CONVEYANCE SOLD TO ZABEEL

Thoroughbred Legends has sold the unbeaten Triple Crown hopeful and **TDN Rising Star** **Conveyance** (Indian Charlie--Emptythetill, by Holy Bull) to Sheikh Rashid Al Maktoum's Zabeel Racing. The deal was brokered by bloodstock agent Omar Trevino, who has purchased, among others, Grade I winners Henny Hughes (Hennessy) and Game Face (Menifee) on Zabeel's behalf. The three-year-old colt will remain in training with Bob Baffert and will, as intended, start in Saturday's GIII San Rafael S. at Santa Anita ([Click for the brisnet.com PPs](http://www.brisnet.com)).

"He's freaky fast, he's out of a Holy Bull mare, and I love Indian Charlie," Trevino replied when asked about the appeal of Conveyance. "He's very athletic and super imposing. We're gonna have fun with this guy."

Though Conveyance hasn't been tested beyond six furlongs, Trevino believes the colt will be able to carry his speed around two turns and confirmed he was purchased with the GI Kentucky Derby in mind.

"We're always looking for prospects, and he's one of the ones who stood out at the end of the year," said Trevino, who added about future plans beyond the San Rafael, "I'd imagine we'd stay in Southern California, but that's going to be up to Bob. We're just along for the ride."

Purchased by Thoroughbred Legends for \$240,000 as a Keeneland September yearling, Conveyance was sent off the favorite in his six-furlong debut at Santa Anita on October and reported home a sharp wire-to-wire winner. It was his second start that earned him Rising Star status, when he dominated by seven lengths in a six-furlong, first-level allowance at Hollywood Nov. 25 ([video](#)). Sheikh Rashid Al Maktoum, son of Sheikh Mohammed, also purchased the now-five-year-old Ready's Echo (More Than Ready) in mid-December.

MISSVINSKI STANDS ALONE AT KEEJAN

A little after three o'clock yesterday afternoon, it may have looked like the fourth session at the Keeneland January sale would draw to a close without a single six-figure sale. That was until Missvinski (Stravinsky), [hip 1358](#), strode into the ring. When the dust had settled, it was team Coolmore that haltered the six-year-old for \$400,000. Coolmore representative Aisling Duignan--who was on hand to sign the ticket--outlasted Shadai Farm. Consigned by agent Michael Byrne, **Missvinski**--an \$8,000 KEENOV weanling and 36,000gns TATOCT yearling purchase--is out of Miss U Fran (Brocco). Just failing to land the day's top prize, Shadai Farm previously purchased Miss U Fran for \$310,000 at the 2007 Keeneland November sale.

"She probably brought more than we expected, but we were happy with what we paid for her," said Duignan. The bay is a granddaughter of Careless Aly (Alydar), who is a full-sister to GI Turf Classic winner Cacoethes, also victorious in the G2 King Edward VII S. The mare was bred by Ray Stark Revocable Trust.

"She was a Group 1 performer and was a real looker, and you have to pay for horses like that," said Duignan. "She stood out in the catalogue, and I don't really know why she was in today. In any case, everyone was here for her."

According to Duignan, Missvinski will go to either Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) or Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat). **Cont. p2**

Reflections on the January Market...

Figures continued to follow the general trend of the first three days of selling, with gross falling 34.78 percent to \$2,245,300, average dropping 21.67 percent to \$11,283 and median sliding 37.50 percent from \$8,000 in 2009 to \$5,000 this term.

Despite the challenges faced by a number of buyers in securing good horses in their price range and for sellers to get their stock sold, horsemen and women marched on resolutely in an effort to get business done.

"It was very disappointing for us," said John Stuart of Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services. "We really thought we'd have a much better sale. Overall, it was much harder than last January."

During Thursday's session, Stuart managed to find new owners for all but two of 25 horses offered, but encountered much tougher conditions Tuesday.

"Book 1 was a lot more difficult than I thought it would be," he said. "There just weren't that many buyers. The quality probably wasn't there to bring them here, and more than likely, there just really isn't much interest to buy horses right now."

Commenting on one possible reason for the significant drop in quality of stock from one year ago, Taylor Made's Ben Taylor said, "People who don't have their own facilities and are from other businesses outside of horseracing, just can't afford to keep the lower end horses. The cost of caring for them and to breed them just doesn't make sense. They have layers of expenses that somebody who has their own farm might not have, and they just can't afford to participate at that level of the market anymore. It's just simple economics."

