ALLYBAR UP TO THE CHALLENGE

Allybar (Ire) (King's Best) proved that his 7 1/2-length victory over G1 Dubai World Cup fancy Presvis (GB) (Sakhee) in a 10-furlong handicap Feb. 10 was something other than a fluke, coming from well back in the field beneath Ahmed Ajtebi for a half-length success in Round 2 of the G3 Maktoum Challenge Thursday night at Meydan. A listed stakes winner in England and France, the progressive four-year-old missed by just 3/4 of a length when third in the G3 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano at Deauville last Aug. 16, then claimed the same spot in the Sept. 19 G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange at Longchamp. Sent through the Arqana Arc Sale, he realized a bid of €370,000 and repaid some of that investment with his overpowering score in a falsely run race 13 days ago. One of the last to leave the stalls along with favored Crowded House (GB) (Rainbow Quest), Allybar cabooseed the field up the backstretch before being steered out to the grandstand side at the quarter pole. He hit the front inside the final furlong and found the line best of all, as Crowded House, left a bit flat-footed entering the lane, closed nicely, but too late. "He is a horse we like, and I imagine we will come back for the third round of the Maktoum Challenge on Super Thursday," commented winning trainer Saeed bin Suroor. Added Ajtebi, "I was always quite happy and he ran on very well when I asked him to win his race."

Drawn widest in a bulky field, Musir traveled three and four wide down the backstretch and on the turn. Switched out when straightened for home, he drove to the front and put the race to bed within a few strides. Next up is the G2 UAE Derby over 1900 meters Mar. 27. "He has been showing us that he's a bit special, and on that performance, the longer trip of the Derby will not be a problem," trainer Mike de Kock told *Racing Post*. "I told [jockey] Chris [Christophe Soumillon] to see what we had tonight and it was good performance." Added the Belgian, "He is a really nice colt and has a lot of class. His cruising speed is so high that he just pulled me into the race. How far he will stay I do not know, but he was impressive--I had been worried about the wide draw."

Fourth to subsequent G1SW Gladiatorus (Silic {Fr}) in this event last year, **Imbongi** took the G3 Criterion S. at Newmarket June 27 before finishing third in the G2 Summer Mile S. at Ascot July 11. Off thereafter, the chestnut returned with a useful runner-up effort behind Barbecue Eddie (Stormy Atlantic) in a Tapeta handicap Feb. 5 and gets back on his preferred surface tonight. **Justenuffhumor** will be saddled for the first time by Saeed bin Suroor. A dual Grade II winner in the States last summer for Kiaran McLaughlin, he was last seen finishing an excellent third to Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 7. The concern is whether there will be enough speed up front to set up his lethal turn of foot.

Racing Round-Up

RACHEL, ZENYATTA ON WORK TAB

Reigning Horse of the Year **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) continued preparations for her 2010 debut with a five-furlong drill yesterday at Fair Grounds. The four-year-old filly completed the distance over a fast main track in 1:00 1/5, clicking off fractions of :12, :23 4/5, :35 3/5 and :47 3/5. She galloped out six furlongs in 1:14 2/5. The work was the second fastest of 19 at the distance yesterday. "The racetrack was wet last week and a little slow, and we were being careful," trainer Steve Asmussen said after the work. "I thought she was overly aggressive today, a little quick, so hopefully we'll level off. Hopefully the weather will be as good as it was this morning and fairly consistent, and then I think we'll be exactly where we want to be." Rachel Alexandra is expected to make her first start since winning the GI Woodward S. last September in the Mar. 13 New Orleans Ladies S. at Fair Grounds and then could meet undefeated **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) in the Apr. 9 GI Apple Blossom H. at Oaklawn Park. Zenyatta also worked yesterday, going six furlongs in 1:14 at Hollywood Park. "She just galloped around there," trainer John Shirreffs told *Daily Racing Form*. "She looked absolutely beautiful." The Moss colorbearer is expected to make her 2010 debut in the Mar. 13 GI Santa Margarita Invitational H. at Santa Anita.

