# Triple Threats

**TIZ CHROME, DOMONATION POSSIBLE FOR SOUTHWEST** Following the cancellation of last Saturday's GII Robert B. Lewis S. at Santa Anita, connections of **Tiz Chrome**

(Tiznow) and **Domonation** (Maria's Mon) are now considering a tilt at the GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn Park Feb. 15, *Daily Racing Form* reports. Even though the Lewis has been rescheduled for Saturday,

trainer Bob Baffert may now send Tiz Chrome, the easy winner of the non-black-type Stuka S. Dec. 19, to the Southwest instead of **"TDN Rising Star"** and Jan. 16 GIII San Rafael S. victor **Conveyance** (Indian Charlie). According to *DRF*, Baffert will make a final decision before a flight leaves from California to Arkansas Wednesday. Domonation's trainer John Sadler plans to keep **Dave in Dixie** (Dixie Union) in the Lewis. Domonation was second in the Stuka and third in the San Rafael in his last two starts, while Dave in Dixie was last seen finishing sixth in the GI Norfolk S. in October. "It's never optimal," Sadler told *DRF*. "They were ready to go Saturday. You want to go when you've trained and [are] ready to run."

## Levine Feeling Blessed Following 'Saint's Breeze...

Buddy's Saint (Saint Liam), dominant winner of the GII Nashua S. and GII Remsen S. at Aqueduct in the fall, remains on track to make his sophomore debut in the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth after earning a bullet for his six-furlong 1:12.68 breeze at Gulfstream Sunday. "He worked really well, better than ever before," trainer Bruce Levine told *Daily Racing Form*. "The horse in front of him kept his attention, and Jose said he was well within himself the whole time [and] that he was afraid to let him run because he had a lot of horse there." The conditioner told the trade daily the Kingfield Stables representative will breeze one final time either Saturday or Sunday in the lead up to the Fountain of Youth.

## Pletcher Plots Paths...

Todd Pletcher has selected the GII Risen Star S. at the Fair Grounds Feb. 20 as the next start for **Discreetly Mine** (Mineshaft), while **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon) is now under consideration for Aqueduct's GIII Gotham S. Mar. 6. Discreetly Mine, a half-brother to GISW Discreet Cat (Forestry), was runner-up in Belmont's GII Futurity S. and GI Champagne S. as a juvenile, and was a troubled fourth as

the favorite in the Spectacular Bid S. at Gulfstream Jan. 9 in his lone start at three. "The way he's been finishing his works and galloping out afterwards is giving me more confidence he'll stay two turns," Pletcher told *DRF*. Super Saver was freshened after rolling to victory in Churchill Downs' GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. in November, and has posted three workouts since late January. **Rule** (Roman Ruler) and **Eskendereya** (Giant's Causeway) remain on target for the Feb. 13 GIII Sam F. Davis S. and Feb. 20 GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S., respectively.