And with only one day of selling left to go, the general consensus remained steadfastly consistent in what it took to get horses successfully through the ring.

"The good ones sold really well and the lower end of the market was a tough place to be," added Taylor.

In relation to last fall's bloodstock sales, it appeared that what was once considered the 'lower end' of the market has fallen even further, making the competition for lower price points even more demanding.

"Between \$20,000 and \$40,000, there are plenty of people to buy a nice horse at that level," said Bloodstock agent Pete Bradley. "If you were dealing with price constraints, it was really tough to get horses in the range you used to be able to buy in."

While this year's January sale struggled with the lesser quality, many felt that other segments of the industry offered greater stability, despite the economic slump.

"I think there is a good demand for young horses to race, and people want racehorses," offered Stuart. "But the breeding end of it, there is just not much interest in it. Also, November was pretty good. Clearly, the Overbrook dispersal drove interest in the crowd for the prices much more than we probably realized, across the board. It dropped off pretty good here. Hopefully, it's at the bottom. We'll see." -Christina Bossinakis

ZENYATTA'S BC WIN MOMENT OF THE YEAR

The historic victory by the undefeated **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic has been voted the 2009 National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) Moment of the Year. The connections of Zenyatta will be honored at the Eclipse Award ceremony this Monday in Beverly Hills with the "NTRA Moment of the Year" award. It is the second consecutive year that a Breeders' Cup victory by Zenyatta earned her the Moment of the Year award. Zenyatta's dramatic late-rallying victory in the Classic garnered 68 percent of the vote. Runner-up honors went to **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro)'s gutsy victory over males in the GI Woodward S. at Saratoga.

This year's balloting was conducted at the NTRA Web site, www.ntra.com, and offered voters 14 choices. The images and events that fans chose from, with percentage of votes they received in parentheses, were:

- Zenyatta remains undefeated and becomes first female to win the Breeders' Cup Classic (68%)
- Rachel Alexandra holds off her male elders in the Woodward S. (10%)
- **Mine That Bird** (Birdstone) posts stunning, 50-1 upset in the Kentucky Derby (9%)
- Rachel Alexandra turns back the late charge of Mine That Bird in the GI Preakness (5%)
- Rachel Alexandra runs off with the GI Kentucky Oaks by more than 20 lengths (2.1%)
- Rachel Alexandra toys with the boys in the Haskell Invitational (2.0%)
- **I Want Revenge** (Stephen Got Even) overcomes a horrific start to capture the GI Wood Memorial (0.9%)
- Linda Rice becomes the first woman to win the Saratoga training title (0.7%)
- **Well Armed** (Tiznow) blows away the field in the Dubai World Cup (0.6%)
- **Presious Passion** (Royal Anthem) fires out to a 20-length lead en route to course record win in United Nations (0.5%)
- **Summer Bird** (Birdstone) registers historic triumph in the Jockey Club Gold Cup (0.2%)
- **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat) captures his fourth consecutive Grade I score in the Arlington Million (0.1%)
- **Goldikova (Fr)** (Anabaa) wins her second straight GI Breeders' Cup Mile (0.1%)

SHE BE WILD BREEZES AT GULFSTREAM

Nancy Mazzone's three-year-old filly **She Be Wild** (Offlee Wild) breezed yesterday at Gulfstream Park as she

Track clockers got the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies champ going a half-mile in :50 3/5, though her trainer, Wayne Catalano, said he timed her going a bit faster. Catalano was on hand to watch the filly train, but is planning to head to California for Monday

night's Eclipse Award dinner. "I got my tux yesterday," Catalano reported, adding of the juvenile filly Eclipse, "I think she should win it. She went out there and beat that other filly on her home track [finalist Blind Luck {Pollard's Vision}, who was third in Breeders' Cup]." Catalano said that he still hadn't decided on a comeback race for She Be Wild, who hasn't started since the Breeders' Cup. "The goal for her is the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland and the [Kentucky] Oaks [at Churchill Downs Apr. 30]," said Catalano. "We'll get her started [at Gulfstream]. There are several options next month on the main track, or possibly turf."

SUMMER BIRD COULD WORK BY MARCH

Pro tem champion three-year-old colt **Summer Bird** (Birdstone) could be back in training as early as Mar. 1, trainer Tim Ice told *Daily Racing Form*.

