SHIP IN THE DESERT

The inaugural meeting of Meydan Racecourse will be held under the lights tonight, with Shadwell Farm sponsoring the eight-race card. Godolphin will be well represented in the night's feature, the G3 Al Maktoum Challenge R1 at 1600 meters on Tapeta. **Midshipman** (Unbridled's Song), the U.S. champion two-year-old of 2008, makes his first start since finishing third by 3/4 of a length in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile on Santa Anita's Pro-Ride surface Nov. 7. Frankie Dettori has the mount aboard the chestnut, who will break from the outside in post 14. "Midshipman is in good form and he looks a much better

horse in terms of condition compared to last season--physically, he appears to be a different horse," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. "He has some very good form on Pro-Ride and Polytrack in America, and the Tapeta surface is very similar. He has been working well, but I think he will improve on whatever he does on Thursday." Trained by Bob Baffert to capture the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Del Mar Futurity in 2008, Midshipman missed most of his sophomore season with a minor injury, but proved a comfortable winner of a Belmont allowance in September prior to his return trip to Santa Anita. Godolphin will also field **My Indy (Arg)** (Indygo Shiner), who captured this event last year when it was contested on dirt at Nad al

Sheba. After adding a score the following month in Round 2, the brown horse was a distant fifth in the G1 Dubai World Cup in March, and hasn't faced the starter since. "We gave him a break in the summer and he looks in really good form at the moment," bin Suroor added. "He has been working really well. I am very pleased with his condition and I am really happy with him. He has been working on the Tapeta and seems to handle the surface. The mile distance will suit him, and I am hoping for a big run."

GIO PONTI TO PREP IN TAMPA BAY?

Castleton Lyons' **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat), who gathered a brace of Eclipse Awards for his 2009 accomplishments, will likely kick off the new year in the Tampa Bay Breeders' Cup S. Feb. 20, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The \$150,000 event will be contested at 8 1/2 furlongs on the turf. Remaining in California following his runner-up effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 7, the bay arrived at Payson Park Tuesday. His early 2010 target is the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 27. "At the moment, we're most probably going to the Tampa Bay Breeders' Cup," Clement told *DRF*. "The distance of the race, quality of the turf course and timing to the Dubai World Cup are all reasons why we chose this particular race." The conditioner added, "The timing of these races was part of the reason why we took Gio Ponti out of California and brought him down here. The one race for him at Santa Anita is seven weeks out from the Dubai World Cup, which is our main goal at the moment. He also missed some training. He jogged seven out of the last 10 days, because of the weather and track conditions at Santa Anita. By bringing him here, I can keep him at Payson Park and see him every day."

Shah's Clutch Player (Malibu Moon), another colt who won well first time out, was euthanized earlier this month after contracting pneumonia.

Eightyfiveinafifty Works at Aqueduct...

Eightyfiveinafifty (Forest Camp) continues to work well for his intended stakes debut in the Whirlaway S. at Aqueduct Feb. 6. The ♣ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♣ was tried around two turns yesterday by trainer Gary Contessa, breezing seven furlongs in an official 1:27 flat at the Big A. He was the lone horse to work the distance. "He went really good and strong, :12 and change every eighth," Contessa told *Daily Racing Form*,

adding that he caught the colt a bit quicker, in 1:26.14. Contessa explained that he was trying to give his charge a bit of two-turn experience, as Eightyfiveinafifty has raced six furlongs in his only two previous starts. He finished third to Dublin (Afleet Alex) in a Saratoga maiden last August, then returned to romp by 17 1/4 lengths over the inner track Jan. 19, earning a 105 Beyer fig. "I was very, very pleased," Contessa said. "He navigated the two turns well, which is what I was more concerned with. Will he go two turns? There are so many factors involved. We'll see. At least we know he's a hell of a sprinter."

([video](#)) with the addition of blinkers. "He went out there and did it the way he was supposed to, the way I really thought he could do it," trainer Steve Klesaris told *DRF*. "He's still trying to figure out the game. If he could harness his energy a little bit he could be better. From a pedigree standpoint, he'll run as far as they write races."