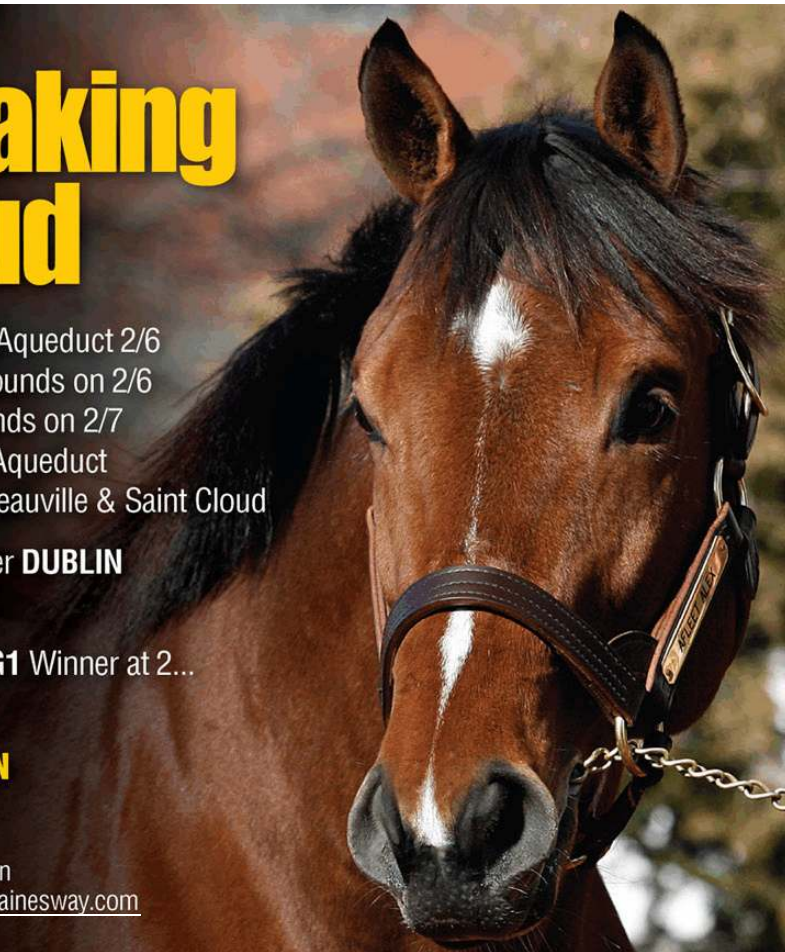


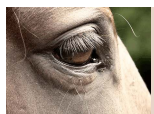

One of the most difficult scenarios for breeders to assess is when a famous racehorse makes a less-than-sensational start to his stallion career, causing his fee to plummet. The current economic climate has only accentuated this situation and American breeders this year have the opportunity to pay \$30,000 for 2004 Horse of the Year Ghostzapper, instead of his original \$200,000; \$20,000 for 2003 Horse of the Year Mineshaft, instead of his opening price of \$100,000; \$15,000 for Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus, who in the past has commanded 10 times that amount; or \$10,000 for 2004's champion three-year-old colt Smarty Jones, who spent his first four years at \$100,000.

Other spectacular reductions are available for some stallions who originally worked their way up the rankings, such as \$17,500 for Forestry, whose fee was as high as \$125,000 as recently as 2007, and \$50,000 for Awesome Again, whose 2008 fee was \$150,000.

Breeders who couldn't previously afford these higher fees now have access to some one-time superstars, but is it wise to support such horses? And is it fair to expect the stallion to maintain his level of performance, or even better it, after his fee has fallen substantially?

Normally a stallion's fee dictates the quality of the mares he attracts, unless he is lucky enough to enjoy the loyal support of a major-league owner or syndicate. So, if the quality of his mares falls in tandem with his fee, can he realistically be expected to thrive?

The answer, I believe, is that some of them represent a worthwhile gamble. For a start, the level of fee can change the type of mare sent to a stallion. We have all witnessed young stallions which make eye-catching starts with hard-knocking mares whose virtues included speed and toughness. After the stallion's bright start sets his fee soaring, he then tends to receive a more classic-type of mare, with more stamina in her background. Unfortunately, this switch in emphasis doesn't always play to the stallion's strengths and consequently his results do not improve in proportion to the rise in his fee. *cont. p4*

Of course the reverse may occasionally also be true. A stallion who is perceived to be failing may actually benefit from the change in the type of mare sent to him. He might prove better suited by tough, talented mares with unexceptional pedigrees than by blue-blooded mares of unproven soundness. Also, there is much more evidence available to breeders using a stallion several years into his career as to what does or does not suit him.

One stallion who successfully halted a decline in his career is Lemon Drop Kid, the 2000 champion older male.

Little more than three years ago, after Citronnade had won the GII San Gorgonio H., I commented in this column that:

“The bare facts are that, after starting out at \$100,000, his [Lemon Drop Kid’s] fee has gone into freefall, quickly dropping to \$75,000 and \$50,000 before sinking to \$20,000. This fall--combined with a similar slump in his number of mares (from 120 in 2003 to 58 in 2006)--would appear to tell the whole story. But does it?

“The fact that his AEI of 1.63 falls well short of his mares’ Comparable Index confirms that Lemon Drop Kid wasn’t worthy of the sort of fee he started out at. But the record of this extremely well-bred son of Kingmambo is by no means all doom and gloom. Indeed he could represent an attractive option at \$20,000.”

