MAST TRACK MOVED TO SHIRREFFS

Mast Track (Mizzen Mast), the gate-to-wire winner of Saturday's GIII Native Diver H. at Hollywood Park, has been transferred to trainer John Shirreffs and will race

in 2010, *Daily Racing Form* reports. Owned, bred and trained by Bobby Frankel before the Hall of Famer's death Nov. 16, the five-year-old was acquired by Frank Stronach last week in a private deal. Humberto Ascanio, a long-time assistant to Frankel, was the trainer of record for the Native Diver. Mike Rogers,

racing manager for Stronach, said the bay will remain in California. No specific races have been selected.

"Clearly, we'll race him, that's for sure," Rogers told *DRF*. "We moved him to John Shirreffs. We actually made a deal that 50 percent of the earnings in 2010 we'll split with the Bobby Frankel estate." The Native Diver snapped a nine-racing losing streak for Mast Track, whose last victory had come in the 2008 GI Hollywood Gold Cup. A winner of six of 20 starts, Mast Track has earned \$922,822 in his career.



WILL MAIDEN BE ON KEY IN CASHCALL?

Make Music For Me (Bernstein), second to Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike) in the GII Best Pal S. and GI Del Mar Futurity in the summer while still a maiden, disappointed when he beat two horses home in a Hollywood maiden special weight Nov. 22, but that hasn't deterred his trainer Alexis Barba from taking a shot at Saturday's GI CashCall Futurity. The bay was gaining on Lookin at Lucky, subsequently second in the Nov. 7 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile following a rough trip, in the Best Pal and Del Mar Futurity, and was a respectable fourth in the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland Oct. 10 in his lone start outside Southern California. Dropped into a maiden event last time, the Ellen and Peter O. Johnson colorbearer waited behind horses until the eighth pole, and raced evenly once he found room to finish sixth as the 2-5 favorite. "I hope he gets a better trip this time," Barba said. "He got behind a wall of horses and couldn't get out. I'm pleased with the way he is doing. I hope to get back on track and see if he can duplicate his races at Del Mar." Should he return to top form, **Make Music For Me** will have the chance to turn the tables on **Lookin at Lucky**, who has been pointed toward the CashCall Futurity by trainer Bob Baffert, who also plans to enter GIII Generous S. runner-up **Marcello** (Johannesburg) and either dominant allowance winner **Conveyance** (Indian Charlie) or **The Program** (Harlan's Holiday). Other probable starts include **Noble's Promise** (Cuvee), third in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile; and **Get My Fix** (Posse) and **Seattle Ruler** (Roman Ruler), second and third, respectively, in the Nov. 21 GIII Hollywood Pevue S.

RACING Round-Up

Plans for Hong Kong International Runners in 2010...

Connections of some of the runners from Sunday's International races at Sha Tin in Hong Kong outlined plans for their charge's respective 2010 campaigns.

Heading the contingent is **Daryakana (Fr)** (Selkirk), winner of the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Vase. "She will stay in training next year," trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre told *Jour de Galop*. "Dubai is not in her program at the moment. On the other hand, we may target the G2 Prix Corrida and G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud." Also expected to return in 2010 is Vase runner-up

Spanish Moon (El Prado {Ire}), who finished fourth in a prior start in the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 7. "I am satisfied with his race, even if [Daryakana] was better than us [in the Vase]," trainer Sir Michael Stoute told *JDG*. "He will now get a little break before participating in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic [at Meydan Racecourse in March]." Failing to hit the board in his seasonal finale was **Youmzain (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}), who crossed the wire 10th in the Vase. "I was hoping he would have run better," trainer Mick Channon told *JDG*. "But the result is of little importance, because we had a good season with him. He will now get a break and return to competition in the Dubai Sheema Classic." According to trainer Luca Cumani, G1 Hong Kong Cup third **Presvis (GB)** (Sakhee) will likely return to Dubai. Runner-up in this year's G1 Dubai Duty Free, the five-year-old may attempt to go one better in Duty Free, or attempt to stretch out in the G1 Dubai World Cup.

Sea the Stars Earns Another Award...