CURLIN'S STUD FEE REDUCED Lane's End announced yesterday that the 2010 stud fee for **Curlin** (Smart Strike) has been reduced to \$40,000, stands and nurses. The two-time Horse of the Year had previously been listed at \$60,00 for the upcoming breeding season. "We are delighted with the three Curlin foals that we've seen so far, and are eagerly awaiting our homebred Curlin babies," majority owner Jess Jackson said in a statement. "We also know that times are tough for our friends in the breeding business. To continue to attract the best book of mares for Curlin and further help our breeders, we have decided to lower Curlin's fee for the 2010 breeding season to \$40,000."

P VAL CLEARED FOR CANNONBALL RIDE Officials at Racing Victoria yesterday gave embattled jockey Patrick Valenzuela the green light to ride Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **Cannonball** (Catienus) in Saturday's G1 Lightning S. at Flemington. The approval came after Racing Victoria received additional information they had requested from American racing officials. Valenzuela, 47, is currently riding full time at the Fair Grounds in New Orleans and was booked despite never having ridden Cannonball in a race. The Ramseys reserved jockey Michael Rodd as a backup. Cannonball, runner-up in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot and third in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, exits a 10th-place finish in the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Sprint Dec. 13. The post position draw for the Lightning S., the first leg of the Global Sprint Challenge, takes place this morning at Flemington.

EASTER CATALOGUE ONLINE The catalogue for the boutique 2010 Inglis Easter Yearling Sale is now online at www.inglis.com.au. The auction, conducted over three days, Apr. 6-8, features 500 lots in the select session one followed by 114 offerings in session two on the final afternoon of the sale. The catalogue features youngsters from 173 stakes-winning dams, including 44 Grade 1 winners. Additionally, there are 172 stakes winners, and 51 winners at the highest level. "Once again, we have been fortunate to receive great support from all of Australasia's leading breeders, with their best horses being aimed at the Easter Sale," Inglis Bloodstock Director Jonathan D'Arcy said. The sale has been bolstered by a couple of high-profile additions since the preview catalogue was published in December. Tony Santic has opted to offer the second foal from three-time G1 Melbourne Cup winner Makybe Diva (GB) (Desert King {Ire}), a filly by Fusaichi Pegasus; Milanova (Aus) (Danehill), purchased by Coolmore Stud for A\$5 million in 2008, will be represented by the Encosta de Lago (Aus) filly she was carrying at the time. The 10-year-old Milanova is a full sister to MG1SW Holy Roman Emperor (Ire). D'Arcy is confident that the prevailing economic situation will open the sale up to a broader group of buyers. "Given market conditions thus far in 2010, it is reasonable to assume that A\$80,000 to A\$150,000 will be able to buy you a top-class individual at this year's sale," he said.

The nicely bred Witty is nearing a return to the races. The half-sister to G1 Dubai World Cup hero Well Armed (Tiznow) and GI Travers S. third Helsinki was sidelined shortly after taking the GIII Railbird S. over the ill-fated Carlsbad (Rocky Bar) last May, but is up to working six panels in the mornings for Richard Mandella. Returning to the worktab in December, she most recently breezed at Santa Anita in 1:15 1/5 Jan. 15 and in 1:13 1/5 Jan. 25.

"Witty is doing well and Dick is looking for a race soon," reported co-owner Ramona Bass. "I think the weather has slowed us down a bit. I know we don't have an exact race in mind, but it should be soon."

Acquired at the 2007 Keeneland September Sale for \$400,000 by Jane B. Dunn on behalf of Bass, Claiborne Farm's Dell Hancock and Adele Dilschneider, Witty debuted a 3 1/2-length winner sprinting 5 1/2 panels at Santa Anita last March ([video](#)). She was subsequently tabbed a ♣ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♣ after capturing a NW1X by daylight at Santa Anita a month later ([video](#)).