Plenty of breeders apparently agreed with me, as the Lane’s End stallion went on to cover 150 mares at his lowest fee in 2007, for a live-foal crop of 117 in 2008. There is good reason for thinking that this crop will benefit both Lemon Drop Kid and the breeders who gave him the benefit of the doubt--it achieved an average of over \$72,000 at the yearling sales, with a top price of \$450,000, which is pretty good going in today’s climate. There is also encouragement to be found in his previous crop, sired at only \$30,000. Lemon Drop Kid attracted fewer than 60 mares in 2006, giving him a three-year-old crop numbering only 39 named foals. Of the 15 which raced at two, seven became winners, three became stakes winners and as many as five won or placed in stakes.

Lemon Drop Kid’s ever-improving record has ensured that his fee has bounced back from the depths of 2007. He covered 155 mares at \$35,000 in 2008 and 127 at \$50,000 last year. His connections have wisely dropped him back to \$35,000 this year, when he is again sure to be popular, thanks to his achievement of siring 11 percent stakes winners. I should also point out that his AEI now stands at more than 2.00 and is now much closer to his Comparable Index.

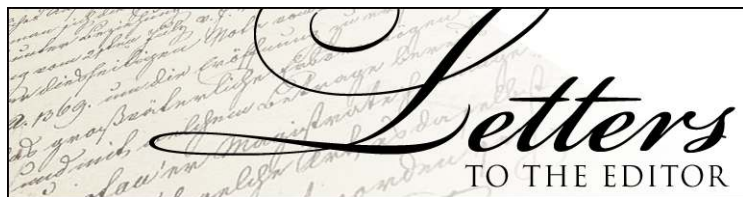
**Pedigree Insights cont.**

As Bill Oppenheim highlighted in his recent columns on the latest APEX figures, Lemon Drop Kid ranks among the most successful stallions of recent years, brushing shoulders with the likes of Galileo, Smart Strike, Unbridled's Song, Giant's Causeway and Oasis Dream as one of the elite Group 1 stallions with an A Runner Index of 2.50+ and an ABC Runners Index of 2.00+. Incidentally, Awesome Again--another of the stallions I mentioned earlier--is another member of this elite group.

Lemon Drop Kid did extremely well to become a Grade I winner at two, despite his May 26 birthday, and he continued to progress throughout his second and third seasons. It is therefore hardly surprising that some of his progeny also shine as mature performers. Citronnade was four when she gained all five of her graded successes; Santa Teresita became a Grade I winner at five; and Richard's Kid, winner of the GII San Antonio H. two days ago, is another slow-burner. The Dubai World Cup contender didn't gain his first graded success until his 19th start, when he took the Pacific Classic last fall.

Richard's Kid has every right to be tough and durable, as Lemon Drop Kid started 24 times and the five-year-old's dam, the turf performer Tough Broad, fully lived up to her name, making 49 starts in five years on the track.

Tough Broad's demanding career hasn't hindered her broodmare career, as she has become only the third daughter of Broad Brush to produce a Grade I winner, following the dams of Dreaming of Anna and Hot Cha Cha. It is worth noting that Lemon Drop Kid has a perfect record with his eight foals out of Broad Brush mares, with two stakes winners among them, and he also two stakes winners from six foals out of mares by Private Account, sire of Richard's Kid's second dam.



I think it's about time racing took advantage of the overhead camera's placed in mini-blimps or other technology available to provide for better camera angles for resolving inquiries. Unfortunately for the connections of Take the Points (*crossed the wire in first, but was DQ'd to fifth in Saturday's GI Gulfstream Park Turf H.*), a better view of what happened was not available. This is not the place to debate the merits of the decision handed down by Gulfstream Park's stewards, the point is to add this technology so Grade 1 races and \$5,000 claimers alike can have the benefit of races under review to be decided with the best available information available.