Christopher Tsui's **Sea the Stars (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) claimed another honour when named Horse of the Year at the annual Irish Horse Racing Awards staged at Leopardstown racecourse yesterday. The superstar sophomore, who won 100 percent of the votes cast, led the way with a trio of prizes heading in the direction of John Oxx's Currabeg Stables. Oxx was handed the Flat Award for his achievements this term and recently retired jockey Michael Kinane picked up Horse Racing Ireland's Contribution to the Industry Award. Veteran trainer Kevin Prendergast, who saddled **Termagant (Ire)** (Powerscourt {GB}) to G1 Moyglare S. success, was honored with the Outstanding Achievement Award. "Despite the gloomy economic backdrop, 2009 was an outstanding year for Irish racing," HRI's Chief Executive Brian Kavanagh told *irishracing.com*. "Our flat horses dominated the major races throughout Europe, and we saw a once-in-a-lifetime champion in Sea the Stars. We can reflect also with great pride on the fact that, according to official rankings, three of the top four flat horses in the world in 2009 were Irish. This is an industry in which Ireland is a genuine world leader and, given appropriate funding structures, that situation can be further enhanced in 2010."

Berry Confirmed as Oxx's Number One...

In addition to scooping the Flat Award at HRI's annual racing awards, trainer John Oxx also indicated Fran Berry will ride as the stable's number one jockey next term. "Fran has been an important part of our team for seven or eight years now," the trainer told *Racing Post*. "He is a very good jockey, and we are happy to have him as our number-one jockey for next year. He's been waiting in the wings, and I'm sure he has been looking at Mick [Kinane]'s birthdays appearing in the newspapers every year for the past few years." Berry, who is riding in Singapore until February, added, "Getting the number-one job at Mr. Oxx's is a dream come true for me. It's something I'm really looking forward to, and I will be returning home early in February to get ready for the new season."

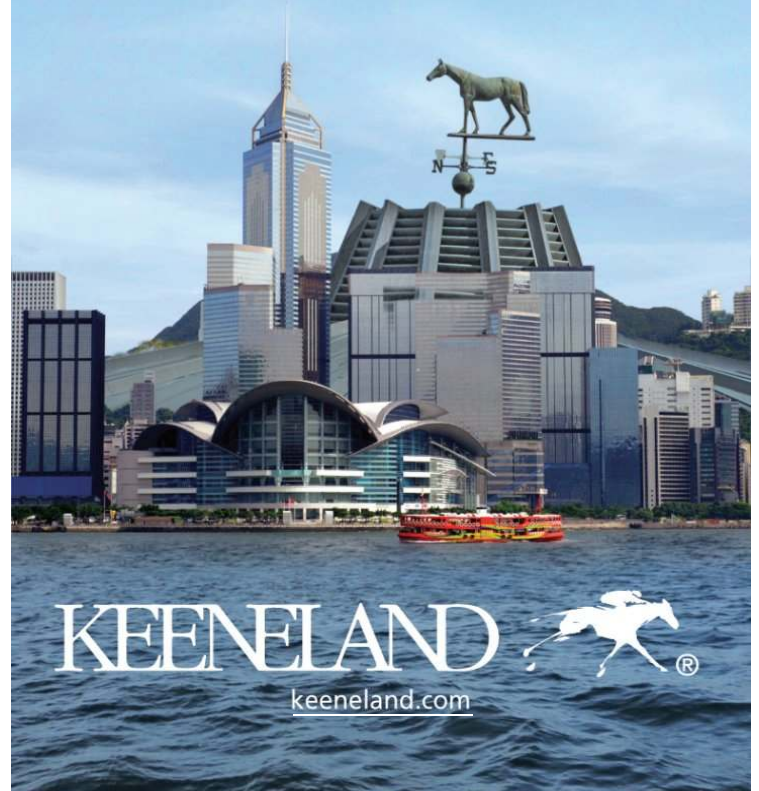
"[She's Funomenal] came from off the pace and until they do it, you don't know if she can do it," Dan Ward,

assistant to Jerry Hollendorfer, told *DRF*. "I like the way she finished, and the way she galloped out was very promising. If you want to have a horse that's going to be a good horse, you can't go full speed the whole way. You've got to save something for the finish." Hollendorfer also trains GI Oak Leaf S. winner Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision), who was third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and goes in next Sunday's GI Hollywood Starlet S.

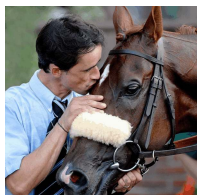

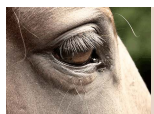

Events down in Argentina last week raised the question of whether American breeders missed an opportunity when Claiborne repatriated Storm Cat's son Easing Along for the 2008 season.

