## HOY DOWN TO 'RACHEL' AND ZENYATTA

As expected, 2009 Horse of the Year consideration will come down to the sport's two dominant female superstars, the three-year-old filly **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) and the five-year-old mare **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}). The showdown was made official yesterday when the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA), National Turf Writers Association (NTWA) and *Daily Racing Form* announced the finalists for the 39th annual Eclipse Awards, to be handed out at the Beverly Wilshire Hotel in Beverly Hills Jan. 18. Though the finalists for Horse of the Year are typically not announced in advance of the ceremony, the pair were so dominant in 2009 that championships in their respective divisions are all but a given, with

the only question being who will walk away with the night's big prize. According to a release, 'Rachel' and Zenyatta were the only two horses to receive votes in the Horse of the Year category. 'Rachel' went eight-for-eight in 2009, with a trio of Grade I wins over males, while Zenyatta was unbeaten in five efforts, including a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

Several other categories figure to be tight, as well. The two-year-old filly race will likely come down to GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner **She Be Wild** (Offlee Wild) against dual Grade I winner **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision), while the older male division finds **Einstein (Brz)** (Spend a Buck), **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat) and **Kodiak Kowboy** (Posse) battling it out.

In the sprint division, **Kodiak Kowboy** (Posse) and **Zensational** (Unbridled's Song) represent an East Coast vs. West Coast battle for supremacy, with GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero **Dancing in Silks** (Black Minnaloushe) also making the cut. **Cont. p2**

## U.S. WAGERING DOWN NEARLY 10% IN 2009

The Equibase Company yesterday released its final figures for the number of dollars wagered on racing in the United States in 2009, as well as purse totals at U.S. tracks for the year. Handle in the U.S., which included worldwide commingled wagering on certain U.S. races, was \$12,319,129,673, a 9.88-percent decline from 2008. Purses were also down, though to a lesser extent. Purses in the U.S. totaled \$1,093,875,799 in 2009, down 5.59 percent. Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, said things could have been worse. "A decline of this magnitude for the year is nothing to celebrate, but it does compare favorably to that of many other industries in 2009, especially when combined with an overall decline in the number of race dates," said Waldrop. "Also, the decrease in the rate of decline over the final two quarters may indicate that the worst is behind us. I believe that horseracing will reverse these trends in the years ahead, especially as we develop new ways to capitalize on our unique right to conduct legal, online wagering."

### FULL TO G1SW HEADWAY TOPS MM OPENER

A full brother to G1SW and G1 Golden Slipper S. runner-up Headway (Aus) (Charge Forward {Aus}--Chatelaine {Aus}, by Flying Spur {Aus}) brought a final bid of A\$500,000 (A\$1 = US\$0.919) to top

the opening session of the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale in Queensland, Australia, yesterday. Consigned by Turangga Farm, the bay was purchased by Headway's trainer, Peter Moody, who was bidding on behalf of a partnership made up of

several of his clients. "He's a lovely colt," Moody said, adding, "He's a bit bigger than his sister." The conditioner has been keeping an eye on the colt since soon after he was foaled. "I've seen him since he was small, and I've always liked him," Moody remarked. "I'm happy

to have him coming to the stables to train. And he might look pretty cheap if his sister comes out in a few weeks and wins the Lightning." Headway, first or second in eight of her 10 career starts, captured the G1 Coolmore Stud Ascot Vale S. by a nose at Flemington in her latest appearance Oct. 31. She

is slated to return in the 1000-meter G1 Lightning S. at Flemington Jan. 30. Moody was the leading buyer at the Magic Millions opener, picking up six yearlings for a total of A\$1.1 million. The Hong Kong Jockey Club was next, paying A\$1,080,000 for four yearlings; the Ingham family laid out A\$730,000 on five yearlings, while Cups King Anthony Cummings spent A\$720,000 on six lots. "There was a great buying bench on hand today, and they competed for a great line-up of youngsters," Magic Millions Managing Director David Chester remarked. "There were buyers on hand from every state in the country, as well as many overseas locations." Chester added that, while he was encouraged by the Gold Coast opener, he expected the sale to get stronger. "I'm hoping for the clearance rate to rise tomorrow during the second session," he said. "There are some lovely prospects to go under the hammer." Bidding starts at 11 a.m. today.