The three-time Grade I winner was sidelined after suffering a nondisplaced condylar fracture to his right foreleg in the days leading up to the Dec. 6 G1 Japan Cup Dirt. The colt is currently recuperating at Ice's base at Oaklawn Park. "As long as everything goes right and there are no setbacks, we'll start him training March 1," Ice told *DRF*. "I don't think the time off is going to be a huge issue, because he ran all summer and fall." Summer Bird hasn't raced since finishing fourth to Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Nov. 7. "As far as a campaign this year, we're looking to go to Belmont this summer, so when he's ready, we'll start looking for a race," Ice added. "The main thing is not pushing him. I think the best is ahead of him, as long as everything goes right once we get back. I really thought last year, before the injury, he'd improve as a four-year-old. He'll be stronger. He was growing as we were racing him last year, and I thought that his four-year-old season would be a very good season for him." Summer Bird was bred and is owned by K.K. and Vilasini Jayaraman.





CHURCHILL ANNOUNCES DATES FOR DERBY FUTURE POOLS Churchill Downs announced the dates for its three Kentucky Derby Future Wager pools and lone Kentucky Oaks Future Wager pool yesterday. In a significant change, all Derby and Oaks future pools will consist of three days of wagering. Previous pools for both wagers had been four-day events. Dates for the three Derby pools, pending final approval by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission, are:

- Pool 1 – Feb. 12-14
- Pool 2 – March 5-7
- Pool 3 – March 26-28

The single pool for the Kentucky Oaks Future wager will coincide with the March 5-7 KDFW Pool 2.

Betting will open each day of the Derby and Oaks pools at noon (all times Eastern). The Derby pools will close at 6 p.m. on Sunday, while betting on the lone Oaks pool will conclude at 6:30 p.m. Exacta wagering, a popular addition to the future betting menu in 2009, will be offered during all three KDFW pools in 2010. The exacta option was offered on the latter two Derby Future pools in 2009, along with its traditional win option. The Kentucky Oaks Future Wager will not offer exactas in 2010.

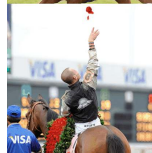

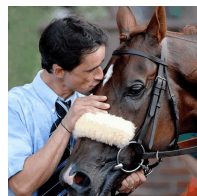

IN SUMMATION RETIRES TO OCALA STUD

Seven-year-old **In Summation** (Put it Back--Fiesta Baby, by Dayjur), a two-time track-record holder and Grade I-

winning millionaire, has been retired from racing and will return to his home state of Florida to start his new career as a stallion at J. Michael O'Farrell Jr.'s Ocala Stud Farm. The Florida-bred's racing career spanned five years and included 11 stakes wins--four of them graded. In Sum-

mation's biggest victory came in the 2007 GI Bing Crosby H. at Del Mar. Perhaps his most electrifying performances were in back-to-back graded stakes wins at Santa Anita in 2008, when he set two track records at six and 5 1/2 furlongs. In Summation won the GIII El Conejo H. in 1:01.27 for 5 1/2 furlongs--a record that still stands-- and he returned three weeks later to win the six-furlong GII Palos Verdes H. in 1:06.67, which was a few ticks off the world record at the time. "In Summation fits the bill of what we look for in a stallion," said O'Farrell. "People in Florida know him well. He was an immensely talented and durable racehorse, and we have high hopes for his career as a stallion." Trained by Christophe Clement for owner Waterford Stable, he retires with a record of 29-12-6-1 and earnings of \$1,266,166. Out of the multiple stakes-producing Dayjur mare Fiesta Baby, In Summation will stand his initial season for a fee of \$4,000, stands and nurses.

"Although I am very sorry that Trade Fair is not returning this season, we have managed to secure an excellent deal for his Northern Hemisphere shareholders, and we also have an agreement from the new owners that we can lease the horse back next year should there be a demand for his services," Redvers said in a press release. "He has made a bright start in Western Australia with his first runners and Absolute Pleasure, who won first time out at Ascot, Perth, looks an exciting prospect. However, although he has had plenty of winners here and has the hugely promising David Elsworth-trained runner, Fair Trade, to look forward to, he failed to produce a stakes winner with his first two-year-old crop, and that was going to make promoting him very difficult this season. At the end of the day, we were made an excellent offer, and it was in his shareholders' best interests to accept." A dual Group 3 winner for owner/breeder Juddmonte Farm, Trade Fair placed third in the 2002 G1 Dewhurst S.