Out of the blue-hen mare Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister), the handsome chestnut announced his presence with authority in 2008, debuting with an 11 1/2-length win in Japan in February, following with a dazzling tally in Belmont's GI Peter Pan S. in May ([video](#)). The 3/4-brother to champion Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) was forced to miss a much anticipated showdown with Big Brown (Boundary) in the GI Belmont S. due to a well-documented stone bruise. Sidelined for five months, he kept his perfect record in tact with a measured allowance score at the Oak Tree meeting in October, but failed to land a blow at odds of 9-1 in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita, fading to finish 12th behind Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality). Casino Drive closed out his three-year-old campaign with a close sixth-place finish in the G1 Japan Cup Dirt in December. His abbreviated four-year-old season consisted of a conditions win at Nakayama in late January and a strong second in the Feb. 22 G1 February S. at Tokyo before his trip to the desert.

To date, Casino Drive sports a record of 8-4-1-0 and \$838,539 in earnings. The \$950,000 KESEP yearling graduate is also a half-brother to GI Belmont S. hero Jazil (Seeking the Gold) and Breeders' Cup Marathon victor Man of Iron (Giant's Causeway).

Hull, an eye-catching maiden winner on the GIII Risen Star S. and GIII Silverbulletday S. undercard at Fair Grounds last February ([TDN In Sharper Focus](#)), earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status following a runaway optional claiming tally at Turfway Apr. 2. Tested for class in Churchill's GIII Derby Trial S. Apr. 25, the dark bay pressed hot early fractions of :21 3/5 and :44 1/5, and powered clear in the stretch despite racing greenly to a four-length decision ([video](#)). Hull lost his unbeaten tag when fading to fourth behind Munnings (Speightstown) in the GII Woody Stephens S. at Belmont Park June 6, and hasn't faced the starter since.

According to Team Valor International principal Barry Irwin, Hull was diagnosed by Dr. Larry Bramlage as suffering from bone bruising on the ends of his cannon bones. The \$82,000 FTMMAY graduate returned to the worktab with a three-furlong move in :35.80 at Fair Grounds Saturday.

"[Trainer] Dale [Romans] traveled from Fort Lauderdale to New Orleans for the colt's first work last Saturday and he told me the colt could not have worked easier or looked any better," Irwin revealed. "Miguel Mena, who rode the colt in his last few races, was aboard for the breeze and said he felt good. We will most likely run him once at Fair Grounds this winter and look to run him during Kentucky Derby weekend at Churchill Downs. He is considered by us to be a candidate for either the Breeders' Cup Sprint or Dirt Mile, as the Breeders' Cup will be at Churchill Downs this year and we know he likes his home track a lot."

Along with Gary Barber, Team Valor International privately purchased a 50-percent interest in Hull from Bill and Corrine Heiligbrodt following his maiden victory.

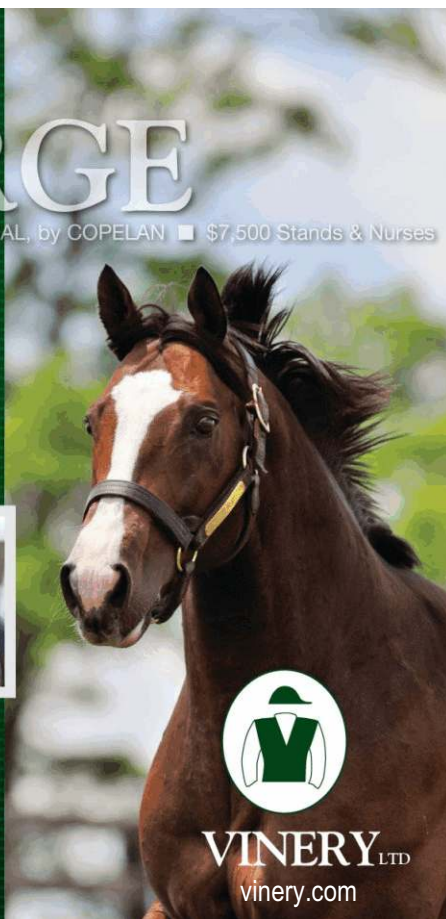

20-SOMETHING

I wish I had a dollar for every time I have heard, "Horse racing is a dying sport. Its customers are doing just that--dying off--and there is no one to replace them. Young people don't like horse racing." And those statements were made by people within the industry!