**MT. LIVERMORE MARE TOPS F-T WINTER**

**Lavender Sky**, a six-year-old daughter of Mt. Livermore, realized the top price of \$340,000 at Fasig-Tipton's Winter Mixed Sale in Lexington Monday. A member of the Three Chimneys Sales consignment, [hip 149](#) was purchased by Dr. William Lockridge, signing the ticket on behalf of an undisclosed foreign client. Out of Munnaya (Nijinsky II), the chestnut finished runner-up in the GII San Gorgonio H. and third in the GII Santa Ana H. The half-sister to stakes winner and group placed Mystic Melody (Seattle Slew) also finished third in the GII Dahlia H. Campaigned by Tom Lenner, Howard Litt, Margie Strauss, Arnold Zetcher and Alex Solis II, the mare is a granddaughter of GSW Hiaam (Alydar--Kamar, by Key to the Mint), who is a half-sister to MGISW Gorgeous (Slew o' Gold), GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Seaside Attraction (Seattle Slew) and Canadian champion Key to the Moon (Wajima).

Despite getting the top prize of the day, Dr. Lockridge failed to land the second-highest priced mare of the afternoon, [hip 136](#). Consigned by Summerfield (Francis and Barbara Vanlangendonck), **Julia Tuttle** (Giant's Causeway) was secured by Cherokee Equine's Tom Ryan, who signed the ticket for the five-year-old. Acting on behalf of the Australian-based Bowden Global Equine, Ryan paid \$235,000 to halter the daughter of Candy Cane (Arg), a full-sister to Argentine champion miler and leading sire Candy Ride (Arg) (Ride the Rails).

Late in the session, seven-year-old **Bear's Kid** (Lemon Drop Kid), secured a \$260,000 final bid from the Novel Group. Consigned by Glenmalure Farm LLC (Peter & Gina Kirwan), the son of GI Gazelle H. winner Tap to Music (Pleasant Tap) is a winner of three starts, including the 2005 GII Summer S. From the extended family of Northern Afleet and graded stakes winner Stellarette, the bay sold as a stallion prospect.

Also drawing six figures yesterday was [hip 94](#), **Rgirldoesn'tbluff** (Pine Bluff--Chasing Wind, by Mining). Louise and Kiki Courtelis' Town and Country Farms purchased the seven-year-old for \$215,000 from the Hunter Valley Farm consignment. Trained by Kirk Ziadie and for a short time by Wesley Ward, Rgirldoesn'tbluff was a four-time stakes winner and was runner-up to Sugar Swirl (Awesome Again) in a sloppy renewal of the GIII First Lady H. in 2008. ## RINGSIDE... with Lucas Marquardt

### THIS 'SKY' IS NOT THE LIMIT

Yesterday's topper, the \$340,000 **Lavender Sky** (Mt. Livermore), in a way represented the meeting of two promising young operations in Thoroughbred Racing. Selling the six-year-old was a group that included Alex Solis II, the son of jockey Alex Solis who, despite being in his mid-twenties, has been involved in the purchase of horses of the ilk of Grade I winner Daytona (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), as well as multiple graded winners The Pamplemousse (Kawfain) and Valbenny (Ire) (Val Royal {Fr}).

And the other operation, the buyer? Well, we can't say, really. Not because we are secretive sort and reluctant to part with the information, but because blood-stock agent Dr. Bill Lockridge, who signed the ticket for Lavender Sky, said his client would rather remain anonymous at present. However, according to Lockridge, the gentleman for whom he is buying is looking to build a powerhouse, international breed-to-race operation.

Asked if it fair to characterize his client as new to the business, Lockridge, who helped establish Ashford Stud in the 1970s before the operation was sold to Coolmore, added, "Not exactly; he's been on the fringes. But now, he's ready to go full blast, and he wants to be a major force internationally. He's a first-glass guy, and very, very astute businessman.

"I would say that we'd like to purchase between 40 and 60 mares," added Lockridge. "I think he'll race; I don't think he's interested in being a commercial breeder. Most of his mares will stay in the Northern Hemisphere."

Lockridge and his client have found themselves a bit behind the eight ball, at least in terms of acquiring mares for the upcoming breeding season. The pair didn't join forces until just before the Keeneland January sale, leaving Lockridge a vastly diminished pool of mares to choose from. Lockridge, however, remained selective, and went after just one mare at January, the eventual sale-topper Miss Isella (Silver Charm), who was knocked down to Frank Stronach for \$1.085 million.

