Sale

Andrew Tinkler, CEO of the Eddie Stobart haulage firm, has made a splash at this year's horses-in-training sales and he paid 210,000gns for another well-bred filly (lot 212) through agent Dwayne Woods. The daughter of High Chaparral (Ire) is out of Diamonaka (Fr) (Akarad {Fr}) and is a sister to three black-type winners from a top Lagardere family. "She was a really nice filly," said Tinkler. "It's a good page and she will be not just for racing, but hopefully, we can breed from her in the future. We picked out a few and Dwayne has helped us narrow down the list and this filly was top of the tree. She's going to Tom Dascombe, whose

Trainer Amanda Perrett outbid Tom Goff to get a Pivotal (GB) colt (lot 161) out of Grandalea (GB) (Grand Lodge). The chestnut cost 16,000gns as a foal, but 190,000gns as a yearling when offered through Brendan and Ger Morrin's Pier House Stud yesterday. The colt missed the October yearling sale because of an elevated temperature. "He's for John Connolly, who has been a great supporter and gets a couple of nice young horses each year," said Perrett. "This was a lovely big, rangy horse and I'm delighted to get him. We'd been looking at the earlier yearling sales for something by a good stallion and from a decent family. Unfortunately, we kept meeting Sheikh Mohammed and Sheikh Hamdan and I think we'd have had trouble buying this colt at those sales."

The brilliant Sadler's Wells has no foals on the ground this year, so his final three yearlings to be offered at public auction were sold yesterday. They were headed by a 160,000gns colt out of Group 1-placed L'Anresse (Ire) (Darshaan) (lot 186) knocked down to Tom Goff. "He's for an owner who keeps horses with John Gosden and was as nice a middle-distance colt as I've seen here today," said Goff. "He was the best model out of the mare and he's out of a Darshaan mare, so it's a stallion's pedigree."

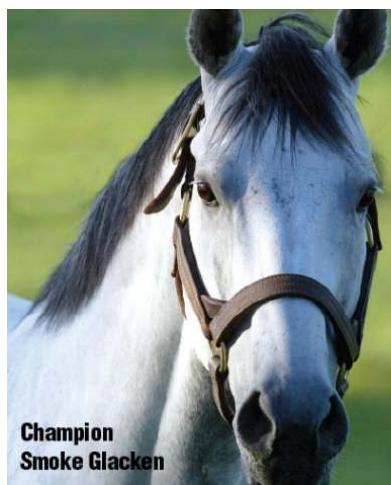
The sale's 3,486,700gns turnover was up 75 percent on last year. The 11,000gns median increased by 29 percent, while the 22,789gns average rose by 18 percent. There was a solid 78-percent clearance rate. The December Foal Sale begins tomorrow.

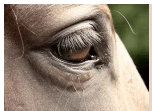

Compared to the feast of the Breeders' Cup weekend, last week was a bit of a famine at the higher levels, with the possible exception of Tiznow's son American Lion (who, with a bit of luck, will be even more deserving of attention after the GI CashCall Futurity in four weeks' time).

In the circumstances, I am taking the opportunity of looking back to She Be Wild's victory in the GI Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, which could easily mark a significant turning point in the career of her sire Offlee Wild.

When Darley America announced its stud fees for 2010 prior to the Breeders' Cup, Offlee Wild was the joint-cheapest of Darley's 16 stallions at \$7,500.

The son of Wild Again had started out at double that fee in 2006, but the fact that he didn't attract a three-figure book in any of his first four seasons indicates that he isn't as highly fashionable as several of Darley's other young stallions.

The explanation is that Offlee Wild isn't a son of such as A.P. Indy, Street Cry or Distorted Humor, but of Wild Again, winner of the inaugural Breeders' Cup Classic at odds of over 30-1 in 1984.

Don't get me wrong. There was a great deal to admire about Wild Again's stallion career. The son of Icecapade was responsible for over nine percent stakes winners among his 943 foals, with around four percent winning at graded level. He just wasn't flashy.