I think it is important that I introduce you to Cole Coan and Jason Gibbons.

Cole is a 26-year-old resident of Richland Hills, Texas. I recently attended his wedding, and was impressed by the design of his cake (see picture). To illustrate even more how much they love the sport, I gave Cole and his bride the choice between a kitchen appliance or a Calvin Borel autographed photo of Rachel Alexandra as a wedding gift, and they both enthusiastically answered, "Are you kidding? The photo!" Cole and his wife attended the Preakness this year and had a great time.

Cole does not come from a horse-racing family. He is a normal 20-something sports fan. He was the captain of his Southlake Carroll High School football team as a 6-3, 260-pound defensive lineman. The top prize is \$500,000 to the winner, so Friday's and Saturday's competition in Las Vegas should be a great deal of fun.

Cole and Jason want horse racing to be successful. Like any 20-something on an entertainment budget, they like free stuff, discounts and live music, all of which create a fun-loving, high-energy atmosphere. Mention college days or nights at the track, with free admission for students, add drink specials and live music, and Cole thinks you have a winner. Use all the new vehicles for communication, such as Facebook, Myspace and Twitter, and there will be advertising savings and greater results. Cole and Jason had 20 other excellent ideas on how to increase business, such as beer and wine festivals, handicapping clubs, fraternity/sorority events, class reunions, collegiate handicapping challenges between schools, dollar days, etc. I think you get the picture.

Many other sports place an emphasis on marketing to the youth. Major League Baseball may be the best. Their teams host many giveaways directed at 12 and under, to attract youngsters and their parents. The Texas Rangers sponsor numerous clinics and other events to promote Little League baseball. When I was a member of the American Quarter Horse Association Racing Council in the 1990s, I witnessed the dedication of leaders such as Jim Helzer to promote youth involvement with that breed.

While I am not advocating totally ignoring families in horse-racing marketing, possibly we should view 20-somethings as our "youth."

They are at an age where they can legally play our game. Many are true entertainment seekers, without the pressures and time constraints of having to raise a family. If Cole and Jason are any indication, they love games and sports. And, as our sport continues to embrace technology, they will be comfortable with our new distribution channels. Do you know anyone under 30 who is not fluent with their cell phone and computer?

So, what should we do about this opportunity? I challenge all tracks and horsemen organizations to begin a 20-something marketing plan. In Kentucky, the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association works with the tracks to give away college scholarships during a day of racing. This has been a very successful promotion. Anyone who has ever been to Keeneland in the spring knows what I am talking about. Del Mar and Lone Star Park have used live music to drive young attendees. As president of Lone Star Park, I will never forget the night we hosted a Willie Nelson concert after the races. That promotion drew over 20,000 fans, and I found myself behind a bar assisting with the sale of more than 50,000 beers.

I will be playing to win in Friday's and Saturday's National Handicapping Championship. As a handicapper, I know that I am 250-1 to take home the trophy. As such, I am going to root for my young friend Jason. The positive reinforcement for him, and positive p.r. for our industry, far outweigh any personal profit motives I may have.

Well...almost.

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



HIGH COURT RULES ON CAMPAIGN FINANCE

In a [landmark 5-4 decision](#), the Supreme Court last week ruled that the government may not ban political spending by corporations in candidate elections. As a result of the ruling, corporations now may spend to advertise in support or opposition of specific candidates.

The decision does not allow corporations to make campaign contributions. Political Action Committees, such as [Horse PAC](#), will continue to serve their role of providing contributions to federal candidates or parties. Only PACs and individuals are allowed to make such contributions.

The high court's ruling last week overruled a [1990 decision](#) that upheld restrictions on corporate campaign spending and a [2003 decision](#) that upheld part of a 2002 law that restricted campaign spending by corporations and unions. It also dismissed parts of a 63-year-old law that forbid corporations from using their own money to endorse or oppose particular candidates by name.