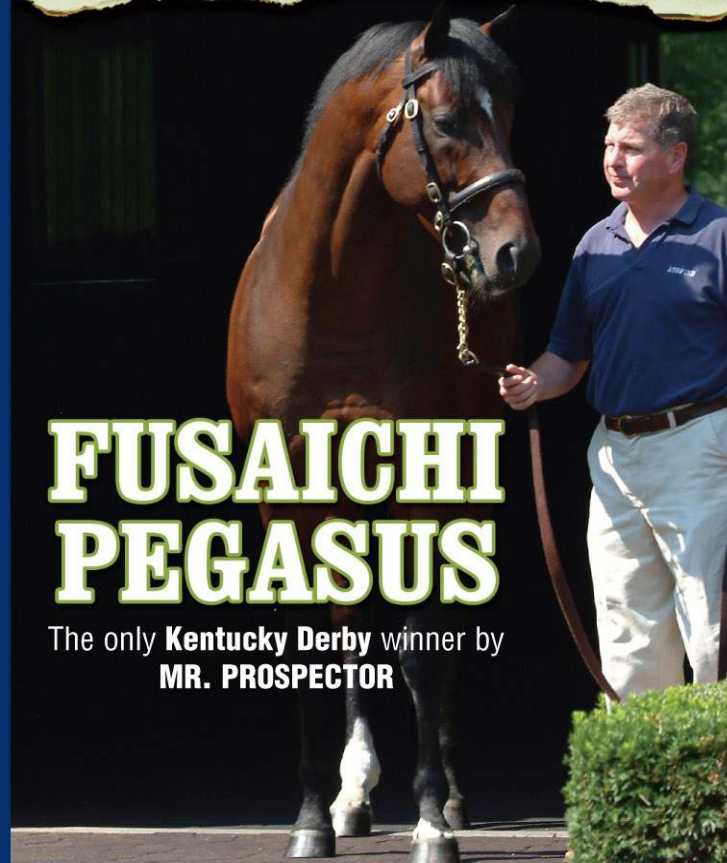

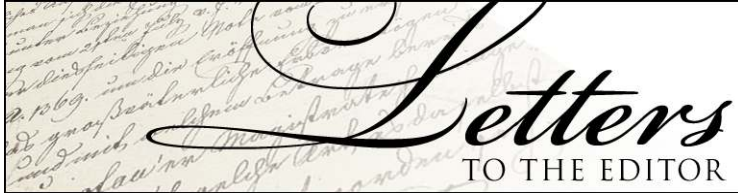

Dubai for Life Is Sweet?

Pam and Martin Wygod's **Life Is Sweet** (Storm Cat) may be sent across the world for the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 27, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Having closed out 2009 with an authoritative score in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic in November, the ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ began her five-year-old campaign with a rallying second in the GII Santa Maria H. at Santa Anita Feb. 13. "We're leaning a little toward Dubai," trainer John Shirreffs told *DRF*. In her only previous start against males, the bay finished third in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup last July.



Arthur Hancock sent a letter to the editor ([click here](#)) that ran in the Jan. 17 issue of the TDN. The following is a response from David Switzer.

The reluctance of some members of the equine community to accept that Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome (MRLS) is caused by Eastern Tent Caterpillars (ETC) is, perhaps, understandable because tent caterpillars have always been on horse farms and the idea that they could cause foal loss seems, on its surface, fantastic. But an intensive and exhaustive investigation linked tent caterpillars to foal losses in 2001 and multiple experiments performed in 2002 and 2003 validated and supported this conclusion. I think the attached review article that Dr. Karen McDowell ([Journal of Animal Science](#)) put together addresses the UK studies quite well in an accessible way. As we stated in this review paper of MRLS research performed by the University of Kentucky, there was extensive pasture monitoring and farm surveys immediately after the problem of MRLS initially came to the attention of the equine community and the University of Kentucky. The survey found no differences related to management that could be associated with MRLS. Specifically, there were no correlations, in pasture management (i.e., fertilization, herbicide treatment, mowing, etc), and no differences in pasture composition or hay fed or differences in nitrate levels in the pastures between pastures mares were grazing in and mares that aborted with signs of MRLS or where there was no MRLS reported. The proponents of the nitrate/nitrite hypothesis say that the testing and surveying was done after the fact. This is true, but Dr. Dwyer's epidemiological survey implicating Eastern Tent Caterpillars was also performed after the fact and scientific experiments that manipulated exposure of pregnant mares to ETC cause foal losses with MRLS symptoms in several, independent experiments. No experiments were performed that investigated nitrate levels because the survey data did not link nitrate levels to MRLS.

Those who champion a role of nitrates have never described controlled experiments that have been performed that would support their hypothesis. By contrast, the experiments to investigate the role of tent caterpillars were designed to be unbiased and many, including some of the University of Kentucky researchers, were skeptical that ETC could cause MRLS, but the results of the experiments were compelling. But the data testing the ETC as a cause of MRLS hypothesis is clear; it has been peer-reviewed by scientists and is published. For scientists that is the 'gold standard,' because the researchers have convinced other skeptical scientists of the validity of their experiments, results and conclusions. There are two factual errors in the recent letter. One was that the standard dose of tent caterpillars administered in some experiments to mares was 50g of ETC, not 500. A second is that mares do readily eat tent caterpillars, and videos are available on the web showing horses eating caterpillars voluntarily. Taken together, the evidence is compelling that the MRLS epidemic, as experienced in central Kentucky in 2001 and 2002, was caused by ingestion of tent caterpillars that were present in abnormally high numbers in those years. Arguments to the contrary are not supported by scientific evidence and may be a disservice to the community.

