ALL PASSION IN MAC DIARMIDA

Presious Passion (Royal Anthem), who has made his reputation by charging out to seemingly unsustainable early leads in marathon events and bravely holding on

to victory over late-closing rivals, went wire-to-wire to take Sunday's GII Mac Diarmida S. at Gulfstream Park. The 8-5 favorite quickly assumed a commanding lead in the 1 3/8-miles event, opening up by seven lengths after a half in :47.46 over a turf course labeled good. His advantage

was gradually eroded as he completed six furlongs in 1:13.11 and, after one mile in 1:37.61, it looked like he would be overtaken by **Winchester** (Theatrical {Ire}), but the wily veteran found another gear and kicked clear to a determined 1 1/4-length victory. Presious Passion is now expected to head to Dubai for the Mar. 27 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. "We were concerned earlier in the day that the course might be less than firm, but after discussing it with [owner] Mr. [Frank] Generazio we decided to go ahead and run," said winning trainer Mary Hartmann. "We decided it would be better looking ahead to Dubai to have a race than not, although we planned to go anyhow and train him up to that race if necessary. We're ready to go now if everything goes all right." **Cont. p2**

ST TRINIANS TO TACKLE BOYS IN BIG 'CAP

St Trinians (GB) (Piccolo {GB}) will attempt to become the first female to win the historic GI Santa Anita H. next Saturday. The five-year-old mare is coming off a 1 3/4-length victory over Life Is Sweet (Storm Cat), third against the boys in last year's Big 'Cap, in the Feb. 13 GII Santa Maria H. St Trinians is unbeaten in four U.S. starts, taking a pair of Southern California allowance races last year before opening 2010 with a win in the Jan. 9 Paseana H. "She gets a little break in the weights than if I ran against Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) a week later [in the Mar. 13 GI Santa Margarita H.]," explained trainer Mike Mitchell. "If there is a question, it's if she can go a mile and a quarter. I think she can, the way she finished winning the Santa Maria." St Trinians worked five furlongs in company Friday at Hollywood Park in 1:01.60. "She worked great," Mitchell said. "It was a good, strong gallop-out."

ALL DUE RESPECT JOINS SANTA ANITA OAKS

All Due Respect (Value Plus), third in last year's GIII Pocahontas S., has joined the list of contenders for next Saturday's GI Santa Anita Oaks. The dark bay filly is coming off a 7 1/2-length maiden victory at Fair Grounds Jan. 24. "I've only had her a few weeks," said trainer Kathy Walsh. "She's doing well and she worked Friday in 1:11 4/5." Also expected for the Santa Anita Oaks, **Cozie Rosie** (Pleasantly Perfect) worked seven furlongs on Pro-Ride Sunday in 1:28.20 and **Crisp** (El Corredor) went six furlongs at Hollywood in 1:12.

SALVE GERMANIA RETURNS THURSDAY

Salve Germania (Ire) (Peintre Celebre), winner of last year's GII Ballston Spa H. at Saratoga, will return to action Thursday at Gulfstream Park. The five-year-old

mare was sold to IEAH Stables after the Ballston Spa and transferred to the barn of Todd Pletcher. She has not raced since running fifth in the GI E. P. Taylor S. at Woodbine Oct. 17. **Salve Germania** is one of 12 fillies and mares entered for Thursday's 1 1/16-miles allowance feature at Gulfstream.

Also entered in the turf event is **Ramona Bass' Providanza (Fr)** (Okawango). Now trained by Christophe Clement, the four-year-old filly captured a French listed stakes for Clement's brother Nicholas. She was seventh in her U.S. debut in the Oct. 17 Calder Oaks and makes her second stateside start Thursday.

