DEEM & MIDSHIPMAN TRIUMPH AT MEYDAN

Godolphin's **Midshipman** (Unbridled's Song) and **Deem (Ire)** (Dalakhani {Ire}), campaigned by Prince Sultan Mohammed Saud Al Kabeer, punched their tickets to participate at the initial Dubai World Cup championships to held at the new Meydan Racecourse Mar. 27. Crowned champion juvenile colt following a victory in the GI Breeders' Juvenile at Santa Anita in 2008, Midshipman proved he was the class of the field with a dominant 3 1/4-length victory in a 1400-meter conditions race at Meydan last night. Jockey Frankie Dettori, who piloted the handsome chestnut to a fourth most recently in the Jan. 28 G3 Al Maktoum Challenge-Round 1, was also aboard for yesterday's victory. "We think he is a [Dubai] World Cup night horse, so we

needed to get him back to winning ways," explained winning trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "He ran well enough in the Al Maktoum Challenge, and hopefully, he can progress from this." Showcasing the fairer set yesterday was the G3 Balanchine S. The 1800-meter test went to Saudi Arabia representative Deem, who was a seventh in last year's G1 Sheema Classic. "She is a nice filly and one we have always held in some regard," said winning trainer Jerry Barton. "Hopefully, we can get her to [Dubai] World Cup night as we did last year when she ran a great race in defeat."

Also establishing herself as a top candidate for the upcoming Dubai World Cup races on last night's card was Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum's

Raihana (Aus) (Elusive Quality), who captured the Listed UAE Oaks in professional fashion. A winner in a conditions event over this surface Jan. 28, the bay was most recently fourth behind **Siyaadah (GB)** (Shamardal) in the Listed UAE 1000 Guineas Feb. 2, but turned the tables on that filly, who was third this time around. "She is a lovely filly and we thought she would

nearly win the UAE 1000 Guineas, but nothing really went right in that race," explained trainer Michael de Kock. "She has done it well tonight, and will probably be back for the UAE Derby." *Dubai Results cont. p2*

Turf Breezes Return to Calder Sale...

For the first time since 2006, Fasig-Tipton will offer consignors the choice to breeze their horses on the turf in advance of next Tuesday's Calder Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale. The breeze show will be conducted this morning at the Miami-area track beginning at 10 a.m. The turf breezes will be conducted immediately following the dirt breezes.

Fasig-Tipton's Terence Collier explained the reasons for bringing the turf works back.

"I think it was a combination of interest from both sides of our customer base," he said. "The consignors like the flexibility, and the buyers view it as an added dimension to some of the pedigrees they're seeing in the book. So, there was persuasion from both sides: an expression of interest from buyers that it was something they'd like to add on, and certainly a willingness among consignors to participate in it. We don't anticipate it will be huge numbers--I think we have about a dozen or so horses scheduled for turf works. They've been schooling on the turf all week." *F-T Calder Sale Cont. p2*

Deem kicked off her career with three straight victories at Saudi Arabia's King Abdulaziz Racecourse at the end of 2008, and made it four in a row in the G3 Cape Verdi Derrinstown Stud S. at Nad Al Sheba last February. The grey suffered her first defeat when fifth in this event last year, then disappeared after running seventh in the Mar. 28 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. Making her return in a conditions test at King Abdulaziz Oct. 16, she scored by 3 3/4 lengths going a mile and an eighth. Deem was runner-up in a 1 1/4-mile handicap event at that track Dec. 11 and was most recently fourth in the Crown Prince Cup at a mile and a half Jan. 8. Dropping back to 1800 meters here, she settled off the pace and came flying at the finish to get her head in front on the line. **Click for the [Racing Post chart](#). MIDSHIPMAN (c, 4, [Unbridled's Song](#)--Fleet Lady {MGSW & GISP-US, \$631,190}, by Avenue of Flags), the 2008 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero and champion two-year-old colt, made only two starts during his three-year-old season, scoring in a Belmont optional claimer in September and completing the trifecta in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Oak Tree Nov. 7.

He reported home fourth in the G3 Maktoum Challenge-Round 1 in his seasonal debut at Meydan Jan. 28. With Frankie Dettori aboard here, the chestnut raced in mid-division, struck the front with 300 meters to go, and had 3 1/4 lengths

Consignor Cary Frommer said that, although she doesn't plan to breeze any horses over the grass, she likes having the option to do so.

"Options are always good," Frommer said. "If you have a grass sire, you don't have to only go to one particular sale--you can come here to Calder, too."



