TATDEC DEFIES, EXCEEDS EXPECTATIONS

Tattersalls' 2009 December Sale--featuring the smallest number of lots offered since 1993--concluded

Thursday with gross receipts of 56,903,100gns, an increase of 14 percent over 2008, a year in which the aggregate fell by more than half. In yet another sign that perhaps the worst of the Thoroughbred market downturn is a thing of the past, the average of 40,674gns rose by three percent, while the 15,000gns median represented a whopping increase of 36 percent. The clearance rate of 79 percent clearance was vastly improved from the 63 percent recorded last year. "The economic upheavals of 2008 had a dramatic effect on the bloodstock industry

throughout the world, and we approached the 2009 sales season with an air of trepidation, but the resilience of the market has been extraordinary," commented Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "From the beginning of Book One of the October Yearling Sale to the conclusion of the December Sale today, all of the sales at Tattersalls have outperformed expectation and, while we are a fair way off the dizzy heights of 2006 and 2007, it has been particularly gratifying to see a real sense of confidence return to the industry."

Mahony continued, "The Tattersalls December Sale is a key indicator of the health of the bloodstock industry and we can all derive a measure of optimism from the 2009 renewal. Not only have the figures provided encouragement for the industry going forward, but equally importantly there has been a genuinely vibrant feel to the proceedings of the last two weeks at Park Paddocks." **TATDEC cont. p2**

ONLY ONE CAN 'RULE' IN THE JACKPOT

A field of eight will line up for tonight's \$750,000 GIII Boyd Gaming's Delta Jackpot, with WinStar Farm's homebred **Rule** (Roman Ruler) leading the way. The dark bay, produced by a half-sister to GI Kentucky Derby hero Funny Cide (Distorted Humor), followed a Belmont maiden victory Oct. 8 with a track-record setting performance in Delta's Jean Lafitte S. Nov. 6. "Any time you have a horse run as big as he did in the previous race, you're always concerned that they avoid the bounce factor," trainer Todd Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. "But he's indicated in his training that he's every bit as good, or perhaps even improved, since the race." Triple AAA Ranch's **Uh Oh Bango** (Top Hit), who received the highest Beyer Speed Figure by a two-year-old male when earning a 102 in the Prairie Meadows Freshman S. Sept. 18, stretches to two turns following a good runner-up effort in Churchill's GIII Iroquois S. Nov. 1. "I do think he was possibly a little short for that race," trainer Kory Owens revealed to *DRF*. Morning-line favorite **Gallant Gent** (Yankee Gentleman), hero of the C. B. Afflerbaugh S. at Fairplex Sept. 16, ships in off a close seventh in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Nov. 7. "He has a lot of speed if we want to use it, and he's also very rateable," trainer Craig Lewis told *DRF*. "He's a real super horse mentally." **Field, p6**

Most importantly 2009 has shown that there is an enduring and widespread demand for quality bloodstock which has always been synonymous with the Tattersalls name."

A Grand Finale...

The 1998 G1 Cheveley Park S. winner **Wannabe Grand (Ire)** (Danehill--Wannabe {GB}, by Shirley Heights {GB}), who is the dam of six winners, topped yesterday's business when making 65,000gns. Australian owner and breeder Scott Springett, buying through Badgers Bloodstock, had the winning bid on [lot 2068](#). Coolmore's Kevin Buckley was underbidder.

"They don't make Danehill mares any more and she's a Group 1 winner as well," said Springett. "She's empty so we can take her straight home and she'll probably go to More Than Ready. It's been a successful cross and we hope to get a good two-year-old. She's going to Duncan Grimley's Glastonbury Farms, where I now have 22 mares and this is the first time I have been here. The mares are different to those back home and the market has been very strong."

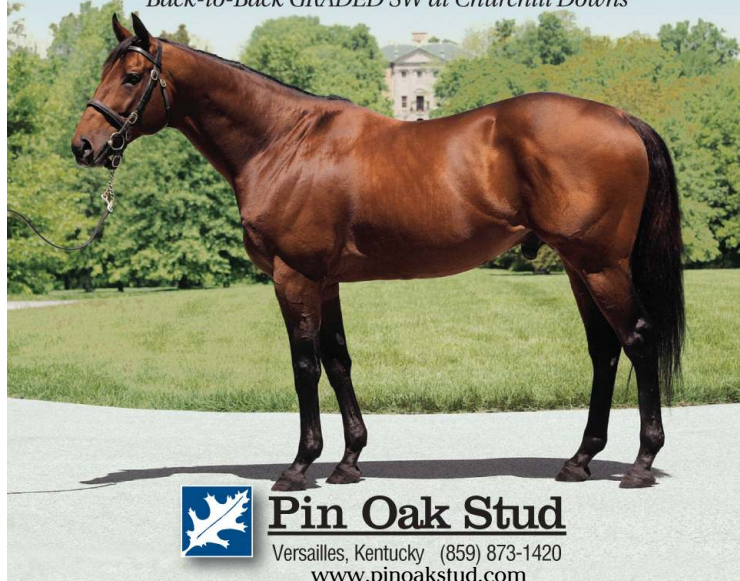

THREE NEW GRADE ONE RACES IN 2010 The Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga, Arkansas Derby at Oaklawn Park and Clark H. at Churchill Downs have all been upgraded to Grade I races in 2010, the American Graded Stakes Committee of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association announced Thursday. The Arkansas Derby, a key prep for the Kentucky Derby, has recently been won by dual Classic winner Smarty Jones (Elusive Quality) and two-time Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike).