It's small wonder that Dogwood Stable President W. Cothran "Cot" Campbell has a soft spot for the two-year-old auctions. After all, it was the first horse he ever bought at a juvenile sale that, as he put it, "is probably responsible for me being in the horse business."

It was more than four decades ago, and Campbell, the chairman of an advertising agency in Atlanta, was trying to get into racing. The New Orleans native was attending a sale in Southern Florida when a filly by Yorktown caught his eye.

"That was Mrs. Cornwallis, who probably is the horse that put me in the game," Campbell recalled. "I bought her for \$5,500 at the two-year-old sale at Hialeah in 1971, and she was one of the top young horses of her generation. She focused a lot of attention on our operation and what we were doing."

What Campbell was attempting was uncharted territory in racing.

"I had begun to form some partnerships just for fun, and, at the time, partnerships had never been done--it was a brand new thing," he remarked. "When Mrs. Cornwallis got good and won the Alcibiades at Keeneland, the Wall Street Journal and Forbes and Fortune and a lot of the big publications wrote about it, and the next thing I knew I had a lot of investors, a lot of horses, and the tail began to wag the dog. It is a good story--very dramatic. She changed my life."

Campbell put his first partnerships together in 1969, and formed Dogwood Stable in 1973. That was the end of his career in advertising. Over the last 30-plus years, Dogwood has campaigned champions Inlander and Storm Song (who also captured the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies), as well as Preakness hero Summer Squall and stakes winners such as Practitioner, Dominion, Nassipour, Southjet, Wild Escapade, Early Warning, Trippi, Smok'n Frolic, Distilled, Limehouse and Cotton Blossom.

Looking to add his name to the roster is one of Dogwood's more recent juvenile purchases, Aikenite. Campbell picked the handsome bay out of the 2009 OBS February sale.

"He'd worked very fast on that synthetic track down there, and yet afterwards he had such an easy-going and placid way about him--it didn't stir him up," Dogwood's head honcho said. "I thought, 'here's a good-looking, big horse that has just worked very fast and he handled it well.' I liked him as an individual, and the breeder [Bobby Jones] was happy to stay in for a piece of him. I liked that, so I bought him."

Aikenite worked a quarter in :20 2/5 at the preview ([video](#)), the fastest move at the distance. That's something that just wouldn't have happened when Campbell was first buying at the breeze-ups.

"It used to be that a good horse, a decently bred horse, would never do anything but gallop," Campbell said. "The only ones that really breezed were the ill-bred horses."

There have been other changes at the juvenile venues.

"You never saw a horse hit with a stick, that was unheard of," he continued. "Blinkers were taboo. Those are all things that have changed. And there were not many pinhookers in the early days--I think there were just breeders who either didn't get their horses sold as yearlings or maybe held them back for a reason."

The type of horse on offer also has adapted to the times.

"It really has, because you never used to see a royally bred horse at a two-year-old sale--never," Campbell explained. "Those horses were sold in July at Keeneland or at Saratoga. The idea of a \$16-million horse being at a two-year-old sale was absolutely unheard of, to use a wild example. There was never much quality in pedigrees in the early days."

Campbell divides his buying time between the yearling and the two-year-old sales, but his philosophy is slightly different when he is shopping for juveniles.

"I probably pay more attention to where they came from [at the two-year-old sales]," he said. "I'm cautious--I think probably some two-year-old consignors bear down pretty hard on them. I'm just a little cautious about who I buy from. I've been buying for a long time, so I know there are certain people that I can have enormous confidence in whatever they tell me about their horse. But I think consignors are more outspoken about their horses' characteristics--good and bad--than they used to be, thanks to the attention that's been focused on integrity at the sales."

Campbell liked what he heard about Aikenite, and the colt lived up to his early promise last season. The Florida-bred was third in the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. and second in the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity. Connections were encouraged by Aikenite's solid fifth-place effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, where he finished just 2 1/2 lengths adrift of the winner, but were disappointed when he ran sixth in his 2010 debut, the Jan. 23 GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream Park.

"We're coming off a race that was mediocre," Campbell admitted, but added, "We think there were reasons for that. He is a poor work horse that had three months off. He was probably not quite fit enough. And Johnny Velazquez put him on kind of a suicidal pace early on, so we gave him an excuse. He was beaten five lengths, and we hope we'll see a tighter horse [in Saturday's GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S.]. We're going back to the rider that we had--[Alan] Garcia. He's going to take him back and make one run with him."

It's early yet to consider Aikenite a Triple Crown contender, but connections are hopeful the colt will be competitive going a distance of ground.

"He's got a bottom side that's got a lot of stay in it," Campbell said. "He's out of a Saint Ballado mare, and his second dam is by Secretariat, so I don't know. I'm not one who makes too many preconceived judgements about that. He relaxes, he's got a beautiful stride, he's a big strong horse. I don't know why he wouldn't go as far as most of them."

