SEVEN TO LINE UP FOR STARLET

A field of seven juvenile fillies was entered yesterday for Sunday's GI Hollywood Starlet S. at Hollywood Park. Among the line-up is GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile

Fillies runner-up **Beautician** (Dehere) and third-place finisher **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision), as well as Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf runner-up **Rose Catherine** (Speightstown). Beautician, who drew post seven for the Starlet, has made a habit of running second in big races during her young career. The Ken McPeek-trained filly was runner-up in both the GIII Schuylerville S. and GI Spinaway S. After running fifth at Keeneland in the GI Darley Alcibiades, she rebounded with a strong second behind She Be Wild (Offlee Wild) in the Juvenile Fillies.

Blind Luck, trained by Jerry Hollendorfer, will break from post three when she makes the sixth start of her career on Sunday. The chestnut filly captured the GI Oak Leaf S. and was runner-up in the GI Darley Debutante S. The Todd Pletcher-trained Rose Catherine was off the board in a pair of starts over conventional dirt in New York, but romped home to an 8 3/4-length maiden win at Belmont in her turf debut. She came up a half-length short of Tapitsfly (Tapit) over the Santa Anita turf and will try to transfer her talent to the synthetic track while starting from post six on Sunday. The field also features **Bickersons** (Silver Deputy), 2 1/2-length winner of the Nov. 22 Moccasin S. over the Hollywood strip. The Kelly Breen trainee was third in the Spinaway and Oak Leaf before running 10th in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.

CALDER CANCELS GRADED STAKES

Calder Race Course has announced that it will not reschedule the GIII Tropical Turf H. and GIII My Charmer H. Both races were initially postponed Dec. 5 when the track was put under quarantine restrictions. A portion of the purse money from the two graded stakes will be reallocated to Calder's overnight purses. The overall quarantine that limited travel in and out of Calder was lifted Monday, but three barns remain under restriction until Dec. 21.

WILDCAT HEIR SETS 2YO WINNERS RECORD

First-crop sire **Wildcat Heir** (Forest Wildcat) broke the Northern Hemisphere record for two-year-old winners when Future Heiress crossed the finish line in front in yesterday's first race at Calder. The bay filly was the Florida stallion's 39th winner. He shares the world record with Chapel Royal, whose 39 winners from last year include a Kentucky-bred victor in Peru. Wildcat Heir stands at Journeyman Stud in Ocala. Winner of the 2004 GI Frank J De Francis Memorial Dash, Wildcat Heir has been represented this term by stakes winners Karmageddon and Wild Mia, as well as multiple stakes placed Always Wildcatin'.

LATINOAMERICANA TO CLUB HIPICO

Club Hipico de Santiago Racecourse in Santiago, Chile, was confirmed as the host of the 2010 Gran Premio Latinoamericana, South America's most prestigious weight-for-age event, at the Asociacion Latinoamericana de Jockey Clubs most recent meeting, held in Buenos Aires, Argentina Dec. 12. It was confirmed that the Santiago track will host three international races worth a combined \$450,000 in prize money. The Group 1 continental championship, held in a different country every year, will be disputed over 2000 meters over Club Hipico de Santiago's right-handed turf course Mar. 7 and will carry purse money of \$300,000. The new races to be added are a 1600-meter event worth \$100,000 and a 1200-meter event, both on the turf. Club Hipico de Santiago will play host to the South American championship for the third time. The Santiago track last hosted the event in 1995. Also at the association meeting, Mexico was approved to have its first representative in the 2010 Latinoamericano, while Peru was approved for three representatives. Hipodromo San Isidro in Buenos Aires will stage the Latinoamericano in 2011.

WRITERS UP

RACING'S BEST (2000-2009)

With just a few days left to go before we turn the page on a decade, it's an appropriate time to look back and celebrate the best of the best over the last 10 years. Here is one person's opinion on Horse, Jockey, Trainer, etc. of the Decade:

Trainer: Bobby Frankel

Frankel did his best work during the early part of the decade, winning Eclipse Awards as the nation's outstanding trainer every year from 2000 through 2003, but even his "down" years were spectacular. Frankel managed just one win (Empire Maker's 2003 Belmont) in the Triple Crown, but that was perhaps the only area where his accomplishments were less than stellar. He won 1,089 races and his stable earned \$153.4 million. He won 138 Grade I races, a staggering number. In 2003 alone, he won 25 Grade Is, a single-season world record.

His closest rival during the 2000's was Todd Pletcher, also a four-time Eclipse Award winner and a trainer who came incredibly far in a short period of time.

But Pletcher's numbers just don't compare. With 2,108 victories and counting during the decade, he won nearly twice as many races as Frankel did, but his exploits were as much about quantity as quality. He won 67 Grade I races during the decade and his stable earned \$157.2 million. That's only slightly better than Frankel, despite some 1,100 more winners.

Jockey: John Velazquez

Jerry Bailey had a stranglehold on this category until announcing his retirement. Considering he lasted only until Jan. 19, 2006, you have to look elsewhere. Garrett Gomez has been the nation's top jockey the last few years, but he accomplished next to nothing in the early part of the decade.

That leaves John Velazquez and Edgar Prado as the top two contenders, with Velazquez getting the nod.

The Eclipse Award-winning jockey of 2004 and 2005, his mounts earned \$168 million this decade and he won 2,574, 72 of them Grade Is. He won

more races and earned more money than Prado did.

Considering that Bailey, Gary Stevens, Pat Day, Chris McCarron, Laffit Pincay, Julie Krone and Eddie Delahoussaye were all still active in the nineties, this, by comparison, was a very weak decade for jockeys.