“Many people have worked hard to bring the Arkansas Derby to this level,” Oaklawn Park Racing Secretary Pat Pope commented. “We have many people to thank in addition to the Graded Stakes Committee. Certainly the horsemen, press and media and our own employees, along with the racing fans of Arkansas, have celebrated the rise in significance of the Arkansas Derby and all share in this news as we get ready for the opening of the 2010 season.” The Committee also revealed that there will be 487 graded stakes next year, two less than in 2009. In addition to the three new Grade I’s, 12 other races were upgraded (*see box*). The Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, Breeders’ Cup Turf Sprint and Breeders’ Cup Marathon will all be be graded for the first time in 2010. Five races--the Citation H. at Hollywood Park, Frank J. De Francis Memorial Dash S. at Laurel Park, Go For Wand H. at Saratoga, John C. Mabee S. at Del Mar and Santa Maria H. at Santa Anita Park--were downgraded to Grade II status. **Cont. p4**

NYC OTB TO FILE FOR BANKRUPTCY New York City Off-Track Betting will file for bankruptcy, and has 60 days to devise a restructuring plan, it was announced Thursday. The state-owned company plans on revising its payment formula for how wagering revenue is distributed, including cutting the amount of money it pays to the racing industry. Whether those cuts to the racing industry come to fruition will be for the legislature to decide. "You can't pay a de facto dividend before you pay your operating costs," NYC OTB Board Chairman Sandy Frucher said during a conference call yesterday. New York City OTB is also seeking to trim its 1,400-plus workforce. Regarding the decision to file for Chapter 9, counsel Richard Levin added, "If OTB were to pay all of its obligations now, it would likely run out of cash by the end of the month." The New York Racing Association released the following statement regarding New York City OTB's filing for bankruptcy. "In response to today's announcement from the New York City Off-Track Betting Corporation that it intends to file a petition for adjustment of its debts under Chapter 9 of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code in the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of New York, The New York Racing Association, Inc. expects to be one of the largest creditors to the NYC OTB bankruptcy action and therefore it would not be prudent for NYRA to comment on the filing outside of the court proceedings."

Hanshin Racecourse. "He looks very good," commented trainer H. James Bond, who will be saddling his first runner outside of North America this weekend. "I thought in one of the pictures of him on the internet, I saw some ribs in the training, and today he

looks very good-his weight is back. He looks very happy. He's always been a horse that lays very close, and he likes to lead. I'd like to see how he handles the track, but he's always a very forwardly placed horse. Regarding the barrier draw, seven is my lucky number so seven would be great, or else middle to inside. Tomorrow, we'll be doing the same kind of work we did this morning." Tizway, who in fact drew the seven hole at Thursday's pill pull, has won two of his five starts this season, including a seven-length score over GI Belmont S. hero Da' Tara (Tiznow) in a one-mile Belmont allowance July 12. He hardly embarrassed himself when fourth, beaten 5 3/4 lengths in the GI Whitney H. Aug. 8 and enters the Japan Cup off a third-place effort to Summer Bird (Birdstone) and Quality Road (Elusive Quality) in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Oct. 3. Rajiv Maragh has the call Sunday.

How did you get into racing, being a NY guy? My father was a horseplayer and started taking me to the track when I was 10 or 11. I began walking horses for John Russell, then I went to rubbing horses for John Campo. I graduated from the Campo school in '79 and went out on my own.

Who was your first big horse? The first horse I ever trained I had claimed for \$18,000. His name was I'm It, and I wound up winning the GIII Grey Wagon with him a few months later. I claimed him for my dad and his two brothers.

Biggest inspiration growing up? I think the two most amazing trainers were [Allen] Jerkens and [Bobby] Frankel. Jerkens would take horses and do the most amazing things. And when I went to the track as a kid every Saturday, Frankel would win a race.

Favorite vacation spot? I don't take vacations. The last one I took was to Disney World five or six years ago. It was good, because my wife likes the beach, and I'm so-so on it. And I'll go to the racebook or casino, and she just sits there. So I figured with Disney, there's no beach and no casino, so we had to stay together. It worked out.

Favorite film? I haven't watched a movie in a theater in a long time. But maybe "Titanic." That was a pretty neat film.

Favorite music? No music. I don't listen to it; I've never bought a record, a CD, nothin'.

Drink of choice? Just water.

What would you be doing if you weren't in horse racing? I'd be in some sort of business; I don't know what exactly, but I'm business-oriented. I'm good with numbers and have a good business mind.

Favorite food or meal? Italian.

Favorite sport besides racing? Probably college hoops. I don't have a favorite team, but I could sit there and watch one game after another, if I had the time. I don't, but I'm able to catch pieces of it. I love all the March Madness stuff.
