GULFSTREAM STAKES FOR SHE BE WILD

She Be Wild (Offlee Wild), the favorite for collecting an Eclipse Award as the nation's top two-year-old filly in 2009 off her win in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, registered her first work since the Breeders' Cup

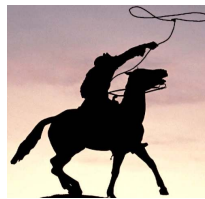
last week and could be pointed toward the Jan. 31 GII Forward Gal S. or Feb. 27 GII Davona Dale S., both at Gulfstream, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The Wayne Catalano-trained filly breezed a sharp four furlongs in :47 1/5 (4/45) at Gulfstream Dec. 30. "I

gave her a little breather after the Breeders' Cup, and she did get in a couple of two-minute gallops before she had her first regular work the other day," Catalano told the publication, adding that the Davona Dale and Forward Gal were both on the radar for the diminutive miss. "Our two main goals at the moment are the [GI] Ashland S. [at Keeneland] and [GI] Kentucky Oaks [at Churchill Downs May 1]," Catalano said.

Another winner on Breeders' Cup Friday, Juvenile Fillies Turf heroine **Tapitsfly** (Tapit), could also make her return at Gulfstream. *DRF* reports that trainer Dale Romans is considering the Jan. 17 Sweetest Chant S. at a mile on the turf for the gray.

RICHARD'S KID TO SAN ANTONIO

Richard's Kid (Lemon Drop Kid), victorious in Del Mar's GI Pacific Classic Sept. 6, will make his next start in the GII San Antonio H. at Santa Anita Feb. 7, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Trainer Bob Baffert opted to run in the nine-furlong test for older horses instead of in Saturday's GII San Pasqual H., which is contested over 1 1/16 miles. Following a third in the GI Goodwood H. Oct. 10, Richard's Kid finished sixth in the Nov. 7 GI Breeders' Cup Classic in his most recent start. Looking further down the road, the four-year-old will be targeted at the Mar. 27 G1 Dubai World Cup at Meydan Race Course.



RACING Round-Up

Stay Put Likely For Risen Star

Trainer Steve Margolis indicated that **Stay Put** (Broken Vow), recording his second straight, two-turn victory at the Fair Grounds last Sunday, is likely to jump on the Triple Crown trail via the GII Louisiana Derby.

"Nothing has been finalized in my mind yet about future plans," said Margolis. "But right now, I'm thinking about holding Stay Put back for the [GII] Risen Star S. on Feb. 20. We think coming back in three weeks for the [GIII] Lecomte S. [Jan. 23] might be pushing things a little. We already know he can go two turns." According to Margolis, the trainer will be represented in the Lecomte with **Cool Bullet** (Red Bullet), winner of the Sugar Bowl S. over the local strip Dec. 19. The chestnut worked five panels in 1:02.40, the 29th fastest of 83 moves at the distance Monday. "I'll probably work him one more time and put him in the Lecomte to see if he can go two turns," said Margolis.



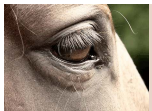

In trying to work out how certain nicks come about, don't underestimate the role played by location. While it doesn't sound sufficiently complicated, you will often find that loyal clients of a particular stallion farm will often send daughters of one of the farm's stallions to one of the farm's newer stallions. If the early matings produce a good winner, the cross starts to gather momentum. Off the top of my head, I can think of Nasrullah/Princequillo and Mr. Prospector/Buckpasser at Claiborne and Roberto/Ribot at Darby Dan.

The Irish National Stud also provides a perfect illustration of this. The stud's stallion roster in the 1970s and '80s featured top-class miler Sallust, who made amends for missing the various 2000 Guineas races by reeling off five consecutive wins, including the Sussex S. and the Prix du Moulin de Longchamp. Sallust was joined in the '80s by his remarkable son Tap on Wood, who had numbered the National S. among his seven juvenile scores in 1978. Tap on Wood is best remembered, though, for carrying the newly arrived Steve Cauthen to victory in the 1979 2000 Guineas, in which he became one of only two horses ever to defeat champion miler Kris during his 16-race career.

In the 1990s, the Irish National Stud recruited Indian Ridge, who had been conceived at the farm during the years his rags-to-riches sire Ahonoora was resident there. Indian Ridge had spent four seasons at modest fees in England, during which time Indian Ridge's owners Sean and Anne Coughlan had supported him by sending him their homebred Tap on Wood mare Ben's Pearl. The first foal from that pairing was Ridgewood Ben, who was good enough to win the G3 Gladness S. and to finish third in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. The second mating did even better. This time it produced a filly, Ridgewood Pearl, who gave a perfect demonstration of her talents when she slammed the opposition in the 1995 Breeders' Cup Mile, having earlier taken the Irish 1000 Guineas, Coronation S. and Prix du Moulin.

Pedigree Insights cont...

Moving Indian Ridge to the Irish National Stud made him easily accessible to more daughters of Tap On Wood, and also to daughters of Sallust. By the time Indian Ridge died in 2006, he had sired 16 foals from 11 daughters of Tap On Wood. Of the 14 which raced, 11 became winners and as many as five became stakes winners (that's 31 percent). Indian Ridge also sired five foals from four daughters of Sallust and one of the five, St Clair Ridge, became a group winner.