According to Jockey Club figures, Easing Along attracted only 58 mares at a fee of \$10,000, with 35 reported live foals. Claiborne had purchased an interest in Easing Along from Haras El Alfalfar after his first crop runners had enjoyed significant success during the 2006-7 Southern Hemisphere season. However, it was to the famous Haras La Quebrada that he returned after his brief spell at Claiborne, and the experiment wasn't repeated in 2009. Perhaps this is just as well, judging by the lack of enthusiasm for the handful of Easing Along weanlings which were offered at Keeneland last month; their prices ranged from \$2,500 to \$12,000.

I must admit that I, too, would have taken some persuading to consider Easing Along in an industry where there are many other available sons of Storm Cat. Why choose one whose finest achievements on the track were a seven-furlong maiden success and a mile allowance victory, both at Aqueduct at the age of two? The fact that Easing Along was off the track throughout his second season suggests he had problems, and his total earnings of \$5,390 from three starts at four did nothing to add to his reputation. **Cont. p5**

However, his shortcomings on the track had to be weighed against his fabulous pedigree. His dam Cadillacing had taken the GI Ballerina S.; his second dam was none other than Relaxing, the champion older mare of 1981; his third dam Marking Time had won the Acorn S.; and his fifth and sixth dams were the celebrated producers Big Hurry and La Troienne.

Cadillacing had previously produced several other stallions, the best qualified being her Grade I-winning Danzig colt Strolling Along, who sired nothing better than a Grade III winner during a brief career. Strolling Along's unraced brother Game Plan fared better in California, where he sired the Grade I winner Mistical Plan, and another brother, The Jogger, sired a couple of group winners in New Zealand.

The most relevant of Cadillacing's sons, with regards to Easing Along, was surely his brother Lion Hearted, who was second in a couple of graded sprints. However, Lion Hearted is credited with just one graded winner from his first 387 foals of racing age, sired in Maryland.

There's every chance that Easing Along would also have struggled to stand out from the crowd in a breeding industry as large as America's. Happily, it has proved a very different story in Argentina, where his son Interaction followed up his victory in the 2000-meter Gran Premio Jockey Club (the second leg of the Triple Crown) with a decisive win in the Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini over an additional 400 meters.

Easing Along demonstrated his class and versatility by also providing the winner of another Group 1 contest on the Carlos Pelegrini card, namely Lloron Cat. This four-year-old also had plenty to spare when he took the Gran Premio Felix de Alzaga Unzue over 1000 meters. All three of these Group 1 wins were gained on turf, but Lloron Cat is also a Group 1 winner on dirt.

Lloron Cat isn't the first good sprinter by Easing Along, the sire is also responsible for Compasivo Cat, winner of the 2008 G1 Gran Premio Estrellas Sprint on dirt, having also posted a Group 1 victory on turf. Que Piensa Cat is another to have won at Group 1 level.

It is well worth pointing out that Easing Along has only three crops of three-year-olds on the track, and that they total fewer than 140 foals. His fourth crop, now Southern Hemisphere two-year-olds, numbers 41 foals, but his early successes with such as Compasivo Cat and Que Piensa Cat earned him larger books, and he has 78 yearlings and 71 weanlings.

It is interesting that La Quebrada, which has done so well with stallions such as Southern Halo, lists three sons of Storm Cat on its website stallion roster, the others being Grand Reward and The Leopard. Other members of the exclusively foreign-bred stallion team include Mutakddim, El Corredor, Indygo Shiner and Luhuk. **Cont. p6**

In the past, several winners of the Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini were given their chance at stud in Kentucky, the most famous of them probably being the 1966 winner Forli, who made an indelible mark at Claiborne by siring Special and Tuerta. It would be fascinating to see how Interaction would fare in the U.S. His dam Inter Rails is by the American import Ride the Rails, whose name has been made much more familiar over the last two years by the progeny of his highly talented son Candy Ride.

As Ride the Rails was by Cryptoclearance, Interaction represents the popular combination of Storm Cat and Fappiano. Perhaps significantly, Candy Ride has enjoyed some of his finest moments with Storm Cat-line mares, siring Capt. Candyman Can from a Storm Creek mare and Evita Argentina from a daughter of Forest Wildcat.