**Retiring 2010 (First Foals 2011)...**

... **Mastercraftsman**, who won the Irish 2000 Guineas and St. James's Palace S., and ran second to Sea The Stars in the Juddmonte International, retires to Coolmore for €20,000... A dual Group 1 winner at two, including Ireland's most important two-year-old race, the seven-furlong G1 National S., he has plenty to recommend him. Coolmore also retires four-time G1 Ascot Gold Cup winner **Yeats**, who will stand for €10,000. He did have the speed and class to win Ireland's two major Derby preps, the G3 Ballysax S. and the 10-furlong G2 Derrinstown Derby Trial as a three-year-old, after which he was favourite for the G1 Epsom Derby. But soreness in a hip caused him to miss that race and the rest of his three-year-old season. He came back at four to win the G1 Coronation Cup at 12 furlongs, then at five stepped up in trip to become a Gold Cup horse. So it's not like he was a plodder--far from it.

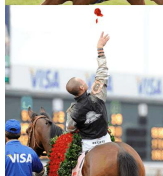
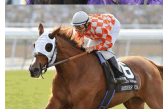
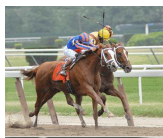
**ADENA LEADING BREEDER FOR SEVENTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR** Adena Springs headed the list of leading individual breeders in North America in 2009 with earnings of \$12,853,329, according to statistics released yesterday by The Jockey Club Information Systems Inc. In

topping the list for the seventh consecutive year, Adena Springs bred the winners of 568 races from 3,903 starts. Runner-up was Eugene Melnyk, who bred the winners of 291 races from 1,588 starts for earnings of \$7,513,369. Adena also tops a second breeder list that includes partnerships. Including partnerships, Adena Springs bred the winners of 568 races from 3,908

starts for earnings of \$12,856,254. Melnyk was again runner-up, having alone or in partnership bred the winners of 291 races from 1,589 starts for earnings of \$7,513,696. Rounding out the list of top 10 individual breeders were Juddmonte Farms Inc., \$7,055,634 (46 wins/310 starts); Brereton C. Jones, \$6,184,957 (265/1,676); Edward P. Evans, \$4,356,533 (99/554); Pam and Martin Wygod, \$4,328,166 (138/777); Stonerside Stable, \$4,064,060 (104/644); Gulf Coast Farms LLC, \$3,683,500 (62/401); Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey, \$3,459,377 (152/1,132); and Maverick Productions Ltd., \$3,368,507 (6/14). 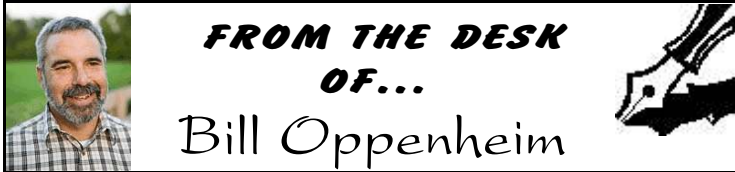

## WHAT EUROS GOT: INBREEDING TO NORTHERN DANCER

### *What Euros Got: Inbreeding to Northern Dancer...*

This is an issue that seems to still be keeping bloggers, other pedigree buffs and professionals occupied: is there too much inbreeding generally, and is there too much inbreeding to Northern Dancer in particular? Brianne and I will be doing some further research on this in the next few weeks, when the new APEX numbers come out to include all 2009 racing, but in the meantime, I've been doing some work on the matter with a database of some 12,000 A Runners foaled 1996-2005, through racing of 2008.

These are very definitely limited measurements. We are measuring only within this population of 12,000, not taking into account what is called "opportunity in the general population." This is a big thing with a lot of people now, how things ought to be measured against opportunity in the general population. I used to think it would be better if I could do that, but I don't think so any more. As far as I'm concerned, the "general population" consists of 98 percent of horses that are not 'A Runners' (top two percent earners), and two percent which are. I'm not sure I even believe it's meaningful to compare one population to another essentially 50 times its size.