As a pedigree pundit, I have to believe that this widespread success was based on more than just a convenient location. One possible explanation for this fruitful relationship could be that Indian Ridge had three lines to Fair Trial, while Tap On Wood and Sallust were members of the Fair Trial male line.

Inevitably breeders also tried sending daughters of Tap On Wood to sons of Indian Ridge and they were rewarded with the fast and precocious Blue Dakota (by Namid) and the outstanding stayer Vinnie Roe (by Definite Article). Another son, Compton Place, has a Group 2 winner with a third dam by Tap On Wood.

Mention of Vinnie Roe is a reminder that, while speed was the main asset of Indian Ridge and most of his sons, he was able to follow Ahonoora's example of siring the occasional top performer over much longer distances.

One would have expected his daughter St Clair Ridge to follow the speed route. Not only was her dam St Clair Star inbred 3x3 to the high-class sprinter Matador, but she was also a half-sister to Superlative, a leading two-year-old sprinter of 1983. However, St Clair Ridge became a group winner over seven furlongs at two years in Ireland before being switched to the USA, where she won a pair of stakes over 1 1/16 miles and was second at Grade II level.

Now St Clair Ridge has become the dam of a Grade II winner over a mile and an eighth, thanks to the San Gorgonio H. victory of her daughter Cat By the Tale.

In view of her background, it is easy to see why Cat By the Tale's purchasers decided to transfer her to Ireland after she had been acquired for \$52,000 at Keeneland's 2008 January Sale.

She justified the move by winning twice, but there was surely always a chance that she would be more at home on America's faster turf tracks.

Cat By the Tale--as her name suggests--is by Tale Of the Cat. With the likes of Gio Ponti, Cat Moves and Alpha Kitten helping him to a second consecutive top-10 finish in 2009, Tale Of The Cat remains an attractive option at a fee of \$30,000.

For a while I was of the opinion that speed rather than stamina was definitely Tale of the Cat's strong suit as a stallion. After Tale of Ekati's victory in the GI Wood Memorial, I pointed out that "none of his best winners has so far succeeded in winning a graded race over a distance longer than 1 1/8 miles, and only three had managed to score over that distance prior to Tale of Ekati's victory over the game War Pass."

I might have to revise that a little, now that Gio Ponti has enjoyed Grade I success over 1 1/4 miles and 1 3/8 miles. Another of Tale Of The Cat's sons, Naval Officer, won the G3 Prix de Conde over 1 1/8 miles as a two-year-old towards the end of 2008, before being transferred to Saudi Arabia, and now Cat By the Tale has shown that she, too, is suited by that route.

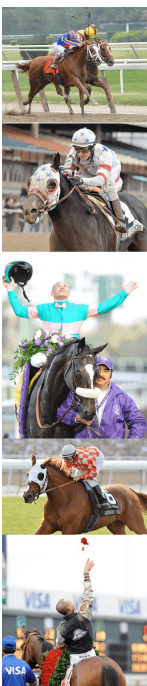

ESPN WINS MEDIA ECLIPSE AWARD The National Thoroughbred Racing Association, Daily Racing Form and the National Turf Writers Association announced yesterday that ESPN will be awarded the Media Eclipse Award for National Television-Live Racing for its telecast of the 2009 GI Belmont S. The Belmont S. program, which aired on ABC June 6, was produced by Mike McQuade. The Media Eclipse will be presented at the 39th Annual Eclipse Awards Monday, Jan. 18 at the Beverly Wilshire Hotel. "We are extremely proud to win this award," said McQuade, who is the senior coordinating producer for ESPN. "No one works harder on this sport than we do. It's a true year-round commitment to horse racing by this group of individuals." Judges for the national television category were: Rob Duboff of Hawk Partners; Chris Svendsen of CBS Sports and Paul Lucey of Comcast Sportsnet--New England. Honorable mention also went to ESPN for its production of the Breeders' Cup World Championships Nov. 7, 2009. Tim Turrell and David Ceisler were the producers of the telecast. "For this year's Belmont, we wanted to give the viewers knowledge of as many individuals involved in the race as possible, not just the favorites, but all of the connections, and provide them an overall context for the show," added McQuade.

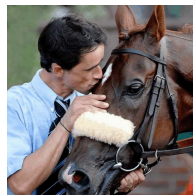

COOLMORE'S DANEHILL DANCER GETS NOD AS TOP SIRE IN ENGLAND/IRELAND It went right down to the final day, but Coolmore Stud earned a gaudy 20th leading sire title in England and Ireland when their Danehill Dancer (Ire) (Danehill) got the bob over Darley's Cape Cross (Ire) (Green Desert) for 2009. Danehill Dancer's offspring earned £3,827,308 in Ireland and England, a scant £12,995 ahead of Cape Cross's £3,814,313. The race for the title caught the attention of Tony Sweeney of the *Irish Times*, who wrote, "Neither an enthusiast for championship titles that add in place money nor for that matter for racing on the all weather surface, I still have to concede that events in the final two days of 2009 involving both aspects will decide the most exciting race for the champion sires flat titles in England and Ireland." Sweeney added, "In the opposite corners of the ring are two great rivals. Sheikh Mohammed's Darley Stud is bidding with Cape Cross for its first title. Standing in the way is John Magnier's Coolmore, which is represented by Danehill Dancer as it tries for an incredible 20th successive title--an unheard of achievement in a championship whose records date back to 1721."