Looking past the Fountain of Youth, Campbell offered, "I don't think there's any plan. This is a crucial race for us. We know he likes the synthetic track. He ran a big race at Keeneland [in the Futurity], and ran well in the Breeders' Cup, so I think we have that in mind. If we run a hell of a race, we'd probably run back in the Florida Derby. If we don't run so good, we may look at Keeneland."

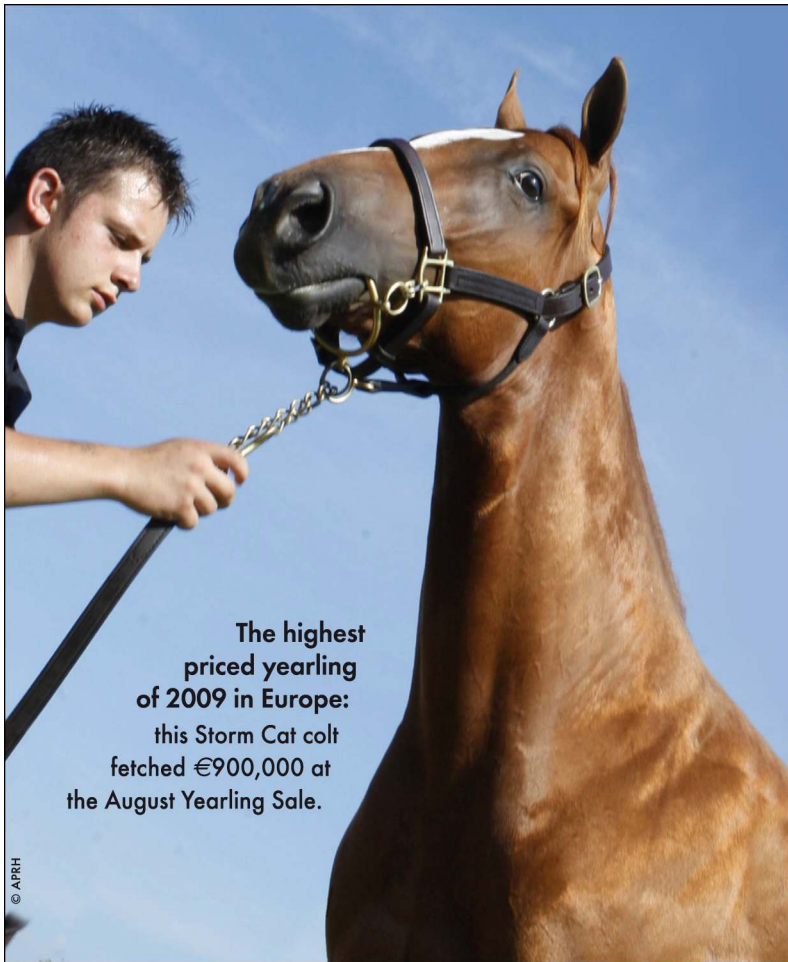

TOC Summit Draws a Crowd:

Nearly 150 people filled the Baldwin Terrace room at Santa Anita for Saturday's first owner/trainer industry summit, hosted by the Thoroughbred Owners of California. The summit's first panel focused on California's satellite wagering system and included participation from Tom Varela of SCOTWINC, George Haines of Santa Anita, Craig Fravel of Del Mar Thoroughbred Club, Robert Harman of Golden Gate Fields and Chris Korby of CARF. The aging system of 32 wagering sites has been losing money in recent years as it faces competition from on-line betting, high-fixed costs, and outdated facilities. Proposed solutions included calls for mini-satellites at sports bars, card clubs and Indian casinos. A second panel focused on the year-round racing calendar, with discussion of the possibility of a reduction in racing dates and longer breaks between meetings. During the final panel, track surfaces were discussed. Drs. Lucy Anthenill and Francisco Uzol of UC Davis Laboratory presented statistics on findings from their necropsy program on racehorse fatalities from 2005 through 2009 on dirt, synthetic and turf tracks. Dr. Rick Arthur of UC David School of Veterinary Medicine and CHRB gave information on catastrophic injuries in racing and training. Trainers John Shirreffs and John Sadler talked about their experiences on synthetic surfaces and explained their desire to return to traditional dirt tracks. From the audience, trainer Darrell Vienna and owner Jerry Moss added their calls for a return to traditional dirt tracks.

Former Trainer Dal Jones Jr Dies:

Former trainer Dal Jones, Jr. died of an apparent heart attack after undergoing surgery at Arcadia Methodist Hospital Tuesday. He was 38. Jones was part of Hollywood Park's marketing and group sales departments. He is survived by his wife Sally, son Dal Jr. and daughter Avary.