Interaction's third dam, Infinity, also ranks as the third dam of Don Incauto, a Group 1 winner by Fappiano's son Roy. This female line also produced the Group 1 winner Interprete, whose achievements include siring the dam of American Horse of the Year Invasor.

And perhaps here's the answer to how Easing Along has emerged as a serious contender in his adopted country. Breeders in Argentina have often been forced by their limited budget to choose between pedigree and performance in the stallions they imported. If the stallion's bloodlines are strong enough, breeders are prepared to forgive some shortcomings on the track. Consequently, these stallions receive a higher standard of care than they would ever have received in their homelands.

An Explanation of Black Type and Stakes Terms

Black Type

Advertisers using "black type" in their ads in the *TDN* are referring to stakes races which will appear in all major sales catalogues, and which:
 *Have a minimum purse value of \$50,000 distributed on the day of the race, as well as other conditions.

Non Black-Type Stakes

The word "stakes" refers to non-black-type stakes, which do not appear in the catalogue page. They are:

*Races in which the prize money offered is made up at least in part of money put up by the owners of the horses entered, but which offers a purse of less than \$50,000; or excludes horses from black-type money levels due to eligibility requirements.

Graded/Group Stakes

There are 16 countries in the world where the racing is of a quality such that that country is allowed to determine its own Graded or Group stakes races, and they are accepted automatically as such in the catalogue. Know that if it has a Grade on it in the *TDN*, it's a real Grade.

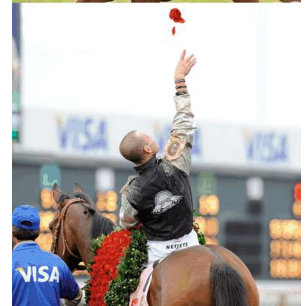

LEE EATON: AHEAD OF HIS TIME

Lee Eaton, who passed away last week at age 76, was always ahead of the curve. "He was using a computer when I was still using an upright Royal typewriter," lifelong friend and business partner John Williams recalled with a chuckle. "Lee was such an innovative guy. He just had such vision."

Eaton was the first horseman to come up with a business model for a company dedicated solely to consigning horses, and it was a model he followed successfully for some 40 years. Williams joined forces with Eaton in 1984 and, until Eaton's retirement in 1995, was privy to many of his mentor's progressive ideas.

"He came up with the call-out cards--now everybody's got these little call-out cards that they shove in your hands at the sales," Williams said. "Lee started all that. Lee's the guy who in Kentucky started bringing in professional showmen. It was not an idea he came up with, but he saw Clay Camp doing that at Saratoga, and he immediately adopted that practice in Kentucky. It made a significant difference.

"He also started prep schedules for outside clients, so that all those horses that were consigned with Lee Eaton, agent, and Eaton Williams, agent, came to the various sales looking similar to horses that were raised either on Eaton Farm or Ballindaggin Farm, my farm, because of those prep schedules. They could follow those things and they knew just how to feed them, how many times they needed to be groomed, when the blacksmith was to come. They knew to leave the manes alone--don't touch 'em, we'll do 'em at the sales! All these things gave us uniformity in our consignments. Because of that kind of horsemanship, our horses made some of the other guy's horses look bad. Lee brought that to the sales. Today, everybody has their horses looking good, because they followed his lead. That's a very important contribution that he made."

It was not only on the sales grounds that Eaton made his mark, however. Williams, along with horsemen like Neil Howard and Tom Evans, was one of many young horsemen who were guided by his influence. Working as the manager for Edgar Lucas's Helmore Farm in Maryland in 1967, Williams traveled to the Keeneland November sale to take a look at a couple of mares that Eaton--who had opened business at his Indian Hill Farm just a couple of years earlier--had purchased for Lucas.

"We became fast friends," Williams said.

Soon, Eaton was encouraging Williams to relocate to the Bluegrass State. A Maryland native, Williams was reluctant to make the move.

He did agree to serve as Eaton's assistant at various sales in 1975, and a year later Eaton arranged an interview for Williams at legendary Spendthrift Farm.

"I told him I wasn't interested, but he insisted, and the upshot of all that was, after an hour and a half of meeting, I said I'd come to Spendthrift," Williams reminisced. "Lee is the guy who brought me to Kentucky for the greatest job a guy could've ever dreamed of at that time. From 1976 until 1984--when I resigned--if you think about what happened at Spendthrift Farm, I was absolutely a kid in a candy store. It was unbelievable.