"She went way beyond what my evaluation of her was; I'm not sure where I quit, but it was substantially less than a million," said Lockridge.

Lockridge was stymied yet again early yesterday. Roughly 20 minutes before Lavender Sky entered the ring, Lockridge struck out on Julia Tuttle (Giant's Causeway) and was the underbidder on that \$235,000 broodmare prospect, but the stars aligned for the sale topper.

"Well, I liked her race record," Lockridge said of Lavender Sky. "Plus she's from the family of Kamar, who's one of the great blue-hen mares in the Thoroughbred world. Her dam was by Nijinsky II, and even though she wasn't a stellar racehorse, it's still Nijinsky. She could run and ran with good company and beat some good horses, so it was a combination of all of the above. She was a good individual--a little small--but very correct. She's the kind of mares you raise runners out of.

"I'd hope to pay less for her, but what I explained to the buyer, the top end of the horses bring as much today as they did three years ago," said Lockridge. "If he continues to buy at this level, I can virtually guarantee him success at the racetrack. I'd gone to my limit and maybe a little beyond, but she was a standout in the sale, and that's the level at which we want to buy. We want mares of that quality."

Lockridge said that he would be busy over the next weeks and months trying to add broodmares into the fold, though he admits that will be a tough proposition this far into the season.

"I'd like to get as many as 20 mares [this spring], which is a tall order, as a lot of these mare are already committed, and a lot of the quality mares are now in very strong hands and are hard to find and buy. But I'll be looking on a daily basis for additional mares. I like young mares, having their first or second foals, and they have to have run and been from a blue-hen family."



Looking toward a possible mate for Lavender Sky, Lockridge pointed to Taxonomist (Seeking the Gold), a two-year-old half-brother to the mare, as a possible deciding factor.

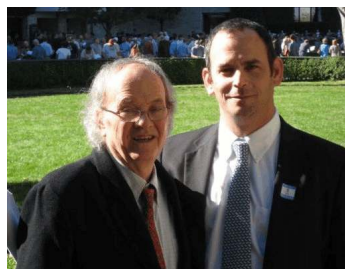
"It is my understanding that they think very highly of the Seeking the Gold, so it was suggested that we go to a Mr. Prospector-line horse," Lockridge explained. "One of the things that jumps out to me as a result of what I have seen Quality Road do--he's been my favorite male race horse over the past two years--is that Elusive Quality [the sire of last weekend's GI Donn H. winner] would be a good choice. But there are a lot of options with this mare. Kamar has crossed well with a number of male lines, and it's just a matter of sitting down and selecting a horse who's a proven stallion that I think is properly priced. In this market, and think you're so much better served with a mare like this to go to a proven stallion."

Lockridge said he wasn't sure where the mare would be boarded.

Now, back to Solis and his partners. Four years and one month ago, at the 2006 Keeneland January Sale, Three Chimneys Farm purchased Lavender Sky for \$130,000 on behalf of Solis, Tom Lenner, Howard Litt, Margie Strauss, and Arnold Zetcher. Litt's son Jason, who works in the bloodstock services department at Three Chimneys, helped find the filly.

Solis explained, "I run a lot of syndicates--The Pamplousse and Daytona (Ire) and horses like that--and I got a phone call from Jason, who's my partner in Kentucky. He said, 'I've got a filly I think you'll like.' So I raised some money out here and we wound up buying her."