Prominent buyer Buzz Chace agreed. "I think it's a good thing," he said. "You have some European people here--they're turf and synthetics. It's a nice turf course, so it's a good option."

South Florida was hammered by torrential rains Wednesday, but things cleared up yesterday and the turf course looks to be in okay shape for the breezes, though Collier said that Fasig would always reserve the

right to move the works to the main track should the turf come up unsatisfactory.

"But the Calder people really manage their tracks extremely well," he said. "As you know, during the summer, they have these huge deluges during the rainy season, and I think Calder is one of the best-managed race tracks when it comes to dealing with weather conditions."

Collier added that Wednesday's rain was actually welcomed by the Fasig crew.

"These guys have been going through a tough winter weather-wise in Ocala, and they've experienced a variety of conditions they rarely have to manage," he explained. "I think some of them have found that it's compromised the fitness of the horses, and Calder's sandy track is not what they've been used to training on in Ocala. The rain puts a different perspective on this track, and it's much easier for us to hold the moisture in the track when there's natural water on it."

Triple Threats

‘WILD’ AND ‘LUCK’ TOP KY OAKS NOMS Nancy Mazzoni’s **She Be Wild** (Offlee Wild), winner of the GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies and the champion two-year-old filly of 2009, and Mark DeDomenico LLC, John Carver and Jerry Hollendorfer’s three-time Grade I winner **Blind Luck** (Pollard’s Vision) top a list of 143 three-year-old fillies nominated to compete in the Apr. 30 GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs. The nomination period closed Feb. 13, however, supplemental nominations to the race will be accepted at the time of entry--Tuesday, Apr. 28--for a fee of \$25,000. The original fee was \$100. The field for the nine-furlong test is restricted to 14 fillies, and if a greater number of fillies should be entered, preference will be given to the sophomores that have accumulated the highest earnings in graded stakes races. This year’s total is down from the 170 fillies nominated to the race a year ago, when eventual Horse of the Year, Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d’Oro), rolled to an impressive 20 1/4-length victory. A record 192 fillies were made eligible for the race in 2007.

Other stars of the sophomore filly crop nominated to this season’s Oaks include GSWs **Beautician** (Dehere), **Biofuel** (Stormin Fever), **Sassy Image** (Broken Vow), **Hot Dixie Chick** (Dixie Union), **Decelerator** (Dehere), **Bickersons** (Silver Deputy), **Quiet Temper** (Quiet American), **Jody Slew** (Slew City Slew), **Amen Hallelujah** (Montbrook), **Ailalea** (Pulpit) and **Crisp** (El Corredor).

I’ve Got the Fever Possible for Gotham

I’ve Got the Fever (Stephen Got Even), who graduated going a mile at Aqueduct last Saturday, could make his next start in the Mar. 6 GIII Gotham S., trainer John Terranova told *Daily Racing Form*. “It’s absolutely under consideration, especially since he’s come out of the race really well,” Terranova told *DRF*. “Ideally, two weeks isn’t that great.” According to Terranova, I’ve Got the Fever was supposed to compete Feb. 11, but that day’s card was canceled due to inclement weather. “He’s been improving steadily every race,” Terranova said. “We added blinkers and it really focused him. It seems like the Stephen Got Evens get better as time goes by.” Additionally, Terranova indicated that Michael Iavarone, president of IEAH Stables, confirmed that the operation would pay \$6,000 to make I’ve Got the Fever a late nominee to the Triple Crown series. Looking a little further down the road, the colt might be targeted toward the Apr. 3 Illinois Derby. In related news, another sophomore hailing from the Terranova barn, **Negligee** (Northern Afleet), will probably be pointed toward the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland Apr. 3. Negligee, who may use the Mar. 6 GIII Herecomesthebride S. at Gulfstream as a prep for Keeneland’s opening weekend feature, won last October’s GI Alcibiades S. “I think more than likely we’ll go straight to the Ashland,” he told *DRF*. “[We] hope to run there and go to the Kentucky Oaks [Apr. 30].”

Plans for Pletcher Team

Todd Pletcher, who enjoyed a banner weekend with his three-year-old squad last weekend, indicated that GIII El Camino Real Derby winner **Connemara** (Giant’s Causeway), who broke his maiden by five lengths at Turfway last fall, will likely make his next start in the Mar. 27 GII Lane’s End S. Dual Grade III winner **Interactif** (Broken Vow), who was a close-up second in the Feb. 7 Hallandale Beach S., may go straight to the GI Santa Anita Derby without a prep. Looking to make his first start of the season, **Super Saver** (Maria’s Mon), winner of the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at two, will probably wait for the GIII Rebel S. Mar. 13 instead of running in the GIII Gotham S. a week earlier.