Wild Again also sired plenty of two-year-old winners, which is pretty much essential in an industry where arguably too much attention is paid to speed and precocity. However, the striking aspect of his career was his ability to come up with durable performers which improved with age. For example, his sons Elmhurst and Wild Event recorded their best victories in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at the age of seven and the GI Early Times Turf Classic at the age of six, respectively.

Gigawatt, Chicago Six, Shine Again, Smile Again, Wild Event and Winfama were sons or daughters of Wild Again which gained their last graded stakes success at the age of six, while El Amante and Madame Pandit were five when they gained theirs. This list was extended in 2002 and 2003 when Milwaukee Brew completed his fine double in the Santa Anita H. at the ages of five and six.

The five-year-old Offlee Wild added his own name to this lengthy list when he defeated Tap Day and Pollard's Vision to take the 2005 GI Suburban H. over a mile and a quarter. In the process, he became the last of Wild Again's Grade I winners, which also included Sarava (Belmont S.), Wild Rush (Metropolitan H.), Vicar (Florida Derby) and Wild Escapade (Hopeful S.).

Offlee Wild's record had typically been one of steady progression. After breaking his maiden over six furlongs at Churchill Downs at two, he became a Grade III winner at three and a Grade II winner at four prior to his Suburban victory at five, when he also won the GI Excelsior H.

Admirable though he was, I rather doubt that Offlee Wild would have won a place at a prestigious Kentucky farm, judged purely on performance. After all, he failed at four and five to reach the qualifying mark of 115 required for an American horse to be included in the World Rankings for older horses.

Fortunately, there is more to stallion success than pure performance and any shortcomings on Offlee Wild's behalf were more than compensated for by his coming from a family with an eye-catching record for producing successful stallions. His dam Alvear is a winning half-sister to Dynaformer and his second dam, the Grade I-winning Andover Way, was a half-sister to the talented stallion Darby Creek Road. Andover Way was also closely related to Kelley's Day, dam of the highly accomplished Japanese stallion Brian's Time.

Perhaps Kentucky breeders also remembered that they had let a very good stallion slip through their fingers when Wild Rush was sold to Japan for \$1.5 million in the summer of 2003. Although the decision to sell looked highly sensible at the time, this son of Wild Again was to salvage his reputation with numerous graded winners, headed by Stellar Jayne, Hollywood Story and Dream Rush.

Despite Offlee Wild's record of improving with age, his daughter She Be Wild is now the winner of four of her five juvenile starts, her only defeat coming when

she was caught on the line in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. Her broodmare sire Seeking the Gold raced only once at two, but he can surely take some of the credit for She Be Wild's Juvenile Fillies victory, as he was directly responsible for two previous winners of this race in Flanders and Cash Run (as well as for a

Distaff winner in Pleasant Home). Interestingly, another of Seeking the Gold's daughters produced a regular Breeders' Cup contender in Riskaverse, a mare sired by Offlee Wild's relative Dynaformer.

She Be Wild's dam, Trappings, fell a long way short of Breeders' Cup standard, failing to win in eight attempts. Trappings has some strong bloodlines, though. In addition to being by Seeking the Gold, she is out of a mare by Triple Crown winner Affirmed. She Be Wild's third dam Lilya's For Real, a sister to the smart sprinter Shananie, had two daughters which produced graded winners, notably Lizeality, dam of the Grade I winner Carson Hollow.

In the Weekly Sales Ticker of Nov. 15, Brianne's table showed us two significant statistics relating to Keeneland Book 2 of the Kentucky November sales. First, the key indicators showed that tier of the market had stabilized or improved since last year: with the number catalogued virtually the same as last year (799 to 800), and a similar high 22-23 percent withdrawal rate, the number of horses sold, of those sent through the ring, jumped from 68 percent to 81 percent; and the number sold, of those catalogued, jumped from 53 percent to 62 percent. The gross increased by 14 percent, and the average dropped just two percent, from \$97,068 to \$95,227. No doubt the Overbrook Dispersal in Book 2 improved all those figures, but they didn't distort them. Book 2 was the strongest tier of the November market.