This year's midterm elections, to be held on November 2, will be the first contested under the new ruling.

TERRY MILLS DIES

Trainer Terry Mills died yesterday following a long battle with cancer. He was 71 years old. Best known for his handling of the 2002 G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. winner Where or When (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}), the Epsom-based conditioner had also been responsible for the 1999 G2 King's Stand S. scorer Mitcham (Ire) (Hamas {Ire}) since taking out a licence six years earlier. A statement from the trainer's assistant Richard Ryan read, "Terry Mills passed away today peacefully after fighting a long struggle against cancer. Our deepest sympathy goes out to his wife Beryl and his two sons Robert and Stephen. I speak for all the staff at Loretta Lodge in feeling the huge loss of our friend and leader. The yard will continue to be run to the highest standards as per the wishes of Mr. Mills. His son Robert is expected to be granted a temporary licence to train shortly." Other notable successes for Mills came courtesy of Bobzao (Ire) (Alzao) in the 1994 G2 Hardwicke S. and Close To You (Ire) (Shinko Forest {Ire}), who dead-headed in the 2005 G2 Champagne S.



EIA-INFECTED HORSES EUTHANIZED

A pair of horses imported to England from Romania via Belgium were recently diagnosed with Equine Infectious Anaemia (EIA)--also referred to as swamp fever--and have been humanely destroyed. Swamp fever, for which there is no cure, is notifiable by law in Britain, and any horse positive for the disease is subject to compulsory slaughter. The risk of transmission to other horses in the United Kingdom is very much reduced at this time of the year, as biting flies are not present in the UK during the winter months. Representatives of England's Thoroughbred Breeders Association welcomed the response to the two infected horses, and demonstrated the closeness of the relationship developed over the recent years between representatives of the Racing and Breeding Industry and DEFRA, the organization responsible for alerting the issue. Louise Kemble, TBA chief executive, said the Industry was "clearly disappointed that two EIA-positive horses were imported from Romania into the UK, in spite of the EU's recognition that Romania's endemic EIA status presents a risk to other EU states, including the UK. These horses should have been properly tested before leaving Romania. However, we are relieved that DEFRA's subsequent investigations to date have confirmed no spread to in-contact horses, which indicates that at the present time there is no need take further action."

The sale got off to a flying start when the first horse through the ring, an Oaklands Park Stud-consigned daughter of the successful dual-hemisphere sire More Than Ready, was hammered down for A\$230,000. John Brocklebank's BC3 Thoroughbreds was the successful bidder on the October foal which was produced by the stakes-winning Ebony Magic (Aus) (Bletchley Park {Aus}), herself a full sister to the dam of G1SW Covertly (Aus) (Metal Storm {Aus}). Simon Marshall, the sales and industry liaison manager for BC3, said their purchase was the pick of the session. "She's a lovely filly--one that will be very suited to the BC3 program," Marshall said. "We have a grading system and she was just one level off the top and we think in three months time she will be there. She is going to make into a lovely breeze-up prospect later in the year."

A son of Fastnet Rock (Aus) led the way for the colts, selling for A\$220,000. Out of the SW & MGSP Imaginaire (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus), the bay was purchased by Magic Millions regular Tiong Seng Ong, one of eight horses snapped up by Singaporean interests.

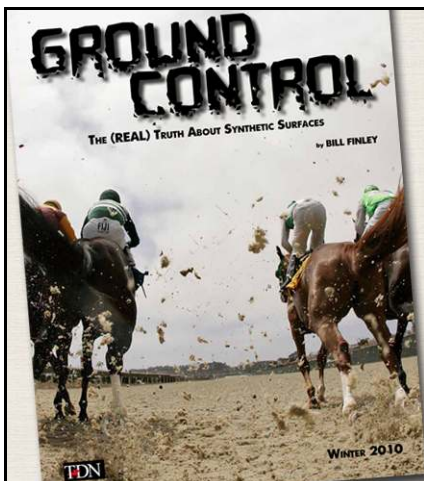