Presious Passion Wins Mac Diarmida (cont. from p1)

Presious Passion, who won the 2009 Mac Diarmida, used his dashing front-running tactics to score victories in last year's GI United Nations S. at Monmouth Park and GI Clement L Hirsch H. He very nearly stole the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, coming up just a half-length short of Conduit (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}), before ending the year with a fifth-place effort in the Dec. 26 GII W. L. McKnight H. at Calder. The seven-year-old gelding had worked only once since that effort, but that wasn't a concern for trainer Mary Hartmann. "He only had the one workout since his last race, but as they get older they don't need to do as much," Hartmann said. "It's become his pattern." Everything went perfectly in the race, according to winning rider Elvis Trujillo. "The horse broke sharp and was very relaxed, and that was very good for the horse," Trujillo said. "Every time he goes right to the lead, and you just hope things go easy. Then at the three-eighths, you put him in the bit, and he just goes on. [The turf] was perfect today. There were no problems."

Fruit of the Vine...

In 2005, Vinery established a breaking and training facility in Summerfield, Florida, to go along with a burgeoning stallion operation. Ian Brennan, who spent about 10 years working for his brother, prominent consignor Niall Brennan, was tabbed as the farm's trainer.

"He does a fantastic job," bloodstock agent Mike Ryan said of Ian Brennan. "He worked for his dad in Ireland, he worked for the Aga Khan and Liam Brown, and at Kildangan Stud, and then he came over to work for Niall. It was a natural progression--I knew ultimately he would go to do his own thing. Vinery asked me to recommend someone, and I told them, 'Here's your guy.' He's very, very good at what he does. He and his staff do a great job."

With 100 stalls, a seven-furlong dirt track and a six-furlong turf course, as well as an aquaciser, the Summerfield base has much appeal. This past September, Vinery announced that they would begin consigning at juvenile sales on their clients' behalf.

"We probably have 25 percent of our clients whose horses go to the two-year-old sales," explained Vinery President Tom Ludt. "I think our breaking operation in Florida is one of the best. Since we're doing most of the work, we figured it's just another way to service our clients. In the past, there were horses coming off our farm that had been prepped for the two-year-old sales and were shipped right to the consignor at the sales grounds. We just thought it was something we should branch out into and offer the product ourselves."

The national economic downturn in the last 18 months has had a significant impact on auction returns, but that didn't affect Vinery's decision to enter the market as a consignor this year.

"The reality of the matter is that we don't have any control over the timing," Ludt said. "This is a business decision as we've developed our farm [in Florida]."

He added, "These are our clients' horses--we are not selling Vinery horses. The horses that we buy at yearling sales, we buy to race. This is just a service to the clients. It's strictly horses that came to us to break and train. Whether they decided in the beginning or decided more recently to put them in a sale, it's just an option to provide that service for them."

The Vinery draft contains a number of noteworthy individuals, including [hip 5](#), a Speightstown half-sister to Grade I winner and Eclipse Award finalist Hot Dixie Chick (Dixie Union); [hip 75](#), a Gone West colt out of a half-sister to top sire Elusive Quality (Gone West); [hip 100](#), a Pulpit colt from the immediate family of Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro); and [hip 122](#), a Giant's Causeway half-sister to multiple Grade I winner Henny Hughes (Hennessy).

"Some of the pedigrees jump out at you," Ludt said of the Vinery consignment. "Obviously, that's what you want, but then you need the goods to back it up, and I think we've got that potential. At these first two-year-old sales, you really don't know what you've got until the last day, because we're going to be careful with these horses. A lot of these horses haven't even been squeezed that hard."

"We've got a really nice group of horses," Ludt continued. "Hopefully, they'll be towards the top of the sale, whatever that turns out to be. We'll consult with [our clients] as we get through the breeze show and the showings to see what kind of reserves they want."

New Kid on the Block...

A familiar face at the sales barns, but consigning at Calder for the first time, is Rebecca Hayden. The Orlando native has been busy showing her four prospects to interested parties, and is optimistic that they'll be well received when they step into the auction ring Tuesday.

"I was very pleased with the breeze show," Hayden said. "I think the horses went well, and I was thrilled with the way that everything turned out."