MORE CHANGES FOR OHIO DERBY The GIII Ohio Derby, which was downgraded from a Grade II last fall, will be contested at 1 1/16 miles at Thistledowns July 31, according to *Daily Racing Form* yesterday. The event, which was run for a purse of \$150,000 in 2009, will also see its purse cut to \$100,000 in 2010. "By shortening the race we might be able to recruit more horses," Bill Couch, Thistledown's director of racing told *DRF*. "While the distance change doesn't seem like a major change, it will be to some horsemen. Positioning the race in late July allows us to steer clear of derbys in other states." Thistledowns' 122-day meeting runs from Apr. 3 through Nov. 6.

THIS WEEK IN HISTORY...

February 26, 1973...With **Secretariat** having been named Horse of the Year for 1972 and champion two-year-old, Claiborne Farm announced that the colt had been syndicated for a then-record \$6,080,000--equivalent to 32 shares at \$190,000 each.

February 27, 1982...Florida apprentice **Mary Russ** became the first female jockey to win a Grade I stakes in North America when she captured the Widener H. aboard Lord Darnley at Hialeah.

February 28, 1957...**John Longden** became the first jockey in history to reach 5,000 victories.

March 1, 1991...**Pat Day**, 37, became the sixth rider in history whose mounts earned \$100 million when he rode Wild Sierra to a second-place finish in the first race at Oaklawn Park.

March 2, 1940...Beaten by a nose in both the 1937 and 1938 Santa Anita H., **Seabiscuit** finally won the Big 'Cap in his final race. He retired the then-leading-money-winning horse in the world.

March 2, 1966...**Kelso**, Horse of the Year 1960-64, ran his last race, finishing fourth at Hialeah Park.

**On the Triple Crown Trail After Impressive Optional
Claiming Victory at Tampa Bay Downs Feb. 17**

Odysseus, the character from Greek mythology, overcame many obstacles to make it home safely after the Trojan War. And now his namesake finds himself on an exciting journey of his own: the path to the Triple Crown.

Named for the hero of the epic poem *The Odyssey*, Odysseus was tabbed a ☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆ after running away to a 15-length victory in a Tampa Bay Downs optional claimer Feb. 17 ([video](#)).

Odysseus is owned by Padua Stables, the racing and breeding organization operated by Satish Sanan, a native of Delhi, India, and his wife, Anne. Their son Sasha and daughter Nadia assist with the family's racing business, while their other daughter Chemaine oversees Satish's private equity fund.

Like Odysseus' voyage to Ithaca from Troy, Sanan's journey to the United States was tortuous. After emigrating from India to England and later to Canada, Sanan later moved to the United States at the request of his employer at the time, SHL Systemhouse.

"The company I was working for in Canada was opening offices in the U.S., and they asked me to come here," said Sanan, who is now a citizen of the United States. "So I moved to the U.S. and eventually started my own company."

That company was technology firm IMRglobal, which started with three employees, but eventually had a market capitalization of \$1.8 billion and 42 offices in seven countries. The company went public in 1996, giving Sanan the money to pursue one of his dreams: owning Thoroughbred

racehorses.

"I was young and had no money in England, and I was introduced to racing by somebody who used to bet horses all the time," said Sanan, now a trustee of Breeders' Cup Ltd. and a member of the board of directors. "I was in Liverpool, and I went with him one day and won a lot of money. I got hooked on it, and I've been doing it ever since. I'm a big horseplayer, but I promised myself, when I could afford to do it, that I would own some horses. It was only supposed to be one or two, but after I got involved with it, we have invested a lot of capital--over a \$150 million over the years."

Sanan, who later started the business process outsourcing firm STI Knowledge before he sold the company in 2007, has used a multi-faceted approach to acquiring his racing stock. While Padua Stables is primarily a breed-to-race operation, Sanan has also found success purchasing horses from yearling sales, two-year-old auctions and through private purchases. Sanan bought the 2002 champion two-year-old Vindication (Seattle Slew) and 1999 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies S. winner Cash Run (Seeking the Gold) for over seven figures as yearlings, and purchased the 1999 GI De Francis Dash winner Yes It's True (Is It True)--now standing at Three Chimneys--as a juvenile for a \$800,000. Sanan acquired an interest in the 2007 GI Preakness S. Curlin (Smart Strike) after his impressive maiden victory at Gulfstream Park, and later sold his stake after the colt won that year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Curlin was later named Horse of the Year for 2007 and 2008. Sanan also partially owned the 2007 GI Haskell Invitational S. winner Any Given Saturday (Distorted Humor), having bought into the colt after he won the Sam F. Davis S. at Tampa Bay Downs.