What we also saw in the Nov. 15 Sales Ticker is that a truer measure of the market is not to compare it to last year, when the November sales took place during global economic free-fall, but to 2007, when things were still riding high, in fact had reached new record levels. Assuming that Book 2 pedigrees are less likely to vary as dramatically as other tiers from year to year, we could see, from comparing Book 2 in 2009 with Book 2 in 2007, the number sold was almost exactly the same (496 in 2009, 495 in 2007), and the percentage of the catalogue listed as sold was almost exactly the same (62.1 percent in 2009, 62.2 percent in 2007). So, after plummeting to 425 sold in 2008 (only 53.1 percent of the catalogue), clearly consignors have adjusted to the new reality, because they sold almost exactly as many this year as they did during the last of the peak times, 2007. So it seems inescapably significant that the Book 2 gross dropped 33 percent from 2007 to 2009, and the Book 2 average dropped 34 percent. Book 2 horses are down a third in two years, and I think that's as close to a description of the "real" horse market as we're going to get. In November Sale terms, a \$95,227 horse in 2009 was comparable to a \$143,459 horse in 2007--the respective Book 2 averages.

This tier becomes even more significant when you realize how it compares to the tiers above and below it. The overall November Sale market totaled \$188.2-million this year, down 52 percent from 2007 (see Weekly Sales Ticker), when it grossed a record \$392.9-million. If the overall market is down by half, yet the Book 2 tier is measurably down by a third, you can bet your bottom dollar the other tiers must have been off even more. So it is, though analysis of both the top tier (Keeneland Book 1 plus Fasig-Tipton

November) and the bottom tier (this year, Keeneland Books 3-7) is complicated by the fact they are off both in quantity (number catalogued and offered) as well as price. If fewer good horses are offered, the gross will be down a certain percentage just because of that. There were 20 percent fewer horses offered in the three top-tier sessions this year. Coincidentally, there were also exactly 20 percent fewer horses offered in the bottom tier this year, too. Actually, there were five percent more horses catalogued in 2008 than in 2007, so, although 2007 was the peak year for prices, 2008 was the peak year for number catalogued--part of the reason why the sold/catalogued percentage dropped nine percentage points, from 62 percent in 2007 to 53 percent in 2008, before rebounding to 59 percent for both November sales combined this year.

Combining the factors of fewer being offered and lower prices, the November top tier was down 57 percent in gross, to \$100,156,500 from \$230,533,000 in 2007. Another way of putting it is that's \$130-million in lost sales, though arguably--in spite of Overbrook this year and Southern Equine last year--a significant portion of that \$130 million is horses that might have been offered in 2007 but weren't offered in 2009. Then there's the bottom tier: down 20 percent in horses catalogued in 2009, down 55 percent in gross from 2007. **Cont. p7**

This is just too much of a coincidence:

Top tier (Kee Book 1 + Fasig): number catalogued down 20 percent from 2008; gross down 57 percent from 2007;

Bottom tier (Kee Book 3 on): number catalogued down 20 percent from 2008; gross down 55 percent from 2007;

Whereas:

Kee Book 2: number catalogued virtually same in 2009 (799) as in 2008 (800); gross down 33 percent from 2007.

I think it's fair to contend that, if we could measure it horse-for-horse like I think we can in Book 2, prices for breeding stock in North America are down a third since peaking in 2006-2007. Combined with the strength of the Australian dollar (and the efforts, says Keeneland Sales Director Geoffrey Russell, of Keeneland's Australian representative, agent Vin Cox), a whole contingent of Australians went straight to Keeneland from the Melbourne Cup (fortuitous timing this year; usually it's run on the same day as Keeneland's opening Tuesday session, the second day of Book 1). Keeneland reports 44 horses sold to Australian billing addresses, totaling over \$7.6 million (average over \$172,000). When you add in purchases for Australia such as those by Adrian Nicol of the BBA Ireland, the total is sure to be over 50 horses and \$10 million--close enough to 15 percent of the horses sold in Book 1 and 15 percent of the money spent. The Yoshida family and other Japanese interests also reappeared to take advantage of lower U.S. prices.