Among Hayden's group is hip 53, a Cozzene filly who is a half-sister to graded stakes winner Western Smoke (Smoke Glacken). The grey filly, a \$135,000 KEESEP purchase, breezed an eighth in :10 2/5 Friday. Hayden will also lead over hip 58, a Forest Wildcat filly that fetched \$270,000 at KEESEP. The granddaughter of Grade I winner Golden Treat (Theatrical {Ire}) did her drill in :10 3/5.

"Her sister ran third in [the Dearly Precious S.] a couple of weeks ago at Aqueduct, so she's got some updates," Hayden offered. "She's a really nice filly."

Hayden grew up riding and showing horses. After attending college for a year, she opted to get some real-life schooling by working for prominent pinhookers Don Graham and Murray Smith. **Cont. p7**

"I worked for Don Graham for about three or four years, coming down to Calder for the two-year-old sales," Hayden revealed. "And Murray has been a great mentor. I learned a lot from both of them. Obviously, they're both very experienced in the business, and it was a great opportunity for me."

Hayden went out on her own several years ago, buying weanlings and reselling them as yearlings.

"Of course, my parents said 'You're never going to make any money in the horse business,'" she recalled. "But I kept being persistent. I got really lucky and had a few good years selling some yearlings, and here I am."

She added, "I feel like this has been my college education. I was just adamant about going to every sale; I looked at it as an investment in my future. Since this is what I wanted to do, the more sales I went to, the more I learned."

Hayden, now based at Eclipse Training Center, sold her first two-year-olds at OBS last spring, and went to Kentucky to look for her next group of prospects.

"I enjoy training and breaking them and getting them ready," she said. "I like a horse that has the right angles --the ones that have the nice long, deep shoulder, long hips and good hind legs. I like to see them have a good walk and be fluid in their action."

Three of the four horses Hayden has were purchased in the name of Tom Van Meter's Stockplace.

"Tom and I partnered on these horses together," she explained. "He's been really good to me. Originally I looked for horses for him and shortlisted a few at the September sale. We put a plan together, and this is where we are. He's a really great guy, and I couldn't ask for a better partner."


It's been a rough 18 months for the racehorse market, but Hayden remains optimistic.

"I think everybody has had their ups and downs," she pointed out. "I love this game, and I hope I can continue doing it. I've got great people around me that help support me, and I've got nice horses. Good horses still sell well."

Hayden's consignment is in Barn 77, just on the other side of the shedrow from her former boss, Murray Smith.

"She's a lovely girl and works very hard," Smith said of her one-time employee. "She's got some nice horses here, and I'm proud of her. I think she's going to do just fine." --MK

F-T Racing Club Kicks Off..

Standing trackside Friday during a sun-soaked but chilly breeze show, Fasig-Tipton's Bayne Welker held court on the Calder Racecourse apron. In attendance were 16 neophytes to the Thoroughbred business. They crowded around, many with a cold beer or cocktail in hand, and listened as Welker explained the vagaries of two-year-old in training sales. This is what this means, that's what that means--*no, yes, that horse moves well, that one less so, etc.*

Class was being conducted for the benefit of members of the Fasig-Tipton Racing Club. Officially launched New Year's Day, the FTRC is a new venture sponsored by Fasig-Tipton that hopes to draw new people into the business. In total, 26 members own shares in four FTRC horses.

The first of the horses, Bialy (Distorted Humor), raced for the club on Valentine's Day. The three-year-old Todd Pletcher trainee got the operation off to a good start with a close-up second-place finish as the favorite in her second career start, a six-furlong maiden special weight at Gulfstream.

In some ways, the club operates like a traditional syndicate--a group of like-minded people come together to divide the risk of Thoroughbred ownership while also sharing its inherent thrills. The FTRC is different, however, in that the horses the members invest in are leased, not purchased outright. The term of the lease is one year, at which point the horses will be returned to their original owners.