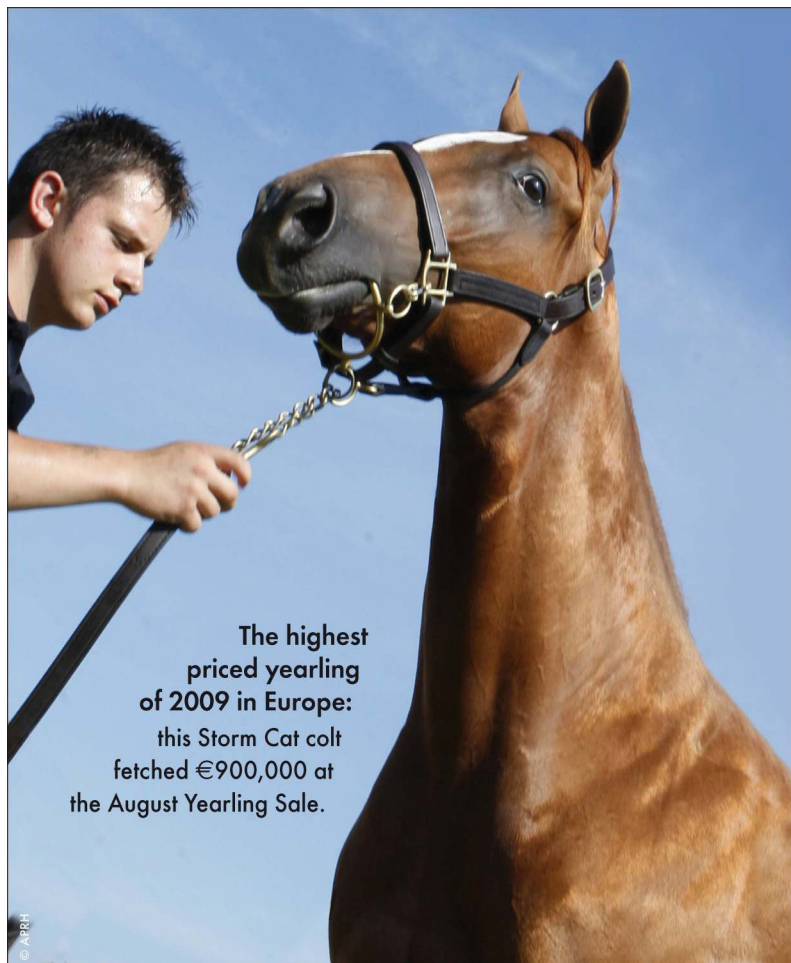
It wound up being an astute purchase, as Lavender Sky placed in a trio of Grade II events and banked nearly \$200,000 before topping yesterday's event. Despite the solid race record, Solis said we probably didn't see the mare's best effort.

"If she was lacking one thing, it was the killer instinct," Solis explained. "She was right there in a lot of those races and ran a five on The Sheets, but we had to

drop her into a 'non-winners of one' to get her to win her second race. But she had all the ability in the world, though mentally, she didn't always want to do it. Physically, she's a beautiful filly. She's not the biggest thing in the world, but a lot of those good grass fillies aren't that big, so that didn't worry us too much. She's really well-balanced and is beautiful and is real kind to be around." *cont. p4*

That clashes with the personality of Lavender Sky's half-sister Dreamalong (Rahy), reports Solis. In what turned out to be another savvy purchase, the same group that owned Lavender Sky came back to the well for Dreamalong, who is two years her junior. They purchased her for \$130,000 as a Keeneland September yearling in 2007, at which point Lavender Sky had broken her maiden and raced well in allowance company after returning from injury.

"Lavender Sky had broken her maiden really impressively [in November of her two-year-old year], but then had to have a chip removed from an ankle," Solis explained of how the story went down. "She came back at Del Mar as a three-year-old and was really coming around, and she finished a good second in an allowance race there. The [September] sale was three weeks later, and there was a stakes race around that time that we decided to pass on, because we didn't want to add black-type to the page. We knew this filly was going through the sale. So we played it a little differently, and everything worked out."

Dreamalong hasn't yet added her own black-type to the page, but Solis thinks it's probably a matter of time.

"She finished fifth, beaten only 1 13/4 lengths, in the GI Del Mar Oaks last summer, and recently was fourth, beaten a length, in a stakes at Hollywood in December," he said. "She's going to run next week in the GII Buena Vista H. at Santa Anita. She's a very talented filly and will be a nice stakes horse for sure."

As for the diverging temperaments, Solis added, "Dreamalong is a pretty evil horse to be around; she'll try to come through the webbing to get you."

Looking back to Lavender Sky's purchase, Solis relates a bit of breaking-and-training trivia.

"Lavender Sky was an unbroken two-year-old at the January Sale when we got her," Solis said. "We sent her to Florida to be broken, and she was actually broken with Zenyatta. Her and Zenyatta were both at Plumely Farms with Jeanne Mayberry. She called me up and said, 'Your filly can really run, but I've got one that's a little better.'"