"The program changes from time to time, from buying yearlings, to buying two-year-olds, to buying racing stock from the racetrack," Sanan said. "Two-year-old sales are good because you get an almost ready-made product. You can hit the ground running. You pay more than with the yearlings, but the consignors have taken the risk. There is no guaranteed success, but the probability is much higher."

Padua Stables bought Odysseus for \$250,000 last year's OBS March Sale after the colt breezed a furlong in :10 2/5 ([video](#)) over the OBS Training Center's Safetrack.

"We caught him breezing," said Sanan's bloodstock agent David Ingordo. "He breezed kinda greenly, but he did it great. I left him off my list, but we later saw him back at the barn. [Consignor] Nick [de Meric] told me, 'This might sound like a load of garbage, but this horse doesn't like the synthetic track,' and I took his word because he's an honest guy. When we signed the ticket, I was happy because I thought we could have paid a lot more for him."

Odysseus stood out to Sanan because the colt appeared to be one who would improve additional distance.

"He was a beautiful chestnut horse," Sanan recalled. "He was a very large at that time, although he hasn't grown much [since]. Our program right now is all about two-turn horses. He had the distance pedigree, he was a correct horse and was very fluid-moving."

Second on debut at Aqueduct Oct. 31 after he was bumped on the start, Odysseus contested the pace and battled down the stretch to earn a half-length victory at Gulfstream Park Jan. 14. The colt romped at Tampa Bay Downs Feb. 17 in his first start over a route of ground, and his connections are now considering a return to the Oldsmar oval for the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 13.

"He got the experience we were looking for," Sanan said of his optional claiming victory. "He got two turns, he won impressively and showed us what we were looking for. We just have to decide where to go from here." -J.F.

Horse Welfare Bill Unanimously Passed by House:

Legislation that will enhance the health and welfare of the horse passed The Kentucky House of Representatives Thursday on a bipartisan vote of 98-0, according to a published release. House Bill 398, sponsored by Rep. Tom McKee, D-Cynthiana, will now be considered by the state Senate. "This legislation is moving forward with strong bipartisan support," said Dr Frank Dwayne Marcum, DVM, an equine veterinarian from Versailles and president of the Kentucky-based Equine Health and Welfare Alliance Inc. "To our knowledge, no other organization in the U.S. has brought before a state legislature specific, focused equine health and welfare identification and reform that offers the chance for real solutions." According to the release, House Bill 398 will create the Kentucky Equine Health and Welfare Board under the Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet to assist, advise, and consult with the Cabinet on issues of equine health and welfare and will take action to help maintain the health, welfare, and safety of equines in the Commonwealth. The bill will also create an equine health and welfare trust fund to be administered by the Board to promote equine health, welfare, and safety. "From the pony in the backyard to the winner of the Kentucky Derby, the horse is special in this state," said McKee, a Harrison County farmer. "It is our signature animal. This bill is a step toward improving the health and welfare of the horse."
 Co-sponsoring the bipartisan legislation is Rep. Royce Adams, D-Dry Ridge; Rep. Ron Crimm, R-Louisville; Rep. Charlie Hoffman, D-Georgetown; Rep. Don Pasley, D-Winchester; Rep. Kent Stevens, D-Lawrenceburg; Rep. Susan Westrom, D-Lexington; and Rep. Wilson Stone, D-Scottsville. The bill is the first major initiative of the newly formed Equine Health and Welfare Alliance Inc., a Kentucky-based nonprofit corporation dedicated to the proper care, maintenance, and treatment of the horse and all equines.

“This bill is focused solely on the horse,” said Dr. Doug Byars, DVM, a founding member of the EHWA from Georgetown, Ky. “The groups, organizations, and individuals that work on behalf of the horse in Kentucky have come together to support this legislation and this effort.”

The Kentucky Equine Health and Welfare Board will have responsibility for the following:

- Undertake research, conduct public hearings, and collect data to determine prevalent equine health and welfare issues.
- Strive to develop regional centers of care for unwanted, abused, neglected, or confiscated equines.
- Create a system of voluntary certification of equine rescue and retirement operations that meet industry-accepted standards for care of equines.
- Research and offer suggestions for statutory changes affecting equine health, welfare, abuse, and neglect issues.
- Assist veterinarians and others in maintaining the health and welfare of equines by identifying and referring to the appropriate authorities critical areas of need.