Because of the short lease period, and because they want members to have a positive experience, they have opted to lease horses with at least some proven form. All four horses in the syndicate had made at least one prior start for their original owners before being leased. By contrast, most racing partnerships in the U.S. acquire unraced horses, either at the yearling or two-year-old in training sales.

Handicappers may have noticed, for instance, that Bialy made her first start not for FTRC, but for Kenny Troutt and Bill Casner's WinStar Farm, which bred the filly. Bialy was well-regarded in her first start for WinStar at Churchill last November, running a good second as the 5-2 choice in a maiden special weight. Despite that auspicious debut, WinStar agreed to lease Bialy to FTRC to help get the venture off the ground.

Likewise, the other three horses in the FTRC were leased by big-name operations. From Darley Stable came two horses, the six-year-old gelding Ea (Dynaformer) and the four-year-old colt Majestic Blue (Forestry). The former has been a hard-knocking sort who placed second in last year's lucrative Charles Town Classic. He has not yet started for the FTRC. Majestic Blue, a first-out winner at Saratoga as a juvenile, finished fifth in a Gulfstream allowance race in his first start for the FTRC Feb. 24.

Katy Moore, who manages the FTRC alongside assistant manager Reed Ringler, says that the club is a sort of "graduate program into Thoroughbred ownership."

She explained, "When the horses are running, they get to come down and go to the paddock, talk to the trainers, meet the jockeys, etc. It's as much for the education and for the social atmosphere as it is just putting together a racing syndicate. At Fasig-Tipton, we have the Calder two-year-old sale, we have Kentucky and, obviously, Saratoga in August, and because of that we're in a very good position to showcase the best racing and the best sales, and give them a good experience. Hopefully, they'll have developed a passion for racing by that point and go into a bigger syndicate, or they'll go and buy horses on their own."

Another difference between FTRC and other partnerships is that the club itself is not being operated to produce any sort of profit for Fasig-Tipton; in fact, the company is paying all the managing expenses. All training and vet expenses are paid out of the member's one-time initial investment. Any purse earnings are shared between FTRC members and the original owner.

The FTRC is taking advantage of Fasig-Tipton's Calder sale, as well as last Saturday's Fasig-Tipton Filly Festival at Gulfstream. Those 16 members at the breeze show flew in to enjoy an extended weekend of warm weather, great racing and exciting sales action and, well, two out of three ain't bad.

"We brought them to the breeze show, we took them to dinner in Miami Friday night, then we took them to Palm Meadows Saturday morning to see all four horses, meet the trainers, watch the horses at the track, and see that side of the business," explained Moore.

"We took them to Gulfstream Park for the party in the paddock Saturday, all the while introducing them to people in the industry--bloodstock agents, trainers, other owners and whatnot--so they could get an idea of what it's like, and who they might be comfortable with if they went out on their own. Then on Sunday morning, Dennis Lynch conducted a conformation clinic. We're fortunate with Fasig to have these brilliant minds to educate our members throughout the year, and we're definitely taking advantage of that."

The brainchild behind the Racing Club--though somewhat bashful to admit it--is Moore herself, who previously worked with Castleton Lyons. In November of 2008, Moore brought an idea to Fasig she'd developed while working abroad in Australia and Japan.

"They do a lot of syndicates over there, but they're big--it's not just a little group," she said. "It's affordable, it's fun. Some of them are leasing syndicates, especially in Japan. They have something like 70,000 people in racing syndicates in Japan, and I think there's not even 15 racing clubs. So I was think, gosh, why don't we do more of that here? The timing was perfect, with Synergy purchasing Fasig-Tipton and being very supportive of the idea, though it wasn't like it was a new idea or concept or anything. But, for some people, it's a great low-risk, entry-level introduction to racing." -LM

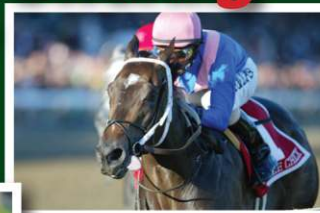