This Australian invasion looks to me a highly significant development, analogous to the Japanese build-up of their breeding industry (which included the purchase of Sunday Silence, who went to stud there in 1991) the last time American and European horse prices crashed, in the late 1980s and early 1990s. One of the innovations which reversed that decline was the widespread development of dual-hemispheric stallions, and there were a certain number of American and European-bred fillies and mares going down to Australasia at the same time. As in South America, many of these were castoffs from top "first-world" families. Their success, and that of mid-range American stallions like Mutakddim, Bernstein and Put It Back in South America, all suggest the Australians are right to try and buy from North America and Europe to upgrade. Only this time they're not just buying the culls and castoffs; now they're in the thick of the action, running off domestic and European "first-world" buyers for Book 1 horses. Word is the Australians are heading for Newmarket in force next week, too. Look for them to be a big factor at Tattersalls' December Mare sale. **Cont. p8**

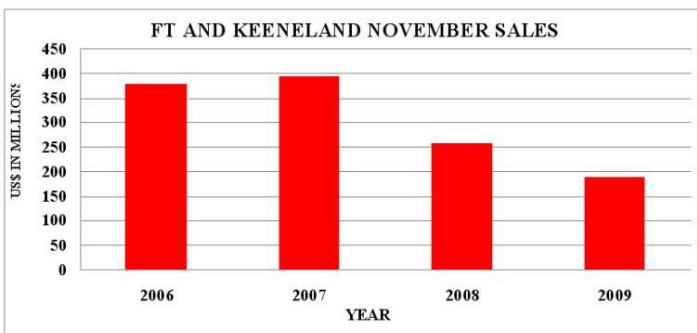

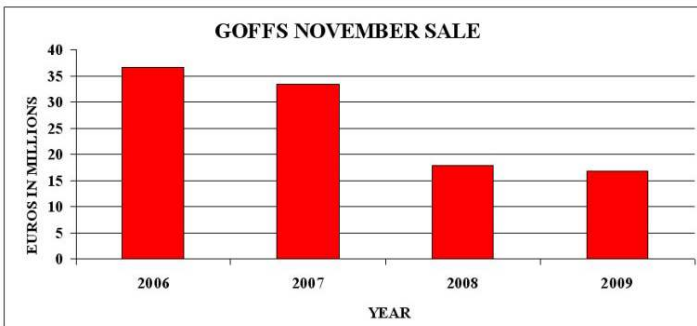
"When we combine Fasig-Tipton's one-day sale (\$28.5-million this year) with Keeneland's 13-day gross of \$159.7-million, we can see the Kentucky November sale markets grossed \$188.2-million, down from \$255.8-million last year and just under \$393-million in 2007. The gross has dropped by 52 percent in two years, the average by 40 percent. There has been a significant recovery in the clearance rates, though. Goffs mirrored Kentucky: gross down 49 percent in two years, average down 37 percent. But there has been plenty of money this month for what has been on offer."

**Move Over, Sheikh Mo...**

Meanwhile, at Goffs...the worst go first at the Goffs (last week) and Tattersalls (this week) foal sales. Their best weanlings sold last Friday, and from all the reports that word 'fierce,' as in 'fierce competition,' kept coming up again, just as it had at Keeneland. After the bottom-tier foals did pretty much what bottom-tier horses are doing everywhere--fewer sold, less money--and the good foals sold fiercely, they were followed by two days of mares and fillies, it all totaled up with similar characteristics to Keeneland. With essentially one day less of bottom-tier foals, they catalogued 16 percent fewer horses for the sale overall but sold 10 percent more, as the clearance rate of those through the ring improved from 54 to 69 percent, and from 44 to 57 percent of those catalogued. The gross dropped only five percent from 2008, the average 13 percent. But the really significant numbers, compared to 2007: gross down by half (49 percent), average down by 37 percent. It's in line with the Kentucky market, and for the same reasons.

There was even a parallel to Keeneland's export market, in the person of buying dervish Hugo Merry, who, in concert with leading Indian bloodstock agent Gautan Kotwal, signed for no fewer than 79 fillies or mares for eight different breeding farms in India on Saturday and Sunday at Goffs.