"And what Spendthrift Farm has meant to my career, I cannot describe," he added. "It's immeasurable. All that happened to me because of Lee Eaton's persistence. Otherwise, I'd still be in Maryland, probably happy as a clam, and wondering where my next meal was coming from. That's Lee's influence on me."

Williams was planning to go out on his own when he resigned from Spendthrift, but Eaton asked him to become his partner in the sales agency, and it was an offer that couldn't be refused. And while many would point to the horses that went through their consignments as their biggest accomplishments in the industry, it was dedication to horse and client that came to mind for Williams. **Cont. p2**



“We tried to be the best horsemen we could be, more importantly than being the best sales agents,” Williams said. “We took care of our clients, but we made sure those horses came to those sales as good as hands could make them.”

Eaton Williams gave 100 percent of their attention to the breeders paying them to bring their horses to the sales.

“We would have people who might say, ‘Can you go buy a yearling for me, or maybe look at a mare for me,’ but we never would do that,” Williams said. “We felt that our presence in those shed rows was all-important. We felt that any time we had a horse that was under our shingle, the owners should expect and deserved our complete attention. We couldn’t be walking around the sale looking at horses, or sitting in the pavilion bidding on horses, when we had a consignment back at the barn. Our presence was required right there in that shedrow.”

People in the business were well aware of how Eaton did business.

“Lee’s reputation as an ethical person was second to none,” Williams said. “He gave total commitment to his client’s horse and his client’s well-being at the sale, and that’s another very important part of Lee Eaton’s ethic.”

The Eaton Williams client list demonstrated the trust that the sellers had in the agency.

“I’ll give you a perfect example,” Williams said. “When Warner Jones decided to disperse Hermitage Farm--this was a major major Kentucky breeder, a \$33-million dispersal back in 1987--he picked up the telephone and called Lee and said, ‘There’s only one person in the world that I want to sell my horses, and that’s you.’ That, for me, speaks volumes.”

That, Williams believed, was of utmost importance to Eaton.

“That was the pride--getting the opportunity from these people,” he said. “We didn’t own a hair on these horses’ backs, but we were getting a piece of the proceeds from the sales, and those, to us, were just gifts. How can you measure our appreciation for that kind of a gift? I tell you how you do it--you bend over backwards to make sure those clients are represented properly at the sales.

“He was a foundation to an awful lot of what you see at the sales right now,” Williams concluded. “He was quite a guy.”

COLOMBIAN JOCKEY DIES IN CHILE Colombian-born jockey Nelson Cajamarca, seriously injured in a three-horse spill at Hipodromo Chile last Saturday, died Sunday morning at Chile University Hospital. Cajamarca sustained serious injuries when falling from 45-1 longshot Spigado (Chi) past the half-way marker of the six-furlong event. Luis Silva, aboard Innocence (Chi), and Emilio Quiroga, aboard Big Crown (Chi), were also involved in the mishap, but escaped injury. Cajamarca, rode 325 winners over more than eight seasons in Chile. He won his first stakes race in 2003 aboard Kaftan in the Clasico Estados Unidos de America. In 2003, Cajamarca was involved in a three-horse spill that ended the life of countrymate Javier Nino. The 45-year-old was the second jockey to die this year on a Chilean racecourse after the death of 20-year-old Jonathan Lavin, who died from massive injuries sustained in a fall at Club Hipico de Concepcion in March.

ROBIN DES PINS DEAD Robin des Pins (Nureyev--Rare Mint, by Key to the Mint), Uruguay's perennial leading sire, died from complications from a lung infection at Haras Don Alfredo in Uruguay Oct. 16. He was 21. The stallion sired 15 black-type winners, including fellow Uruguayan champions La Signora (Uru), Robin Fir (Uru), Ventilato (Uru) and Verceli (Uru), a leading sire in Uruguay. Bred in Kentucky by Flaxman Holdings Ltd, Robin des Pins is a full-brother to Robin des Bois, sire of multiple Grade I winner Gentlemen (Arg), and Argentina's champion sprinter Painter (Arg). German highweight Robin des Pins captured the 1993 G2 Jacobs Goldene Peitsche at Baden Baden and a pair of Group 3 events at Longchamp.