Like him or loathe him, Jess Jackson came into horse racing with a type of hurricane-like force rarely seen before. He rocked a boat that needed rocking when it came to integrity in the bloodstock business, he

wielded his checkbook every time he saw a horse that caught his eye, won back-to-back Horse of the Years with Curlin and, of course, campaigned Rachel Alexandra during the second half of her three-year-old year. Most importantly, Jackson was daring and bold, something the sport desperately needed

after so many careful owners and trainers treated their horses ever so carefully and retired them the first chance they had. Buying a horse a few days after the Kentucky Oaks and running her back in the Preakness and winning the race is almost enough right there to earn the title in this category.

Racetrack: Keeneland

Once the stodgiest racetrack in America, Keeneland has become the most innovative. They helped usher in the synthetic surface era (to some, that's a strike against them), became one of two U.S. racetracks to use Trakus technology, experimented with takeout reductions and have consistently offered a level of racing that is unsurpassed anywhere in this country.



This was the decade when the bettors fully embraced Keeneland. The total wagering there in 1999 was \$207 million. Ten years later, total handle was about \$240 million and it peaked at \$298 million in 2007 before the nation went into an economic slump. Noting its low

takeouts, its many player-friendly innovations on its website and the abundance of large fields, the Horseplayers' Association of North America rated Keeneland No. 1 in the nation in its inaugural ratings of North American racetracks.

Three stallions went to stud in North America in 2009 at stud fees of \$50,000 and up - Lane's End's Curlin (\$75,000), Three Chimneys' Big Brown (\$65,000), and Ashford's **Henrythenavigator** (\$65,000)... There were 11 mares offered in foal to **Henrythenavigator**, of which 10 sold, for an average of \$160,000; his stud fee dropped 38 percent, to **\$40,000**. **Henrythenavigator** had the second highest covering sire average, the highest clearance rate, and the biggest drop in stud fee... He's just as good a prospect as he was this time last year, yet his stud fee dropped in the neighborhood of twice as much as this sire class's other top prospects.

He was flat out the fastest horse that raced during the decade. Smarty Jones may have gotten the most headlines in 2004, but it was Ghostzapper who was named Horse of the Year. He only raced 11 times, but he won nine races, including the Met Mile, the Breeders' Cup Classic, the Woodward and the Vosburgh. Some male horses, Curlin and Tiznow among them, may have accomplished more, but when Ghostzapper was right there wasn't another male horse who raced from 2000 through 2009 that could have beaten him.

Horse of the Decade: Zenyatta

No one has beaten the drum for Rachel Alexandra's candidacy for 2009 Horse of the Year harder than I have, which might make this selection seem a bit hypocritical. Actually, it's not. Rachel Alexandra had the better year. Zenyatta had the better decade. Over the course of three years, Zenyatta was 14 for 14, won two Breeders' Cups, will win two Eclipse Awards (champion older mare in 2008 and 2009), may be named 2009 Horse of the Year and became the first filly ever to win the Breeders' Cup Classic. That she won the Classic with a dramatic run from last only added to the accomplishment. Rachel Alexandra, on the other hand, was just another horse during her two-year-old season. Somehow, she managed to lose three of six starts and her biggest win came in a Grade II event, the Golden Rod S. at Churchill Downs. Her decade was very, very, very good, but she loses points for her two-year-old season.

Laurel Provides Update on Slots Approval Process:

Laurel Park officials held a news conference yesterday morning to provide a status report on its attempts to obtain permits for facilities, infrastructure, road network and utility capacities in the event that the proposed Video Lottery Terminal facility venue for Arundel Mills fails to receive zoning approval. Anne Arundel County Council will meet Monday to vote on Bill 82-09. Should the zoning bill fail to pass, the VLT bidding process could be reopened. "The Mills is going to create 4,000 jobs, which could be created here," said Maryland Jockey Club President Tom Chuckas. "The risk is you are destroying 15,000 jobs [in the racing industry]. The best move from our perspective is vote no on 82-09, wait and allow us back in the bidding process." Officials said Laurel Park is well ahead of Arundel Mills in terms of achieving permits. "Laurel Park, since 2003, started getting permits for an eventual slots facility," said Laurel Park project manager Walter Lynch. "It wasn't until last year, 2008, to actually achieve those permits." Laurel Racing Association has appealed to the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals to protest the award of the Anne Arundel County VLT license to PPE Casino Resorts. Laurel Racing was disqualified from the bidding process in February when it challenged the legality of a requirement for a non-refundable initial license fee. "We are confident that Laurel Racing will ultimately prevail and either have its bid reinstated or the Anne Arundel County license will be legally required to be rebid," said Alan M Rifkin, attorney for Laurel Racing.

TRPB Introduces Tote Security Initiative:

The Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau, an arm of the Thoroughbred Racing Associations of North America, proposed a new strategy to facilitate stop-betting throughout the pari-mutuel network at the start of every race. "As TRPB's Wagering Integrity Unit has been increasingly called upon to review wagering associated with races involving some type of tote protocol communication failure, the need to proactively address these matters through the development of enhanced tote security measures is apparent," TRPB President Frank Fabian said. "TRPB has the unique experience, expertise and vendor relationships to fashion these advancements." Details of the technical plan were not revealed, but Fabian said that ongoing discussions with industry service providers and all four U.S.-based tote companies have been productive. The TRPB Wagering Analysis Unit already reviews the daily wagering for races at every TRA member track. The TRA and TRPB boards of directors unanimously approved and funded TRPB's proposal to develop the TRPB Tote Security Initiative business plan for presentation during the boards' annual meeting in March 2010.