It would have made even Sheikh Mohammed sit up and take notice: there were 304 horses sold on Saturday and Sunday, and Merry bought more than one in four of them--26 percent. The sale grossed €5,458,500, and Merry accounted for 31 percent of it--€1,712,000. "We benefited from an outbreak of CEM in sport horses in England," said Hugo when I spoke to him on Sunday morning. "Their misfortune meant our clients couldn't buy in England this year, so we always knew this sale was the target. Irish Thoroughbred Marketing does a great job of organizing things for them, too--cars, drivers, hotels, whatever they need. I've been going to India for almost 20 years. I have a lot of respect for them--these buyers are smart businessmen, successful in their own right--and I'm lucky to work with Gautan, who is the premier bloodstock agent in India." A logistical nightmare, I assume? How do you sort out 80 mares for eight different interests? "We have a great team," laughed Hugo, "and lots of lists." So that's more evidence that the emerging 'second world' racing nations are stocking up on 'first-world' pedigrees. *Cont. p9*

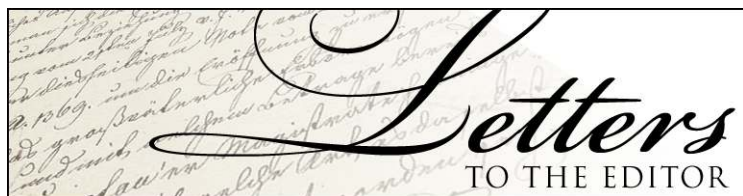

So the market divides itself into identifiable tiers. The bottom tier is shrinking, because there is little demand for it, including for export. The top tier is as volatile as ever, but clearly the number of top-tier pedigrees and prospects being offered at auction is also shrinking, plus prices are down (probably a third, horse-for-horse) for them, too. In fact, even at one-third off 2007 prices, demand for anything above the bottom tier is strong. When we say 'bottom tier' though, it's also important to note that still constitutes two-thirds of the horses, down from three-quarters in 2007. Same old story: strong demand for the top third, little to no demand for the rest.

Leading up to the 2007 Breeders' Cup at Monmouth Park, all of us in the Stronach Stable camp were excited at the prospect of Ginger Punch's participation in the Ladies' Classic. Five days out, I received a call from Bobby Frankel. In typical Bobby fashion, there was minimal small talk before he cut to the chase. He informed me that he would be unable to attend the Breeders' Cup, going into detail regarding his dog Happy's unfortunate medical condition and his decision to remain in California with her. My initial reaction was a simple "really?" Bobby asked me to respectfully relay the information to Mr. and Mrs. Stronach. I assured him that I would pass along the circumstances surrounding his decision to Frank and Frieda.

I immediately called Frank and relayed Bobby's message. Frank's response was identical to my own: "really?" Frank then requested that I get Bobby on the line so he could speak to him directly. I was apprehensive--my gut reaction was that the conversation would not go over very well with either of them.

I reached Bobby and told him that I had Frank on the line. It was easy to sense Bobby's own apprehension with his simple, "Hi, Frank." Following a pregnant pause, Frank said in the most caring voice, "Bobby, how's your dog?" I gave a strong sigh of relief, and I'm certain Bobby did as well. Bobby went on to explain that his dog was not doing very well, and he was uncomfortable leaving her in California. After the two of them talked about Happy, Frank asked Bobby how Ginger Punch was doing. Bobby replied that she was ready to run the race of her life, and there was nothing more he could do for her. Frank finished the call, saying, "OK Bobby, you look after Happy and we'll look after Ginger."

I will always remember the feeling I had when I hung up after listening to two immensely successful, yet very misunderstood men. They each managed to show great respect for what was important to the other man.

Ginger Punch went on to run exactly as Bobby predicted. Her Breeders' Cup victory was her crowning achievement and ultimately led to a coveted Eclipse Award. Happy lived a little while longer with Bobby close to her side, but ultimately succumbed to her illness. Bobby eventually acquired two new dogs. His choice of names was a very fitting tribute to one of the many champions that he trained during his remarkable Hall of Fame career: Ginger and Punch.

We will all miss him.