The other limitation on the information I analyzed is that the "inbreeding" is only "sire on damsire," or what has also been called "first cross" data. Though this is the most frequently occurring form of inbreeding, there are many other combinations, especially involving the sire's damsire and the second dam's sire. I can't count those--that's a limitation of the system.

Key Committees and appointments: Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV) appointed Sen. Schumer to serve as Vice Chair of the Democratic Conference following the 2006 elections. It is the number three position on the Democratic Leadership team and a position he continues to hold. He sits on the Judiciary, Banking and Finance Committees, among others, and is Chairman of the [Subcommittee on Immigration, Refugees, and Border Security](#) for the Judiciary Committee.

Impact on horse racing industry: As Chairman of the Senate Immigration Subcommittee, Sen. Schumer has immersed himself in comprehensive immigration reform, an emerging and contentious issue in the current Congress.

Even given those limitations, what I can count yields what seem to be to be impressive results. Please see the accompanying graph, which shows the incidence of Northern Dancer line (sire) over Northern Dancer line (damsire) in relation to two populations. First--the blue line--is the incidence of 'Northern Dancer over Northern Dancer' as a percentage of all Northern Dancer-line sired A Runners, by year foaled, 1996-2005. That percentage increased from 13.2 percent among 380 Northern Dancer-line sired A Runners foaled in 1996 to 22.4 percent of the 566 Northern Dancer-line sired A Runners foaled in 2004, and 22.7 percent of the 409 Northern Dancer-line sired A Runners of 2005 (including just three-year-olds by the end of 2008, so the number of 2005-foaled A Runners will have increased significantly by the end of 2009). The second/red line shows the percentage of "Northern Dancer over Northern Dancer" A Runners as a percentage of the entire population of A Runners foaled that year. That percentage has increased from 4.3 percent (50) of the 1,151 A Runners foaled in 1996 to 9.3 percent (127) of the 1,371 A Runners foaled in 2004, and 9.6 percent (93) of the 967 A Runners (through the end of 2008) foaled in 2005. **Cont. p8**



Those trend lines tell us one thing: Whatever the theories, it is working. Is “Northern Dancer over Northern Dancer” nine or 10 percent of the whole population? I don’t know, and I don’t think I care. What I can see for sure is that, as a percentage of the annual population of new A Runners, the percentage has more than doubled in the last 10 years. How much faster could it possibly be expected to accelerate?

My conclusion: We shouldn’t even be discussing “Northern Dancer over Northern Dancer” any more, except as a sort of umbrella designation, like “Native Dancer” or “Nasrullah” are now used. Northern Dancer is so successful, so powerful, that it really has branched off into nine separate sire lines (in my classifications, one of those lines is actually “Nearctic other than Northern Dancer,” such as Explodent, Icecapade, and Wild Again. Even though it’s historically incorrect, because Nearctic was also Northern Dancer’s sire, that’s the way I classify it). Of the nine, Danzig, Sadler’s Wells, and Storm Cat/Storm Bird are the most active; Nureyev and Deputy Minister/Vice Regent may or may not survive as active sire lines.

Nijinsky, Lyphard, Nearctic, and Miscellaneous Northern Dancer (includes the likes of The Minstrel and, more recently, Dixieland Band) are very unlikely to survive as sire lines. In any case, it’s time to stop talking about Northern Dancer over Northern Dancer and start talking about, for example, Danzig over Sadler’s Wells--a cross that didn’t even exist in 1996, but had 39 A Runners through the end of 2008, including 11 foaled in 2004. The “cross index,” at that point, came out at 2.39, when 1.00 is average.

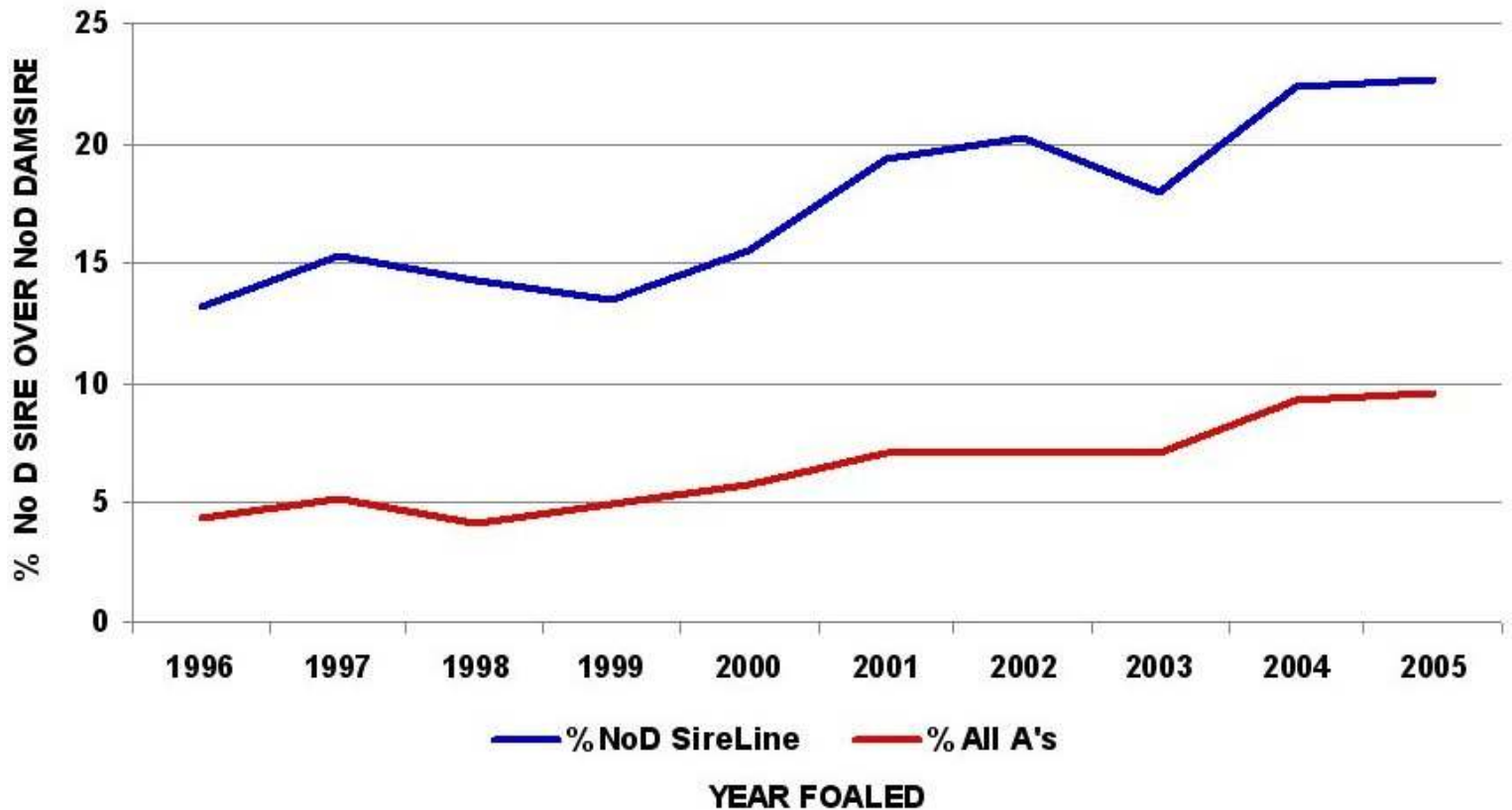

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission voted unanimously on Tuesday to up the suspension following Borel's appeal of the original ruling, which resulted in an automatic stay of the penalty. Borel was given three days after his mount Pulpit's Secret (Pulpit) was disqualified from first to second in the 10th race at Churchill Downs Nov. 20, a 6 1/2-furlong maiden special weight. The chart indicates that Pulpit's Secret "drifted out late under left-handed urging, bumped Magic Max and was fully extended to last." Borel dropped the appeal on Dec. 12, which indicated to officials that he had appealed just to avoid serving days during the final weekend at Churchill.
